ATHLETIC MEDIA RELATIONS OFFICE: The Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office is located in Room 202 of Humphrey Coliseum. Office hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays.

CREDENTIALS: Requests for press/photo credentials should be faxed or mailed on official letterhead to the Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office (FAX 662.325.3654) at least 48 hours prior to the event. Since space is limited, accommodations are on a priority basis: daily newspapers, originating radio and television stats, national weekly or monthly publications, electronic media outlets, local and regional television crews. Priority is granted to members of the media who cover Mississippi State on a regular basis, and to visiting media members. At the MSU Softball Field, media credentials will be available for pickup at the press tent. Only working media with proper credentials will be allowed access to the press area.

PHOTO REGULATIONS: Photo passes will be issued only to accredited photographers on assignment. Photographers may shoot from designated areas outside of the fences of the field and within the stadium. The Mississippi State Athletic Department adheres to NCAA photography policies and reserves all commercial and non-commercial rights to the use of film, videotape and still photographs of its athletic events and facilities.

MSU SOFTBALL FIELD: With its fully enclosed press box and telephone lines that allows for faxing and web site updates, as well as radio/television broadcasting capabilities, the MSU Softball Field is an on-campus facility located near the intersection of Lakeview Drive and U.S 182 East. With a seating capacity of 750, the press box telephone number is 662.325.7546.

PARKING: The MSU Softball Field is an on-campus facility located near the intersection of Lakeview Drive and U.S. 182 East. The parking lot located between the MSU Softball Field and the A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre is reserved for game officials and staff. Parking for the media and general public is located beyond the outfield fence. The parking lot located between the A.J. Pitts Tennis Center and the Carl Maddox Track has been reserved for overflow parking.

SERVICES: The Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office will provide a complete box score and play-by-play of each game. Programs containing rosters and game notes on each team will also be provided to the working media. An automatic facsimile machine is available in the Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations offices in the Bryan Building and the Humphrey Coliseum.

TELEPHONES: Telephone service is available in the press box area (4 lines). The MSU Softball Field press box telephone number is 662.325.7546. Mississippi State freely provides telephone services to working media. However, any special requests must be made in advance through the Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office at 662.325.7556. These requests should be submitted at least two weeks in advance to the media relations office on official letterhead.

INTERVIEW POLICY: All interviews with Mississippi State players and coaches must be arranged through the media relations office. Please contact Brock Turnipseed at 662.325.7556 to set up an interview. Home or cell phone numbers for student-athletes will not be given to the media under any circumstances, although players will grant phone interviews via the media relations office. Coach Jay Miller is available for phone interviews on weekday mornings (8 a.m.-Noon) during the season, but in-person interviews must be coordinated through the media relations office. Players are available for interviews before each practice at approximately 1:30 p.m. at the MSU Softball Field. Media are requested to submit postgame interview requests to media relations personnel prior to the start of the seventh inning.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: Following a 10-minute cooling off period, head coach Jay Miller and/or requested players will be available on the playing surface of the MSU Softball Field. The opponent head coach and/or players will also be available on the field. Please make interview requests through the visiting softball contact.

ARCHIVAL INFORMATION: The Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office maintains information on all current student-athletes, as well as historical information on previous student-athletes and the program in general. For information, interviews, photo shoots and/or file photos, please call, stop by our office or fax a request.

BOB HARTLEY MEMORIAL FELLOWSHIP

For more than half a century Robert M. "Bob" Hartley dedicated his life's work to promoting Mississippi State athletics. From his hiring as the school's first sports publicity director in August 1946 to his initial "retirement" as assistant athletic director for communications in June 1985, through his later years as an invaluable consultant for the Mississippi State University Department of Athletics, the man we called "Hart" gave special meaning to the words "loyalty" and "devotion to duty."

Mr. Bob's labors of love with MSU have not gone unrecognized. He has taken his place among college athletics' greats as a member of both the university's and the state's sports halls of fame and the College Sports Information Directors of America Hall of Fame.

His willingness to generously give of his talent, his time and his friendship serves as an inspiration to the countless lives he touched and to those that aspire to follow in his footsteps. In that respect, the Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship was created by the MSU Department of Athletics to provide internship opportunities for young media relation practitioners.

Jay Middleton was selected as the sixth recipient of the Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship for the 2007-2008 academic year. A native of Tupelo, Miss., Middleton enters his fifth season working with the Mississippi State athletic media relations office. Middleton worked as a student assistant from 2003-2006 and enters his second year as a graduate assistant. Middleton has served the last two years as the primary contact for the men's tennis and women's golf programs at MSU. Among other duties, he works with msta-athletics.com, MSU's official athletic website, and Maroon to the Max, a video streaming service provided to MSU fans worldwide. Most recently, he earned national recognition for the 2007 men's tennis media guide which was awarded the third best tennis publication in the country by CoSIDA.

Middleton earned his bachelor's degree in communication with an emphasis in public relations in the summer of 2006 from State and is currently seeking a master's degree in business administration.

View the process of how these hand-poured candles are scented and molded. This group tour ends in their stunning showroom and gift shop. Tours available by appointment Mon.-Thu. Store hours are from 9:30 a.m.-5:30 p.m., Mon.-Sat.

Elvis Presley Birthplace & Museum (662-841-1245)

Located an hour north in Tupelo, the site of The King's birth is open 9 a.m.-5:30 p.m., Mon.-Sat. (May-Sept.) and 9 a.m.-5 p.m., Mon.-Sat. (Oct.-Apr.), and 1-5 p.m. on Sun. Closed on Thanksgiving and Christmas Days. Admission is \$2 to the birthplace and \$5 to the museum.

Herzer Dairy Manufacturing (662-325-3200)

An overview of the dairy plant concludes with a slide show describing the process of making Mississippi's famous cheese products. Cheese and homemade ice cream samples are for sale in the gift shop. Tours available by appointment.

John Grisham Room (662-325-2559)

The John Grisham Room in the Mitchell Memorial Library at Mississippi State is the only complete collection in the United States of the renowned author's papers and publications. It includes literary manuscripts, legislative files, photographs, signed works, international editions and other materials on display. Open from 9 a.m.-4 p.m., Mon.-Fri.

MSU Golf Course (662-325-3028)

This 18-hole golf course was rated by Golf Digest as one of the "Best Places to Play" and is also one of the top 10 public golf courses in Mississippi. Call for tee times.

Noxubee National Wildlife Refuge (662-323-5548)

Located within 30 minutes of the MSU campus, the Refuge is a 48,000-acre forest offering many outdoor and sightseeing opportunities. March 14, 2003, was the Centennial anniversary of the National Wildlife Refuge System, which was established by President Theodore Roosevelt in 1903 to protect fish and wildlife for the benefit of all generations.

Templeton Music Museum and Archives (662-325-7680)

Located in MSU's Mitchell Memorial Library, the museum features a vast collection of all types of musical instruments, sheet music, phonographs and music boxes.

McKay Food Research and Enology Lab (662-325-3011)

Located in the North Farm area of the MSU campus, a visit to this attraction allows you to see how research produces MSU wine, juices, and jellies from local muscadine grapes. A guided tour ends with a wine tasting, if desired. Tours are available by appointment.

Mississippi Horse Park & Agri-Center (662-325-9350)

Home to the Golden Triangle Regional Fair held every September, and several regional rodeo events, the Horse Park serves as Mississippi's only full service Horsepark. Other events held on the grounds include the World Famous Lipizzaner White Stallions, Monster Truck Nationals and Thrill Show and barrel races.

Silver Star Resort & Casino (800-557-0711)

Situated just more than an hour from Starkville in Philadelphia, Silver Star offers gaming and entertainment opportunities, as well as a first-class hotel, golf course and restaurant.

Oktibbeha Co. Heritage Museum (662-323-0211)

Located on a tree-shaded hillside where Fellowship Street joins the curve of Russell Street, the Heritage Museum was established in 1976 as a joint Bicentennial project of the City of Starkville, Oktibbeha County, and the Oktibbeha County American Revolution Bicentennial Committee. The museum is housed in the former GM&O Railroad Depot (built in 1874) and boasts a large display of items 50 years old or older. Among the collection are antique dolls, arrowheads, confederate flag and soldiers' letters, military uniforms, household and farm tools, grist mill, hospital instruments and incubator, homemade brick forms, wedding dresses, school pictures, and quilts. Corner of Fellowship and Russell Streets. Open 1 to 4 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Group tours available at other hours by prior arrangement.

Old Waverly Golf Club (662-494-6463)

One of the premier private golf courses in the South, Old Waverly in West Point hosted the 1999 U.S. Women's Open Championship.

CAVE™ (662-325-7642)

You can enter the 4th dimension when you take a tour at the Engineering Research Center for computational field simulation. The ERC gives visitors the chance to try out their virtual reality programs in the CAVE™ (Computer Automatic Virtual Environment). Ride a virtual roller coaster or fly through a forest.

Home to the Mississippi State women's softball team since 1997, the MSU Softball Field gives the Bulldogs one of the finest facilities in the Southeast.

Located on the northside of the Mississippi State campus, the MSU Softball Field sits in the heart of Mississippi State's impressive physical plant. It joins W.O. Spencer Stadium (track and field), Dudy-Noble Field/Polk Dement Stadium (baseball), the MSU Soccer Field and the A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre to give Mississippi State some of the finest Olympic sport venues in collegiate athletics.

The facility features a main grandstand area which will accommodate more than 750 people with opportunities for expansion in the future. Also included is a state-of-the-art pressbox complete with phone lines and a public address system, an electronic scoreboard and bullpens behind both stepdown dugouts which are complete with restroom facilities for both teams.

Hailed as one of the top playing surfaces in the Southeastern Conference, the field stretches 200 feet down the left and rightfield lines and spans 220 feet to straight-away centerfield. The regulation NCAA Championship field features Mississippi Pride grass - developed by researchers on the Mississippi State campus - making it home to one of the finest playing surfaces in the country. A grounds crew is responsible for the field maintenance of the MSU Softball Field.

With each season, the MSU Softball Field seems to get better and better. Following the program's inaugural season in 1997, lights were added to the facility, bringing a much-more enjoyable climate to Bulldog fans as well as visiting fans across the country. In 2000, another facility-improving project

was completed as the MSU Softball Field's dugouts were enhanced with brick, bringing yet another eye-pleasing feature to the facility. In 2001, construction of an additional batting cage, as well as the placing of sidewalks in and around field and spectator areas, were added.

Work was completed in the fall 2005 on a one million dollar indoor facility which features a state-of-the-art practice field, as well as a lockerroom, clubhouse, training room, coaches' lockerrooms and players lounge. In addition, a revamped bullpen area was added just behind the dugout on the third base side of the facility. The indoor facility is the only one of its kind in the nation.

Since beginning play at the MSU Softball Field, the Mississippi State has posted a 210-100 (.677) overall record and, in 1999, tallied a program-high 21-6 record at home, including a 12-2 mark at home inside the Southeastern Conference. Mississippi State has also shutout its opponent 60 times in front of its home fans - 22 times completing the task in abbreviated innings.

The opening game on the newly constructed Mississippi State Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, when Mississippi State hosted visiting Samford University. The Bulldogs opened the park successfully, sweeping Samford 4-0 and 4-0 in a doubleheader witnessed by more than 300 fans that braved the inclement weather.

The Bulldogs averaged just more than 300 fans during that first season and set an attendance record which still stands to this day on April 25, 1998, when 1,547 fans watched the Bulldogs battle archrival Mississippi.



MSU SOFTBALL FACILITIES

PALMEIRO CENTER



The Palmeiro Center - a \$3.8 million, 68,000-square foot, climate-controlled indoor practice facility - was completed in August 2005 and gives the Bulldogs an additional practice option during inclement weather. Named for former Bulldog baseball great and Major League Baseball star Rafael Palmeiro, the facility features a turfed 120-yard long practice surface and a \$1.5 million, 9,500-square foot banquet room which will seat up to 350 people.

ROUSE WEIGHT ROOM



The Rouse Weight Room is a recently constructed 10,000-square foot weight facility that includes more than \$100,000 worth of essential weight training equipment. Under the guidance and supervision of strength coach Ben Pollard, and a nationally certified strength and conditioning staff, each and every player is helped to reach peak physical performance. In all, the center gives State players access to 22 power stations. Each nine-foot rack sits on a six-foot by eight-foot oak platform.

SOFTBALL INDOOR FACILITY



Mississippi State's indoor facility, located adjacent to the left field foul line of the Mississippi State Softball Field, includes an 8,000-square foot indoor practice facility complete with collapsible batting cages. Access to the indoor facility can be obtained by any of the six main areas of the indoor facility by simply walking through a door.



Included in the price of the million-dollar facility is a brand new locker room facility for the Bulldogs which will allow the players convenient access to both the indoor practice facility as well as the varsity game field. A 1,200-square foot team lounge is located directly above the locker room.



One of four satellite training rooms in Mississippi State's sports medicine department, the training room at the softball indoor facility is equipped with training tables, rehabilitation equipment and an ice machine and helps certified athletic trainer Corey Lock cater to the health needs of all MSU Softball athletes and coaches.



From the team lounge, players can view game film, or just relax and watch TV on a state-of-the-art drop down screen.



SOFTBALL INDOOR TEAM LOUNGE



When not on the practice field or watching game film, MSU softball players can kick back and relax with a game of ping-pong, or play pool on a regulation size table in the team lounge.



Above the Mississippi State locker room in the Softball Indoor Facility is a 1,200-square foot team lounge. Here, players can study, watch TV, or just kill time before their next class.



As you enter Mississippi State's indoor facility, you pass through the Stairway of All-Americans, where jerseys of MSU's six All-Americans are adorned.



The Northeast Village, made up of four residence halls with the largest single room sizes in university history, opened in August 2006. A co-residential, 160,000-square foot, three-story freshman hall, Ruby is located at the north end of campus. Ruby Hall offers students the latest in technology, including Ethernet access and full wireless internet coverage.



The \$19 million, 150,000-square foot Sanderson Center recreation complex opened to students in 1996. The state-of-the-art facility offers recreational opportunities in aquatics, fitness and aerobics, strength and conditioning, and intramural sports.

Mississippi State set out in 2007 to make a return to the postseason following a trying 2006 campaign.

Head coach Jay Miller's squad succeeded in its quest, putting together a 35-27 record, finishing third in the Southeastern Conference's Western Division and advancing to the school's fourth NCAA regional in Miller's five seasons at the helm.

MSU enters the 2008 campaign with the goal of continuing the success on the field that it found a year ago. Big goals are not out of reach this season with 11 letterwinners returning, including six starters from last year's squad.

The veteran leadership that is scattered throughout the lineup will be beneficial in quickly grooming a freshman class which will be asked to contribute immediately.

PITCHERS

The biggest question mark entering the season will come in the circle where the Bulldogs have to replace three pitchers who combined for 28 of the team's 35 victories.

Despite the loss of so much experience, Miller feels that this year's staff might have the most talent of any staff he has placed on the field in his previous five seasons here in Starkville.

Miller's squad will look to leadership from junior **Kelsey Nurnberg**, who joined the program last January just before the start of the 2007 season. Despite having limited experience in the circle for the Bulldogs, Nurnberg brings a workhorse mentality to the mound while pos-

sessing good velocity and movements to keep opposing hitters off-balance.

Nurnberg picked up a team second-best seven victories a year ago to go along with a 3.07 ERA.

With Nurnberg expecting to carry much of the pitching load this season, her success will help make an easier transition to the collegiate level for a pair of talented freshmen in **Misty Flesher** and Mississippi native **Elizabeth Woolven**.

"Misty and Elizabeth have the potential to really dominate at our level," Miller said. "Obviously they haven't been through the rigors of an SEC season, and you don't know how they will adjust to that. They have the talent, but they just need the experience."

The duo will receive collegiate experience very early against tough competition as the Bulldogs open at the prestigious Palm Springs Classic.

Flesher, a hard-throwing right-hander from Oklahoma, showed that she could be an immediate contributor with a solid fall season. She joins the Bulldogs following a stellar prep career at Lone Grove High School where she set the single-season state and career national records for shutouts while earning four Oklahoma All-Star selections and Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-America accolades.

Woolven makes the short venture to Starkville bringing an outstanding resume that she compiled while leading Mooreville High School to a Mississippi 3A semifinal appearance a year ago and a state championship in 2006. Woolven brings a tough mentality to the circle that nicely compliments her solid repertoire of pitches. The multi-time all-state selection played the summer of 2006 for the Virginia Shamrocks, helping that team knock off the nation's best travel ball teams to win the prestigious ASA Gold Nationals.

Sophomore **Jessie Bailey** could also offer some innings of relief during the season, however, she will see most of her time anchoring third base for a veteran infield that appears to be solid, beginning with the catcher's spot.

CATCHERS

With the graduation of Blair Hewitt, Miller will look for stability behind the plate to help in the development of the young pitching staff.

Sophomore **Chelsea Bramlett** will anchor the signal-caller's position after splitting time behind the plate and at second base a year ago.

The SEC Freshman of the Year and

first team NFCA all-American brings good speed and a strong arm to the position. A year ago she hit .386 as a rookie and set the school record for stolen bases in a season with 46 in 50 attempts.

"Chelsea will be a great catcher for us," Miller said. "I'm looking forward to letting her settle in at one position and get used to that spot."

The Bulldogs will look to senior **Megan Bateman** to back-up Bramlett behind the plate this season. A versatile player who could also be used in the outfield, Bateman offers a strong bat with the ability to deliver clutch hits.

INFIELD

With the youth and inexperience in the circle this season for the Bulldogs, a veteran infield will be relied upon greatly to bolster the defense.

The infield remains essentially intact from a year ago, with two seniors, a junior and a sophomore returning with another valuable year of experience under their belt in the rugged Southeastern Conference.

Courtney Bures bolsters the shortstop position for her final campaign after a stellar first three years that have seen her set school records while earning All-SEC and All-America accolades. While she possesses a stellar bat, her glove is just as impressive as Miller says that she has the ability to make plays that no other player in the country can make. Offensively, Bures anchors the lineup after she hit a team second-best .354 last season and led the squad with 56 RBI — the third most in school



history.

While Bures is entrenched at short, senior **Lindsay Hunley** looks to provide additional senior leadership at second base after mixing time between first and second in 2007.

Hunley offers a solid glove at second base, committing only two errors in the field while driving in 11 runs at the plate.

The senior will find herself battling freshman **Ali Bainbridge** for the starting nod at second base. The freshman showed in the fall that she will compete for playing time, leading the team in batting average just months removed from her graduation from Vestavia Hills High School in Birmingham, Ala. A player who has the ability to play multiple positions, Bainbridge could also end up seeing time in the outfield.

A pair of sisters anchor the corners of the Bulldog infield this season. Junior **Sammie Jo Bailey** will hold down first base this season after fielding .988 and hitting .297 as a sophomore.

Her sister, sophomore **Jessie Bailey**, has locked down the "hot corner" this season after a stellar freshman campaign for the Bulldogs. Last season, Jessie batted .251 and accounted for 48 runs as a rookie while fielding .949 in 216 chances.

"Having Courtney and Jessie on the left side of the infield really gives us a great defensive side of the infield," Miller said. "I feel really good where we sit in the infield."

Another freshman could see time on the infield, as **Courtney Nesbit** brings a solid bat and great defensive skills to the team at first base following a prep career at Harrison High School in Acworth, Ga., in which she earned all-state honors as a senior and twice won the team's Most Outstanding Offensive Player accolades.

The depth chart at third base also provides a lot of depth behind Bailey this season. Junior **Gina McCloud** has made the move to third after starting her career behind the plate. The Mississippi native has adjusted well to the position, and she will once again provide a good bat in the lineup.

Sophomore **Laurie Siebert** will provide another capable bat and glove at third. Siebert showed a tremendous amount of potential during her freshman campaign and the fall season. The Illinois prep product has good power to the gaps, and her defense at the "hot corner" continues to progress.

Another freshman, **Jessie Spain**, could step in and contribute in the infield as well. A teammate of Bainbridge at Vestavia Hills High School, Spain has the ability to play any position in the infield, and she might also see some work in the outfield.

OUTFIELD

The outfield, like the infield, will be a strong point for the Bulldog defense this season. Senior **Hayle Guess** will captain the outfield again this season from center field after a 2007 season in which she led the team with six home runs and collected four triples while batting at a .324 clip.

Guess, who earned second team all-region honors from the NFCA last season, can cover a lot of turf in the outfield. The in-state standout also possesses a strong arm that opposing base-runners rarely choose to test.

Guess and the speed of senior **Nakita Boyce** will make open space limited for opposing hitters. Offensively, Boyce brings a left-handed slapper to the batting order, and she is a threat on the bases, stealing 20 bases in 22 attempts after hitting .308 last season.

Bainbridge and fellow freshman **Brittany Bell** will have the opportunity to contribute in the outfield this season. Bainbridge could start the season in outfield, but the coaching staff would like to eventually get her outstanding glove in the infield.

Bell is another speedster who brings a great arm to the outfield. The Tampa, Fla., native reminds the coaching staff of a young Lyhia McMichael with her exceptional speed and ability to hit for power. Eventually becoming the Bulldogs' center fielder, Bell could make an immediate impact this season playing in right and left.

THE OFFENSE

Miller thought the offense played well a year ago, hitting .297 in leading the Bulldogs to a spot in the Tucson regional. This year he's expecting even better production as the top three average hitters and top home run and RBI producers all return.

That could be more potent this season with additional speed on the squad.

"I think we'll be able to generate some runs this season," Miller said. "We're faster this year, and I think we can take advantage of our speed even more this year. We have more speed from top to bottom in the lineup."

THE OFFENSE

The Bulldogs have once again put together a challenging schedule. MState opens the year at the prestigious Palm Springs Classic where it will face Oregon in a five-game slate that includes three NCAA tournament clubs from 2007.

MSU will meet 12 more regional squads, including Wright State and Southern Illinois in its own Bulldog Round Robin. Six teams that advanced to super regional play sit on the Bulldogs' schedule including Tennessee, who advanced to the Women's College World Series championship a year ago. The Vols are one of nine teams that ended 2007 ranked in the top 25 polls, and five hail from the SEC.

State opens a 28-game conference slate at Auburn March 11. The team will then turn-around and face Alabama before going on the road to Mississippi and LSU.

MSU will meet the United States Olympic Team in an exhibition match-up in Ridgeland, Miss., following the Bully Bash that will be contested during MSU's annual Super Bulldog Weekend. After a mid-week road trip to Mississippi Valley State, State will open a seven-game homestand that includes Georgia and Tennessee before closing the regular season at Arkansas.



DIAMOND CLUB

The BULLDOG DIAMOND CLUB is the official booster club of the Mississippi State University softball team. With three NCAA Regional appearances in the past four years, the Bulldogs are poised to join the nation's "elite" team this year. 



Miller's successes at the collegiate and international level have placed him among the nation's elite fastpitch softball coaches. His name will be placed among the other greats of the game in December as he will become the third Southeastern Conference head coach to be inducted into the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Utilizing a coaching model that emphasizes hard work, loyalty, enthusiasm, dedication to the classroom and a commitment to the playing field, Jay Miller enjoyed another milestone season in 2007 to further cement his reputation as one of the most well-respected coaches in the sport.

Under his leadership, his Mississippi State squad returned to the postseason for the fourth time in his five seasons at the helm and finished in third place in the SEC's Western Division. Last summer he added to his already-impressive international resume, guiding the United States Junior National Team to the gold medal at the Junior World Championships in The Netherlands.

The success he has enjoyed both on and off the field at the collegiate and international level have earned him a distinguished place among fastpitch softball's coaching greats in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Hall of Fame. Miller will become just the third SEC head coach to be inducted into the annal, joining Yvette Girouard of LSU and Joyce Compton of South Carolina in December as part of

the association's 18th class.

In more than two decades of coaching softball at the Division I level at Missouri and Mississippi State, Miller has helped develop the talents of a plethora of players who have gone on to write their own success stories. Over the last 11 years, he has had the pleasure of mentoring 42 all-conference players, as well as nine all-Americans. In addition, Miller has coached two players - Barb Wright at Missouri and Lyhia McMichael at MSU - to three different conference player of the year accolades. Since 1996, 29 players have secured conference player of the week laurels under Miller as well.

Through his first five seasons in the third base box at MSU, 29 single-season and school records have been set, and three players have earned Louisville Slugger/NFCA First-Team All-American a total of four times. The most recent, sophomore Chelsea Bramlett, also earned SEC Freshman of the Year to join Courtney Bures as the only Bulldogs to receive the honor. In addition to the all-America honors, seven of Miller's players have earned all-region honors nine collective times. Bramlett and Hayle Guess earned the regional distinction last season, joining 2005 and 2006 selection Courtney Bures as the current Bulldogs with all-region laurels.

In his first season with the Maroon & White, McMichael was named a top-10 finalist for USA Softball Player of the Year. The next season she finished her senior campaign as one of the three finalists for the prestigious award after becoming the school's second multiple-time first team all-American.

Miller stresses academic excellence as much, if not more, than on the field excellence, and this is never more evident than with the 61 academic all-SEC selections at Mississippi State during his first five seasons. Since 1985, Miller has had 109 conference academic honor roll picks and, last season, Mississippi State earned nine NFCA all-America scholar-athlete selections, matching 2006 for the most ever at State. MSU boasted a 3.41 cumulative GPA, the nation's 11th-best, for the 2006-07 academic year, and this year's squad established the highest fall average in MSU athletics with a 3.45 mark.

Success with MState is nothing new for Miller, as it has followed him at every stop of his coaching career. Having posted winning records in all but two of his 25 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Miller has coached his teams to 40+-win seasons on seven occasions, with the 2004 version of the Bulldogs falling just one victory shy of number eight. His 1986 Oklahoma City squad turned in an eye-popping 50-win campaign as the Stars compiled a 50-26 mark en route to a national runner-up finish.

In only his first year at Mississippi State, Miller led the Bulldogs to a 34-30 record and

their second consecutive NCAA postseason berth - the first time the Maroon and White had achieved consecutive NCAA Regional bids in the history of its program. Furthermore, Mississippi State broke or tied eight team single season records in his first campaign in Starkville, then shattered two more the following season.

He arrived at Mississippi State after serving 15 years as the head coach at Missouri. There, he led the Tigers to a pair of Women's College World Series appearances in 1991 and 1994, five NCAA Regional appearances and compiled a 556-309 overall record. In 1991 and 1997, his squads won the overall league championship and, on three occasions, his squads have taken the league tournament title.

No stranger to success, one would think that Miller would have to have at least one favorite coaching moment in his first 25 seasons of coaching fastpitch softball.

"I don't really have a favorite moment," he said. "Every year you have a favorite moment and every year you have memorable moments - from teams that went to the World Series, to the Olympic team when they won the first gold medal, to the national team programs and the things that they have done.

"Even years when you don't win as many games as you would like, you still have memorable moments. You still have kids that you live and die

for everyday in practice and every game that they go out there and play."

The enthusiastic mentor, who turns 52 on May 25, has had his share of successes over the years. His is a resumé that includes a handful of conference and region coaching honors, as well as team successes from Women's College World Series and top 10 appearances, and international experiences in several countries, as well as on U.S. soil.

But, when it is all said and done, Miller still remains humble, each day arriving in his office well before many of his colleagues to plan out the day's, and sometimes the week's, agenda.

"In whatever you do, you're only going to get out what you put in," Miller said. "That's a key to understand and we want kids with that kind of work ethic and that kind of dedication."

Entering his 26th season as a Division I head coach, Miller, whose career victory total currently ranks 12th among active coaches in the NCAA, will carry an 850-530 record into his fifth year at Mississippi State - a job that he took the reigns of towards the end of July, 2002. Since then, he has become comfortable with a team that, he knows, will give him some more of those memorable moments he so cherishes.

"I think that there is tremendous potential here at Mississippi State," Miller said. "You have an administration that is supportive and wants you to be successful and provides you with the resources so that you can be successful.

"I think there are some tremendous athletes overall in the South. If you look at the states in which the SEC encompasses, they haven't had a lot of experience playing fastpitch softball, but they are getting more and more."

Unlike some of his counterparts in other sections of the United States, Miller - born Charles Jay on May 25, 1956, in Aurora, Ill. - was a ball fan of a different type growing up. With the Aurora Seal Masters - winners of the first two-ever world titles in men's fastpitch softball - training nearby, the young Miller often found himself emulating a star pitcher throwing out of a circle, rather than off of a mound.

His experiences as a fastpitch player on the

men's major level towards the end of his high school and throughout his college careers, unexpectedly, helped move him into the coaching world when he was completing his master's work at Purdue. Although deadset on a career in the psychology or counseling world, Miller found himself taking on pitching coach (and later head coach) duties for the Purdue women's club team in the late 70's.

"I never really thought about coaching," he said. "The faculty sponsor of Purdue's women's club team asked me if I would come out and help him with the pitchers because I told him that I had played a lot and so I did. That was in August. In October, he resigned and the players asked me if I would be their coach.

"So, that's really how I got started in coaching. I enjoyed that a lot more than working in the counseling center, so I sort of changed careers at the last minute."

Just more than three years following his informal introduction to the coaching world, Miller took on his first full-time coaching duties as an assistant at Missouri where, years later, he would eventually make a big name for himself. While in Columbia under current South Carolina coach Joyce Compton, he served primarily as the pitching coach and Missouri rattled off an impressive 107-51 overall record during the stretch – a mark which included one conference championship, two NCAA Regional appearances and an appearance in the 1983 Women's College World Series.

He received his first head coaching stint in 1984 as skipper of now-NAIA powerhouse Oklahoma City who, at the time, were Division I and looked to harvest recruits that state-powerhouses Oklahoma and Oklahoma State would grow to envy. Miller coached the Chiefs one season at the Division I level before starting Oklahoma City's dominance in the NAIA with a pair of top five finishes (2nd in 1986, 4th in 1987) in his final two seasons with the team, both of which produced District IX Coach of the Year accolades. His team's 1987 achievements earned him Southwest Region Coach of the Year honors.

"In March, during the first year that I was there, they announced that they were going to change to the NAIA the following year," said Miller of the surprise move. "I coached there for three years and we were very successful. We finished second in the nation and fourth in the nation my last two years there, and then I had an opportunity to go back to Missouri."

Although his coaching career in the Sooner state

had officially come to a close when he accepted the offer to become Missouri's sixth head coach in 1987, Miller was still reaping the benefits of the hard work in his career. While in Oklahoma City, the site of the Amateur Softball Association's Hall of Fame, he developed close contacts while working with the ASA that allowed him to draw his first international experience as a pitching coach for Netherlands Antilles in the 1987 Pan Am Games in Indianapolis.

Months later, he returned to Columbia, Mo., to find a program much different than when he left three years prior. While Mizzou had accumulated a .677 winning percentage during Miller's stay as an assistant coach, the program had struggled since, going 89-72 (.553) from 1984-1987, including a 14-18 mark the season prior to Miller's rehiring.

"It was really an opportunity to build, or to rebuild, the program there," said Miller of the opportunity to return to his roots, of sorts. "That's what we worked on doing. We went out and worked hard and tried to bring some players in that could compete at the top level, and we got back to the World Series in four years."

However, the Tigers flirted with greatness immediately, capturing either second or third in the Big Eight over the next three years before reeling off a 39-14 record in 1991 en route to both the conference regular season and tournament championships, as well as a fifth-place finish in the Women's College World Series. The transformation struck gold for Miller as well, as he was decorated with his second-straight Big Eight Coach of the Year laurels.

Miller continued his work towards greatness the following season as he led Mizzou to its second 40-win season since taking over the program (44-18 in 1988) and its best season since 1981, then churned out a 31-18 clip the following season despite losing six starters to graduation. In 1994, the Tigers finished seventh at the WCWS after filing a 40-23 record, then turned in a school-record 47 wins the following season on the way to their second-straight trip to the NCAA postseason.

Two years later, 10 years to the date following his being named Missouri's skipper, Mizzou went the distance in the conference and conference tournament for the fourth time in school history, achieving the program's best record since 1983 (47-16) and securing its fourth postseason appearance under his direction. The run earned Miller his third conference coaching honor and his first such accolade in the Big 12.

"The awards mean that you have good players," he said. "It is a reflection on the team and the kind of work and effort and commitment that your players put in and the dedication that they have to your program. I think that is where those awards come from."

Over the next four years, his Missouri teams finished each season with no less than 30 victories, making its fifth appearance in the NCAA Regionals with a 41-21 clip in 1999. Having reeled off a 556-309 record in 15 seasons as head coach of the Black and Gold, he parted ways with Columbia following the 2002 campaign to take over the reigns of the Maroon and White.

Mixed in with his collegiate success, Miller was achieving international success as well during the 90's. He was appointed to his first stint with USA Softball from 1992-96, serving on the National Team selection committee that would, ultimately, be in charge of choosing the inaugural USA Softball team to compete in 1996 Olympics in Atlanta.

Since then, he has served in various capacities with the organization, including head coaching stints of the USA Red squad that captured Gold in the 2001 U.S. Cup and the USA Elite team that took home runner-up honors at the 2002 Canada Cup and the championship of the 2003 Canada Cup. He also was an assistant coach for the USA National Team in gold medal runs at both the Pacific Rim Sports Summit and the Intercontinental Cup in 2004. He was also on the coaching staff of the USA Elite squad in its run

to a silver medal at the 2005 Canada Cup in June. In 2006, Miller was an assistant coach on the World University squad that won the gold medal in Taiwan ... In the fall, Miller led the Junior Pan American squad to a perfect 10-0 record at the Pan America qualifier, and that squad will take on the world in Poland next summer. His international success continued with the world championship won by the junior national team last summer.

"It has helped tremendously because you are working with the best coaches in the world and the best coaches in the United States obviously," he said. "It enabled me to exchange ideas, to talk about what works and what doesn't work. That's a continual process. You do that each time."

In addition to his coaching prowess, Miller is a leading authority on softball technology, having written more than 30 articles for professional publication. He most recently authored a chapter entitled "Offensive Strategy" for The Softball Coaching Bible, published by Human Kinetics Press in 2002.

In addition, he has developed four softball skills videotapes currently marketed internationally. He is also considered one of the top softball clinicians in the world, having conducted more than 100 camps and clinics in the United States, Netherlands Antilles, Italy, Czech Republic, Holland, France and Malaysia.

Associate Head Coach Annie Smith enters her 12th year as a collegiate softball coach, her sixth season at Mississippi State and her 12th as an assistant to head coach Jay Miller, officially joining the Bulldog staff on Aug. 26, 2002.

Smith's duties include, but are not limited to, hitting and defense instruction, recruiting coordination, administration and practices, travel coordination, camp co-direction, assistance in the implementing of MSU Softball's strength/conditioning program, and assisting in the fundraising and promotion of the program.

Entering his 23rd year as a collegiate softball coach, Bo Reid enters his sixth season at Mississippi State, his 12th as a Southeastern Conference coach, and his sixth alongside head coach Jay Miller, officially joining the Bulldog staff on June 22, 2000.

Reid's duties include, but are not limited to, pitching instruction, equipment and facility management, scheduling and co-coordinating camps and clinics.

"Coming into a new program, adjustment is always the toughest thing," Miller said. "He's been a tremendous help to my adjustment not only to Starkville and Mississippi State, but also to our ballclub and to our



"Coach Miller has given me a jumpstart on my softball career," Reid said. "He has given me a lot of knowledge about the game. We are a very good and a very close coaching staff and that is what makes a program successful. We're going to accomplish great things at Mississippi State."

An accomplished fastpitch hurler, Reid retired from competitive pitching in 1995, but not before leading his team to the national tournament in nine of the last 10 years of his career. A highlight of his playing stint came in 1992 when he pitched nine games in a 24-hour period, including four consecutive no-hitters.

He made his debut in the softball coaching world in 1984, working with Spartanburg Methodist as an assistant coach, spending one season before joining Alleen Hawkins' staff at Furman University. The pair worked together 11 seasons with the Paladins before making the transition to the Southeastern Conference in Athens.

During his four seasons with Georgia, Reid molded a remarkable foundation with the Red and Black pitchers. Due to his extensive work with the Bulldog battery, Reid's pitching staff ranked among the best staffs in the conference following every season of his tenure at UGA.

In his first season with Georgia, Reid's development of the Bulldog pitchers showed quickly as Georgia finished as one of the better pitching teams in the conference, tallying a 2.39 team ERA while allowing the third-fewest hits among the 11 SEC softball-playing institutions.

One of his pitchers, Natalie Price, was the only freshman to finish in the top 10 of nine statistical categories in the Southeastern Conference in 1997, including third in strikeouts and complete games. Her 792 career strikeouts currently ranks second in the conference. She also collected SEC Pitcher of the Week honors three times in 1999.

Born July 22, 1949, in Greenville, S.C., Reid is the father of two children, son, B.J. (8-26-74) and daughter, Ryan (1-12-81). He also has two granddaughters, Elizabeth and Alison. His hobbies include softball, bowling and watching and collecting movies. Reid is currently single.

players. He brings a great insight into strengths and weaknesses and areas that we need to concentrate on and work on.

"He's a great guy to work with. He knows the game very well. He's an excellent pitching coach and, in addition, not only works well with our pitchers, but also in other aspects of our program. He is just a good stabilizer for us on our staff."

In his six seasons with Mississippi State, Reid has been responsible for a pitching staff that has held its own inside the SEC, ranking in the top half of several statistical pitching categories. In his first season with the team in 2001, Reid coached a staff that turned in an impressive 36 wins, a 2.12 overall team ERA, 235 strikeouts and 13 saves.

This past season, the Bulldogs picked up 35 victories and 13 saves a year after a young staff to start the season, turned in 33 victories and 7 saves. His hurlers have routinely stepped up when facing the top competition, earning 35 victories over nationally ranked opponents since the beginning of the 2002 season.

Since his hiring, Reid's Mississippi State pitching staff has filed a respectable 2.44 ERA, fired five no-hitters and collected four conference Pitcher of the Week accolades.





In only its 12th year of existence, Southeastern Conference softball continues to grow as a national force in collegiate softball.

The Southeastern Conference qualified seven teams for the 2007 NCAA Tournament - Alabama, Florida, Georgia, LSU, Mississippi State, South Carolina and Tennessee as the conference made its 10th overall, fifth consecutive, Women's College World Series appearance.


A record five teams advanced to the Super Regional rounds and Tennessee led the charge all the way to the Championship series of the World Series. History was made as the Lady Vols became the first SEC team to advance to the Championship Series and was part of the most-viewed WCWS game on TV. As the runners-up, Tennessee finished the season ranked No. 2, the highest ever by an SEC team.

Tennessee was the SEC Regular Season Champion as LSU claimed the SEC Tournament Championship. The Lady Vols' Ralph and Karen Weekly were named SEC Co-Coach of the Year, while India Chiles earned SEC Player of the Year honors. Four-time All-American Monica Abbott of Tennessee earned SEC Pitcher of the Year, while teammate Lindsay Schutzler earned SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors. Mississippi State's Chelsea Bramlett was tabbed SEC Freshman of the Year.

With seven teams, the SEC trailed only the PAC-10, with eight, that advanced to the 2007 NCAA Tournament.

Softball came under the auspices of the Southeastern Conference in the 1996-97 season. Since that time, nine different conference teams have

made appearances in the NCAA Championship, including four teams earning Women's College World Series berths - one by South Carolina in the inaugural season, Alabama in 2000 and 2005, LSU in 2001 and 2004 and Tennessee in 2005, 2006 and 2007.

Eight teams (Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, Mississippi State, South Carolina and Tennessee) have made Top 25 appearances and four teams have climbed into the Top 10 (Alabama, Georgia, LSU and Tennessee) of the NFCA/USA Today Poll. At least one SEC team has been ranked in the poll

each week since the inception of SEC Softball. In 1999 alone, SEC teams made 29 appearances in the poll.

South Carolina is the flagship team of the league with a rich history in softball dating back 33 seasons. The Gamecocks have made 15 NCAA Regional and three Women's College World Series appearances.

Mississippi State played softball for five seasons during the 1980's before resuming the sport when it was added to the SEC. Tennessee added softball in 1995-96, one year before its inception in the SEC. Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU and Ole Miss began softball programs in 1996-97 to give the league 11 representatives (Vanderbilt does not sponsor softball).

The 1999 season was the first in which the conference was eligible for an automatic berth to the NCAA Championships.

As the sport continues to grow in competitiveness and popularity, the SEC has had five different regular season champions and four different conference tournament champions.

- 2007 marks the first time that three SEC Teams have been ranked in the top six heading into the NCAA Tournament.
- Tennessee's No. 2 ranking in the final USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll is the highest finish by any SEC school. Prior to the 2007 season, the highest ranking any SEC team has been in the final USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll is third. LSU tied for third in 2001, and was ranked third in 2004. In 2005, Tennessee finished the season with a No. 3 ranking.
- The SEC has had three teams finish the season ranked in the Top 10 twice. In 2007, Tennessee finished No. 2, Alabama was No. 9 and LSU was No. 10. In 2005 Tennessee finished the season with a No. 3 ranking, Alabama was No. 7 and Georgia was No. 9.







Langley, who amassed a 34-78 (.304) mark as State's volleyball coach from 1983-85, led the Bulldogs to their first winning season in 1985, then guided the Maroon and White to another winning campaign in 1986 before the discontinuation of the program.

KATHY ARENDSSEN

1997-02 • 220-160 (.579)



Having reintroduced the sport to State's varsity program in 1997, Arendsen led the Bulldogs to the championship game of the 1998 SEC Tournament before a 44-win campaign in 2000 helped the Bulldogs secure their first postseason berth. Arendsen coached 14 all-SEC and 12 all-American

athletes in her six-year career in Starkville. A 13-time ASA all-American as a player, she also had 48 of her players named to the SEC academic honor roll during her tenure.

JAY MILLER

2003-present • 176-142 (.553)



Having helped State secure NCAA postseason bids in four of his first five seasons in Starkville, Miller currently ranks as the NCAA's 12th-winningest active coach and secured his 885th career victory during the 2007 season. He has coached three all-Americans at MSU, with three of his play-

ers earning SEC Athlete and SEC Freshman of the Year accolades. Miller will be inducted into the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2008.

ATHLETIC Excellence


Mississippi State student-athletes have been achievers on the playing fields and off them. For every Bulldog winning all-SEC or All-America honors, another earns recognition for academic achievement. Players are coached to greatness throughout the MSU athletic program.

Bulldog catcher EDWARD EASLEY (R) was named the winner of the 2007 Coleman Company Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher. Bench (L) presented Easley with the award. Easley also won the 2007 Cellular South Ferris Trophy as Mississippi's top collegiate baseball player.

IYHIA McMICHAEL, who concluded her career in 2004, is the only two-time SEC Softball Athlete of the Year in league history.

LAURENT MIQUELARD (L) and JOC SIMMONS won the NCAA men's tennis doubles national championship in 1994.

LAWRENCE ROBERTS was the SEC Player of the Year in 2004 and a national finalist for the Wooden Award, given annually to college basketball's top player.



Great Players

As a relief pitcher with the Boston Red Sox, **JONATHAN PAPELBON** was named to the MLB All-Star game in each of his first two seasons.

JERIOUS NORWOOD concluded his football career in 2005 as the school's single-game and career rushing leader. He was named winner of the Conerly Trophy as the state's top college football player, was selected to play in the Senior Bowl, and was taken by the Atlanta Falcons in the NFL Draft.

LATOYA THOMAS concluded her career in 2003 as a two-time SEC Player of the Year and became only the sixth player in NCAA Division I history to be named a four-time Kodak All-America.

TIFFANY McWILLIAMS won the NCAA national championship in the 1500 meter run in 2003 and '04, and the national title in the indoor mile in 2004.

ATHLETIC Excellence

State's coaches care for their student-athletes and the school's sports programs. Each has a passion for their specialty, experience as a player and coach, and expertise to instruct at the highest levels. Their goal is to coach champions on the field and mold productive college graduates from the university's classroom.

SYLVESTER CROOM was named head coach at MSU in December 2003, an announcement that brought immediate national attention to the Bulldog football program.

CHRISTI SANDERS (back left) has the longest, consecutive coaching reign of any head coach at State, with 20 seasons at the helm of the women's golf program. She has twice been named SEC Coach of the Year (1990, 2000).

RON POLK has guided six MSU squads to the College World Series, including the 2007 Diamond Dogs and 20 teams to NCAA regional showings.

RICK STANSBURY'S men's basketball teams have averaged better than 20 wins per year under his guidance and have participated in postseason play seven times in his nine years.

NEIL MACDONALD is the only head coach to guide the MState soccer program to an SEC Tournament appearance in his first season (2004).



On Nov. 10, 2006, SHARON FANNING became the 29th NCAA Division I women's basketball head coach to reach the 500-win plateau. Fanning is also the winningest basketball coach in Lady Bulldog history.

Great Teachers



CLAY HOMAN, a second-team all-SEC performer during his MState playing career, has led the men's golf program to 32 top 10 finishes in four years.



TRACY LANE has the most wins of any head women's tennis coach in MSU history. She directed the 2005 Lady Bulldogs to an SEC Western Division title and has guided MSU to four NCAA Championship berths in her 11 seasons at the State helm.



JAY MILLER is one of the most respected coaches around the country, and a key contributor to USA Softball in various capacities. He has directed the State softball program to four NCAA postseason appearances in his five seasons.



TINA SEALS returned to her alma mater as head volleyball coach in 2004. The school's first All-SEC volleyball performer guided the Bulldogs in 2006 to their most wins since 1996 and a school-record for SEC wins.



Now in his second decade as the head coach of the men's and women's track teams, **AL SCHMIDT** has coached three MState athletes to national titles.

ATHLETIC Excellence

MSU has played in the SEC Football Championship Game, the basketball Final Four, the baseball College World Series, and in numerous NCAA national title events since 1996. The last decade has brought overall achievement unmatched at State, and each new generation adds more hardware to the school's trophy cases.




The 1999 Maroon football team won its first eight games of the season, amassed 10 victories for just the second time in school history, and defeated Clemson in the Peach Bowl at Atlanta. Quarterback Wayne Madkin (above), State's all-time leading passer, was named the bowl game's Most Valuable Offensive Player.

State won the SEC Western Division title in 1998 and held a fourth-quarter lead on eventual national champion Tennessee in the league championship game at the Georgia Dome. The Bulldogs' appearance in the championship game garnered the school a berth in the 1999 Cotton Bowl.




MSU's 1998 men's tennis team was one of two Bulldog squads that reached the NCAA semifinals, losing to perennial national champion Stanford. The '98 team was one of 10 State net teams that earned NCAA Sweet 16 berths from 1991-2001.



State's soccer team captured the 2001 SEC Western Division crown, the first SEC championship of any kind by an MSU women's team. That title came in just the sport's seventh year of existence on the campus.

Great Teams




The "thunder and lightning" duo of Rafael Palmeiro and Will Clark guided the Bulldog baseball program to SEC regular season and tournament titles, and to a national third-place finish at the College World Series in 1985. The '85 team's finish was the best of MSU's seven CWS squads.



The 1995-96 Mississippi State men's basketball team earned the school's first-ever NCAA Final Four appearance after claiming the program's first SEC Tournament title and winning the SEC Western Division crown.



The Lady Bulldog basketball team has gone to eight postseason appearances under Head Coach Sharon Fanning, including four NCAA Tournament appearances.



The MState men's golf team captured the school's second-consecutive SEC Tournament title in 1997 and participated in NCAA regional competition for just the second time in school history.

ATHLETIC Excellence

Mississippi State athletes play in some of the nation's finest facilities. Almost every Bulldog competition site has either been constructed or renovated in the last 15 years. During that time along, more than \$60 million in facility enhancements have been made.



DAVIS WADE STADIUM AT SCOTT FIELD: Near-sellout crowds have become the norm at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field, where the Bulldogs have played before masses reaching 85 percent of stadium capacity. Since the 2000 season when expansion and renovation projects gave the nation's second-oldest stadium a gleaming new look, crowds have grown by nearly 30 percent.



PITTS TENNIS CENTRE: Considered among the finest tennis facilities in the collegiate ranks, the modern, six-court, 1,000-seat A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre recently completed its 24th year serving the men's and women's programs. Recent enhancements at the facility include new locker areas and concession stands (1998) and a permanent press box (2004).

**W.O. SPENCER STADIUM/
CARL MADDOX TRACK:** Co-named in honor of a two-time Mississippi State Olympian and a former MSU athletic director, the W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track has served as host to the Southeastern Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships three times since 1985, joining Tennessee as the most frequent host for that event during that time.



DUDY NOBLE FIELD, POLK-DEMENT STADIUM: One of the nation's leaders in baseball season ticket sales and attendance, Dudy Noble Field, Polk-Dement Stadium still holds the nation's on-campus single-game attendance mark — 14,991. With a seating capacity of more than 7,000 and more space in the world-famous outfield, *Sports Illustrated* magazine named the park, the "Best Place To Watch College Baseball" in a 1997 issue.

NEWELL GRISSOM BUILDING:

The 12,000-square foot, hardwood-floored Newell-Grissom Building serves as the home for Mississippi State's volleyball program and serves as a practice facility for both of the school's basketball programs. A state-of-the-art heating and air conditioning system was installed in 2004.

Great Places



HUMPHREY COLISEUM: Season ticket sales records and all-time attendance marks have also been set over the past decade by Bulldog and Lady Bulldog basketball teams in the Humphrey Coliseum, the state's largest on-campus basketball arena. The latest addition to the facility was a \$1.8 million, center-hung, four-sided video scoreboard and jumbotron screen installed in 2004.

MSU GOLF COURSE:

Nominated by *Golfweek* and *Golf Digest* magazines as one of the premier public golf courses in the United States, Mississippi State's championship University Golf Course is the home to the men's and women's programs. The 18-hole course was recently furnished with a 5,000-square-foot clubhouse, complete with locker areas, snack bar, golf shop and classroom.



MSU SOCCER FIELD: Built in 1995, the lighted Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldog women one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast, a 114-yard long, 72-yard wide regulation NCAA Championship field. The lush turf is Mississippi Pride grass, developed by researchers on the MSU campus.



MSU SOFTBALL FIELD: Constructed in 1997, the Mississippi State Softball Field has undergone almost constant improvement at the northern-most point of campus. Lights were added to the facility in 1998, brick work was added to the dugouts two years later and, in 2001, additional batting cages were built. In 2005, softball moved into a new locker, training and meeting facility adjacent to the park.



BRYAN BUILDING: The state-of-the-art John H. Bryan Athletic Administration Building is the crown jewel of MSU's expansion projects of the last decade. Opened in 1996, this showcase facility is named for longtime Bulldog friend and supporter John H. Bryan Sr., and houses athletic administration, football, ticket, athletic development and media relations offices.


MSU student-athletes are prepared for life after their collegiate careers come to an end. Former State athletes succeed professionally in both sports and business.



ERICK DAMPIER led the Bulldog basketball program to back-to-back NCAA Tournament bids in 1995 and '96. Now an 11-year NBA veteran, he helped lead the Dallas Mavericks to an NBA Finals appearance in 2006.



TYRONE KEYS (center) starred for the MSU football team from 1977-80, won Super Bowl XX with the Chicago Bears, and is founder and president of All Sports Community Service, a Tampa-based firm that assists high-risk youth.



SAM NICHOLS lettered four years for the MState football team (1973-76) and is currently a Colonel in the United States Army.

BAILEY HOWELL, who still ranks second on the school's all-time basketball scoring list, enjoyed a 12-year career in the NBA and was elected to the Basketball Hall of Fame in 1997.

Great Alumni

ROSA MARIELLA (JIMINEZ) MAHAN was an ITA All-Academic Scholar women's tennis player for State in 1988, and is Senior VP and Regional Manager for Central America, the Caribbean, and Northern South America for Prisma Energy International in Houston, Texas.

BUCK SHOWALTER, currently a senior advisor to baseball operations for the Cleveland Indians, was an all-America baseball player at MSU in 1977 and has managed three clubs in the major leagues, including the Texas Rangers.

BOBBY THIGPEN helped MSU baseball to the College World Series in 1985 and still holds the Major League record for saves in a season (57 in 1990 with the Chicago White Sox).



Academics

While the MSU athletic program has experienced success both on the field and court, Bulldog and Lady Bulldog athletes are excelling where it counts the most — in the classroom. During the 2006-07 school year, 153 MState athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll honors.



Featuring 2005 graduates (L-R) Shane Power, Ontario Harper, Wesley Morgan and Branden Vincent, coach Rick Stansbury's Bulldogs lead all SEC schools with a total of 20 SEC Academic Honor Roll recipients in men's basketball over the past five seasons.



Burke Masters was a two-time First Team GTE-CoSIDA Academic All-American (1989 and 1990), four-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection and the 1990 Boyd McWhorter SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.



A two-time Academic all-SEC selection, Kate Jaspers racked up numerous academic awards while at MSU. She was twice named ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American, and a three-time NFCA Scholar Athlete All-America. In 2004, Jaspers was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, as well as the CoSIDA Academic Player of the Year.



Annemarie Pimentel was a four-year soccer letterwinner. While at State, she was a three-time Academic all-SEC selection, while being named to the GTE and Verizon Academic All-District teams. Her career culminated in being selected the 2000 SEC Boyd McWhorter Post-Graduate Scholarship winner, awarded to the student-athlete who best demonstrates excellence in athletics, academics and community service.



WAY

Traditions

Mississippi State is deep with tradition. From Bully to cowbells and the maroon and white, evidence of *The Bulldog Way* are found deep in the heart of every State graduate.

The most unique and certainly the most resounding symbol of MSU tradition is the cowbell. Cowbells decorate homes and offices of MSU alumni, and are passed down through generations of Bulldog fans. Although banned from SEC games since 1974, the ruling has not damaged the cowbell's historical importance.

MSU's athletic teams are called the Bulldogs, a name earned and maintained over the decades by the tough, tenacious play of student-athletes wearing the maroon and white. The official school mascot is an American Kennel Club registered English Bulldog, given the inherited title of "Bully." A costumed Bully often makes his presence known at various athletic events.



MISSISSIPPI State

MSU has the largest enrollment in the state of Mississippi. Founded as a land-grant institution, its grass, flowers and trees are as prevalent as buildings, sidewalks and parking lots. Large enough to sport diversity in all areas, the university still maintains a warm, friendly atmosphere.

Ruby Hall, a residence hall with the largest single room size in university history, opened in August 2006. A co-residential, 160,000-square-foot, three-story freshman hall, Ruby is located at the north end of campus, in convenient proximity to the Colvard Union, the Perry Cafeteria, Mitchell Memorial Library, the Sanderson Center and all athletic facilities. Ruby Hall offers students the latest in technology, including Ethernet access, full wireless internet coverage, a refrigerator and microwave, and free cable with HBO in each room.



The Colvard Union is a popular meeting place for MSU students. Whether working on a group project, enjoying the food court, or simply relaxing, the student union is one of the campus' main meeting places.



The Chapel of Memories and Carillon Tower were built with bricks from Old Main Dormitory, the largest residence hall in the country when constructed, later destroyed by fire in 1959. The Chapel of Memories, which hosts numerous weddings each year, is one of the most-recognized landmarks on campus.

The Drill Field, located squarely in the center of campus, shows the expanse of greenery for which the campus is famous.



The People's University



When built in the 1920s, Perry Cafeteria was the largest dining hall in the country. The 300-foot long, Gothic style interior is one of the most beautiful buildings on the campus. It has accommodations for 600 students, faculty and staff and serves as the dining hall for MSU athletes.

The \$19 million, 150,000-square foot Sanderson Center recreation complex opened to students in 1996. The state-of-the-art facility offers recreational opportunities in aquatics, fitness and aerobics, strength and conditioning, and intramural sports.



Barnes & Noble opened on the MSU campus in August 2006 and features a world-class bookstore, apparel and gift shop, and café.

DR. ROBERT H. FOGLESONG
University President
West Virginia, 1968

Doc Foglesong was born and raised in Mingo County, West Virginia. He's the son of a steam fitter on the railroad and a first-grade teacher. He attended West Virginia University and eventually earned his bachelor's, master's, and doctorate in chemical engineering—and married his former English teacher—Mary Thrasher Foglesong of Sistersville, West Virginia.

Currently, Foglesong is the President of Mississippi State University—a land-grant school of more than 16,500 students committed to excellence in teaching, research, and service. His vision is for the university to be the most respected land-grant school in the Southeast. He also is President and Executive Director of the Appalachian Leadership and Education Foundation, an organization committed to finding, mentoring, and developing young men and women who will be the next generation of leadership across Appalachia.

Foglesong has been designated by the President of the United States as the Co-Chairman of the Joint US - Russia Commission on POWs/MIAs. He is also a Director on the Board of Massey Energy and a Director on the Board of the Michel Baker Corp.

Foglesong previously was a four-star general in the United States Air Force. He flew fighters, was a senior leader in organizations equivalent to companies ranking 9th, 110th, and 430th on the Fortune 500 List, and worked directly with the most senior national leaders including congressional members, cabinet members, and heads of state.

Foglesong received numerous awards for leadership. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, has written more than 60 publications that cover a range of topics, and has an honorary Doctorate of Strategic Intelligence. He likes to run and collect slide rules and blow torches.

During his career as athletic director at Mississippi State, Larry Templeton has guided the sports program to unparalleled success and overseen accomplishments never attained in the near-100 years the school played on athletic fields and courts prior to his tenure. He has overseen achievement by State student-athletes in the classroom and in competition with the nation's premier programs. And he has done all that while operating within the department's now \$30 million budget.

Mississippi State competes for championships in every sport program, its athletes continue to excel in the classroom, and the department has operated in the black while expanding its varsity athletic sport program and drastically improving its facilities. Templeton has overseen all that and more as the head of the program.

On the playing field, the decade of the '90s saw virtually every State sport establish a best-ever finish. The start of the new millennium has been no different with MSU sports teams having qualified for postseason play 51 times during the past seven seasons; a school-record 12 did so in 2004-05.

But State's student-athletes are not just succeeding on the playing field. MSU's men's and women's athletes recorded the highest combined grade point average during the 2005-06 academic year in the 18 years in which student-athlete grades have been tracked. In 14 of the last 16 years, the Bulldog football team has been one of just a handful of schools cited by the American Football Coaches Association for having a graduation rate exceeding 70 percent. MSU is the only school in the SEC to make that list with that much frequency. In spring 2007, exactly one-half of all scholarship student-athletes at Mississippi State earned a grade point average of 3.00 or higher.

MSU has produced the SEC's Male and Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year three times each during Templeton's tenure. And over the past seven years, State is second among league schools in number of Academic all-SEC selections in the sports in which MSU competes.

Templeton oversaw Mississippi State's move to come into compliance with the SEC's Gender Equity plan, adding women's soccer and softball to the school's varsity sport menu. The first season of soccer was in 1995, while softball began competition in 1997. Since that time, the soccer team has won the SEC Western Division title (2001) and the softball team has never had a losing season and has qualified for NCAA postseason play six of the last eight years.

And for the 20th year in a row this past year, the MSU athletic program joined just a small group of NCAA Division I schools nation-wide to finish in the black financially at year's end.

Templeton's work also stretches far from the Starkville campus. He has served as chairman of the SEC's athletic directors since 1990. He is serving a second term on the prestigious NCAA Baseball Committee, currently serving as that committee's chairman. He is a former member of the NCAA Championship Committee, the NCAA Management Council and the NCAA Bowl Certification Committee.

Templeton is married to the former Linda Jo Nichols. They have a son, Brian, who received his second degree (landscape architecture) at Mississippi State in May 2002. A second son, Stephen, received his doctorate from Mississippi State in August 2002, and a daughter, Nici, is an attorney in Columbia, S.C. Granddaughters Ella Grace and Addison McSwain Comer, and Eliana Xiaojong Nichols live in Columbia, S.C., and Chattanooga, Tenn., respectively.

A veteran of 12 years in athletic administration at MSU and a former Lady Bulldog athlete, Ann Carr was named the university's associate athletic director for women's sports in June 2006.

Carr is in her second stint within the State athletic department following seven years as Assistant Athletic Director for Student Life. In that position, she worked with the personal development of MSU's student-athletes in addition to continuing her prior responsibilities as academic counselor for the Bulldog football team.

Carr serves as the director of the department's Life Skills program, which includes the support systems and career programs for all MSU student-athletes, and its CHAMPS program (Challenging Athletes' Minds for Personal Success).

As SWA, Carr will oversee the operation and supervision of MSU's women's sport program. Hired in 1993 as an assistant director in the athletic academic office, she returned full-time to MState in 1999 following a one-year stay in a similar capacity at the University of Southern Mississippi.

A native of Brookhaven, Miss., Carr was a four-year letter winner on the Mississippi State women's basketball team (1986-90). When Carr finished her women's basketball playing career, she ranked first on the career leaders list in free-throw percentage, shooting 75.8 percent over a four-year span. She also ranked 12th on the career points list, having scored 762 points in her tenure, averaging 8.3 points per contest. In rebounding, Carr brought down 597 boards (6.5 per game) to finish her career sixth on the all-time list in rebounds and rebounding average. She also finished her career holding the individual record in most three-point field goals made (five) in a single game.

A 1990 graduate of State, she later earned her master's degree in counseling from the institution in 1992.

Mississippi State and USA Softball

Since first really making a name for itself at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, representing the United States on the softball field has been a goal of many players to come through the collegiate ranks.

Many players who have donned the Maroon and White for Mississippi State have aspired to one day wear the Red, White and Blue while hustling, diving and sliding for the United States.

Since softball became an Olympic sport in 1996, the Bulldogs have contributed greatly to the success that the U.S. has enjoyed on the international stage.

USA Softball was created by the Amateur Softball Association to train, equip and promote the various national teams to competition both in the United States and on the mainland.

Bulldog head coach Jay Miller plays a vital role in helping guide and teach the athletes who are selected to carry on the rich tradition of success the United States has enjoyed for many years. Miller currently serves as a member of the U.S. National Team coaching staff.

Miller got his first taste of international coaching experience in 1987 as the pitching coach for the Netherlands Antilles' Pan-Am Games team. He joined the USA Softball coaching ranks in 1992 as a member of the USA Softball National Team Selection Committee, which was responsible for selecting the teams that compete in various international competitions, and he has served with the program ever since.

Miller has also enjoyed his share of success on the field for the U.S. at the international level. Just last summer he guided the United States Junior National Team that ventured to

The Netherlands and returned to the mainland with the 2007 Junior World Championship. In 2006 he coached the junior national team to the Pan American Qualifier title, securing the team a berth in the Pan-Am Games.

Throughout his numerous journeys with the national team program, Miller has had the opportunity to coach a trio of Bulldogs on the international stage. In 2006 he assisted Michigan head coach Carol Hutchins on the USA's World University Games team. That team included senior Bulldog shortstop Courtney Bures, who had earned NFCA All-Region accolades a year removed from claiming SEC Freshman of the Year and first team All-America honors.

Bures' selection to the United States' World



University Games team continues a rich tradition that previously included fellow all-Americans Iyhia McMichael and Kellie Wilkerson. Both competed extensively on various U.S. squads following the completion of MSU careers which saw them establish numerous school records.

Wilkerson, a four-time all-SEC selection, has seen extensive action on the international stage, competing with the 1999 junior national team, the USA Elite National Team, and the



U.S. National Team in 2005 following a collegiate career in which she still rates as MSU's lone four-time all-American

McMichael played on Miller's Elite squad that captured the 2003 Canada Cup. The two-time all-American clinched the title for the Americans, hitting a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 14th inning against Australia after Miller's squad knocked off the U.S. National Team in the semifinal.

Both players currently play in the National Pro Fastpitch league, as McMichael was the top selection for the Akron Racers who won a league title in 2005 after her game-winning home run against the Chicago Bandits. For McMichael, the successes professionally and at the international level are a continuation of her outstanding MSU career which included a pair of SEC Player of the Year honors.

Michelle Gates and Keri McCallum earned the program's first U.S. team selections since the program returned in 1997. The duo, who led State to the SEC Tournament finals in 1998 and the program's first NCAA regional appearance in 2000, were both invited by USA Softball to the Olympic Festival in 1998 and again in 1999.

Mississippi State Softball in the Professional Ranks

For more than a decade, fastpitch softball players have had the opportunity to continue their playing careers at the professional level through the Women's Professional Softball League and, currently, National Pro Fastpitch.


NPF is currently enjoying unprecedented success through regularly-televised games on ESPN and ESPN2 and rapidly-growing fan attendance. Since returning to the playing field, Mississippi State softball has played an integral role in the growth of the professional league dating back to the development of the WPSL.

The Bulldogs' impact on the professional league began with Autumn Anderson and Keri McCallum being drafted by the WPSL. Since then, eight other MSU alumni have gone on to compete in the WPSL or the NPF.

In its first season as NPF, the Akron Racers utilized the No. 1 overall senior draft pick to select former Bulldog all-American Lyhia McMichael.

Her former teammate, Kellie Wilkerson, was drafted by the league's New York/New Jersey Juggernaut. Both players have since captured a league title, as McMichael led the Racers to the 2005 crown a year after Wilkerson helped the Juggernaut to the 2004 championship.

Since entering the league, both McMichael and Wilkerson have consistently topped the NPF leaderboard in numer-



ous offensive categories. The duo has also been tabbed to multiple NPF All-Star teams, and McMichael claimed the 2004 National Pro Fastpitch Most Valuable Player Award after leading the league in batting average (.339) and runs scored (34) and ranking third overall in home runs (four) and doubles (12).

Wilkerson finished immediately behind McMichael in the hitting title race, batting .331 with a league fourth-best 20 RBI while guiding the Juggernaut to the Cowles Cup which is presented annually to the league champion.

The very next season McMichael experienced the thrill of hoisting the championship trophy after she hit the game-winning home run off USA national team member Jennie Finch to clinch the title series for the Racers. That season McMichael and Wilkerson, who had moved to the New England Riptide, both finished among the top offensive players in the league.

Wilkerson concluded the year second in batting average after hitting .435. McMichael continued to solidify her place among the league's greats, ranking fifth with a .400 average and hitting 11 home runs which ranked right behind USA national team member Crystl Bustos for tops in the league and for the Racers.

Former Bulldog hurlers Melissa Massey and Kasey Whitehead joined McMichael on the Racers for a season, and several other former MSU standouts completed in the professional ranks in either NPF or the WPSL.


Anderson, a 1998 NFCA second team all-region selection in the circle, was selected with the ninth overall pick by the Durham Dragons in the 1999 WPSL draft. A year later, McCallum, MSU's first four-time all-SEC selection and a two-

time NFCA all-region winner, was selected with the 10th overall pick by the Tampa Bay Firestix. McCallum's former teammates, Michelle Gates and Karrie Rider, also enjoyed stellar careers in the professional softball ranks. Gates, who earned two all-region accolades playing third base for the Bulldogs, actually teamed with Rider for the Ohio Pride who lost in the 2000 WPSL championship series to the Florida Wahoos.


