CREDENTIALS: Requests for press/photo credentials should be faxed or mailed on official letterhead to the Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office (FAX 662-325-3654) at least 48 hours prior to the event. Since space is limited, accommodations are on a priority basis: daily newspapers, originating radio and television stats, national weekly or monthly publications, electronic media outlets, local and regional television crews. Priority is granted to members of the media who cover Mississippi State on a regular basis, and to visiting media members. At the MSU Soccer Field, media credentials will be available for pickup in the press box. Only working media with proper credentials will be allowed access to the press area.

PHOTO REGULATIONS: Photo passes will be

PHOTO REGULATIONS: Photo passes will be issued only to accredited photographers on assignment. Photographers may shoot from designated areas outside of the fences of the field and within the stadium. The Mississippi State Athletic Department adheres to NCAA photography policies and reserves all commercial and non-commercial rights to the use of film, videotape and still photographs of its athletic events and facilities.

MSU SOCCER FIELD: The MSU Soccer Field is an on-campus facility located on the corner of Collegeview Drive and University Drive. With a seating capacity of 500, the complex features a newly-built press box that accommodates media, radio and video. The media facility is equipped with lines for hi-speed internet, as well as telephone access which can be ordered through Mississippi State Information Technology Services. The press box telephone number is (662) 325-0905.

PARKING: Parking for the media and general public is located directly behind the grandstand area of the MSU Soccer Field. The parking lot located directly behind McArthur Hall is reserved for players, officials and game

SERVICES: The Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office will provide a complete box score and play-by-play of each game. Programs containing rosters and game notes on each team will also be provided to the working media. An automatic facsimile machine is available in the Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations offices in the Bryan Building and the Humphrey Coliseum.



**TELEPHONES:** Telephone service can be ordered for the press box area though MSU Information Technology Services. The MSU Soccer Field press box telephone number is (662) 325-0905. Any special requests must be made in advance through the Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office at (662) 325-7556. These requests should be submitted at least two weeks in advance to the media relations office on official letterhead.

INTERVIEW POLICY: The Mississippi State Soccer team is scheduled to practice between 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. daily during the 2009 season. All practices are open to the general public. Members of the working media are invited to attend all practices at the MSU Soccer Field. Interviews must be conducted before or after practice. Requests should be made at least 24 hours in advance to ensure probability.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: Following a 10-minute cooling off period, head coach Neil Macdonald and/or requested players will be available on the playing surface of the MSU soccer Field. The opponent head coach and/or players will also be available on the field. Please make those interview requests through the visiting soccer contact.

ARCHIVAL INFORMATION: The Mississippi State Athletic Media Relations Office maintains information on all current student-athletes, as well as historical information on previous student-athletes and the program in general. For information, interviews, photo shoots and/or file photos, please call, stop by our office or fax a request.

## MSU SOCCER FIELD

ome to the Mississippi State women's soccer team since 1995, the Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldogs one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast.

Located on the north side of the Mississippi State University campus, the MSU Soccer Field is situated in the heart of the University's impressive physical plant. It joins W.O. Spencer Stadium (track and field), Dudy-Noble Field/Polk Dement Stadium (baseball), the MSU Softball Field and the A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre to give Mississippi State one of the finest Olympic sport venues in collegiate athletics.

The facility features a main grandstand area which accommodates more than 500 people with opportunities for expansion in the future.

The MSU Soccer Field will unveil its newest addition, a state-of-the-art scoreboard and video board, when the Bulldogs kick-off the 2009 campaign on Aug. 23. The newest addition, which



will rank among one of the finest in the Southeastern Conference, includes an LED-based scoreboard display and advertising spaces surrounding a 15'x10' video board.

The new scoreboard comes a year after the program debuted a 2,600 square-foot

brick facility which houses a concession stand, men's and women's restrooms and a spacious press box.

The press facility is divided into four separate work areas, with each equipped with hispeed internet and telephone

access. It is also setup to accommodate television and team video personnel. The MSU Soccer Field also includes covered dugouts for participating teams.

Hailed as one of the top playing surfaces in the Southeastern Conference, the field stretches 114 yards long and 72 yards wide. The regulation NCAA Championship field features Mississippi Pride grass - developed by researchers on the Mississippi State campus - making it home to one of the finest playing surfaces in the country. A grounds crew, supervised by groundskeeper Bart Prather, is responsible for the field maintenance of

the Mississippi State Soccer Field.

To reflect the strong commitment to constant improvement on the field, the Mississippi State locker facilities have undergone a drastic renovation over the course of the past three years. Custommade wooden lockers complete with spacious storage areas, along with a 52" color television and brand new carpets, have been installed to give the facility a championship feel.

Lights were added just after the conclusion of the 2002 campaign, equipping the facility for evening competition and giving it an added amenity that can only translate into better atmospheres.

In its 14 seasons at the MSU Soccer Field, the Mississippi State women's pro-

gram has posted a 58-64-8 (.492) overall record and, in 1996, tallied a program-best 12-2 record at home, including a 9-0 mark against non-conference foes. Mississippi State has also shut out its opponent 33 times in front of its home fans.

The program's improvement can be felt with the size of the home crowds as well. In 2004, Mississippi State established a new program high for average and total attendance as a program-high 4,411 fans made their way to 10 Bulldog home dates (441 avg.). Of the top 10 MSU Soccer Field attendance marks, seven were set over the course of the past six seasons, including a standing-room-only crowd of 743 that witnessed MSU's double overtime victory over Auburn on regional television

in 2001. In 2007, the ninth-largest crowd in facility history witnessed the Bulldogs' 3-1 win over Alabama, while the third-most fans in school annals (673) cheered MSU in it's 2008 season-opening win over Mississippi Valley State.

Mississippi State will play host to eight matches during the 2009 campaign, including five Southeastern Conference match ups.

The Bulldogs will also play host to a very attractive non-conference schedule that opens Aug. 23 with defending Southwestern Athletic Conference champion Mississippi Valley State. The preconference slate also includes matches against Troy and East Tennessee State.



Mississippi State head soccer coach Neil Macdonald enters the 2009 season with a great deal of optimism following a 2008 campaign that fell short of expectations due to a rash of injuries that decimated the depth chart.

A healthy Bulldog squad showed what it was capable of in the spring, however, and set the expectation level in Starkville high for the 2009 campaign.

Macdonald's contingent will be a youthful one, with seniors Hannah Tyler, Leanna Baldner and Taryn Holland leading a team that consists of six juniors, seven sophomores and 13 freshmen.

This year's Bulldog squad might be short on game experience, but the roster sports a great deal of versatility and a plethora of speed. The improvements in those areas will see State attack the goal more this season, something that was hampered by the numerous injuries up front a year ago.

#### **FORWARDS**

The front line struggled with injuries and inexperience a year ago, but the unit returns in 2009 as one of the team's strong points.

Sophomore Tarah Henderson anchors one side of the field looking to build on a freshman campaign in which she tied for the team lead in goals and ranked second in points.

The Martinez, Ga., native's outstanding speed makes her a threat to serves over the top, and with improved ball-handling, she could develop into one of the conference's top offensive threat.


Henderson could most benefit from the addition of Kat Walsh to the lineup. The sister of former Bulldog Shannon Walsh, the Birmingham native sat out last season after transferring from LSU.

Walsh made an immediate impact on the roster in the spring, and her speed and intensity on the pitch could provide the perfect compliment to Henderson.

The increased depth has Macdonald looking at the chance to play more aggressively up front, and one player that he is anticipating making a big contribution is freshman Rachel Wannek.

The Canadian national team standout has the ability to play a number of positions on the field, but her blend of speed and size make her a formidable target in the middle.

Last season the Bulldogs missed the contributions of talented junior Ashley Hood. Forced to redshirt the 2008 season due to illness, Hood returns to the lineup this

season anxious to build on a 2007 season in which she scored her first career goal and started 12 matches. Sophomore Taylor Turnipseed enters her second season anxious to rebound from a

2008 season that was limited to 14 games by injury. The Oklahoma native showed tremendous potential early in the year, scoring two goals and assisting on two more in just 392 minutes. A return to that form could help her develop into a dangerous goal-scorer.

Junior Danielle Kite will mostly see time in the midfield, but her speed and ball-handling ability provide the opportunity to move her to the top. The Hornchurch, England, native saw her first action at forward last season, and it translated into the first three goals of her

Sophomore Kim Pettit could be a factor this season after a spring campaign that saw her make tremendous strides with her development as a player.

True freshmen Katy Hoover and Alex Kytan add valuable depth up top following stellar prep and club careers in Mississippi and Washington, respectively.




Sophomore Tarah Henderson's ability to speed past defenders helped her tie for the team's points lead last season as a freshman.

#### **MIDFIELDERS**

Like the forward spot, the midfield will feature a great deal of versatility between the veterans and talented newcomers.

Although she could see action up front, Macdonald believes that Hood's biggest impact could be in the midfield with her ability to win balls and attack the goal.

Another veteran who could provide significant contribution in the middle of the field is senior **Andrea Harrison**. The Vicksburg, Miss., product brings an outstanding work ethic to the squad, and that hard work paid off last season as she played in all 20 matches and started a career-best 10 of those

Kite will also make the move to the midfield after splitting time between forward and defender last season. The move to the middle of the field will allow the speedster more goal-scoring opportunities.

Sophomore Lauren Morgan could be a tremendous asset in the middle of the pitch after making significant contributions as a freshman. The Texas native appeared in 18 matches and started all but one, assisting on two goals in 1,076 minutes.

Junior **Hadley Gable** and Pettit can provide depth in the midfield along with a talented group of freshmen.

One of those rookies, Texas native **Monica Alvarado**, comes to Starkville boasting a stellar international resume that includes

a stint with the Mexican Women's National Team over the summer. Clinton, Miss., prep standout Madison McKee and Florida product Aubrey Curington, the daughter of MSU alums, offer size and ball-winning ability to the middle of the park.

Fellow newcomers Abby Trevino, Zehra Syed, Jasmine Simmons and Julie Waddle will also challenge for minutes with their blend of speed and ball-handling ability.

#### **DEFENDERS**

Arguably the most experienced aspect of the lineup this season, the defense returns two-thirds of the starting back line from last year's squad.

Senior Hannah Tyler anchors the middle of the defense after starting all 20 games on the back line last season and logging a team-high 1,762 minutes.

The Mississippi State defense got a boost last season with the addition of junior Leanna Baldner from the midfield at the

mid-point of the year. A tough player with

the ability to win balls in the air, Baldner started all 20 games and scored a goal while assisting on two more. Junior Mary Clare

Junior Mary Clare Scurria enters the 2009 season looking to maintain the starting spot she earned for the last four matches of the 2008 season. The Vicksburg, Miss., native played in 17 matches, logging a career-best 960 minutes and notching a teamleading three assists.

Scurria will be challenged on the left-side of the defense by sophomore Serena Prendergast. The Brandon, Miss., product enjoyed a solid freshman campaign in the midfield, scoring a goal over 530 minutes, but Macdonald played her on defense during the spring and was impressed by her instincts in winning possessions.

Fellow sophomore Allison Ouren will also factor into the mix at defender. The Oklahoma native saw action in 13 matches as a true freshman in 2008, starting nine of those contests and logging an assist.

Katie Goodman, who redshirted the 2008 season, will provide depth on the back line along with sophomore Kelsey Kitchings and freshman Jennifer Grant.

#### **GOALKEEPER**

Macdonald enters the year with a great deal of optimism in the net this year.

Freshman **Skylar Rosson** entered the 2008 preseason expecting to push veteran **Taryn Holland** for the starting nod in goal, but a knee injury forced her to redshirt the year and limited the Bulldogs to Holland in goal.

Holland manned the net for every minute of the 2008 season, and the Franklin, Tenn., native responded by stopping an SEC second-most 124 shots over 1,815 minutes. Holland led the conference and stood 27th nationally with 6.20 saves per game.

She stopped a personal-best 13 shots against Alabama and enters her final collegiate season just 17 saves behind the school record set by Kirstin Olson.

The senior goalkeeper will get a serious challenge from the talented Rosson, who enjoyed a stellar career in goal in the Oklahoma high school and club ranks. Rosson brings outstanding shot-stopping ability to the squad, and her knowledge of the game and organization of the field has been impressive for a second-year player.

## Neil Macdonald

Head Coach • 6th Year at Mississippi State • 12th Year Overall • Augusta State, 1997



Simply stated, and loosely defined, a coach is a person who teaches and directs another person via encouragement and advice. However, as in all of his every day activities, coaching has become a form of commitment for sixth-year Mississippi State Head Coach Neil Macdonald.

With success having followed him every step of the way from his humble beginnings in the soccer world, to his time in Starkville, Macdonald knows no one can get anywhere in life without focus and hard work.

Just weeks before the Bulldogs would report for preseason camp and open the 2004 season at home with Middle Tennessee, Macdonald was named just the third head coach in the history of the MSU soccer program. The transition stage would be short-lived, but Macdonald was more than prepared to take on the task full circle.

Macdonald became the most successful rookie coach in MSU history, helping the Maroon and White to its most wins since 2001 while securing a record-tying five league victories en route to State's second SEC Tournament berth.

Having posted winning seasons in all but four seasons of his collegiate coaching career, Macdonald knew that building a competitive program would be an enduring process.

That future began to take shape in 2007, as a young, inexperienced Bulldog squad claimed the second-most wins in a season under his tenure while last season's edition claimed the third-most.

Like all Scottish youngsters around his age growing up,

Macdonald often found himself in the streets of his Inverness neighborhood refining his soccer skills on the blacktop, rather than on the grass of a freshly mowed pitch. To him, as well as his friends, it was perceived as normalcy to set up makeshift goals out of trash cans and jackets just to play the game they developed a strong love for early on in life.

There was always time for soccer too, whether it be 15 minutes at break time or even an hour before school started, finding foes and teammates was never a challenge. The challenge lied in finding enough daylight to play an entire game.

As Macdonald foraged his way through primary and secondary school, his skills could not do anything but develop. It did not take long before he was dominating his chums on the field, often times catching the eyes of professional scouts looking for young talent, or from coaches abroad looking to find talent for their collegiate programs in the United States.

At the still tender age of 18, Macdonald attended a coaching school in nearby Edinburgh where he would find himself playing on the other side of the ball from future college teammates and longtime friends Neil McGuire and Kevin Moreland. Following his experience there, it was then that Macdonald got the call that would, inevitably, change his life.

In 1996, with his parents' blessing and his friends helping him to adjust, Macdonald made the transition to the United States, making a name for himself as a standout athlete at Augusta State University in southern Georgia. Having turned heads with both his tactical and technical skills from those who attended practices, Macdonald also impressed his coaches as well in his first preseason.

Macdonald saw action in every game of his rookie campaign and would go on to play a number of different positions at Augusta State, but typically made most of his playing appearances in the center

midfield role.

A four-year starter for the Jaguars, Macdonald captained the team during his junior and senior seasons and was also a recipient of a handful of team awards, as well as one conference player of the week accolade. He played and started all but one game during his illustrious career in Augusta and left the distinguished academic institution as the career record holder in games played and games started.

Following his graduation from Augusta State in 1997, Macdonald had set his sights on graduate school at the university with the full intention of becoming a future history teacher. However, with McGuire in need of an assistant coach at his new job at lowa Central Community College, Macdonald, once again, got a phone call that would set his path in a new direction. It was the years following he would find himself in the coaching world, trading the classroom for the soccer field.

During the duo's initial campaign in Fort Dodge, Iowa, as coaches of both the men's and women's teams, the ICCC women finished the season as regional champions with a 9-3-1 clip and featured the nation's leading scorer at that level. The men's team won the regional championship as well en route to concluding the season with a 15-4-1 record and a No. 14 national ranking.

Following a 1998 campaign that

saw both the Tritons and Lady Tritons march to regional and national rankings, McGuire would depart the campus of ICCC for an assistant coaching job at lowa State, thereby handing over his position as head coach to Macdonald, who took the reigns of the program at full speed.

Over the course of the next five seasons, he would skipper the men's team to five regional championships, four times reaching the Sweet 16 of the National Junior College Association of America (NJCAA) national tournament, including his final season in 2002 when the squad advanced through to the Final Four.

His accomplishments and rigor as a coach and mentor were equally noted on the women's side as well, where he led the Lady Tritons to five consecutive regional championships, including an appearance in the Elite Eight in 2002.

During his five-year tenure in Fort Dodge, Macdonald collected an impressive 149-34-5 coaching record. At the conclu-

sion of the 2002 campaigns, he was honored with NJCAA Region Coach of the Year accolades, along with being named one of three finalists for NSCAA National Coach of the Year honors. He was also lauded with Who's Who of America's Teachers as well.

With the background of assistant and head coaching jobs at lowa Central, along with a professional coaching stint with the W-League's Memphis Mercury, Macdonald was offered and accepted his first Division I coaching job as a volunteer assistant at Mississippi State in 2003, where he was reunited with McGuire who, three years earlier, had attained his first tenure as a Division I head coach at the Northeast Mississippi school.

Working primarily on the defensive unit during his initial spring season in Starkville, Macdonald was instrumental in helping to progressively enhance an already experienced defensive club. Prior to the Fall season in 2003, Macdonald was elevated to assistant coach where his primary duties included assuming day-to-day coaching duties with the defense, as well as recruiting. With his experience as a coach, the Bulldogs turned in a school-record goals against average and yielded just 0.86 goals per game en route to a 9-8-3 record — one that included a pair of victories over nationally-ranked squads, including No. 6 Florida. The victories were

the first for an MSU team over a top 25 squad in school history.

"There was, obviously, a step up in the physical aspects of the game when I moved from coaching junior college soccer to coaching Division I soccer," Macdonald said. "The pace of the game was better and I began to deal with better athletes. After working with professional athletes in the W-League, I had a good idea of what the top level was and where the lower level was, so it was just a matter of finding a middle ground."

Following a season that saw the Maroon and White attain their fourth winning season in school history, Macdonald would get the opportunity of a lifetime when McGuire departed Starkville toward the end of July to become an assistant coach at Texas. On July 29, 2004, just days before he would welcome a squad of 21 players back to campus, he was named Mississippi State's third head coach

"Coaching has always been something that has just fell into my lap," Macdonald said. "People have always told me that I would have a future in it. I have always felt that I can make teams click on their way to being successful. I have just been very fortunate to be in the right place at the right time. I've always had very good opportunities presented to me."

Macdonald will begin his ninth season as a collegiate coach this year, having been successful at each step of his progression up the ladder rungs of the coaching world. Over the years, he has developed his coaching philosophies and tailored it to his work ethic and responsibilities.

Attitude and determination to succeed should always be number one when it comes to playing the game.

Commitment to the cause has been something that has translated into his recruiting philosophy as well.

"I look for character first of all," said Macdonald of the three things he looks for in a prospective student-athlete. "Because we are in the Southeastern Conference, you have to look at athleticism and pace as an incredibly important factor. Ideally, you'd like to have a technically sound player that has a good grasp of what the fundamentals of the game are. That makes things a lot easier."

Over the years, Macdonald has seen his share of life-changing experiences, but nothing comes close to what he experienced before the his tenure as MState's head coach even began. Having met his wife Jamie, an assistant professor in the Graphic Design program at Mississippi State, when both were athletes at Augusta State. The couple celebrated the birth of their first child, Colin Ross, in May, 2004, and welcomed their second son, Liam in April, 2008.

Born May 16, 1972, in Banff, Scotland, Macdonald currently holds his coaching license from the Scottish Football Association. This past summer, Macdonald returned to his home country to begin work on earning his Scottish FA UEFA license, one of the top coaching decorations in international soccer.

"I am a great believer in simply out-working other people and other teams. You can have all the talent in the world, but if you have no heart or commitment, you are always going to be average."

Beginning his 10th year as a collegiate soccer coach, Andy Manners enters his fifth season at MSU, but his seventh working alongside head coach Neil Macdonald, officially joining the Mississippi State staff on January 10, 2005.

Manners' duties include, but are not limited to, on-field instruction, day-to-day operations and recruiting. He is also in charge of scouting, purchasing and compliance.

"Andy brings an awful lot to the table for us," Macdonald said. "He is a very intelligent person and he knows the game of soccer inside-out. He is a very good on-field coach and I don't know if I have ever worked with anyone better than he is. He is the type

of guy that expects excellence from his players and will demand greatness from them everyday."

Manners came to Starkville following a very successful coaching career in Fort Dodge, lowa, where he was charged with the head coaching duties of both the Triton and Lady Triton soccer teams. As head coach of the nationally-ranked ICCC programs for two seasons, Manners collected a 33-6-3 record as head coach of the men's team and a 26-9-3 clip as skipper of the Lady Tritons.

Having secured the Region XI championship for the second-straight season under Manners' guidance, the ICCC men concluded the 2004 campaign with a 15-4-3 record that was stopped short on a heart-breaking overtime loss to South Suburban CC in the district tournament. The Lady Tritons finished their season with a stand-out 13-5-1 mark, but were stopped just shy of their seventh consecutive Region XI championship with a loss to lowa Western in the region finals.

While in Fort Dodge, Manners mentored three females and one male to NJCAA all-America accolades, while his tutelage also led to eight all-region accolades (five women) for his athletes.

Prior to his appointment as ICCC head coach, Manners served two stints (1999, 2001-02) as an assistant in Fort Dodge under Macdonald where the duo led both squads to a pair of NJCAA national tournament berths.

"Neil and I worked alongside one another for three years in lowa and were very successful, so I to have the opportunity to

work with him again," Manners said. "He is an excellent coach and leader and he communicates well with his players at any level. I have learned a lot from him, especially at the Division I level."

Manners played in 80 games (79 starts) during his career at George Mason (1994-97) and scored 35 points on 12 goals and 11 assists from his central defender position. While in Fairfax, Va., he helped lead the Patriots to a combined 44-32-10 record, including a trip to the 1996 NCAA Tournament. A first team all-Colonial Athletic Association selection and second team all-Virginia honoree as a junior, Manners was also a three-time recipient of CAA Scholar-Athlete laurels as well. In addition to his playing career at George Mason, Manners has also played professional soccer in England for both Watford F.C. and Sunderland.

Manners earned his Bachelor of Science degree in health, fitness and recreation resources from George Mason in 1998 before taking a break from coaching in 2000 to earn his Master's degree in education from Augusta State in 2002.

A native of Sunderland, England, Manners currently holds his 'B' coaching license from the United States Soccer Federation, an English 'C' coaching certificate and a NSCAA level 2 goalkeeping diploma. He is currently serving as a coach for the state of Alabama Olympic Development Program as well.





# SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE WOMEN'S SOCCER

The Southeastern Conference has continued its rise as one of the top conferences in women's soccer.

The 2008 women's soccer season reaffirmed the SEC's prominence in the country. Six teams from the SEC were invited to the NCAA Tournament. Auburn, Florida, Georgia, LSU, South Carolina and Tennessee all made the 64-team field.

SEC women's soccer will begin its 17th season in 2009 deeply rooted in the national scene of collegiate soccer. Since the SEC initiated soccer as a varsity sport in 1993, the sport's popularity has grown through the country, especially in the Southeast. A defining point in the SEC's women's soccer success came in 1995 when FOX Sports South broadcasted the SEC Tournament Championship match on a tape-delayed basis, signifying the first appearance of an SEC women's soccer match on television. Southeastern Conference women's soccer continued to grow over the next couple of years as the conference made a name for itself nationally. In 1998, the SEC had its breakout season with Florida winning the conference's first NCAA title in just the program's fourth year of existence. The league led the nation with six NCAA Tournament teams that year, an accomplishment which firmly inserted the SEC as one of the major conferences in women's soccer. The SEC also made bigger strides in its television coverage with three regular season matches and the SEC Tournament championship match shown live on the SEC-TV package. In 2003, the SEC Soccer Tournament moved to Orange Beach, Ala., signifying the growth of the sport's popularity. In 2006, SEC-TV's women's soccer coverage was increased to four regular-season matches, in addition to the SEC Tournament championship match.

That incremental growth, combined with increasing exposure on the national and regional scene, has SEC women's soccer looking to blossom to new heights in the year 2009 and beyond.





MSU has the largest enrollment in the state of Mississippi. Founded as a land-grant institution, its grass, flowers and trees are as prevalent as buildings, sidewalks and parking lots. Large enough to sport diversity in all areas, the university still maintains a warm, friendly atmosphere.

Ruby Hall, a residence hall with the largest single room size in university history, opened in August 2006. A co-residential, 160,000-square foot, three-story freshman hall, Ruby is located at the north end of campus, in convenient proximity to the Colvard Union, the Perry Cafeteria, Mitchell Memorial Library, the Sanderson Center and all athletic facilities. Ruby Hall offers students the latest in technology, including Ethernet access, full wireless internet coverage, a refrigerator and microwave, and free cable with HBO in each room.



State's coaches care for their studentathletes and the school's sports programs. Each has a passion for their specialty, experience as a player and coach, and expertise to instruct at the highest levels. Their goal is to coach champions on the field and mold productive college graduates from the university's classroom.



CHRISTI SANDERS (back left) has the longest, consecutive coaching reign of any head coach at State, with 21 seasons at the helm of the women's golf program. She has twice been named SEC Coach of the Year (1990, 2000).

RICK STANSBURY, the winningest coach in MSU basketball history, has guided the Bulldogs to 231 wins and eight postseason appearances in his 11 seasons at State.

Former MSU baseball standout JOHN COHEN was introduced as Mississippi State's new baseball skipper in June 2008.

DAN MULLEN is widely regarded as one of the top young minds in college football. With 15 years of experience in the collegiate coaching ranks, Mullen was named the 32nd head football coach in the history of Mississippi State University on December 10, 2008.

NEIL MACDONALD is the only head coach to guide the MState soccer program to an SEC Tournament appearance in his first season (2004).

Mississippi State athletes play in some of the nation's finest facilities. Almost every Bulldog competition site has either been constructed or renovated in the last 15 years. During that time alone, more than \$60 million in facility enhancements have been made.

DAVIS WADE STADIUM AT SCOTT FIELD: Near-sellout crowds have become the norm at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field, where the Bulldogs have played before masses reaching 85 percent of stadium capacity. Since the 2000 season when expansion and renovation projects gave the nation's second-oldest stadium a gleaming new look, crowds have grown by nearly 30 percent.




PITTS TENNIS CENTRE: Considered among the finest tennis facilities in the collegiate ranks, the modern, six-court, 1,000-seat A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre recently completed its 26th year serving the men's and women's programs. Recent enhancements at the facility include new locker areas and concession stands (1998) and a permanent press box (2004).

#### W.O. SPENCER STADIUM/ CARL MADDOX TRACK:

Co-named in honor of a two-time Mississippi State Olympian and a former MSU athletic director, the W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track has served as host to the Southeastern Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships three times since 1985, joining Tennessee as the most frequent host for that event during that time.



DUDY NOBLE FIELD, POLK-DEMENT STADIUM:
One of the nation's leaders in baseball season ticket sales and attendance, Dudy Noble Field, Polk-Dement Stadium still holds the nation's on-campus single-game attendance mark — 14,991. With a seating capacity of more than 7,000 and more space in the world-famous outfield, Sports Illustrated magazine named the park, the "Best Place To Watch College Baseball" in a 1997 issue.



MSU SOCCER FIELD: Built in 1995, the lighted Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldog women one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast, a 114-yard long, 72-yard wide regulation NCAA Championship field. The lush turf is Mississippi Pride grass, developed by researchers on the MSU campus.

MSU SOFTBALL FIELD: Constructed in 1997, the Mississippi State Softball Field has undergone almost constant improvement at the northern-most point of campus. Lights were added to the facility in 1998, brick work was added to the dugouts two years later and, in 2001, additional batting cages were built. In 2005, softball moved into a new locker, training and meeting facility adjacent to the park.



BRYAN BUILDING: The state-of-the-art John H. Bryan Athletic Administration Building is the crown jewel of MSU's expansion projects of the last decade. Opened in 1996, this showcase facility is named for longtime Bulldog friend and supporter John H. Bryan Sr., and houses athletic administration, football, ticket, athletic development and media relations offices.

## MSU has played in the SEC

MSU has played in the SEC Football Championship Game, the basketball Final Four, the baseball College World Series, and in numerous NCAA national title events since 1996. The last decade has brought overall achievement unmatched at State, and each new generation adds more hardware to the school's trophy cases.

State won the SEC Western Division title in 1998 and held a fourth-quarter lead on eventual national champion Tennessee in the league championship game at the Georgia Dome. The Bulldogs' appearance in the championship game garnered the school a berth in the 1999 Cotton Bowl.

The 1999 Maroon football team won its first eight games of the season, amassed 10 victories for just the second time in school history, and defeated Clemson in the Peach Bowl at Atlanta. Quarterback Wayne Madkin (above), State's all-time leading passer, was named the bowl game's Most Valuable Offensive Player.



MSU's 1998 men's tennis team was one of two Bulldog squads that reached the NCAA semifinals, losing to perennial national champion Stanford. The '98 team was one of 10 State net teams that earned NCAA Sweet 16 berths from 1991-2001.

State's soccer team captured the 2001 SEC Western Division crown, the first SEC championship of any kind by an MSU women's team. That title came in just the sport's seventh year of existence on the campus.

Now a 13-year NBA veteran, he helped lead the Dallas Mavericks to an NBA Finals appearance in 2006.

## TEMPLETON ACADEMIC CENTER



The Shira Athletic Complex received it's second neighborhood addition in the past four years on Nov. 1, 2008, when the Templeton Athletic Academic Center was officially dedicated.

Mississippi State's student-athletes have enjoyed outstanding success in the classroom, and the new \$10 million facility provides state-of-the-art amenities that will help the Bulldogs and Lady Bulldogs continue that success while reaching new levels.

The Templeton Athletic Academic Center includes a large computer lab and individual computer rooms and work stations that will allow student-athletes access to a computer at their convenience. The building also houses academic counselor offices, large study areas, resource rooms, conference rooms and tutor rooms that will allow MState's academic staff the most efficient way to interact with student-athletes.

The two biggest areas of the State's newest facility are a 300-seat dining room and a large foyer that captures many of the team highlights and individual greats that have encompassed Mississippi State's rich athletic history.

Perhaps the greatest attribute of the Templeton Athletic Academic Center is the location. Situated adjacent to the Shira Complex and Holliman Athletic Center, the facility stands in the heart of MSU's athletic facilities.

The structure is named for Larry Templeton, who served as Mississippi State's director of athletics from 1987-2008. Under his leadership, MState accomplished many great athletic feats. The football team reached six postseason bowl games, the men's basketball squad reached the Final Four and the baseball team went to the NCAA College World Series three times. State teams also claimed five Southeastern Conference champi-

onships under his guidance and advanced to NCAA championship play 29 times. The Bulldog softball team made seven of those trips in a nine-year stretch.

With all of the on-field accomplishments under Templeton's watch, State enjoyed even more success in the classroom. During the 2005-06 academic year, MSU's men and women athletes posted the highest combined grade-point average ever recorded in the 18 years of tracking student-athlete grades.

The newest addition to the MSU campus will allow the Mississippi State soccer team to continue its excellent academic tradition. Last season, the Bulldogs placed 14 players on the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll and an SEC-best nine on the freshman academic honor roll.

## Dr. Mark E. **Keenum**

#### President SE Missouri State, 1964

Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

After completing his bachelor's and master's degrees in agricultural economics at Mississippi State, Dr. Keenum joined the university faculty in 1984 as a marketing specialist with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service. Two years later, he accepted a position as a research associate with the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station at MSU.

He continued his education at the university, in 1988 receiving a doctorate in agricultural economics, and he joined the faculty of that department as an assistant professor/economist. During his professional tenure at Mississippi State, his primary research and extension work focused on the marketing and economics of aquaculture, specialty crops and forestry. He continued his faculty ties at the university 1997-2006 as an adjunct professor, teaching an annual course on agricultural legislative policy.

Prior to being named president of Mississippi State in November 2008, Dr. Keenum served as Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture for two years, where he provided leadership and oversight for the Farm Service Agency, the Risk Management Agency and the Foreign Agricultural Service. The mission area, comprised of the three agencies, had a total operating budget of \$1.7 billion and approximately \$40 billion in program authority. The three agencies employed more than 16,500 people at more than 2,300 offices nationwide and 98 locations around the globe.

In 1989, Dr. Keenum joined the Washington, D.C., staff of U.S. Senator Thad Cochran as Legislative Assistant for Agriculture and Natural Resources. As Sen. Cochran's adviser on agricultural affairs, he worked on numerous issues important to U.S. agriculture, including the 1990, 1996, and 2002 Farm Bills. From 1996-2006, he served as Chief of Staff for Sen. Cochran. In this role, Dr. Keenum was the chief adviser to the senator on political, legislative and appropriations issues. He also was responsible for managing all administrative and legislative functions of Sen. Cochran's Washington, D.C., office and three Mississippi offices, including direct oversight of the U.S. Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry and the U.S. Senate Committee on Appropriations.

Dr. Keenum and his wife Rhonda have four children.

## Greg **Byrne**

#### Director of Athletics Arizona State, 1994

hen Greg Byrne was named Mississippi State University's 15th Director of Athletics on February 21, 2008, he became the youngest top current athletic administrator in the Southeastern Conference. At 36 years of age, he became the youngest to lead an athletic program at the NCAA Division I-A level.

Despite his age, Byrne is anything but inexperienced. He has been around successful athletic programs, and the director's chair at those institutions, literally all his life. He is the son of long-time athletic administrator Bill Byrne, currently the Director of Athletics at Texas A&M University.

Byrne, however, has made a name for himself in intercollegiate athletics. He has 15 years of professional experience, a resume' that shows progressive growth in both responsibility and achievement. He has been directly involved in raising over \$120 million in gifts during his career in athletics. He has finalized and implemented an annual giving renovation for athletics at three different institutions. Byrne has also helped in the reorganization of the athletic program at one school while renovating the department's budgeting systems, development, marketing, and compliance programs. Byrne was on the ground floor of resurrecting a football program and athletic department at another institution, one that achieved success for the first time in three decades.

Prior to being named to head State's athletic program, Byrne came to MSU in June 2006 as Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs. In just his first year on the job, Byrne initiated a first-ever volunteer fund-drive that resulted in 969 new Bulldog Club members for Mississippi State. He implemented a priority seating program for football and men's basketball that led to a \$1 million increase in annual giving. He also led the effort to package State's donor and ticketing software, in connection with the department's athletic web site, for fan convenience. In so doing, MSU became the first Bowl Championship Series school to enlist XOS Technologies for total donor support in those areas.

Byrne held a similar position at the University of Kentucky prior to coming to Starkville. As Associate Athletic Director for Development and Fund-Raising at UK from 2002-05, he managed the development staff and operated a multi-million dollar budget. He oversaw development efforts that raised annual gifts from \$4 million to \$9 million annually. While in Lexington, Byrne led a \$35 million athletic facility campaign, and participated in the design, funding and marketing for Kentucky's \$30 million basketball practice facility. He worked with a corporate sponsorship team to manage UK marketing and development efforts, including signing one of the nation's top multi-media rights packages. Byrne was one of four members on the UK search committees that brought new head football and baseball coaches to the Wildcat athletic program.

Byrne possibly made his greatest athletic program impact as Associate Athletic Director for Development at Oregon State University from 1998-2002. Managing an eight-person staff, he replaced an antiquated 60-year old fund-raising organization and increased annual giving from \$1 million to over \$5 million in cash during his tenure there. He assisted the Director of Major Gifts in raising more than \$30 million in capital gifts for facilities and budget enhancement while in Corvallis. He participated in securing a \$12.5 million gift to rename the Beavers' football stadium. Byrne was involved in the department's transition of corporate sponsorships for radio, television, stadium and arena signage and game program sales to increase revenue.

Byrne began his athletic fund-raising career as Regional Director of Development at the University of Oregon from 1995 through '98, overseeing development efforts for Portland, Southern and Central Oregon, Northern California and the Oregon coast. He secured the largest donation totals ever for each region during his U of O career. While overseeing the Duck's letterman's organization, he participated in raising \$14 million for an indoor football facility and soccer complex.

The energetic Byrne launched his professional career as Special Projects Coordinator for the Fiesta Bowl in Tempe, Ariz., from 1993-95. During that time, he managed a 1,000-person volunteer base for 63 Fiesta Bowl annual events. Byrne was promoted to a full-time position following an initial internship period.

A native of Pocatello, Idaho, Byrne earned his bachelor's degree from Arizona State University in 1994. He anticipates receiving his master's degree from Mississippi State this summer.

Byrne is married to the former Regina Misa of Junction City, Ore., and the couple has two sons: Nick (13) and Davis (11).
