### Who to Contact?

The Mississippi State Communications Department is here to serve the media throughout the 2017 Bulldog soccer season. Media members in need of assistance can contact Caleb Garner in the Communications office at (662) 325-6259 or by cell at (662) 361-1993.

### MSU Player/Coach Availability

Players and coaches will be made available to the media upon request. Those wishing to set up an interview must contact Caleb Garner via phone or e-mail. On gameday, players and coaches are only available postgame.

For post-practice interviews, media members should contact Caleb Garner no later than 10 p.m. the night before. In most cases, players will be available for a brief time before and after practices which are scheduled during the morning hours of 7:45-10:15 each weekday.

Telephone interviews can also be scheduled with players on a call-back basis during the week with arrangements made through Caleb Garner.

### **Postgame Interviews**

Requested MSU players, along with head coach Tom Anagnost, will be available for interviews approximately 10 minutes after all games near the midfield sideline opposite of the dugouts.

The Mississippi State locker room and field dugouts are off limits to the media.

### **Press Box Services**

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following the end of the first half and at the conclusion of each game. Media members also have access to game notes, statistics, lineups and rosters prior to the start of each game upon request. A pregame meal is also served in the press box around 45 minutes prior to each game.

### Photographers/Videographers

Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot around the MSU Soccer Field in approved areas. Those wishing to shoot a game must contact Caleb Garner the day before the game to be granted access.

### **Radio Broadcasts**

The MSU Soccer Field press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Caleb Garner in the Communications office.

### MISSISSIPPI STATE SOCCER FIELD

Home to the Mississippi State soccer team since 1995, the Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldogs one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast.

Located on the north side of the Mississippi State University campus, the MSU Soccer Field is situated in the heart of the university's impressive physical plant. It joins the Mike Sanders Track Compex, Dudy-Noble Field/Polk Dement Stadium (baseball), Nusz Park (softball) and the A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre to give MSU one of the finest Olympic sport venues in collegiate athletics.

The facility features a main grandstand area which accommodates more than 500 people, while the grass hillsides that bookend the stands can seat over 1,000 fans for any given contest. The atmosphere is enhanced with a 15'x10'LED-based video board, which is situated behind the north goal.



The new scoreboard came a year after the program debuted a 2,600 square-foot brick facility in 2008 which houses a concession stand, men's and women's restrooms and a spacious press box.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas, with each equipped with hi-speed internet and telephone access. It is also setup to accommodate television and team video personnel. The MSU Soccer Field also includes covered dugouts for participating teams.

Hailed as one of the top playing surfaces in the Southeastern Conference, the field stretches 114 yards long and 74 yards wide. The regulation NCAA Championship field features Mississippi Pride grass - developed by researchers on the Mississippi State campus - making it home to one of the finest playing surfaces in the country.

Lights were added just after the conclusion of the 2002 campaign, equipping the facility for evening competition and giving it an added amenity that can only translate into better atmospheres.

The atmosphere at the facility has grown over the years, with MSU setting seven of the Top 10 attendance marks since 2012. The Bulldogs claimed a new stadium attendance record in the 2013 season against Florida, only to eclipse that mark at the start of the 2014 campaign with 1,010 on hand to watch the opener against lowa State. The mark was surpassed again in 2014, this time against Ole Miss with a crowd of 1,235 on hand. Then, in 2015, the stadium attendance record was shattered with a crowd of 1,327 on hand to watch the Bulldogs take on Florida.

### MISSISSIPPI STATE SOCCER CLUBHOUSE

Beginning in the 2016 season, Mississippi State soccer took on a new feel when its clubhouse was completed.

The MSU Soccer Clubhouse, a \$1.8 million facility covering nearly 3,000 square feet adjacent to the soccer field, gives the Maroon and White one of the finest buildings of its type in all of college soccer. It also gives the Bulldog soccer program an onsite locker room for the first time in program history.

Past teams had to dress and get treatment for practice and games at Humphrey Coliseum before crossing College View Drive in order to gain access to the field.

It features a 1,000-square-foot player locker room, shower area and bathroom, a 600-square-foot film room/lounge area, a

500-square-foot treatment area, a 300-square-foot equipment and laundry room, a 300-square-foot coaches conference room/locker room and a 250-square-foot kitchen to top it all off.

The addition of the clubhouse adds to one of the best soccer atmospheres in the South and further demonstrates the dedication of the MSU Athletics Department to the soccer program at MSU.



### SEASON PREVIEW | 2017 HAIL STATE SOCCER

New faces abound for the 2017 Mississippi State soccer season, starting in the coaches' offices, but the goal remains the same—make it to Orange Beach for the Southeastern Conference Tournament.

Despite losing 11 players from the 2016 squad due to transfer and graduation, the expectations remain high for new head coach Tom Anagnost and the Bulldogs.

2016 saw MSU go 6-12-0 and win just one game in conference



play, but hopes remain high for the 2017 Bulldog soccer campaign.

Anagnost comes in after successful stints at the University of Miami (Fla.) from 2011-12 and at Central Michigan from 2008-10. Upon his hiring, he immediately got to work assembling his staff, which is composed of a pair of his former assistants from his time in Coral Gables. Jason Hamilton

was brought in after spending the last three seasons as the head coach at Troy. Matt Kagan joined the Bulldogs after three years as an assistant at Loyola Marymount.

To reach the SEC Tournament for the first time since 2004, the Bulldogs will have to navigate through a difficult schedule, both in the non-conference slate and in the always-difficult SEC.

Six of the teams the Bulldogs will square off against this season made the NCAA Tournament in 2016, with four of them making it past the first round. Two of those teams made it all the way to the quarterfinals of the tournament.

A majority of the roster is composed of junior and seniors, as



well as a graduate transfer who brings a wealth of experience in the net. 11 newcomers highlight the roster, with eight of them true freshmen to accompany the three transfers, so a lot of new talent will be relied upon to help the veterans bring the Bulldogs success in 2017.

2016 team captain Mallory Eubanks returns for her senior season after training with the U-23 U.S. Women's National Team in the offseason. It was her third offseason training with the national team. Eubanks led the club in nearly every offensive category a year ago, scoring three goals and dishing out three assists.

In order to take that next step, the Bulldogs will need to score more. In both 2015 and 2016, the Bulldogs scored 17 goals. However, MaKayla Waldner returns for her sophomore campaign as the team's second-leading scorer from a year ago. The incoming class of newcomers is also loaded with goal-scorers, which will help boost the chances of MSU goals this season.

### SEASON PREVIEW | 2017 HAIL STATE SOCCER



One of the newcomers that has a chance to see early playing time is junior Brooke McKee, who transferred in from Troy. McKee scored eight goals in her first two seasons of college soccer with the Trojans. She was also a finalist for Alabama's Gatorade Player of the Year honor as a senior. Also, Olivia Hernandez, a transfer from Arizona State was a prolific scorer in high school, scoring a district-record 141 goals in her four years.

MSU's midfield is one of the more veteran areas on the team, with two-time minutes leader Carly Mauldin returning as a junior. Katelyn Watson and Kelly Dorney also return as seniors to help Mauldin and junior Kiley Martens provide leadership to the young Bulldog squad. MSU also added Clinton, Mississippi native Hayden Oswalt, who comes from Sam Houston State.

Freshman Grace Doran comes in as a capable goal scorer for the midfield unit, having scored 12 goals and had 22 assists as a junior in high school in Michigan.

MSU returns several veterans from the defensive end of the field. Seniors Hannah Smith and Khalyn Harmon have seen significant time in the backfield for MSU over their previous three years, while junior Courtney Robicheaux has played over 3,100 minutes for the Bulldogs in just two years. Senior Kaleigh Henry and sophomore Emily Malone also return, giving the Bulldogs plenty of veteran leadership on the defensive end of the field.

Rhylee DeCrane returns in goal for the Bulldogs after not seeing the field a year ago. Joining the goalkeepers is graduate transfer Catalina Perez, who comes in after three years at Miami (Fla.). Perez also has two years of international experience with the Colombian Women's National Team, where she has made appearances in both the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup and 2016 Summer Olympics. Washington freshman Bri Aldridge rounds out the keepers unit for Anagnost's first MSU club. Aldridge had a successful high school career, holding her high school's shutouts record and she could see time in front of the net for the Bulldogs this season.

Anagnost's first season kicks off with a pair of exhibition games at Florida (Wednesday, Aug. 9) and at home against Memphis (Friday, Aug. 11) that will help prepare the club for difficult opposition throughout the year.

The regular season will then kick off on Friday, Aug. 18 at home against first-time opponent Stephen F. Austin. Then, on Sunday, Aug. 20, the Bulldogs will host Missouri State before taking a trip to Ruston, Louisiana to take on Louisiana Tech on Aug. 24. MSU will then return home to play three straight home matches against opponents new to MSU in Central Arkansas (Aug. 27), Houston (Sept. 1) and Colgate (Sept. 3).

The Maroon and White will then get back on the road and travel to South Florida in Tampa on Thursday, Sept. 7. MSU will then return back to Starkville to host 2016 NCAA Tournament participant South Alabama on Sunday, Sept. 10 to round out the non-conference slate.

MSU will kick off SEC play at Arkansas on Friday, Sept. 15. The Bulldogs will host Missouri (Sept. 21), Auburn (Sept. 29), Kentucky (Oct. 8) and in-state rival Ole Miss (Oct. 22), while Texas A&M (Oct. 26) will serve as the regular season finale. In addition to the trip to Arkansas, the Bulldogs will also visit LSU (Sept. 24), South Carolina (Oct. 5), Alabama (Oct. 15) and Georgia (Oct. 19).

If the Bulldogs can survive its gauntlet of a 2017 schedule, it will have a chance to play in the SEC Tournament in Orange Beach, Alabama to be held from Oct. 31-Nov. 5. Should the Bulldogs move past that would mean they would walk a path no MSU team has walked before by going to the NCAA Tournament, set to begin Nov. 10.





# TOM ANAGNOST



Head Coach First Season at MSU | Kalamazoo College '95

Tom Anagnost is entering his first season at the helm of the Mississippi State soccer program

MSU Director of Athletics John Cohen announced on Dec. 8, 2016 the hiring of Tom Anagnost as the soccer program's new head coach. Anagnost comes to MSU from North Carolina State, where he spent the past season as an assistant coach, aiding the Wolfpack to a NCAA Sweet 16 berth.

Anagnost is considered by many as one of the top Division I head coaches in the country and has found success everywhere he has been. His teams have advanced to the NCAA tournament in each of his four years, and twice to the second round, once with each program. He spent five years in the classroom as a teacher and educator and has shown a major commitment to academics, increasing his team's GPA each year in charge.

Anagnost has also shown a great ability to turn around soccer programs in just a short period of time, as he has showcased this talent in each of his head coaching stops. In his first head-coaching gig at Central Michigan, Anagnost's club earned a second place finish in the Mid-American Conference despite finishing 10th a season before he took over the reigns. Anagnost followed up the runner-up showing with back-to-back MAC titles and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances to cap his time with the Chippewas. At his next stop, Anagnost took Atlantic Coast Conference basement dweller Miami to back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths as he led the squad to the second round in his first season with the club in 2011.

Anagnost, who becomes the Bulldogs' fifth head coach in program history, has spent the last two seasons as an assistant coach, first with the Michigan Wolverines in 2015 before joining NC State. In Raleigh, Anagnost aided the Wolfpack to a Sweet 16 appearance in his one season at NC State as the squad turned in a 11-9-2 record (4-5-1 ACC) in 2016.

With Michigan, the Wolverines posted a 12-7-2 record (6-3-2 Big Ten) and advanced to the second round of the conference tournament in 2015. Anagnost worked under head coach and former United State Women's National Team coach Greg Ryan. During his time with the Wolverines, Anagnost helped improve the team's NCAA Tournament resume and increased its RPI from

the previous year. He played a major part in raising the quality and brand of soccer at Michigan.

Prior to his assistant coaching jobs, Anagnost was the head coach of the University of Miami (Fla.) women's soccer program for two seasons from 2011-12. He led the Hurricanes to a combined 19-15-5 record on the pitch and two consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including the program's first trip to the NCAA second round in 2011. The Hurricanes also qualified for the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament in 2012, while earning two wins over top-10 teams for the first time in school history.

Before his time in Coral Gables, Fla., Anagnost was the head coach of the Central Michigan program from 2009-10 after earning the job as an interim head coach in 2008 following his successful stint as an assistant with the club in 2007. He guided teams to a combined 45-12-7 record in his three seasons with the Chippewas and earned a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. Anagnost was named the Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons in 2008 and 2009. Inside the MAC, Anagnost's clubs turned in a 31-4-6 record in league play.

Anagnost has perfected the art of turning around a program in a short period as he's displayed that at his last two head coaching stops. With CMU, the Chippewas finished 10th overall in the MAC before Anagnost took over the helm as the squad finished 8-10-0 in 2007. Over his three-year span with the club, the Chippewas finished with one runner-up and two first place finishes in the MAC as the club won an impressive 45 matches under Anagnost. At Miami, Anagnost led the Hurricane's to back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths and the program's first and only second round appearance. Since Anagnost's departure from Miami, the Hurricanes have not advanced to the postseason.

Anagnost has also spent five years in the classroom as a teacher and educator and has shown a major commitment to academics, increasing his team's GPA each year in charge. While with Miami, the Hurricanes improved in the classroom each season under Anagnost's guidance as the club posted the highest GPA in the ACC in 2011 and the best team GPA for Miami since 2000. At the helm with the Chippewas, Anagnost's teams earned two consecutive NSCAA Academic National Championships

Anagnost, a native of Saginaw, Michigan, also boasts nine years at the high school level in his home state, coaching the Bay City John Glenn program (1999-02), Saginaw Heritage (2000-02) and Flint Powers Catholic (2003-07). He was named Saginaw Valley League Coach of the Year at Saginaw Heritage in 2002 after leading his club to the SVL title, while also earning two more Coach of the Year honors with Flint Powers.

As a collegiate player, Anagnost was a three-time NCAA Division III All-American at Kalamazoo College (1992-95). He graduated with a bachelor's degree in political science with a minor in history in 1995 and later went on to earn a teaching certificate from Saginaw Valley State in 2003. In 2006, he was inducted into the Kalamazoo College Sports Hall of Fame for his contributions over his successful four-year career with the Hornets.



Associate Head Coach First Season at MSU | Southern New Hampshire '03

Matt Kagan, a former assistant of Tom Anagnost at the University of Miami (Fla.), joins the Bulldogs as an associate head coach after spending the past three seasons as an assistant with Loyola Marymount.

"Matt is definitely one of the best recruiters in the country and one of the greatest people I've met in the game," Anagnost said. "He is a passionate coach who cares deeply about the team and all the players on it. I trust him in every way and I can't put into words how elated I am to be working with him again."

Kagan was announced to the MSU soccer coaching staff on Dec. 20, 2016. Kagan has served as an assistant coach for LMU (2014-16), Providence College (2013), Miami (2011-12), Evansville (2008-10) and Assumption College (2004). Kagan also has experience as a head coach with Division III Worcester State (2005-07).

"The people I met on my visit, along with the top-notch facilities, make Mississippi State a truly remarkable place," Kagan said. "The opportunity to work with Tom Anagnost and Jason Hamilton again was something I couldn't pass up. I can't wait to get started as we build something very special at MSU."

While with LMU, Kagan aided the squad to a NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in 2015, after the club turned in an impressive 15-6-1 record. All three seasons with the Lions were winning seasons as Kagan and LMU earned 35 wins during his tenure. Additionally, Kagan landed the No. 37 ranked recruiting class with the Lions in 2015.

Before his time with LMU, Kagan served as an assistant coach on the Providence College women's soccer coaching staff during the 2013 season. He took over interim head coaching duties in January of 2014 until accepting the position with LMU. While with Providence, Kagan turned the 20th ranked recruiting class in the nation, his third Top 20 as a coach, to boost his recruiting resume. Kagan also oversaw the academics for a Friars' club that earned a 2013 NSCAA Team Academic Award with a GPA of 3.25.

At Coral Gables, Kagan spent two seasons with the Hurricanes from 2011-12 where he helped the Anagnost coached club to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances. In addition, Kagan aided Miami to its first and only second round berth in the NCAA Tournament in 2011. His focused recruiting led to a pair of Top 20 ranked recruiting class as well while with the Hurricanes.

Prior to his time with Miami, Kagan spent three seasons serving as an assistant coach for the University of Evansville women's soccer program. Already earning an reputation for his recruiting, Kagan landed Canadian National Team Captain Vanessa Legault-Cordisco to the Purple Aces in 2010. Legault-Cordisco was the first national team player to sign with Evansville. The Purple Aces made one NCAA Tournament appearance in 2008 after the club won the Missouri Valley Conference. Kagan and the rest of the Evansville coaching staff were named the MVC Coaching Staff of the Year in 2008.

Kagan directed Worchester State to three-consecutive Division III NCAA Tournament appearances as a head coach. With the Lancers, Kagan compiled a 45-15-3 mark from 2005 through 2007. In his final season with Worchester State, Kagan led the Lancers to a NCAA Sweet 16 berth and a national ranking of No. 21 in the NSCAA poll to cap the 2007 campaign. During his tenure at Worchester State, Kagan also helped develop 19 all-conference players, including a 2007 D3Kicks. com All-American. Kagan was named the 2005 Massachusetts State College Athletic Conference (MASCAC) Coach of the Year.

As a player, Kagan played at Southern New Hampshire University where his team advanced to the NCAA Tournament Division II Championship game and he was named to the Final Four All-Tournament Team in 2002. He received a Bachelor of Science in sports management from SNHU in 2003, before earning a Master of Business Administration from his alma mater in 2007.

Kagan holds an Advanced National Coaching Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

Originally from Newington, Connecticut, Kagan was born on Oct. 30, 1981, and is married to wife Jessica Kagan who is a native of Las Vegas, Nevada.





## JASON HAMILTON



Associate Head Coach First Season at MSU | Detroit Mercy '05

Jason Hamilton, a former assistant of Tom Anagnost at the University of Miami (FL), joins the Bulldogs as an associate head coach after spending the past three seasons as the head coach of the Troy women's soccer team.

"Jason is a proven head coach who is extremely talented and versatile," Anagnost said. "I believe he is at an elite level when it comes to goalkeeping. Jason has exceptional natural abilities and will be able to help in all facets of the program. I have an enormous amount of respect for him and I am super excited that he is now a Bulldog."

Hamilton was announced to the MSU soccer coaching staff on Dec. 20, 2016. Hamilton has served as a collegiate assistant coach with Florida (2013) and Miami (2011-12) before his head coaching stint at Troy (2014-16). Hamilton also has experience in the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) as an assistant coach with the Boston Breakers (2013).

"I'm very excited to be joining the soccer program at Mississippi State," Hamilton said. "From the second I arrived on campus, I felt part of the Bulldog family. I look forward to working with Tom Anagnost and Matt Kagan again. I think we all bring different qualities that can take MSU to a very high level."

While at Troy, Hamilton compiled a 37-19-5 record with the Trojans in his three seasons at the helm. In his first season with Troy, Hamilton set the record for most wins in program history after earning a 16-6-0 mark. Despite the program only cracking the RPI Top 200 just twice in the school's history, Hamilton's Trojans posted back-to-back seasons in the Top 100, finishing No. 73 and No. 61, respectively. His Trojan squads also flourished in the classroom as well, receiving a NSCAA Team Academic Award in each of Hamilton's first two seasons with the club.

Defensively, the Trojans were one of the best clubs in the nation under Hamilton's watch as Troy ranked in the Top 20 nationally in 2014 and 2015. As team, the 2014 Trojans recorded 13 shutouts, the most in a single-season at Troy. The team also posted a 0.76 goals against average, best in the Sun Belt Conference and in school history. Troy's backline allowed just 17 goals all season, the fewest ever by a Trojan squad.

Hamilton came to Troy after spending the 2013 season as an assistant coach with the Florida Gators where he worked with the goalkeepers, team defending and focused on team set pieces.

Prior to his time in Gainesville, Hamilton served as an assistant for the Boston Breakers of the NWSL. While with the Breakers, his role included scouting opponents, individual training, as well as working with the goalkeepers. During the 2013 season, Hamilton trained Sydney Leroux, Heather O'Reilly and Alyssa Naeher of the United States National Team.

Before shipping up to Boston, Hamilton spent two years on Anagnost's staff at

Miami where he rose quickly in the ranks, from volunteer coach to fulltime assistant. Hamilton aided the Hurricanes to back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths as well as the program's first and only second round appearance in 2011. While with the Hurricanes, Hamilton worked with the back line, midfield and goal-keepers, as well as scouting opponents and directing camps. He was also a part of landing a pair of Top 20 recruiting classes as well while with the Hurricanes.

As a player, Hamilton was a midfielder for Macomb College in Clinton Charter Township, Michigan. The team advanced to the 2000 NJCAA Final Four, with Hamilton earning a pot on the NJCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team. He was also an All-Conference First Team selection. After a collegiate soccer career that included a three-year stint at the University of Miami [Florida] and a season at the University of Florida, Betsy Middleton was named coordinator of operations for the Mississippi State soccer program by head coach Tom Anagnost in August 2017.

Stephanie Snow serves as an assistant athletic trainer for both the women's soccer and women's golf teams. She became a part of the Bulldog family in the summer of 2017.

Before starting at Mississippi State, Snow was a graduate assistant at the University of Utah. During her time in Salt Lake City, she spent two years working with the football team. She graduated from Utah with a Master of Science in Sports Medicine in 2017.

Prior to her time in Utah, Snow received her Bachelor of Science in Athletic Training from the University of Alabama. She is originally from Harvest, Alabama.

Going into the 2016 season, expectations were higher for the Mississippi State soccer program than in years past due to having one of the more veteran teams Aaron Gordon has had since taking over the program in 2013. That showed as the Bulldogs turned in its best overall record since 2012, owning a 6-12-0 ledger.

Heading into the season, the Bulldogs were loaded with a mix of young talent to accompany a host of juniors and seniors, as well as some sophomores who played a lot of minutes as freshmen in 2015. Team captain Mallory Eubanks returned to lead the charge for a second straight season as captain after training with the United States U-20 National Team in the offseason. So, there was reason to see why Gordon and his staff were high on the possibilities for the 2016 edition of MSU soccer.

For the first time since 2012, MSU began the season with a victory—a 1-0 win at College of Charleston to open the 2016 campaign. It was also the first time MSU had won a road game to open the season since 2010. Two days later in Charleston, the Bulldogs took on its first ranked opponent of the season in No. 17 Virginia Tech, but dropped a hard-fought contest to the Hokies, 2-1, after a pair of goals in the last two minutes of the contest.

State returned home to open up its home slate vs. Lipscomb, dropping a 1-0 decision to the Bison before downing UT Martin 3-1 two days later at the MSU Soccer Field.

The Maroon and White hit the road again, this time to face


South Alabama and Southern Miss. In Mobile, it took two overtime periods to finish, but the Bulldogs took down the Jaguars 2-1. Two days later in Hattiesburg, MSU got a big break on a USM own goal to escape with a 1-0 victory.

MSU dropped its Southeastern Conference home opener against Arkansas, but responded well with a Senior Day victory against Louisiana-Lafayette behind Jamila Coner's game-winner.

Then, MSU dropped three straight conference affairs—a double-overtime 2-1 loss to Vanderbilt and a 3-0 loss at arch-rival Ole Miss followed by a 2-1 overtime loss at Missouri.

State finished the month of September on a high note, taking a 1-0 decision from Alabama at home after Johanna Hamblett



scored her second goal of the season to open the second half.

October was a difficult month for the Bulldogs, as they dropped their final six games of the season with five in a row being shutouts. It began with a 1-0 loss to South Carolina at home followed by a 3-0 loss at Auburn. The skid continued with a tough 1-0 loss at home to LSU.

The Bulldogs then traveled up to Rocky Top and lost a 3-0 decision at Tennessee before going down to nationally-ranked Florida, losing a hard-fought 1-0 decision. MSU returned home for its season finale against Texas A&M and lost a 2-1 decision. Eubanks scored the Bulldogs' lone goal.

By ending the season 14th in the conference for the third time in his four seasons at the helm of the Bulldogs, Aaron Gordon was reassigned following the 2016 season—giving way for new MSU head coach Tom Anagnost. MSU was led in points (9), goals (3), assists (3), shots (37) and shots on goal (23) by Eubanks. Johanna Hamblett led the Bulldogs with a pair of game-winning goals, while Kayleigh Henry led MSU in corner kicks with 30. For the second-straight year, MSU was led in saves by Tanya de Souza (88).

## **The University**

Mississippi State is a comprehensive doctoral-degree-granting institution offering a diverse student body a wide range of opportunities and challenges for learning and growth.

The largest university in the Magnolia State, MSU has a statewide enrollment of more than 21,000 students and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Calleges to award baccalaureate, masters, specialists and doctorate degrees.

Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research and service.

The University began as The Agricultural and Mechanical College of the State of Mississippi, one of the national Land-Grant Colleges established after Congress had passed the Morrill Act in 1862. It was created by the Mississippi Legislature on February 28, 1878, to fulfill the mission of offering training in "agriculture, horticulture and the mechanical arts ... without excluding other scientific and classical studies, including military tactics."

The College received its first students in the fall of 1880 in the presidency of Confederate General Stephen D. Lee. In 1887 Congress passed the Hatch Act, which provided for the establishment of the Agricultural Experiment Station in 1888. Two other pieces of federal legislation provided funds for extending the mission of the College: in 1914, the Smith-Lever Act called for "instruction in practical agriculture and home economics to persons not attendant or resident," thus creating the state-wide effort which led to Extension offices in every county in the State; and, in 1917, the Smith-Hughes Act provided for the training of teachers in vocational education.

By 1932, when the Legislature renamed the College as Mississippi State College, it consisted of the Agricultural Experiment Station (1887), the College of Engineering (1902), the College of Agriculture (1903), the School of Industrial Pedagogy (1909), the School of General Science (1911), the College of Business and Industry (1915), the Mississippi Agricultural Extension Service (1915), and the Division of Continuing Education, (1919). Further, in 1926 the College had received its first accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

By 1958, when the Legislature again renamed the College, as Mississippi State University, the Office of Graduate Studies had been organized (1936), doctoral degree programs had begun (1951), the School of Forest Resources had been established (1954), and the College of Arts and Sciences had been created (1956).

The College of Architecture admitted its first students in 1973. The College of Veterinary Medicine admitted its first class in 1977, and the School of Accountancy was established in 1979.



## **Academics & Student Life**



Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as one of 38 Truman Honor Institution.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options.

The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day One Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and juniors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study abroad opportunities.

## **The Bulldogs**

Mississippi State University's athletic teams are called Bulldogs, a name earned and maintained over the decades by the tough, tenacious play of student-athletes wearing the Maroon and White. The official school mascot is an American Kennel Club-registered English Bulldog, given the inherited title of 'Bully.'

As with most universities, Mississippi State University teams answered to different nicknames through the years. The first squads representing Mississippi A&M College were proud to be called Aggies. When the school officially became Mississippi State College in 1932, the nickname Maroons, for MSU's uniform color, gained prominence. Bulldogs became the official title for State teams in 1961, not long after State College was granted university status.

Yet references to school teams and athletes as Bulldogs actually go back to early in the century, and this nickname was used almost interchangeably with both Aggies and Maroons, since at least 1905.

On November 30 of that year, the A&M football team shut out their arch-rivals from the University of Mississippi 11-0 in Jackson, Miss. The campus newspaper, The Reflector, reported: "After the game, filled with that emotion that accompanies every great victory, there was nothing left for the cadets to do but to complete the great victory by showing sympathy for the dead athletic spirit of the University, by having a military funeral parade.

"A coffin was secured, decorated with University colors and a bull-dog pup placed on top. It was then placed on the shoulders of a dozen cadets, and the procession started down Capitol Street, preceded by the brass band playing a very pathetic funeral march."

Other newspaper reports of the victory commented on the 'bulldog' style of play by the A&M eleven, and the Bulldog was soon publicly accepted as a school athletic symbol. Accounts of a 1926 pep rally in Meridian, Miss., had another bulldog parading with students.



## **Bully XXI, "Jak"**

At Super Bulldog Weekend 2015 this past April, the Bulldog family celebrated the passing of the harness, as Bully XXI, known as "Jak," accepted mascot duties from his father Bully XX, fondly called "Champ."

Jak's formal name is "Cristil's Golden Prince," and the American Kennel Club-registered English Bulldog was born in October 2014, soon after the legendary Jack Cristil passed away. Naming the newest Bully for the legendary Voice of the Bulldogs who called football and basketball games for 58 years was a fitting choice.

While Jak enters the 2015 season less than a year old, Champ turns 10 around the 2015 season opener. When mascot handlers realized Bully was getting toward retiring age, though he's still in good health, a female bulldog was selected based on her pedigree and history. Following the female's selection, litter of mascot-sired puppies were evaluated.

Jak's responsibilities will be similar to those of previous mascots, she



## **Official Mascot In 1935**

Use as an official game mascot began in 1935 when coach Major Ralph Sasse, on 'orders' from his team, went to Memphis, Tenn., to select a bulldog. Ptolemy, a gift of the Edgar Webster family, was chosen and the Bulldogs promptly defeated Alabama 20-7.

A litter-mate of Ptolemy became the first mascot called 'Bully' shortly after Sasse's team beat mighty Army 13-7 at West Point that same year - perhaps the greatest victory in MSU football history. But Bully I earned other fame the hard way, in 1939 when a campus bus cut short his career.

Days of campus mourning followed, as Bully lay in state in a glass coffin. A half-mile funeral procession accompanied by the Famous Maroon Band and three ROTC battalions went to Scott Field where Bully was buried under the bench at the 50-yard line. Even Life magazine covered the event. Other Bullys have since been buried by campus dorms, fraternity houses, and also at the football stadium.

For years Bully was a target for kidnappers, the last incident occurring prior to the 1974 State-Ole Miss game. The Bulldog team won anyway, 31-13. While early Bullys once roamed campus freely or lived in fraternities, today the official university mascot is housed at the School of Veterinary Medicine when not on duty at State home football games. For all their fierce appearance and reputation, today's mascot bulldogs are good-natured, friendly animals and favorites with children.

A student wearing a Bulldog suit, also answering to Bully, is part of the MSU cheerleading team and assists in stirring up State spirit at games and pep rallies

## **The Cowbell**

The most unique and certainly the most resounding symbol of Mississippi State University tradition is the cowbell. Despite decades of attempts by opponents and authorities to banish it from scenes of competition, diehard State fans still celebrate Bulldog victories loudly and proudly with the distinctive sound of ringing cowbells.

The precise origin of the cowbell as a fixture of Mississippi State sports tradition remains unclear to this day. The best records have cowbells gradually introduced to the MSU sports scene in the late 1930s and early 1940s, coinciding with the 'golden age' of Mississippi State football success prior to World War II.

The most popular legend is that during a home football game between State and archrival Ole Miss, a jersey cow wandered onto the playing field. Mississippi State soundly whipped the Rebels that Saturday, and State College students immediately adopted the cow as a good luck charm.

Students are said to have continued bringing a cow to football games for a while, until the practice was eventually discontinued in favor of bringing just the cow's bell.


Whatever the origin, it is certain by the 1950s cowbells were common at MSU games, and by the 1960s were established as the special symbol of MSU. Ironically, the cowbell's popularity grew most rapidly during the long years when State football teams were rarely successful. Flaunting this anachronism from the 'aggie' days was a proud response by students and alumni to outsider scorn of the university's 'cow college' history.

In the 1960s two MSU professors, Earl W. Terrell and Ralph L. Reeves, obliged some students by welding handles on the bells so they could be rung with more convenience and authority. By 1963 the demand for these long-handled cowbells could not be filled by home workshops alone. So, at the suggestion of Reeves, the Student Association bought bells in bulk and the Industrial Education Club agreed to weld on handles. In 1964, the MSU Bookstore began marketing these cowbells with a portion of profits returning to these student organizations.

Today many styles of cowbells are available on campus and around Starkville, with the top-of-the-line being a heavy chrome-plated model with a full Bulldog figurine handle. But experts insist the best and loudest results are produced by a classic long-handled, bicycle-grip bell made of thinner and tightly-welded shells.

Cowbells decorate offices and homes of Mississippi State alumni, and are passed down through generations of Bulldog fans. But they were not heard at Southeastern Conference games - not legally, at least - since the 1974 adoption of a conference rule against 'artificial noisemakers' at football and basketball games. On a 9-1 vote, SEC schools ruled cowbells a disruption and banned them. The ban was lifted prior to the 2010 season. The ban did little harm to the cowbell's popularity, or to prevent cowbells from being heard outside stadiums in which the Bulldogs are playing.

They are now heard at non-conference football contests, as well as other sporting events on campus.

Maroon and White are the distinctive colors of Mississippi State University athletic teams, dating back over a century to the very first football game ever played by the school's student-athletes.

On November 15, 1895, the first Mississippi A&M football team was preparing for a road trip to Jackson, Tenn., to play Southern Baptist University (now called Union University) the following day. Since every college was supposed to have its own uniform colors, the A&M student body requested that the school's team select a suitable combination.

Considering this choice to be an honor, the inaugural State team gave the privilege to team captain W.M. Matthews. Accounts report that, without hesitation, Matthews chose Maroon and White.

## Dr. Mark Keenum

## **University President (January 2009-present)**



Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

Now in his ninth year of tenure, Dr. Keenum has guided Mississippi State to unprecedented heights. The university has experienced record enrollment growth – climbing toward nearly 22,000 students. Mississippi State has awarded more than 4,000 degrees at all levels for six straight years.

The campus has expanded and improved on Dr. Keenum's watch. Chief

among those projects has been The Mill at MSU - a \$40-million, stateof-the-art conference and meeting complex. A ribbon-cutting for the Old Main Academic Center, a new \$41-million classroom building and multi-level parking garage, was recently celebrated. A \$60-million project featuring two new residence halls and Nusz Hall, which houses the G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Center for America's Veterans, opened last fall. A \$10-million, fourth-floor expansion of Mitchell Memorial Library to house the Ulysses S. Grant Presidential Library will celebrate its official opening this fall. Mississippi State has completed or initiated capital improvements totaling more than \$700 million since 2009.

A \$55-million expansion and renovation of Dudy Noble Field/ Polk-Dement Stadium - home to one of the most storied college baseball programs in America - is also underway. The first phase of the project added the largest video board in the nation to the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball." The second phase commenced in June at the conclusion of the 2017 season. This major investment will significantly enhance the Dudy Noble fan experience - already described by many as one of the most unique in college sports today.

New construction projects launching over the next two years include a new Music Building and the completion of an Animal and Dairy Science/ Poultry Science complex for the Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine. Additionally, the university is developing a comprehensive plan to build additional teaching and research lab space to meet growing demand.

Fundraising has reached all-time record levels. MSU's current Infinite Impact capital campaign reached its initial goal three years ahead of schedule. Due to that unprecedented success, the university announced a new goal - \$1 billion by 2020 - the largest campaign goal ever for an educational institution in Mississippi. During his tenure, Dr. Keenum has been instrumental in expanding the MSU Promise Program, which provides need-based scholarship assistance to Mississippi students whose families have limited financial means.

Mississippi State is ranked by the National Science Foundation as a "Top 100" research institution. The most recent research success has been MSU's designation as the Federal Aviation Administration's National Center of Excellence for Unmanned Aircraft Systems and Boeing's decision to locate a composite research center at MSU's Raspet Flight Research Laboratory. In fall 2016, the state of Mississippi became a member of the Pan-Pacific UAS Test Range Complex, one of the FAA's seven national test sites, and Mississippi State researchers will lead this Gulf Coast R&D hub for unmanned aircraft. This past spring, the Department of Homeland Security selected a Mississippi State-led team to operate its demonstration range facility for small unmanned aircraft systems.

In 2016, Dr. Keenum was elected president of the Southeastern Conference, where he is a member of the SEC Executive Committee and continues to serve on the SEC's Content Committee that oversees the highly successful ESPN-SEC Network. He also represents the SEC as a member of the College Football Playoff's (CFP) Board of Managers.

He is also serving as president of the Mississippi Association of Col-

leges and Universities, which promotes goodwill among the state's public and private colleges and universities and works to stimulate academic and professional cooperation. Mississippi State will host the organization's 2017 annual conference this fall.

Dr. Keenum travels frequently to Washington, D.C., meeting with Congressional leaders and federal agency heads to pursue research opportunities and broaden the university's influence on the national level. He has also worked closely with state leaders in Jackson in support of higher education in Mississippi.

Mississippi State plays an integral role in economic development locally, statewide, and regionally. Its impact is further felt nationally and internationally through unique collaborative partnerships with peer institutions, business and industry, government agencies, and leading non-governmental organizations. Dr. Keenum leads these efforts because he understands the positive impact the nation's major research universities can have in the diverse communities they serve.

A graduate of Mississippi State with degrees in agricultural economics, Dr. Keenum's interest in international food security has strengthened the university's contributions to global economic sustainability. In 2014, he was appointed vice chairman of the Foundation for Food and Agricultural Research by U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Thomas J. Vilsack. That same year along with other university presidents, he signed the Presidents' Commitment to Food and Nutrition Security at the United Nations in New York City. This marks the first time universities around the world began to share a collective focus on ending food insecurity.

Dr. Keenum's passion for international engagement and transformative research and service has positioned Mississippi State as a leader in addressing global food security and poverty, among other critical issues. In 2014 and again in 2016, he was invited to address the United Nations in New York about the crucial roles public research universities play as the global community works to address critical challenges for a growing population.

Dr. Keenum began his career at MSU as a faculty member with the Extension Service and the Department of Agricultural Economics. He went on to serve as chief of staff to U.S. Senator Thad Cochran in Washington, D.C. and was Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture prior to returning home to Mississippi State.

A graduate of Corinth High School, Dr. Keenum earned an associate in arts degree from Northeast Mississippi Community College in Booneville and was a member of the Northeast Tigers football team. He is married to the former Rhonda Newman of Booneville, also an MSU graduate. They have four children: Rett, Mary Phillips, Katie and Torie.

## John Cohen

## **Director of Athletics (November 2016-present)**



When John Cohen was named Mississippi State University's 17th director of athletics on November 4, 2016, he wasted little time putting his stamp on the department.

The former MSU head baseball coach and two-time Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year has overseen the hiring of three coaches, while nine teams have advanced to postseason since he took over the helm, seven earning Top 25 rankings with baseball, women's cross country and women's basketball finishing in the Top 16.

In all, four sports - women's cross country, women's basketball, women's track and field (indoor and outdoor) - posted or tied their highest NCAA Championships/postseason finish in school history.

"I love Mississippi State University," Cohen said. "As a student-athlete, as a coach, and now with this once in a lifetime opportunity, I feel deeply honored to lead MSU's athletics program. I am profoundly grateful for the chance to lead the totality of MSU athletics as I have tried to lead MSU's baseball program - in daily and dogged pursuit of championships at the highest level."

Cohen, who spent more than two decades coaching college baseball, was named MSU's head baseball coach in July of 2008. Nine years later, Cohen's official role in administration began when he assumed the role of associate athletic director in addition to head baseball coach. The following November, he took charge of an athletic department that has since achieved new heights in athletic, academic, facility and fundraising achievements.

One day after becoming athletics director, Cohen named Andy Cannizaro as MSU's next head baseball coach. Cannizaro, a former Major Leaguer and one of the nation's rising coaching stars in college baseball, led the Bulldogs to a Top 10 ranking and trip to the Super Regionals. Subsequent hires by Cohen include women's soccer coach Tom Anagnost and men's golf coach Dusty Smith.

During Cohen's short tenure as director of athletics, the athletic department has enjoyed notable success. In April, the women's basketball team advanced to the national championship game after its historic upset of No. 1 ranked UConn to snap an NCAA-record 111-game winning streak, a feat that garnered Vic Schaefer's team an ESPY award in July. This achievement came after the Bulldogs played in the SEC Tournament finals, a month before the men's tennis team also played for the conference

As an athletic department, MSU placed 49th in the Learfield Director's Cup with 490 points to mark the first time in school history to post backto-back Top 50 finishes.

As athletic director, Cohen is charged with providing leadership, management, and administration for the university's athletic programs. Cohen is currently overseeing the multi-million dollar renovation of famed Dudy Noble Field to make it the premier facility in all of college baseball.

A Tuscaloosa, Ala., native and MSU alumnus, Cohen was a head coach in the SEC for 12 years. His teams have been successful both on the field and in the classroom. At MSU, he led the Bulldogs to a College World Series finals appearance, an SEC regular season championship and an SEC Tournament championship. Since 2009, MSU baseball has had 133 players selected to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, including three straight SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year winners from 2013-15.

"I'm fortunate to know our MSU coaches as friends and colleagues, and to know many of our athletes in all sports," Cohen said. "While baseball has been a huge part of my life, my passion for seeing MSU athletics thrive extends to all sports. I'm grateful to Dr. Keenum and the MSU Family for allowing me to embrace these new and critical responsibilities."

As a baseball player at MSU, Cohen was a key player on the Bulldogs' 1989 SEC championship team and 1990 College World Series team. He graduated from MSU with a degree in English in 1990 and received a master's degree in sports management from the University of Missouri in

After a six-year stint with Missouri as a graduate assistant and assistant coach, Cohen was the head coach at Northwestern State University from 1998-2001. Cohen spent two seasons as an assistant baseball coach at the University of Florida before becoming the head coach at the University of Kentucky in 2004, a position he held for five seasons before returning to his alma mater.

While winning 284 games as a head coach at MSU, Cohen demonstrated a keen ability to develop players and coaches. During his tenure, 138 MSU baseball players were selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, including All-American Brent Rooker this June. His influence can be seen throughout the SEC as four of his former assistants are now or have been head coaches — Brad Bohannon (Alabama), Gary Henderson (Kentucky), Nick Mingione (Kentucky) and Butch Thompson (Auburn).

Cohen is the only coach in SEC history to win an SEC championship, SEC tournament championship, and advance to the College World Series both as a player and head coach. Cohen's 2013 Bulldog Club advanced to the CWS championship series for the first time in MSU history. Currently 31 of Cohen's former players are playing professional baseball. Cohen's 2012 club produced an SEC record-tying eight major leaguers. Eight of the university's top ten all-time marks in baseball season ticket sales have come during Cohen's tenure, including a school record of 5,874 in 2014.

Cohen and his wife, Nelle, are active members of the Starkville community. The couple has two daughters, Jordan Baker and Avery Lawson.
