#### TOUCH 'EM ALL - THE TOP STORYLINES THIS WEEK

- > Michigan returned to the NFCA national poll this week, appearing at No. 25 after its 4-1 start to the 2023 season.
- > Bonnie Tholl is also 4-1 in her head coaching career and earned her first win with a 10-0, five-inning decision over Colgate in U-M's THE Spring Games opener. Tholl contributed to 1,366 wins as Carol Hutchins' top assistant over the last 29
- > Lexie Blair, who leads the Wolverines with a .471 batting average after the first weekend, is one double shy of Michigan's career record (61) in the category. Blair, the 2021 Big Ten Player of the Year, also ranks fifth in program history with her current .377 batting average.
- > Ellie Mataya, who transferred to U-M from Boston College, boasts a .438 average and moved to the leadoff spot, swapping with Blair at No. 2, over the last three games. Mataya and Blair combined for 15 hits, 10 runs and 11 RBI over the opening weekend.
- > Jessica LeBeau and Lauren Derkowski own ERAs of 0.00 and 0.89 after the first weekend with 19 strikeouts over 15.2 innings pitched apiece. LeBeau, a transfer from Kent State, earned her first collegiate collegiate no-hitter in last weekend's finale vs. Portland, striking nine while allowing an unearned run on an error and three walks through six innings.



Tholl, who was a part of 1,366 wins during her 29 years as Carol Hutchins' top assistant coach, was named the fourth head coach in program history on Aug. 24, 2022, after Hutchin's retirement. Over her time on the coaching staff, Michigan has captured 22 Big Ten regular-season and 10 tournament titles, earned 27 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, 12 Women's College World Series appearances and captured the 2005 NCAA championship.
- Graduate student outfielder Lexie Blair led the Wolverines with a .471 average (8-for-17) over the opening weekend, including three extra-base hits with two doubles and a triple, and posted five runs and six RBI. She posted three hits and three runs against Colgate, drove in the game-tying run in the sixth inning of the second game vs. WKU and posted two hits and two RBI in U-M's sixth-inning surge against Portland State.
- Blair added two doubles -- and a triple -- over the first weekend to up her career doubles tally to 60 and move to second among U-M's all-time leaders in the category. She is just one away from the program doubles record (61), currently held by Catherine Davie (1996-99) and Alessandra Giampaolo (2005-08). Blair's current .377 career batting average also ranks fifth in program history. Volunteer coach Faith Canfield (2016-19) ranks fourth with a .379 average, while Sierra Romero (2013-16) holds the Michigan school record at .441.
- · Graduate student outfielder Ellie Mataya made a big splash in her first Michigan action, batting .438 (7-for-16) with two extra-base hits, five runs and five RBI from the top of the lineup. Mataya, previously a two-time All-ACC performer at Boston College, went 3-for-4 with a double and a triple in the first WKU game and later drove across the go-ahead run in the sixth inning against Portland State.
- Junior RHP Jessica LeBeau went 2-0 at THE Spring Games Opening Weekend with a 0.00 ERA, 19 strikeouts and a .080 opposing average. She tossed her first collegiate no-hitter -- with nine strikeouts -- in a 9-1, six-inning win over Portland State and allowed just one hit through four innings against Colgate.
- · Sophomore RHP Lauren Derkowski earned Michigan's other two wins over the opening weekend, going 2-1 with a 0.89 ERA, 19 strikeouts and a .175 opposing average. She posted a career-high nine strikeouts in both of her complete-game performances and earned the final four outs and the win in relief in the second game against WKU.
- Five Wolverine freshmen made their collegiate debuts over the first weekend of action. Maddie Erickson started four of five U-M games at first base and posted three hits, including an RBI single against Colgate. Indiana Langford, who earned starts at second base and field, and Madi Ramey also posted their first collegiate hit, while Avery Fantucci scored her first run. Janelle Ilacqua appeared in four games as a pinch runner.

#### WHAT TO WATCH FOR (PRESEASON)

• Bonnie Tholl was named the fourth head coach in Michigan program history on Aug. 24, 2022, after the retirement of Carol Hutchins, the winningest coach in NCAA softball history. Tholl spent 29 seasons as Hutchins' top assistant coach and contributed to nearly all of the program's postseason success, in-

cluding 22 Big Ten regular-season titles since 1995, 10 Big Ten Tournament crowns, 27 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, 12 NCAA Women's College World Series appearances and the 2005 NCAA championship.

- U-M returned 12 letterwinners from its 2022 squad that posted a 38-18 record and advanced to the program's 27th straight NCAA Tournaments. Among their notable returnees are outfielder Lexie Blair, the 2021 Big Ten Player of the Year, and fellow All-Big Ten honorees Audrey LeClair and Melina Livingston.
- Michigan welcomed three transfers last summer in outfielder Ellie Mataya and pitchers Hannah George and Jessica LeBeau. Mataya was a two-time All-ACC honoree at Boston College and batted .373 in 2021 -the eighth best single-season average in BC program history. LeBeau twice earned All-MAC selection for Kent State and was named to the NFCA All-Mideast Region in 2022 after ranking among the conference's leaders in nearly every pitching category, including ERA (2.62) and strikeouts per game (9.05). George posted a 35-23 record at North Carolina with a 3.90 ERA and 231 strikeouts and tossed her first collegiate no-hitter last season.
- · U-M also welcomed a talented six-member freshman class that that includes four nationally-ranked prospects. Lilly Vallimont, the highest rated of the group at No. 5 overall, will miss the 2023 season due to injury, while the others -- Maddie Erickson, Avery Fantucci, Janelle Ilacqua, Indiana Langford and Madi Ramey -- are all likely to see playing time this season.
- Michigan brings back three of its top five hitters in 2022, most notably Blair, who ranked second with a .338 average, 22 runs scored and 24 RBI. Blair, a threetime All-Big Ten first team honoree, was injured for part of the conference slate last year and moved from the outfield to first base. She owns a .375 career average with a .563 slugging percentage and .430 on-base percentage. She'll return to the outfield this
- · LeClair posted a breakout season in 2022, ranking fourth on the team with a .323 average -- a 156-point improvement over her average the previous season (.167) -- and boasted career highs in every offensive category, including 28 runs, 40 hits and 14 RBI. Primarily a pinch runner over her first two seasons, LeClair started 43 games in the outfield last season but will move to third base in 2023.
- Michigan graduated a pair of All-America pitchers in Meghan Beaubien and Alex Storako, who combined for nearly 80 percent (302.1/380) of U-M's innings pitched last season. Lauren Derkowski is the

Wolverines' top returner after posting a 3-3 record with a 2.19 ERA and 43 strikeouts over 44.2 innings last season.

- Michigan posted a 5-0 record in fall ball, outscoring its opposition, 45-10, with wins over Toledo, Central Michigan, Bowling Green and Detroit Mercy. U-M earned a pair of shutout wins and, in its tightest game of the fall, overcame a four-run deficit to beat CMU, 8-5, in the second game of a Saturday doubleheader.
- Graduate student Melina Livingston and senior Lexi Voss will serve as Michigan's co-captains in 2022-23. Both are first-year team captains for the Wolverines.
- The Wolverines' 2023 schedule features 17 opponents who reached the NCAA Tournament a season ago, notably Oklahoma State, Northwestern and UCLA, which all advanced to the 2022 Women's College World Series, and five of U-M's first nine opponents over the next two weekends, including USF in Thursday's opener.

#### THE MICHIGAN DIFFERENCE

- The Wolverines surpassed 50 wins 13 times since 1995. Michigan's program single-season wins record is 65, set by the 2005 NCAA championship team. The Wolverines compiled 24 consecutive 40-win seasons before the 2021 conference-only schedule snapped the streak (38-8).
- U-M won nine consecutive B1G Championships (2008-16) and 22 of the last 30 since 1992. No other team has a stretch of more than two in a row (Northwestern, 1984-85).
- · Michigan's 12 WCWS appearances (1995-98, 2001-02, 2004-05, 2009, 2013, 2015-16) ranks as the sixth

most in NCAA history.

· Michigan has appeared in 11 of the 17 NCAA Super Regionals held since the format was introduced in 2005. The Wolverines are six-time Super Regional hosts, winning five of those home series.

#### THE MICHIGAN SOFTBALL ACADEMY

- The 14th Michigan Softball Academy is slated for Thursday, April 27, 2023.
- Since 2007, the Michigan softball program has raised more than \$1,567,500 for Making Strides (seven walks, 13 academies).
- The 2022 Academy raised a record \$184,500. The previous record was \$163,661, raised in 2018 as the academy "Marched past a Million."
- The Academy is a one-night softball fantasy camp for men and women over the age of 21. Participants run through softball drills and scrimmages led by the Michigan coaches and players on Alumni Field.




