ABOUT SOUTHERN MISS: The Golden Eagles are coming off a monumental comeback at UTSA over the weekend. USM took an eight-run deficit and turned it into a seven-run victory in eight innings by a score of 20-13. Destini Brown has broken the USM career steals record with more than 100 bags swiped, and Tata Davis has broken the career hits record. The Golden Eagles are 2-1 against SEC teams this year, defeating then-No. 4 Florida and MSU earlier this season in Hattiesburg. Two of the last three meetings with State have been one-run games.

LEADING OFF

OUR STATE: The Bulldogs are 20-4 against teams from the state of Mississippi under **Samantha Ricketts**. MSU has outscored in-state foes, 173-57, in her tenure.

SEND THEM PACKING: With **Annie Willis** (9.11) and **Kenley Hawk** (7.91) both averaging nearly 8.0 strikeouts per 7 innings (min. 50 IP), the Bulldogs have a chance for the third season in program history with multiple pitchers posting a K/7 above 8.0 in the same year.

GLOVEWORK: State has turned six double plays in its last eight games and is now third in the SEC with eight in league play.

QUICK STARTS: The Bulldogs have outscored opponents, 105-36, in the first two innings. MSU is 23-2 when leading after the second.

PERSISTENT PAIGE: **Paige Cook** is the third-toughest strikeout in the SEC, averaging one punchout every 13.8 at-bats. She is also State's best two-out hitter with a .442 average and 18 RBIs.

MULTIPLES FOR MIA: **Mia Davidson** holds the school record with 54 career multi-RBI games, and her 66 career multi-hit games are fifth in MSU history.

ALL HAIL THE QUEEN: Davidson's 87 career homers are the most in SEC baseball or softball history and tied for sixth in NCAA softball history.

HONOR ROLL: Davidson is a Top 25 Finalist for the USA Softball Player of the Year award and MSU's nominee for the SEC's H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete of the Year Post-Graduate Scholarship.

PINCH HIT PURVIS: **Addison Purvis** is MSU's most-common pinch hitter and has reached in 12 of her 24 plate appearances with a .353 average and five walks.

LINEUP LOG: Ricketts has used 34 different batting orders and 22 different defensive alignments to start the game. She is averaging using 14.2 players per game this season.

SOFTBALL MEDIA PORTAL

Mississippi State has created an online portal for media members covering the Bulldogs' softball program. To access the portal, visit hailst.at/SBMedia. To request login information, contact Brian Ogden.

The Softball Press Box Page of HailState.com will include links to media guides, quick facts, game notes, box scores, recaps, pool photography and team and staff headshots.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following each game. Seats will be assigned, and masks covering the nose and mouth may be required, consistent with current university policy. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas equipped with high-speed internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team radio/video personnel.

RADIO BROADCASTS

The Nusz Park press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office. Radio workspace will be contingent on available seating, but MSU will make every effort to accommodate visiting radio broadcasts.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Requested MSU players, along with head coach Samantha Ricketts, will be available for a postgame media session approximately 25 minutes after home games. For road games, phone interviews may be conducted postgame with advance notice. The Mississippi State locker room, indoor facility and field dugouts are closed to the media.

NUSZ PARK

FAST FACTS

- Since 2016, MSU is 147-54 in Nusz Park (.731).
- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season.

CAREER HOME RUNS: Mia Davidson has entered the top 10 in NCAA softball history with 87 career home runs, which is tied for sixth. She is the SEC's all-time career leader.

TEAM NOTES

QUICK HITTERS

- State is among the top 50 teams in the nation in home runs per game (27th), on-base percentage (48th) and slugging percentage (31st).
- Mia Davidson** is seventh in the nation in home runs (18), ninth in slugging percentage (.926) and No. 10 in total bases (113).
- The Bulldogs have allowed just 23 stolen bases this season, which is tied for 29th nationally.
- MSU's pitchers have struck out 78 batters looking, which leads the SEC.
- State has turned eight double plays in SEC play, which is third in the conference. The Bulldogs have six double plays in their last eight games.
- Paige Cook** is the third-toughest strikeout in the SEC, averaging one punchout every 13.8 at-bats.
- Chloe Malau'ulu** is tied for fourth in the SEC with six doubles in SEC play. Her batting average (.377) leads the team and both her slugging percentage (.585) and on-base percentage (.476) are second only to Davidson.

SUCCEEDING IN SEC SERIES

- State has won five of its last nine SEC series, dating back to 2021. MSU swept Ole Miss, then-No. 17 Tennessee and then-No. 22 Georgia.
- The Bulldogs are 13-11 in their last eight regular-season SEC series dating back to 2021.
- A 13-11 record would be MSU's best mark in conference play since the league moved to an eight-series league schedule in 2013.

TACKLING A TOUGH SCHEDULE

- The Bulldogs' strength of schedule is No. 3 in the latest NCAA RPI rankings. The Bulldogs are No. 29 in the RPI.
- 28 of MSU's 55 regular-season games are against teams that were ranked or receiving votes in the preseason NFCA Coaches' Poll or ESPN/USA Softball Poll.
- MSU has played 10 games against NFCA top-five teams this season, which is second-most in a season in school history behind 2016 (16).
- MSU's past and future opponents have combined for a .651 winning percentage, which ranks third in the nation.
- Last year, MSU's strength of schedule was No. 8 in the final RPI calculation, and its opponents combined for a .650 winning percentage which was fifth nationally.

TWO-OUT TROUBLEMAKERS

- State is hitting .321 with two outs in conference play, which is second in the SEC and is 62 points higher than its overall average (.259).
- 30 of MSU's 63 RBIs in SEC games have come with two outs.
- Paige Cook** is the best two-out hitter on the team with a team-leading 18 two-out RBIs and a .442 average (min. 20 ABs).
- In SEC play, however, it's been **Chloe Malau'ulu's** .500 (9-for-18) average and **Madisyn Kennedy's** six RBIs that lead the team.
- The Bulldogs were exceptional with two outs in the series against Ole Miss (3/18-20), going 14-for-33 (.424) with 12 two-out RBIs.
- State scored 14 of its 22 runs (63.6 percent) in the series with two outs.

SCORING EARLY

- The Bulldogs play their best ball early in the game. State's highest batting average (.347) and slugging percentage (.577) come in the second inning.
- The Bulldogs have outscored opponents, 105-36, in the first two innings. MSU is 23-2 when leading after the second.
- MSU is 24-4 when scoring first this season, and 5-15 when the opponent scores first.

SECOND GAME STATS

- MSU is 4-2 in Game 2s in SEC series. State's ERA plummets in the second matchup from 5.07 in Games 1 and 3 to 2.54.
- State has outscored opponents 26-18 in Game 2 but has been outscored 65-41 in series openers and finales.

THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In six full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019. The 2021 team hit 70 home runs, which ranks second, and gives Ricketts a hand in each of the top four seasons in school history.
- Currently, MSU is averaging 1.31 homers per game and its 63 homers are already third in school history. State is on pace for a school-record 72 home runs in the regular season alone, which would be its third 70-homer season on record, all under Ricketts.
- The Bulldogs are 15th nationally and tied for fourth in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 293 home runs.
- Under Ricketts, State has homered in 53.9 percent of its games (230 of 427) and gone 168-62 in such contests.

- MSU hit a school-record six home runs at Memphis (3/23), and every run in the 13-3 win was scored on a home run.
- The Bulldogs then tied that record with six homers in a 19-14 slugfest at Middle Tennessee (3/30) a week later.
- The previous record of five home runs was also set against Memphis on April 10, 2019.
- Mia Davidson** and **Addison Purvis** hit two each, and **Matalasi Faapito** and **Paige Cook** both hit one at Memphis.
- Cook homered twice at Middle Tennessee along with homers from Davidson, **Madisyn Kennedy**, **Chloe Malau'ulu** and **Jackie McKenna**.

ALL HAIL THE QUEEN

Mia Davidson, is the SEC all-time career home run leader in both softball and baseball. She also holds MSU softball's single-season record (26, 2019) and freshman record (19, 2018). Davidson is tied for 12th in NCAA softball history.

MIA'S MILESTONE WATCH

- Mia Davidson** has 266 career hits, which is sixth in program history. She needs 15 to tie Courtney Bures (281, 2005-08) for fifth.
- Davidson now holds school records with 210 career RBIs and 583 career total bases. Her 209 runs are third in school history, and she needs nine to tie Ilyhia McMichael (218, 2001-04) for second.
- She has started all 254 games she has played, which is fourth in MSU history and one shy of Hayle Guess (2004-08) for third. The school record is 260 by Kellie Wilkerson (1999-02).
- Davidson is third in school history with 41 runners caught stealing and holds the MSU record with 12 runners picked off for 53 total runners erased. Sam Lenahan (2011-14) holds the record for both runners caught stealing (49) and runners erased (54).

ALL HAIL THE QUEEN

- MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro likes to share his nickname "Thunder" with **Mia Davidson**, who last season broke his record for the most career home runs by an MSU baseball or softball player.
- Davidson broke the SEC softball career record on Feb. 18 against Central Arkansas with her 72nd home run. She now has 87, and is sixth in NCAA softball history.
- Davidson surpassed LSU's Eddy Furniss (80) for the most home runs in SEC history in baseball and softball in 26 fewer games.
- Only five NCAA softball players have ever hit 90 career home runs. Davidson, who trails only Oklahoma's Jocelyn Alo among active players, would be the sixth to reach the mark.
- Davidson's career homers per game rate (0.343) is just a tick better than the NCAA softball career record holder, Stacey Nuvevan (UCLA), who homered at a 0.341 rate. Meanwhile, Alo is on a 0.444 homers per game pace for her career.



TEAM NOTES

MORE ON MIA

- **Mia Davidson** saw her career-long 26-game reached base streak end on Apr. 23 against No. 18 Auburn, which is the 10th-longest streak in MSU history.
- Davidson holds the school record with 54 career multi-RBI games, and her 66 career multi-hit games are fifth in MSU history.
- She is two career hit-by-pitches shy of tying the school record (52) set by Brittany Bell (2008-12).

DAVIDSON'S DOMINANT DAY

- **Mia Davidson** had a career day on Feb. 25 against Longwood, tying her career-high and the MSU single-game record with three home runs, including a grand slam, and collecting a career-high six RBIs while going 4-for-4.
- Davidson's three homers in a game are tied for the most in a game this season.
- Her six RBIs are a career high and tied for the fourth-most in MSU single-game history.
- The grand slam was the third of her career, which ties the MSU career record. She is one of four Bulldogs with three career grand slams.

COOKING UP A RECORD

- **Paige Cook** had a career day at the plate, collecting a career-high four hits and seven RBIs, at Middle Tennessee (3/30).
- Her seven RBIs are tied for the sixth-most in a game the NCAA this season and tied school record previously held by Hayle Guess (vs. Pacific; May 18, 2007) and Iyhia McMichael (vs. Samford; Feb. 16, 2003).
- Cook hit a three-run homer in her first trip and a two-run single in her second before adding a two-run homer in her third at-bat.
- She was also hit by a pitch to reach in all five trips to the plate.

PURVIS PICKS UP PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- **Addison Purvis** was named SEC Co-Player of the Week (3/29) after batting .750 (6-for-8) with a 1.875 slugging percentage. She drove in seven runs with three doubles and a pair of homers.
- Purvis opened her week by turning in her first career multi-homer game, hitting a three-run and a two-run shot at Memphis (3/24) as the Bulldogs tallied a school-record six long balls.
- In the doubleheader sweep of Samford (3/26), Purvis' hits either eventually came around to score (2 runs) or drove in (2 runs) all of MSU's runs.

CHLOE'S CANNON

- **Chloe Malau'ulu** is the SEC's returning leader in outfield assists (7) and putouts (91) from last spring. Only Tennessee senior Cailin Hannon had more putouts (101) last year.
- Of Malau'ulu's seven assists, six were runners thrown out at home plate, and her assists were tied for second in school history with Iyhia McMichael's 2004 mark.
- She has three outfield assists in 2022, giving her 11 for her career.

NEW LOOK FOR KENLEY

- **Kenley Hawk** looks like a different pitcher this season, both on the field and on the stat sheet.
- Hawk adopted a facemask over the summer after her play in the Florida Gulf Coast League was cut short by a ball hit to her face.
- She is currently pitching to a team-leading 2.64 ERA, which is a significant improvement from last year when Hawk threw just 8.1 innings and allowed 12 earned runs (10.08 ERA). She struck out nine and walked eight.

SENDING THEM PACKING

- With **Annie Willis** (9.11) and **Kenley Hawk** (7.91) both averaging nearly 8.0 strikeouts per 7 innings (min. 50 IP), the Bulldogs have a chance for the third season in program history with multiple pitchers posting a K/7 above 8.0 in the same year.
- As a team, MSU's 7.41 K/7 is currently fifth in school history.

FOILING FLORIDA

- **Annie Willis** led the Bulldogs to their first victory over an NFCA top-five team since 2019 with a shutout at No. 4 Florida (Mar. 13).
- The Gators entered the weekend ranked second nationally in scoring (7.56 runs per game) and leading the nation in hits.
- The Bulldogs last top-five win came on March 31, 2019, in an extra-innings victory at No. 4 Alabama.
- The win was State's fifth shutout victory over the Gators and the first since a 3-0 victory in Gainesville on April 24, 2005.

WONDERFUL WILLIS

- **Annie Willis** was named the SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week (3/15) after shutting out then-No. 4 Florida (3/13).
- Willis was the first Bulldog pitcher to shut out a top-five team since April 18, 2014, at No. 4 Tennessee when Alexis Silkwood struck out 11 in a complete game.
- She is one of seven Bulldogs with multiple no-hitters in her career and the first to throw multiple 7.0 inning no-hitters.
- State has thrown at least one no-hitter in every season since 2015, and Willis has thrown each of the last two.

- The Bulldogs are now 20-4 against teams from the state of Mississippi under **Samantha Ricketts**.
- MSU swept Ole Miss for the first time since 2013, which was also in Starkville.
- The Bulldogs outscored the Rebels, 22-11, in the series, and capped the three-game set with a shutout in the finale.
- State has now won four straight against Ole Miss, dating back to the 2021 SEC Tournament.

OFF THE BENCH

- **Samantha Ricketts** utilizes nearly every player on her bench in a game either as pinch runners, pinch hitters or defensive replacements.
- She's especially known for getting creative with the flex and offensive player positions to increase the number of players that get in the game.
- This season, Ricketts is averaging using 14.2 players per game, the highest rate of her head coaching career.
- She played a season-high 18 student-athletes at Middle Tennessee (3/30).
- The Bulldogs carry 23 players on their roster with five who only pitch and 18 hitters.

SETTLING NEW TERRITORY

- **Samantha Ricketts** has expanded the Bulldogs' recruiting reach in recent years.
- Three current student-athletes are the first Bulldog from their state: **Riley Hull** (Kentucky), **Kenley Hawk** (Arkansas) and **Grace Fagan** (New Jersey).
- One of MSU's recent hotbeds has been the state of North Carolina. The first player from the state arrived in Starkville in 2014, and there have been seven total student-athletes from the Tar Heel State. Four of those seven are currently on the roster in **Mia Davidson**, **Montana Davidson**, **Allison Florian** and **Phoebe Florian**.
- Additionally, **Bri Bower** is the first Bulldog from Illinois since Alexis Silkwood graduated in 2014, and **Addison Purvis** is the first from the state of Missouri since Nakita Boyce graduated in 2008.

NEW NAMES TO KNOW

- 2021 NJCAA Player of the Year **Shea Moreno** has enrolled at MSU after spending last season at Seminole State College in Oklahoma where she led the nation with a .673 batting average, .709 on-base percentage and 1.280 slugging percentage.
- In addition to her Player of the Year honors, Moreno was named a First Team All-American.
- 2021 NFCA National Freshman of the Year Finalist **Matalasi Faapito** has also joined the Bulldogs from New Mexico State. Faapito was the only player in the country to both hit 16 or more homers and strike out 60 or more batters in 2021.
- While not a newcomer, **Mia Davidson** married Sean Smith in December 2021 and now officially goes by Mia Davidson-Smith off the softball field. She will continue to use only Davidson on her jersey and for statistical purposes.

- Became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10-game start by a head coach in program history.
- Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- In her second season, led MSU to its 16th NCAA Regional and third consecutive Regional Championship game.
- Has coached at least three players to All-Region honors in each of the last three seasons.
- Served as an assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach.
- Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, seven NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career.
- In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs.
- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019.
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans in 2019 (Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson).
- Davidson was the lone player in the conference to record at least 60 RBIs, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019.
- Davidson then broke Rafael Palmeiro's mark for the most home runs in a career by a Bulldog baseball or softball player in 2021 and entered the 2022 season just two long balls shy of the SEC softball career record.
- Four of the top five single-season home run totals in program history have come under Ricketts' watch, and the Bulldogs have broken the season record four times.
- MSU has hit at least one home run in 52.8 percent of its games (197-of-373) entering 2022 since Ricketts arrived as an assistant.
- In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional and Caroline Seitz became the first Bulldog to earn First Team All-SEC honors since Chelsea Bramlett in 2010.
- During the 2016 season, she led Kayla Winkfield to an SEC-leading six triples, which ranked among the nation's top 10.
- In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416).

- Led Cacy Williams to an NFCA All-Midwest Region First Team selection in 2014 as well as MVC Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year, becoming the first student-athlete in MVC history to receive both in the same year
- Williams broke the Wichita State single-season records for batting average (.424), slugging percentage (.812), on-base percentage (.531), total bases (138), runs scored (57), home runs (16) and RBIs (47).
