ABOUT NORTH ALABAMA: At 18-3, the Lions are off to their best start to a season since making the move to Division I in 2018. UNA was very successful at the D-II level, winning the 2016 national championship. With a win, UNA will tie its win total from all of last season. The Lions have already tied their 2021 season total with 214 hits. That total would rank second in the nation if UNA was eligible for the statistical rankings. Over the weekend, Harley Stokes hit her fourth career grand slam. UNA has trailed at some point in 11 of 18 wins this year.

LEADING OFF

SCHEDULE STRENGTH: MSU's past and future opponents have combined for a .706 winning percentage this season, which ranks fourth in the nation. 28 of its 55 games are against teams that were ranked or receiving votes in the preseason polls.

RECORD WATCH: In addition to her SEC career home run record (79), Mia Davidson now holds MSU career records in RBIs (196) and total bases (531) after breaking both records last weekend.

SEC SLUGGERS: Davidson's 79 home runs trail only LSU's Eddy Furniss (80) for the most in SEC baseball and softball history. She has done so in 228 career games, while Furniss hit his in 265 games.

KEEPING IT CLEAN: MSU has committed just two errors over its last 29.0 innings (87 outs) defensively, and only one of those errors has allowed a run to score unearned.

IN THE ZONE: Kenley Hawk's 0.65 ERA is No. 12 nationally. She has allowed just three earned runs in 32.1 innings.

LAUNCHING PAD: MSU is fifth in the nation with 33 home runs and is averaging 1.50 homers per game. With 55 regular-season games on the schedule, State is on pace for a school-record 82.5-homer season. The Bulldogs have hit at least one home run in every game they've won this season.

BIG BOOKENDS: The Bulldogs play their best ball early and late in the game. MSU has outscored opponents, 79-20, across the first, second, sixth and seventh innings, and once MSU holds a lead at the end of an inning, the Bulldogs are undefeated.

HAVE MERCY: Nine of MSU's 14 wins have come via run-rule, which is tied for the fifth-most in a season in school history and the most since 2018 (11).

LINEUP LOG: Samantha Ricketts has reused a lineup card in just one game this season. In 22 games, she's used 21 different batting orders and 13 defensive alignments. Last year, she used 33 different batting orders and 16 different fielding alignments.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following each game. Seats will be assigned, and masks covering the nose and mouth may be required, consistent with current university policy. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas equipped with high-speed internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team radio/video personnel.

RADIO BROADCASTS

The Nusz Park press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office. Radio workspace will be contingent on available seating, but MSU will make every effort to accommodate visiting radio broadcasts.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

For road games, phone interviews may be conducted postgame with advance notice. The Mississippi State locker room, indoor facility and field dugouts are closed to the media.

FAST FACTS

- Since 2016, MSU is 137-51 in Nusz Park (.729).
- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season

TEAM NOTES

QUICK HITTERS

- Since 2016, MSU is 137-51 in Nusz Park (.729).
- Nine of MSU's 14 wins have come via run-rule, and State is averaging 8.8 runs and 2.0 home runs per game in its wins. The Bulldogs are averaging just 1.4 runs per game in their losses.
- State is fifth nationally in home runs (33), ninth in home runs per game (1.50) and No. 14 in slugging percentage (.571) as a team.
- Mia Davidson is second in the nation in home runs (10) and third
 in the NCAA in total bases (61) while ranking eighth in slugging
 percentage (1.052). She leads the SEC in all three categories.
- Davidson has a team-high 17 extra-base hits this season (7 2B, 10 HR) after leading the team with 29 in 2021.

PITCHING POINTS

- The Bulldog pitching staff leads the SEC with 40 looking strikeouts this season and is fourth in total strikeouts (156).
- The Bulldog pitching staff was second in the SEC with 417 strikeouts in 2021 and led the league with 109 looking strikeouts.
- Matalasi Faapito made three pitching appearances last week, striking out 13 in 10.0 innings and allowing just one run.
- Kenley Hawk is 12th in the nation with a 0.65 ERA. Aspen Wesley (1.97) and Faapito (0.47) join her on the staff to give State three pitchers with an ERA below 2.00.

TACKLING A TOUGH SCHEDULE

- The Bulldogs are set to play 28 of their 55 games against teams that were ranked or receiving votes in either the NFCA Coaches' Poll or the ESPN/USA Softball Poll.
- 24 of those games will come in conference play, and 20 will come on the road or at neutral sites.
- The Bulldogs past and future opponents have combined for a .706 winning percentage this season, which ranks fourth in the nation.
- Last year, MSU finished with the No. 8 strength of schedule in the nation and its opponents combined for a .650 winning percentage, which was fifth nationally.

STARTING FROM THE TOP

- MSU has begun using a new leadoff hitter in Riley Hull who has reached base in 5-of-15 leadoff opportunities (33.3 percent).
- Chloe Malau'ulu (12-of-24) and Brylie St. Clair (9-of-18) have reached base safely in 50.0 percent of the innings they've led off. Last year, Malau'ulu reached on 43.0 percent of her opportunities.
- State is 4-2 this season when St. Clair (3-1) or Malau'ulu (1-1) reach to open the game. The Bulldogs were 21-6 when Malau'ulu reached to open the game in 2021.

MIA'S MILESTONE WATCH

- Mia Davidson became the 12th Bulldog to reach 200 career hits, and is eighth in program history with 241. She needs 14 to match Michelle Gates (255; 1997-00) for seventh.
- Davidson now holds school records with 196 career RBIs and 531 career total bases
- Her 191 runs are tied for fourth in school history with Keri McCallum (191, 1997-00), and she needs seven to tie Kellie Wilkerson (198, 2001-04) for third.
- Davidson is fifth in school history with 37 runners caught stealing and holds the program record with 11 runners picked off for 48 total runners erased. Sam Lenahan (2011-14) holds the record for both runners caught stealing (49) and runners erased (54).

ALL HAIL THE QUEEN

- MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro likes to share his nickname "Thunder" with Mia Davidson, who last season broke his record for the most career home runs by an MSU baseball or softball player
- Davidson broke the SEC softball career record on Feb. 18 against Central Arkansas with her 72nd home run. She now has 79.
- Only 16 baseball and softball players in the history of the conference to have hit 60 career home runs, and only 10 have hit 65.
- MSU boasts three of the sluggers (Will Clark and Palmeiro) which is tied for the league lead with Florida (Matt LaPorta, Lauren Haeger and Megan Bush).
- Davidson's 0.346 homers per game is second among the 10 hitters with 65 long balls behind only Palmeiro (0.366).
- Davidson is tied with LSU's Brad Cresse for second in SEC history between the two sports, having done so in 13 fewer games. She only trails LSU's Eddy Furniss (80) who achieved his total in 265 games.
- Only five NCAA softball players have ever hit 90 career home runs. Davidson, who trails only Oklahoma's Jocelyn Alo among active players, would be the sixth to reach the mark.

DAVIDSON'S DOMINANT DAY

- Mia Davidson had a career day on Feb. 25 against Longwood and Relmont
- She tied her career-high and the MSU single-game record with three home runs against Longwood, including a grand slam, and collected a career-high six RBIs against the Lancers while going 4-for-4
- Her six RBIs are tied for the third most in MSU single-game history and the most since Kat Moore had six against Alabama (March 31, 2019).
- The grand slam was the third of her career, which ties the MSU career record. She is one of four Bulldogs with three career grand slame.

THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In six full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019. The 2021 team hit 70 home runs, which ranks second, and gives Ricketts a hand in each of the top four seasons in school history.
- Currently, MSU is averaging 1.50 homers per game. With 55 regular-season games on the schedule, State is on pace for a school-record 82.5-homer season.
- The Bulldogs are 13th nationally and third in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 263 home runs.
- Under Ricketts, State has homered in 54.1 percent of its games (217 of 401) and gone 159-58 in such contests. The Bulldogs have hit at least one home run in every game they've won this season.

NEW LOOK FOR KENLEY

- Kenley Hawk looks like a different pitcher this season, both on the field and on the stat sheet.
- Hawk adopted a facemask over the summer after her play in the Florida Gulf Coast League was cut short by a ball hit to her face.
- She is currently pitching to a 0.65 ERA, which is No. 12 nationally, and has allowed just three earned runs, in 32.1 innings this season.
- Hawk is No. 53 nationally in strikeouts per seven innings (9.7).
- That's a significant improvement from last year when Hawk threw just 8.1 innings and allowed 12 earned runs (10.08 ERA). She struck out nine and walked eight.



ALL HAIL THE QUEEN

Mia Davidson, the SEC softball all-time career home run leader, is one of 10 SEC athletes, playing either baseball or softball, with 60 or more career home runs.

WESLEY WHIPPING IT

- Aspen Wesley boasts a 1.00 WHIP and is among the top 100 in the nation in walks per seven innings (1.09).
- Wesley tossed her first two complete-game shutouts in back-toback starts last week in The Snowman, allowing just four total hits in the tournament.
- She turned in a career-best 15.0 consecutive innings without allowing a run earlier this season.
- She has pitched to a 1.60 ERA in her last 14 outings (48.0 innings), dating back to last year while going 7-2 in that span.

WONDERFUL WILLIS

- Annie Willis threw the 23rd no-hitter in program history and the second of her Bulldog career at Louisiana Tech (4/10).
- She is one of seven Bulldogs with multiple no-hitters in her career and the first to throw multiple 7.0 inning no-hitters.
- The game was her fifth 10-strikeout game as a Bulldog.
- State has thrown at least one no-hitter in every season since 2015, and Willis has thrown each of the last two.

BOOKENDING THINGS

- The Bulldogs play their best ball early and late in the game.
 State's highest batting averages and slugging percentages come in the second and sixth innings.
- MSU hits .367 in the second while slugging .673 and holds a .387 average with a .629 slugging in the sixth.
- The Bulldogs have outscored opponents, 79-20, across the first, second, sixth and seventh innings. Once MSU holds a lead at the end of an inning, the Bulldogs are undefeated.
- Last year, the sixth inning was MSU's best inning, producing its highest batting average (.311) and its lowest ERA (2.24) and opponents' average (.222) of any frame. State outscored opponents, 40-16 in the sixth
- The Bulldogs went 27-2 when leading after four innings and 21-0 when leading after five last year.

NOTHING TOUCHES THE GRASS

- The Bulldog outfielders had arguably one of the best seasons in program history, leading the SEC with 15 outfield assists in 2021.
- MSU's assists ranked third in school history behind the 2002 (18) and 2010 (17) seasons.
- State's outfielders were tied with LSU for second in the conference with 232 total chances (Missouri, 239).

SETTLING NEW TERRITORY

- Samantha Ricketts has expanded the Bulldogs' recruiting reach in recent years.
- Three current student-athletes are the first Bulldog from their state: Riley Hull (Kentucky), Kenley Hawk (Arkansas) and Grace Fagan (New Jersey).
- One of MSU's recent hotbeds has been the state of North Carolina. The first player from the state arrived in Starkville in 2014, and there have been seven total student-athletes from the Tar Heel State. Four of those seven are currently on the roster in Mia Davidson, Montana Davidson, Allison Florian and Phoebe Florian.
- Additionally, Bri Bower is the first Bulldog from Illinois since Alexis Silkwood graduated in 2014, and Addison Purvis is the first from the state of Missouri since Nakita Boyce graduated in 2008.

NEW NAMES TO KNOW

- 2021 NJCAA Player of the Year Shea Moreno has enrolled at MSU after spending last season at Seminole State College in Oklahoma where she led the nation with a .673 batting average, .709 on-base percentage and 1.280 slugging percentage.
- In addition to her Player of the Year honors, Moreno was named a First Team All-American.
- 2021 NFCA National Freshman of the Year Finalist Matalasi
 Faapito has also joined the Bulldogs from New Mexico State.

 Faapito was the only player in the country to both hit 16 or more homers and strike out 60 or more batters in 2021.
- While not a newcomer, Mia Davidson married Sean Smith in December 2021 and now officially goes by Mia Davidson-Smith off the softball field. She will continue to use only Davidson on her jersey and for statistical purposes.

CHLOE CAPTAINS THE OUTFIELD

- Chloe Malau'ulu is the SEC's returning leader in outfield assists [7] and putouts [91] from last spring. Only Tennessee senior Cailin Hannon had more putouts [101] last year.
- Malau'ulu led the conference in outfield assists and total chances in the outfield as she displayed her versatility across all three positions. Only seven SEC outfielders recorded at least 80 chances, and of those, only three return in 2022.
- Of Malau'ulu's seven assists, six were runners thrown out at home plate.
- She was second in fielding percentage (.990) among league outfielders with at least 60 total chances trailing only Missouri's Casidy Chaumont who had an error-free campaign over 76 chances.
- Her assists were tied for second in school history with lyhia McMichael's 2004 mark.

- A permanent graphical fixture on the right field wall at Nusz Park was installed to commemorate Wilcox. The Bulldogs also re-branded the annual February Freezer tournament and now host the The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial tournament in February.

- Became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10game start by a head coach in program history.
- Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).

- In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs.
- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019.
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans in 2019 (Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson).
- Davidson was the lone player in the conference to record at least 60 RBIs, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019.
