- Recorded 252 kills on this season, which was third-most on the team
- Finished the season with 285.0 points, finishing fifth on the team
- Put 24.5 points on the board for the Bulldogs in four sets against Stetson (Sept. 8)
- Had an attack percentage of .600 against Grambling State (Aug. 31)

## 2016 | SOPHOMORE

- Played in six matches totaling 10 sets
- Finished her second year in the Maroon and White with career highs in kills (seven), kills per set (0.70), attacks (14), blocks (one) and points (7.5)
- Made her season debut against Lamar on Aug. 27
- Put together the best match of her career to date against UT Martin (Sept. 2), tallying four kills on nine attempts with her first-career block and 4.5 points
- Made her first SEC appearance of the 2016 season at Kentucky (Sept. 25)

## 2015 | FRESHMAN

- Saw action in five matches (six total sets) during her first season with the Maroon and White
- Totaled two kills and two digs in those five appearances
- Made her collegiate debut against Mississippi Valley State (Sept. 5), tallying her first-career kill and dig
- Made her SEC debut at LSU on Oct. 16
- Played a career-high two sets in MSU's trip to Missouri on Oct. 23, recording a dig
- Made her SEC home debut against Auburn on Nov. 13, where she earned her first SEC kill

- A five-year letter winner from Starkville High School who began playing for the Yellowjackets in her seventh-grade year, with her first varsity season coming as an eighth-grader
- In her five seasons, she helped the Yellow Jackets to a 2011 District Championship and a second-place finish in the district in 2014
- Was named the Commercial Dispatch's 2012 Volleyball Player of the Year
- Followed that up with First Team All-District honors and being named to the MAC North All-Star team in 2013
- In 2014, she earned a WCBF Player of the Week accolade, as well as being named to the Southaven Invitational All-Tournament Team
- Was named First Team All-District in 2014, her final season with the Yellow Jackets
- Spent four seasons playing at the club level at Level Elite under head coach Tina Seals, who was formerly at the helm of the MSU volleyball program from 2004-08
- Her time with Shoals Attack and Mississippi Juniors teams were highlighted by showings at both the 2012 and 2013 Delta Region High Performance Camps
- Named Starkville High School's Most Outstanding Sophomore
- Has been a consistent presence on the school's honor roll
- Member of the National Honor Society

## **JULIE DARTY**

Julie Darty, who has served as the head coach at Jacksonville University since 2014, was named Mississippi State's 12th head volleyball coach by Director of Athletics John Cohen announced on January 10, 2018.

"Julie is a bright, hard-working and passionate coach," Cohen said. "She has been very successful in creating a brand for her programs, and she's been a part of successful teams at several levels. Julie is determined to lead Mississippi State volleyball to new heights. We are excited to welcome Julie to Starkville."

Darty has eight years of collegiate coaching experience, including four years as a head coach and two years as an assistant in the Southeastern Conference. The 31-year-old makes her debut in Starkville after turning Jacksonville into one of the Atlantic Sun's top programs. The 2013 and 2014 AVCA "Thirty under 30" award winner, she led the Dolphins to the 2014 Atlantic Sun Tournament championship and a NCAA tournament appearance during her first year as a collegiate head coach.

"I am just so humbled and grateful for the opportunity to lead Mississippi State volleyball," Darty said. "There is a tremendous amount of potential and growth for our program, and I'm excited to get into the gym with our team and grind it out.

"I'm a competitor. I want to help us find a will to win to turn this program into a contender in the SEC and the region. I know Mississippi State is a special place, and the potential is endless."

During her Jacksonville tenure (2014-17), Darty coached 11 All-Atlantic Sun honorees, including five first-team selections, five ASUN All-Tournament selections and three ASUN All-Academic Team members. This past season, she guided the Dolphins to an 18-10 overall record and a 9-2 home mark while overcoming adversity left in the wake of Hurricane Irma. Jacksonville's Swisher Gymnasium was unplayable for much of the season, and the Dolphins were forced to practice and play in several area gymnasiums.

The Dolphins also finished the season with a 12-2 mark against ASUN Conference opponents to earn the No. 2 seed in the league tournament. It was the first time since the 2013 season that Jacksonville posted 10 or more wins in the ASUN and received higher than the third seed in the ASUN tournament. Six Dolphins earned All-ASUN accolades and Mackenzie Swan was the second player under Darty's leadership to earn ASUN Defensive Player of the Year accolades.

Darty posted 58 career wins in four seasons, and she earned her 50th career victory in 2017 – a 3-1 victory over Kennesaw State. Other notable victories during her tenure included a 3-1 triumph over Lipscomb, which crowned the Dolphins the 2014 ASUN Tournament Champions; a 3-2 defeat over Stephen F. Austin in 2015; a 3-0 sweep of Presbyterian in 2016; and a 3-2 conquest over Bethune-Cookman in 2017 to push JU to 51-0 all-time against the Wildcats.

In 2017, Darty's squad ranked first in overall digs in the Atlantic Sun with 1,846. Jacksonville finished 38th in the NCAA and first in the conference with 16.94 digs per set. The Dolphins also finished third in the ASUN with 1,425 team kills and 211.5 total blocks.

In January 2017, Darty also took on the role of director of volleyball over the university's beach program. Under Darty's tutelage, the beach program captured back-to-back appearances in the ASUN Championship (2015-16), and the 2016 season also saw the Dolphins sweep South Carolina in the Gamecock Invitational.

In her first season with the Dolphins and her first year as a head coach, Darty led the indoor program to its third conference tournament championship. Jacksonville

won four of its final five ASUN matches to earn the No. 3 seed in the league tournament. Defeating each opponent, 3-1, the Dolphins were crowned the 2014 ASUN Champions, earning an automatic berth to the NCAA tournament.

Year two saw an improved win mark in league play (8-6) and several league distinctions including All-Atlantic Sun Defensive Player of the Year, two All-Atlantic Sun First Team honors, an Academic All-Conference honor, and an All-Atlantic Sun Tournament honor.

Before Jacksonville, Darty spent two seasons at the University of South Carolina (2012-13) where she was the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the Gamecocks. After the 2012 season, she was named to the AVCA's "Thirty Under 30" list as one of the rising stars in the coaching world. In her time in Columbia, the Gamecocks won 30 games and posted just their second winning record in a decade during the 2012 season.

Prior to South Carolina, Darty spent a pair of seasons at Villanova University where the Wildcats posted back-to-back top-four finishes in the 15-team Big East in the 2010 and 2011 seasons. She got her start as an assistant coach at Lake Mary (Fla.) High School. At the same time, she helped with two club teams in the Orlando area.

Darty, an Oviedo, Fla., native, holds a degree in communications from Mercer, where she graduated in 2008. As a four-year player for the Bears, Darty earned A-Sun All-Freshman honors and led the team in kills per set all four years, setting the career record in program history for that category.

Green's analytical mind is one of the best in the sport, having expertise in DataVolley, DataVideo and scouting preparation. His experience and strong relationships will benefit MSU's recruiting endeavors.

While at USF, his role with the program resulted in significant growth. He served as the program's camp director, which doubled in size under his direction. In 2016, he organized the team's foreign tour to Europe and was tasked with running the Bull's defensive system. The 2016 season marked the program's best record since 2007.

As a former setter who played club volleyball at Florida State, Green also worked extensively with USF's setters. During his tenure, Green increased the Bulls' assists per set average each season from 11.48 in 2014, 12.17 in 2015 and 12.42 in 2016. He guided USF setter Alex Mendoza to fourth in career assists with 3,147. Mendoza became just the fifth player in program history to reach 3,000 assists.

Prior to his role at USF, he served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Florida International University (2012-13). There he learned from two former Olympians — Rita Buck-Crockett and Felix Hou.

Green remained involved with the Florida Region of USA Volleyball during his tenure as a college coach. He served as an assistant coach for the region's High Performance Team, Team Florida (2013-2017) and its professional team, Florida Wave (2014-2016). His crowning achievement with both programs came while on the sidelines with Julie Darty. Together they won the Youth International division gold medal with Team Florida in 2017 and the \$10,000 championship prize with Florida Wave in 2016.

In 2009, Green was named head coach of Lake Mary High School, his alma mater, where he posted a 61-23 record in three years at the helm. His teams won the conference title twice and earned a district championship in 2010. In 2009, Darty served on Green's staff, helping to bring the program its first conference championship since 1997.

He also maintained the role of head coach and club administrator at Orlando Volleyball Academy (2008-12). At OVA his teams had multiple Top 10 finishes at AAU Nationals, most notably a second-place finish in 2011.

Green was named Seminole Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2009 and 2010 and the 2010 Male Coach of the Year while at Orlando Volleyball Academy.

An Orlando native, Green graduated from Florida State in 2008 with a B.S. in Recreation and Leisure Services Administration. He is married to Sloane Green and the couple has two dogs, Archie and Fletcher.

Unroe was the defensive coordinator at High Point University. While on staff, the team earned its first ever at large bid to the NCAA tournament for any sport in school history. The team went undefeated in Big South Conference play.

Prior to her stint at HPU, Unroe served as an assistant coach at George Mason University. During her two seasons in Fairfax, Va., she served as the defensive coordinator and passing coach. Under her tutelage, the Patriots led the Atlantic-10 in digs for the first time since the school joined the conference. The Newell-Grissom Building, with a colorful and varied history as a campus landmark that spans seven decades, is in its 22nd year as the home for Mississippi State's Volleyball Bulldogs in 2018. The spacious facility has served as the Bulldogs' on-campus volleyball home since 1997. Mississippi State played Georgia (October 3, 1997) in the first volleyball match at the Newell-Grissom Building. Now, 22 years later, first-year head coach Julie Darty will lead the Bulldogs in a total of 13 home matches, which also includes hosting the StarkVegas Classic to start the season.

Including nearly 600 maroon chair back seats installed in the arena's east stands prior to the start of the 2006 campaign, the volleyball-exclusive facility, featuring 12,000 square feet of hardwood flooring, has arena seating for more than 2,000.

Fifteen of the 20 most-attended volleyball events at the Newell-Grissom Building have occurred in the last five years. MSU eclipsed the 1,000-mark in attendance twice in 2011, including a facility-record 3,021 that packed the arena August 26 for a season-opening match against Southern Illinois. MSU and Florida were the only SEC teams to eclipse the 3,000-attendance mark in a regular season match in 2011. The Bulldogs also brought in a crowd of 4,525 in a 3-0 victory against No. 25 Kentucky in an Oct. 14 matchup at Humphrey Coliseum, setting the state of Mississippi's attendance record for a volleyball match.

In 2013, the Bulldogs posted four of the top 10 attendance figures. MSU had the second-highest attendance in program history as well in 2013, when 1,633 packed State's home venue in an ESPN broadcast against in-state rival Ole Miss. Last season, MSU posted

three attendance showings in The Griss' top 15.

Located adjacent to State's football stadium, Davis Wade Stadium, the Newell-Grissom Building has undergone a myriad of significant transformations since its arrival on the MSU scene in the early 1950s. Since 2004, the facility has seen the addition of an air conditioning system, chair back seating and a new sound system. The locker rooms and team areas have undergone renovations, a concession facility has been added to service the needs of a growing fan base, and a new sound system and scoreboard have been installed to enhance the game experience.

In 2012, The Griss saw the installation of a new lighting system that improves the illumination of volleyball-exclusive markings on a resurfaced court and colorful decorative interior and exterior banners that have been installed to give the facility an added Mississippi State flavor.

Prior to the 2016 season, The Griss received a number of upgrades, including one of the few gray courts, as the Newell-Grissom floor was stripped and resurfaced. To kick off the Darty era, significant renovations were done to Newell-Grissom with the addition of a high-definition Daktronics video board, as well as DVSPORT replay capabilities. Other upgrades included new graphics inside the facility, which brings a whole new feeling to the arena: new window banners on all windows, "StarkVegas" wall wraps in the main lobby, both ends of the court and locker room hallways.

The hospitality room is now called the FAMILY ROOM, which includes Hail State dimensional lettering and door wraps that will be used for pregame meals and other activities for the players. There has been an addition

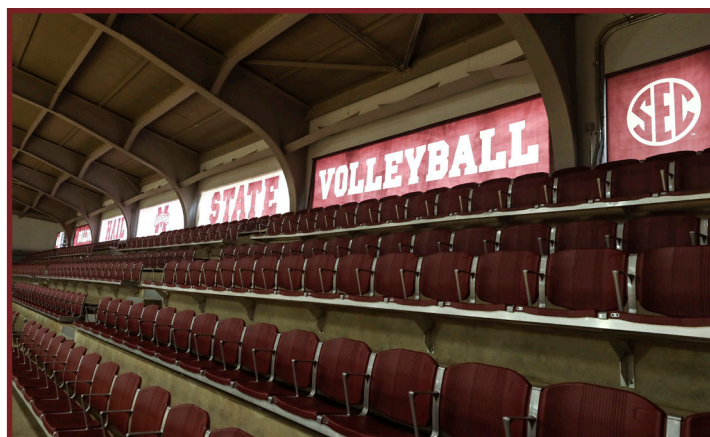
of an officials' locker room with ample room for officials.

As its early nickname, "the cow barn," indicates that the Newell-Grissom Building was designed primarily as a facility for rodeos, livestock shows and equestrian competitions. It eventually developed into the campus and regional center for concerts and other entertainment events, and the building's size and central location on campus also made it a natural for graduation ceremonies, class registration operations and other university functions.

In 1978, the arena was formally named in honor of two long-time leaders in MSU's animal science department, Paul F. Newell (1910) and E.E. Grissom (1932). The structure went largely unused in the 1980s and early 1990s, and it gradually fell into disrepair.

Faced with an expensive "tear-it-down-or-fix-it-up" proposition, the university, partnered with the MSU Department of Athletics, embarked in early 1995 on a million-dollar renovation project. That initial project included reroofing, the installation of a hardwood floor and a lighting system, the construction of locker rooms and team meeting areas, and the addition of public restroom facilities. The renovated Newell-Grissom Building initially served as an auxiliary practice site for volleyball and both the men's and women's basketball teams at Mississippi State in 1996 while Humphrey Coliseum served as the primary on-campus competition site for all three teams.

The Newell-Grissom Building is the third on-campus home in 42 full seasons of intercollegiate volleyball at Mississippi State University. MSU's first volleyball teams competed in McCarthy Gymnasium prior to moving to Humphrey Coliseum in the 1970s.

### THE UNIVERSITY

Mississippi State is a comprehensive doctoral-degree-granting institution offering a diverse student body a wide range of opportunities and challenges for learning and growth.

The largest university in the Magnolia State, MSU has a statewide enrollment of more than 21,000 students, and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to award baccalaureate, masters, specialists and doctorate degrees.

Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research and service.

The University began as The Agricultural and Mechanical College of the State of Mississippi, one of the national Land-Grant Colleges established after Congress had passed the Morrill Act in 1862. It was created by the Mississippi Legislature on February 28, 1878, to fulfill the mission of offering training in "agriculture, horticulture and the mechanical arts . . . without excluding other scientific and classical studies, including military tactics."

The College received its first students in the fall of 1880 in the presidency of Confederate General Stephen D. Lee. In 1887 Congress passed the Hatch Act, which provided for the establishment of the Agricultural Experiment Station in 1888. Two other pieces of federal legislation provided funds for extending the mission of the College: in 1914, the Smith-Lever Act called for "instruction in practical agriculture and home economics to persons not attendant or resident," thus creating the state-wide effort which led to Extension offices in every county in the State; and, in 1917, the Smith-Hughes Act provided for the training of teachers in vocational education.

By 1932, when the Legislature renamed the College as Mississippi State College, it consisted of the Agricultural Experiment Station (1887), the College of Engineering (1902), the College of Agriculture (1903), the School of Industrial Pedagogy (1909), the School of General Science (1911), the College of Business and Industry (1915), the Mississippi Agricultural Extension Service (1915), and the Division of Continuing Education, (1919). Further, in 1926 the College had received its first accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

By 1958, when the Legislature again renamed the College, as Mississippi State University, the Office of Graduate Studies had been organized (1936), doctoral degree programs had begun (1951), the School of Forest Resources had been established (1954), and the College of Arts and Sciences had been created (1956).

The College of Architecture admitted its first students in 1973. The College of Veterinary Medicine admitted its first class in 1977, and the School of Accountancy was established in 1979.

### ACADEMICS AND STUDENT LIFE



Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as one of 38 Truman Honor Institution.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options.

The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day One Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and juniors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study abroad opportunities.



## THIS IS MSU | TRADITIONS

### THE BULLDOG

Mississippi State University's athletic teams are called Bulldogs, a name earned and maintained over the decades by the tough, tenacious play of student-athletes wearing the Maroon and White. The official school mascot is an American Kennel Club registered English Bulldog, given the inherited title of 'Bully.'

As with most universities, Mississippi State University teams answered to different nicknames through the years. The first squads representing Mississippi A&M College were proud to be called Aggies. When the school officially became Mississippi State College in 1932, the nickname Maroons, for MSU's uniform color, gained prominence. Bulldogs became the official title for State teams in 1961, not long after State College was granted university status.

Yet references to school teams and athletes as Bulldogs actually go back to early in the century, and this nickname was used almost interchangeably with both Aggies and Maroons, since at least 1905.

On November 30 of that year, the A&M football team shut out their arch-rivals from the University of Mississippi 11-0 in Jackson, Miss. The campus newspaper, *The Reflector*, reported: "After the game, filled with that emotion that accompanies every great victory, there was nothing left for the cadets to do but to complete the great victory by showing sympathy for the dead athletic spirit of the University, by having a military funeral parade."

"A coffin was secured, decorated with University colors and a bulldog pup placed on top. It was then placed on the shoulders of a dozen cadets, and the procession started down Capitol Street, preceded by the brass band playing a very pathetic funeral march."

Other newspaper reports of the victory commented on the 'bulldog' style of play by the A&M eleven, and the Bulldog was soon publicly accepted as a school athletic symbol. Accounts of a 1926 pep rally in Meridian, Miss., had another bulldog parading with students.

Use as an official game mascot began in 1935 when coach Major Ralph Sasse, on 'orders' from his team, went to Memphis, Tenn., to select a bulldog. Ptolemy, a gift of the Edgar Webster family, was chosen and the Bulldogs promptly defeated Alabama 20-7.

A litter-mate of Ptolemy became the first mascot called 'Bully' shortly after Sasse's team beat mighty Army 13-7 at West Point that same year - perhaps the greatest victory in MSU football history. But Bully I earned other fame the hard way, in 1939 when a campus bus cut short his career.

Days of campus mourning followed, as Bully lay in state in a glass coffin. A half-mile funeral procession accompanied by the the Famous Maroon Band and three ROTC battalions went to Scott Field where Bully was buried under the bench at the 50-yard line. Even *Life* magazine covered the event. Other Bullies have since been buried by campus dorms, fraternity houses, and also at the football stadium.

For years Bully was a target for kidnappers, the last incident occurring prior to the 1974 State-Ole Miss game. The Bulldog team won anyway, 31-13. While early Bullies once roamed campus freely or lived in fraternities, today the official university mascot is housed at the School of Veterinary Medicine when not on duty at State home football games. For all their fierce appearance and reputation, today's mascot bulldogs are good-natured, friendly animals and favorites with children.

A student wearing a Bulldog suit, also answering to Bully, is part of the MSU cheerleading team and assists in stirring up State spirit at games and pep rallies.

### THE COWBELL

The most unique and certainly the most resounding symbol of Mississippi State University tradition is the cowbell. Despite decades of attempts by opponents and authorities to banish it from scenes of competition, diehard State fans still celebrate Bulldog victories loudly and proudly with the distinctive sound of ringing cowbells.

The precise origin of the cowbell as a fixture of Mississippi State sports tradition remains unclear to this day. The best records have cowbells gradually introduced to the MSU sports scene in the late 1930s and early 1940s, coinciding with the 'golden age' of Mississippi State football success prior to World War II.



The most popular legend is that during a home football game between State and archrival Ole Miss, a jersey cow wandered onto the playing field. Mississippi State soundly whipped the Rebels that Saturday, and State College students immediately adopted the cow as a good luck charm.

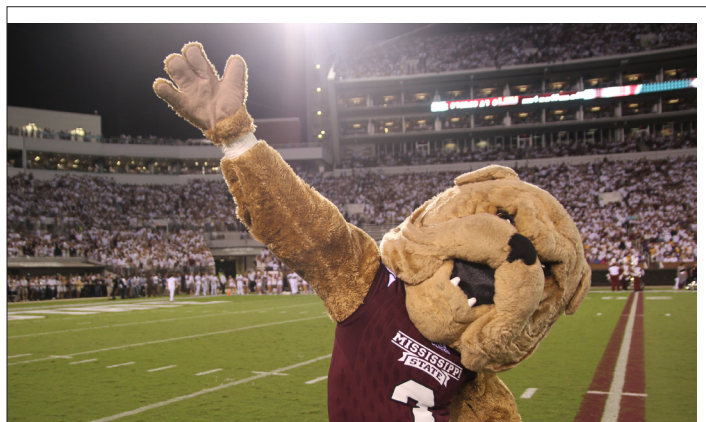
Students are said to have continued bringing a cow to football games for a while, until the practice was eventually discontinued in favor of bringing just the cow's bell.

Whatever the origin, it is certain by the 1950s cowbells were common at MSU games, and by the 1960s were established as the special symbol of MSU. Ironically, the cowbell's popularity grew most rapidly during the long years when State football teams were rarely successful. Flaunting this anachronism from the 'aggie' days was a proud response by students and alumni to outsider scorn of the university's 'cow college' history.

In the 1960s two MSU professors, Earl W. Terrell and Ralph L. Reeves, obliged some students by welding handles on the bells so they could be rung with more convenience and authority. By 1963 the demand for these long-handled cowbells could not be filled by home workshops alone. So, at the suggestion of Reeves, the Student Association bought bells in bulk and the Industrial Education Club agreed to weld on handles. In 1964, the MSU Bookstore began marketing these cowbells with a portion of profits returning to these student organizations.

Today many styles of cowbells are available on campus and around Starkville, with the top-of-the-line being a heavy chrome-plated model with a full Bulldog figurine handle. But experts insist the best and loudest results are produced by a classic long-handled, bicycle-grip bell made of thinner and tightly-welded shells.

Cowbells decorate offices and homes of Mississippi State alumni, and are passed down through generations of Bulldog fans. But they are not heard at Southeastern Conference games -- not legally, at least - since the 1974 adoption of a conference rule against 'artificial noisemakers' at football and basketball games. On a 9-1 vote, SEC schools ruled cowbells a disruption and banned them.



This has done little harm to the cowbell's popularity, however, or to prevent cowbells from being heard outside stadiums in which the Bulldogs are playing. They can still be heard at non-conference football contests, as well as other sporting events on campus. And bold Bulldog fans still risk confiscation for the privilege of keeping a unique Mississippi State tradition alive and ringing at SEC affairs.

### MAROON & WHITE

Maroon and White are the distinctive colors of Mississippi State University athletic teams, dating back over a century to the very first football game ever played by the school's student-athletes.

On November 15, 1895, the first Mississippi A&M football team was preparing for a road trip to Jackson, Tenn., to play Southern Baptist University (now called Union University) the following day. Since every college was supposed to have its own uniform colors, the A&M student body requested that the school's team select a suitable combination.

Considering this choice to be an honor, the inaugural State team gave the privilege to team captain W.M. Matthews. Accounts report that without hesitation Matthews chose Maroon and White.

In the 112 years since, every Mississippi State athlete has donned the Maroon and White in some sort of combination. Often a shade of gray has been added to the scheme, such as for the numerals. Briefly in the 1980s, the men's and women's basketball teams wore all-gray uniforms with maroon and white trim, while football has at times sported silver game pants, and baseball will often wear all gray road outfits.

Only once has an MSU team appeared in any other color combination. In 1938, football coach Spike Nelson secretly had cardinal and gold uniforms made for State, a selection that did not sit well with the team or the college at the first game. Neither the uniforms nor Nelson were back for the next season.

# DR. MARK E. KEENUM

Mississippi State University | President

Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

Now in his 10th year of tenure, Dr. Keenum has guided Mississippi State to unprecedented heights. The university has experienced record enrollment growth to nearly 22,000 students, and a new all-time record is expected this fall when final enrollment numbers are announced. Mississippi State has awarded more than 4,000 degrees at all levels for seven straight years, and the university is ranked by SmartAsset as the state's Best Value College with graduates earning an impressive average starting salary of \$47,900 – the highest in the state. The Chronicle of Higher Education recently designated Mississippi State as a "Great College To Work For" after receiving top ratings from employees on workforce practices and policies.

The campus has expanded and improved on Dr. Keenum's watch. Mississippi State has completed or initiated capital improvements totaling more than \$1 billion since 2009. Chief among those projects has been The Mill at MSU – a \$40-million, state-of-the-art conference and meeting complex. The Old Main Academic Center, a new \$41-million classroom building and multi-level parking garage, opened in August 2017. A \$60-million project featuring two new residence halls and Nusz Hall, which houses the G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Center for America's Veterans, opened the previous fall. A \$10-million, fourth-floor expansion of Mitchell Memorial Library to house the Ulysses S. Grant Presidential Library and the Frank and Virginia Williams Collection of Lincolniana celebrated its official opening in November 2017. In March 2018, the university and its partner, Memphis-based EdR Collegiate Housing, broke ground on the innovative \$67-million College View development. The first-of-its-kind project for any Mississippi university combines student housing with a mix of retail, commercial, and restaurant space.

A \$55-million expansion and renovation of Dudy Noble Field/Polk-Dement Stadium – home to one of the most storied college baseball programs in America – is also nearing completion for the 2019 season. The first phase of the project added the largest video board in the nation to the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball." The second phase includes the Left Field Lofts and Rooftop Club that will provide fans with unforgettable game day memories. This major investment will significantly enhance the Dudy Noble fan experience – already described by many as one of the most unique in college sports today.

New construction projects launching over the next two years include a new Science and Engineering Complex, Music Building, and the completion of an Animal and Dairy Science/Poultry Science Complex for the Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine. Additionally, the university is developing a comprehensive plan to build additional teaching and research lab space to meet growing demand, and investing in campus infrastructure, including new parking facilities, roadways, and technology.

Fundraising has reached all-time record levels in recent years. MSU's current Infinite Impact capital campaign reached its initial goal three years ahead of schedule. Due to that unprecedented success, the university announced a new goal – \$1 billion by 2020 – the largest campaign goal ever for an educational institution in Mississippi. During his tenure, Dr. Keenum has been instrumental in expanding the MSU Promise Program, which provides need-based scholarship assistance to Mississippi students whose families have limited financial means.

Dr. Keenum is immediate past president of the Southeastern Conference. During his two-year term, he led the SEC Executive Committee, and he continues to serve on the SEC's Content Committee Board of Directors that oversees the highly successful ESPN-SEC Network. He also represents the SEC as a member of the College Football Playoff's (CFP) Board of Managers.

In 2018, he was elected to serve a six-year term on the Board of Trustees of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History, which is the second-oldest state department of archives and history in the country. A comprehensive historical agency founded in 1902, MDAH collects, preserves, and provides access to the archival resources of the state; administers museums and historic sites, including the new Museum of Mississippi History and the Mississippi Civil Rights Museum; and oversees statewide programs for historic preservation, government records management, and publications.

Dr. Keenum travels frequently to Washington, D.C., meeting with Congressional leaders and federal agency heads to pursue research opportunities and broaden the university's influence on the national level. He has also worked closely with state leaders in Jackson in support of higher education in Mississippi.

Mississippi State plays an integral role in economic development locally, statewide, and across the region. Its impact is further felt nationally and internationally through

unique collaborative partnerships with peer institutions, business and industry, government agencies, and leading non-governmental organizations. Dr. Keenum leads these efforts because he understands the positive impact the nation's major research universities can have in the diverse communities they serve. Mississippi State is ranked by the National Science Foundation as a "Top 100" research institution, and its annual research and development expenditures have exceeded \$239 million. Most recently, MSU R&D expenditures accounted for more than half of all expenditures in the state. This research activity is playing an ever-increasing role in the state's overall economic development efforts.

A graduate of Mississippi State with degrees in agricultural economics, Dr. Keenum's interest in international food security has strengthened the university's contributions to global economic sustainability. In 2014, he was appointed to the Board of Directors of the Foundation for Food and Agricultural Research by U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Thomas J. Vilsack and now serves as chairman. That same year along with other university presidents, he signed the Presidents' Commitment to Food and Nutrition Security at the United Nations in New York City. This marks the first time universities around the world began to share a collective focus on ending food insecurity.

Dr. Keenum's passion for international engagement and transformative research and service has positioned Mississippi State as a leader in addressing global food security and poverty, among other critical issues. In 2014 and again in 2016, he was invited to address the United Nations in New York about the crucial roles public research universities play as the global community works to address critical challenges for a growing population.

In 2018, President Donald J. Trump appointed Dr. Keenum chairman of the Board for International Food and Agricultural Development (BIFAD). BIFAD was created in 1975 under Title XII (Famine Prevention and Freedom from Hunger) of the Foreign Assistance Act. Its mission is to draw on higher education's scientific knowledge and expertise in global food security and world hunger to advise U.S. international assistance efforts.

Dr. Keenum began his career at MSU as a faculty member with the Extension Service and the Department of Agricultural Economics. He went on to serve as chief of staff to U.S. Senator Thad Cochran in Washington, D.C. and was Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture prior to returning home to Mississippi State.

A graduate of Corinth High School, Dr. Keenum earned an Associate in Arts degree from Northeast Mississippi Community College in Booneville and was a member of the Northeast Tigers football team. He is married to the former Rhonda Newman of Booneville, also an MSU graduate. They have four children: Rett, Mary Phillips, Katie and Torie

# JOHN COHEN

Mississippi State University | Director of Athletics

When John Cohen was named Mississippi State University's 17th director of athletics on November 4, 2016, he wasted little time putting his stamp on the department. Since that time, the former MSU head baseball coach and two-time Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year has overseen the hiring of seven coaches, while 21 teams have advanced to postseason.

During Cohen's short tenure as director of athletics, the athletic department has enjoyed historic success. A record 12 MSU teams advanced to the postseason during the 2017-18 campaign, with seven sports concluding play in the Top 25 and four reaching the Top 10. Under Cohen's watch, State was the only school in the nation who won a bowl game and reached an NCAA Final Four – men's or women's – and the College World Series.

MSU claimed multiple SEC championships in a single athletic year for the first time since 1996. Matt Roberts, the SEC Coach of the Year, guided the men's tennis team to its first SEC Tournament championship since 1996. Vic Schaefer, the 2018 National Coach of the Year, led the women's basketball program to its first SEC regular season title with a perfect 30-0 regular season and a second-straight NCAA national championship game appearance.

Baseball completed one of the most remarkable turnarounds in SEC history, reaching its 10th College World Series and finishing third nationally. The Diamond Dawgs were ranked as high as No. 4 nationally in the final polls, representing the third-highest finish in program history. Meanwhile, the men's track and field program tallied its highest NCAA Outdoor Championships point total since 1982 to claim 10th.

As a result of the Bulldogs' unprecedented athletic success, CBS Sports named MSU the 14th-best athletics program in the country and fourth overall in the SEC for 2017-18. MSU also placed 42nd among the nation's Division I schools in the final Learfield Director's Cup standings, eclipsing the department's previous best of 44th in 2015-16. The top three Director's Cup finishes in school history have occurred in the last three years.

Success carried into the classroom as Bulldog student-athletes generated a school-record 3.08 cumulative GPA for the combined 2017-18 fall and spring semesters. After already producing a school-record fall GPA of 3.15, MSU student-athletes followed that up with a spring GPA of 3.01, the highest spring GPA on record.

"It was a memorable year to be a Bulldog," Cohen said. "I am very proud of our teams, coaches and student-athletes for their collective efforts in setting the highest of standards not only in their sports but also in the classroom and community."

Since becoming Athletic Director, Cohen has been the driving force for numerous state-of-the-art facility projects on campus, including the new \$55 million Dudy Noble Field, which opens in full capacity in the spring of 2019. The project has drawn rave reviews and will feature the Left Field Lofts, a revolutionary college baseball experience with luxury two-bedroom suites offering exquisite views of the new ballpark.

Cohen approved construction of a new \$3.6 million football gameday home locker room and recruiting center inside the north end of Davis Wade Stadium. The 11,100 square-foot locker room, which opens in September 2018, includes custom-built player lockers, separate coaches and staff locker rooms, an expansive athletic training room as well as an equipment room.

In addition, the Templeton Athletic Academic Center underwent a renovation in the summer of 2018 with modern wall graphics and displays.

Cohen has been instrumental in enhancing the gameday experience for Bulldog fans. In the summer of 2018, MSU announced significant price decreases on all food and beverage at concessions for all home venues beginning with the 2018-19 athletic year. State also unveiled a football season ticket price reduction in several sections of Davis Wade Stadium. New LED videoboard displays were installed at the MSU Soccer Field and Newell-Grissom Building in the spring of 2018.

Cohen, who spent more than two decades coaching college baseball, was named MSU's head baseball coach in July of 2008. Nine years later, Cohen's

official role in administration began when he assumed the role of associate athletic director in addition to head baseball coach. The following November, he took charge of an athletic department that has since achieved new heights in athletic, academic, facility, and fundraising achievement.

Success shouldn't come as a surprise as it was never far removed from him during his 12-year run as a head coach in the SEC. His teams have been successful both on the field and in the classroom.

At MSU, he led the Bulldogs to a College World Series finals appearance, an SEC regular season championship and an SEC Tournament championship. In the classroom upon his arrival in 2009, 133 players were selected to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, including three straight SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year winners from 2013-15.

"I'm fortunate to know our MSU coaches as friends and colleagues, and to know many of our athletes in all sports," Cohen said. "While baseball has been a huge part of my life, my passion for seeing MSU athletics thrive extends to all sports. I'm grateful to Dr. Keenum and the MSU Family for allowing me to embrace these new opportunities and responsibilities."

As a baseball player at MSU, Cohen was a key player on the Bulldogs' 1989 SEC championship team and 1990 College World Series team. He graduated from MSU with a degree in English in 1990 and received a master's degree in sports management from the University of Missouri in 1994.

Following a six-year stint with Missouri as a graduate assistant and assistant coach, Cohen was the head coach at Northwestern State University from 1998-2001. Cohen spent two seasons as an assistant baseball coach at the University of Florida before becoming the head coach at the University of Kentucky in 2004, a position he held for five seasons before returning to his alma mater.

While winning 284 games as a head coach at MSU, Cohen demonstrated a keen ability to develop players and coaches. During his tenure, 138 MSU baseball players were selected in the Major League Baseball Draft. Nine of his former Bulldogs have reached the Major Leagues, including Dakota Hudson (Cardinals) in July 2018. His influence can be seen throughout the SEC as four of his former assistants are now or have been head coaches — Brad Bohannon (Alabama), Gary Henderson (Kentucky/Mississippi State), Nick Mingione (Kentucky) and Butch Thompson (Auburn).

Cohen is the only coach in SEC history to win an SEC championship, SEC tournament championship, and advance to the College World Series both as a player and head coach. His 2013 Bulldog club advanced to the CWS championship series for the first time in MSU history. Cohen also had the privilege of being a part of a College World Series as a player, head coach and now athletic director when the Diamond Dawgs reached Omaha in June 2018. His 2012 club produced an SEC record-tying eight Major Leaguers.

Cohen and his wife, Nelle, are active members of the Starkville community. The couple has two children, Jordan and Avery.
