2008 OUTLOOK

BULLDOGS IN REBUILDING MODE IN 2008

The school colors are Maroon and White, but Mississippi State's Volleyball Bulldogs could easily mix in a couple of shades of green for 2008.

"With nine new players, all freshmen, on this year's team, we are most definitely in a rebuilding year," said fifth-year Bulldog head coach Tina Seals. "It's a great collection of young players, though, and they all bring solid backgrounds in high-caliber volleyball programs with them to Mississippi State. We were successful in recruiting quality players at all positions across the board, and we're looking forward to seeing them compete for starting and key backup positions on the team very early in their careers."

It's quite a contrast to the 2007 season, when Mississippi State returned five seasoned seniors and nine letter-winners, including four starters and the team's libero.

While the newcomers are expected to take on increasingly significant roles on the team as their experience levels grow, Seals is counting heavily on a handful of experienced returning veterans to form the corps of the 2008 Mississippi State team.

Outside hitter **Cristina Jucan** (Cluj, Romania), the lone senior and the most experienced of MSU's 2008 Bulldogs, is positioned to take on a leadership role on the team. Jucan, one of two Romanian standouts on the team, averaged a team-best 3.33 kills per set and finished second on the team in total kills with 293. She was on target to finish the team leader in kills before a back ailment sidelined her for the final six matches of the season. Jucan also finished third on the team with 243 digs, tops among MSU's '08 returnees.

The Bulldogs also return a solid offensive threat in junior outside hitter **Ioana Demian** (Baia Mare, Romania), the team's No. 3 leaders in kills and one of six Bulldogs to see playing time in all 29 matches. Demian, also from Romania, had a solid finish to her sophomore campaign last fall, averaging better than 10 kills per match over the second half of the 2007 season.

At the net the Bulldogs return sophomore middle blocker **Ashley Newsome** (Florence, Ala.), one of the rising stars among the SEC's 2007 rookies. Newsome, who drew starts in 10 of her 25 matches played as a freshman, tallied 107 kills and 35 total blocks in 2007 and enjoyed a productive stretch run to her first collegiate season.

Junior **Dorey Gray** (Indiana Harbour Beach, Fla.) enters the 2008 season as the leading candidate to replace departed two-year starting setter **Eva Kriegel**. Gray played in 18 matches and drew one start as a sophomore, a career-best 40-assist performance in MSU's 2007 season-opener. Gray and Kriegel teamed up in a pair of spring beach volleyball tournaments in Florida, earning top honors at a tournament in Siesta Key, Fla. Sophomore **Kaitlin Wheatley** (Lexington, Ky.) made her collegiate debut and gained invaluable playing experience with court time in seven matches as a rookie.

Sophomore defensive specialist **Kayla Woodard** (Addison, Ala.) drew 25 starts and played in all 29 matches as a rookie in 2007. She tallied 177 digs, fifth-most on the team and second-most among MSU's 2008 returnees. Woodard and Gray are also contenders for the job as the Bulldogs' libero in 2008.

The Bulldog newcomers will likely make their presence felt quickly throughout the lineup in 2008. Middle blockers **Mandy Mellencamp** (Prescott, Ariz.), **Caitlin Rance** (Kingwood, Texas) and **Aynne Swindell** (Germantown, Tenn.) are expected to join returning veteran **Ashley Newsome** in the mix for playing time at the net. Outside hitters **Leanna King** (Huntsville, Ala.) and **Kellye Jordan** (Jasper, Ala.) and right side hitters **Hilary Hunt** (Tampa, Fla.) and **Faith Steinwedell** (LaJolla, Calif.) are expected to challenge for playing time and provide depth on offense. Newcomers preparing to direct the Bulldog offense as setters are **Grace Hoyt** (Suwanee, Ga.) and **Kelsey Nichols** (Hoover, Ala.).

LARGEST FRESHMAN CLASS FOR MSU

Mississippi State's current freshman class can claim a school record even before first serve for the 2008 season.

With nine first-year student-athletes, the Bulldogs' rookie class rates as the largest in school history.

The newcomers provide excellent height, with seven of the players standing at least six feet tall. At 6-3, rookie opposite hitter **Hilary Hunt** of Tampa, Fla., is the tallest member of the 2008 MSU volleyball team.

Mississippi State recruited players at every position on the court, with the players hailing from seven states — Alabama, Arizona, California, Florida, Georgia, Tennessee and Texas. Middle hitter **Mandy Mellencamp** is the first Mississippi State volleyball signee from Arizona (Prescott, Ariz.).

SWEET HOME ALABAMA

A third of Mississippi State's 15-player roster for 2008 hails from neighboring Alabama, the single-biggest one-state contingent for MSU volleyball since 1999. The players hail from Addison (Kayla Woodard), Florence (Ashley Newsome), Hoover (Kelsey Nichols), Huntsville (Leanna King) and Jasper (Kellye Jordan).

ON THE TUBE AGAIN

Mississippi State makes its eighth appearance in a televised volleyball match in 2008 when the SEC's Regional Sports Network beams the broadcast of State's Oct. 19 matchup with Georgia. The Sunday match, set to be contested in the Newell-Grisson Building, has a special 1 p.m. start time.

LIKE MOTHER, LIKE DAUGHTER

MSU has its first legacy player in volleyball. **Kelsey Nichols**, a freshman setter/defensive specialist from Hoover, Ala., is the daughter of former Mississippi State volleyball standout **Vickie (Pickens) Nichols**. Mrs. Nichols lettered with the Volleyball Bulldogs from 1984 to 1987 and was a teammate of current MSU volleyball coach **Tina Seals**.

LINDSAY SHONDELL JOINS MSU STAFF

There's a new face on coach **Tina Seals'** Mississippi State volleyball coaching staff in 2008. Indiana native **Lindsay Shondell** joined the MSU coaching staff in January after serving for a season at Samford University in Birmingham, Ala. Shondell is a 2007 graduate of Purdue University, where she was a three-year standout for the Boilermakers volleyball team.

'08 SLATE FEATURES TWO HOME TOURNAMENTS

Mississippi State will for the first time in the modern era play host to two early-season volleyball tournaments in Starkville. State opens its 34th season of volleyball entertaining longtime regional rival **Troy** and first-time foes **Arkansas-Pine Bluff** and **Colorado** in the MSU Classic Aug. 29-30 at the Newell-Grisson Building. Two weeks later State plays host to Centenary, Memphis and another first-time foe, Central Arkansas, in the MSU Bulldog Club Invitational that will be played Sept. 12-13 in Humphrey Coliseum. It stands as State's first competition since 2002 in Humphrey Coliseum, the Volleyball Bulldogs' on-campus volleyball home prior to their 1997 move to the Newell-Grisson Building.

State plays 16 of its 31 matches at home, including 10 Southeastern Conference matches.

NCAA RULE CHANGES FOR '08

The NCAA Women's Volleyball Rules Committee and the Playing Rules Oversight Panel have enacted a number of rules changes that will go into effect for the 2008 season.

Beginning in 2008, the term for the units that comprise a volleyball match will be changed from "game" to "set", matching the terminology already in place for international volleyball. As with previous competition, a match will still consist of a best-of-five competition.

The biggest change for 2008 and one that will shorten the time of the match is a change in the number of points required to win a set. Beginning this fall teams will play to 25 points rather than 30, again matching the rules in place for international volleyball. The number of points required to win the deciding fifth set remains at 15.

In association with the change to 25-point sets, the NCAA has also reduced the maximum number of substitutions per set from 15 to 12.

Among points of emphasis for collegiate volleyball officials is a directive designed to make for more consistency in officials' ball handling judgments. The new approach to ball handling judgments is intended to increase intensity and focus for the players and coaches and result in fewer play-stopping whistles for minor ball handling infractions.

Tina (Burcham) Seals, who during her collegiate career became one of Mississippi State University's first standout volleyball performers, is in her fifth season as head coach of MSU's Volleyball Bulldogs.

Seals joined the Mississippi State University Athletic Department staff in March 2004, becoming the ninth head coach in the history of State's 34-year old volleyball program.

Over the course of four seasons, the Florence, Ala., native has engineered an impressive resurgence in the Mississippi State volleyball program, guiding State to back-to-back winning campaigns in 2005 and 2006 while climbing the ladder as one of MSU volleyball's most successful coaches.

Seals' State teams have compiled a 58-58 mark, tying or setting school records for conference wins in three of her four seasons while establishing the school mark for home court wins.

In 2004, her first season at the MSU helm, Seals guided the Bulldogs to a 14-16 worksheet, an 11-win gain over the 2003 edition and one of the program's biggest season-to-season turnarounds. That '03 team, projected for a last place SEC finish, tied a school record with five league wins and finished tied for eighth in the overall SEC standings, just missing a berth in the eight-team field of the SEC tournament. That MSU team, climbed 111 spots to a No. 156 final national ranking by RichKern.com.

Seals' 2005 edition climbed further up the ladder, posting a 15-12 worksheet, the program's seventh winning campaign in 31 seasons and only its second in 13 seasons. Along the way the Bulldogs established a school record with six SEC wins and earned the school's first berth in the SEC Tournament since qualification standards were put in place following the 1998 season.

During the 2005 season RichKern.com ranked the Bulldogs as high as No. 66 --- the highest in-season national ranking ever for a Mississippi State volleyball. After spending much of the year ranked in the top 100, State finished the year at No. 111, also a school-best. The '06 Bulldogs begin the year with a Pablo system ranking of No. 77.

State's success story continued in 2006 when the Bulldogs raced to a 10-1 started en route to a 17-13 finish, the most wins in program history since 1996. State again set the school standard for conference wins, registering eight victories in rugged league competition. MSU swept a pair of SEC series (vs. Mississippi and South Carolina) for just the second time in school history and closed out the season with a program-first win over SEC West power and 2006 NCAA Tournament entrant Arkansas. That season-ending win at home was MSU's school-record 10th.

Injuries impeded the Bulldogs' progress in 2007, but Mississippi State still managed to register season series sweeps of divisional foes Arkansas and Auburn and notch its first win over SEC East power Tennessee since 1996.

Seals has maintained an emphasis on academic excellence during her coaching tenure at MSU. The number of Bulldog players represented on the annual SEC Academic Honor Roll has climbed in each of Seals' first four seasons at State, including a school-record nine selections in 2007-08. Including five first-year players featured on the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll, 14 of State's 15 rostered players earned academic all-conference plaudits last year.

Prior to coming to MSU Seals enjoyed a highly-successful 12-year run as volleyball coach at Northwest-Shoals Community College in Muscle Shoals, Ala.

A native of Florence, Ala., she launched her coaching career at Northwest-Shoals C.C. in 1992, the inaugural year for the sport at NW-SCC. She quickly built the program into a perennial power in the

Alabama junior college ranks, compiling a remarkable 444-137 record (.764) in 12 seasons.

Seals' first team posted a 28-12 record and finished runner-up in Alabama. Her teams won 30 or more matches over the next 11 seasons. In 12 seasons the Patriots claimed seven state junior college titles and took runner-up honors four times. Her last five teams concluded play with top 20 rankings, including the 2000 edition that posted a 47-9 record and a school-highest No. 2 national ranking.

Seals guided the Patriots to the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Division I or Division II national volleyball tournament seven times during her term there. And she directed NW-SCC to top 10 national rankings in three of her last five seasons at Northwest-Shoals.

Eight players coached by Seals at NW-SCC were accorded All-America team accolades while 10 of her players also earned Academic All-America team honors.

Seals' accomplishments did not go unnoticed. She was honored as the Tachikara/AVCA Regional Coach of the Year in 1999, 2000 and 2002 and seven times was recognized as the Alabama Junior College Coach of the Year. During her term at NW-SCC Seals tutored nearly 50 players advanced their volleyball careers with athletic scholarships at four-year colleges and universities.

Seals signed a volleyball scholarship with Mississippi State University in 1981 following a stellar prep career at Bradshaw High School, where she was a three-sport athlete. She earned all-state honors in volleyball and also competed in basketball and on the BHS track team.

She was recruited to Mississippi State by coach Gina Jacobellis and played her first two seasons at MSU for coach Lynn Keiser (1981 and 1982). Seals concluded her playing career competing her final two seasons for coach Vivian Langley, becoming one of MSU's initial four-year letter winners in volleyball. She served as team captain in 1982, 1983 and 1984.

Following her sophomore season she was selected to play for the touring

Athletes in Action volleyball team that competed in China and Japan in the summer of 1983. The successful AIA Asian tour helped advance her career and set the stage for a career-best senior season at Mississippi State in 1984, a campaign in which she paced the Bulldogs with 387 kills and a .316 hitting percentage, still the fourth-best single season hitting mark in 33 seasons of State volleyball. For her exploits Seals was accorded first-team All-Southeastern Conference honors as a senior, becoming the first Mississippi State player to earn such distinction.

The MSU standout was also a member of the MSU softball team during her college career, earning a varsity letter as an outfielder in 1983.

Seals got her first taste of coaching as an undergraduate assistant on Langley's MSU volleyball staff in 1985 team before earning a bachelor's degree in civil engineering in 1987.

Following graduation she worked four years as an engineer with the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA). Her involvement with volleyball continued during that span when she formed and directed a club volleyball program in Muscle Shoals. She later earned her master's degree in math education at the University of North Alabama in 1994.

Seals has been active in the development of youth volleyball throughout her career. She founded the Golden Triangle Volleyball Club and the Mississippi State Juniors Club in 2004 and has also been a guiding force behind the establishment of summer youth volleyball camps on the MSU campus. USA Volleyball honored Seals in 2008 for her efforts to promote club volleyball with a Robert L. Lindsay Meritorious Service Award for the USVBA Delta Region.

During her MSU volleyball playing career she met and married Tony Seals, a native of Winfield, Ala., and a 1986 graduate of Mississippi State University. They are the parents of a daughter, Tracey Marie, a senior at Starkville High School. The Seals also serve as a host family for Takatoshi Sato, an international exchange student from Fukuyama, Japan.

Prior to his work with NCAJ, Perkins served from 2001 to 2003 as head coach and club director of the University of Albany Men's Volleyball Club. He guided his 2003 edition to the NIRSA National Championship Tournament. Perkins also worked with the University of Albany women's volleyball team, one of the region's top NCAA Division I teams.

Perkins, who also previously coached the Georgetown University men's volleyball club, began coaching women's volleyball in 2001, serving as assistant coach and offensive coordinator at the Sage Junior College of Albany.

The MSU assistant has also worked extensively with USA Volleyball, first as the director of High Performance Programs for the Iroquois Empire Region and as an evaluator and court coach for the USA Youth and Junior National team tryouts. In 2008 he served on the staff of the USA Volleyball High Performance Pipeline camp in Austin, Texas.

Perkins' coaching history also includes a stint as an assistant coach with the Adirondack Region Men's and Girl's Empire State Games in 2003 and 2005 respectively. Additionally, he has served as camp instructor and clinician at volleyball camps at the University of Florida, University of Texas, the University of Albany and the University of Pennsylvania as well as Mississippi State University.

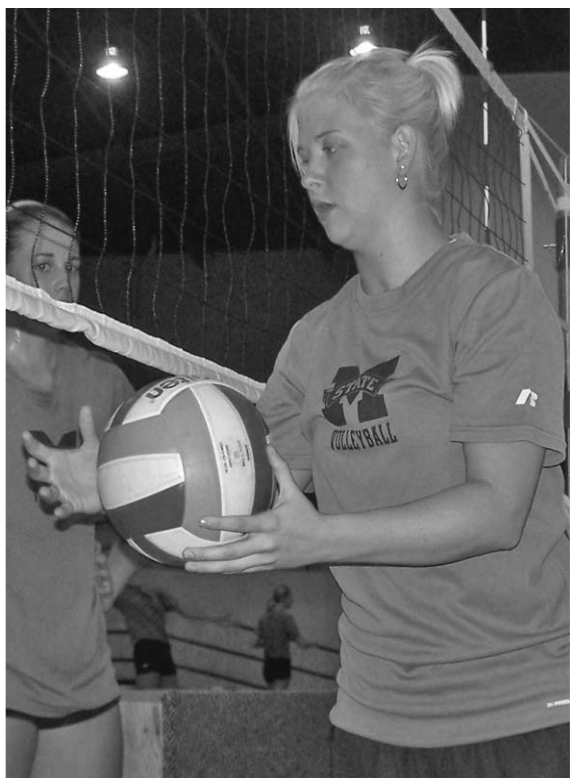

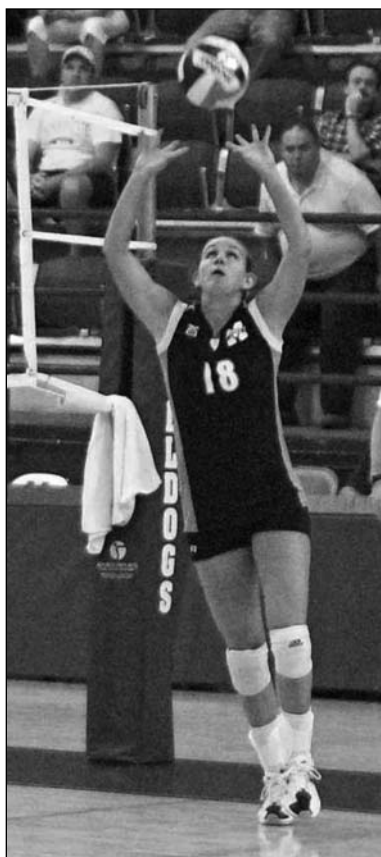

THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

Mississippi State University is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference, which in 2007-08 celebrated its 75th anniversary as a pioneer in the integration of higher education and athletic competition and a national leader in intercollegiate athletics.

The SEC, with an impressive legacy of more than seven decades of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of any intercollegiate athletic league in the nation since the conference's inception in 1933.

Centrally headquartered in Birmingham, Ala., the Southeastern Conference is comprised of 12 universities that span a nine-state area, conducting championships in 11 women's and nine men's sports.

The member schools are split into two divisions. Mississippi State University is joined in the SEC Western Division by instate rival Mississippi, Louisiana State, Alabama, Auburn and Arkansas. The SEC's Eastern Division features Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, South Carolina, Tennessee and Vanderbilt. All but Arkansas and South Carolina were among 13 charter members of the SEC, with those schools joining the league for competition in 1991-92.

Since the Southeastern Conference conducted its first volleyball championship tournament in 1979, the sport has enjoyed steady growth in both popularity and strength in the league. During the decade of the 1990s SEC volleyball blossomed into a formidable force on the national scene, and over the past three seasons the league has set conference marks for postseason tournament entrants --- six SEC teams advanced to NCAA postseason play in 2005, a league-record seven reached the field of 64 in 2006, and five more reached postseason play in 2007.

The conference has sent at least two teams to the NCAA Tournament in every season the last 18 years, with an SEC team reaching NCAA volleyball's Final Four nine times in the last 17 seasons and coming within a win of Final Four placement four times over that span.

In 2006, perennial power Florida captured its 17th overall league title and made its 18th appearance in the NCAA Volleyball Tournament.

The Gators had plenty of Southeastern Conference company in the 64-team of the NCAA Tournament. SEC Eastern Division entrant Kentucky

and four teams from the SEC's Western Division --- Alabama, Louisiana State and Mississippi reached the single-elimination tourney.

Since the inaugural SEC volleyball championship in 1979-80, many changes have occurred in the conference with volleyball. The addition of Arkansas and South Carolina to the league

in 1991 brought divisional format to the sport with five teams competing in the Eastern Division and six teams in the Western Division. The most significant change in recent years came in 1999 with the league adopting an eight-team format for its three-day conference tournament. In 2002 the SEC began a

16-match league scheduling format. The league scheduling evolved further last fall when the SEC expanded its conference schedule to 20 matches while discontinuing its 27-year old season-ending league tournament. The regular season league champion now earns the Southeastern Conference's automatic qualifying berth for the NCAA Tournament.

Volleyball has enjoyed a steady increase in popularity and interest in the Southeastern Conference, mirroring the sport's growth nationwide. Exposure for Southeastern Conference volleyball received a major boost in 1995 when the league's volleyball made its debut on SEC-TV (FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and Sun Network) on a tape-delay basis.

That coverage has since grown in recent years to include live telecasts of regular season matches. The conference's television package, now called the Regional Sports Network (RSN), beams Southeastern Conference Volleyball to more than 22 million cable subscribers in the SEC's nine-state region.

More about SEC Volleyball...

- All 11 SEC teams posted double-digit win totals in 2007, with Florida (29-3) leading a quartet of SEC teams reaching the 20-win plateau.
- Two players from the SEC (Florida's Marcie Hampton and Angie McGinnis) earned AVCA All-America Team honors in 2007 while five more were accorded honorable mention all-America honors and nine league players earned AVCA All-South Region plaudits.
- SEC volleyball teams placed two players on the **2007** ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Volleyball Team (Auburn's Rachel Shanks and Florida's Amber McCray).
- In the past 17 years, 980 student-athletes have earned selection to the SEC Volleyball Academic Honor Roll. Mississippi State placed nine players on that academic all-conference team and five more on the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

2008 SEC VOLLEYBALL TV SCHEDULE

Five regular season matchups involving nine of the SEC's 11 competing volleyball teams are included in this fall's SEC volleyball television lineup on the SEC's Regional Sports Network.

Mississippi State is scheduled to make its eighth SEC TV appearance in 11 seasons this fall when the Bulldogs entertain SEC East rival Georgia Oct. 19 in a 1 p.m. match at the Newell-Grissom Building.

RSN telecasts are broadcast on FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and the Florida-based Sun Network, reaching more than 22 million households throughout the region.

2007 SEASON IN REVIEW

With five seniors and the bulk of its starting lineup returning from a team that posted a 17-13 mark and set a school record for SEC wins, Mississippi State entered the 2007 volleyball campaign filled with high hopes.

Could the Volleyball Bulldogs register a winning campaign for a school-record third consecutive year, and, after making a solid bid for NCAA postseason play in 2006, finally break through with the program's first NCAA tournament appearance?

Sadly, coach Tina Seal's fourth MSU volleyball edition found the answers to the questions not to their liking. A series of injuries to key performers coupled with the usual challenges of a rugged Southeastern Conference schedule left the Bulldogs nursing a 12-17 record.

"It seemed like every starter had a major injury at one time or another," said Seals, who absorbed only her second losing season in 16 seasons as a collegiate head coach. "As a result, we had to move players out of their normal positions. We weren't able to develop our younger players at the pace we wanted, and we fell short of the goals we set as a team."

Still, the 2007 had its share of bright moments.

State won five of its nine non-conference matches, including a 3-2 thriller in Waco, Texas, against tournament-host Baylor. MSU claimed runner-up honors in the season-opening MSU/Microtel Classic in Starkville and at the University of Memphis Invitational where State dropped a 3-2 decision to the host team in the tournament championship match.

In conference play the Bulldogs registered a program-first series sweep of perennial divisional power Arkansas, topping the Lady Razorbacks in Fayetteville for the first time in school history. MSU also recorded a two-match series sweep SEC West divisional rival Auburn, snapped a 15-match series losing skid to Tennessee with a hard-fought five-game win in Starkville, and bested in-state SEC rival Ole Miss for the seventh time in eight matches during the Seals era.

State's 7-13 league mark was one win shy of matching the school record for league wins, a standard set by the 2006 Bulldogs, and left State tied for seventh with South Carolina in the final conference standings.

There were numerous noteworthy individual accomplishments, both on and off the court.

Veteran setter Eva Kriegel closed out her three-year Mississippi State career in impressive fashion. The native of Jaszbereny, Hungary tallied a team-leading 992 assists, concluding her career with 2,710 kill-producing passes, fifth-most in school history. And for the second time in as many seasons, Kriegel led the Southeastern Conference in "triple-doubles", bettering her own school record in 2007 with five while concluding her career with an SEC-record 13 "triple-doubles". Kriegel tallied a team-best 54 service aces and helped Mississippi State pace the SEC in aces for the fourth straight year. Her 158 career aces stands as the third-most in school history.

Kriegel has since gone on to continue her volleyball career on the professional level in France.

Libero Megan Lukasek of St. Louis, Mo., etched her name in the Mississippi State record book as a senior, pacing the Bulldogs and ranking seventh in the SEC with a single-season MSU-record 511 digs. Lukasek led State in digs for four consecutive seasons and ended her career as MSU's No. 2 all-time career digs leader with 1,564.

Jamie Joyner, a senior opposite hitter from St. Louis, Mo., ranked as the lone Bulldog to avoid the injury bug and start all 29 matches. She led MSU on offense with a career-best 359 kills and became the ninth MSU player to crack the 1,000-mark in career kills. Joyner piled up 1,010 kills, and her .229 career hitting percentage was ninth-best in MSU volleyball history. She was named the team's Most Valuable Player for 2007.

State got solid play at the net from a pair of veteran middle blockers. Lauren Kowal of Chesterfield, Mo., led State with 85 total blocks, including a staff-leading 21 solo blocks. Four-year regular Erin Seago of Rockford, Ill., led MSU with a .342 hitting percentage, tying for the fifth-highest hitting percentage in the SEC in 2007. Seago piled up 236 assisted blocks, seventh most by a Volleyball Bulldog. Seago was the recipient of MSU's Newsom Award for volleyball in 2007.

Here are some other noteworthy Bulldog volleyball achievements for the past year:

ACADEMIC HONORS — Fourteen of Mississippi State's 15 players were cited for academic all-conference honors in 2007. Named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll were Ioana Demian, Dorey Gray, Jennifer Hauskey, Jamie Joyner, Stefanie Joyner, Cristina Jucan, Lauren Kowal, Megan Lukasek and Erin Seago. Additionally, all five MSU freshmen earned positions on the 2007 SEC Freshman

Academic Honor Roll — Miranda Bauman, Ashley Newsome, Meaghan Schlueter, Kaitlin Wheatley and Kayla Woodard.

The MSU volleyball team was one of 70 NCAA Division I teams and one of two from the Southeastern Conference to receive an AVCA Team Academic Award for 2007-08. The Volleyball Bulldogs compiled a 3.42 grade point average to earn the school's third AVCA Team Academic Award. MSU also claimed the honor in 2001 and 2002.

USVBA SERVICE AWARD FOR SEALS — MSU coach Tina Seals was honored by USA Volleyball as the recipient of a Robert L. Lindsay Meritorious Service Award for the USVBA Delta Region. The award recognizes individuals for contributing outstanding participation, motivation and other services in the promotion of volleyball on the club level. Seals was cited for her work in the establishment of the Golden Triangle Volleyball Club/Mississippi Junior Club in 2004.

SUCCESS ON THE BEACH — Mississippi State capped a productive spring volleyball training period in 2008 with participation in a pair of beach volleyball tournaments in Florida. State fielded two-player teams in the inaugural Southeastern Conference Coaches Beach Volleyball Championships in Gainesville, Fla., April 12. A week later in the "Dig the Beach" Tournament at Siesta Key, Fla., Dorey Gray and Eva Kriegel teamed up to win the championship of the gold bracket while Cristina Jucan and Stefanie Joyner took runner-up honors in the silver bracket.

CAREER COACHING WIN NO. 500 FOR SEALS — Mississippi State's 3-1 win at Arkansas was the first for a Bulldog volleyball team in Fayetteville, snapping a run of 13 consecutive wins by the Lady Razorbacks. It also marked a milestone for MSU coach Tina Seals. It was her 500th career coaching win in 16 seasons as a head coach at Northwest Shoals (Ala.) Community College and at Mississippi State University..

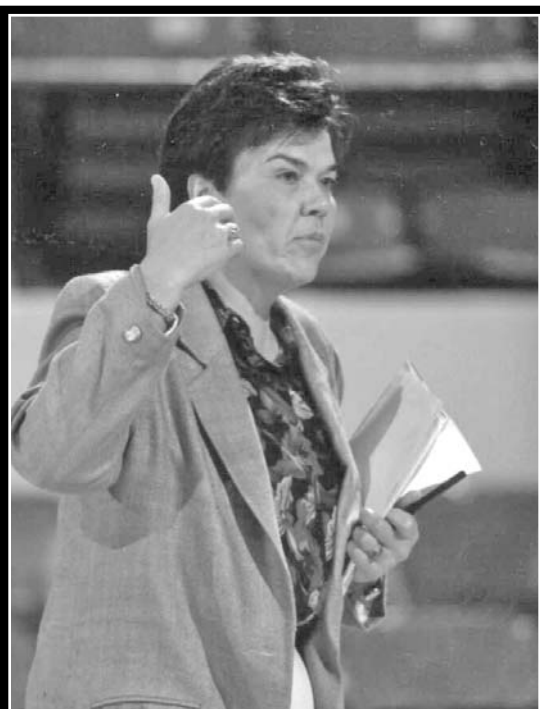

MSU'S SAMYE JOHNSON IN THE MISSISSIPPI SPORTS HALL OF FAME

Mississippi State University volleyball has representation in the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame.

Samye Johnson, who served as Mississippi State University head volleyball coach for three seasons (1994-96) and as MSU's senior women's athletics administrator until her retirement in July 2006, joined the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame in 2002. She was among eight Mississippi sports standouts in the 40th Anniversary MSHoF Class inducted during ceremonies April 12, 2002 in Jackson, Miss.

Johnson, a 1971 graduate of Mississippi University for Women where she was a four-sport athlete, served as head volleyball coach at MUW for 15 years prior to joining the MSU staff as volleyball coach and assistant AD for women's sports in 1994.

She retired from coaching in 1997, concluding her stellar 20-year coaching career with 506 wins. Johnson served as MSU's senior administrator for women's sports until her retirement in July 2006.

Born in Jackson, Miss., and reared in Mendenhall, Miss., Johnson launched her coaching career at Festus (Mo.) High School and later served as volleyball and tennis coach at East Texas State University.

Johnson was the lone Mississippi State representative among the eight inductees in 2002 and is the only collegiate volleyball coach enshrined in the tradition-bound 45-year old Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame.

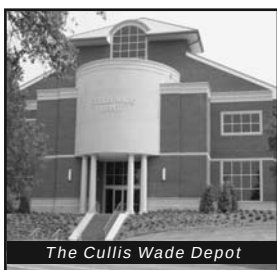

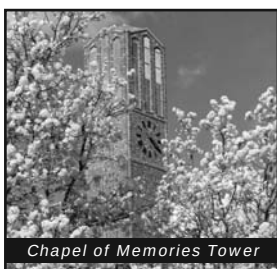

Mississippi State is a comprehensive land-grant institution and the largest university in Mississippi, with a statewide enrollment of more than 17,000 students.

Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research, and service.

Growth and success

For the first time in its 130-year history, Mississippi State in 2007 surpassed the 17,000 mark in enrollment and is on track to post enrollment gains again in 2008. Enrollment includes a record number of African-Americans, as well as record enrollment for the Meridian campus, graduate and distance learning students.

Through an innovative Pathfinders program—a mentoring and intervention effort—the freshman-to-sophomore retention rate is 83.4 percent. In 2008, Pathfinders celebrates its 10th anniversary and has generated significant research about student retention. Other institutions now are adopting the model.

Mississippi State has one of the largest cooperative education programs in the Southeast, with more than 750 students enrolled. More than 10,000 students have participated since the program's inception in 1955.

In 2008, Mississippi State students for the second consecutive year won the top prize in the Challenge X competition to redesign a fuel efficient and environmentally friendly SUV. Another 17-member student team brought home the 2008 Best Flight Award of the Association for Unmanned Vehicle Systems International. A recent MSU graduate also won \$100,000 and the top prize in the nationally televised game show, Jeopardy.

Research gains

Research at Mississippi State has a direct impact on the state's economy and competitiveness in a global market, as well as providing tangible benefits for students. Fiscal year 2007 marked a record year for total amount of research awards for the university, \$187 million compared the \$154 million in fiscal year 2006.

Centers of excellence identified in the university's strategic plan are agriculture and natural resource systems; computational science and engineering; applied social sciences; transportation systems; and materials and devices.

The impact of research programs at Mississippi State is recognized nationally and internationally. The university is placing increased emphasis on taking research results to market

and providing industry-specific research needed by the state.

MSU is partnering with a Starkville high-tech business to develop small, low-cost satellites for the United States market. The university is working with InfiniSat, a company spun off from MSU research, to develop less expensive technologies that can be deployed quickly.

The university is one of about two dozen National Centers of Academic Excellence in Information Assurance Research. The designation, made by the National Security Agency and Department of Homeland Security, enables research institutions to seek ways to secure the worldwide information grid.

A first-ever MSU conference on avian genomics and gene ontology drew scientists from around the world. Sponsored by the Institute for Digital Biology, the conference focused on ways to use genomics to develop new medical procedures and understand diseases such as the bird flu, as well as improving poultry and egg production, among other areas.

The Sustainable Energy Research Center at MSU coordinates university research efforts in alternative energy, especially related to resources available in Mississippi and the Southeast. Currently, a center team is creating fuel from crops, waste water and other sources.

Outreach and service

When it comes to providing educational opportunities to the people of Mississippi, there are not many paths Mississippi State University has overlooked. That is especially true in the Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine.

Each year, thousands of Mississippians turn to the MSU Extension Service, the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment station or other units in the division for continuing education opportunities, information related to their farm or other business, management of their personal resources or for self improvement. Sometimes all that is involved is a visit to an MSU Web site or a call or visit to one of Mississippi's 82 county Extension offices. Several thousand people also take advantage of the chance to participate in activities on the Starkville campus, an MSU experiment station or other facilities.

The Mississippi State University Extension Service is a primary source of leadership development programs designed to improve overall community engagement as well as to provide community leaders with the tools necessary to address specific community issues. Available to both rural and urban locales, these programs have proven effective in advancing community initiatives and providing a basis for local residents to take a more active role in their community.



MSU PRESIDENT/ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

Dr. Vance Watson

Interim President

Named Interim President of Mississippi State in April 2008, Vance Watson assumed the top leadership role after a career of progressively responsible positions at the land-grant university.

Most recently, he served as vice president of the Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine; dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences; director of the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station; executive director of Extension and Outreach; and professor of agronomy.

A native of Missouri, he earned his undergraduate degree from Southeast Missouri State University in his native state, followed by a master's degree at the University of Missouri and a doctorate from Mississippi State. He has invested his 42-year career in the institution and the state he has come to call 'home.'

Under his leadership, the Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine gained an eighth-place ranking for total research and development expenditures, and a third-place ranking for federal expenditures, as calculated by the National Science Foundation. Units making up the division include the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station, Mississippi State University Extension Service, Forest and Wildlife Research Center, College of Veterinary Medicine, College of Forest Resources, and the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences.

Watson was instrumental in the establishment of a number of interdisciplinary research efforts, including one that led to a sustainable energy research partnership between the Bagley College of Engineering and the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. He played a key role in securing a commitment for a collaborative poultry research facility that will house research scientists from MSU, USDA, and the Agricultural Research Service—USDA's research arm. The latter will provide more opportunities to assist an important segment of Mississippi's economy.

Within the division, he advocated a faculty mentoring program to help enhance the success and contributions of junior faculty members, and as Interim President, seeks to expand the concept university-wide.

An Eagle Scout, he also is a Fellow of the American Society of Agronomy and a Fellow of the Crop Science Society of America. He has received the Mississippi Farm Bureau Federation Distinguished Service Award, the Southern Association of Agricultural Experiment Station Directors' 2007 Excellence in Leadership Award, and numerous other awards and honors.

He and his wife, Jo Ann, have three children and seven grandchildren.



Greg Byrne

Director of Athletics

When Greg Byrne was named Mississippi State University's 15th Director of Athletics on February 21, 2008, he became the youngest top current athletic administrator in the Southeastern Conference. At 36 years of age, he became the youngest to lead an athletic program at the NCAA Division I-A level.

Despite his age, Byrne is anything but inexperienced. He has been around successful athletic programs, and the director's chair at those institutions, literally all his life. He is the son of long-time athletic administrator Bill Byrne,

currently the Director of Athletics at Texas A&M University.

Byrne, however, has made a name for himself in intercollegiate athletics. He has 15 years of professional experience, a resume' that shows progressive growth in both responsibility and achievement. He has been directly involved in raising over \$120 million in gifts during his career in athletics. He has finalized and implemented an annual giving renovation for athletics at three different institutions. Byrne has also helped in the reorganization of the athletic program at one school while renovating the department's budgeting systems, development, marketing, and compliance programs. Byrne was on the ground floor of resurrecting a football program and athletic department at another institution, one that achieved success for the first time in three decades.

Prior to being named to head State's athletic program, Byrne came to MSU in June 2006 as Associate Athletic Director for External Affairs. In just his first year on the job, Byrne initiated a first-ever volunteer fund-drive that resulted in 969 new Bulldog Club members for Mississippi State. He implemented a priority seating program for football and men's basketball that led to a \$1 million increase in annual giving. He also led the effort to package State's donor and ticketing software, in connection with the department's athletic web site, for fan convenience. In so doing, MSU became the first Bowl Championship Series school to enlist XOS Technologies for total donor support in those areas.

Byrne held a similar position at the University of Kentucky prior to coming to Starkville. As Associate Athletic Director for Development and Fund-Raising at UK from 2002-05, he managed the development staff and operated a multi-million dollar budget. He oversaw development efforts that raised annual gifts from \$4 million to \$9 million annually. While in Lexington, Byrne led a \$35 million athletic facility campaign, and participated in the design, funding and marketing for Kentucky's \$30 million basketball practice facility. He worked with a corporate sponsorship team to manage UK marketing and development efforts, including signing one of the nation's top multi-media rights packages. Byrne was one of four members on the UK search committees that brought new head football and baseball coaches to the Wildcat athletic program.

Byrne possibly made his greatest athletic program impact as Associate Athletic Director for Development at Oregon State University from 1998-2002. Managing an eight-person staff, he replaced an antiquated 60-year old fund-raising organization and increased annual giving from \$1 million to over \$5 million in cash during his tenure there. He assisted the Director of Major Gifts in raising more than \$30 million in capital gifts for facilities and budget enhancement while in Corvallis. He participated in securing a \$12.5 million gift to rename the Beavers' football stadium. Byrne was involved in the department's transition of corporate sponsorships for radio, television, stadium and arena signage and game program sales to increase revenue.

Byrne began his athletic fund-raising career as Regional Director of Development at the University of Oregon from 1995 through '98, overseeing development efforts for Portland, Southern and Central Oregon, Northern California and the Oregon coast. He secured the largest donation totals ever for each region during his career at Oregon. While overseeing the Duck's lettermen's organization, he participated in raising \$14 million for an indoor football facility and soccer complex.

The energetic Byrne launched his professional career as Special Projects Coordinator for the Fiesta Bowl in Tempe, Ariz., from 1993-95. During that time, he managed a 1,000-person volunteer base for 63 Fiesta Bowl annual events. Byrne was promoted to a full-time position following an initial internship period.

A native of Pocatello, Idaho, Byrne earned his bachelor's degree from Arizona State University in 1994. He anticipates receiving his master's degree from Mississippi State this summer.

Byrne is married to the former Regina Misa of Junction City, Ore., and the couple has two sons: Nick (12) and Davis (10).



MISSISSIPPI State

MSU has the largest enrollment in the state of Mississippi. Founded as a land-grant institution, its grass, flowers and trees are as prevalent as buildings, sidewalks and parking lots. Large enough to sport diversity in all areas, the university still maintains a warm, friendly atmosphere.

Ruby Hall, a residence hall with the largest single room size in university history, opened in August 2006. A co-residential, 160,000-square foot, three-story freshman hall, Ruby is located at the north end of campus, in convenient proximity to the Colvard Union, the Perry Cafeteria, Mitchell Memorial Library, the Sanderson Center and all athletic facilities. Ruby Hall offers students the latest in technology, including Ethernet access, full wireless internet coverage, a refrigerator and microwave, and free cable with HBO in each room.



The Colvard Union is a popular meeting place for MSU students. Whether working on a group project, enjoying the food court, or simply relaxing, the student union is one of the campus' main meeting places.

The Chapel of Memories and Carillon Tower were built with bricks from Old Main Dormitory, the largest residence hall in the country when constructed, later destroyed by fire in 1959. The Chapel of Memories, which hosts numerous weddings each year, is one of the most-recognized landmarks on campus.

The Drill Field, located squarely in the center of campus, shows the expanse of greenery for which the campus is famous.



The People's University



When built in the 1920s, Perry Cafeteria was the largest dining hall in the country. The 300-foot long, Gothic style interior is one of the most beautiful buildings on the campus. It has accommodations for 600 students, faculty and staff and serves as the dining hall for MSU athletes.

The \$19 million, 150,000-square foot Sanderson Center recreation complex opened to students in 1996. The state-of-the-art facility offers recreational opportunities in aquatics, fitness and aerobics, strength and conditioning, and intramural sports.



Barnes & Noble opened on the MSU campus in August 2006 and features a world-class bookstore, apparel and gift shop, and café.



ATHLETIC Excellence

State's coaches care for their student-athletes and the school's sports programs. Each has a passion for their specialty, experience as a player and coach, and expertise to instruct at the highest levels. Their goal is to coach champions on the field and mold productive college graduates from the university's classroom.

SYLVESTER CROOM was named the consensus SEC Coach of the Year after leading the MSU football team to an 8-5 record in 2007, a season that concluded with a win over Central Florida in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis, Tenn.



CHRISTI SANDERS (back left) has the longest, consecutive coaching reign of any head coach at State, with 21 seasons at the helm of the women's golf program. She has twice been named SEC Coach of the Year (1990, 2000).

Former MSU baseball standout **JOHN COHEN** was introduced as Mississippi State's new baseball skipper in June 2008.

RICK STANSBURY, the winningest coach in MSU basketball history, has guided the Bulldogs to 208 wins and eight post-season appearances in his 10 seasons at State.

NEIL MACDONALD is the only head coach to guide the MState soccer program to an SEC Tournament appearance in his first season (2004).

On Nov. 10, 2006, SHARON FANNING became the 29th NCAA Division I women's basketball head coach to reach the 500-win plateau. Fanning is also the winningest basketball coach in Lady Bulldog history.

Great Teachers



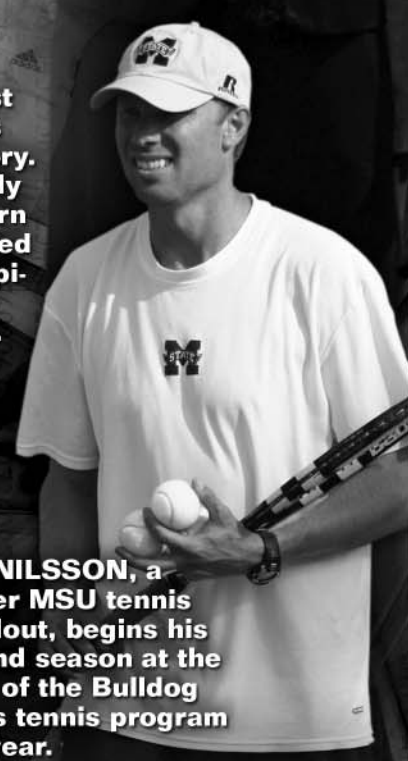
CLAY HOMAN, a second-team all-SEC performer during his MState playing career, has led the men's golf program to 43 top 10 finishes in five years.



TRACY LANE has the most wins of any head women's tennis coach in MSU history. She directed the 2005 Lady Bulldogs to an SEC Western Division title and has guided MSU to four NCAA Championship berths in her 12 seasons at the State helm.



JAY MILLER is one of the most respected coaches around the country, and a key contributor to USA Softball in various capacities. The NFCA Hall of Famer has directed the State softball program to five NCAA postseason appearances in his six seasons.



PER NILSSON, a former MSU tennis standout, begins his second season at the helm of the Bulldog men's tennis program this year.



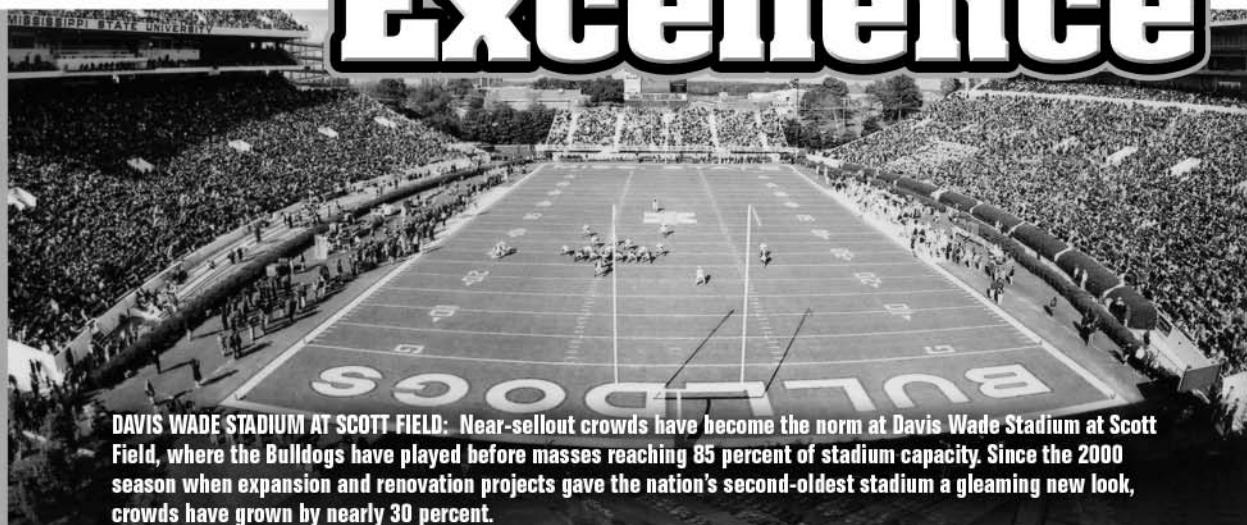
TINA SEALS returned to her alma mater as head volleyball coach in 2004. The school's first All-SEC volleyball performer guided the Bulldogs in 2006 to their most wins since 1996 and a school-record for SEC wins.



Now in his second decade as the head coach of the men's and women's track teams, **AL SCHMIDT** has coached three MState athletes to national titles.

ATHLETIC Excellence

Mississippi State athletes play in some of the nation's finest facilities. Almost every Bulldog competition site has either been constructed or renovated in the last 15 years. During that time along, more than \$60 million in facility enhancements have been made.



DAVIS WADE STADIUM AT SCOTT FIELD: Near-sellout crowds have become the norm at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field, where the Bulldogs have played before masses reaching 85 percent of stadium capacity. Since the 2000 season when expansion and renovation projects gave the nation's second-oldest stadium a gleaming new look, crowds have grown by nearly 30 percent.



PITTS TENNIS CENTRE: Considered among the finest tennis facilities in the collegiate ranks, the modern, six-court, 1,000-seat A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre recently completed its 25th year serving the men's and women's programs. Recent enhancements at the facility include new locker areas and concession stands (1998) and a permanent press box (2004).



DUDY NOBLE FIELD, POLK-DEMENT STADIUM: One of the nation's leaders in baseball season ticket sales and attendance, Dudy Noble Field, Polk-Dement Stadium still holds the nation's on-campus single-game attendance mark — 14,991. With a seating capacity of more than 7,000 and more space in the world-famous outfield, *Sports Illustrated* magazine named the park, the "Best Place To Watch College Baseball" in a 1997 issue.

**W.O. SPENCER STADIUM/
CARL MADDOX TRACK:** Co-named in honor of a two-time Mississippi State Olympian and a former MSU athletic director, the W.O. Spencer Stadium/Carl Maddox Track has served as host to the Southeastern Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships three times since 1985, joining Tennessee as the most frequent host for that event during that time.



NEWELL GRISSOM BUILDING:

The 12,000-square foot, hardwood-floored Newell-Grissom Building serves as the home for Mississippi State's volleyball program and serves as a practice facility for both of the school's basketball programs. A state-of-the-art heating and air conditioning system was installed in 2004.

Great Places



MSU GOLF COURSE:

Nominated by *Golfweek* and *Golf Digest* magazines as one of the premier public golf courses in the United States, Mississippi State's championship University Golf Course is the home to the men's and women's programs. The 18-hole course was recently furnished with a 5,000-square-foot clubhouse, complete with locker areas, snack bar, golf shop and classroom.



MSU SOCCER FIELD: Built in 1995, the lighted Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldog women one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast, a 114-yard long, 72-yard wide regulation NCAA Championship field. The lush turf is Mississippi Pride grass, developed by researchers on the MSU campus.



HUMPHREY COLISEUM: Season ticket sales records and all-time attendance marks have also been set over the past decade by Bulldog and Lady Bulldog basketball teams in the Humphrey Coliseum, the state's largest on-campus basketball arena. The latest addition to the facility was a \$1.8 million, center-hung, four-sided video scoreboard and jumbotron screen installed in 2004.



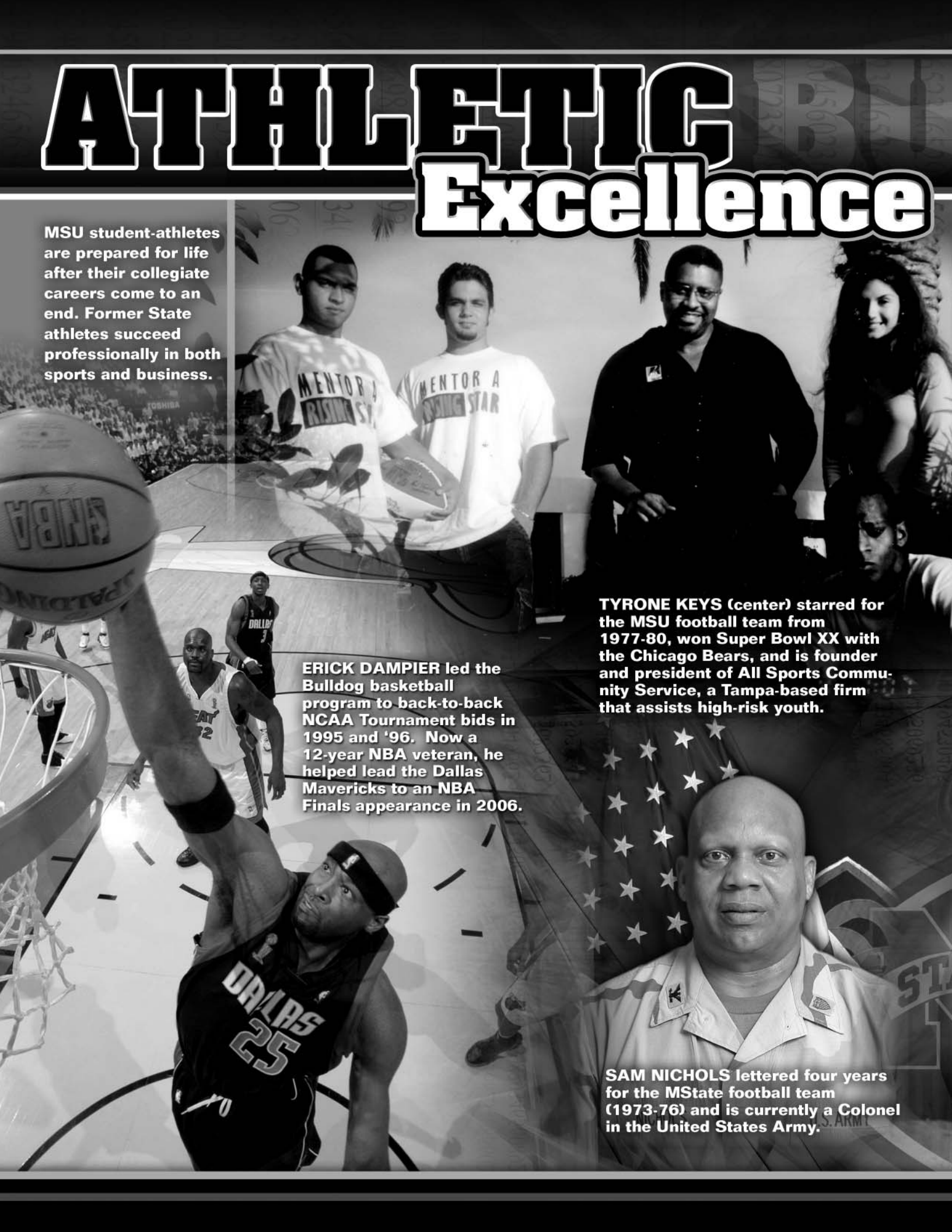
MSU SOFTBALL FIELD: Constructed in 1997, the Mississippi State Softball Field has undergone almost constant improvement at the northern-most point of campus. Lights were added to the facility in 1998, brick work was added to the dugouts two years later and, in 2001, additional batting cages were built. In 2005, softball moved into a new locker, training and meeting facility adjacent to the park.



BRYAN BUILDING: The state-of-the-art John H. Bryan Athletic Administration Building is the crown jewel of MSU's expansion projects of the last decade. Opened in 1996, this showcase facility is named for longtime Bulldog friend and supporter John H. Bryan Sr., and houses athletic administration, football, ticket, athletic development and media relations offices.

ATHLETIC Excellence

MSU student-athletes are prepared for life after their collegiate careers come to an end. Former State athletes succeed professionally in both sports and business.



ERICK DAMPIER led the Bulldog basketball program to back-to-back NCAA Tournament bids in 1995 and '96. Now a 12-year NBA veteran, he helped lead the Dallas Mavericks to an NBA Finals appearance in 2006.

TYRONE KEYS (center) starred for the MSU football team from 1977-80, won Super Bowl XX with the Chicago Bears, and is founder and president of All Sports Community Service, a Tampa-based firm that assists high-risk youth.

SAM NICHOLS lettered four years for the MState football team (1973-76) and is currently a Colonel in the United States Army.

BAILEY HOWELL, who still ranks second on the school's all-time basketball scoring list, enjoyed a 12-year career in the NBA and was elected to the Basketball Hall of Fame in 1997.

Great Alumni

ROSA MARIELLA (JIMINEZ) MAHAN was an ITA All-Academic Scholar women's tennis player for State in 1988, and is Senior VP and Regional Manager for Central America, the Caribbean, and Northern South America for Prisma Energy International in Houston, Texas.

BUCK SHOWALTER, currently a senior advisor to baseball operations for the Cleveland Indians, was an all-America baseball player at MSU in 1977 and has managed three clubs in the major leagues, including the Texas Rangers.

BOBBY THIGPEN helped MSU baseball to the College World Series in 1985 and still holds the Major League record for saves in a season (57 in 1990 with the Chicago White Sox).

Bulldog right-hander **JEFF BRANTLEY** (1982-85) still holds SEC records for pitching wins in a season (18) and career (45). He is now a radio broadcaster for the Cincinnati Reds.

Academics

While the MSU athletic program has experienced success both on the field and court, Bulldog and Lady Bulldog athletes are excelling where it counts the most — in the classroom. During the 2006-07 school year, 153 MState athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll honors.

Featuring 2005 graduates (L-R) Shane Power, Ontario Harper, Wesley Morgan and Branden Vincent, coach Rick Stansbury's Bulldogs lead all SEC schools with a total of 20 SEC Academic Honor Roll recipients in men's basketball over the past five seasons.

Burke Masters was a two-time First Team GTE-CoSIDA Academic All-American (1989 and 1990), four-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection and the 1990 Boyd McWhorter SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

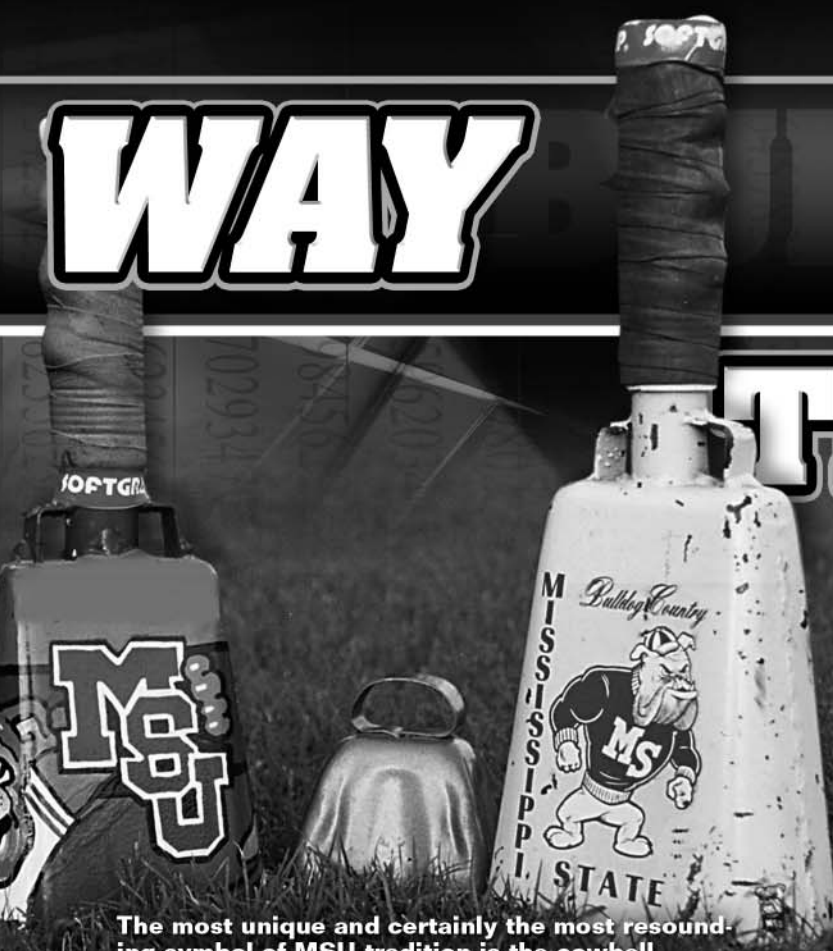
A two-time Academic all-SEC selection, Kate Jaspers racked up numerous academic awards while at MSU. She was twice named ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American, and a three-time NFCA Scholar Athlete All-America. In 2004, Jaspers was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, as well as the CoSIDA Academic Player of the Year.

Annemarie Pimentel was a four-year soccer letterwinner. While at State, she was a three-time Academic all-SEC selection, while being named to the GTE and Verizon Academic All-District teams. Her career culminated in being selected the 2000 SEC Boyd McWhorter Post-Graduate Scholarship winner, awarded to the student-athlete who best demonstrates excellence in athletics, academics and community service.

Traditions



The most unique and certainly the most resounding symbol of MSU tradition is the cowbell. Cowbells decorate homes and offices of MSU alumni, and are passed down through generations of Bulldog fans. Although banned from SEC games since 1974, the ruling has not damaged the cowbell's historical importance.

The official school mascot is an American Kennel Club registered English Bulldog, given the inherited title of "Bully." A costumed Bully often makes his presence known at various athletic events.

MOST WINS IN A SEASON

10 (2006)

Mississippi State is in its second decade of competition in its on-campus home, the Newell-Grissom Building. The spacious facility features 12,000 square feet of hardwood flooring and arena seating for more than 2,000. MSU's volleyball home has seen two major improvements in the facility over the past three years. An air conditioning system was added following the 2004 season and 489 maroon chair back seats were installed in the east stands prior to the start of the 2006 campaign.

The facility has served as the home court for Mississippi State volleyball since Oct. 3, 1997 when State met Georgia in the first match at the Newell-Grissom Building. Another first for the facility unfolded a year later when the 1998 season-ending MSU-Mississippi volleyball match was televised regionally by SEC-TV on FOX Sports Net South.

Located approximately two blocks southwest of Scott Field, the Newell-Grissom Building served as an auxiliary practice site for volleyball and both the men's and women's basketball teams at Mississippi State in 1996 while Humphrey Coliseum served as those teams' primary on-campus competition site.

Newell-Grissom is MSU's third on-campus volleyball home in 34 seasons. MSU's first volleyball teams competed in McCarthy Gymnasium prior to moving to Humphrey Coliseum.

The Newell-Grissom Building has a varied and colorful history that spans five decades and covers a broad spectrum of campus events.

Construction of the building began in January, 1951. The \$500,000 Animal Husbandry Service Building was completed in the spring of 1953, with dedicatory ceremonies held on April 28, 1953. The original structure included two classrooms, two offices, an area to house two graduate students, two exhibit areas, a multi-bunk dormitory area for visiting teams, and a dirt floor to accommodate its primary mission as host for livestock-related events.

But the "cow barn", as it became affectionately known on campus, was used for much more than livestock shows, rodeos and equestrian competition. It developed into the campus and regional center for concerts and other entertainment events. The building's size and central location on campus also made it a natural for graduation ceremonies and class registration operations.

In 1978, the arena was formally named in honor of two long-time leaders in Mississippi State University's animal science department, Paul F. Newell (1910) and E.E. Grissom (1932). The structure went largely unused in the 1980s and early 1990s and gradually fell into disrepair. But in early 1995, the university, faced with an expensive "tear it down or fix it up" proposition, partnered with the MSU Athletic Department to share the costs of a million dollar renovation project.

In addition to the installation of a hardwood floor, the initial project included reroofing, the installation of a new lighting system, the construction and refurbishing of locker rooms and team meeting areas, and the addition of public rest room facilities.
