ABOUT MIDDLE TENNESSEE: The Blue Raiders' Anyce Harvey leads C-USA and ranks No. 28 nationally with 10 doubles. In the circle, Corrina Dodd is third in the conference in hits per seven innings (5.03), and Claire Woods is second in saves (2). Middle Tennessee opened conference play by winning two of three games against Southern Miss, a team MSU will play in its next midweek contest, but was then swept by Marshall in C-USA play. The Blue Raiders are 3-3 against teams MSU will face later this year and 0-2 against SEC teams.

LEADING OFF

SEC LEADERS: Chloe Malau'ulu is tied for second in the SEC in batting average and fifth in on-base percentage in conference play. Mia Davidson is tied for eighth in on-base percentage and leads the league in hit-by-pitches.

ANOTHER JEWEL IN HER CROWN: Davidson has now hit 82 career homers, which is the most in SEC baseball or softball history and is tied for No. 12 in NCAA softball history.

PURVIS PICKED AS PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Addison Purvis batted .750 (6-for-8) last week across three starts and posted a 1.875 slugging percentage. She drove in seven runs with three doubles and a pair of homers.

DON'T TRY IT: The Bulldogs are tied for eighth in the NCAA and second in the SEC with just 11 stolen bases allowed this season.

STARTING STRONG: State is 7-2 this season when its leadoff batter reaches base to open the game.

FIRST RUNS FIRST: The Bulldogs have outscored opponents, 84-19, in the first two innings. MSU is 20-0 when leading after the second and 19-1 when scoring first this season.

HELPING HER OWN CAUSE: Matalasi Faapito has won four games as a pitcher and has homered in three of those. She also has nine RBIs and seven walks when she pitches.

POWER PITCHERS: Kenley Hawk is currently pitching to a 1.50 ERA, which is fourth in the SEC and No. 40 in the nation. She and Annie Willis both average more than 8.0 strikeouts per game.

KEEPING IT CLEAN: MSU has a .973 fielding percentage over its last 15 games (93 innings, 368 chances) and has allowed just four unearned runs.

TOUGH SLATE: State's strength of schedule is No. 11 in the latest RPI. MSU's opponents have combined for fourth-highest winning percentage (.670) in the nation.

SOFTBALL MEDIA PORTAL

The Softball Press Box Page of HailState.com will include links to media guides, quick facts, game notes, box scores, recaps, pool photography and team and staff headshots.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following each game. Seats will be assigned, and masks covering the nose and mouth may be required, consistent with current university policy. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas equipped with high-speed internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team radio/video personnel.

RADIO BROADCASTS

The Nusz Park press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office. Radio workspace will be contingent on available seating, but MSU will make every effort to accommodate visiting radio broadcasts.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Requested MSU players, along with head coach Samantha Ricketts, will be available for a postgame media session approximately 25 minutes after home games. For road games, phone interviews may be conducted postgame with advance notice. The Mississippi State locker room, indoor facility and field dugouts are closed to the media.

NUSZ PARK

FAST FACTS

- Since 2016, MSU is 143-51 in Nusz Park (.737).
- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season.

CAREER HOME RUNS: Mia Davidson has a chance to become the sixth player in NCAA history to hit 90 or more career home runs. She is the SEC's all-time career leader.

TEAM NOTES

QUICK HITTERS

- State is among the top 30 teams in the nation in doubles (24th), home runs (16th), home runs per game (22nd) and slugging percentage (20th).
- **Mia Davidson** is fourth in the nation in home runs (13) and leads the SEC. Her slugging percentage (.975) is second in the league and seventh nationally.
- The Bulldogs are tied for eighth in the NCAA and second in the SEC with just 11 stolen bases allowed this season.
- MSU has a .973 fielding percentage over its last 15 games (93 innings, 368 chances) and has allowed just four unearned runs.
- The Bulldog pitching staff leads the SEC with 57 looking strikeouts this season, which is tied for No. 27 nationally.
- **Chloe Malau'ulu** leads the team in batting average (.500), slugging percentage (.722) and on-base percentage (.571) in SEC games. Her average is tied for second in the SEC in league games.

PURVIS PICKS UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- **Addison Purvis** batted .750 (6-for-8) last week across three starts and posted a 1.875 slugging percentage. She drove in seven runs with three doubles and a pair of homers.
- Purvis opened her week by turning in her first career multi-homer game, hitting a three-run and a two-run shot at Memphis (3/24) as the Bulldogs tallied a school-record six long balls.
- In the doubleheader sweep of Samford (3/26), Purvis hits either eventually came around to score (2 runs) or drove in (2 runs) all of MSU's runs.

SUCCEEDING IN SEC SERIES

- State has swept three of its last four SEC series dating back to last season with sweeps of Ole Miss, then-No. 17 Tennessee and then-No. 22 Georgia.
- MSU has won four of its last five SEC series, adding in a road series win last spring at South Carolina.
- The Bulldogs are 11-3 in their last five regular-season SEC series dating back to 2021.

TACKLING A TOUGH SCHEDULE

- The Bulldogs' strength of schedule is No. 11 in the latest NCAA RPI rankings. The Bulldogs are No. 27 in the RPI.
- 28 of MSU's 55 regular-season games are against teams that were ranked or receiving votes in the preseason NFCA Coaches' Poll or ESPN/USA Softball Poll, and 20 of those games are road or neutral contests.
- MSU's past and future opponents have combined for a .670 winning percentage, which ranks fourth in the nation.
- Last year, MSU's strength of schedule was No. 8 in the final RPI calculation, and its opponents combined for a .650 winning percentage which was fifth nationally.

SWEEPING IN-STATE RIVALS

- MSU swept Ole Miss for the first time since 2013, which was also in Starkville.
- The Bulldogs outscored the Rebels, 22-11, in the series, and capped the three-game set with a shutout in the finale.
- State has now won four straight against Ole Miss, dating back to the 2021 SEC Tournament.

TWO-OUT TROUBLEMAKERS

- The Bulldogs were exceptional with two outs in the series against Ole Miss (3/18-20), going 14-for-33 (.424) with 12 two-out RBIs.
- State scored 14 of its 22 runs (63.6 percent) in the series with two outs.
- **Chloe Malau'ulu** was a perfect 4-for-4 with two outs, while **Brylie St. Clair** was 3-for-5 with three RBIs.
- State is batting .351 (20-for-57) with two outs in SEC play.

STARTING FROM THE TOP

- MSU has begun using a new leadoff hitter in **Riley Hull** who has reached base in 9-of-30 leadoff opportunities (30.0 percent).
- **Chloe Malau'ulu** (15-of-32) has reached base safely in 46.9 percent of the innings she's led off, and **Brylie St. Clair** has reached safely in 50.0 percent (11-of-22). Last year, Malau'ulu reached on 43.0 percent of her opportunities.
- State is 7-2 this season when St. Clair (3-1), Malau'ulu (1-1) or Hull (3-0) reach to open the game. The Bulldogs were 21-6 when Malau'ulu reached to open the game in 2021.

THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In six full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019. The 2021 team hit 70 home runs, which ranks second, and gives Ricketts a hand in each of the top four seasons in school history.
- Currently, MSU is averaging 1.34 homers per game. With 55 regular-season games on the schedule, State is on pace for a school-record 74-homer season and its third 70-homer season on record, all under Ricketts.
- The Bulldogs are 14th nationally and fourth in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 273 home runs.
- Under Ricketts, State has homered in 53.3 percent of its games (219 of 411) and gone 161-58 in such contests.

TROTTING IN MEMPHIS

- MSU hit a school-record six home runs at Memphis (3/23), and every run in the 13-3 win was scored on a home run.
- The previous record of five home runs was also set against Memphis on April 10, 2019.
- **Mia Davidson** and **Addison Purvis** hit two each, and **Matalasi Faapito** and **Paige Cook** both hit one.
- Davidson has hit four homers in those two record-setting games.

IN A PINCH

- The Bulldogs are 9-for-31 (.290) when pinch hitting this season and **Samantha Ricketts'** pinch hitters are batting at a .292 clip (26-for-89) in her career.

SCORING EARLY

- The Bulldogs play their best ball early in the game. State's highest batting average (.378) and slugging percentage (.628) come in the second inning.
- The Bulldogs have outscored opponents, 84-19, in the first two innings. MSU is 20-0 when leading after the second.
- MSU is 19-1 when scoring first this season, and 3-9 when the opponent scores first.

BRYLIE'S BREAKOUT

- **Brylie St. Clair** batted .700 in the series against Ole Miss (3/18-20). She scored four times and drove in four runs.
- Her bunt single in her first at-bat of the series broke an 0-for-12 slump over her previous eight games.
- St. Clair drove in the game-winning runs in the second and third games of the series.
- Defensively, she threw out a runner at third and made a catch at the wall for one of her seven put outs.

MIA'S MILESTONE WATCH

- **Mia Davidson** became the 12th Bulldog to reach 200 career hits, and is eighth in program history with 249. She needs six to match Michelle Gates (255; 1997-00) for seventh.
- Davidson now holds school records with 204 career RBIs and 549 career total bases.
- Her 199 runs are third in school history, and she needs 19 to tie lyhia McMichael (218, 2001-04) for second.
- Davidson is fifth in school history with 38 runners caught stealing and holds the program record with 11 runners picked off for 49 total runners erased. Sam Lenahan (2011-14) holds the record for both runners caught stealing (49) and runners erased (54).



TEAM NOTES

ALL HAIL THE QUEEN

- MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro likes to share his nickname "Thunder" with **Mia Davidson**, who last season broke his record for the most career home runs by an MSU baseball or softball player
- Davidson broke the SEC softball career record on Feb. 18 against Central Arkansas with her 72nd home run. She now has 82, and is tied for No. 12 in NCAA softball history.
- Davidson surpassed LSU's Eddy Furniss (80) for the most home runs in SEC history in baseball and softball in 26 fewer games.
- Only five NCAA softball players have ever hit 90 career home runs. Davidson, who trails only Oklahoma's Jocelyn Alo among active players, would be the sixth to reach the mark.
- Davidson's career homers per game rate (0.345) is just a tick better than the NCAA softball career record holder, Stacey Nueman (UCLA), who homered at a 0.341 rate. Meanwhile, Alo is on a 0.440 homers per game pace for her career.

DAVIDSON'S DOMINANT DAY

- Mia Davidson** had a career day on Feb. 25 against Longwood, tying her career-high and the MSU single-game record with three home runs, including a grand slam, and collecting a career-high six RBIs while going 4-for-4.
- Davidson's three homers in a game are tied for the most in a game this season.
- Her six RBIs are tied for the third most in MSU single-game history and the most since Kat Moore had six against Alabama (March 31, 2019).
- The grand slam was the third of her career, which ties the MSU career record. She is one of four Bulldogs with three career grand slams.

CHLOE'S CANNON

- Chloe Malau'ulu** is the SEC's returning leader in outfield assists (7) and putouts (91) from last spring. Only Tennessee senior Cailin Hannon had more putouts (101) last year.
- Of Malau'ulu's seven assists, six were runners thrown out at home plate, and her assists were tied for second in school history with Iyhia McMichael's 2004 mark.
- She has two outfield assists in 2022, giving her 10 for her career.

- She's especially known for getting creative with the flex and offensive player positions to increase the number of players that get in the game.
- This season, Ricketts is averaging using 14.4 players per game, the highest rate of her head coaching career.
- The Bulldogs carry 23 players on their roster with five who only pitch and 18 hitters.

HELPING HER CAUSE

- Matalasi Faapito** helps her own cause when she's in the circle. The hitting pitcher has won four games and has homered in three of those.
- Faapito is 6-for-23 (.261) in games when she pitches with seven walks, three homers and nine RBIs.
- MSU is 9-1 in Faapito's nine pitching appearances, and she boasts a 4-0 record.

NEW LOOK FOR KENLEY

- Kenley Hawk** looks like a different pitcher this season, both on the field and on the stat sheet.
- Hawk adopted a facemask over the summer after her play in the Florida Gulf Coast League was cut short by a ball hit to her face.
- She is currently pitching to a 1.50 ERA, which is fourth in the SEC and No. 40 in the nation.
- That's a significant improvement from last year when Hawk threw just 8.1 innings and allowed 12 earned runs (10.08 ERA). She struck out nine and walked eight.

FOILING FLORIDA

- Annie Willis** led the Bulldogs to their first victory over an NFCA top-five team since 2019 with a shutout at No. 4 Florida (Mar. 13).
- The Gators entered the weekend ranked second nationally in scoring (7.56 runs per game) and leading the nation in hits.
- The Bulldogs last top-five win came on March 31, 2019, in an extra-innings victory at No. 4 Alabama.
- The win was State's fifth shutout victory over the Gators and the first since a 3-0 victory in Gainesville on April 24, 2005.

WONDERFUL WILLIS

- Annie Willis** was named the SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week (3/15) after shutting out then-No. 4 Florida (3/13).
- Willis was the first Bulldog pitcher to shut out a top-five team since April 18, 2014, at No. 4 Tennessee when Alexis Silkwood struck out 11 in a complete game.
- She is one of seven Bulldogs with multiple no-hitters in her career and the first to throw multiple 7.0 inning no-hitters.
- State has thrown at least one no-hitter in every season since 2015, and Willis has thrown each of the last two.

- Samantha Ricketts** has expanded the Bulldogs' recruiting reach in recent years.
- Three current student-athletes are the first Bulldog from their state: **Riley Hull** (Kentucky), **Kenley Hawk** (Arkansas) and **Grace Fagan** (New Jersey).
- One of MSU's recent hotbeds has been the state of North Carolina. The first player from the state arrived in Starkville in 2014, and there have been seven total student-athletes from the Tar Heel State. Four of those seven are currently on the roster in **Mia Davidson**, **Montana Davidson**, **Allison Florian** and **Phoebe Florian**.
- Additionally, **Bri Bower** is the first Bulldog from Illinois since Alexis Silkwood graduated in 2014, and **Addison Purvis** is the first from the state of Missouri since Nakita Boyce graduated in 2008.

#NOONEFIGHTSALONE

- Honoring the legendary spirit of the late Alex Wilcox, Mississippi State will continue its "No One Fights Alone" campaign throughout the 2021 softball season.
- The Bulldogs will continue to wear teal uniforms throughout the season to raise awareness for ovarian cancer in honor of the former softball student-athlete who passed away in 2018 at the age of 18 after a courageous fight with the disease.
- MSU immortalized Wilcox last fall by retiring her No. 8 jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the first female student-athlete in Mississippi State history to have her jersey retired.
- A permanent graphical fixture on the right field wall at Nusz Park was installed to commemorate Wilcox. The Bulldogs also re-branded the annual February Freezer tournament and now host the The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial tournament in February.

MAROON AND WHITE

- Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019
- Became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10-game start by a head coach in program history.
- Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- In her second season, led MSU to its 16th NCAA Regional and third consecutive Regional Championship game.
- Has coached at least three players to All-Region honors in each of the last three seasons.
- Served as an assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach.
- Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, seven NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career.
- In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs.
- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019.
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans in 2019 (Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson).
- Davidson was the lone player in the conference to record at least 60 RBIs, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019.
- Davidson then broke Rafael Palmeiro's mark for the most home runs in a career by a Bulldog baseball or softball player in 2021 and entered the 2022 season just two long balls shy of the SEC softball career record.
- Four of the top five single-season home run totals in program history have come under Ricketts' watch, and the Bulldogs have broken the season record four times.
- MSU has hit at least one home run in 52.8 percent of its games (197-of-373) entering 2022 since Ricketts arrived as an assistant.
- In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional and Caroline Seitz became the first Bulldog to earn First Team All-SEC honors since Chelsea Bramlett in 2010.
- During the 2016 season, she led Kayla Winkfield to an SEC-leading six triples, which ranked among the nation's top 10.
- In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416).

WICHITA STATE UNIVERSITY

- Served as assistant coach at Wichita State from 2012-14, working with the team's hitters and consistently improving their production
- Her last spring at WSU saw the Shockers increase their overall win total by 15 from 2013 to 2014 and win the program's first regular-season conference title
- Part of the 2014 MVC Coaching Staff of the Year, helping to improve the Shockers from the ninth place in 2012, to eighth place in 2013, to MVC champs in 2014
