Office hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays.

CREDENTIALS: Requests for press/photo credentials should be faxed or mailed on official letterhead to the Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office (FAX 662-325-3654) at least 48 hours prior to the event. Since space is limited, accomodations are on a priority basis: daily newspapers, originating radio and television stats, national weekly or monthly publications, electronic media outlets, local and regional television crews. Priority is granted to members of the media who cover Mississippi State on a regular basis, and to visiting media members. At the MSU Soccer Field, media credentials will be available for pickup in the press box. Only working media with proper credentials will be allowed access to the press area.

PHOTO REGULATIONS: Photo passes will be issued only to accredited photographers on assignment. Photographers may shoot from designated areas outside of the fences of the field and within the stadium. The Mississippi State Athletic Department adheres to NCAA photography policies and reserves all commercial and non-commercial rights to the use of film, videotape and still photographs of its athletic events and facilities.

MSU SOCCER FIELD: The MSU Soccer Field is an on-campus facility located on the corner of Collegeview Drive and University Drive. With a seating capacity of 500, the complex featues a newly-built press box that accommodates media, radio and video. The media facilty is equipped with lines for hi-speed internet, as well as telephone access which can be ordered through Mississippi State Information Technology Services. The press box telephone number is (662) 325-0905.

PARKING: Parking for the media and general public is located directly behind the grandstand area of the MSU Soccer Field. The parking lot located directly behind McArthur Hall is reserved for players, officials and game

SERVICES: The Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office will provide a complete box score and play-by-play of each game. Programs containing rosters and game notes on each team will also be provided to the working media. An automatic facsimile machine is available in the Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations offices in the Bryan Building and the Humphrey Coliseum.



TELEPHONES: Telephone service can be ordered for the press box area though MSU Information Technology Services. The MSU Soccer Field press box telephone number is (66/2) 325-0905. Any special requests must be made in advance through the Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office at (66/2) 325-7556. These requests should be submitted at least two weeks in advance to the media relations office on official letterhead.

INTERVIEW POLICY: The Mississippi State Soccer team is scheduled to practice between 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. daily during the 2008 season. All practices are open to the general public. Members of the working media are invited to attend all practices at the MSU Soccer Field. Interviews must be conducted before or after practice. Requests should be made at least 24 hours in advance to ensure availability.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: Following a 10-minute cooling off period, head coach Neil Macdonald and/or requested players will be available on the playing surface of the MSU soccer Field. The opponent head coach and/or players will also be available on the field. Please make those interview requests through the visiting soccer contact.

ARCHIVAL INFORMATION: The Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office maintains information on all current student-athletes, as well as historical information on previous student-athletes and the program in general. For information, interviews, photo shoots and/or file photos, please call, stop by our office or fax a request.



ome to the Mississippi State women's soccer team since 1995, the Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldogs one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast.

Located on the northside of the Mississippi State University campus, the MSU Soccer Field is situated in the heart of the University's impressive physical plant. It joins W.O. Spencer Stadium (track and field), Dudy-Noble Field/Polk Dement Stadium (baseball), the MSU Softball Field and the A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre to give Mississippi State one of the finest Olympic sport venues in collegiate athletics.

The facility features a main grandstand area which will accomodate more than 500 people with opportunities for expansion in the future. New to the facility is a 2,600 square-foot brick facility which will house a concession stand, men's and women's restrooms and a spacious press box. The press facility is divided into four separate work areas, with each equipped with hi-spped internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team video personnel. The MSU Soccer Field features an electronic scoreboard and covered dugouts for participating teams.

Hailed as one of the top playing surfaces in the Southeastern Conference, the field stretches 114 yards long and 72 yards wide. The regulation NCAA Championship field features Mississippi Pride grass - developed by researchers on the Mississippi State campus - making it home to

one of the finest playing surfaces in the country. A grounds crew, supervised by groundskeeper Bart Prather, is responsible for the field maintenance of the Mississippi State Soccer Field.

To reflect the strong commitment to constant improvement on the field, the Mississippi State locker facilities have undergone a drastic renovation over the course of the past three years. Custom-made wooden lockers complete with spacious storage areas, along with a 52" color television and brand new carpets, have been installed to give the facility a championship feel.

Lights were added just after the conclusion of the 2002 campaign, equipping the facility for evening competition and giving it an added amenity that can only translate into better atmospheres.

In its 11 seasons at the MSU Soccer Field, the Mississippi State

women's program has posted a 55-51-3 (.518) overall record and, in 1996, tallied a programbest 12-2 record at home, including a 9-0 mark against non-conference foes. Mississippi State has also shut out its opponent 32 times in front of its home fans.

The program's improvement can be felt with the size of the home crowds as well. In 2004, Mississippi State established a new program high for average and total attendance as a programigh 4,411 fans made their way to 10 Bulldog home dates (441 avg.). Of the top 10 MSU Soccer Field attendance marks, seven were set over the course of the past five seasons, including a stand-

2008 PREVIEW

Last season the Mississippi State soccer team had a young, inexperienced squad that made tremendous strides during the 2007 season.

The Bulldogs lost two starters from that team — leading goal scorer Treena Ferguson and forward Jessica Davis — who combined to score nine goals and three assists in leading the Bulldogs to six victories.

The 2008 edition of the Maroon and White brings back 13 goals and 17 assists, but will once again look to the defense to create a solid foundation for attack opportunities.

Last season's freshmen earned significant minutes, and they expect to contribute even more with that year of Division I play under their belt.

Neil Macdonald's squad is one of the most experienced that he's had during his five-year career. Six seniors return, and they have demonstrated the best leadership ability of the head coach's tenure in Starkville. The team also includes seven juniors, making for 13 upperclassmen who will be counted on in striving for State's first SEC Tournament berth since 2004, Macdonald's first year at the helm.

That run to the postseason could also hinge on how well a group of 10 freshmen adapt to the collegiate level. Macdonald has been very impressed with the newcomers during preseason training, and he sees many of them making significant contributions to the

squad during their rookie seasons.

The annual preseason poll of the conference coaches placed the Bulldogs sixth in the Western Division. State was predicted in the bottom of the division a year ago and ended up finishing fourth, and this year's squad hopes to build on last season's fourth-place finish after dropping several close matches.

This year's schedule is another challenging slate for the squad. The team will face seven teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament a year ago, including Georgetown as part of the George Mason Tournament in Fairfax, Va.

After opening the last two seasons with four straight road matches, the 2008 slate opens in the friendly confines of the MSU Soccer Field with Mississippi Valley State followed by the program's first on-campus tournament, the Bulldog Classic.

Following non-conference matchups with Nicholls State,

South Alabama, Memphis and Southern Mississippi, the Bull-

dogs open the SEC slate with home match-ups with reigning SEC West champion LSU and Arkansas.

State then hits the road to challenge Alabama and NCAA participant Auburn before making the Eastern Division trek to face South Carolina and 2007 SEC champion Florida.

MSU's schedule sets up well for a late run at a tournament berth as the Bulldogs host four of their last five matches, with the one exception being a trip to Lexington to face Kentucky.



The front line could be the most inexperienced group on the squad this season, but it is not an area lacking in talent.

Junior **Katelyn Graben** anchors the unit and returns as the team's leading goal scorer after netting a career-best five shots a year ago.

Fellow junior Ashley Hood looks to have a break-out season in her third season on campus. The Huntsville, Ala., product battled injuries a year ago to notch three points on a goal and assist, and if healthy, Macdonald believes she could be a potent option on the attack.

"Ashley's had a rough ride the past two seasons with injuries," the

big things from her this season. If she can stay healthy, she can create a lot of opportunities and score some goals for us." State will deploy an attacking midfielder

Bulldog head coach said. "We are expecting

State will deploy an attacking midfielder some this season, and that role is expected to be filled by fifth-year senior **Kevyn Shelledy** with help from freshman **Kim Pettit**. Shelledy looks to close with a career year after having her 2007 campaign sidelined by injury. Having Shelledy's experience at the position will help give Pettit the opportunity to make the transition to the collegiate level.

Fellow freshmen **Taylor Turnipseed** and **Tarah Henderson** add depth at the position, and both could utilize their exceptional athletic ability and speed to create scoring opportunities for the Bulldogs.

"Kim, Taylor and Tarah give us good depth up front," Macdonald said. "Their quickness will help put pressure on opponents' back lines."

Another newcomer, freshman **Serena Prendergast**, has impressed the coaching staff with her ability despite being sidelined most of the preseason by illness.

MIDFIELDERS

The midfield was one area coming into 2008 that Macdonald and his staff had to strengthen. With a nice mix of experience and newcomers, Macdonald believes the midfield has grown tremendously in mobility and athleticism.

"We have added some speed and mobility to the midfield this season," Macdonald

said. "That should help us transition faster this season."

Leanna Baldner anchors the midfield following a stellar freshman season in which she logged 16 starts and played in all 19 games. State's main ball-winner in the middle of the field, Baldner adds scoring potential after landing two shots in the back of the net a year ago.

Junior **Heather Buttrey** also brings the ability to win balls at midfield, and her versatility allows her to also play on the back line.

Buttrey provides a solid defensive presence in the middle along with senior captain Mariclaire Fancher. Fancher a Greenwood, Miss., product, plays an aggressive style and does an exceptional job of tackling.

Another senior, **Meredith Jacobson**, will also play some defensive midfielder in certain systems. Macdonald hails Jacobson has one of the top defenders in the conference, and the Tomball, Texas, native heads into her final campaign following a break-out junior year in which she set career highs in goals, assists and points.

Sophomore Lauren Host adds depth following a solid preseason, and Anna Goblirsch is a solid passer who reads the field really well. Another second-year player, Hadley Gable, presents another option in the lineup. The Texas prep product has added confidence following a freshman season in which she played in 17 games and started six.

Through her first two seasons with the Bulldogs, Heather Buttrey has shown the versatility to play the midfield and the back line. Along with Leanna Baldner, Buttrey will be relied on to win balls at midfield this season.

Freshman Lauren Morgan has shown tremendous technical skills and the ability to get out of pressure, and fellow rookie Sarah Lowdon is a skilled player for the English ranks who has the ability to slow the game down with her ball-handling ability.

DEFENDERS

The strongest area for the Bulldogs this season should be the back line with several experienced players back in the mix.

"Defense is an area that we have strengthened," Macdonald said. "We have options back there and we feel that it is our strongest area."

Senior Bethany Frazier will focus on the left side this season after seeing some time in the midfield a year ago. The Madison, Miss., native is outstanding at creating scoring opportunities for teammates, as evidenced by her team-leading and SEC fourth-best seven assists a year ago. Frazier brings stability and experience to the position after being a regular starter all three years of her MSU career.

Sophomore Mary Clare Scurria

adds valuable depth on the left side behind Frazier. Scurria has made tremendous strides dur-

ing the preseason in learning the position and furthering her knowledge of the game.

Another player with plenty of experience at defender is Mary Kate Ayers. Ayers, an outstanding attacker from the back, hopes to close her career on a high note after injuries limited her to eight games last season. Ayers is an exceptional player with the ball in front of her, and she is very good a getting in position for the cross ball.

Sophomore Danielle Kite will also see a lot of minutes on the right side. The Hornchurch, England, native provides a solid passing ability and very good defensive instincts. She has performed well during training camp and will present a viable attacking option.

Junior **Hannah Tyler** anchors the center of the defense with her speed and aggressive play. Jacobson will also patrol the middle, bringing veteran experience in reading the field.

With Buttrey also seeing time on the back line, the Bulldogs will also look for some productive minutes out of freshmen Allison Ouren and Kelsey Kitchings.

State's most heated preseason battle has come in goal, where returning starter **Taryn Holland** and freshman **Skylar Rosson** have battled for the starting spot.

Holland, a junior, has started 27 of the 30 games she's played in during her two-year career. The Franklin, Tenn., native stopped a career-best and school sixth-best 104 shots a year ago, an average of 5.47 per game.

"Taryn has to be a leader for us this year," Macdonald said. "She is an outstanding shotstopper and is very athletic with quick feet. She is constantly improving her leadership and communication in setting up the field."

Holland enters the campaign with added confidence following a sophomore season in which she held South Carolina to a scoreless tie and stopped nine shots in MSU's 1-0 upset of then-No. 17 Georgia.

She has received a lot of push from Rosson, who came to Starkville this season following an impressive prep and club career in Oklahoma.

"Skylar is much like Taryn in that she is athletic and has quick feet in stopping shots," Macdonald said. "She commands her area well, and has fantastic technique for a freshman."



simply stated, and loosely defined, a coach is a person who teaches and directs another person via encouragement and advice. However, as in all of his every day activities, coaching has become a form of commitment for fifth-year Mississippi State Head Coach Neil Macdonald.

With success having followed him every step of the way from his humble beginnings in the soccer world, to his time in Starkville, Macdonald knows no one can get anywhere in life without focus and hard work.

Just weeks before the Bulldogs would report for preseason camp and open the 2004 season at home with Middle Tennessee, Macdonald was named just the third head coach in the history of the MSU soccer program. The transition stage would be shortlived, but Macdonald was more than prepared to take on the task full circle.

"The big thing was that I knew the girls. That

made the transition easy," he said. "They were used to hearing from me as a coach. I was involved heavily in the coaching aspect of things, particularly with the defensive end, so I thought it was a fairly smooth transition."

Whatever it was, it worked. Macdonald became the most successful rookie coach in MSU history, helping the Maroon and White to its most wins since 2001 while securing a record-tying five league victories en route to State's second SEC Tournament herth

Having posted winning seasons in all but three seasons of his collegiate coaching career, Macdonald knew that building a competitive program would be an enduring process.

"For us to build a consistently successful program, it's going to take time," Macdonald said. "We are in the early stages of that. We just have to be patient and, if we approach things in an organized and professional manner as a staff, we can get the best out of the girls that we have and build a strong foundation for a bright future."

That future began to take shape last season, as a young, inexperienced Bulldog squad claimed the second-most wins in a season under his tenure.

Like all Scottish youngsters around his age growing up, Neil Macdonald often found himself in the streets of his Inverness neighborhood refining his soccer skills on the blacktop, rather than on the grass of a freshly mowed pitch. To him, as well as his friends, it was perceived as normalcy to set up makeshift goals out of trash cans and jackets just to play the game they developed a strong love for early on in life.

There was always time for soccer too, whether it be 15 minutes at break time or even an hour before school started, finding foes and teammates was never a challenge. The challenge lied in finding enough daylight to play an entire game.

"I really didn't get into organized soccer until primary school, but I started playing at a very young age," said the first year Mississippi State head coach. "I really didn't get exposed to the professional side of the game until I was about 12. We would all get to school an hour before class started and play on the playground and, when we got

home, we would all change out of our school clothes and go and play out on the street until it got dark.

"That was all we did. Your whole focus was trying to become a professional soccer player."

So, as Macdonald foraged his way through primary and secondary school, his skills could not do anything but develop. It did not take long before he was dominating his chums on the field, often times catching the eyes of professional scouts looking for young talent, or from coaches abroad looking to find talent for their collegiate programs in the United States.

At the still tender age of 18, Macdonald attended a coaching school in nearby Edinburgh where he would find himself playing on the other side of the ball from future college

teammates and longtime friends Neil McGuire and Kevin Moreland. Following his experience there, it was then that Macdonald got the call that would, inevitably, change his life.

"My goal was always to play professionally in Scotland," Macdonald said. "When I realized that was not going to happen, I then started to look at other options. After I attended the coaching school, I got a phone call asking if I wanted to come over and play at Augusta State with a full scholarship."

So, in 1996, with his parents' blessing and his friends helping him to adjust, Macdonald made the transition to the United States, making a name for himself as a standout athlete with the academic institution in southern Georgia. Having turned heads with both his tactical and technical skills from those who attended practices, Macdonald also impressed his coaches as well in his first preseason.

"Neil had exceptional fundamental skills and was a phenomenal player," said Lowell Barnhart, who coached the Scotsman through his first three years in Augusta. "Even the American players were amazed with his skills. He had excellent distribution skills and was cool in every situation. He was a very dependable and consistent player as well which was a direct reflection of his character."

Said Ron Keller, Macdonald's coach during his senior season in 1997, "You could see the leadership qualities in him every day. He had already been coaching a club team before I got there, so he had those leadership skills already. I think we had about seven veterans and 20 freshmen in my first season there, and Neil was instrumental in helping Augusta State make

the turnaround that it did that year and the years following. I always knew he would end up being a pretty good coach."

Macdonald saw action in every game of his rookie campaign and would go on to play a number of different positions at Augusta State, but typically made most of his playing appearances in the center midfield role.

A four-year starter for the Jaguars, Macdonald captained the team during his junior and senior seasons and was also a recipient of a handful of team awards, as well as one conference player of the week accolade. He played and started all but one game during his illustrious career in Augusta and left the distinguished academic institution as the career record holder in games played and games started.

"My first year, I spent a lot of time battling homesickness," Macdonald said. "It was a totally different culture and a whole new way of life. From a soccer perspective, the game was much slower and less physical so the transition was pretty easy for me.

"Playing at Augusta State was an unbelievable experience for me or for any young man or woman. It totally changes your life. To have the opportunity to get your education paid for while you play sports is amazing to me. I certainly didn't have that opportunity in Scotland."

Following his graduation from Augusta State in 1997, Macdonald had set his sights on graduate school at Augusta State with the full intention of becoming a future history teacher. However, with McGuire in need of an assistant coach at his new job at lowa Central Community College, Macdonald, once again, got a phone call that would set his path in a new direction. It was the years following he would find himself in the coach-

ing world, trading the classroom for the soccer field.

During the duo's initial campaign in Fort Dodge, Iowa, as coaches of both the men's and women's teams, the ICCC women finished the season as regional champions with a 9-3-1 clip and featured the nation's leading scorer at that level. The men's team won the regional championship as well en route to concluding the season with a 15-4-1 record and a No. 14 national ranking.

Following a 1998 campaign that saw both the Tritons and Lady Tritons march to regional and national rankings, McGuire would depart the campus of ICCC for an assistant coaching job at lowa State, thereby handing over his position as head coach to Macdonald who took the reigns of the program at full speed.

Over the course of the next five seasons, he would skipper the men's team to five regional championships, four times reaching the Sweet 16 of the National Junior College Association of America (NJCAA) national tournament, including his final season in 2002 when the squad advanced through to the Final Four.

His accomplishments and rigor as a coach and mentor were equally noted on the women's side as well where he led the Lady Tritons to five consecutive regional championships, including an appearance in the Elite Eight in 2002.

During his five-year tenure in Fort Dodge, Macdonald collected an impressive 149-34-5 coaching record. At the conclusion of the 2002 campaigns, he was honored with NJCAA Region Coach of the Year accolades, along with being

named one of three finalists for NSCAA National Coach of the Year honors. He was also lauded with Who's Who of America's Teachers as well.

"I was very fortunate that, when I was at Augusta State, I was coaching club soccer and I got to meet a guy named Colin Clark who had played for Arsenal and Oxford United in the English professional league," Macdonald said. "He taught me basically everything I know about the game from a coaching standpoint. He taught me how to break down my own game and how to use it to teach young kids. It was a matter of, as a player, you have to look after yourself and, as a coach, you have to look after everybody.

"He was definitely the one that got me interested in coaching and he was also the one that told me that I could have a future in it."

With the background of assistant and head coaching jobs at lowa Central, along with a professional coaching stint with the W-League's Memphis Mercury, Macdonald was offered and accepted his first Division I coaching job as a volunteer assistant at Mississippi State in 2003 where he was reunited with McGuire who, three years earlier, had attained his first tenure as a Division I head coach at the Northeast Mississippi school.

Working primarily on the defensive unit during his initial Spring season in Starkville, Macdonald was instrumental in helping to progressively enhance an already experienced defensive club. Prior to the Fall season in 2003, Macdonald was elevated to assistant coach where his primary duties included assuming day-to-day coaching duties with the defense, as well as recruiting. With his experience as a coach, the Bulldogs turned in a school record goals against average and yielded just 0.86 goals per game en route to a 9-8-3 record

- one that included a pair of victories over nationally ranked squads, including No. 6 Florida. The victories were the first for an MSU team over a top 25 squad in school history.

"There was, obviously, a step up in the physical aspects of the game when I moved from coaching junior college soccer to coaching Division I soccer," Macdonald said. "The pace of the game was better and I began to deal with better athletes. After working with professional athletes in the W-League, I had a good idea of what the top level was and where the lower level was so it was just a matter of finding a middle ground."

Following a season that saw the Maroon and White attain their fourth winning season in school history, Macdonald would get the opportunity of a lifetime when McGuire departed Starkville toward the end of July to become an assistant coach at Texas. On July 29, 2004, just days before he would welcome a squad of 21 players back to campus, he was named Mississippi State's third head coach.

"Coaching has always been something that has just fell into my lap," Macdonald said. "People have always told me that I would have a future in it. I have always felt that I can make teams click on their way to being successful. I have just been very fortunate to be in the right place at the right time. I've always had very good opportunities presented to me."

Macdonald will begin his eighth season as a collegiate coach this year, having been successful at each step of his progression up the ladder rungs of the coaching world. Over the years, he has developed his coaching philosophies and tailored it to his work ethic and responsibilities.

Attitude and determination to succeed should always be number one when it comes to playing the game.

"There is a great quote that 'Games are won in the noise and excitement of the playing field, but championships are won quietly and without applause on the training ground,' and that, for me, sums up my philosophy on the game," he said. "Success is determined completely by what the culture of training is and how committed people are to the cause.

"I am a great believer in simply outworking other people and other teams. You can have all the talent in the world, but if you have no heart or commitment, you are always going to be average. My ideal player is one that is always busy, and passionate about the game."

Commitment to the cause has been something that has translated into his recruiting philosophy as

"I look for character first of all," said Macdonald of the three things he looks for in a prospective student-athlete. "Because we are in the Southeastern Conference, you have to look at athleticism and pace as an incredibly important factor. Ideally, you'd like to have a technically sound player that has a good grasp of what the fundamentals of the game are. That makes things a lot easier."

Over the years, Macdonald has seen his share of life-changing experiences, but nothing comes close to what he experienced before the his tenure as MState's head coach even began. Having met his wife Jamie, an assistant professor in the Graphic Design program at Mississippi State, when both were athletes at Augusta State, the couple celebrated the birth of their first child, Colin Ross, in May, 2004. The couple also celebrated their sixth wedding anniversary on August 26.

Born May 16, 1972, in Banff, Scotland, Macdonald currently holds his coaching license from the Scottish Football Association.

"In addition to his outstanding qualities as a mentor and friend, Neil is so easy to talk to and his door is always open to whatever we need as players," said former MSU defender Morgan McDonald (2001-04), who captained the Bulldogs her last two seasons in Starkville. "He has his serious side, but he always keeps practice fun with his sense of humor. I learned so much from him in the two years I played under him because he is such an amazing coach with great patience and treats every player as if they were part of his family."

He is the type of guy that expects excellence from his players and will demand greatness from them everyday."

Manners came to Starkville following a very successful coaching career in Fort Dodge, lowa, where he was charged with the head coaching duties of both the Triton and Lady Triton soccer teams. As head coach of the nationally ranked ICCC programs the past two seasons, Manners collected a 33-6-3

record as head coach of the men's team and a 26-9-3 clip as skipper of the Lady Tritons.

Having secured the Region XI championship for second straight sea-son under Manners' guidance, the ICCC men concluded the 2004 campaign with a 15-4-3 record that was stopped short on a heartbreaking overtime loss to South Suburban CC in the district tournament. The Lady Tritons finished their season with a standout 13-5-1, but were stopped just shy of their seventh consecutive Region XI championship with a loss to Iowa Western in the region finals.

he Southeastern Conference has continued its rise as one of the top conferences in women's soccer.

The 2007 women's soccer season reaffirmed the SEC's prominence in the country. Six teams from the SEC were invited to the NCAA Tournament. Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, South Carolina and Tennessee made the 64-team field. The six teams combined for a record of 5-5-2 with both the Gators and Lady

Vols advancing to the third round. The SEC now has a 41-47-8 (.469) NCAA Tournament record in 50 appearances.

SEC women's soccer will begin its 16th season in the year of 2008 deeply rooted in the national scene of collegiate soccer. Since the SEC initiated women's soccer as a varsity sport in 1993, the sport's popularity has grown through the country and especially in the Southeast. A defining point in the SEC's women's soccer success came in 1995 when FOX

Sports South broadcasted the SEC Tournament Championship match between Alabama and Kentucky on a tape-delayed basis, signifying the first appearance of an SEC women's soccer match television. Southeastern Conference women's soccer continued to grow

over the next couple of years as the conference made a name for itself n ationally. In 1998, the SEC had its brea

out season with Florida winning theconference's first NCAA title in women's soccer in just the program's fourth year of existence.

The league led the nation with six NCAA Tournament teams that year, an accomplishment which firmly inserted the SEC as one the major conferences in women's soccer. The SEC also made

bigger strides in its television coverage with three regular season matches and the SEC Tournament championship match shown live on the SEC-TV package.

In 2003, the SEC Soccer Tournament moved to a neutral site in Orange Beach, Alabama, signifying the growth of the sports' popularity. In 2006, SEC-TV's women's soccer coverage was increased to four regular-season matches, in addition to the SEC Tournament championship match. That incremental growth, combined with increasing exposure on the national and regional scene, has SEC women's soccer looking to blossom to new heights in the year 2008 and beyond.

SEC SOCCER NOTES

- Florida's Stacy Bishop was named an NSCAA Scholar All-American. The SEC had seven schools receive NSCAA/adidas College Team Academic Awards (teams which maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher) - Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky and Vanderbilt.
- Florida's Melanie Booth and Georgia's Carrie Patterson were named Second Team All-America by the NSCAA in 2007 and Florida's Lauren Hyde and Tennessee's Jaimel Johnson were selected Third Team NSCAA All-Americans. The SEC placed six athletes on Soccer Buzz All-America teams. Booth and Patterson were second team members, while Kylee Rossi of Tennessee earned the lone third team honor. Bishop, Johnson and Blakely Mattern of South Carolina were fourth team selections.
- The Southeastern Conference placed 17 players on NSCAA All-Region squads. The SEC placed six athletes on first teams, five on second teams and six on a third team. LSU teammates Michelle Makasiniand Malorie Rutledge were named to the Central Region first team. Florida teammates Melanie Booth and Lauren Hyde along with Georgia's Carrie Patterson and Tennessee's Jaimel Johnson were all named to the Southeast Region's first team.
- The SEC placed five players on the Soccer Buzz Freshman All-America team. Georgia's Kelli Corless was a first team pick. Georgia's Caroline Simpson, LSU's Taryne Boudreau and South Carolina's Brittiny Rhoades were third team members. Dani Abelson of Georgia was a fourth team choice. Corless was also a Soccer America First Team All-Freshman Team selection.
- The SEC has had at least two teams advance to postseason play for 12 of the last 13 years. Ten of the league's teams (Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss, South Carolina, Tennessee and Vanderbilt) have made at least one NCAA Tournament appearance since 1994. Six teams (Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, South Carolina and Tennessee) advanced to the 2007 NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC also had four CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All- Americans, 12 Top Drawer National Team of the Season members and three Top Drawer All-Rookie Team selections.


MSU has the largest enrollment in the state of Mississippi. Founded as a landgrant institution, its grass, flowers and trees are as prevalent as buildings, sidewalks and parking lots. Large enough to sport diversity in all areas, the university still maintains a warm, friendly atmosphere.

Ruby Hall, a residence hall with the largest single room size in university history, opened opened in August 2006. A co-residential, 160,000-square foot, three-story freshman hall, Ruby is located at the north end of campus, in convenient proximity to the Colvard Union, the Perry Cafeteria, Mitchell Memorial Library, the Sanderson Center and all athletic facilities. Ruby Hall offers students the latest in technology, including Ethernet access, full wireless internet coverage, a refrigerator and microwave, and free cable with HBO in each room.

The Colvard Union is a popular meeting place for MSU students. Whether working on a group project, enjoying the food court, or simply relaxing, the student union is one of the campus' main meeting places.

The Chapel of Memories and Carillon Tower were built with bricks from Old Main Dormitory, the largest residence hall in the country when constructed, later structed, later destroyed by fire in 1959. The Chapel of Memories, which hosts numerous weddings each year, is one of the most-recognized landmarks on campus.

The Drill Field, located squarely in the center of campus, shows the expanse of greenery for which the campus is famous.

CHRISTI SANDERS (back left) has the longest, consecutive coaching reign of any head coach at State, with 21 seasons at the helm of the women's golf program. She has twice been named SEC Coach of the Year (1990, 2000).


Former MSU baseball standout JOHN COHEN was introduced as Mississippi State's new baseball skipper in June 2008.

SYLVESTER CROOM was named the consensus SEC Coach of the Year after leading the MSU football team to an 8-5 record in 2007, a season that concluded with a win over Central Florida in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tenn.



RICK STANSBURY, the winningest coach in MSU basketball history, has guided the Bulldogs to 208 wins and eight post-season appearances in his 10 seasons at State.

NEIL MACDONALD is the only head coach to guide the MState soccer program to an SEC Tournament appearance in his first season (2004).



HREATHARDERS

CLAY HOMAN, a second-team all-SEC performer during his MState playing career, has led the men's golf program to 43 top 10 finishes in five years.

TRACY LANE has the most wins of any head women's tennis coach in MSU history. She directed the 2005 Lady Bulldogs to an SEC Western Division title and has guided MSU to four NCAA Championship berths in her 12 seasons at the State helm.

JAY MILLER is one of the most respected coaches around the country, and a key contributor to USA Softball in various capacities. The NFCA Hall of Famer has directed the State softball program to five NCAA postseason appearances in his six seasons.

PER NILSSON, a former MSU tennis standout, begins his second season at the helm of the Bulldog men's tennis program this year.

TINA SEALS returned to her alma mater as head volleyball coach in 2004. The school's first All-SEC volleyball performer guided the Bulldogs in 2006 to their most wins since 1996 and a school-record for SEC wins.

Now in his second decade as the head coach of the men's and women's track teams, AL SCHMIDT has coached three MState athletes to national titles.

Mississippi State athletes play in some of the nation's finest facilities. Almost ever Bulldog competition site has either been constructed or renovated in the last 15 years. During that time along, more than \$60 million in facility enhancements have been made.

DAVIS WADE STADIUM AT SCOTT FIELD: Near-sellout crowds have become the norm at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field, where the Bulldogs have played before masses reaching 85 percent of stadium capacity. Since the 2000 season when expansion and renovation projects gave the nation's second-oldest stadium a gleaming new look, crowds have grown by nearly 30 percent.



PITTS TENNIS CENTRE: Considered among the finest tennis facilities in the collegiate ranks, the modern, six-court, 1,000-seat A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre recently completed its 25th year serving the men's and women's programs. Recent enhancements at the facility include new locker areas and concession stands [1998] and a permanent press box [2004].

W.O. SPENCER STADIUM/
CARL MADDOX TRACK:
Co-named in honor of a two-time
Mississippi State Olympian and a
former MSU athletic director, the
W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox
Track has served as host to the
Southeastern Conference Outdoor
Track and Field Championships three
times since 1985, joining Tennessee
as the most frequent host for that
event during that time.



DUDY NOBLE FIELD, POLK-DEMENT STADIUM: One of the nation's leaders in baseball season ticket sales and attendance, Dudy Noble Field, Polk-Dement Stadium still holds the nation's on-campus single-game attendance mark — 14,991. With a seating capacity of more than 7,000 and more space in the world-famous outfield, Sports Illustrated magazine named the park, the "Best Place To Watch College Baseball" in a 1997 issue.



The 12,000-square foot, hardwood-floored Newell-Grissom Building serves as the home for Mississippi State's volleyball program and serves as a practice facility for both of the school's basketball programs. A state-of-the-art heating and air conditioning system was installed in 2004.

ticket sales records and all-time attendance marks have also been set over the past decade by Bulldog and Lady Bulldog basketball teams in the Humphrey Coliseum, the state's largest oncampus basketball arena. The latest addition to the facility was a \$1.8 million, center-hung, foursided video scoreboard and jumbotron screen installed in 2004.

MSU GOLF COURSE

Nominated by Golfweek and Golf Digest magazines as one of the premier public golf courses in the United States, Mississippi State's championship University Golf Course is the home to the men's and women's programs. The 18-hole course was recently furnished with a 5,000-square-foot clubhouse, complete with locker areas, snack bar, golf shop and classroom.

MSU SOFTBALL FIELD: Constructed in 1997, the Mississippi State Softball Field has undergone almost constant improvement at the northern-most point of campus. Lights were added to the facility in 1998, brick work was added to the dugouts two years later and, in 2001, additional batting cages were built. In 2005, softball moved into a new locker, training and meeting

BRYAN BUILDING: The state-ofthe-art John H. Bryan Athletic Administration Building is the crown jewel of MSU's expansion projects of the last decade. Opened in 1996, this showcase facility is named for longtime Bulldog friend and supporter John H. Bryan St., and houses athletic administration, football, ticket, athletic development and media relations offices.

MSU has played in the SEC Football

the SEC Football Championship Game, the basketball Final Four, the baseball College World Series, and in numerous NCAA national title events since 1996. The last decade has brought overall achievement unmatched at State, and each new generation adds more hardware to the school's trophy cases.

The 1999 Maroon football team won its first eight games of the season, amassed 10 victories for just the second time in school history, and defeated Clemson in the Peach Bowl at Atlanta. Quarterback Wayne Madkin (above), State's all-time leading passer, was named the bowl game's Most Valuable Offensive Player.

State won the SEC Western Division title in 1998 and held a fourth-quarter lead on eventual national champion Tennessee in the league championship game at the Georgia Dome. The Bulldogs' appearance in the championship game garnered the school a berth in the 1999 Cotton Bowl.



MSU's 1998 men's tennis team was one of two Bulldog squads that reached the NCAA semifinals, losing to perennial national champion Stanford. The '98 team was one of 10 State net teams that earned NCAA Sweet 16 berths from 1991-2001.

State's soccer team captured the 2001 SEC Western Division crown, the first SEC championship of any kind by an MSU women's team. That title came in just the sport's seventh year of existence on the campus.

While the MSU athletic program has experienced success both on the field and court, Bulldog and Lady Bulldog athletes are excelling where it counts the most — in the classroom. During the 2006-07 school year, 153 MState athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll honors.

Featuring 2005 graduates (L-R) Shane Power, Ontario Harper, Wesley Morgan and Branden Vincent, coach Rick Stansbury's Bulldogs lead all SEC schools with a total of 20 SEC Academic Honor Roll recipients in men's basketball over the past five seasons.

Burke Masters was a two-time First Team GTE-CoSIDA Academic All-American (1989 and 1990), four-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection and the 1990 Boyd McWhorter SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

A two-time Academic all-SEC selection, Kate Jaspers racked up numerous academic awards while at MSU. She was twice named ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American, and a three-time NFCA Scholar Athlete All-America. In 2004, Jaspers was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, as well as the CoSIDA Academic Player of the Year.

Annemarie Pimentel was a four-year soccer letterwinner. While at State, she was a three-time Academic all-SEC selection, while being named to the GTE and Verizon Academic All-District teams. Her career culminated in being selected the 2000 SEC **Boyd McWhorter Post-**Graduate Scholarship winner, awarded to the student-athlete who best demonstrates excellence in athletics, academics and community service.

MSU ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Vance Watson

Interim President SE Missouri State, 1964

amed Interim President of Mississippi State last April, Vance Watson assumed the top leadership role after a career of progressively responsible positions at the land-grant university.

Most recently, he served as vice president of the Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine; dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences; director of the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station; executive director of Extension and Outreach; and professor of agronomy.

He earned his undergraduate degree from Southeast Missouri State University in his native state, followed by a master's degree at the University of Missouri and a doctorate from Mississippi State. He has invested his 42-year career in the institution and the state he has come to call 'home.'

Under his leadership, the Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine gained an eighth-place ranking for total research and development expenditures, and a third-place ranking for federal expenditures, as calculated by the National Science Foundation. Units making up the division include the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station, Mississippi State University Extension Service, Forest and Wildlife Research Center, College of Veterinary Medicine, College of Forest Resources, and the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences.

Watson was instrumental in the establishment of a number of interdisciplinary research efforts, including one that led to a sustainable energy research partnership between the Bagley College of Engineering and the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. He played a key role in securing a commitment for a collaborative poultry research facility that will house research scientists from MSU, USDA, and the Agricultural Research Service— USDA's research arm. The latter will provide more opportunities to assist an important segment of Mississippi's economy.

Within the division, he advocated a faculty mentoring program to help enhance the success and contributions of junior faculty members, and as Interim President, seeks to expand the concept university-wide.

An Eagle Scout, he also is a Fellow of the American Society of Agronomy and a Fellow of the Crop Science Society of America. He has received the Mississippi Farm Bureau Federation Distinguished Service Award, the Southern Association of Agricultural Experiment Station Directors' 2007 Excellence in Leadership Award, and numerous other awards and honors.

He and his wife, Jo Ann, have three children and seven grandchildren.



Ann Carr

Sr. Assoc. Athletic Director
Women's Sports/StudentAthlete Services
Mississippi State, 1990

12-year MSU athletic administration veteran and a former Lady Bulldog athlete, Ann Carr was named the associate athletic director for women's sports in June 2006.

Carr is in her second stint within the State athletic department following seven years as Assistant Athletic Director for Student Life. In that position, she worked with the personal development of MSU's student-athletes in addition to continuing her prior responsibilities as academic counselor for the Bulldog football team.

Carr directs the department's Life Skills program, which includes the support systems and career programs for all MSU student-athletes, and its CHAMPS program (Challenging Athletes' Minds for Personal Success). As SWA, Carr oversees the operation and supervision of MSU's women's sport program. Hired in 1993 as an assistant director in the athletic academics, she returned full-time to MState in 1999 following a one-year stay in a similar capacity at the University of Southern Mississippi.

The Brookhaven, Miss., native was a four-year letter winner on the Mississippi State women's basketball team (1986-90), finishing her career ranked first on the career leaders list in free-throw percentage (75.8 percent). She also ranked 12th on the career points list with 762, an average of 8.3 points per contest. Carr brought down 597 rebounds (6.5 per game) to finish her career sixth on the all-time list.

A 1990 graduate of State, she later earned her master's degree in counseling from the institution in 1992.



Greg Byrne

Director of Athletics Arizona State, 1994

hen Greg Byrne was named Mississippi State University's 15th Director of Athletics on February 21, 2008, he became the youngest top current athletic administrator in the Southeastern Conference. At 36 years of age, he became the youngest to lead an athletic program at the NCAA Division I-A level.

Despite his age, Byrne is anything but inexperienced. He has been around successful athletic programs, and the director's chair at those institutions, literally all his life. He is the son of long-time athletic administrator Bill Byrne, currently the Director of Athletics at Texas A&M University.

Byrne, however, has made a name for himself in intercollegiate athletics. He has 15 years of professional experience, a resume' that shows progressive growth in both responsibility and achievement. He has been directly involved in raising over \$120 million in gifts during his career in athletics. He has finalized and implemented an annual giving renovation for athletics at three different institutions. Byrne has also helped in the reorganization of the athletic program at one school while renovating the department's budgeting systems, development, marketing, and compliance programs. Byrne was on the ground floor of resurrecting a football program and athletic department at another institution, one that achieved success for the first time in three decades.

Prior to being named to head State's athletic program, Byrne came to MSU in June 2006 as Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs. In just his first year on the job, Byrne initiated a first-ever volunteer fund-drive that resulted in 969 new Bulldog Club members for Mississippi State. He implemented a priority seating program for football and men's basketball that led to a \$1 million increase in annual giving. He also led the effort to package State's donor and ticketing software, in connection with the department's athletic web site, for fan convenience. In so doing, MSU became the first Bowl Championship Series school to enlist XOS Technologies for total donor support in those

Byrne held a similar position at the University of Kentucky prior to coming to Starkville. As Associate Athletic Director for Development and Fund-Raising at UK from 2002-05, he managed the development staff and operated a multimillion dollar budget. He oversaw development efforts that raised annual gifts from \$4 million to \$9 million annually. While in Lexington, Byrne led a \$35 million athletic facility campaign, and participated in the design, funding and marketing for Kentucky's \$30 million basketball practice facility. He worked with a corporate sponsorship team to manage UK marketing and development efforts, including signing one of the nation's top multi-media rights packages. Byrne was one of four members on the UK search committees that brought new head football and baseball coaches to the Wildcat athletic program.

Byrne possibly made his greatest athletic program impact as Associate Athletic Director for Development at Oregon State University from 1998-2002. Managing an eight-person staff, he replaced an antiquated 60-year old fundraising organization and increased annual giving from \$1 million to over \$5 million in cash during his tenure there. He assisted the Director of Major Gifts in raising more than \$30 million in capital gifts for facilities and budget enhancement while in Corvallis. He participated in securing a \$12.5 million gift to rename the Beavers' football stadium. Byrne was involved in the department's transition of corporate sponsorships for radio, television, stadium and arena signage and game program sales to increase revenue.

Byrne began his athletic fund-raising career as Regional Director of Development at the University of Oregon from 1995 through '98, overseeing development efforts for Portland, Southern and Central Oregon, Northern California and the Oregon coast. He secured the largest donation totals ever for each region during his U of O career. While overseeing the Duck's letterman's organization, he participated in raising \$14 million for an indoor football facility and soccer complex.

The energetic Byrne launched his professional career as Special Projects Coordinator for the Fiesta Bowl in Tempe, Ariz., from 1993-95. During that time, he managed a 1,000-person volunteer base for 63 Fiesta Bowl annual events. Byrne was promoted to a full-time position following an initial internship period.

A native of Pocatello, Idaho, Byrne earned his bachelor's degree from Arizona State University in 1994. He anticipates receiving his master's degree from Mississippi State this summer.

Byrne is married to the former Regina Misa of Junction City, Ore., and the couple has two sons: Nick (12) and Davis (10).
