THE BOB HARTLEY MEMORIAL FELLOWSHIP

Providing training opportunities for young SIDs



Bob Hartley

For more than half a century **Robert M. "Bob" Hartley** dedicated his life's work to promoting Mississippi State University athletics. From his hiring as the school's first sports publicity director in August 1946 to his initial "retirement" as assistant athletic director for communications in June 1985, through his later years as an invaluable consultant for the Mississippi State University Department of Athletics, the man we called "Hart" gave special meaning to the words "loyalty" and "devotion to duty."

Mr. Bob's labors of love with MSU have not gone unrecognized. He has taken his place among college athletics' greats as a member of both the university's and the state's sports halls of fame and the **College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Hall of Fame**.

His willingness to generously give of his talent, his time and his friendship serves as an inspiration to the countless lives he touched and to those that aspire to follow in his footsteps.

In that respect, the **Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship** was created by the MSU Department of Athletics to provide hands-on training opportunities for young media relations practitioners.

Jay Middleton was selected as the sixth recipient of the Bob Hartley Memorial Fellowship for the 2007-2008 academic year. A native of Tupelo, Miss., Middleton enters his fifth season working with the Mississippi State athletic media relations office. Middleton worked as a student assistant from 2003-2006 and enters his second year as a graduate assistant. Middleton has served the last two years as the primary contact for the men's tennis and women's golf programs at MSU. Among other duties, he works with MStateAthletics.com, MSU's official athletic website, and Maroon to the Max, a video streaming service provided to MSU fans worldwide. Most recently, he earned national recognition for the 2007 men's tennis media guide, voted third-best tennis publication in the nation by CoSIDA.

Middleton earned his bachelor's degree in communication with an emphasis in public relations in the summer of 2006 from State and is currently seeking a master's degree in business administration.

In 2005, Coach **Tina Seal's** second Mississippi State volleyball edition registered a 15-12 mark and earned State's first winning campaign in five years. Last fall Mississippi State raised the bar with a 17-win season, marking just the second time in school history MSU had recorded back-to-back winning seasons on the volleyball court.

This fall, the Bulldogs take aim on an unprecedented third straight winning season. And with four returning starters and a solid corps of returning senior players, the table appears to be set for just such a run at Mississippi State.

Seals' 2007 squad features five seniors and eight of the 10 players that drew match-opening assignments and sparked State to its biggest single-season win totals in a decade.

"We've got a lot of experienced players returning in 2007, so one of the keys to our success could be our ability to stay healthy and avoid injuries," said Seals.

"We're going to have to develop our talent at the outside hitter position after losing two very valuable components of our offense from a year ago. But we have players with the potential to step up and fill those holes."

The quintet of returning seniors includes a trio of players --- opposite hitter **Jamie Joyner**, libero **Megan Lukasek** and middle blocker **Erin Seago** --- that were part of the six-player 2003-04 MSU recruiting class that was ranked among the nation's top 50 by PrepVolleyball.com, the first such ranking for a Mississippi State volleyball recruiting class.

Versatile senior setter **Eva Kriegel**, beginning her third year in the MSU program, and senior middle blocker and second-year Bulldog **Lauren Kowal**, complete an impressive collection of experienced players for MSU in 2007.

Junior outside hitter **Cristina Jucan** and sophomore outside hitter **Ioana Demian** drew 28 starts between them last fall and will be counted on to step up their games and take on leadership roles on offense.

A pair of sophomores, defensive specialist **Jennifer Hauskey**, one of five Bulldogs to play in all 30 matches last fall, and setter **Dorey Gray**, return primed to play more significant roles for State in 2007. Both earned berths on the 2006 squad as walk-ons.

While Mississippi State returns the lion's share of its 2006 team, the team did sustain a pair of significant losses, both at the outside hitter position.

Offensive standout **Orshi Kriegel**, the first European to play volleyball at Mississippi State, piled up 931 kills and 744 digs in three seasons at MSU. She wrapped up her stellar MSU

career with a team-leading 354-kill campaign in 2006.

All-SEC Freshman selection **Martina Gregusova**, who totaled 245 kills in just 24 matches and sported the team's second-best kills-per-game average (3.36), opted to return to her native Slovakia following her rookie season in the Southeastern Conference.

The Bulldog roster features five newcomers in 2007. State inked a pair of signees last November --- **Ashley Newsome**, a

6-0 outside hitter/middle blocker from Florence, Ala., and 6-4 opposite hitter **Meaghan Schlueter** from Lampasas, Texas.

The MSU roster is also bolstered by a trio of walk-on candidates --- outside hitter **Miranda Bauman** of Killen, Ala., setter **Kaitlin Wheatley** of Lexington, Ky., and defensive specialist **Kayla Woodard** of Arley, Ala.

SISTER ACT

The 2006 Mississippi State volleyball roster includes one sister act. Opposite hitter **Jamie Joyner** is one of five seniors on the '07 squad. She is joined on the State squad by her younger sister **Stefanie**, a 2005-06 MSU signee who sat out the 2006 season as a redshirt. The Joyners hail from St. Louis, Mo., and prepped at Mehlville High School.

WHAT'S NEW FOR 2007?

The MSU volleyball program welcomed a new coaching staff member during the summer.

The newcomer is assistant coach **Don Perkins**, a native of East Greenbush, N.Y., who served as head volleyball coach at The State University of New York Institute of Technology (SUNYIT), an NCAA Division III program in Utica, New York.

Two Bulldog players will be wearing different jersey numbers in 2007. Defensive specialist **Jennifer Hauskey** has traded her No. 9 for a No. 12 jersey while setter **Dorey Gray** will wear No. 18 after wearing No. 8 in 2006.

NEW TRAVEL PARTNERS IN SEC

The SEC has rotated some of the team pairings for travel purposes for the 2007 season.

Arkansas will be without a travel partner in 2007, resulting in a few changes in the pairings of teams for weekend travel purposes. **Mississippi State** will now be partnered with the **University of Alabama** after sharing weekend

foes with instate SEC rival Mississippi, now paired with Louisiana State. In the SEC East, Auburn is partnered with Georgia and Florida is paired with South Carolina. Kentucky and Tennessee are the only teams not impacted by the change.

Here's a position-by-position summary at the 2007 Volleyball Bulldogs:

Setter --- **Eva Kriegel** starred in her first season as MSU's full-time setter in 2006, piling up 1,120 assists, ninth-most in a season in MSU volleyball history. But the Jaszbereny, Hungary, product, one of five seniors on the 2007 squad, has proven to be quite the versatile player for MSU --- leading MSU and ranking second in the SEC with 57 aces (eight-most in season at State), finishing second on the club with 49 total blocks and adding offensive punch with 194 kills. MSU's 2006 MVP matched her own school record and led the SEC with four "triple-doubles". Set to serve as Kriegel's primary backup is sophomore **Dorey Gray** (Indian Harbour Beach, Fla.) and freshman walk-on **Kaitlin Wheatley** (Lexington, Ky.).

Outside Hitter --- Junior **Cristina Jucan** from Cluj, Romania, and sophomore **Ioana Demian** from Baia Mare, Romania, are the top two candidates to replace MSU's departed starting outside hitters from 2006, senior **Orshi Kriegel** and Freshman All-SEC selection **Martina Gregusova**. The two showed flashes of brilliance in 2006 when they combined for 28 starts, with Jucan ranking second on the team with 266 kills.

Freshman signee **Ashley Newsome** (Florence, Ala.) has worked with the outside hitters and middles during preseason drills and should challenge for playing time this year. Redshirt freshman **Stefanie Joyner** (St. Louis, Mo.), younger sister of Bulldog senior, is looking for her first career playing time at the position this fall. So, too, is freshman walk-on **Miranda Bauman** (Killen, Ala.).

Opposite Hitter --- Left-handed hitting **Jamie Joyner** of St. Louis, Mo., returns for her senior campaign and her fourth season as a starter. She tallied a career-best 243 kills, hit .218 and ranked third on the team with 48 total blocks in State's 17-win season last fall. A 6-4 freshman signee, **Meaghan Schlueter** (Lampasas, Texas), will serve as Joyner's primary backup.

Middle Blocker --- Senior **Erin Seago** of Rockford, Ill., the team leader with 14 solos and 74 total blocks last year, leads MSU's middle blocking corps. A starter in 29 of 30 matches as a junior, Seago led State and ranked fifth in the SEC with a .363 hitting percentage. Another senior, **Lauren Kowal** of Chesterfield, Mo., returns to action as a middle after recovering from a knee injury that ended a promising junior campaign midway through the season. Kowal, who began her career at Xavier University, hit at a .354 clip and, despite playing in just 17 matches, ranked second with nine solo blocks and fourth on the team with 39 total blocks. Rookie **Ashley Newsome**, also listed as an outside hitter, could see action as a middle.

Libero --- Despite missing her first seven matches with a back ailment, **Megan Lukasek** of St. Louis, Mo., piled up 295 digs and paced MSU in the statistical category for the third straight year. She returns to the court for her fourth season as State's defensive leader. Sophomore defensive specialist **Jennifer Hauskey** (Springdale, Ark.), who replaced Lukasek during her injury last fall, and freshman walk-on **Kayla Woodard** (Arley, Ala.) add a measure of depth to the MSU defense.

Tina (Burcham) Seals, who during her collegiate career became one of Mississippi State University's first standout volleyball performers, is in her fourth season as head coach of the Volleyball Bulldogs.

Seals joined the Mississippi State University Athletic Department family in March 2004, becoming the ninth head coach in the history of the 33-year old program.

Over the course of three seasons, the Florence, Ala., native has engineered an impressive resurgence in the Mississippi State volleyball program, guiding State to back-to-back winning campaigns the last two seasons while climbing the ladder as one of MSU volleyball's most successful coaches.

Seals' State teams have compiled a 46-41, tying or setting school records for conference wins each season and establishing the school mark for homecourt wins.

In 2004, her first season at the MSU helm, Seals guided the Bulldogs to a 14-16 worksheet, an 11-win gain over the 2003 edition and one of the program's biggest season-to-season turnarounds. That '03 team, projected for a last place SEC finish, tied a school record with five league wins and finished tied for eighth in the overall SEC standings, just missing a berth in the eight-team field of the SEC tournament. That MSU team, climbed 111 spots to a No. 156 final national ranking by RichKern.com.

Seals' 2005 edition climbed further up the ladder, posting a 15-12 worksheet, the program's seventh winning campaign in 31 seasons and only its second in 13 seasons. Along the way the Bulldogs established a school record with six SEC wins and earned the school's first berth in the SEC Tournament since qualification standards were put in place following the 1998 season.

During the '05 season RichKern.com ranked the Bulldogs as high as No. 66 -- the highest in-season national ranking ever for a Mississippi State volleyball. After spending much of the year ranked in the top 100, State finished the year at No. 111, also a school-best. The '06 Bulldogs begin the year with a Pablo system ranking of No. 77.

State's success story continued in 2006 when the Bulldogs raced to a 10-1 start en route to a 17-13 finish, most wins in program history since 1996. State again set the school standard for conference win, registering eight victories in rugged league competition. MSU swept a pair of SEC series (vs. Mississippi and South Carolina) for just the second time in school history and closed out the season with a program-first win over SEC West power and 2006 NCAA Tournament entrant Arkansas. That season-ending win at home was MSU's school-record 10th.

Prior to coming to MSU Seals enjoyed a highly-successful 12-year run as volleyball coach at Northwest-Shoals Community College in Muscle Shoals, Ala.

A native of Florence, Ala., she launched her coaching career at Northwest-Shoals C.C. in 1992, the inaugural year for the sport at NW-SCC. She quickly built the program into a perennial power in the Alabama junior college ranks, compiling a remarkable 444-137 record (.764) in 12 seasons.

Seals' first team posted a 28-12 record and finished runner-up in Alabama. Her teams won 30 or more matches over the next 11 seasons. In 12 seasons the Patriots claimed seven state junior college titles and took runner-up honors four times. Her last five teams concluded play with top 20 rankings, including the 2000 edition that posted a 47-9 record and a school-highest No. 2 national ranking.

Seals guided the Patriots to the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Division I or Division II national volleyball tournament seven times during her term there. And she directed NW-SCC to top 10 national rankings in three of her last five seasons at Northwest-Shoals.

Eight players coached by Seals at NWCSS were accorded All-America team honors, including Anisha Hill, a two-time first-team All-American selection in 2002 and 2003. Ten of her players also earned Academic All-America team honors.

Seals' accomplishments did not go unnoticed, as she was honored as the Tachikara/AVCA Regional Coach of the Year in 1999, 2000 and 2002 and seven times received the Alabama Junior College Coach of the Year award. During her term at NW-SCC Seals tutored nearly 50 players that advanced their volleyball careers with athletic scholarships at four-year colleges and universities.

Seals signed a volleyball scholarship with Mississippi State University in 1981 following a stellar prep career at Bradshaw High School, where she was a three-sport athlete. She earned all-state honors in volleyball and also competed in basketball and on the BHS track team.

She was recruited to Mississippi State by coach Gina Jacobellis and played her first two seasons at MSU for coach Lynn Keiser (1981 and 1982). Seals concluded her playing career competing her final

two seasons for coach Vivian Langley, becoming one of MSU's initial four-year letterwinners in volleyball. She served as team captain in 1982, 1983 and 1984.

Following her sophomore season she was selected to play for the touring Athletes in Action volleyball team that competed in China and Japan in the summer of 1983. The successful AIA Asian tour helped advance her career and set the stage for a career-best senior season at Mississippi State in 1984, a season in which she paced the Bulldogs with 387 kills and a .316 hitting percentage, still the fourth-best single season hitting mark in 29 seasons of Mississippi State volleyball. For her exploits Seals was accorded first-team All-Southeastern Conference honors as a senior, becoming the first Mississippi State player to earn such distinction.

The MSU standout was also a member of the MSU softball team during her college career, earning a varsity letter as an outfielder in 1983.

Seals got her first taste of coaching as an undergraduate assistant on Langley's MSU volleyball staff in 1985 team before earning a bachelor's degree in civil engineering in 1987.

Following graduation she worked four years as an engineer with the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA). Her involvement with volleyball continued during that span when she formed and directed a club volleyball program in Muscle Shoals. She later earned her master's degree in math education at the University of North Alabama in 1994.

During her MSU career she met and married Tony Seals, a native of Winfield, Ala., and a 1986 graduate of Mississippi State University. They are the parents of a daughter, Tracey Marie, a sophomore at Starkville High School.

Cothran, 36, with more than 15 years experience in coaching and athletic administration, is in his second coaching association with MSU head coach Tina Seals.

At Mississippi State Cothran oversees individual skill development and serves as MSU's national recruiting coordinator. On the court Cothran serves as the coordinator of MSU's offense, working with outside hitters. Prior to joining Tina Seals' coaching staff at Northwest-Shoals, Cothran launched his coaching career at his high school alma mater in Centre, Ala., **Cherokee County High School**. There he served as assistant volleyball coach from 1997 to 1999, helping CCHS to three straight Elite Eight and state top five finishes, and as an assistant basketball coach in 1999 and 2000.

He served as president of the **Shorter College** club volleyball team in Rome, Ga., (1990 to 1993) and coached teams in both Jacksonville, Ala. (1998) and Muscle Shoals, Ala. (2003). He worked in a variety of capacities with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Rome, Ga. (1991 to 1996, 1998) and in Gainesville, Ga. (1996-97). In recognition of his work with the Boys and Girls Clubs, he was selected as an Olympic Torchbearer prior to the 1996 Olympic games in Atlanta. He served as the executive director of the summer youth program in Centre, Ala., in 1999.

Cothran earned a bachelor of science degree in general studies at Shorter College in 2001. Since leaving Northwest-Shoals, Cothran worked as an individual trainer for volleyball players in the Muscle Shoals area, developed and conducted team and individual volleyball camps and launched two new club volleyball teams in Northern Alabama.

He is married to the former **Melissa Lehman** of Wadesville, Ind., and they are the parents of a daughter, **Elena "Ellie" Camille**, born April 1, 2006.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

Mississippi State University is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference, which in 2007-08 is celebrating its 75th anniversary as a pioneer in the integration of higher education and athletic competition and a national leader in intercollegiate athletics.

The SEC, with an impressive legacy of more than seven decades of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of any intercollegiate athletic league in the nation since the conference's inception in 1933.

Centrally headquartered in Birmingham, Ala., the Southeastern Conference is comprised of 12 universities that span a nine-state area, conducting championships in 11 women's and nine men's sports. The member schools are split into two divisions. **Mississippi State University** is joined in the SEC Western Division by instate rival Mississippi, Louisiana State, Alabama, Auburn and Arkansas. The SEC's Eastern Division features Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, South Carolina, Tennessee and Vanderbilt. All but Arkansas and South Carolina were among 13 charter members of the SEC, with those schools joining the league for competition in 1991-92.

Since the Southeastern Conference conducted its first volleyball championship tournament in 1979, the sport has enjoyed steady growth in both popularity and strength. During the decade of the 1990s SEC volleyball blossomed into a formidable force on the national scene. Over the past two seasons the league has set conference marks for postseason tournament entrants --- six SEC teams advanced to NCAA postseason play in 2005 and seven reached the field of 64 in 2006.

The conference has sent at least two teams to the NCAA Tournament in every season the last 17 years, with an SEC team reaching NCAA volleyball's Final Four nine times in the last 16 seasons and coming within a win of Final Four placement four times over that span.

In 2006, perennial power Florida captured its 16th overall league title and made its 17th appearance in the NCAA Volleyball Tournament.

The Gators had plenty of Southeastern Conference company in the 64-team of the NCAA Tournament. SEC Eastern Division entries Kentucky and Tennessee also advanced while four teams from the SEC's Western Division -- Alabama, Arkansas, Louisiana State and Mississippi reached the single-elimination tourney..

Since the inaugural SEC volleyball championship in 1979-80,

many changes have occurred in the conference with volleyball. The addition of Arkansas and South Carolina to the league in 1991 brought the divisional format to the sport with five teams competing in the Eastern Division and six teams in the Western Division. The most significant change in recent years came in 1999 with the league adopting an eight-team format for its three-day conference tournament. In 2002 the SEC began a 16-match league scheduling format. The league scheduling evolves further this fall when the SEC expands its conference schedule to 20 matches and discontinues the season-ending league tournament.

Volleyball has enjoyed a steady increase in popularity and interest in the Southeastern Conference, mirroring the sport's growth nationwide. Exposure for SEC volleyball got a major boost in 1995 when Southeastern Conference volleyball made its debut on SEC-TV (FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and Sun Network) on a tape-delay basis.

That coverage has grown in recent years to include live telecasts of regular season matches along with the broadcast of the SEC Tournament championship match. The conference's television package is now called the **Regional Sports Network (RSN)**, with the telecasts beamed to more than 22 million cable subscribers in the SEC's nine-state region.

SEC coaches and administrators voted to discontinue the league's postseason tournament for 2006, ending a 27-year for the event. The regular season league champion now earns the Southeastern Conference's automatic qualifying berth for the NCAA Tournament.

More about SEC Volleyball...

- Ten of 11 SEC teams posted double-digit win totals in 2006, with Florida leading the way with a 30-2 mark. SEC West champ LSU notched 26 wins.

- Two players from the SEC (**Florida's Angie McGinnis** and **Amber McCray**) earned **AVCA All-America Team** honors in 2006 while six more were accorded honorable mention AA honors and eight earned AVCA All-South Region plaudits.

- SEC volleyball teams placed two players on the **2006 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Volleyball Team** (Tennessee's

Kelsey Fautsch and Auburn's **Rachel Shanks**).

- In the past 16 years, 908 student-athletes have earned selection to the SEC Volleyball Academic Honor Roll.

2007 SEC VOLLEYBALL ON SEC-TV

Five regular season matchups involving eight of the SEC's 11 competing volleyball teams are included in this fall's SEC volleyball television lineup on the SEC's Regional Sports Network.

Mississippi State makes its seventh appearance in 10 seasons when the Bulldogs entertain SEC Eastern Division foe Kentucky October 21 in a 1 p.m. (CT) contest at the Newell-Grissom Building.

RSN telecasts are broadcast on FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and the Florida-based Sun Network, reaching more than 22 million households throughout the region.

2006 SEASON IN REVIEW

With a blend of veterans and newcomers and a strong flavoring of international talent, Mississippi State continued its upward climb on the volleyball court in 2006. State fashioned a 17-13 record, the program's most wins since 1996, and made its strongest bid to date at earning a school-first berth in the NCAA tournament.

The 17-win season, coming on the heels of State's 15-12 showing in 2005, gave Mississippi State back-to-back winning campaigns in volleyball for the first time since 1989-1990 and just the second time in the 32-year history of the Mississippi State volleyball program.

Senior outside hitter **Orshi Kriegel**, the lone senior and one of four returning starters on the 2006 edition, easily emerged as Mississippi State's "go-to" player on the court. Kriegel, also the first European to play volleyball at MSU, paced State with 354 kills, averaging 11.8 kills and 9.4 digs. Kriegel hit double-digits in kills in 22 of 30 matches, three times eclipsing the 20-kill mark. And with 281 digs, second-most on the team, she finished the year with a team-best 12 double-doubles.

Two other Bulldogs, junior opposite hitter **Jamie Joyner** and junior setter **Eva Kriegel**, Orshi's younger sister, were major contributors who also drew starts in all 30 matches.

Joyner finished fourth on the club with 243 kills and with 48 total blocks ranked third in that defensive category.

Kriegel, MSU's primary setter, tallied 1,120 assists (ninth-most in a season at State). But she also proved to be a force in so many other ways. She paced State and ranked second in the SEC with 57 service aces (eighth-most in a season at MSU), ranked third on the team with 225 digs, second on the club with 49 total blocks and a surprising fifth in kills with 194. Kriegel's versatility enabled her to record four "triple-doubles", the most in the SEC in 2006. For her exploits she was honored as the team's most valuable player.

The Bulldogs got solid play at the net in 2006 from junior middle blocker **Erin Seago**. Seago, who played in all 103 games and started 29 of 30 matches, paced MSU with 74 total blocks, including a team-high 14 solo stops. She delivered 156 kills while hitting at a crisp team-best .363 clip, fifth-best in the Southeastern Conference.

Junior libero **Megan Lukasek**, after missing the first seven matches of the campaign due to injury, returned to the MSU lineup during the MSU/Microtel Classic. Despite the slow start, Lukasek led MSU with 295 digs, ranking eighth in the SEC with a 3.69 per-game digs total.

The Bulldogs opened the campaign in impressive fashion, rolling to wins in nine of their first 10 matches in non-conference play. State claimed tournament titles at the **Capital One Classic** in Lafayette, La., and the **MSU/Microtel Classic** in Starkville and took runner-up honors in the **Regency Suites Midtown Invitational** in Atlanta, Ga.

Mississippi State successfully opened the SEC's new 20-match scheduling format Sept. 13 with a straight-sets home

court win over instate league rival Mississippi. It would be the first of a school-record eight league wins for MSU, bettering State's six-win showing against league competition in 2005. Half of those wins came against teams that advanced to NCAA post-season play.

There were some notable league wins along the way. State bested SEC East rival South Carolina in a regionally-televised match in Columbia, S.C., Oct. 15 and completed the series sweep with a straight-sets win over USC in Starkville Nov. 3, marking MSU's first series sweep of the Gamecocks since 1991. A 3-1 win Oct. 18 over instate Mississippi in Oxford, Miss., gave State its third straight series sweep of the Lady Rebels and extending MSU's win streak over UM to six matches, the longest such win streak for State against a conference opponent.

State also reached previously uncharted territory in its 2006 season finale against Arkansas Nov. 19. Arkansas had claimed all 26 previous meetings before State registered a breakthrough straight-sets win over the Lady Razorbacks, one of seven SEC teams to advance to the NCAA Tournament. The win was the 10th of the season at the Newell-Grisson Building for MSU, a school-record for Mississippi State wins in 10 seasons at its current home arena and for all-time wins at home wins.

Here are some other noteworthy achievements of the

TEAM MVP --- Junior setter **Eva Kriegel**, who for the second season registered an SEC-leading four "triple-doubles", was selected team MVP for 2006. The Jaszbereny, Hungary, native led Mississippi State with 57 service aces and 1,120 assists. She also registered 194 kills, 225 digs and 49 total blocks.

ACADEMIC HONORS --- Eleven members of the 2006 MSU volleyball team were accorded academic all-conference honors. **Jamie Joyner**, **Cristina Jucan**, **Lauren Kowal**, **Orshi Kriegel**, **Megan Lukasek** and **Erin Seago** were named to the **SEC Volleyball Academic Honor Roll** while **Ioana Demian**, **Dorey Gray**, **Jennifer Hausley**, **Stefanie Joiner** and **Emily Tooker** earned placed on the **SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll** for 2006. Stefanie

Joiner also was honored as the recipient of MSU's **Newsom Award** as volleyball's top scholar-athlete. Her older sister, current MSU senior **Jamie Joyner**, won the award in 2005.

FRESHMAN AWARD --- Rookie outside hitter **Martina Gregusova** became the first MSU player honored named to the **SEC All-Freshman Team**. The Nitra, Slovakia, native, a three-time **SEC Freshman of the Week** selection, finished third on the team with 245 kills.

CLIMBING MSU'S COACHING WIN CHARTS --- With 17 wins in 2006, MSU head volleyball coach climbed from seventh to a tie for third on the MSU career wins chart. Seals now sports a 46-41 career record at State. With a school-record eight SEC wins last fall, Seals now stands second on State's career SEC wins list with 19.

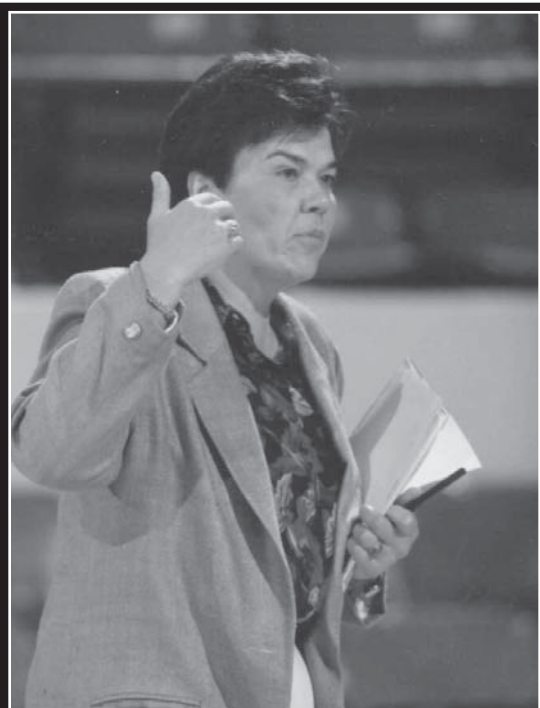

MSU'S SAMYE JOHNSON IN THE MISSISSIPPI SPORTS HALL OF FAME

Mississippi State University volleyball has representation in the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame.

Samye Johnson, who served as Mississippi State University head volleyball coach for three seasons (1994-96) and as MSU's senior women's athletics administrator until her retirement in July 2006, joined the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame in 2002. She was among eight Mississippi sports standouts in the 40th Anniversary MSHoF Class inducted during ceremonies April 12, 2002 in Jackson, Miss.

Johnson, a 1971 graduate of Mississippi University for Women where she was a four-sport athlete, served as head volleyball coach at MUW for 15 years prior to joining the MSU staff as volleyball coach and assistant AD for women's sports in 1994.

She retired from coaching in 1997, concluding her stellar 20-year coaching career with 506 wins. Johnson served as MSU's senior administrator for women's sports until her retirement in July 2006.

Born in Jackson, Miss., and reared in Mendenhall, Miss., Johnson launched her coaching career at Festus (Mo.) High School and later served as volleyball and tennis coach at East Texas State University.

Johnson was the lone Mississippi State representative among the eight inductees in 2002 and is the only collegiate volleyball coach enshrined in the tradition-bound 44-year old Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame.

MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY

Mississippi State is a comprehensive land-grant institution and the largest university in Mississippi, with a statewide enrollment of more than 16,000 students.

Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research, and service.

Academics and Student Life

Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as a Truman Honor Institution. In the past year, a student team competed for and won first place in a national Challenge X competition to redesign a fuel-efficient and environmentally-friendly SUV.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options. The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day One Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and juniors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study-abroad opportunities

Research

Mississippi State faculty researchers attracted \$186.5 million in external funding for 2006-07, up from about \$155 million during the previous year. This funding supported 1,691 sponsored projects in 2007.

Based on the latest rankings available from the National Science Foundation, MSU ranks seventh in the nation in agricultural sciences research expenditures and 44th nationally in engineering. Last year MSU faculty and staff disclosed 80 new technologies resulting in three new start-up companies,



nine licenses, and 22 patent applications. The university now holds 77 patents.

In recent years, MSU has established the Thad Cochran Endowment for Entrepreneurship, as well as collaborating with federal agencies and industries to help increase technology-oriented start-up companies. Among the collaborators and sponsors are the U.S. departments of Defense and Energy, NASA, General Electric, Northrop Grumman, EADS/American Eurocopter, Boeing, Raytheon, General Dynamics, Israeli Aerospace Industry, and the Mississippi Technology Alliance.

In a key area of economic interest to Mississippi, MSU's Center for Advanced Vehicular Systems, established in 2001, continues research and development supporting a goal of attracting automotive industries to the state. The center is conducting research in areas that include materials processing, human and systems engineering, alternative power systems, computational manufacturing and design, and advanced learning technologies.

Outreach and Service

From its academic programs to the work of countless individuals, Mississippi State has "extended farther" and gone "beyond the limit" to make a difference in the lives of citizens around the state. In 2006, the university formed the Mississippi State Community Action Team to organize university

resources and expertise for quick response to local issues around the state. MSU's Extension Service is the first in the nation to have an interactive videoconferencing system in every county Extension office. Through the Freedom Calls program, the system is being used to connect Mississippians with family members in the U.S. military serving our country in Iraq.

The MSU Extension Service maintains offices in almost every county of the state, and the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station operates 10 branch stations throughout Mississippi. Four strategically located research and extension centers coordinate the delivery of services statewide.

Dr. Robert H. "Doc" Foglesong

President

Robert H. "Doc" Foglesong is the 18th president of Mississippi State University, a land-grant university committed to excellence in learning, research and service. His vision is for MSU to become the most respected land-grant school in the Southeast. As president, he is responsible for planning, budgeting and execution for the largest university in the state of Mississippi.

He is also the president and executive director of the **Appalachian Leadership and Education Foundation**, a non-profit body operating to identify the next generation of leaders in Appalachia and mentor/financially support their journey towards academic, leadership and character excellence. He's a director of Massey Energy, one of the largest producers of coal the nation, and a director of the Michel Baker Corp., an international energy and engineering firm. He also has been designated by President George W. Bush to co-chair the **United States-Russia Joint Commission on POW/MIAs**.

Previously, he was nominated by the President, confirmed by the U.S. Senate, and served as a **four-star general in the United States Air Force**. He had responsibility for policy recommendations and implementation of policy relative to personnel, operations, infrastructure and intra/inter governmental affairs for an organizations of 358,000 uniformed members and 158,000 civilian employees. He was responsible for planning/programming for future strategies involving an annual budge of \$90 billion (equivalent to the position of chief operating officer for a company ranked No. 9 on the Fortune 500 list). His jobs required almost daily interface with members of Congress, the White House and many governmental agencies.

Foglesong spent a significant amount of the past decade as a national security advisor at Cabinet and Presidential levels. In this capacity, he had opportunities to travel extensively with the most senior members of the government and directly engage with the most senior civilian and military levels of foreign governments around the globe.

Foglesong has spent 33 years in public service with a clear understanding of the role leadership plays in establishing a sense of integrity/ethics, encouraging service above self and fostering an attitude of excellence. He has received numerous awards for his demonstrated leadership. In addition, he has continued his education by attending professional military education schools as well as advanced civilian forums. He is a member of several professional aviation organizations and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations.

He has authored more than 60 publications which cover a range of subjects, including technical and leadership topics. A graduate of West Virginia University (bachelor's, master's and doctorate), he was a member and president of Tau Beta Pi, the national engineering honorary, as well as numerous other academic honoraries.

He has accumulated 30 military awards for leadership and technical skills. He holds an honorary Doctorate of Strategic Intelligence.

A native of Mingo County, W.V., the MSU president is married to the former **Mary Thrasher** of Sistersville, W.V. They have two sons --- David, married to Laura, and father of two sons (Robert and David), and Mark. David is in the United States Air Force, as is Laura. Mark is in the television business. Foglesong's hobbies include running marathons and collecting slide rules and blow torches.



Larry Templeton

Director of Athletics

Director of Athletics **Larry Templeton** this fall begins his 21st season as the head of the intercollegiate athletics program at Mississippi State University. Under his guidance MSU's 16 varsity sports teams compete for championships in the highly-competitive Southeastern Conference while establishing new standards for achievement in the classroom.

With nearly 20 seasons under his belt, Templeton ranks as the third-longest tenured AD in MSU history and rates as the dean of ADs in the SEC. Under his direction the Mississippi State University Athletics Department has seen a rapid and dramatic progression in the improvement of its sports facilities, all the while adhering to fiscally sound budgeting principles that have enabled MSU athletics to rank among an elite corps of programs nationally that have operated consistently in the black.

Virtually every sport at Mississippi State established best-ever finishes on the fields and courts of competition during the decade of the '90s, and that trail of success has continued on into the new millennium. During the past seven years MSU sports teams qualified for postseason competition 57 times, including a school-record 12 in 2004-05.

But State's student-athletes are not just successful in the realm of athletic competition. MSU's men's and women's athletes recorded the highest combined grade point average during the 2005-06 academic year, a record that covers 18 years in which such student-athlete grades have been tracked. In spring 2007, half of all scholarship student-athletes earned a grade point average of 3.00 or higher.

MSU has produced the SEC's Male and Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year three times each since 1990. In 1993 Bulldog volleyball standout **Aimee York** became the first MSU student-athlete to earn the SEC Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award. And over the past seven years, State ranks second among league schools in number of academic all-conference honorees in the sports in which MSU competes. And over the past nine years State ranks second among league schools in the number of academic all-conference selections in the sports in which MSU competes.

Templeton oversaw Mississippi State's move to come into compliance with the SEC's Gender Equity plan, adding women's soccer in 1995 and softball in 1997 to the school's varsity sports menu. Since then soccer has won the SEC Western Division title (2001) while softball has advanced to NCAA postseason play in five of the last seven seasons. MSU's other seven women's sports have also enjoyed success that has advanced each to postseason competition.

Templeton's work also stretches far from the Starkville campus. In 2007 he begins his 15th year as **chair of the SEC Athletics Directors**. Currently in his second term on the NCAA Baseball Committee, Templeton serves as that committee's chairman. He is a former member of the NCAA Championship Committee, the NCAA Management Council and the NCAA Bowl Certification Committee.

Templeton, 60 and a lifelong resident of Starkville, served in a variety of capacities within the Mississippi State University Athletic Department prior to his appointment as MSU's 14th director of athletics in October 1987. He is married to the former **Linda Jo Nichols**. They have a son, Brian, who received his second degree (landscape architecture) at Mississippi State. A second son, Stephen, received his doctorate from MSU in August 2002, and a daughter, Nici, is an attorney in Columbia, S.C. Granddaughters Ella Grace Comer and Addison McSwain Comer, and Eliana Xiaojiong Nichols, live in Columbia, S.C., and Chattanooga, Tenn., respectively.



MISSISSIPPI State

MSU has the largest enrollment in the state of Mississippi. Founded as a land-grant institution, its grass, flowers and trees are as prevalent as buildings, sidewalks and parking lots. Large enough to sport diversity in all areas, the university still maintains a warm, friendly atmosphere.

Ruby Hall, a residence hall with the largest single room size in university history, opened this past August. A co-residential, 160,000-square foot, three-story freshman hall, Ruby is located at the north end of campus, in convenient proximity to the Colvard Union, the Perry Cafeteria, Mitchell Memorial Library, the Sanderson Center and all athletic facilities. Ruby Hall offers students the latest in technology, including Ethernet access, full wireless internet coverage, a refrigerator and microwave, and free cable with HBO in each room. MSU freshman football players are housed in Ruby Hall.



The Colvard Union is a popular meeting place for MSU students. Whether working on a group project, enjoying the food court, or simply relaxing, the student union is one of the campus' main meeting places.

The Chapel of Memories and Carillon Tower were built with bricks from Old Main Dormitory, the largest residence hall in the country when constructed, later destroyed by fire in 1959. The Chapel of Memories, which hosts numerous weddings each year, is one of the most-recognized landmarks on campus.

The Drill Field, located squarely in the center of campus, shows the expanse of greenery for which the campus is famous.



The People's University

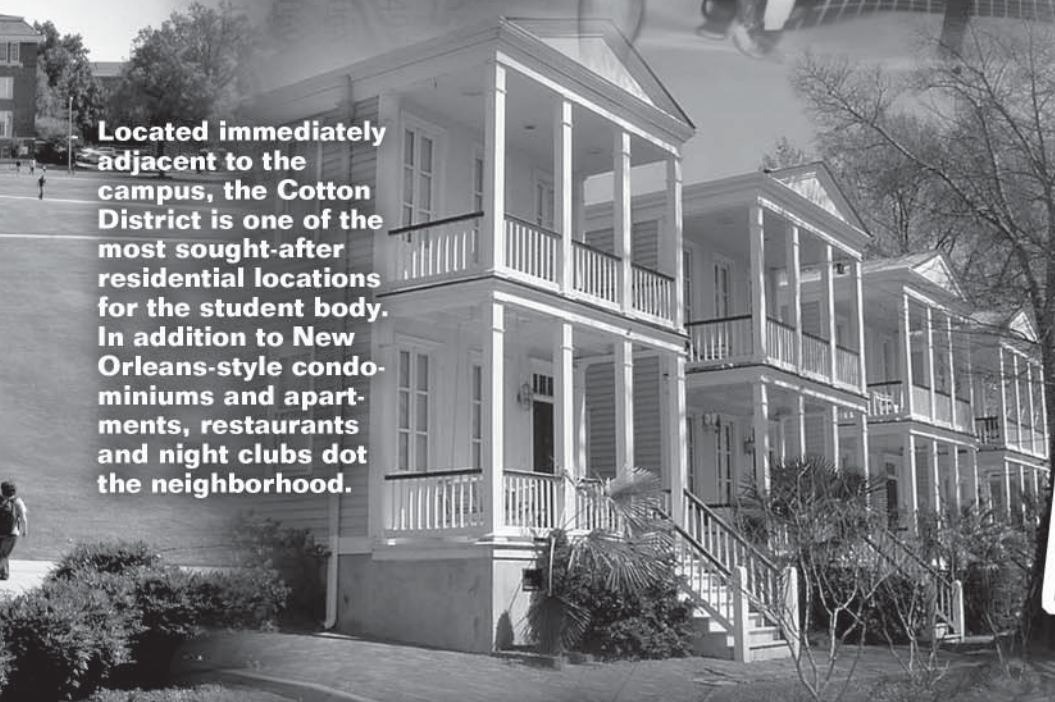


When built in the 1920s, Perry Cafeteria was the largest dining hall in the country. The 300-foot long, Gothic style interior is one of the most beautiful buildings on the campus. It has accommodations for 600 students, faculty and staff and serves as the dining hall for MSU athletes.

The \$19 million, 150,000-square foot Sanderson Center recreation complex opened to students in 1996. The state-of-the-art facility offers recreational opportunities in aquatics, fitness and aerobics, strength and conditioning, and intramural sports.



Located immediately adjacent to the campus, the Cotton District is one of the most sought-after residential locations for the student body. In addition to New Orleans-style condominiums and apartments, restaurants and night clubs dot the neighborhood.



ATHLETIC Excellence

State's coaches care for their student-athletes and the school's sports programs. Each has a passion for their specialty, experience as a player and coach, and expertise to instruct at the highest levels. Their goal is to coach champions on the field and mold productive college graduates from the university's classroom.

SYLVESTER CROOM was named head coach at MSU in December 2003, an announcement that brought immediate national attention to the Bulldog football program. In just his first season, State beat a ranked opponent for the first time since 2000.

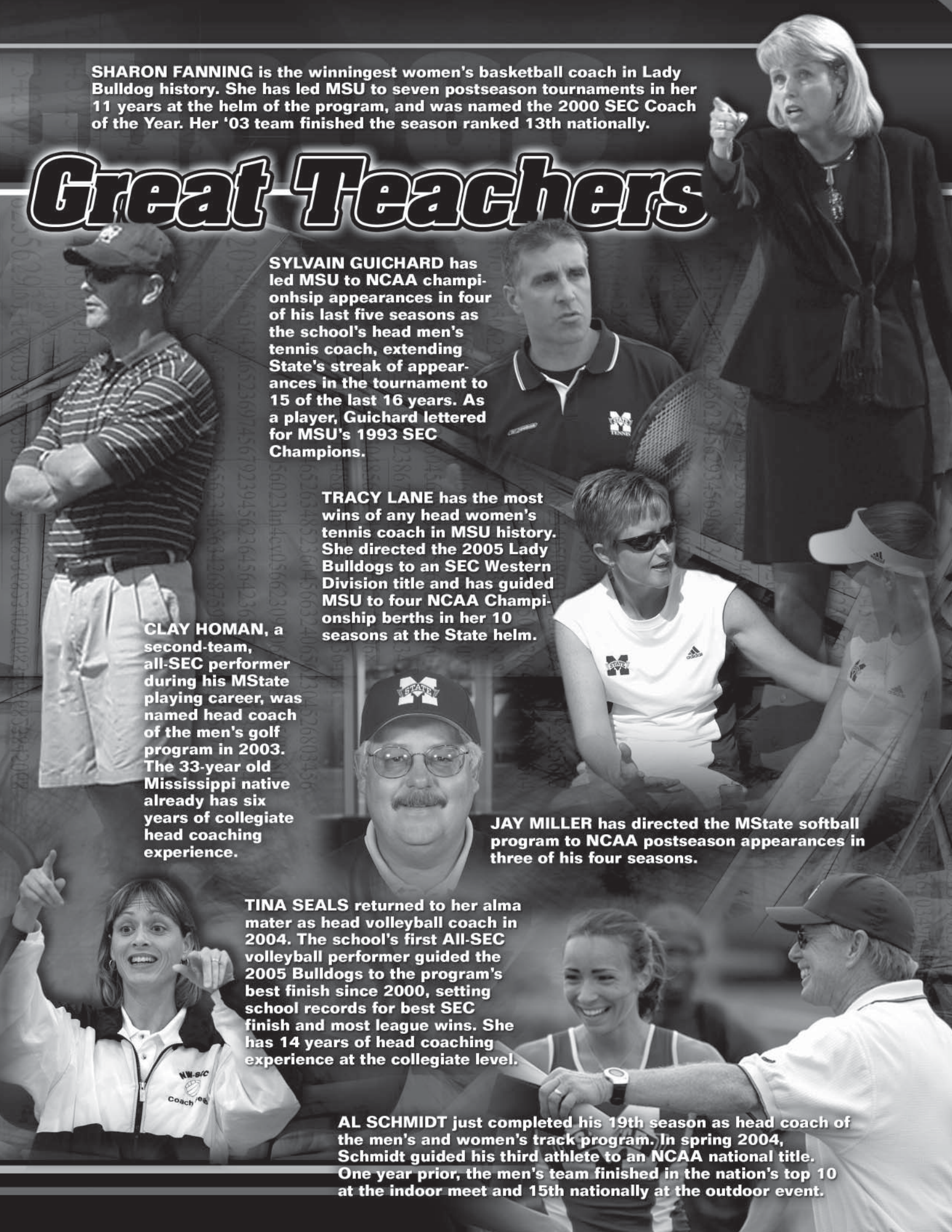


CHRISTI SANDERS (back left) has the longest, consecutive coaching reign of any head coach at State, with 19 seasons at the helm of the women's golf program. She has twice been named SEC Coach of the Year (1990, 2000).

RON POLK is the legendary head coach of the MSU baseball program. He is the winningest coach in SEC history and with more than 1,300 career coaching wins ranks sixth among college baseball's all-time winningest coaches. He has guided five MSU teams to the College World Series and 19 to regional competition.

RICK STANSBURY's men's basketball teams have averaged better than 20 wins per year under his guidance and have participated in postseason play six times in his eight years. MSU has played in four NCAA Tournaments in five seasons and won the SEC championship in 2004 and tournament title in '02.

NEIL MACDONALD is the only head coach to guide the MState soccer program to an SEC Tournament appearance in his first season (2004). The 34-year old already has six years head coaching experience on the college level.



SHARON FANNING is the winningest women's basketball coach in Lady Bulldog history. She has led MSU to seven postseason tournaments in her 11 years at the helm of the program, and was named the 2000 SEC Coach of the Year. Her '03 team finished the season ranked 13th nationally.

Great Teachers

SYLVAIN GUICHARD has led MSU to NCAA championship appearances in four of his last five seasons as the school's head men's tennis coach, extending State's streak of appearances in the tournament to 15 of the last 16 years. As a player, Guichard lettered for MSU's 1993 SEC Champions.

TRACY LANE has the most wins of any head women's tennis coach in MSU history. She directed the 2005 Lady Bulldogs to an SEC Western Division title and has guided MSU to four NCAA Championship berths in her 10 seasons at the State helm.

CLAY HOMAN, a second-team, all-SEC performer during his MState playing career, was named head coach of the men's golf program in 2003. The 33-year old Mississippi native already has six years of collegiate head coaching experience.

JAY MILLER has directed the MState softball program to NCAA postseason appearances in three of his four seasons.

TINA SEALS returned to her alma mater as head volleyball coach in 2004. The school's first All-SEC volleyball performer guided the 2005 Bulldogs to the program's best finish since 2000, setting school records for best SEC finish and most league wins. She has 14 years of head coaching experience at the collegiate level.

AL SCHMIDT just completed his 19th season as head coach of the men's and women's track program. In spring 2004, Schmidt guided his third athlete to an NCAA national title. One year prior, the men's team finished in the nation's top 10 at the indoor meet and 15th nationally at the outdoor event.

ATHLETIC Excellence

Mississippi State athletes play in some of the nation's finest facilities. Every Bulldog competition site has either been constructed or renovated during the last decade or so. During that time alone, more than \$60 million in facility enhancements have been made... a real building boom in Bulldog Country.



DAVIS WADE STADIUM AT SCOTT FIELD: Near-sellout crowds have become the norm at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field, where the Bulldogs have played before masses reaching 85 percent of stadium capacity. Since the 2000 season when expansion and renovation projects gave the nation's second-oldest stadium a gleaming new look, crowds have grown by nearly 30 percent.



PITTS TENNIS CENTRE: Considered among the finest tennis facilities in the collegiate ranks, the modern, six-court, 1,000-seat A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre recently completed its 23rd year serving the men's and women's programs. Recent enhancements at the facility include new locker areas and concession stands (1998) and a permanent press box (2004).

**W.O. SPENCER STADIUM/
CARL MADDOX TRACK:** Co-named in honor of a two-time Mississippi State Olympian and a former MSU athletic director, the W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track has served as host to the Southeastern Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships three times since 1985, joining Tennessee as the most frequent host for that event during that time.



DUDY NOBLE FIELD, POLK-DEMENT STADIUM: One of the nation's leaders in baseball season ticket sales and attendance, Dudy Noble Field, Polk-Dement Stadium still holds the nation's on-campus single-game attendance mark — 14,991. With a seating capacity of more than 7,000 and more space in the world-famous outfield, *Sports Illustrated* magazine named the park, the "Best Place To Watch College Baseball" in a 1997 issue.

NEWELL GRISSOM BUILDING:

The 12,000-square foot, hardwood-floored Newell-Grissom Building serves as the home for Mississippi State's volleyball program and serves as a practice facility for both of the school's basketball programs. A state-of-the-art heating and air conditioning system was installed in 2004.

Great Places



MSU GOLF COURSE:

Nominated by *Golfweek* and *Golf Digest* magazines as one of the premier public golf courses in the United States, Mississippi State's championship University Golf Course is the home to the men's and women's programs. The 18-hole course was recently furnished with a 5,000-square-foot clubhouse, complete with locker areas, snack bar, golf shop and classroom.



MSU SOCCER FIELD: Built in 1995, the lighted Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldog women one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast, a 114-yard long, 72-yard wide regulation NCAA Championship field. The lush turf is Mississippi Pride grass, developed by researchers on the MSU campus.



HUMPHREY COLISEUM: Season ticket sales records and all-time attendance marks have also been set over the past decade by Bulldog and Lady Bulldog basketball teams in the Humphrey Coliseum, the state's largest on-campus basketball arena. The latest addition to the facility was a \$1.8 million, center-hung, four-sided video scoreboard and jumbotron screen installed in 2004.



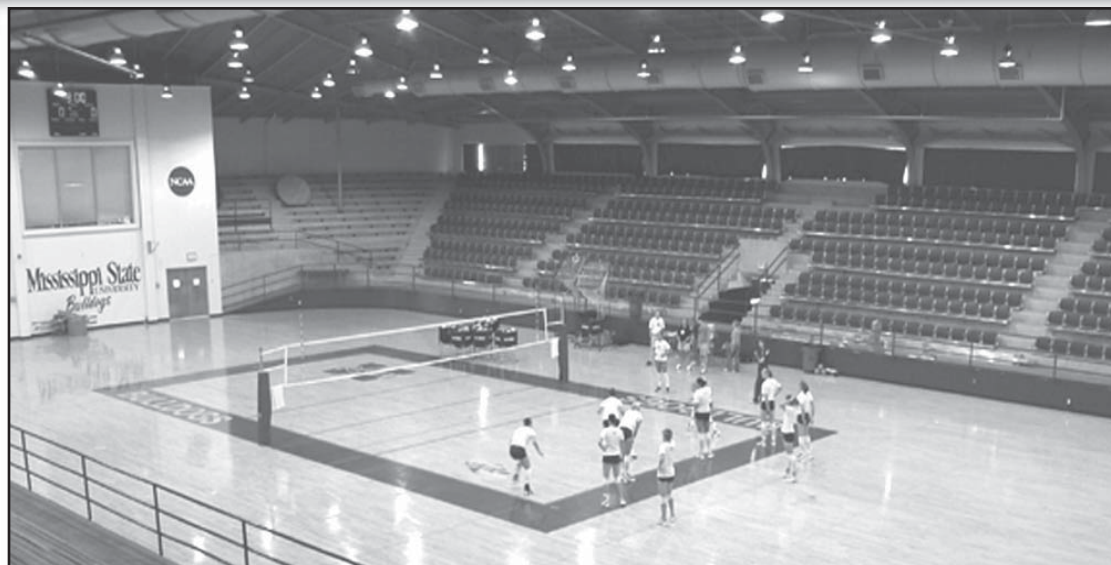
MSU SOFTBALL FIELD: Constructed in 1997, the Mississippi State Softball Field has undergone almost constant improvement at the northern-most point of campus. Lights were added to the facility in 1998, brick work was added to the dugouts two years later and, in 2001, additional batting cages were built. In 2005, softball moved into a new locker, training and meeting facility adjacent to the park.



BRYAN BUILDING: The state-of-the-art John H. Bryan Athletic Administration Building is the crown jewel of MSU's expansion projects of the last decade. Opened in 1996, this showcase facility is named for longtime Bulldog friend and supporter John H. Bryan Sr., and houses athletic administration, football, ticket, athletic development and media relations offices.



NEWELL-GRISSOM BUILDING



Mississippi State begins its second decade of competition this fall in its on-campus home, the Newell-Grissom Building. The spacious facility features 12,000 square feet of hardwood flooring and arena seating for more than 2,000. MSU's volleyball home has seen two major improvements in the facility over the past three years. An air conditioning system was added following the 2004 season and nearly 600 maroon chairback seats were installed in the east stands prior to the start of the 2006 campaign.

The facility has served as the home court for Mississippi State volleyball since Oct. 3, 1997 when State met Georgia in the first match at the Newell-Grissom Building. Another first for the facility unfolded a year later when the 1998 season-ending MSU-Mississippi volleyball match was televised regionally by SEC-TV on FOX Sports Net South.

Located approximately two blocks southwest of Scott Field, the Newell-Grissom Building served as an auxiliary practice site for volleyball and both the men's and women's basketball teams at Mississippi State in 1996 while Humphrey Coliseum served as those teams' primary on-campus competition site.

Newell-Grissom is MSU's third on-campus volleyball home in 32 seasons. MSU's first volleyball teams competed in McCarthy Gymnasium prior to moving to Humphrey Coliseum.

The Newell-Grissom Building has a varied and colorful history that spans five decades and covers a broad spectrum of campus events.

Construction of the building began in January, 1951. The \$500,000 Animal Husbandry Service Building was completed in the spring of 1953, with dedicatory ceremonies held on April 28, 1953. The original structure included two classrooms, two offices, an area to house two graduate students, two exhibit areas, a multi-bunk dormitory

area for visiting teams, and a dirt floor to accommodate its primary mission as host for livestock-related events.

But the "cow barn", as it became affectionately known on campus, was used for much more than livestock shows, rodeos and equestrian competition. It developed into the campus and regional center for concerts and other entertainment events. The building's size and central location on campus also made it a natural for graduation ceremonies and class registration operations.

In 1978, the arena was formally named in honor of two long-time leaders in Mississippi State University's animal science department, Paul F. Newell (1910) and E.E. Grissom (1932). The structure went largely unused in the 1980s and early 1990s and gradually fell into disrepair. But in early 1995, the university, faced with an expensive "tear it down or fix it up" proposition, partnered with the MSU Athletic Department to share the costs of a million dollar renovation project.

In addition to the installation of a hardwood floor, the initial project included reroofing, the installation of a new lighting system, the construction and refurbishing of locker rooms and team meeting areas, and the addition of public rest room facilities.
