WEEKEND STORYLINES

- Following the postponement to its Big 12 series at Baylor this weekend, the No. 1 Oklahoma softball team picked up a pair of games against Mississippi State and Louisiana Tech (13-16) this Saturday, April 10, in Ruston, La.
- The Sooners will play Mississippi State at 12:30 p.m. CT Saturday before turning around to face off against Louisiana Tech on their home field at 3 p.m.
- The games will be available to watch via CUSA.tv (subscription required) and can be heard on The Franchise 2 (103.3 FM, 1560 AM) in Oklahoma and the Tuneln app nationwide with OU play-by-play announcer Chris Plank on the call. Limited quantity tickets are available via Louisiana Tech's ticket office (318-257-3631) or at LaTechSports.com/tickets.
- OU is the only unbeaten team in the country. With a 28-0 mark in 2021 and wins in their final seven games of 2020, the Sooners hold an NCAA-best win streak of 35 games. Oklahoma's 28-0 start is the best unbeaten streak to start a season in program history.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS

- **Mississippi State:** The Bulldogs (19-15, 0-9 SEC) are coached by 2009 Oklahoma alum and All-American Samantha Ricketts. 2021 marks Ricketts second season at the helm of the program after taking the position following four seasons as an assistant coach in Starkville.
- Also on staff with the team is former 2018 OU graduate and two-time national champion Nicole Pendley. Pendley is in her second season as a graduate assistant with the Bulldogs in 2021.
- MSU is coming off a walk-off win Wednesday night over Central Arkansas, 4-3. Their weekend SEC series with Tennessee was postponed for COVID concerns within the UT program.
- The Bulldogs boast power at the plate, hitting .286 as a team with seniors Fa Leilua (12 HR, 32 RBI, .362 BA) and Mia Davidson (10 HR, 23 RBI, .330 BA) leading the charge.
- Senior Annie Willis paces the team in the circle with a 2.56 ERA and an 11-4 record. Willis has registered 95 strikeouts to 20 walks in 79.1 inning pitched in 2021.
- **Last Time They Met OU:** The Sooners are undefeated against the Bulldogs, boasting a 3-0 mark with the last matchup coming in Norman on March 24, 2017, a 5-3 OU victory. Oddly enough, the teams first met in Ruston, La., the site of this weekend's matchup, on April 16, 1983, with OU shutting out MSU 4-0.
- Current redshirt senior Nicole Mendes helped the Sooners to the 2017 win with a triple, one run driven in and a run scored as she batted in the leadoff spot.
- **Louisiana Tech:** The Lady Techsters (13-16, 3-1 CUSA) are guided by Bianca Duran in her first season as interim head coach and fifth year with the program.
- La Tech comes into the weekend off a 1-7 loss to McNeese State in Lake Charles, La., on Wednesday night and a narrow 4-6 loss to No. 17/15 LSU Tuesday evening in Baton Rouge.
- The Lady Techsters are batting .252 as a team and have four players with two home runs. Freshman infielder Caroline Easom leads the team with 14 RBIs while fellow frosh KB Briley paces the team with a .293 batting average.
- Senior Bre Hernandez (4.05 ERA) leads the pitching staff with six wins in the circle to five losses and 45 strikeouts to 37 walks. Fellow senior Audrey Pickett has four wins and leads the team with 49 strikeouts.
- **Last Time They Met OU:** The Sooners hold a 8-4 record over La Tech with the last meeting coming in Oklahoma City, a 5-1 OU win on March 25, 2017. Then a freshman, Nicole Mendes hit her first career home run against the Lady Techsters, finishing the game 3-for-4 with a double, home run and two runs scored.
- The teams have met just once in Ruston on April 15, 1983, a 2-1 game in La Tech's favor. Coincidentally, the same weekend that OU met Mississippi State for the first time in program history.

to 56 straight (52-0-4 in that span). The Sooners have not lost a conference series since 2011 and have won 49 consecutive regular season Big 12 games dating back to April 23, 2017 vs. Baylor.

► Oklahoma won game won in shutout, run-rule fashion, 14-0 in five innings. OU took game two 6-2 and the finale 10-2 in five innings.

► The Sooners blasted five home runs in game one including three in the first inning. Senior captain Lynnsie Elam hit two while freshman Tiare Jennings, sophomore Kinzie Hansen and senior Jocelyn Alo all hit solo shots. Shannon Saile was magnificent in the circle, collecting her eighth win of the season in shutout fashion with eight strikeouts, no runs, two hits and one walk.

► Redshirt senior pitcher Giselle Juarez guided the Sooners to the game two win with a six-inning, nine strikeout performance that featured no walks, four hits and one run allowed. Freshman Jayda Coleman continued to impress at the dish and on the base path with a 2-for-2 day with two runs scored and two stolen bases. Fellow freshman Tiare Jennings and sophomore Mackenzie Donihoo each batted in a pair of runs.

► Junior Grace Lyons and sophomore Mackenzie Donihoo led the Sooners at the plate in a 10-2 series finale win, each ripping home runs with Lyons racking up four RBIs on the day. Redshirt senior Giselle Juarez (10-0) got the win in the circle for the second time in as many days, going three innings and allowing no runs, hits or walks and registering one strikeout. Freshman Nicole May finished the job, collecting five strikeouts and scattering four hits and giving up just one run.

► Freshman Tiare Jennings was named Big 12 Player of the Week for her performance, her third weekly conference honor of the season, the most of any Big 12 player in 2021. Jennings finished 6-for-9 (.667 BA) with one home run and three extra-base hits to go with six RBIs and 11 total bases versus Kansas.

and four-plus in one inning four times.

- ▶ The Sooners have hit back-to-back home runs nine times in 2021 and back-to-back-to-back blasts three times.
- ▶ Oklahoma has won by run rule in 20 of its 28 games.
- ▶ The Oklahoma defense holds third in the country with a .985 fielding percentage.
- ▶ OU's pitching staff is tied for first in the country with 14 shutouts. The staff ranks eighth with a 1.45 ERA.
- ▶ Oklahoma holds the top two run single-game run totals of 2021 with 33 in its victory over New Mexico Feb. 27 and 29 in its season opener over UTEP.
- ▶ Oklahoma set an NCAA single-game home run record with 13 in the season opener versus UTEP, a 29-0 (5 inn.) run-rule victory. The team tied the NCAA record for homers in an inning with five in the first and fifth innings of the game.
- ▶ Freshman Tiare Jennings and junior Grace Lyons tied the school record for home runs in a game with three a piece against the Miners in the season opener.
- ▶ Oklahoma registered a program-best 28 hits in its 33-4 victory over New Mexico on Feb. 27 in Phoenix.

CONFERENCE PLAY BEGINS

- ▶ The top-ranked Sooners are 6-0 through two Big 12 conference series. OU swept Iowa State March 26-28 in Ames before a three-game sweep of Kansas in Norman April 1-3.
- ▶ Oklahoma has won 49 consecutive Big 12 regular season games, with its last loss coming against Baylor on April 23, 2017. The streak is the longest in program history.
- ▶ OU is undefeated in their last 56 conference series (52-0-4 in that span) and have not lost a conference series since 2011.

AMAZING ALO

- ▶ Senior utility player Jocelyn Alo leads the country with 22 home runs in OU's 28 games. The Hawaii native has hit a homer in 20 of OU's 28 games, including two grand slams and two multi-HR games.
- ▶ Alo has moved up the OU record book for career home runs to second in program history with 76. The NCAA HR record holder Lauren Chamberlain ranks first in program and NCAA history with 95. Alo's 76 blasts is already good for a share of 12th all-time in NCAA history.
- ▶ The slugger tied the NCAA record for consecutive games with a home run at seven from March 7 vs. Sam

Redshirt senior Giselle Juarez, redshirt sophomore Brooke Vestal and freshman Nicole May pitched a perfect game vs. Portland State (2/28). Three OU pitchers, Vestal, freshman Alanna Thiede and sophomore Olivia Rains, combined for OU's second perfect game of the season vs. Sam Houston, March 7. Juarez, Rains and Shannon Saile combined to throw a no-hitter versus New Mexico Feb. 26, an 8-0 run-rule OU victory.

► The staff holds a 1.45 ERA and has allowed 39 runs in 28 games to go with 211 strikeouts and 77 hits allowed to 47 walks.

► Redshirt senior Shannon Saile ranks fourth in the country with a 0.41 ERA, giving up her only two earned runs of 2021 March 27 at Iowa State. Saile boasts 61 strikeouts in 34.0 innings of work to go with eight wins and two saves. Opponents are batting just .085 against the Land O'Lakes, Fla., native.

Entering her 27th season at the University of Oklahoma, NFCA Hall of Fame head coach Patty Gasso has molded the OU softball program into a national power and permanently placed herself among the elite college softball coaches in the country.

Oklahoma has won four national championships, all under Gasso: 2000, 2013, 2016 and 2017. OU is one of just three programs in NCAA history to win more than two national titles. She's reached the Women's College World Series 13 times during her tenure and advanced to the postseason in each one of her 25 seasons.

With 29 seasons as a head coach to her name, Gasso has a career collegiate coaching record of 1441-396-3 (.783) and holds an overall record of 1280-337-2 (.791) at the University of Oklahoma.

She has won more Big 12 games (343-85; .801) than any coach in the league's history and has more than twice as many overall wins as any other coach in OU history. OU has claimed 12 Big 12 regular season, including an unprecedented eight straight since the 2012 season, and six championship titles under her direction. Gasso's Sooner teams have finished second or higher 20 different times in the 24 years since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996.

Numerous Sooner players have prospered under Gasso's tutelage and garnered national, regional and conference recognition. Keilani Ricketts was the two-time USA Softball National Player of the Year in 2012 and 2013, becoming just the third player in history to win more than once. Gasso has also directed 65 All-Americans, 141 All-Region honors and 100 first-team all-conference selections.

In the Big 12 era, Sooners have been named Big 12 Player of the Year a total of 13 times and Big 12 Pitcher of the Year seven times, while eight have been selected as Big 12 Freshman of the Year and one as Big 12 Newcomer. In 2010, Amber Flores became the first player in league history to earn Player of the Year honors twice, while Shelby Pendley joined her in 2015.

The OU softball success under Gasso has also spilled over into the classroom where the Sooners have been honored with 141 academic all-conference honors. Nine of those have gone on to become Academic All-Americans, including Lana Moran, the 2000 Academic All-American of the Year.

Gasso and her staff have consistently been recognized for their efforts on and off the field. The staff was awarded three consecutive Speedline/NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards from 1999-2001 and received the national honor in 2000, 2013, 2016 and 2017. Gasso and staff have claimed the regional honor in 13 of their 25 seasons with the most recent award coming in 2019. In addition, Gasso has been named the Big 12 Coach of the Year 12 times: 1996, 1999, 2000, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019.
