► Two-time defending national champion and top-ranked Oklahoma is back on the road this weekend, March 10-12, in Starkville, Miss., for four games at the Bulldog Invitational hosted by Mississippi State.

► Oklahoma meets Southeastern Louisiana (12:30 p.m. CT) and MSU (6 p.m.) on Friday before a nationally-televised rematch with the Bulldogs Saturday at 3 p.m. and a Sunday finale vs. Omaha at 10:30 a.m.

► Friday and Sunday's neutral site games vs. SELU and Omaha can be seen via an "In the Booth" camera on SoonerSports.tv while Friday's 6 p.m. matchup vs. MSU will stream on SEC Network+ and Saturday's game vs. the Bulldogs will be televised on SEC Network with Tiffany Greene and Madison Shipman on the call. All games can be heard on the radio via 107.7 The Franchise or The Franchise 2 (103.3 FM, 1560 AM) in Oklahoma and nationwide on The Varsity app with OU play-by-play announcer Chris Plank calling the action.

LAST TIME OUT

► The Sooners swept through home-opening weekend at Marita Hynes Field, celebrating the start of the 25th season of Sooner softball in the venue. OU beat No. 17/16 Kentucky and UIC twice, with a run-rule win over each squad. Friday saw OU beat UIC 5-0 before a 18-0, five-inning win over UK. Saturday, the Sooners beat the Wildcats 7-1 prior to a 9-0 run-rule victory over the Flames.

► Jayda Coleman had an exceptional weekend at the plate, hitting three home runs, two doubles and batting .636 with five RBIs. Before Saturday's second game vs. UIC in which the junior had just one at-bat, Coleman had homered in five straight games dating back to Feb. 25 vs. LMU.

► In the circle, OU's pitching staff continued to impress with shutouts in three of the four games and just one run allowed on the weekend to go with 30 strikeouts and three walks. Nicole May K'ed a career-best 11 in Friday's win over UIC, while Alex Storako threw her second career no-hitter vs. Kentucky Friday, just one hit by pitch away from a perfect contest.

EARLY SEASON STORYLINES

► The Sooners have already collected six ranked wins on the season, including a win over then-No. 1 UCLA at the Mary Nutter Classic. OU meets 11 teams ranked in the preseason coaches top 25, including three of the preseason top five in UCLA, Oklahoma State and Florida State.

► OU is outscoring its opponents by a combined score of 162-14 on the season, surrendering an average of under one run per game. The pitching staff has been exceptional, tossing shutouts in 12 of OU's 18 games. Junior Nicole May and sophomore Jordy Bahl combined on the staff's first no-hitter of the season on Feb. 18 vs. Army before Alex Storako threw an individual no-no vs. Kentucky last Friday.

► May leads the pitching staff with a perfect 0.00 ERA and 55 strikeouts, while three of OU's four pitchers hold ERAs under 1.00.

► As a team, OU is batting a nation-best .391 with 31 home runs. Freshman Jocelyn Erickson has impressed in her initial season in the Crimson and Cream, leading the team with 25 RBIs and is tied with Jayda Coleman for the team lead in home runs with five.

LAST TIME THEY MET

► **Southeastern Louisiana:** OU holds a 3-0 all-time record over SELU, last meeting in 2004 with the Sooners beating the Lions 5-4 in Baton Rouge. The other two meetings came in Lafayette in 1991 with OU sweeping SELU, 4-2 and 6-1.

► **Mississippi State:** The Sooners and Bulldogs have met five times in the history of the two programs with OU holding an undefeated 5-0 mark vs. MSU. This weekend will be the first matchups in Starkville as four of the previous five meetings have come on a neutral field. Aside from the teams' first meeting in Ruston, La., in 1983, every ensuing matchup has come in a season that Oklahoma has won the national title (2000, '17, '21 and '22). OU most recently beat MSU in Irvine, Calif., last season at the Mark Campbell Invitational, winning 9-0 in five innings. The Bulldogs are coached by 2009 OU alum and two-time All-American Samantha Ricketts, the older sister of two-time USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, Keilani Ricketts.

► **Omaha:** The Sooners and Mavericks have met four times in program history, with OU holding a 4-0 lead. The teams last met twice in Norman almost six years to the date of this weekend's matchup. OU run-ruled Omaha by scores of 8-0 and 9-1 each in five innings on March 10, 2017.

HOMER HAPPY

► As OU paced the country in home runs each of the past two seasons (NCAA-record 161 in 2021; 155 in 2022), the Sooners are off to another scorching pace in 2023, having blasted 31 so far in the early season, good for third in the country.

► In 2023, the Sooners have homered in 14 of 18 games, including seven games with multiple home runs. OU hit single-season high six blasts vs. No. 1/1 UCLA (Feb. 26) and No. 17/16 Kentucky (March 3). The Sooners have hit two-plus in 14 games, three-plus in four games and six twice in a game this season.

► Individually, 11 Sooners have already hit a long ball in 2023 out of the 16 active non-pitchers on the roster. Of those 11, eight have multi-homer games, including seven with three-plus and three with four or more, paced by Jayda Coleman and Jocelyn Erickson's five a piece.

► Coleman and Kinzie Hansen each have multi-homer games on the season.

► Additionally, OU has hit five homers in one inning once this year (vs. Kentucky, 3/3), hit four in an inning twice, three-plus in two, and two-plus in three.

► The Sooners have hit back-to-back blasts three times this season and three consecutive once.

OUT OF THIS WORLD OFFENSE

► Since 2021, Oklahoma has paced the country offensively in several categories. OU led the nation in home runs in 2021 (161) and 2022 (155) and sit at third with 31 in the early 2023 season. Their 2021 mark broke an 11-year NCAA record for single-season home runs.

► In OU's recent span of offensive domination, the team has led the country in batting average for three straight seasons: 2021 - NCAA-record .405; 2022 - .371; 2023 - .391

► Additionally, the team has paced the country in runs, runs per game and slugging each of the past three seasons. The 2021 team's 638 runs, 10.63 runs/game and .778 SLG % all stand as NCAA records.

► In 2023, OU paces the country with an average of 9.0 runs/game, a .391 batting average and .709 slugging clip.

ELITE IN THE CIRCLE

► OU's pitching staff has been equally as dominant as the offense the past three seasons. The staff has led the country in shutouts the last two seasons (23 in 2021, school-record 33 in 2022) and are second in shutouts already in 2023 with 12 in OU's 18 games.

► The Sooner arms led the country in ERA a season ago with an exceptional 1.05 mark and are off to a dominant start in 2023, ranking third with a 0.93 earned run average.

► The staff has two no-hitters under their belt already in 2023 after Nicole May and Jordy Bahl combined to no-hit Army on Feb. 18 before Alex Storako threw her second career individual no-no vs. Kentucky on March 3. These come a year after the staff had six no-hitters and two perfect games a season ago.

► Three of OU's four pitchers hold ERA's less than 1.00, led by Nicole May's perfect 0.00 average. The others: Alex Storako - 0.27; Kierston Deal - 0.62; Jordy Bahl - 2.33.

► The quartet has fanned a combined 140 batters in 2023 to go with just 31 walks. May leads the group with 55 K's to Bahl's 40. The four have allowed opponents to bat just .162 against them and surrendered just 14 runs, an average of 0.77/game. In OU's six games that they've allowed a run across, the staff has limited the damage with no opponent scoring more than four runs in 2023 (done twice).

MORE NOTES & NUMBERS

► Oklahoma has won 132 of its last 140 games (.943 win %) dating back to the start of the 2021 season.

► Of those 140 games, 87 have been run-rule victories (62%).

► Of OU's six games against top-25 competition, three have been run-rule wins. Furthermore, in those six ranked victories, the Sooners have outscored opponents 58-6.

► OU's defense ranks first in the country with an exceptional .992 fielding percentage, committing just three errors on the season. The Sooners last committed an error on Feb. 11 vs. Washington. The defense has turned 16 double plays already in 2023.

► Oklahoma has outhit its opponent in 17 of 18 games on the season, and in the one game they didn't outhit the opposition (vs. Texas A&M, 2/24), the Sooners won 8-0 in run-rule fashion in five innings (five hits to A&M's six).

► The Sooners have been dominant across all innings in 2023, but specifically the second inning, outscoring teams 49-0 in the second. The team has not surrendered runs in each the second, sixth, seventh or extra innings on the season.

BACK ON TOP

► The Sooners streak of being the top-ranked team for 31 consecutive coaches polls dating back to March 2, 2021 was snapped Feb. 21 after a narrow 4-3 loss at Baylor. Oklahoma quickly regained the top spot last week after a 14-0 thrashing of then-No. 1 UCLA. OU has been the No. 1 team in both major rankings for 33 of the last 34 polls dating back to March 2, 2021.

► Oklahoma was chosen as the unanimous No. 1 in both the 2023 USA Today/NFCA Division I Preseason Coaches Poll and ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Preseason Top 25.

► Oklahoma's No. 1 spot in the NFCA poll marks the fourth time the Sooners enter a season in the top spot (2017, '18, '22, '23) and the third time OU has been the unanimous choice in the coaches poll, joining the 2017 and 2022 squads.

► Additionally, it's the 12th straight year the Sooners have started in the NFCA's top 10, good for the nation's longest active streak. OU has been ranked in the top five 10 of the past 11 years, the most over that stretch.

► Overall, the Sooners are tied with Arizona for second with 23 top-10 appearances in the NFCA preseason poll, trailing only UCLA's 24.

► Oklahoma, UCLA and Washington are the only programs to be ranked in every NFCA preseason poll, which dates back to 1995. OU also extended its streak of being the only program ranked every week in the 28-year existence of the NFCA's poll, 407 straight polls (start of 2023).

EIGHT NAMED TO PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

► Eight members of the Oklahoma softball team have been named to the 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Watch List, the organization announced the 50-player watch list Wednesday.

► Redshirt seniors Haley Lee, Grace Lyons and Alex Storako, senior Kinzie Hansen, juniors Jayda Coleman and Tiare Jennings and sophomores Jordy Bahl and Cydney Sanders are among the 50 student-athletes on the preseason watch list.

► OU's eight selections lead the nation, followed by three representatives from Arkansas, Florida and UCLA.

► Recognized as the most distinguished individual honor in NCAA Division I Softball, the trophy has stayed in Norman each of the past two seasons with 2022 graduate Jocelyn Alo claiming the award in 2021 and 2022. All-time, OU has four USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year honors with Alo's two and 2013 alumna Keilani Ricketts' back-to-back crowns in 2012-13.

► The top 25 finalists for the 2022 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award will be announced April 19. While an athlete does not have to be on the Watch List to be considered for the top 25, the eventual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year will come from the top 25 finalists.

► The top 10 finalists will be announced May 3 and the top three announced May 17. The 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year will be revealed prior to the Women's College World Series. Freshmen can be considered for the Player of the Year award once they have competed at the collegiate level.

BIG 12 FAVORITES

► The ten-time defending Big 12 champion Oklahoma softball team has been voted by the league's head coaches as the 2023 preseason favorite.

► The Sooners received 36 points in this year's poll and were followed by Oklahoma State with 29 and Texas with 28. OU received six of the seven first-place votes with OSU garnering the other. This marks the 11th straight year and 14th in the last 15 seasons that OU has topped the conference's preseason poll.

► Baylor was selected fourth (20 points) and Iowa State fifth (16 points). Rounding out the poll was Texas Tech (12 points) and Kansas (6 points).

► The Sooners finished the Big 12 regular season 17-1 in 2022 en route to their tenth consecutive conference regular season crown.

► Oklahoma holds a combined Big 12 record of 161-15 the past 10 seasons and has not lost a conference series since 2011.

► Overall, the program has won 21 Big 12 titles (14 regular season titles and seven Big 12 tournament championships) all under head coach **Patty Gasso**.

25TH ANNIVERSARY OF MARITA HYNES FIELD

► 2023 marks the 25th anniversary of historic Marita Hynes Field in Norman. The iconic field that has housed the nation's premier program opened its gates in 1998 and the Sooners have since gone 533-62-1 (.893).

► The field, named for former softball coach and senior woman administrator Marita Hynes on April 24, 2004, has a current capacity of 1,378 with standing room for over 2,000. The largest crowd to ever watch an OU softball game at the venue was May 4, 2019, with 2,076 in attendance for Bedlam vs. Oklahoma State.

► Oklahoma has gone undefeated on its home field four seasons since 1998, including each of the past two years. The Sooners last home loss was Feb. 29, 2020, a narrow 4-3 decision to North Texas. Over the past five seasons, OU holds a 100-2 mark at MHF.

► 2023 is anticipated to be the final season played at Marita Hynes as OU looks to open the state-of-the-art Love's Field in 2024.

SEVEN NAMED TO BIG 12 PRESEASON TEAM

► Seven Oklahoma softball student-athletes were named to the 2023 Big 12 Softball Preseason Team.

► Redshirt seniors Haley Lee and Grace Lyons, juniors Alyssa Brito, Jayda Coleman and Tiare Jennings and sophomores Jordy Bahl and Cydney Sanders were among the 12 players chosen to the squad by the league's head coaches. Bahl and Jennings were two of five unanimous selections to the team.

► Oklahoma paced the conference with seven of the 12 named to the team with the next-closest school being Oklahoma State with two selections. Baylor, Kansas and Texas each had one representative. Student-athletes were chosen regardless of position and coaches could not vote for their own players.

CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

► OU finished the Big 12 regular season 17-1 en route to winning its 14th regular season crown and 10th consecutive in 2022.

► The Sooners have won 76 of their last 78 Big 12 regular season games. Their streak of 57 consecutive that ended in Stillwater with a narrow loss to the Cowgirls in 2021 was the longest in conference and program history.

► OU is unbeaten in their last 66 conference series (62-0-4 in that span) and have not lost a conference series since 2011.

► OU has finished first in the Big 12 over the past 10 seasons with a combined record of 161-15. Prior to OU's current run of 10 straight regular season titles, no team had ever won more than two consecutive.

► Overall, the Sooners have 21 Big 12 titles with 14 regular season crowns and seven Big 12 tournament championships, all under head coach Patty Gasso.

ALL-AMERICANS ALL OVER THE FIELD

► The Sooners return five NFCA All-Americans on a loaded roster that added a trio of All-American transfers. Super senior Grace Lyons, senior Kinzie Hansen, juniors Jayda Coleman and Tiare Jennings and sophomore Jordy Bahl join forces with transfer additions redshirt seniors Haley Lee and Alex Storako, and sophomore Cydney Sanders.

► A Top 10 Finalist for USA Softball Player of the Year a season ago, **Grace Lyons** returns for her super senior year in 2023 as the two-time defending Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and two-time NFCA All-American. Lyons had a career year at the plate in 2022, hitting 23 homers and batting in 70 runs.

► 2021 WCWS All-Tournament Team selection, **Kinzie Hansen** looks to replicate the success she's seen since her freshman season as a true senior in 2023 with two years of eligibility remaining. The 2021 All-American catcher has 36 career homers and has been a force behind the plate for OU with a .993 career fielding percentage.

► A two-time NFCA First Team All-American, **Jayda Coleman** led the team with 13 stolen bases a season ago and ranked second with a .424 batting average and .584 on-base clip to go with eight home runs, nine doubles and 40 RBIs.

► **Tiare Jennings**, a twice unanimous NFCA First Team All-American, looks to continue her dominance at the plate, hitting 56 home runs in her two seasons in Norman and pacing the country in RBIs back-to-back seasons.

► The reigning Big 12 Co-Pitcher of the Year and NFCA National Freshman of the Year, **Jordy Bahl** had a dominant first-year campaign for the Sooners. Also a 2022 Top 10 Finalist for player of the year, Bahl finished with a 22-1 record in 2022 to go with 205 strikeouts. She surrendered just 22 earned runs in 141.1 innings pitched en route to NFCA First Team All-America honors.

► **Haley Lee**, one of OU's four transfer additions this offseason, comes to Norman with 47 career home runs throughout her time at Texas A&M. A versatile player that was an NFCA Third Team All-American in 2021, Lee looks to be a weapon across the field for the Sooners in 2023.

► **Alex Storako** brings with her to Norman over 900 career strikeouts and a 1.71 ERA from her four years at Michigan. An NFCA Second Team All-American and the unanimous Big Ten Pitcher of the Year in 2021, Storako joins a loaded OU pitching staff that looks to lead the nation for the second straight season in ERA.

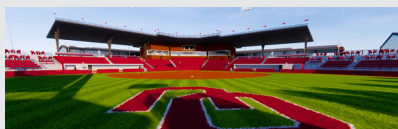
► Another addition via the portal, **Cydney Sanders** transfers to the Sooners after an exceptional freshman season where she was one of three finalists for NFCA National Freshman of the Year and named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year and an NFCA First Team All-American. The San Marcos, Calif., native started all 54 games at first base for Arizona State in 2022 and hit a program single-season record 21 home runs.

FRESH FACES

► Another key transfer addition along with Lee, Sanders and Storako will be senior **Alynah Torres** from Arizona State. The true senior, with two seasons of eligibility remaining, holds a .327 career batting average with 37 home runs and 24 doubles. An All-Region and All-Pac 12 First Team honoree a season ago, Torres has started 131 of her 132 career games played.

► Joining the four transfers as newcomers in 2023 will be four highly-touted freshmen: Kierston Deal (LHP), Jocelyn Erickson (C/UTL), SJ Geurin (LHP) and Avery Hodge (INF).

LOVE'S FIELD OPENING 2024



In October 2021, Love's Travel Stops, the nation's leading travel stop network, provided the lead and naming gift for the University of Oklahoma's new softball stadium, Love's Field.

The company pledged \$9 million toward the project and also extended a challenge to other donors. It will match every other donation dollar for dollar up to an additional \$3 million dollars as part of project fundraising. Once fulfilled, the match will result in a total gift of \$12 million from Love's, which is the largest philanthropic gift directed toward a female specific sport program in OU Athletics history.

Love's Travel Stops is headquartered in Oklahoma City. The company opened its first location in 1964 in Watonga, Oklahoma, and now has over 560 locations and 33,000 employees in 41 states.

The new facility includes a 10,500 square-foot indoor training facility, which is nearly double the size of the current training space, and several team spaces including a training room, locker room and classroom. It also has space for a recognition area to showcase national championships, All-Americans and other outstanding accomplishments.

Love's Field will be constructed at the northwest corner of South Jenkins Avenue and Imhoff Road, approximately one-half mile south of the current stadium location. It will accommodate seating for 3,000 and is being designed to allow for expansion. The current stadium has a seating capacity of 1,378. Temporary seating is added annually to increase the capacity to approximately 1,900.

In the current plans, the overall square footage of the complex will reach 44,000 as compared to 15,150 at the present facility. The team areas will expand from 2,949 square feet to 5,375 square feet and the indoor practice facility increases from 4,700 square feet to 10,531 square feet.

Love's Field will include three concessions stands with a total of eight points of sale, with additional space for auxiliary locations. It also includes an increase of more than 80 restroom fixtures from the current facility.

Minimum estimates for Love's Field currently stand at approximately \$27 million. To date more than \$20 million has been raised through the generosity of Sooner Club members. Love's Field is expected to be fully funded by direct private support making it the most ever privately fundraised for a female student-athlete facility in intercollegiate sport. Architects and facility planners are completing design concepts. Groundbreaking occurred in September 2022. It is expected that the stadium will open for the 2024 season.

- The consensus No. 1 player and pitcher in the class of 2022, **Kierston Deal** comes to Norman from East Forsyth H.S. in Winston Salem, N.C., where she was an Extralining Softball First Team High School All-American. The crafty lefty looks to contribute as one of just two left-handed pitchers on the staff.
- The other freshman lefty hurler, **SJ Geurin**, will be a redshirt candidate on a loaded, veteran pitching staff. The No. 20 recruit in the class of 2022 and an All-State pitcher in the state of Texas, Geurin played travel ball for the well-known Texas Bombers Gold.
- **Avery Hodge** brings an impressive defensive mentality as a freshman in 2023. The No. 6 prospect in the class of 2022 by Extra Inning Softball, Hodge throws right and bats left as a crafty hitter that can bunt, slap or hit for power. The Richmond, Texas, product played travel ball for Texas Bombers Gold along with fellow frosh SJ Geurin, helping the team to a national-runner up finish at the 2021 Alliance Fastpitch Championship. Also a U.S. Junior National Team member, Hodge helped the U.S. to a Pan-American Championship title.

► A highly-touted catcher recruit from Phoenix who attended the same HS as senior captain Grace Lyons, **Jocelyn Erickson** was the No. 10 recruit in the class of 2022 and played for OU's well-known travel ball club the OC Batbusters-Stith squad. Erickson was named the 2021-22 Gatorade Arizona Softball Player of the Year. A rare lefty catcher who also bats left, Erickson impressed with her power in the fall and will look to contribute behind the plate or at first base in 2023.

HOME RUN U

- Oklahoma is officially Home Run University. With Jocelyn Alo's record-breaking career homer No. 96 (122 career total), two Sooners sit atop the NCAA record books for career home runs in Alo and 2015 alum Lauren Chamberlain.
- In addition to Alo and Chamberlain, 2015 alum Shelby Pendley sits at 10th all-time with 84 career blasts.
- More evidence of the Sooners staking claim to HRU is the past two seasons when OU has lit up the record books:
- 2021 saw the Sooners set NCAA records for home runs (161), runs scored (638), runs per game (10.63) and homers per game (2.68), among other records.
- Jocelyn Alo hit 34 blasts in 2021 and 2022 for second all-time in single-season NCAA history, just three shy of Laura Espinoza's (Arizona) 37 in 1995. Alo's 2018 along with Chamberlain's 2012 and '13 where each hit 30 homers a piece all rank in the all-time top-10.
- Current junior Tiare Jennings nearly matched Alo and Chamberlain's record (30) for freshman homers in 2021, hitting 27 to come within three of the NCAA frosh record. She followed suit in 2022 with 29 round-trippers.
- Jennings looks to continue the legacy at Oklahoma with two more seasons in the Crimson & Cream and already holding the No. 5 spot in the OU record book with 59 career homers. The two-time unanimous All-American is just six blasts shy of third place in program history.
- Senior captain Grace Lyons has come into her own offensively, hitting a career single-season best 23 blasts last year to bring her career total to 50, good for eighth in the OU record book.

HISTORIC STREAK

- Oklahoma's 40-game win streak that came to an end at Texas on April 16, 2022 went down as tied for third all-time in DI softball history, tying the Sooners own mark from 2020-21. The streak is second to OU's 41-game win streak in 2019 and 1996-97 Arizona's 47-game mark.
- OU's 38-0 start to the 2022 season went down as the best start to a season in Division I history.

HONORING THE HOME RUN QUEEN

- **Jocelyn Alo** is the new home run queen of college softball. In front of the home crowd of friends of family in Honolulu on March 12, 2022, Alo hit career home run No. 96 to break the tie with OU alum Lauren Chamberlain to be the NCAA career home run leader. Alo concluded her storybook career with 122 home runs.
- After an eight-game stretch that saw Alo walk a combined 16 times including three intentional walks, the Hauula, Hawaii, native left no doubt when she finally saw the pitch she wanted for No. 96.
- The historic homer came in the top of the sixth inning versus Hawaii, a two-run blast to right center on a 2-1 count. Alo went 3-for-3 in the game with three RBIs.
- Alo hit the 96 mark in 224 games and 651 at-bats, she hit the record-tying No. 95 in 215 games, less games than Chamberlain (220) and anyone else in the all-time top 10.

- "Championship Mindset" will feature never-before-seen interviews with the team's coaches and student-athletes, giving fans a special and unique look into the legacy that is Oklahoma softball.
- All five episodes can be viewed on ESPN+, YouTube and on a dedicated page within SoonerSports.com, including snippets on Oklahoma softball's official social platforms.
- Three episodes have been released, with two more episodes to be released later this season.
- LEARFIELD's dedicated content team, LEARFIELD Studios, produced and directed the series in complete collaboration with Oklahoma's athletics administration.

Recently completing her 28th season at the University of Oklahoma in 2022, NFCA Hall of Fame head coach Patty Gasso has molded the OU softball program into a national power and permanently placed herself among the elite college softball coaches in the country.

Oklahoma has won six national championships, winning in 2000, 2013, 2016, 2017, 2021 and most recently in 2022. OU is one of just three programs in NCAA history to win more than two national titles. She's reached the Women's College World Series 15 times during her tenure, and in the process, advanced to the postseason in each one of her 28 seasons (no tournament in 2020).

With 32 seasons as a head coach to her name, Gasso has a career collegiate coaching record of 1,556-403-3 (.793) and holds an overall record of 1,395-344-2 (.801) at the University of Oklahoma.

She has won more Big 12 games (376-87; .812) than any coach in the league's history and has more than twice as many overall wins as any other coach in OU history. OU has claimed 14 Big 12 regular season titles, including an unprecedented 10 straight since the 2012 season, and seven championship titles under her direction. Gasso's Sooner teams have finished second or higher 22 different times in the 26 years since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996.

Numerous Sooner players have prospered under Gasso's tutelage and garnered national, regional and conference recognition. Most recently, Jocelyn Alo helped lead the Sooners to back-to-back titles en route to winning consecutive USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year awards in 2021 and 2022. Keilani Ricketts was also a two-time USA Softball Player of the Year in 2012 and 2013. Gasso has directed 70 All-Americans, 157 All-Region honors and 116 first-team all-conference selections.

In the Big 12 era, Sooners have been named Big 12 Player of the Year a total of 14 times and Big 12 Pitcher of the Year seven times, while 10 have been selected as Big 12 Freshman of the Year and one as Big 12 Newcomer. In 2010, Amber Flores became the first player in league history to earn Player of the Year honors twice. Shelby Pendley joined her in 2015 before Alo claimed the honor in consecutive seasons in 2021 and 2022.

The OU softball success under Gasso has also spilled over into the classroom where the Sooners have been honored with 162 academic all-conference honors. Ten of those have gone on to become Academic All-Americans, including Lana Moran, the 2000 Academic All-American of the Year.

Gasso and her staff have consistently been recognized for their efforts on and off the field. The staff was awarded three consecutive Speedline/NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards from 1999-2001 and received the national honor in 2000, 2013, 2016 and 2017. Gasso and staff have claimed the regional honor in 14 of their 28 seasons with the most recent award coming in 2022. In addition, Gasso has been named the Big 12 Coach of the Year 14 times: 1996, 1999, 2000, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2021 and 2022.

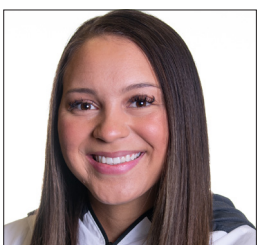
