Likewise, training room, locker room and apartment/dormitory areas are considered private player areas and are off-limits to the media.

BOB HARTLEY MEMORIAL FELLOWSHIP

Providing Internship Opportunities to Young SIDs





For more than a half century Robert M. "Bob" Hartley dedicated his life's work to promoting Mississippi State athletics. From his hiring as the school's first publicity director in August 1946 to his initial "retirement" as assistant athletic director for communications in June 1985, through his later years as an invaluable consultant for the Mississippi State Department of Athletics, the man we called "Hart" gave special meaning to the words "loyalty" and "devotion to duty."

Mr. Bob's labors of love with MSU have not gone unrecognized. He has taken his place among college athletics' greats as a member of both the university's and the state's sports halls of fame and the College Sports Information Hall of Fame. His willingness to generously give of his talent, his time and his friendship serves as an inspiration to the countless lives he has touched and to those that aspire to follow in his footsteps. In that respect, the Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship was created by the MSU Department of Athletics to provide internship opportunities for young media relation practitioners.

Jay Middleton was selected as the sixth recipient of the Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship for the 2007-2008 academic year. A native of Tupelo, Miss., Middleton enters his fifth season working with the Mississippi State athletic media relations office. Middleton worked as a student assistant from 2003-2006 and enters his second year as a graduate assistant. Middleton has served the last two years as the primary contact for men's tennis and women's golf programs at MSU. Among other duties, he works with mstateathletics.com and Maroon to the Max. Most recently, he earned national recognition for the 2007 men's tennis guide which was awarded the third best tennis publication in the country by CoSIDA.

Middleton earned his bachelor's degree in communication with emphasis in public relations in summer 2006 from State and is currently seeking a master's degree in business administration.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

SETTING THE STANDARD FOR INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS IN CROSS COUNTRY AND TRACK & FIELD

In the ever-changing world of collegiate athletics, the tradition of excellence in the Southeastern Conference has remained constant. The SEC boast a rich history and has dominated track and field like no other conference.

2006 CROSS COUNTRY

Arkansas finished in a tie for fifth at the NCAA Cross Country Championships in its quest for a fourth national championship in nine years. The SEC sent two other teams to compete in the NCAA Championships, with Florida finishing 21st and Alabama 31st respectively. Arkansas' men captured their 16th straight SEC crow and their amazing 33rd consecutive conference titles prior to joining the SEC in 1991. Arkansas' John McDonnell was named SEC Male Cross Country Coach of the Year. The award marked McDonnell's 12th consecutive honor. Barnabus Kirui of Ole Miss garnered Male Cross Country Athlete of the Year honors as well as Male Cross Country SEC Freshman of the Year honors.

The Arkansas women finished fifth to lead the SEC at the NCAA Cross Country Championships. The SEC was represented by three other teams at the NCAA Championships with Georgia finishing 15th, Florida 26th and Tennessee 28th. Arkansas was crowned the SEC Champion. Brooke Upshaw of Arkansas was named SEC Cross Country Athlete of the Year and her teammate, Dani Parry, took home SEC Freshman of the Year honors. Arkansas head coach Lance Harter earned SEC Female Cross Country Coach of the Year honor.

2007 MEN'S INDOOR

The SEC sent eight teams to the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships with Auburn, Arkansas, LSU and Tennessee all finishing in the top 10. The four other SEC teams that were represented included Florida, Kentucky, Ole Miss and South Carolina. Arkansas' claimed its 14th SEC indoor championship in 16 tries since entering the league in 1992. Georgia's Ian Burrell claimed SEC Men's Runner of the Year. Auburn's Corey Martin was named the SEC's Men's Field Event Athlete of the Year. Alabama's Emmanuel Bor was tabbed as the SEC's Men's Freshman Runner of the Year. Florida's Mike Morrison earned the SEC's Men's Freshman Field Event Athlete of the Year, while John McDonnell of Arkansas was named SEC Men's Indoor Track and Field Coach of the Year.

2007 WOMEN'S INDOOR

The SEC had four teams finish in the top five at the NCAA Indoor Championships with LSU finishing National Runner-Up followed by Tennessee, Georgia and Auburn finishing third, fourth and fifth. Tennessee claimed its second SEC Indoor Track and Field title in three years tallying up 120 points to hold off defending champion Georgia. Patricia Sylvester of Georgia was tabbed as the SEC Women's Field Event of the Year. Florida's Shara Proctor was named SEC Women's Freshman Field Event Athlete of the Year. J.J. Clark of Tennessee was named SEC Women's Indoor Track and Field Coach of the Year. Auburn's Kerron Stewart was named the SEC Women's Runner of the Year and LSU's Latavia Thomas was tabbed SEC Women's Freshman Runner of the Year.

2007 MEN'S OUTDOOR

LSU was the National Runner-Up at the NCAA Championships, posting 48 points. Auburn and Tennessee posted top five finishes, with the Tigers (34 points) taking third and the Vols (31 points) fourth. The SEC sent six other teams to the NCAA Championships including Ole Miss, Georgia and Mississippi State finishing in the top-30. Florida, South Carolina and Arkansas finished tied for 34thand 62nd, respectively. Tennessee scored 129.5 points to win the SEC Track Championship and end the run of Arkansas' four straight titles. Tennessee Head Coach Bill Webb was named 2007 SEC Men's and Field Coach of the Year. Ole Miss distance runner Barnabus Kirui was named Men's Runner of the Year, while Auburn and Florida took home a pair of awards. Auburn's Corey Martin was named Field Athlete of the Year. Florida freshman Calvin Smith was named Freshman Runner of the Year, while Mike Morrison was named Freshman Field Athlete of the Year.

2007 WOMEN'S OUTDOOR

The SEC was well represented at the NCAA Championships with a total of nine teams in which LSU post the best result of 53 points earning themselves a National Runner-Up. Of the other eight teams which the SEC sent, Georgia (9th), Auburn (T12th), South Carolina (T12th), Arkansas (15th), Alabama (T21st), Ole Miss (T27th) and Tennessee (T27th) all finished in the top-30 with Florida finishing tied for 46th respectively. The LSU women advanced from sixth place following the conclusion of Saturday's events to win the championship with 139.5 points. LSU's Dennis Shaver was named 2007 SEC Women's Track and Field Coach of

the Year; while Auburn's Kerron Stewart took home Runner of the Year Honors and Ole Miss's Britney Reese was named Field Athlete of the Year. Nia Ali of Tennessee was named SEC Freshman Runner of the Year and Florida's Mariam Kevkhishvili was named Freshman Field Athlete of the Year. Georgia's Natalie Picchetti and South Carolina's Natasha Hastings were named Co-Scholar Athletes of the Year.

CROSS COUNTRY

MEN- Eight national championships , two individual titles, 82 All-Americans since 1984, 36 teams have finished among the Top 25 since 1984.

WOMEN- One team championship in 1988, 52 All-Americans since 1981, 42 teams have finished among the Top 25 since 1982.

INDOOR TRACK

MEN- Fourteen national championships since 1992, 125 NCAA individual champions and three NCAA Championships record holders, 31 individuals earned All-American status in 2007 with Auburn finishing fifth.

WOMEN- Thirteen national championships since 1987, 98 NCAA individual champions, nine NCAA Championship record holders, 32 All-Americans in 2007 with LSU finishing Runner-up.

OUTDOOR TRACK

MEN- Seventeen NCAA titles and 15 of 18 national championships since 1989, 167 NCAA individual champions, five NCAA Championship record holders, 49 All-Americans in 2007. LSU finished as the Runner-up.

WOMEN- Eleven consecutive NCAA titles by LSU from 1987-97 and again in 2000, 110 NCAA individual champions (not including relays) since 1982, eight NCAA Championship record holders, 41 All-Americans in 2007. LSU finished as Runner-up.



St. Louis University, 1975

Regarded and respected nationwide as an authority on endurance running and training, Al Schmidt enters his 20th season at the helm of the Mississippi State's men's and women's track teams. Since his hiring on Oct. 22, 1988, Schmidt has parlayed his 36 years of collegiate coaching experience into many individual and team accomplishments for MSU, both on and off of the track. In his previous 19 seasons, Schmidt has produced 32 all-Americans and 33 SEC champions.

In 2007, Schmidt guided five Bulldogs to all-American status. Schmidt also witnessed three school records broken. At the SEC Championships, the men's team had a total of four athletes score 30 points to finish 11th overall. Among those scorers included Golden Coachman and Travis McKay scoring in the 800-meter run and 3000-meter steeplechase, with third and fourth place finishes, respectively.

Out of the 21 events the Bulldogs competed in, 62 of the athletes marked a personal best in their respective event. There were also six regional qualifiers for the men's team and two relay regional marks met. Bruce Davis, Ezra Jones, Nathan Daniels, and Arthur Davis finished fourth at the NCAA Championships, with a time of three minutes, 3.49 seconds.

On 22 separate times this past season, 15 Lady Bulldogs met their personal best marks, along with seven regional qualifiers. Marrissa Harris finished fourth in the heptathlon at the SEC Championships with a personal-best 5,242 points, along with Jennifer McPherson who finished fourth in the 1500-meter run with a time of 4:20.87, and Michelle Corrigan who took sixth in the 10000-meter run with a time of 37:15.760. A total of 16 Lady Bulldogs scored a total of 19 points for MSU as they finished 11th at the meet.

In 2005, Schmidt witnessed six Bulldogs garner all-America accolades. At the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Championships, Elzie Coleman, Arthur Davis, LaChristopher Lewis and Jamel Ashley ran a school-record 3:01.63 to finish fifth in the 4x400-meter relay. Ashley placed second in the 400, while Lewis took 11th in the long jump to earn his first all-America honor in the event. At the Mideast Regional, Steve Mullings won the 100-meter dash title, repeating his performance from the SEC Championships. Lewis also won the long jump title at the conference meet, while Ashley finished second in the 400-meter dash. Travis McKay finished seventh in the steeplechase, setting the third-best time in school history. As a team, the Bulldogs finished 19th in the last Trackwire 25 of the season.

On the women's side, Meggan Hodge broke the MSU school record in the 3000-meter steeplechase with a 10:46.04 eighth-place finish at the SEC Championships. Jasmine Walls cleared a personal best to tie for second in the high jump. Crystal Averitt ended her career atop the

all-time list in the hammer throw, while Lacey Johnson extended her school record in the pole vault.

Three-time all-American Tiffany McWilliams closed out her MSU career in 2004 by becoming the most decorated female athlete in Lady Bulldog track and field history. McWilliams repeated her 2003 feat of winning the outdoor 1500-meter title and also won the NCAA Indoor title in the mile. Behind McWilliams and a strong distance core, MSU achieved a No. 12 national ranking.

On the men's side, decathlete and all-American Trey Hardee set a school record in the event after tallying 8,041 points in a second-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Five Bulldogs were named all-Americans in 2003. Ashley Davis, Lewis and Keston Nelson all earned the recognition following a third-place finish in the 4x400-meter relay at nationals. Ashley picked up the honor in the 400-meter dash in addition to the 4x4.

In 2003, McWilliams became the first woman in MSU track and field history to win a national championship. Running 4:06.75, McWilliams broke an NCAA Championships record en route to winning the 1500-meter run. She was also crowned the SEC indoor champion in the mile run in addition to the outdoor 800- and 1500-meter runs.

At the Outdoor Championships, State tallied the second-highest point total with 20 points. MSU finished in tied for 15th behind Pierre Browne's second-place showing in the 100-meter dash (10.34). Hardee took fifth in the decathlon for his first all-America honor, while Kelvin Harris ran 13.86 in the 110-meter hurdles to earn his first all-America nod.

The men topped all previous indoor squads at the NCAA Indoor Championships. The Bulldogs scored 15 points to score in the top 10 for the first time in school history. Browne won the 60-meter dash title (6.60), while Marquis Davis finished second in the 200 (20.70).

During 2002, Schmidt and the MSU program hosted the SEC Outdoor Championships. At the meet, State's men scored 35 points as a team, the second-highest total of an MSU squad since his arrival. He also witnessed the men's program tally its highest points total since 1991 at the SEC Indoor Championship.

Elisha Williams become the school's first indoor all-American in 2001 after taking second in long jump. Later in the season, Williams became the second woman to become a double all-American in the same year. Williams took fifth in the outdoor long jump. Schmidt also helped Falilatu Ogunkoya finished her MSU career in 2001 as a five-time all-American, and Camille Harper closed out her career as an all-American in the 100-meter dash

The 1990s saw Aki Bradley benefit from the tutelage of Schmidt. Bradley became a double all-American at the 1994 NCAA Outdoor Championships, placing in both the 100- and 200-meter sprints. In 1992, MSU hosted the SEC Outdoor meet. In the first year Arkansas and South Carolina were members of the conference, the Bulldogs finished seventh overall.

Schmidt's first men's team in 1989 showed immediate improvement, finishing fifth at both the SEC Indoor and Outdoor Championships. It marked the first time in five years the Bulldogs finished in the top half of the conference.

During Schmidt's first three years, he saw Festus Igbinoghene earn six all-America awards in horizontal jumps, including three runner-up finishes in the triple jump.

ACADEMICS

Under Schmidt, State's squads have also excelled in the classroom. A total of 193 student-athletes have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll a combined 239 Times. Three athletes - Rob Irwin, Tina Bridgeman and April Ecke each earned Academic all-America honors. Distance runner Ecke earned the 1995 H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar Athlete of the Year honor after an outstanding career on the track and in the classroom. Chris Boldt earned First Team Academic all-District honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America in 2003, while Matt Denton collected the honor in 2005. Joining Boldt and Denton this past year were Brian Irwin who finished 1st Team Academic all-District for the Men's, Joy Griffith who finished First Team Academic all-District, and Zita Magloire who finished with 2nd Team Academic all-District. Also, in 2006 the Lady Bulldogs were selected by the U.S. Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association, as an All-Academic Team. They were one of 77 teams nationally and joined four other Southeastern Conference squads for the prestigious honor. In 2007, both cross country teams were selected the Track and Field and Cross Country Coaches Association, as an All-Academic Team. The MState women were one of 158 schools, while the men were one of 98 nationwide that receive the honor. Only six SEC teams had both their male and female teams represented.

PRIOR TO MSU

Before coming to MSU, Schmidt was instrumental in the success of Florida State University's track and field program in the mid 1980s. First serving as an assistant women's track coach and head cross country coach, he later became an assistant men's track coach and head cross country coach. Under his guidance, the Lady Seminoles won two national titles, taking the 1984 outdoor and 1985 indoor titles. The FSU women also claimed runner-up honors at the 1983 and 1985 outdoor meets.

Upon earning his bachelor's degree from St. Louis University, Schmidt made his coaching debut as an assistant cross country coach at the University of Missouri-St. Louis before returning to his alma mater as head men's track coach for the next five years. After spending two year in private business, Schmidt returned to the track in 1982 as a graduate assistant at the University of Kansas. Following his one season at KU, he began his six-year stint at Florida State.

PERSONAL

In 1997, Schmidt served as a District 9 representative for the NCAA Women's Cross Country Championships. Having rewritten the endurance curriculum for Levels I and II, Schmidt currently serves as the vice-chairman of USA Track and Field' Coaches Education Committee. Schmidt, 57, is married to the former Jessie Garfield of St. Louis, Mo. They are the parents of two children - daughter Sara Lynne, a junior at MSU and son, Daniel, a high school senior.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH Men's Sprints Eighth Season Mississippi State, 1995

An integral part of the Bulldogs' success since his return to Starkville, Steve Dudley begins his seventh year at Mississippi State as the associate head coach for the track and field squads and head coach of the men's cross country team.

Through seven seasons back on campus, Dudley has tutored 18 athletes to all-American status since his return to his alma mater in 2000. Last season, Dudley led four Bulldog sprinters to regional qualifying marks, including two individuals in the 400-meter dash and two in the 800-meter run. Golden Coachman, Bruce Davis and Chris Woods made postseason trips.

The 2007 tandum of MState's 4x400-meter relay team of B. Davis, Nathan Daniels, Arthur Davis and Ezra Jones bested their previous finish from 2006, finishing in three minutes, three seconds to take fourth place. Coachman and the quartet all gained all-America honors. The 2006 edition of State's 4x400-meter relay team of juniors B. Davis, Ezra Jones, A. Davis and Daniels ran 3:05 to finish seventh at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. The finish by the quartet garners A. Davis with his third all-America honor in the event, while B. Davis, Jones and Daniels collected their first. In 2005, Dudley guided MState's 4x400meter relay squad to a fifth-place finish at the national championships and broke a school record held for more than a decade (3:01.63). As a result, senior Jamel Ashley, freshman Elzie Coleman, Arthur Davis, senior LaChristopher Lewis, Kendall Pyant II and Chris Woods earned all-America status. In the 4x100-meter relay, Ashley, Lewis, sophomore Eliott Morant and Mullings tied a school record with a 39.09 clocking at the Texas Relays. Mullings, Ashley, Davis and Lewis combined to finish third in the event at the SEC Championships. Since the 2003 Penn Relays, the Bulldogs have failed to win the 4x200-meter relay only once. Former Bulldog Steve Mullings posted the fastest regionalqualifying time in the country in the 100-meter dash (10.06) and won the Southeastern Conference and Mideast Regional championships. In his final season for the Maroon and White, Jamel Ashley garnered all-America honors with a second-place finish in the 400-meter dash at the national championships. Ashley's 44.75 broke a school record he set a

At the 2004 SEC Championships, Ashley, Davis, Keston Nelson and Lewis finished second in the 4x4. Ashley took eighth in the 400 at the national meet, while the 4x4 squad finished third.

Pierre Browne was named the 2003 NCAA Indoor national champion in the 60-meter dash and finished runner-up in the 100 at the outdoor national meet. Marquis Davis finished second in the 200 at the outdoor national meet the same season. Throughout the season, four of his athletes accumulated six all-America honors. Dudley's first season in Starkville saw his athletes earn eight all-America accolades.

In three seasons at Bevill State (Ala.) Community College, Dudley coached three NJCAA national champions and 19 all-Americans. In cross country, the men's and women's squads captured the Region XXII title in 1999. The Bears also won the 1998 Region XXII title en route to a third-place national showing. His 1999 Lady Bear team earned Academic Team of the Year honors, and the men finished second the same season. Twelve Bears earned Academic all-America accolades.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Dudley served as a captain for MSU's track team from 1991-95. While at State, he was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll for three years (1993-95). He currently ranks fifth on MSU's all-time superlatives list in two categories--the indoor 5000-meter run and the outdoor 10,000-meter run.

The Hamilton, Ala.-native graduated with a bachelor's degree in May 1995. He received his master's degree in environmental geology from State in December 2004.



BRYAN FETZER

Bryan Fetzer comes to Mississippi State from University of California, Berkeley. His primary responsibilities are coaching hurdles, jumpers and women's sprints. Fetzer joined the Bears' staff in 2004 as the women's sprints and hurdles coach and also worked as recruiting coordinator. While at Cal, his athletes broke 11 school records in sprints and hurdles. He also coached the women's squad to their highest NCAA finishes with an eighth place showing at the 2007 outdoor meet and 15th at the 2007 indoor championship.

Prior to Cal, Fetzer spent one year at Ball State University in Muncie, Ind. as the women's sprints and hurdles coach and also coached field events. At BSU, Fetzer coached five NCAA regional qualifiers and three Mid-American champions. He also coached the Cardinals to their first MAC cross country team title in 2003.

Fetzer is credited with building the inaugural track and field program at Gardner-Webb University in Boiling Springs, N.C. As the head coach of both the cross country and track and field programs he coached the women's squad to an NCAA Division II indoor fourth-place finish and fifth-place finish at outdoors in 2000. For his efforts that year, he was named the USATF NCAA Division II Southeast Head Coach of the Year. In their first year at the Division I level, Gardner-Webb was the Atlantic Sun outdoor women's runner-up.


Following his college graduation, Fetzer was named as an assistant track and field coach at Ranger College in Ranger, Texas, where he initiated the indoor track and cross country programs. He was also head women's track and field and cross country coach from 1997-99.

A 1996 graduate of Canisius College in Buffalo, N.Y., Fetzer earned his Bachelor of Arts in physical education with a teaching certification. Fetzer was a four-year football letterman and served as captain his senior year. Fetzer also holds a Master's in physical education from Tarleton State University.

Fetzer has coached 16 national individual champions and 83 all-Americans. He has coached one IAAF world ranked leader and one USATF national champion. Fetzer has also served on the U.S. Women's Coaches Association Executive Committee since 2003. On the international level, Fetzer served as World University Games Assistant Coach for Uganda in 2001 and assistant coach of the NACAC Under 23 Championship squad in Jamaica. He has also served on the NJCAA Track and Field Coaches Association Executive Committee.

Distance Fourth Season Mississippi State, 1998

Houston Franks returned home to Mississippi State in 2004 as an assistant track and field coach. An accomplished distance runner at for the Maroon and White from 1994-98, Franks assists coaching and developing men's distance runners.

The four-year coach is an integral part to the recent success of the MState men's cross country program. This past cross country season, the Bulldogs finished fifth at the Southeastern Conference Cross Country Championship - the best placement by the men's squad since the 1981 season and the best finish since the program was revived in 2003. Working alongside men's head cross country coach Steve Dudley, Franks helped the squad to a season-opening meet win at the Sewanee Invite. The 2005 team also finished second at the Crimson Classic. The men finalized the 2005 slate with an eighth-place spot at the NCAA South Regional.

Prior to returning to Starkville, Franks spent five years at Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State University). While at SMS, Franks served as head cross country coach for the Bears. While there, he won three Missouri Valley Conference women's titles. His women's teams finished in the top four at the NCAA Midwest Regionals during his last three years and his men's squads finished in the top half of the conference during all five seasons. During the track and field season, the Bears captured three indoor and outdoor league championships on the women's side.

Franks was a three-time MVC Coach of the Year in women's cross country. During the 2002-03 season, he was also a part of the first SMS squad since 1993-94 to win the league's coveted Triple Crown championships in cross country and both indoor and outdoor track and field.

Franks was also a graduate assistant at MSU under Al Schmidt during the 1998-99 season. While an assistant, he developed training programs for distance runners and coordinated team travel, recruiting and meet administration.

While running for the Maroon and White, Franks was considered MSU's top distance runner and was named to the Southeastern Conference's Academic Honor Roll three times. He currently ranks second on MState's all-time list in the indoor 3000-meter run and fourth in the outdoor 10,000-meter run.

Franks is a 1998 MSU graduate with a teaching and coaching degree. He received his master's degree in sports administration from MSU in August 1999.

The Tupelo, Miss.-native was a four-year letterwinner at Tupelo High School and was named an all-American in cross country his senior season. A state champion in both cross country and the two-mile run, he was also named an all-State selection three times during his track and field career at THS.

He and his wife, the former Meggan Hodge, were married in December 2007.

Thomas helped UT win the 2005 SEC Indoor Championship. She was part of Tennessee's 2005 NCAA Mideast Regional team that captured the program's first victory at that event.

Entering his third season assisting with the MState track and field program is Joe Gant. Gant, a former two-year letterwinner on the Bulldog track squad in 1974 and 1975, works daily with the vertical jumps. The Vaiden, Miss.-native came to State in 1974 after a two-year stint in the junior college ranks in Mississippi. He turned in a personal best 15 feet, six inches in the pole vault competition and placed second in the Southeastern Conference decathlon with 7,041 points. His total in the event is a school record (old javelin).

After his collegiate days, Gant remained in the state of Mississippi in the high school football ranks at Weir High School in Choctaw County, Miss. While at WHS, Gant led the Lions to five Class 1A State Championships. His quintet of state titles is second all time in the Mississippi High School Athletic Association's coaching laurels. He is the only coach in Mississippi to have won that many at one school.

His nephew, Jamie Gant, played two seasons for the MSU Diamond Dogs from 2003-04.

Sprints

Three-time all-American LaChristopher Lewis returns to the program as a volunteer assistant coach for the 2007-08 season. Lewis, a four-year letterwinner for the Bulldogs, will assist with the sprinters this season under the direction of Associate Head Coach Steve Dudley.

Lewis has been to two NCAA Championships for the Bulldogs and finished in the top 20 both times. In 2004, he competed in the long jump and was a member of the 4x400-meter relay team that placed third. In 2005, the Coldwater, Miss.-native, competed in the long jump again and ran third leg on the 4x400-meter relay tandum that took home fifth place and still holds the MSU school record for fastest time (three minutes, 1.67 seconds) in the 4x400-meter relay. Lewis also rain the final leg on the 4x100-meter relay-school record holding team that ran a time of 39.09. Lewis still holds the freshman record in the 400-meter dash, clocking a time of 46.20 in 2002.

Lewis ranks third on the all-time indoor superlatives list in the 200-meter dash, fourth in the pentathlon and first on the 4x400-meter relay.

The former SEC Athlete of the Week and SEC Champion in the long jump was also named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll and recipient of the Jace Lacoste award.





State's Golden Coachman And 4x400 Meter Relay Team Finish Fourth At NCAA Championship

Mississippi State's Golden Coachman and the 4x400meter relay team both finished fourth in the nation in their respective events on the final day of the 2007 NCAA Track & Field Championships in Sacramento, Calif. on Saturday.

With Coachman's finish along with MSU's foursome of Arthur Davis, Bruce Davis, Nathan Daniels and Ezra Jones placement in the relay final, all five Bulldogs earned all-American status. Goldman, who spent time in Iraq with the military a couple of seasons ago, becomes the second MSU track and field athlete to earn the status of all-American in the 800-meter run. Arthur Davis also etched his name in MState's track laurels. The Mobile, Ala.-senior became just the second MSU trackster to earn all-American honors in all four seasons in the Maroon and White. Daniels and B. Davis have garnered the honor for the second-straight season.

"We had a good meet," said MSU head coach Al Schmidt. "Golden's (Coachman) story is truly incedible – to be serving in Iraq a couple of years to now earning all-American status in his first season here. We are very proud of all five individuals for being all-Americans this season. It was a good year on the men's side."

Coachman clocked a final time of one minute, 47.96 seconds, his best time of the weekend. The men's 800-meter run had two preliminary rounds preceding the finals. The Birmingham, Ala.-product set the school record earlier in the year at the Southeastern Conference Championships in May with a mark of 1:47.40.

The time turned in by the State 4x400-meter relay team set a new season-best time with a finish of 3:03.49 which is fifthbest all-time at MSU. They finished just behind LSU and ahead of Georgia.

As a team, MSU placed 28th in the overall team standings with 10 points. With the placement, the Bulldog track squad has finished in the top-30 in six of the last seven seasons at the NCAA national meet.

MSU Track Heads To Missouri For 2007 Mideast Regional

Mississippi State's track and field team will travel to Columbia, Mo. this weekend for postseason competition at the 2007 NCAA Mideast Regional, hosted by the University of Missouri beginning on Friday, May 25.

State has 12 individuals and two relay teams that vie for

bids to the NCAA Championships this weekend. MState senior Travis McKay will pull double-duty this weekend by qualifying for two separate events at the NCAA Regional. McKay, will be in the field for the men's 1500-meter run and the 3000-meter steeplechase. He is coming off a fourth-place finish in the steeplechase at the 2007 Southeastern Conference Track and Field Championships two weeks ago.

MSU's Golden Coachman, who set the school record in the 800-meter run at SEC meet, comes into the meet with the fourth-best time in the nation with his one minute, 47.40 second mark at the SEC Championship. He will be joined by teammate Chris Woods in the two-lap event. Woods has a 1:49.25 qualifying mark which was set at the Auburn Invitational. In the 400-meter run, the Bulldogs will be represented by seniors Arthur Davis and Bruce Davis. A. Davis ranks eighth in the Mideast region with a mark of 46.37 in the event. Juniors Delandus O'Neal and Kyle Roberts are slated to run in the 400-meter hurdles.

State Garners Five NCAA Regional Marks At Mississippi Open

Mississippi State reeled in five NCAA Regional qualifying marks at the Mississippi Open on Saturday at the University of Mississippi. The Bulldogs notched four post season marks at the event.

MState's men registered two qualifying marks in both the 400-meter dash and the 800-meter run. Bruce Davis and Arthur Davis earned bids to the post-season competition in the 400-meter dash. B. Davis clocked a time of 46.72 seconds while A. Davis finished right behind him at 46.77.

It marks the second-straight season that A. Davis has reached the NCAA Regionals in the 400-meter dash. In the 800-meter run, the Maroon and White finished one-two with junior Golden Coachman registering a qualifying time of one minute, 49.97 seconds to win the event. Senior Chris Woods finished runner-up with a 1:50.03 mark. Woods advances to the regionals in back-to-back seasons in the 800-meter run.

"Today was an excellent day considering the weather conditions that we were faced with," said MSU Associate head coach Steve Dudley. "Anytime you get five qualified, it is worth the trip.I really think running in the weather conditions last week at Texas really prepared us for today."

State's Golden Coachman Wins Gold Medal At NACAC Championships

Mississppi State's Golden Coachman claimed gold in the men's 800-meter run at the North America, Central America and Caribbean Athletic Association's (NACAC) Senior Championships late Saturday night.

The Birmingham, Ala.-native clocked a time of one minute, 49.01 seconds to claim medalist honors. He was 27-tenths of a second faster than the silver medalist Pablo Solares of Mexico. With his gold medal at the NACA Championships, Coachman becomes the first MSU track student athlete since Dion Crabbe won gold at the Central America and Caribbean Games in 2003.

Coachman's gold medal is one of 15 first-place finishes by the United States team at the 32-country event. The NACAC is comprised of 32 member countries and approximately 500 athletes are on hand competing in the championships. The NACAC is affiliated with the International Association of Athletics Federation (IAAF).

Senior Distance Standout Travis McKay Earns SEC Male Runner of the Week


Mississippi State senior distance runner Travis McKay has been tabbed by the Southeastern Conference as the league's male track and field runner of the week announced Tuesday by the conference office in Birmingham. Ala.

McKay earned an NCAA regional qualifying mark in the men's 3000-meter steeplechase this past weekend at the Georgia Relays in Athens, Ga. The Edmonton, Alberta, Canadanative qualified with a personal-best eight minutes, 54.95 seconds to claim the top spot in the event. He becomes the first runner in the country to garner a regional qualifying mark. The time posted also ranks as the top time in the nation as of March 19 along with being the third-best mark in MSU track and field laurels.

This award marks the third time McKay has earned the weekly honor from the SEC. This past fall, he earned the award for winning the Sewanee Invite during the cross country season. He was also a 2005 weekly award winner in cross country.

She will continue her education on the MState campus at the school's veterinary program. The Tuscaloosa, Ala.-product owns the 3000-meter steeplechase school record on the women's side.

Sophomore Michelle Corrigan joins Griffith on the university division first team. Corrigan sports a 3.85 GPA in biological sciences at MSU. This season she set the MSU school record in the 10,000-meter run at the Mt. SAC Relays with a time of 35 minutes, 30.43 seconds. She was selected to the 2006 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll. Junior Annie Falor was tabbed to the district's second team. Falor, from Flagstaff, Ariz. and an English major at State, posted a 3.96 GPA during the academic year. She was the women's cross country Newsom Award winner and is a two-time all-SEC academic honoree.

McPherson came off a personal-best effort in the 1500meter run with a mark of 4:20.87 at the league championships. McPherson, the Nampa, Idaho-native, was ranked 10th in the 1500-meter Dandy Dozen.

McPherson Closes Out MSU Career At Mideast Track & Field Regional

Mississippi State had four individuals advance to the finals of their respective events on Friday at the NCAA Mideast Regional on the University of Missouri campus.

On the women's side, senior Nicola Wilson registered a mark of 45 feet, eight and a half inches in the shot put to finish 19th in the field. Senior Jen McPherson closed out her stellar career in the Maroon and White with a time of 4:29.33. The Nampa, Idaho-product closes out her Lady Bulldog stint as one of three MSU women to compete at all three NCAA Championships cross country, indoor track and outdoor track.

"Jen (McPherson) closes out her great career at MSU. It is sad to see it end, but she went to a lot of championships for us," said head coach Al Schmidt.

Harris, Wilson Complete MSU's Competition At Mt. SAC Relays

Mississippi State sophomore Marrissa Harris finished second in the women's 100-meter hurdles on the final day of competition at the Mt. SAC Relays on Sunday. The Memphis, Tenn.-native also finished in the top-10 of the long jump event.

Harris improved her NCAA Regional qualifying time in the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 13.71 seconds. She posted her second qualifying mark of the season in the long jump with a mark of 19 feet, 11 and half inches.

"She (Marrissa) improved her NCAA mark in the hurdles," said MSU head coach Al Schmidt. "All in all, I think it was a pretty good trip put here."

Senior Nicola Wilson competed in the invitational section of women's shot put at the west coast event and finished as the top collegiate competitor with a toss of 47-02 ½. The Trenton, N.J.-product now owns four of the top five shot put marks in the MState record books.

MState Track Wins Team Titles At Bulldog Invitational

Both the men's and women's Mississippi State track and field teams won the Bulldog Invitational on Saturday at the W.O Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track as part of Super Bulldog Weekend activities. The Lady Bulldogs scored 228 points.

Freshman Wendy Copeland of Tupelo, Miss., garnered one of three NCAA regional qualifying marks in women's field events for MSU. Copeland registered a mark of 19 feet, nine and three quarter inches in the long jump. Senior Nicola Wilson carded a regional mark with a toss of 47-07.75. Christina Hernandez posted her second regional qualifying mark of the season in the discus with a throw of 156-01.

"It was a good weekend," said MSU head coach Al

Schmidt. "The wind was a bit tough today for the sprints. Anytime you get NCAA qualifiers, it's a good day and we won the event, which makes it even better."

MSU honored two Lady Bulldogs for their achievements in the classroom on Saturday with the presentation of the Newsom Award. The award recognizes outstanding achievement in the classroom and in athletics. The 2007 recipients of the award include Joy Griffith, women's track, and Annie Falor for women's cross country.

State Earns Five Regional Qualifying Marks; Harris Breaks School Record In Long Jump At Alabama Relays

Mississippi State's track and field squad registered five NCAA regional qualifying marks on Saturday at the Alabama Relays at the Sam Bailey Track and Field Stadium. With the five qualifying marks at the UA event, MSU now has eight NCAA marks in the first three weeks of the season.

Sophomore Marrissa Harris posted two of the regional qualifying marks for MSU. The Memphis, Tenn.-product earned a mark of 13.81 seconds in the 100-meter hurdles, which ranks third-best all-time at State. Harris's second regional mark of the day came in long jump competition. 

Bulldog Track Finishes Tenth At NCAA Mideast Regional; Nine Individuals Advance To NCAA Championships

Competing in one of the toughest regions in the country, Mississippi State's men's track team finished tenth in the 2007 NCAA Mideast Track and Field Championships on Saturday at the University of Missouri. The Bulldogs will have at least nine individuals move on to NCAA Championships and will await word on at-large berths by the governing organization next week.

MState finished with 29 points at the Mideast Regional that hosted over 74 men's teams. Six of seven the Southeastern Conference teams finished in the top-10 with LSU claiming the Regional title. Teams from the Big 12, Big East and Conference USA were also among the leagues represented at Audrey J. Walton Stadium on the UM campus.

This was a great day, said MSU head coach Al Schmidt. To finish where we did in this region is outstanding. All the guys ran well today, especially Chris (Woods), Golden (Coachman) and Travis (McKay) had a personal record in the steeplechase.

State's 4x400-meter relay team clocked a season-best time of three minutes, 4.72 seconds to cap off the superb day for the Maroon and White. The foursome of Bruce Davis, Nathan Daniels, Arthur Davis and Ezra Jones finished third behind Kentucky and LSU. The time posted by the team fell 12 seconds short of breaking into the top-five all-time times in the 4x400 at MSU. They will advance to compete at the NCAA Championships on Sacramento, Ca., beginning on June 6.

In the 400-meter run, senior Bruce Davis placed runner-up with a career-best mark of 46.02. The Phenix City, Ala.-product finished just four tenths of a second behind Wisconsin's James Groce. His mark ranks fifth all-time in MSU track laurels. Davis will continue his career with a trip to the NCAA Championships. Senior Arthur Davis posted a time of 46.56 and placed seventh in the event. He will await word on an at-large bid into the 400-meter dash event at the national meet, due to his regular season time. MSU also had two individuals in the finals of the 800-meter run with Golden Coachman and Chris Woods finishing fourth and fifth respectively. In his last two outings, Coachman has finished third at the SEC Championships and fourth at the Mideast Regional.

Senior distance standout Travis McKay bested his personal-best time in the 3000-meter steeplechase with a time of 8:49.45 to finish seventh overall. His previous best was 8:52.23 set earlier in the year at the Mt. SAC Relays. The Edmonton, Alberta, Canada-native extends his season to the NCAA Championships with his finish at the regional level.

The Bulldogs will now prepare for the trip to Sacramento, Ca. for the 2007 NCAA Championships that will begin on June 6.

State's Golden Coachman And 4x400 Meter Relay Team Finish Fourth At NCAA Championship

Mississippi State's Golden Coachman and the 4x400-meter relay team both finished fourth in the nation in their respective events on the final day of the 2007 NCAA Track & Field Championships in Sacramento, Calif. on Saturday.

With Coachman's finish along with MSU's foursome of Arthur Davis, Bruce Davis, Nathan Daniels and Ezra Jones placement in the relay final, all five Bulldogs earned all-American status. Goldman, who spent time in Iraq with the military a couple of seasons ago, becomes the second MSU track and field athlete to earn the status of all-American in the 800-meter run. Arthur Davis also etched his name in MState's track laurels. The Mobile, Ala.-senior beame just the second MSU trackster to earn all-American honors in all four seasons in the Maroon and White. Daniels and B. Davis have garnered the honor for the second-straight season.

"We had a good meet," said MSU head coach Al Schmidt. "
Golden's (Coachman) story is truly incedible – to be serving in Iraq a couple
of years to now earning all-American status in his first season here. We are
very proud of all five individuals for being all-Americans this season. It was a
good year on the men's side."

Coachman clocked a final time of one minute, 47.96 seconds, his best time of the weekend. The men's 800-meter run had two preliminary rounds preceding the finals. The Birmingham, Ala.-product set the school record earlier in the year at the Southeastern Conference Championships in May with a mark of 1:47.40.

The time turned in by the State 4x400-meter relay team set a new season-best time with a finish of 3:03.49 which is fifth-best all-time at MSU. They finished just behind LSU and ahead of Georgia.



UNIVERSITY STORY

Mississippi State University

Mississippi State is a comprehensive land-grant institution and the largest university in Mississippi, with a statewide enrollment of more than 16,000 students. Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi,

Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research, and service.



Academics and Student Life

Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as a Truman Honor Institution. In the past year, a student team competed for and won first place in a national Challenge X competition to redesign a fuel-efficient and environmentally-friendly SUV.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options. The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day one Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and invitors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study-abroad opportunities.



Research

Mississippi State faculty researchers attracted \$186.5 million in external funding for 2006-07, up from about \$155 million during the previous year. This funding supported 1,691 sponsored projects in 2007.

Based on the latest rankings available from the National Science Foundation, MSU ranks 7th in the nation in agricultural sciences research expenditures and 44th

in engineering. Last year MSU faculty and staff disclosed 80 new technologies resulting in three new start-up companies, nine licenses, and 22 patent applications. The university now holds 77 patents.

In recent years, MSU has established the Thad Cochran Endowment for Entrepreneurship, as well as collaborating with federal agencies and industries to help increase technology-oriented start-up companies. Among the collaborators and sponsors are the U.S. departments of Defense and Energy, NASA, General Electric, Northrop Grumman, EADS/American Eurocopter, Boeing, Raytheon, General Dynamics, Israeli Aerospace Industry, and the Mississippi Technology Alliance.

In a key area of economic interest to Mississippi, MSU's Center for Advanced Vehicular Systems, established in 2001, continues research and development supporting a goal of attracting automotive industries to the state. The center is conducting research in areas that include materials processing, human and systems engineering, alternative power systems, computational manufacturing and design, and advanced learning technologies.




Outreach and Service

From its academic programs to the work of countless individuals, Mississippi State has "extended farther" and gone "beyond the limit" to make a difference in the lives of citizens around the state. In 2006, the university formed the Mississippi State Community Action Team to organize university resources and expertise for quick response to local issues around the state. MSU's Extension Service is the first in the nation to have an interactive videoconferencing system in every county Extension office. Through the Freedom Calls program, the system is being used to connect Mississispians with family members in the U.S. military serving our country in Iraq.

The MSU Extension Service maintains offices in almost every county of the state, and the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station operates 10 branch stations throughout Mississippi. Four strategically located research and extension centers coordinate the delivery of services statewide.

IYHIA McMICHAEL, who concluded her career in 2004, is the only two-time SEC Softball Athlete of the Year in league history.

LAURENT MIQUELARD (L) and JOC SIMMONS won the NCAA men's tennis doubles national championship in 1994.

LAWRENCE ROBERTS was the SEC Player of the Year in 2004 and a national finalist for the Wooden Award, given annually to college basketball's top player.

Great-Players

As a relief pitcher with the Boston Red Sox, JONATHAN PAPELBON was named to the MLB All-Star game in each of his first two seasons.

JERIOUS NORWOOD concluded his football career in 2005 as the school's single-game and career rushing leader. He was named winner of the Conerly Trophy as the state's top college football player, was selected to play in the Senior Bowl, and was taken by the Atlanta Falcons in the NFL Draft.

LATOYA THOMAS

TIFFANY McWILLIAMS won the NCAA national championship in the 1500 meter run in 2003 and '04, and the national title in the indoor mile in 2004.

State's coaches care for their

student-athletes and the school's sports programs. Each has a passion for their specialty, experience as a player and coach, and expertise to instruct at the highest levels. Their goal is to coach champions on the field and mold productive college graduates from the university's classroom.

CHRISTI SANDERS (back left) has the longest, consecutive coaching reign of any head coach at State, with 20 seasons at the helm of the women's golf program. She has twice been named SEC Coach of the Year (1990, 2000).


RON POLK has guided six MSU squads to the College World Series, including the 2007 Diamond Dogs and 20 teams to NCAA regional showings.

SYLVESTER CROOM was named head coach at MSU in December 2003, an announcement that brought immediate national attention to the Bulldog football program.



RICK STANSBURY'S men's basketball teams have averaged better than 20 wins per year under his guidance and have participated in postseason play seven times in his nine years.

NEIL MACDONALD is the only head coach to guide the MState soccer program to an SEC Tournament appearance in his first season (2004).

CLAY HOMAN, a second-team all-SEC performer during his MState playing career, has led the men's golf program to 32 top 10 finishes in four years.

TRACY LANE has the most wins of any head women's tennis coach in MSU history. She directed the 2005 Lady Bulldogs to an SEC Western Division title and has guided MSU to four NCAA Championship berths in her 11 seasons at the State helm.

JAY MILLER is one of the most respected coaches around the country, and a key contributor to USA Softball in various capacities. He has directed the State softball program to four NCAA postseason appearances in his five seasons.

PER NILSSON, a former MSU tennis standout, began his first season at the helm of the Bulldog men's tennis program this year.

TINA SEALS returned to her alma mater as head volleyball coach in 2004. The school's first All-SEC volleyball performer guided the Bulldogs in 2006 to their most wins since 1996 and a school-record for SEC wins.

Now in his second decade as the head coach of the men's and women's track teams, AL SCHMIDT has coached three MState athletes to national titles.

MSU has played in the SEC Football

Championship Game, the basketball Final Four, the baseball College World Series, and in numerous NCAA national title events since 1996. The last decade has brought overall achievement unmatched at State. and each new generation adds more hardware to the school's trophy cases.

The 1999 Maroon football team won its first eight games of the season, amassed 10 victories for just the second time in school history, and defeated Clemson in the Peach Bowl at Atlanta. Quarterback Wayne Madkin (above), State's all-time leading passer, was named the bowl game's Most Valuable Offensive Player.

State won the SEC Western
Division title in 1998 and held a
fourth-quarter lead on eventual
national champion Tennessee in
the league championship game
at the Georgia Dome. The
Bulldogs' appearance in the
championship game garnered
the school a berth in the 1999
Cotton Bowl.



MSU's 1998 men's tennis team was one of two Bulldog squads that reached the NCAA semifinals, losing to perennial national champion Stanford. The '98 team was one of 10 State net teams that earned NCAA Sweet 16 berths from 1991-2001.

State's soccer team captured the 2001 SEC Western Division crown, the first SEC championship of any kind by an MSU women's team. That title came in just the sport's seventh year of existence on the campus.



The "thunder and lightning" duo of Rafael Palmeiro and Will Clark guided the Bulldog baseball program to SEC regular season and tournament titles, and to a national third-place finish at the College World Series in 1985. The '85 team's finish was the best of MSU's seven CWS squads.

The 1995-96 Mississippi State men's basketball team earned the school's first-ever NCAA Final Four appearance after claiming the program's first SEC Tournament title and winning the SEC Western Division crown.

The Lady Bulldog basketball team has gone to eight postseason appearances under Head Coach Sharon Fanning, including four NCAA Tournament appearances.

MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY

The MState men's golf team captured the school's second-consecutive SEC Tournament title in 1997 and participated in NCAA regional competition for just the second time in school history.

Mississippi State athletes play in some

Mississippi State athletes play in some of the nation's finest facilities. Almost ever Bulldog competition site has either been constructed or renovated in the last 15 years. During that time along, more than \$60 million in facility enhancements have been made.

DAVIS WADE STADIUM AT SCOTT FIELD: Near-sellout crowds have become the norm at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field, where the Bulldogs have played before masses reaching 85 percent of stadium capacity. Since the 2000 season when expansion and renovation projects gave the nation's second-oldest stadium a gleaming new look, crowds have grown by nearly 30 percent.



PITTS TENNIS CENTRE: Considered among the finest tennis facilities in the collegiate ranks, the modern, six-court, 1,000-seat A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre recently completed its 24th year serving the men's and women's programs. Recent enhancements at the facility include new locker areas and concession stands [1998] and a permanent press box (2004).

W.O. SPENCER STADIUM/ CARL MADDOX TRACK:

Co-named in honor of a two-time Mississippi State Olympian and a former MSU athletic director, the W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track has served as host to the Southeastern Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships three times since 1985, joining Tennessee as the most frequent host for that event during that time.



DUDY NOBLE FIELD, POLK-DEMENT STADIUM: One of the nation's leaders in baseball season ticket sales and attendance, Dudy Noble Field, Polk-Dement Stadium still holds the nation's on-campus single-game attendance mark — 14,991. With a seating capacity of more than 7,000 and more space in the world-famous outfield, Sports Illustrated magazine named the park, the "Best Place To Watch College Baseball" in a 1997 issue.



The 12,000-square foot, hardwood-floored Newell-Grissom Building serves as the home for Mississippi State's volleyball program and serves as a practice facility for both of the school's basketball programs. A state-of-the-art heating and air conditioning system was installed in 2004.

CERT-Places

HUMPHREY COLISEUM: Season ticket sales records and all-time attendance marks have also been set over the past decade by Bulldog and Lady Bulldog basketball teams in the Humphrey Coliseum, the state's largest oncampus basketball arena. The latest addition to the facility was a \$1.8 million, center-hung, foursided video scoreboard and jumbotron screen installed in 2004.

MSU GOLF COURSE:

Nominated by Golfweek and Golf Digest magazines as one of the premier public golf courses in the United States, Mississippi State's championship University Golf Course is the home to the men's and women's programs. The 18-hole course was recently furnished with a 5,000-square-foot clubhouse, complete with locker areas, snack bar, golf shop and classroom.

MSU SOFTBALL FIELD: Constructed in 1997, the Mississippi State Softball Field has undergone almost constant improvement at the northern-most point of campus. Lights were added to the facility in 1998, brick work was added to the dugouts two years later and, in 2001, additional batting cages were built. In 2005, softball moved into a new locker, training and meeting facility adjacent to the park.

MSU SOCCER FIELD: Built in 1995, the lighted Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldog women one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast, a 114-yard long, 72-yard wide regulation NCAA Championship field. The lush turf is Mississippi Pride grass, developed by researchers on the MSU campus.



BRYAN BUILDING: The state-ofthe-art John H. Bryan Athletic Administration Building is the crown jewel of MSU's expansion projects of the last decade. Opened in 1996, this showcase facility is named for longtime Bulldog friend and supporter John H. Bryan St., and houses athletic administration, football, ticket, athletic development and media relations offices.

MSU student-athletes are proposed for life.

MSU student-athletes are prepared for life after their collegiate careers come to an end. Former State athletes succeed professionally in both sports and business.

ERICK DAMPIER led the Bulldog basketball program to back-to-back NCAA Tournament bids in 1995 and '96. Now an 11-year NBA veteran, he helped lead the Dallas Mavericks to an NBA Finals appearance in 2006.

TYRONE KEYS (center) starred for the MSU football team from 1977-80, won Super Bowl XX with the Chicago Bears, and is founder and president of All Sports Community Service, a Tampa-based firm that assists high-risk youth.

SAM NICHOLS lettered four years for the MState football team (1973-76) and is currently a Colonel in the United States Army.



The BULLION

Academics

While the MSU athletic program has experienced success both on the field and court, Bulldog and Lady Bulldog athletes are excelling where it counts the most — in the classroom. During the 2006-07 school year, 153 MState athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll honors.

Featuring 2005 graduates (L-R) Shane Power, Ontario Harper, Wesley Morgan and Branden Vincent, coach Rick Stansbury's Bulldogs lead all SEC schools with a total of 20 SEC Academic Honor Roll recipients in men's basketball over the past five seasons.

Burke Masters was a two-time First Team GTE-CoSIDA Academic All-American (1989 and 1990), four-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection and the 1990 Boyd McWhorter SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

A two-time Academic all-SEC selection, Kate Jaspers racked up numerous academic awards while at MSU. She was twice named ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American, and a three-time NFCA Scholar Athlete All-America. In 2004, Jaspers was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, as well as the CoSIDA Academic Player of the Year.

Annemarie Pimentel was a four-year soccer letterwinner. While at State, she was a three-time Academic all-SEC selection, while being named to the GTE and Verizon Academic All-District teams. Her career culminated in being selected the 2000 SEC Boyd McWhorter Post-Graduate Scholarship winner, awarded to the student-athlete who best demonstrates excellence in athletics, academics and community service.



Fallions

The most unique and certainly the most resounding symbol of MSU tradition is the cowbell. Cowbells decorate homes and offices of MSU alumni, and are passed down through generations of Bulldog fans. Although banned from SEC games since 1974, the ruling has not damaged the cowbell's historical importance.

MSU has the largest enrollment in the


MSU has the largest enrollment in the state of Mississippi. Founded as a landgrant institution, its grass, flowers and trees are as prevalent as buildings, sidewalks and parking lots. Large enough to sport diversity in all areas, the university still maintains a warm, friendly atmosphere.

Ruby Hall, a residence hall with the largest single room size in university history, opened opened in August 2006. A co-residential, 160,000-square foot, three-story freshman hall, Ruby is located at the north end of campus, in convenient proximity to the Colvard Union, the Perry Cafeteria, Mitchell Memorial Library, the Sanderson Center and all athletic facilities. Ruby Hall offers students the latest in technology, including Ethernet access, full wireless internet coverage, a refrigerator and microwave, and free cable with HBO in each room.

The Colvard Union is a popular meeting place for MSU students. Whether working on a group project, enjoying the food court, or simply relaxing, the student union is one of the campus' main meeting places.

The Chapel of Memories and Carillon Tower were built with bricks from Old Main Dormitory, the largest residence hall in the country when constructed, later destroyed by fire in 1959. The Chapel of Memories, which hosts numerous weddings each year, is one of the most-recognized landmarks on campus.

The Drill Field, located squarely in the center of campus, shows the expanse of greenery for which the campus is famous.

DR. ROBERT H. FOGLESONG University President West Virginia, 1968 Joined MState: April 2006

Doc Foglesong was born and raised in Mingo County, West Virginia. He's the son of a steam fitter on the railroad and a first-grade teacher. He attended West Virginia University and eventually earned his bachelor's, master's, and doctorate in chemical engineering—and married his former English teacher—Mary Thrasher Foglesong of Sistersville, West Virginia.

Currently, Foglesong is the President of Mississippi State University — a land-grant school of more than 17,000 students committed to excellence in teaching, research, and service. His vision is for the university to be the most respected land-grant school in the Southeast. He also is President and Executive Director of the Appalachian Leadership and Education Foundation, an organization committed to finding, mentoring, and developing young men and women who will be the next generation of leadership across Appalachia.

Foglesong has been designated by the President of the United States as the Co-Chairman of the Joint US - Russia Commission on POWs/MIAs. He is also a Director on the Board of Massey Energy and a Director on the Board of the Michel Baker Corp.

Foglesong previously was a fourstar general in the United States Air Force. He flew fighters, was a senior leader in organizations equivalent to companies ranking 9th, 110th, and 430th on the Fortune 500 List, and worked directly with the most senior national leaders including congressional members, cabinet members, and heads of state.

Foglesong received numerous awards for leadership. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, has written more than 60 publications that cover a range of topics, and has an honorary Doctorate of Strategic Intelligence. He likes to run and collect slide rules and blow torches.

During his career as athletic director at Mississippi State, Larry Templeton has guided the sports program to unparalleled success and overseen accomplishments never attained in the near-100 years the school played on athletic fields and courts prior to his tenure. He has overseen achievement by State student-athletes in the classroom and in competition with the nation's premier programs. And he has done all that while operating within the department's now \$30 million budget.

Mississippi State competes for championships in every sport program, its athletes continue to excel in the classroom, and the department has operated in the black while expanding its varsity athletic sport program and drastically improving its facilities. Templeton has overseen all that and more as the head of the program.

On the playing field, the decade of the '90s saw virtually every State sport establish a best-ever finish. The start of the new millennium has been no different with MSU sports teams having qualified for postseason play 51 times during the past seven seasons; a school-record 12 did so in 2004-05.

But State's student-athletes are not just succeeding on the playing field. MSU's men's and women's athletes recorded the highest combined grade point average during the 2005-06 academic year in the 18 years in which student-athlete grades have been tracked. In 14 of the last 16 years, the Bulldog football team has been one of just a handful of schools cited by the American Football Coaches Association for having a graduation rate exceeding 70 percent. MSU is the only school in the SEC to make that list with that much frequency. In spring 2007, exactly one-half of all scholarship student-athletes at Mississippi State earned a grade point average of 3.00 or higher, MSU has produced the SEC's Male and Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year three times each during Templeton's tenure. And over the past seven years, State is second among league schools in number of Academic all-SEC selections in the sports in which MSU competes.

Templeton oversaw Mississippi State's move to come into compliance with the SEC's Gender Equity plan, adding women's soccer and softball to the school's varsity sport menu. The first season of soccer was in 1995, while softball began competition in 1997. Since that time, the soccer team has won the SEC Western Division title (2001) and the softball team has never had a losing season and has qualified for NCAA postseason play six of the last eight years.

The early 1990's expansions and renovations of the Leo Seal M-Club Center, the Shira Athletic Complex,

and the completion of the John H. Bryan Sr. Athletic Administration Building, were fueled by Templeton. That building trend continued into the latter stages of the '90s, with construction completed on permanent seating at the MSU Soccer Field, the conversion of McCarthy Gymnasium on campus into a varsity indoor tennis facility, and expanded seating at Humphrey Coliseum. Additional chairbacks and 18 skyboxes at Dudy Noble Field/Polk-DeMent Stadium, MSU's baseball facility, were completed in time for the 2000 season, and a \$30 million expansion of the east side of Scott Field has raised capacity at the football stadium to 55,082. Fifty new skyboxes and 1,700 chairback seats opened for the 2001 season.

Another building boom occurred during 2004-05. The Holliman Athletic Center (a 46,000-square-foot addition at the Shira Complex) the Palmeiro Center (an indoor practice facility for baseball and football), and a softball locker and training facility were added to the athletic facility plant. This past spring, a 34,000-square foot athletic academic building was approved with a 2008 completion date planned.

And for the 20th year in a row this past year, the MSU athletic program joined just a small group of NCAA Division I schools nation-wide to finish in the black financially at year's end.

Templeton's work also stretches far from the Starkville campus. He has served as chairman of the SEC's athletic directors since 1990. He is serving a second term on the prestigious NCAA Baseball Committee, currently serving as that committee's chairman. He oversees the group that chooses the sites for regional and super-regional competition, selects the 64-member playing field, oversees the operation of the tournament, selects the umpire crews, gives direction to the game operations personnel and works with the radio and television talent. He is a former member of the NCAA Championship Committee, the NCAA Management Council and the NCAA Bowl Certification Committee.

Templeton is married to the former Linda Jo Nichols. They have a son, Brian, who received his second degree (landscape architecture) at Mississippi State in May 2002. A second son, Stephen, received his doctorate from Mississippi State in August 2002, and a daughter, Nici, is an attorney in Columbia, S.C. Granddaughters Ella Grace and Addison McSwain Comer, and Eliana Xiaojiong Nichols live in Columbia, S.C., and Chattanooga, Tenn., respectively.

ANN CARR ASSOCIATE AD/WOMEN'S SPORTS Mississippi State, 1990 Joined MState: 1993



A veteran of 12 years in athletic administration at MSU and a former Lady Bulldog athlete, Ann Carr was named the university's associate athletic director for women's sports in June 2006.

Carr is in her second stint within the State athletic department following seven years as Assistant Athletic Director for Student Life. In that position, she worked with the personal development of MSU's student-athletes in addition to continuing her prior responsibilities as academic counselor for the Bulldog football team.

Carr serves as the director of the department's Life SKills program, which includes the support systems and career programs for all MSU student-athletes and its CHAMPS program (Challenging Athletes' Minds for Personal Success).

As SWA, Carr will oversee the operation and supervision of MSU's women's sport program. Hired in 1993 as an assistant director in the athletic academic office, she returned full-time to MState in 1999 following a one-year

stay in a similar capacity at the University of Southern Mississippi.

A native of Brookhaven, Miss., Carr was a four-year letter winner on the Mississippi State women's basketball team (1986-90). When Carr finished her women's basketball playing career, she ranked first on the career leaders list in free-throw percentage, shooting 75.8 percent over a four-year span. She also ranked 12th on the career points list, having scored 762 points in her tenure, averaging 8.3 points per contest. In rebounding, Carr brought down 597 boards (6.5 per game) to finish her career sixth on the all-time list in rebounds and rebounding average. She also finished her career holding the individual record in most three-point field goals made (five) in a single game.

A 1990 graduate of State, she later earned her master's degree in counseling from the institution in 1992.



W.O. SPENCER STADIUM / CARL MADDOX TRACK



W.O. SPENCER STADIUM

Co-named in honor of two-time Olympian and a former MSU athletic director, the W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track is the home of the Bulldog and Lady Bulldog track and field teams.

Dedicated on Nov. 13, 1982, with Maddox presiding, the W.O. Spencer Track Stadium was originally named in honor of one of MSU's all-time athletic greats.. A former Mississippi A&M track captain (1922) and track coach (1936-47). Spencer participated in the 1924 Olympics in Paris and the 1928 Olympics in Amsterdam. He was a member of the gold medal-winning mile relay team in the 1924 Olympics, and also ran on the steeple relay team in 1928.

CARL MADDOX TRACK

Carl Maddox Track is a 400-meter, ninelane oval in addition to runways for use in the long jump, triple jump and pole vault events. The oval is a Sika/Bram "Granutan" track and is made of polyurethane, which provides a spike-resistant, highly resilient running surface.

The facility has served as host of three Southeastern Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships - 1985, 1992 and 2002. MSU uses the facility to host two home meets each spring - The Jace Lacoste Invitational and the Bulldog Invitational along with a high school meet.



CARL MADDOX TRACK INFIELD

Now in its third decade of service to Mississippi State's track and field program, the Spencer Stadium/Maddox Track was the vision of former MSU director of athletics Carl Maddox. In dire need of a new facility with a limited budget to work from, Maddox negotiated a deal with the Mississippi National Guard to provide all the engineering and much of the labor as a training exercise. The facility was completed at a cost of around \$250,000. The track grandstand, which seats 3,500 fans, was a gift from Leo W. Seal, Jr.

EXPANSION OF DAVIS WADE STADIUM-\$30 MIL

PALMEIRO CENTER/BRYCE GRIFFIS BOARDROOM-\$8.3 MIL
