


TRACK FACILITY LOCATION



BOB HARTLEY MEMORIAL FELLOWSHIP

Providing Graduate Assistant Opportunities to Young SIDs



For more than half a century Robert M. "Bob" Hartley dedicated his life's work to promoting Mississippi State athletics. From his hiring as the school's first sports publicity director in August 1946 to his initial "retirement" as assistant athletic director for communications in June 1985, through his later years as an invaluable consultant for the Mississippi State University Department of Athletics, the man we called "Hart" gave special meaning to the words "loyalty" and "devotion to duty."

Mr. Bob's labors of love with MSU have not gone unrecognized. He has taken his place among college athletics' greats as a member of both the university's and the state's sports halls of fame and the College Sports Information Directors of America Hall of Fame.

His willingness to generously give of his talent, his time and his friendship serves as an inspiration to the countless lives he touched and to those that aspire to follow in his footsteps. In that respect, the Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship was created by the MSU Department of Athletics to provide graduate assistantship opportunities for young media relations practitioners.

Tony Schmidt was selected as the fifth recipient of the Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship for the 2005-06 academic year. A native of Starkville, Miss., Schmidt earned his bachelor's degree with an emphasis in public relations and sports communication, in the summer of 2005 from Mississippi State. He served as a student assistant in the MSU athletic media relations office for four years. During his stint as an undergraduate, he served as the contact for the MSU men's golf team in 2003-04 and 2004-05.

The 2004 and 2005 MSU men's golf media guides received awards from CoSIDA. The 2004 edition was rated third in District 6, while the 2005 guide placed second in the district.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

SETTING THE STANDARD FOR INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS IN CROSS COUNTRY AND TRACK & FIELD

In the ever-changing world of collegiate athletics, the tradition of excellence in the Southeastern Conference has remained constant. The SEC boasts a rich history and has dominated track and field like no other conference

2005 CROSS COUNTRY

Arkansas led all SEC teams at the 2005 NCAA Men's Cross Country Championships, placing second to national champion Wisconsin. The Razorbacks were led by Josphat Boit, who finished seventh, earning All-America honors. Arkansas' Peter Kosgei (12th) and Kenny Cormier (28th) as well as Tennessee's Zach Sabatino (23rd) earned All-America honors as well. Three other SEC teams placed in the top 30, led by Alabama (21st), Florida (23rd) and Tennessee (28th). Arkansas also earned its 15th consecutive men's SEC title with Boit claiming his second consecutive conference individual crown.

Tennessee won its third straight SEC women's championship and placed 28th in the NCAA Championships. Auburn's Angela Homan captured her third straight women's SEC individual title and was the SEC's top finisher in the women's NCAA championships, placing ninth, and earning All-America honors. Arkansas was the SEC's top finisher at the NCAA Championships, placing 19th.

2006 MEN'S INDOOR

Arkansas scored 53 points to clinch their 19th indoor national crown and its 42nd national championship overall. LSU finished off the pace in second with 45 points. Arkansas' claimed its 13th SEC Indoor championship in 15 tries since entering the league in 1992. LSU's Xavier Carter claimed SEC Men's Runner of the Year. Florida's Mike Morrison was named the SEC Men's Field Event Athlete of the Year, as his gator teammate, Willie Perry, was tabbed as the SEC Men's Freshman Runner of the Year. Arkansas' Nkosinza Balumbu earned the SEC Men's Freshman Field Event Athlete of the Year, while John McDonnell of Arkansas was named SEC Men's Indoor Track and Field Coach of the Year.

2006 WOMEN'S INDOOR

Auburn eighth and South Carolina in 10th. Georgia won its first SEC Indoor title in school history. South Carolina's Shalonda Solomon was named the SEC Women's Runner of the Year after winning the NCAA 200m title and Florida's Shannon Leinert was tabbed SEC Women's Freshman Runner of the Year. Georgia's Jenny Dalhgren was tabbed as the SEC Women's Field Event Athlete of the Year, while teammate Levern Spencer was named SEC Women's Freshman Field Event Athlete of the Year. Georgia's Wayne Norton was named SEC Women's Indoor Track and Field Coach of the Year.

2006 MEN'S OUTDOOR

LSU was the National Runner-up at the NCAA Championships. Arkansas and Tennessee posted top-10 finishes, with the Razorbacks taking fifth and the Vols sixth. LSU sophomore Xavier Carter was honored in four events on the NCAA Division I Men's Outdoor Track and Field All-America Team and was also named the 2005-06 Roy F. Kramer SEC Male Athlete of the Year. Arkansas won its fourth straight SEC outdoor title. The Razorbacks have claimed 13 SEC Outdoor titles out of 15 since joining the conference in 1991-92.

2006 WOMEN'S OUTDOOR

Auburn women's track and field team won its first ever national title at the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships. The Tigers posted All-American performances in nine events, including two individual national champions and three second-place finishers, and broke two school records during the four-day event. Tiger Coach Ralph Spry was named the NCAA Division I Outdoor Track and Field Coaches of the Year. South Carolina finished third at the NCAA Championships, while LSU and Georgia posted top 10 finishes at seventh and ninth respectively. Georgia claimed the SEC Outdoor title, holding off an Auburn rally to finish one point ahead of the Tigers.

THE NATION'S TOP TRACK & FIELD CONFERENCE

CROSS COUNTRY

MEN - Eight national championships, two individual titles, 79 All-Americans since 1984, 34 teams have finished among the Top 20 since 1984.

WOMEN - One team championship in 1988, 51 All-Americans since 1981, 40 teams have finished among the top 25 since 1982.

INDOOR TRACK

MEN - Fourteen national championships since 1992 and 124 NCAA individual champions; 49 individuals earned All-American status in 2006 with Arkansas winning the NCAA title.

WOMEN - Thirteen national championships since 1987 and 90 NCAA individual champions; 41 All-Americans in 2006.

OUTDOOR TRACK

MEN - Seventeen NCAA titles and 15 of 17 national championships since 1989 and 163 NCAA individual champions; 39 All-Americans in 2005.

WOMEN - Eleven consecutive NCAA titles by LSU from 1987-97 and again in 2000, 100 NCAA individual champions since 1982; 72 All-Americans in 2006 with Auburn winning the title.

COMBINED EVENTS

The Bulldogs return two experienced individuals to comprise the MSU decathlete duo. Junior Joseph Queen scored a personal-best 6,519 pts at the Southeastern Conference Championships a year ago. The Jackson, Miss.-product finished 19th and sixth respectively at the league-wide event in his first two seasons. Joining Queen in the decathlon will be sophomore Darryl Brady. As a freshman in 2006, the Vancleave, Miss.-native registered 6,253 points in the SEC Decathlon.

DISTANCE

One of the most senior-laden groups in 2007 will be the distance competitors. The 2007 class was the first class assembled at MSU since the revival of the men's cross country program in 2003. Under the tutelage of Associate head track coach Steve Dudley and Houston Franks, the men's distance corp. is coming of a productive 2006 cross country season. Last fall, the State men finished sixth at the SEC Cross Country Championships - the best finish for the men in 25 seasons. The squad was led by senior Travis McKay, who finished his cross country career atop the school's all-time top 10 finishes list with six. Among the six top 10 finishes, he recorded a win at the Sewanee Invite to open the campaign. His performance in the first week of the season garnered him SEC Male Athlete of the Week honors. The MState men opened the '06 slate with a one-two finish at the Sewanne Invite and the Crimson Classic. Along with McKay, senior Wade Martin earned all-South Region status as a junior. Senior Phillip Moore claimed the 1500-meter run at the 2006 Bulldog Invitational, while Ryan Irwin posted a personal-best (4:01.33) in the 1500meter run at the SEC Championships.

The distance squad features new faces in 2007 that will add depth to the line up. Jonathan Rono, a transfer from Missouri State will be an added benefit along with two-time Mississippi High School Athletic Association 5A Cross Country Champion from Madison Central High School - Daniel Simpkins. Simpkins, a stellar student in the classroom was named a National Merit Finalist.

Other newcomers include - Neel Stewart of Pensacola, Fla., Cameron Vincent of Ocean Springs, Miss. and local product Clayton Walters of Starkville High School.

State returns three jumpers from a season ago in senior Jerald Wilson, junior Joseph Queen and sophomore Allen Cassell. All three individuals contributed to the Bulldog scoring ledger throughout the 2006 campaign. SPRINTS & MIDDLE DISTANCE

On the heels of a seventh-place finish in the 4x400-meter relay at the 2006 Outdoor National Championships, the MSU quartet of Arthur Davis, Bruce Davis, Ezra Jones and Nathan Daniels returns for 2007 in hopes of improving on the '06 accomplishments. The relay team earned all-American status for its finish at the national championships. A. Davis garnered his third all-American honor during his junior season and will be striding for his fourth this season. If the Mobile, Ala.-native can achieve the feat, he would become just the second MSU track and field athlete to earn all-American honors in all four seasons at State. The only other individual to complete that honor was Lorenzo Daniel (1985-88). B. Davis and Jones had stellar junior seasons after transferring to MState from Wallace State Community College

in Alabama. The team placed third in the 4x400-meter relay at the SEC Championships and qualified for nationals at the Mideast Regional, clocking a season-best three minutes, 3.09 seconds.

Chris Woods advanced to nationals in the 800-meter run. In two seasons on the Starkville campus, the Atlanta, Ga. native has advanced to nationals as a freshman and sophomore and garnered all-American honors as a part of the 4x400-meter relay squad during his rookie campaign.

Five newcomers boost the sprints with junior college transfers Jamil Hubbard, who won a junior college championship as a member of the 4x400-meter relay team at Wallace State CC. Delandus O'Neal was named honorable mention all-American on the junior college level in the 400-meter hurdles at WSCC. Freshmen Kendall May won the Alabama High School State crown in the 100-meter dash and claimed fourth in the 200-meter.





Regarded and respected nationwide as an authority on endurance running and training, Al Schmidt enters his 19th season at the helm of the Mississippi State's men's and women's track teams. Since his hiring on Oct. 22, 1988,

Schmidt has parlayed his 34 years of collegiate coaching experience into many individual and team accomplishments for MSU, both on and off of the track. In his previous 18 seasons, Schmidt has produced 27 all-Americans and 33 SEC champions.

In 2006, Schmidt guided four Bulldogs to all-American status. Schmidt also witnessed six school records broken along with six new freshman records. At the SEC Championships, the men's team had a total of five athletes score 19 points to finish 11th overall. Among those scorers included Joseph Queen and Darryl Brady doubling in the decathlon, with fifth and eighth place finishes, respectively.

Out of the 21 events the Bulldogs competed in, 78 of the athletes marked a personal best in their respective event and won 18 events, including Tim Williams winning the B section of the high jump at the Texas Relays, after clearing six feet, 10-and-three-quarters inches. There were also 16 regional qualifiers for the men's team and nine relay regional marks met during the season. B. Davis, Jones, Daniels, and Elzie Coleman finished first in the Championship Flight of the 4X400-meter relay at the Penn Relays, with a time of 3 minutes, 6.54 seconds.

On 55 separate times this past season, 20 Lady Bulldogs met their personal best marks, along with 25 regional qualifiers. Joy Griffith finished third in the 3000-meter steeplechase at the SEC Championships with a time of 10:43.30, along with Marissa Harris who finished fourth in the heptathlon with 5,112 points, and Jasmine Walls who took fourth in the high jump with a jump of 5-10 ½. A total of 21 Lady Bulldogs scored a total of 27 points for MSU as they finished 11th at the meet.

The Lady Bulldogs were also a part of 19 first-place finishes this past season. In the 4X800-meter relay, Jen McPherson, Andrea Wahlin, Liz Grube and Zita Magoire finished first at the LSU Tiger Relays and Alabama Relays, second at the Texas Relays, breaking a school-record with 8:47.84, and sixth at the Penn Relays. In the distance medley relay, McPherson, Antrese Banks, Wahlin and Magloire finished first at the LSU Tiger Relays and second, running an 11:29.63, at the Texas Relays behind the top-ranked Longhorns.

In 2005, Schmidt witnessed six Bulldogs garner all-America accolades. At the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Championships, Elzie Coleman, Arthur Davis, LaChristopher Lewis and Jamel Ashley ran a school-record 3:01.63 to finish fifth in the 4x400-meter relay. Ashley placed second in the 400, while Lewis took 11th in the long jump to earn his first all-America honor in the event. At the Mideast Regional, Steve Mullings won the 100-meter dash title, repeating his performance from the SEC Championships. Lewis also won the long jump title at the conference meet, while Ashley finished second in the 400-meter dash. Travis McKay finished seventh in the steeplechase, setting the third-best time in school history. As a team, the Bulldogs finished 19th in the last Trackwire 25 of the season.

On the women's side, Meggan Hodge broke the MSU school record in the 3000-meter steeplechase with a 10:46.04 eighth-place finish at the SEC

Championships. Jasmine Walls cleared a personal best to tie for second in the high jump. Crystal Averitt ended her career atop the all-time list in the hammer throw, while Lacey Johnson extended her school record in the pole vault.

Three-time all-American Tiffany McWilliams closed out her MSU career in 2004 by becoming the most decorated female athlete in Lady Bulldog track and field history. McWilliams repeated her 2003 feat of winning the outdoor 1500-meter title and also won the NCAA Indoor title in the mile. Behind McWilliams and a strong distance core, MSU achieved a No. 12 national ranking.

On the men's side, decathlete and all-American Trey Hardee set a school record in the event after tallying 8,041 points in a second-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Five Bulldogs were named all-Americans in 2003. Ashley Davis, Lewis and Keston Nelson all earned the recognition following a third-place finish in the 4x400-meter relay at nationals. Ashley picked up the honor in the 400-meter dash in addition to the 4x4.

In 2003, McWilliams became the first woman in MSU track and field history to win a national championship. Running 4:06.75, McWilliams broke an NCAA Championships record en route to winning the 1500-meter run. She was also crowned the SEC indoor champion in the mile run in addition to the outdoor 800- and 1500-meter runs.

At the Outdoor Championships, State tallied the second-highest point total with 20 points. MSU finished in tied for 15th behind Pierre Browne's second-place showing in the 100-meter dash (10.34). Hardee took fifth in the decathlon for his first all-America honor, while Kelvin Harris ran 13.86 in the 110-meter hurdles to earn his first all-America nod.

The men topped all previous indoor squads at the NCAA Indoor Championships. The Bulldogs scored 15 points to score in the top 10 for the first time in school history. Browne won the 60-meter dash title (6.60), while Marquis Davis finished second in the 200 (20.70).

During 2002, Schmidt and the MSU program hosted the SEC Outdoor Championships. At the meet, State's men scored 35 points as a team, the second-highest total of an MSU squad since his arrival. He also witnessed the men's program tally its highest points total since 1991 at the SEC Indoor Championship.

Elisha Williams become the school's first indoor all-American in 2001 after taking second in long jump. Later in the season, Williams became the second woman to become a double all-American in the same year. Williams took fifth in the outdoor long jump. Schmidt also helped Falilatu Ogunkoya finished her MSU career in 2001 as a five-time all-American, and Camille Harper closed out her career as an all-American in the 100-meter dash.

The 1990s saw Aki Bradley benefit from the tutelage of Schmidt. Bradley became a double all-American at the 1994 NCAA Outdoor Championships, placing in both the 100- and 200-meter sprints. In 1992, MSU hosted the SEC Outdoor meet. In the first year Arkansas and South Carolina were members of the conference, the Bulldogs finished seventh overall.

Schmidt's first men's team in 1989 showed immediate improvement, finishing fifth at both the SEC Indoor and Outdoor Championships. It marked the first time in five years the Bulldogs finished in the top half of the conference.

During Schmidt's first three years, he saw Festus Igbinoghene earn six all-America awards in horizontal jumps, including three runner-up finishes in the triple jump.

ACADEMICS

Under Schmidt, State's squads have also excelled in the classroom. A total of 164 student-athletes have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll a combined 239 Times. Three athletes - Rob Irwin, Tina Bridgeman and April Ecke each earned Academic all-America honors. Distance runner Ecke earned the 1995 H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar Athlete of the Year honor after an outstanding career on the track and in the classroom. Chris Boldt earned First Team Academic all-District honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America in 2003, while Matt Denton collected the honor in 2005. Joining Boldt and Denton this past year were Brian Irwin who finished 1st Team Academic all-District for the Men's, Joy Griffith who finished First Team Academic all-District, and Zita Magloire who finished with 2nd Team Academic all-District. Also, in 2006 the Lady Bulldogs were selected by the U.S. Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association, as an All-Academic Team. They were one of 77 teams nationally and joined four other Southeaster Conference squads for the prestigious honor.

PRIOR TO MSU

Before coming to MSU, Schmidt was instrumental in the success of Florida State University's track and field program in the mid 1980s. First serving as an assistant women's track coach and head cross country coach, he later became an assistant men's track coach and head cross country coach. Under his guidance, the Lady Seminoles won two national titles, taking the 1984 outdoor and 1985 indoor titles. The FSU women also claimed runner-up honors at the 1983 and 1985 outdoor meets.

Upon earning his bachelor's degree from St. Louis University, Schmidt made his coaching debut as an assistant cross country coach at the University of Missouri-St. Louis before returning to his alma mater as head men's track coach for the next five years. After spending two year in private business, Schmidt returned to the track in 1982 as a graduate assistant at the University of Kansas. Following his one season at KU, he began his six-year stint at Florida State

PERSONAL

In 1997, Schmidt served as a District 9 representative for the NCAA Women's Cross Country Championships. Having rewritten the endurance curriculum for Levels I and II, Schmidt currently serves as the vice-chairman of USA Track and Field' Coaches Education Committee. Schmidt, 56, is married to the former Jessie Garfield of St. Louis, Mo. They are the parents of two children - daughter Sara Lynne, a sophomore at MSU and son, Daniel, a high school junior.

An integral part of the Bulldogs' success since his return to Starkville, Steve Dudley begins his seventh year at Mississippi State as the associate head coach for the track and field squads and head coach of the men's cross country team.

Through six seasons back on campus, Dudley has tutored 13 athletes to all-American status since his return to his alma mater in 2000. Last season, Dudley led five Bulldog sprinters to regional qualifying marks, including four individuals in the 400-meter dash. Chris Woods made a trip to the NCAA postseason in the 800-meter run. The 2006 edition of State's 4x400-meter relay team of juniors Bruce Davis, Ezra Jones, Arthur Davis and Nathan Daniels ran 3 minutes, five seconds to finish seventh at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. The finish by the quartet garners A. Davis with his third all-America honor in the event, while B. Davis, Jones and Daniels collected their first.

In 2005, Dudley guided MState's 4x400-meter relay squad to a fifth-place finish at the national championships and broke a school record held for more than a decade (3:01.63). As a result, senior Jamel Ashley, freshman Elzie Coleman, Arthur Davis, senior LaChristopher Lewis, Kendall Pyant II and Chris Woods earned all-America status. In the 4x100-meter relay, Ashley, Lewis, sophomore Eliott Morant and Mullings tied a school record with a 39.09 clocking at the Texas Relays. Mullings, Ashley, Davis and Lewis combined to finish third in the event at the SEC Championships. Since the 2003 Penn Relays, the Bulldogs have failed to win the 4x200-meter relay only once.

Former Bulldog Steve Mullings posted the fastest regional-qualifying time in the country in the 100-meter dash (10.06) and won the Southeastern Conference and Mideast Regional championships. In his final season for the Maroon and White, Jamel Ashley garnered all-America honors with a second-place finish in the 400-meter dash at the national championships. Ashley's 44.75 broke a school record he set a day earlier.

At the 2004 SEC Championships, Ashley, Davis, Keston Nelson and Lewis finished second in the 4x4. Ashley took eighth in the 400 at the national meet, while the 4x4 squad finished third.

Pierre Browne was named the 2003 NCAA Indoor national champion in the 60-meter dash and finished runner-up in the 100 at the outdoor national meet. Marquis Davis finished second in the 200 at the outdoor national meet the same season. Throughout the season, four of his athletes accumulated six all-America honors. Dudley's first season in Starkville saw his athletes earn eight all-America accolades.

In three seasons at Bevill State (Ala.) Community College, Dudley coached three NJCAA national champions and 19 all-Americans. In cross country, the men's and women's squads captured the Region XXII title in 1999. The Bears also won the 1998 Region XXII title en route to a third-place national showing. His 1999 Lady Bear team earned Academic Team of the Year honors, and the men finished second the same season. Twelve Bears earned Academic all-America accolades.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Dudley served as a captain for MSU's track team from 1991-95. While at State, he was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll for three years (1993-95). He currently ranks fifth on MSU's all-time superlatives list in two categories--the indoor 5000-meter run and the outdoor 10,000-meter run.

The Hamilton, Ala.-native graduated with a bachelor's degree in May 1995. He received his master's degree in environmental geology from State in December 2004.



HOUSTON FRANKS

ASSISTANT COACH
Men's Distance
Third Season • Mississippi State, 1998

Houston Franks returned home to Mississippi State in 2004 as an assistant track and field coach. An accomplished distance runner at for the Maroon and White from 1994-98, Franks assists coaching and developing men's distance runners.

The third-year coach is an integral part to the recent success of the MState men's cross country program. This past cross country season, the Bulldogs finished sixth at the Southeastern Conference Cross Country Championship - the best placement by the men's squad since the 1981 season and the best finish since the program was revived in 2003. Working alongside men's head cross country coach Steve Dudley, Franks helped the squad to a season-opening meet win at the Sewanee Invite. The 2005 team also finished second at the Crimson Classic. The men finalized the 2005 slate with an eighth-place spot at the NCAA South Regional.

Prior to returning to Starkville, Franks spent five years at Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State University). While at SMS, Franks served as head cross country coach for the Bears. While there, he won three Missouri Valley Conference women's titles. His women's teams finished in the top four at the NCAA Midwest Regionals during his last three years and his men's squads finished in the top half of the conference during all five seasons. During the track and field season, the Bears captured three indoor and outdoor league championships on the women's side.

Franks was a three-time MVC Coach of the Year in women's cross country. During the 2002-03 season, he was also a part of the first SMS squad since 1993-94 to win the league's coveted Triple Crown championships in cross country and both indoor and outdoor track and field.

Franks was also a graduate assistant at MSU under Al Schmidt during the 1998-99 season. While an assistant, he developed training programs for distance runners and coordinated team travel, recruiting and meet administration.

While running for the Maroon and White, Franks was considered MSU's top distance runner and was named to the Southeastern Conference's Academic Honor Roll three times. He currently ranks second on MState's all-time list in the indoor 3000-meter run and fourth in the outdoor 10.000-meter run.

Franks is a 1998 MSU graduate with a teaching and coaching degree. He received his master's degree in sports administration from MSU in August 1999.

The Tupelo, Miss. native was a four-year letterwinner at Tupelo High School and was named an all-American in cross country his senior season. A state champion in both cross country and the two-mile run, he was also named an all-State selection three times during his track and field career at THS.

Former Florida State University standout Karen Rademeyer joined the MSU staff during the 2004-05 season. Her primary responsibilities at MSU are coaching throwers and combined event athletes.

In 2006, she guided freshmen Emily Sanders into

the MState freshmen record books in the discus and hammer competitions. Sanders mark of 172 feet, two inches was also good for a spot in the USATF Junior Outdoor Championships. Under her guidance, a total of six athletes garnered all-Southeastern Conference status and three Lady Bulldogs set new all-time outdoor superlatives in the hammer competition since the 2005 slate. Junior Christina Hernandez earned a regional qualifying mark in the discus competition. Her mark of 156 not only earned her spot in the postseason event, but also claimed the top spot at the Jace Lacoste Invitational. In the shot put, Illian tutored junior Nicola Wilson to a school record 50 feet, one inch and three quarters attempt to earn her a regional qualifying mark. She coached Marrissa Haris to a new school record in the 100-hurdles (13:52). She tutored Lauren Johnson to all-SEC honors in the pentathalon and heptathalon. On the men's side, Joseph Queen and Darryl Brady each captured all-SEC awards in the decathalon.

During the 2003-04 season, Illian served as an assistant coach at McNeese State University in Lake Charles, La. While there, Illian was responsible for throwers, combined events and the program's strength and conditioning training. Under Illian, several McNeese State athletes qualified for the NCAA Regionals in the shot put, discus and javelin.

At Jacksonville University in Jacksonville, Fla. during the 2002-03 season, Illian was in charge of the throws and multi-events, including helping Andrea Pressley to the NCAA and USA Championships.

A 2002 graduate of FSU, Illian was an NCAA qualifier in the javelin her final season. She also finished her junior year ranked among the nation's top 35 javelin throwers. During her Atlantic Coast Conference career, Illian finished ranked in the top 10 in the javelin, hammer throw and heptathlon in three seasons of competition.

During her senior season, Illian completed conference competition ranked eighth in both the heptathlon and hammer throw and second in the javelin. In 2001, she finished second in the ACC in the heptathlon and third in the javelin. At the conclusion of the 2000 season, Illian finished ranked fifth in the heptathlon, fourth in the javelin throw, eighth in the hammer throw and helped lead the Seminoles to the ACC team title. Currently, she ranks fourth in the javelin throw on the FSU all-Time list and fifth in the hammer throw. She also ranks eighth on the list in the heptathlon.

Illian graduated magna cum laude with a bachelor's degree in English education. She received her master's in exercise physiology from McNeese State in May 2004. She has received her Level I and Level II certifications in throws from USA Track.

This past summer, she married MSU assistant strength and conditioning coach Travis Illian. He works directly with MSU football, softball and women's tennis programs.

Seventh Season • Mississippi State, 1995

Kurt Thomas joined the Mississippi State staff in 2004 as a graduate assistant, and in 2005, was promoted to assistant coach. His primary responsibilities are coaching hurdlers, jumpers and women's sprints.

This past season Thomas directed the women's 4X800-meter relay team that includes Jen McPherson,

Andrea Wahlin, Liz Grube, and Zita Magloire. They set a Mississippi State school record with 8 minutes, 47.84 seconds, and finished second only behind No. 1 nationally ranked Texas at the Texas Relays, and also went on to win the LSU Tiger Relays and the Alabama Relays. In the Distance Medley, McPherson, Wahlin, Magloire, and Antrese Banks won both the LSU Tiger Relays, Alabama Relays, finished second at the Texas Relays, and seventh at the Penn Relays. With Thomas's assistance Marrissa Harris finished in the top 5 of all six of her 100meter hurdle events, including a first place finish at the Jace Lacoste Invitational. In conclusion to the year Thomas helped guide four Mississippi State Outdoor Track and Field records to be broken including the 100-meter hurdlers by Harris, 13.52, 4X800-meter relay, and the High Jump by Jasmine Walls with a five feet, 10-and-three-quarter inches jump. Also, three freshman records were broken including the 100-meter hurdles by Harris, High Jump by Dot Youmans with 5-07, and the Triple Jump by Janelle Finley with 39-08. In addition, Thomas oversaw 19 personal best marks achieved by the women's team in sprints, hurdles, and jumps. Thomas also assisted in leading the men's team to 14-personal best marks in the hurdles and jumps for the 2006 year, and assisted Allen Cassell to a 5th place SEC finish in the high jump finishing with 6-08 ¾ jump.

Prior to coming to Starkville, Thomas was a student assistant with the University of Tennessee men's program. Under Vince Anderson, he aided in the training and development of athletes, as well as meet and administration management. He was also a part of two Southeastern Conference championship teams and two NCAA national championship squads.

Thomas worked with numerous all-Americans and SEC champions in all events and worked with professional athletes, including world champion and Olympic gold medalist Justin Gatlin, Leonard Scott, Tom Pappas, Gary Kikaya, Jabari Greer and Stephan Harris.

Thomas also assisted with the UT Championship Track and Field Camp for three summers. He instructed athletes from ages 8-18 in areas of correct warm-up procedures, as well as instruction in sprints and sprint starts, long jump, basic track and field techniques and proper nutrition.

In addition to his collegiate coaching experience, Thomas coached the Knoxville (Tenn.) Track Club. His primary area of interest was among 7-18 year olds competing in sprints, hurdles and relays. One of his athletes qualified for the Amateur Athletic Union national trials in the boys' 100-meter dash.

As an undergraduate at the University of New Mexico, Thomas scored at the Western Athletic Conference indoor meet in the 60-meter dash and 4x400-meter relay. He also participated in the WAC outdoor meet in the 100-meter dash and 4x100-meter relay.

As a high school athlete, Thomas was an all-State performer in the 4×100 -, 4×200 - and 4×400 -meter relays at Hobbs (N.M.) High School. He was a three time all-District selection in the 100 and 200-meter dashes, 4×100 -, 4×200 - and 4×400 -meter relays and district champion in all three relay events.

Thomas received his Bachelor of Arts degree in history from the University of Tennessee in 2004, and is currently pursing a master's degree in kinesiology from Mississippi State. He has two USATF Level II certifications, the first in sprint, hurdles and relays and the second in combined events.







The most decorated female athlete in the history of Mississippi State track and field returns to the program as a volunteer assistant coach for the 2007 season. Tiffany McWilliams, a three-year letterwinner for the Lady Bulldogs will assist with the distance runners this season under head coach Al Schmidt.

McWilliams, a three-time NCAA Champion and all-American at MSU, she established herself as one of the top middle distance runners in the NCAA and is now one of the best in the United States. She captured her first NCAA crown at the 2003 outdoor championships in the 1,500-meter run. The Red Bay, Ala.-native won six Southeastern Conference titles during her time in the Maroon and White. McWilliams registered SEC crowns in the indoor milerun in 2003 and 2004 and captured the 2003 and 2004 800-meter run and 1500-meter run events. She was named the SEC's Runner of the Year in 2004 and was tabbed as the conference's Athlete of the Week three times in track and once in cross country. She holds three MSU records in indoor track and owns three in outdoor competitions.

In cross country, she was a back-to-back all-Region honoree in 2002 and 2003. She finished 19th at the NCAA South Regional in 2002 and runner-up in the 2003 edition of the NCAA South Regional.





4X4 FINISHES SEVENTH ON FINAL DAY OF NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Mississippi State University men's 4x400-meter relay team of juniors Bruce Davis, Ezra Jones, Arthur Davis and Nathan Daniels ran 3 minutes, five seconds to finish seventh on the final day of the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

"Ezra just didn't run the curve, and we got stuck in traffic," said MSU head coach Al Schmidt. "We didn't run the way we could, but they're all-Americans. We've had a good year with this group, and next year's a new year. We'll be back (at the national meet) strong."

The finish garners A. Davis with his third all-America honor in the event, while B. Davis, Jones and Daniels collect their first.

As a team, the Bulldogs' two points from the event gave MSU a share of 58th place.

JUNIOR CHRIS WOODS EARNS SEC-OND STRAIGHT NCAA APPEARANCE

Sophomore Chris Woods' top time of 1:48.90 ranked second overall in the SEC this year and brought a win for the all-American at the Bulldog Invitational on April 1. His second-best time -- 1:48.94 -- came at the Auburn Invitational. Woods automatically qualified for the national meet, having posted the fifth-best qualifying time in the 800 (1:49.91) and taking fifth in the final at the Mideast Regional (1:49.14). After running 1:51.19 in the preliminaries of the SEC meet, Woods was unable to compete in the final due to injury.

MSTATE SENDS EIGHT TO REGIONAL

The Bulldogs sent eight individuals and a relay team to Knoxville, Tenn. for the Mideast Regional. The Bulldogs were most-represented in the 400-meter dash, having five athletes in the event. Junior all-American Arthur Davis (Mobile, Ala.) led the contention after finishing third in the 400 at the Jace Lacoste Invitational (46.40). A pair of mid-season



transfers -- Bruce Davis and Ezra Jones -- competed at their first NCAA regional. Davis, a product of Phenix City, Ala., ran 46.45 to take second at the Auburn Invitational, while Jones (Wildwood, Fla.) won the Bulldog Invitational title in 46.99. Sophomore all-American Elzie Coleman (Newburgh, N.Y.) ran 47.06 in his only open 400 of the season at the Auburn Invitational, while junior Nathan Daniels (New Iberia, La.) qualified at the same meet after finishing fourth in 47.03.

RELAY TEAM WINS COLLEGIATE 4X400 AT PENN RELAYS

The Mississippi State University men's 4x400-meter relay team closed out the 112th Penn Relays by winning the college men's division of the event. A trio of juniors - Bruce Davis (Phenix City, Ala.), Ezra Jones (Wildwood, Fla.) and Nathan Daniels (New Iberia, La.) - along with sophomore all-American Elzie Coleman (Newburgh, N.Y.) clocked a regional-qualifying 3 minutes, 6.54 seconds to take the title.

STATE MEN DOMINATE INVITATIONAL

The Mississippi State University men's outdoor track and field squad hosted the Bulldog Invitational at the W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track. The Bulldogs won seven individual events and one relay and set five NCAA regional qualifying marks. Sophomore all-American Chris Woods (Atlanta, Ga.) ran 1 minute, 48.90 in the men's 800-meter run, besting the next competitor by three seconds. Woods' time is a personal best and ranks fifth on the MSU all-time superlatives list in the event.

State's distance corps dominated the 3000-meter run field. Junior Travis McKay (Edmonton, Alberta) won running 8:26.51, a new Spencer Stadium/Maddox Track record and personal best. As a team, the Bulldog beat out Louisiana Tech by scoring 147 points compared to La. Tech's 105. Southern Miss placed third (99), Missouri State (91) was fourth, Memphis (78) was fifth and Alabama-Huntsville (18).




IRWIN NAMED TO ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM

Ryan Irwin (Ballwin, Mo.) was named to the ESPN the Magazine College Sports Information Directors of America District VI Academic all-District First Team. Irwin's cumulative grade point average is a 3.87 in computer engineering. He ran a personal best time in the 1500-meter run at the SEC Championships (4:01.33) and was a member of the 4x800-meter relay team that ran 7:53.52 to post the fifth-best time in school history at the Texas Relays. Irwin was also on the winning distance medley relay team at the FSU Snowbird (10:32.35).

Academically, Irwin has received the Newsom Academic award. He has also been named to the Bulldog and SEC Academic Honor Rolls and the President's List. He is a research assistant at MSU's Center for Advanced Vehicular Systems (CAVS) and a member of the student-athlete community service organization, M-Club.

McPHERSON COMPETES AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

McPherson entered the national meet having received an at-large bid to join the 28-person field in the women's 1500-meter run. At the Mideast Regional, McPherson ran 4:27.18 in the final to finish eighth overall and at the Southeastern Conference Championships, also finished eighth (4:31.24). Her top time came at the Auburn Invitational on April 22. There, she posted the second-best time in the conference this season, winning the meet title in 4:22.26. In addition to the win at Auburn, McPherson won the Jace Lacoste Invitational title on April 15 (4:28.11).

LADY BULLDOGS SEND SCHOOL RECORD 10 ATHLETES TO REGIONAL

The Lady Bulldogs send a record number 10 athletes to the Mideast Regional meet. Freshman Marrissa Harris was a double-qualifier in the 100-meter hurdles and long jump. Harris shattered the MSU school record in the 100-meter hurdles after winning the SEC Championships heptathlon race in 13.52 seconds. The mark also ranks as an MSU freshman record and the 11th best time posted in the region this season.

Senior high jumper Jasmine Walls traveled to her first Mideast Regional having posted a mark of 5-10 ¾. The distance trio of senior Zita Magloire and juniors Jen McPherson and Joy Griffith also trek to Knoxville seeking to continue their impressive seasons.

GRIFFITH CRUSHES STEEPLECHASE REOCORD PENN RELAYS

Mississippi State University opened competition at the 112th Penn Relays on Thursday with junior Joy Griffith running an MSU school-record and regional-qualifying 10:35.31 seconds to finish 10th in the women's 3000-meter steeplechase championship race.



WILSON BREAKS TWO SCHOOL RECORDS IN THROWS EVENTS

Mississippi State University junior Nicola Wilson threw a school record 51-01^{3/4} to finish fourth in the shot put and lead MSU on the third day of competition at the Alabama Relays. Wilson's mark meets an NCAA regional qualifying mark in the event and is the second school record Wilson holds (indoor shot put).

She posted a mark of 48-04 to break the indoor shot put record.

GRIFFITH ADDS CLASSROOM AWARD TO HER '06 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Joy Griffith was named to the ESPN the Magazine College Sports Information Directors of America District VI Academic all-District First Team and was named to the U.S. Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association's all-Academic Team.

Griffith posted a 3.96 cumulative grade point average in animal/dairy sciences (pre-veterinary medicine). She set the MSU school record in the 3000-meter steeplechase, clocking a regional-qualifying 10 minutes, 35.31 seconds in a 10th-place finish at the Penn Relays.

Griffith was named the overall female winner for the Newsom Academic award, presented annually to the top MSU athlete in each sport. She also received the animal/diary sciences female scholarship and has been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

MSTATE WOMEN GARNER ACADEMIC TEAM AWARD FROM USTFCCCA

Mississippi State University's women's track and field team garnered all-Academic Team status by the U.S. Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association. The Lady Bulldogs were one of 77 teams nationally and joined four other Southeastern Conference squads on the list. They were joined by



league members – Alabama, Arkansas, South Carolina and Vanderbilt. The selection of the team awards were based on combinations of athletic and academic achievements.

The USTFCCCA also announced individual academic honors. MState had five individuals make the all-Academic Team for the 2006 campaign. On the women's side, juniors Joy Griffith and Jennifer McPherson along with senior Jasmine Walls and freshman Marrissa Harris were all recipients of the individual award.

MSU CROSS COUNTRY SQUAD FINISH STRONG AT SEC CHAMPIONSHIP

Both Mississippi State's men's and women's cross country teams finished in the top half of the 2006 Southeastern Conference Cross Country Championship meet in Baton Rouge, La. on Saturday. The men finished sixth in the league-wide event. On the men's ledger, the Bulldogs placement is best in 25 years for the program and the best since reviving the program four seasons ago.

Leading the way for the Bulldogs in the SEC meet was senior Travis McKay, who crossed the line at 24:41.66 in 15th place. He finished one spot in the individual standings from being named all-SEC. Jonathan Rono finished at 25.40:71 (40th), followed by Robert Scribner (25:42.60) and Pad Judd (25:48.40). Scribner and Judd both finished in the top-50 of the field. Wade Martin and Phillip Moore rounded out the MSU scoring with times of 25:58.84 and 26.23:21 respectively.


MSU'S TRAVIS MCKAY NAMED SEC MALE ATHLETE OF THE WEEK

MSU WOMEN FINISH FIFTH AT SEC CHAMPIONSHIP

Mississippi State's women's cross country teams finished in the top half of the 2006 Southeastern Conference Cross Country Championship meet in Baton Rouge, La. on Saturday. The Lady Bulldogs claimed fifth place in the league-wide event.

State's finish on the women's side is the best finish for them at the SEC Championship since the 2002 campaign in which MSU also placed fifth in the meet.

Senior Jennifer McPherson turned in MState's best performance in the women's 6K race with a time of 21:06.50 to finish 22nd in the individual standings. Annie Falor followed suit with a time of 21:16.43, which was 24th best in the field. Sophomore Michelle Corrigan finished 38th (21:44.48) followed by Mina Thorstenson (22:06.64) and Liz Grube (22:14.13) Thorstenson and Grube finished 48th and 50th respectively.

McPHERSON CONCLUDES NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP ON WET, MUDDY COURSE

Lady Bulldog senior distance standout Jennifer McPherson posted a time of 23:32.3 at the 2006 NCAA Cross Country National Championships on Monday. The Nampa, Idaho-native finished 221st in the national meet.

The course at the LaVerne Gibson complex had its share of inclement weather over the past week in Terre Haute, Ind. It endured five inches of rain over the past five days which allotted for slower times at the 2006 edition of the NCAA Cross Country Championship.

McPherson became the first MState woman to compete at the national event since Tiffany McWilliams ran in 2003. As her final year in the Maroon and White cross country uniform comes to a close, she recorded three top-20 finishes, including two in the top-five. She earned All-South Region honors for the second time in her career this season.

STATE'S FALOR, MCPHERSON NAMED TO ALL-SOUTH REGION TEAM

Mississippi State's Annie Falor and Jennifer McPherson were named to the South All-Region team on Tuesday by the United States Track and Field/Cross Country Coaches Association.


To be considered for the All-Region team, athletes must finish in the top-25 of their region and meet NCAA Division I Cross Country Coaches Association requirements.

Falor, a junior from Flagstaff, Ariz., is a first-time selection to the squad after posting a time of 22:08.5 this past Saturday in the NCAA South Region at Knoxville, Tenn. She finished 24th in the field.

McPherson acquired All-Region status for the second time in her Lady Bulldog career. The Nampa, Idaho senior was awarded region status in 2004 as a sophomore. She becomes the fourth Lady Bulldog to earn the honor twice in a career, joining former distance standouts April Ecke (1992, '93), Meggan Hodge (2001,'02) Tiffany McWilliams (2002, '04).







WOODS, 4X4 QUALIFY FOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS ON FINAL DAY OF MIDEAST REGIONAL

Sophomore all-American Chris Woods ran 1 minute, 49.14 seconds in the 800-meter run and Mississippi State's 4x400- meter relay team posted a season's best 3:03.09 to qualify for the NCAA Championships on the final day of the Mideast Regional. The meet was held at Tom Black Track at LaPorte Stadium on the University of Tennessee campus.

"The 4x4 was incredible. They ran great. The mark will put them maybe into the top five in the country," said MSU head coach Al Schmidt. "It was a great way to finish, and we'll know late Monday or early Tuesday what Jen's status is as far as nationals."

State's 4x4 featured an all-junior squad which ran the third fastest time in school history and led off with Bruce Davis. Ezra Jones, all-American Arthur Davis and Nathan Daniels rounded out the crew. Woods finished fifth and advanced to the NCAA meet along with Tennessee sophomore Yarrick Kincaid.

Junior Travis McKay closed out his season, running 9:41.43 in the men's 3000-meter steeplechase.

Junior Jen McPherson finished eighth in the women's 1500- meter finals with a time of 4:27.18. While the top five at the regional meet automatically advance to the NCAA meet, McPherson may still be chosen as an at-large candidate based on her best time of the season, 4:22.26 posted at the Auburn Invitational.

Competing at her first regional meet, junior Christina Hernandez placed sixth in her flight of the discus with a throw of 144 feet, three inches. In the women's 3000-meter steeplechase, junior Joy Griffith ran 11:55.05.

MCPHERSON CHOSEN AS AT-LARGE SELECTION FOR NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Mississippi State junior Jen McPherson was chosen as an at-large selection for the women's 1500-meter run at the 2006 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships in Sacramento, Calif.

The top five competitors in each individual event automatically qualified for nationals. McPherson finished eighth in the event at the Mideast Regional. However, her time of 4:22.26, posted at the Auburn Invitational, was good enough for McPherson to be extended an invitation to join the 28-person field. Her time is the 21st best among entrants in the event.

"Ezra just didn't run the curve, and we got stuck in traffic," said MSU head coach Al Schmidt. "We didn't run the way we could, but they're all-Americans. We've had a good year with this group, and next year's a new year. We'll be back (at the national meet) strong."

The finish garners A. Davis with his third all-America honor in the event, while B. Davis, Jones and Daniels collect their first.

As a team, the Bulldogs' two points from the event gave MSU a share of $58\mathrm{th}$ place.






1922 & 1923 OUTDOOR 440-YARD DASH




1982 OUTDOOR 1600-METER RELAY




1972 INDOOR 600-YARD RUN









TIFFANY McWILLIAMS (2002-04)

The most decorated female athlete in the history of Mississippi State track and field returns to the program as a volunteer assistant coach for the 2007 season. Tiffany McWilliams was a three-year letterwinner at MSU from 20002-04

McWilliams, a three-time NCAA Champion and all-American at MSU, she established herself as one of the top middle distance runners in the NCAA and is now one of the best in the United States. She captured her first NCAA crown at the 2003 outdoor championships in the 1,500-meter run. The Red Bay, Ala.-native won six Southeastern Conference titles during her time in the Maroon and White. McWilliams registered SEC crowns in the indoor mile run in 2003 and 2004 and captured the 2003 and 2004 800-meter run and 1500-meter run events. She was named the SEC's Runner of the Year in 2004 and was tabbed as the conference's Athlete of the Week three times in track and once in cross country. She holds three MSU records in indoor track and owns three in outdoor competitions.

In cross country, she was a back-to-back all-Region honoree in 2002 and 2003. She finished 19th at the NCAA South Regional in 2002 and runner-up in the 2003 edition of the NCAA South Regional. She is only one of three MSU women track athletes to compete at all three NCAA Championships - Indoor, outdoor and cross country. McWilliams joins former Lady Bulldog April Ecke (1991-95) and current senior Jen McPherson as the only three individuals to represent MState at all three national events.


In 2004, she ranked seventh in the nation in the 1500meter run by *Track and Field News*.

Her professional resume' includes a runner-up spot at the 2006 USA Indoor Championships and won the mile event at the Tyson Invitational (4:30.60). McWilliams ranks fifth in the United States by *Track and Field News*.

As a prep star in Red Bay, Ala., McWilliams was named

captain of the RBHS track team. She set Alabama state records in the 2A division in the 800-meter, 1,600-meter and 3,200-meter run. Claimed the Alabama State Title in cross country as a junior and senior. McWilliams earned four letters in basketball, two in tennis and one letter each in cheerleading and softball.

JAMEL ASHLEY (2001-05)

Former Bulldog Jamel Ashley joins a long list of MSU sprinters that have taken their running talents to the professional level. Ashley, concluded his collegiate days on a high note, recording second place-finish in the 400-meter dash at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. The Dudley, Ga.-native came to the Starkville campus after a two-year stint at Wallace State Community College in Alabama. He made immediate impact in 2004, earning all-American status in the 400-meter dash and in the 4x400-meter relay. He left his

mark in the MSU track and field laurels by shattering a ten year old record in the 400-meter relay at the 2005 NCAA Championships. The record was previously held by former bulldog sprinter Jude Monye. Ashley ran on the 4x4 squads that finished third at the Penn Relays and fifth at the 2005 NCAA Mideast Regional. He met five regional-qualifying marks in the 200-and 400-meter dashes combined. He set a Jace Lacoste Invitational in the 400-meter (45.69).

His individual wins include the 100-meter dash and 200-meter dash events at the 2004 MSU-hosted Jace Lacoste Invitational. At Wallace State Community College, he garnered six all-American honors and finish second in the 100 and 200 meters as a freshman at WSCC. An all-around athlete, Ashley participated in basketball and football on the prep level. He was named the Most Valuable Offensive Player for West Laurens High School on the gridiron.

After departing the Maroon and White program, Ashley continued his stellar performances in his events on the professional level within the United States and across the world. In the January, 2007 issue of *Track and Field News*, he ranks 15th on the 400-meter world list. A year ago, Ashley finished third in the 400-meter at the Tyson Invite, a meet that coincides with the Visa Championship Series. At the U.S. Championships in Indianapolis, Ind., the former Bulldog placed fifth in the 400-meter dash. He also participated in the 2006 Reebok Grand Prix along with an eighth-place finish at the Adidas Track Classic

On the worldwide level, Ashley is a member of the U.S. 4x400-meter relay team that features Darold Williamson, Derrick Brew and LaShawn Merritt, world cup champion in the 400-meter. At the 2006 Norwich Union International event in Birmingham, England, Ashley captured the 400-meter dash over Russia's European Championships silver medalist Vladmir Frolov.



Mississippi State athletes play in some EXCEILER

Mississippi State athletes play in some of the nation's finest facilities. Every Bulldog competition site has either been constructed or renovated during the last decade or so. During that time alone, more than \$60 million in facility enhancements have been made... a real building boom in Bulldog Country.

DAVIS WADE STADIUM AT SCOTT FIELD: Near-sellout crowds have become the norm at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field, where the Bulldogs have played before masses reaching 85 percent of stadium capacity. Since the 2000 season when expansion and renovation projects gave the nation's second-oldest stadium a gleaming new look, crowds have grown by nearly 30 percent.



PITTS TENNIS CENTRE: Considered among the finest tennis facilities in the collegiate ranks, the modern, six-court, 1,000-seat A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre recently completed its 23rd year serving the men's and women's programs. Recent enhancements at the facility include new locker areas and concession stands (1998) and a permanent press box (2004).

W.O. SPENCER STADIUM/
CARL MADDOX TRACK:
Co-named in honor of a two-time
Mississippi State Olympian and a
former MSU athletic director, the
W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox
Track has served as host to the
Southeastern Conference Outdoor
Track and Field Championships three
times since 1985, joining Tennessee
as the most frequent host for that
event during that time.



DUDY NOBLE FIELD, POLK-DEMENT STADIUM: One of the nation's leaders in baseball season ticket sales and attendance, Dudy Noble Field, Polk-Doment Stadium still holds the nation's on-campus single-game attendance mark — 14,991. With a seating capacity of more than 7,000 and more space in the world-famous outfield, Sports Illustrated magazine named the park, the "Best Place To Watch College Baseball" in a 1997 issue.

NEWELL GRISSOM BUILDING:

The 12,000-square foot, hardwood-floored Newell-Grissom Building serves as the home for Mississippi State's volleyball program and serves as a practice facility for both of the school's basketball programs. A state-ofthe-art heating and air conditioning system was installed in 2004.

HUMPHREY COLISEUM: Season ticket sales records and all-time attendance marks have also been set over the past decade by Bulldog and Lady Bulldog basketball teams in the Humphrey Coliseum, the state's largest oncampus basketball arena. The latest addition to the facility was a \$1.8 million, center-hung, foursided video scoreboard and jumbotron screen installed in 2004.

MSU GOLF COURSE:

Nominated by Golfweek and Golf Digest magazines as one of the premier public golf courses in the United States, Mississippi State's championship University Golf Course is the home to the men's and women's programs. The 18-hole course was recently furnished with a 5,000-square-foot clubhouse, complete with locker areas, snack bar golf shop and classroom.

MSU SOCCER FIELD: Built in 1995, the lighted Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldog women one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast, a 114-yard long, 72-yard wide regulation NCAA Champion-ship field. The lush turf is Mississippi Pride grass, developed by researchers on the MSU campus

MSU SOFTBALL FIELD: Constructed in 1997, the Mississippi State Softball Field has undergone almost constant improvement at the northern-most point of campus. Lights were added to the facility in 1998, brick work was added to the dugouts two years later and, in 2001, additional batting cages were built. In 2005, softball moved into a new locker, training and meeting facility adjacent to the park.



BRYAN BUILDING: The state-ofthe-art John H. Bryan Athletic Administration Building is the crown jewel of MSU's expansion projects of the last decade. Opened in 1996, this showcase facility is named for longtime Bulldog friend and supporter John H. Bryan Sc, and houses athletic administration, football, ticket, athletic development and media relations offices.

MSU has played in the SEC Football

the SEC Football Championship Game, the basketball Final Four, the baseball College World Series, and in numerous NCAA national title events since 1996. The last decade has brought overall achievement unmatched at State, and each new generation adds more hardware to the school's trophy cases.

The 1999 Maroon football team won its first eight games of the season, amassed 10 victories for just the second time in school history, and defeated Clemson in the Peach Bowl at Atlanta. Quarterback Wayne Madkin (above), State's all-time leading passer, was named the bowl game's Most Valuable Offensive Player.

State's soccer team captured the 2001 SEC Western Division crown, the first SEC championship of any kind by an MSU women's team. That title came in just the sport's seventh year of existence on the campus.

Great Heams Stite

The "thunder and lightning" duo of Rafael Palmeiro and Will Clark—guided the Bulldog baseball program to SEC regular season and tournament titles, and to a national third-place finish at the College World Series in 1985. The '85 team's finish was the best of MSU's seven CWS squads.

The Lady Bulldog basketball team has gone to seven postseason tournaments in the last nine years, including four NCAA Tournament appearances from 1999-2003. The '02 team (below) finished fourth in the SEC and defeated Boston College in the first round of the NCAA tourney before losing to nationally top-10 ranked Texas Tech in Lubbock.

ROBERT H. FOGLESONG

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT First Year • West Virginia, 1968

Robert H. Foglesong is the 18th president of Mississippi State University, a land-grant university committed to excellence in learning, research, and service. His vision is for MSU to become the most respected land-grant school in the Southeast. As president, he is responsi-

ble for planning, budgeting, and execution for the largest university in the state of Mississippi. He is also the president and executive director of the Appalachian Leadership and Education Foundation, a nonprofit operating to identify our next generation of leaders in Appalachia and mentor/financially support their journey toward academic, leadership, and character excellence. He's a director of Massey Energy, one of the largest producers of coal in the nation, and a director of the Michael Baker Corp., an international energy and engineering firm. He also has been designated by President George W. Bush to co-chair the United States-Russia Joint Commission on POW/MIAs.

Previously, he was nominated by the President, confirmed by the U.S. Senate, and served as a four-star general in the United States Air Force. He had responsibility for policy recommendations and implementation of policy relative to personnel, operations, infrastructure, and intra/inter governmental affairs for an organization of 358,000 uniformed members and 158,000 civilian employees. He was responsible for planning/programming for future strategies involving an annual budget of \$90 billion (equivalent to the position of chief operating officer for a company ranked No. 9 on the Fortune 500 list). His jobs required almost daily interface with members of Congress, the White House, and many governmental interagency offices.

In previous positions, Foglesong had CEO responsibilities for field units with budgets up to \$3 billion per year (110th and 430th on the Fortune 500 list). These organizations included up to 87,000 personnel and dependents and were often geographically separated from corporate headquarters. Most involved mission-oriented operations and included responsibilities for housing, medical services, personnel force development, equal-opportunity programs, training, education, and other services for skilled technical and line employees.

He has most often been asked to lead and manage large organizations in establishing a sense of relevancy given a constantly changing national and international environment. Foglesong spent a significant amount of the past decade as a national security advisor at Cabinet and Presidential levels. In this capacity, he had opportunities to travel extensively with the most senior members of the government and directly engage with the most senior civilian and military levels of foreign governments around the globe.

Foglesong has spent 33 years in public service with a clear understanding of the role leadership plays in establishing a sense of integrity/ethics, encouraging service above self, and fostering an attitude of excellence. He has received numerous awards for his demonstrated leadership. In addition, he has continued his education by attending professional military education schools, as well as advanced civilian education forums. He is a member of several professional aviation organizations and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. His 57 publications cover a range of subjects including technical and leadership topics. A graduate of West Virginia University (bachelor's, master's and doctorate), he was a member and president of Tau Beta Pi, the national engineering honorary, as well as numerous other academic honoraries.

He has accumulated 30 military awards for leadership and technical skills. He holds an honorary Doctorate of Strategic Intelligence. He is married to Mary Thrasher Foglesong. They have two sons--David, married to Laura, and father of two sons (Robert and David), and Mark. David is in the United States Air Force, as is Laura. Mark is in the television business. Foglesong's hobbies include running marathons, collecting slide rules, collecting potato mashers, and public speaking.

LARRY TEMPLETON

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

20th year • Mississippi State, 1969

Mississippi State Director of Athletics Larry Templeton begins his 20th year at the head of the Bulldog sport program in 2006, and under his watchful eye MSU competes, and has competed, for championships in every sport program. MState student-athletes continue to excel in the classroom, setting academic records nearly every semester. And the depart-

ment has operated in the black while expanding the program and drastically improving its facilities. He is the third-longest-tenured AD in MSU history and the longest in the Southeastern Conference with 19 seasons under his belt, and the university's athletic program has reached heights never before achieved under his guidance.

On the playing field, the decade of the '90s saw virtually every State sport establish a best-ever fi nish. The start of the new millennium has been no different with MSU sports teams having qualifi ed for postseason play 51 times during the past seven seasons; a school-record 12 did so in 2004-05. But State's student-athletes are not just succeeding on the playing fi eld. MSU's men's and women's athletes recorded the highest combined grade point average during the 2005-06 academic year in the 16 years in which student-athlete grades have been tracked, and the combined 2.95 grade point average in fall 2005 was a one-semester high. In 13 of the last 15 years, the Bulldog football team has been one of just a handful of schools cited by the American Football Coaches Association for having a graduation rate exceeding 70 percent. MSU is the only school in the SEC to make that list with such frequency. In spring 2006, 145 of the 270 scholarship student-athletes at Mississippi State (54 percent) earned a grade point average of 3.00 or higher. Seventy-eight scholarship student-athletes made either the Dean's List (3.5 GPA) or the President's Scholar List (3.8 GPA).

The early 1990's expansions and renovations of the Leo Seal M-Club Center, the Shira Athletic Complex, and the completion of the John H. Bryan Sr. Athletic Administration Building, were fueled by Templeton. That building trend continued into the latter stages of the '90s, with construction completed on permanent seating at the MSU Soccer Field, the conversion of McCarthy Gymnasium on campus into a varsity indoor tennis facility, and expanded seating at Humphrey Coliseum. Additional chairbacks and 18 skyboxes at Dudy Noble Field/Polk-DeMent Stadium, MSU's baseball facility, were completed in time for the 2000 season, and a \$30 million expansion of the east side of Scott Field raised capacity at the football stadium to 55,082. Fifty new skyboxes and 1,700 chairback seats opened for the 2001 season. Another building boom occurred during 2004-05. The Holliman Athletic Center (a 46,000-square-foot addition at the Shira Complex), the Palmeiro Center (an indoor practice facility for baseball and football), and a softball locker and training facility were added to the athletic facility plant.

Templeton's work also stretches far from the Starkville campus. He has served as chairman of the SEC's athletic directors since 1990. He has also begun a second term on the prestigious NCAA Baseball Committee, currently serving as that committee's chairman. He oversees the group that chooses the sites for regional and super-regional competition, selects the 64-member playing fi eld, oversees the operation of the tournament, selects the umpire crews, gives direction to the game operations personel and works with the radio and television talent. He is a former member of the NCAA Championship Committee, the NCAA Management Council and the NCAA Bowl Certification Committee.

Templeton is married to the former Linda Jo Nichols. They have a son, Brian, who received his second degree (landscape architecture) at Mississippi State in May 2002. A second son, Stephen, received his doctorate from Mississippi State in August 2002, and a daughter, Nici, is an attorney in Columbia, S.C. Granddaughters Ella Grace Comer and Addison McSwain Comer reside in Columbia, S.C.



ANN CARR

ASSOCIATE AD/WOMEN'S SPORTS 8th year • Mississippi State, 1990

A veteran of 12 years in athletic administration at MSU and a former Lady Bulldog athlete, Ann Carr succeeds Samye Johnson, who retired as the university's senior woman's administrator in June 2006.

Carr is in her second stint within the State athletic department. She assumes her new role following seven years as Assistant Athletic

Director for Student Life. In that position, she worked with the personal development of MSU's student-athletes in addition to continuing her prior responsibilities as academic counselor for the Bulldog football team.

Carr serves as the director of the department's Life Skills program, which includes the support systems and career programs for all MSU student-athletes, and its CHAMPS program (Challenging Athletes' Minds for Personal Success). As SWA, Carr will oversee the operation and supervision of MSU's women's sport program.

Hired in 1993 as an assistant director in the athletic academic office, she returned full-time to MState in 1999 following a one-year stay in a similar capa ity at the University of Southern Mississippi.

A native of Brookhaven, Miss., Carr was a four-year letter winner on the Mississippi State women's basketball team (1986-90). When Carr finished her women's basketball playing career, she ranked first on the career leaders list in free-throw percentage, shooting 75.8 percent over a four-year span. She also ranked 12th on the career points list, having scored 762 points in her tenure, averaging 8.3 points per contest. In rebounding, Carr brought down 597 boards (6.5 per game) to finish her career sixth on the all-time list in rebounds and rebounding average. She also finished her career holding the individual record in most three-point field goals made (five) in a single game.

A 1990 graduate of State, she later earned her master's degree in counse ing from the institution in 1992.



BULLDOG TRADITIONS

THE BULLDOG

Mississippi State University athletic teams are called Bulldogs, a name earned and maintained over the decades by the tough, tenacious play of student-athletes wearing the Maroon and White. The official school mascot is an American Kennel Club registered English Bulldog, given the inherited title of "Bully."

As with most universities, Mississippi State University teams answered to different nicknames through the years. The first squads representing Mississippi A&M College were proud to be called Aggies. When the school officially became Mississippi State College in 1932, the nickname Maroons, for MSU¹s uniform color, gained prominence. Bulldogs became the official title for State teams in 1961, not long after State College was granted university status.

Yet references to school teams and athletes as Bulldogs actually go back to early in the century, and this nickname was used almost interchangeably with both Aggies and Maroons, since at least 1905.

On November 30 of that year, the A&M football team shut out their arch-rivals from the University of Mississippi 11-0 in Jackson, Miss. The campus newspaper, The Reflector, reported: "After the game, filled with that emotion that accompanies every great victory, there was nothing left for the cadets to do but to complete the great victory by showing sympathy for the dead athletic spirit of the University, by having a military funeral parade.

"A coffin was secured, decorated with University colors and a bulldog pup placed on top. It was then placed on the shoulders of a dozen cadets, and the procession started down Capitol Street, preceded by the brass band playing a very pathetic funeral march."

Other newspaper reports of the victory commented on the 'bulldog' style of play by the A&M eleven, and the Bulldog was soon publicly accepted as a school

athletic symbol. Accounts of a 1926 pep rally in Meridian, Miss., had another bulldog parading with students.

Use as an official game mascot began in 1935 when coach Major Ralph Sasse, on 'orders' from his team, went to Memphis, Tenn., to select a bulldog. Ptolemy, a gift of the Edgar Webster family, was chosen and the Bulldogs promptly defeated Alabama 20-7.

A litter-mate of Ptolemy became the first mascot called 'Bully' shortly after Sasse's team beat mighty Army 13-7 at West Point that



same year - perhaps the greatest victory in MSU football history. But Bully I earned other fame the hard way, in 1939 when a campus bus cut short his career.

Days of campus mourning followed, as Bully lay in state in a glass coffin. A half-mile funeral procession accompanied by the Famous Maroon Band and three ROTC battalions went to Scott Field where Bully was buried under the bench at the 50-yard line. Even Life magazine covered the event. Other Bullys have since been buried by campus dorms, fraternity houses, and also at the football stadium.

THE COWBELL

The cowbell as a fixture of MSU sports tradition remains unclear to this day. The best records have cowbells gradually introduced to the MSU sports scene in the late 1930s and early 1940s, coinciding with the 'golden age' of MSU football success prior to World War II.

The most popular legend is that during a home football game between State and arch-rival Mississippi, a jersey cow wandered onto the playing field. Mississippi State soundly whipped the Rebels that Saturday, and State College students immediately adopted the cow as a good luck charm. Students are said

to have continued bringing a cow to football games for a while, until the practice was eventually discontinued in favor of bringing just the cow's bell.

Whatever the origin, it is certain that by the 1950s cowbells were common at MSU games, and by the 1960s were established as the special symbol of Mississippi State. Ironically, the cowbell's popularity grew most rapidly during the long years when State football teams were rarely successful. Flaunting this anachronism from the

'aggie' days was a proud response by students and alumni to outsiders corn of the university's 'cow college' history.

In the 1960s two MSU professors, Earl W. Terrell and Ralph L. Reeves obliged some students by welding handles on the bells so they could be rung with much more convenience and authority. By 1963 the demand for these long-handled cowbells could not be filled by home workshops alone so, at the suggestion of Reeves, the Student Association bought bells in bulk and the Industrial Education Club agreed to weld on handles. In 1964, the MSU Bookstore began marketing these cowbells with a portion of profits returning to those organizations.

Today many styles of cowbells are available on campus and around Starkville, with the top-of-the-line being a heavy chrome-plated model with a full Bulldog figurine handle. But experts insist the best and loudest results are produced by a classic long-handled, bicycle-grip bell made of thinner and tightly-welded shells.

Cowbells decorate offices and homes of Mississippi State alumni, and are passed down through generations of Bulldog fans. But they are not heard at Southeastern Conference games of a conference rule against 'artificial noise-makers' at football and basketball games. On a 9-1 vote, SEC schools ruled cowbells a disruption and banned them. And in 2002, the SEC voted to impose a set of penalties to enforce the rule.

This has done little harm to the cowbell's popularity, however, or to prevent cowbells from being heard outside stadiums in which the Bulldogs are playing.

ATHLETIC ACADEMICS



The MSU Athletic Academic Office is committed to preparing Mississippi State University student-athletes for life after college. In order to accomplish this mission, the Athletic Academic Office provides quality programs and services to facilitate graduation and promote the overall development of student-athletes. The student services provided by the Athletic Academic Office are designed to promote the personal, educational and career development of the student-athletes. The Athletic Academic staff is committed to empowering student-athletes to develop independence, self-reliance, personal values, leadership skills and responsibility for their own lives

The primary purpose of the Athletic Academic Office is to provide quality academic assistance to MSU student-athletes during their tenure at the university and beyond. Assisting student-athletes in the successful completion of their degrees is our main concern. In order to accomplish this mission, the Athletic Academic office has developed programs and activities in areas such as CHAMPS/Life Skills, Orientation, Academic Advisement, Academic Mentoring, Tutorial Services, Development, Study Skills, Career Exploration and Development and Life Management Skills.

ADVISEMENT

The Athletic Academic Office assigns counselors by the program participants' sport. Academic Counselors assist student-athletes with class advising, tutoring, mentoring with career development, and selected petition processes. Counselors also serve as a resource for students in personal development areas including management of test anxieties, personal counseling and developing time management skills. Athletic Academic Counselors assist student-athletes throughout their educational experience at Mississippi State University and are available on both a walk-in basis and through scheduled appointments. All student-athletes are encouraged to utilize the Athletic Academic Counselor services.

The overall athletics program at Mississippi State garner national recognition for its high marks in the classroom and in the athletic arena. Each year, Mississippi State University produces a lion's share of Academic All-Southeastern Conference classroom stars. The goal now is to increase this level of academic success.

This is a daunting task for athletes competing with a full load of classes and a full sched-

ule of opponents and practices. However, Bulldog athletes continue to prove that they are up to the challenge as, each year, its number of academic all- SEC honor roll members increase.

The secret behind the academic success for Bulldog athletes is Mississippi State's athletic academic counselors, headed by Assistant Athletic Director Ray Berryhill along with academic counselors Tyler Hill, Lynda Moore, Victor Parker and Brittany Wagner. Joining this group are two graduate assistants and 40 part-time tutors who work in Hathorn Hall.

The Athletics Academic staff works as a liaison between the Athletic Department, undergraduate divisions and the administrative office of Mississippi State University. The staff offers career advice and counseling, makes sure all athletesare maintaining satisfactory progress toward their degrees and monitors academic eligibility. The advisors also secure tutors and schedule study sessions

SUPERVISED STUDY

Supervised study is a monitored study program designed to provide student-athletes with organized study/tutoring time in flexible environment conducive to successful learning. Study sessions are required for all first semester freshmen, transfer student-athletes and any student-athlete whom the appropriate coaching staff and the Athletic Academic Office staff believe would benefit from the experience.

Study sessions are to provide a more structured environment to assist student-athletes in their transition from high school to college. Any study area or learning center is available for use during these times. The hours required by the student's adviser will be totaled at the end of each week. The ultimate goal of supervised study is to assist studentathletes in developing their intellectual and academic potential and to familiarize the student with all services offered by the academic center.

TUTORING

Tutors are provided for student-athletes in all subject areas. They are available on a one-to-one basis and in small group sessions. The Athletic Academic staff may recommend tutors for you, or you can request one for yourself. Tutoring services are usually arranged on an appointment basis. Student-athletes are expected to keep all tutoring appointments they schedule.



W.O. SPENCER STADIUM/ MADDOX TRACK



Co-named in honor of a two-time Olympian and a former MSU athletic director, the W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track is the home of the Bulldog and Lady Bulldog track and field teams.

Dedicated on Nov. 13, 1982, with Maddox presiding, the W.O. Spencer Track Stadium was originally named in honor of one of MSU's all-time athletic greats. A former Mississippi A&M track captain (1922) and track coach (1936-47), Spencer participated in the 1924 Olympic Games in Paris and the 1928 Olympics in Amsterdam. He was a member of the gold medal-winning mile relay team in the 1924 Olympics, and also ran on the steeple relay team in 1928.

Carl Maddox Track is a 400-meter, nine-lane oval in addition to runways for use in the long jump, triple jump and pole vault events. The oval is a Sika/Bram "Granutan" track and is made of polyurethane, which provides a spike-resistant, highly resilient running surface.

The facility has served as host of three Southeastern Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships - 1985, 1992 and 2002. MSU uses the facility to host two home meets each spring - The Jace Lacoste Invitational and the Bulldog Invitational along with a high school meet.





Now in its third decade of service to Mississippi State's track and field program, the Spencer Stadium/Maddox Track was the vision of former MSU director of athletics Carl Maddox. In dire need of a new facility with a limited budget to work from, Maddox negotiated a deal with the Mississippi National Guard to provide all of the engineering and much of the labor as a training exercise. The facility was completed at a cost of around \$250,000. The track grandstand, which seats 3,500 fans, was a gift from Leo W. Seal Jr.
