2013 BULLDOG SOCCER



Home to the Mississippi State women's soccer team since the program's berth in 1995, the Mississippi State Soccer Field has evolved into one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast.

Located on the north side of the Mississippi State University campus, the facility features a 500-seat grandstand with room for future expansion.

Over the past three seasons, additions and renovations to the pitch have turned the MSU Soccer Field into a premier soccer facility. The 2010 season saw the debut of a state-of-the-art, sand-based playing surface that includes new irrigation and sub-surface drainage systems.





Prior to the 2009 season the facility received a new LED-based scoreboard display and 15'x10' video board. A year earlier, the program opened a 2,600 square-foot brick facility that houses a concession stand, men's and women's restrooms and spacious press box.

The MSU Soccer Field also includes covered dugouts for participating teams, and lights were added to the facility at the conclusion of the 2002 season.

Dedicated on November 1, 2008, the Templeton Athletic Academic Center is a welcome addition to the Bulldog athletic program. The \$10 million facility is named for former MSU Director of Athletics Larry Templeton.



The 34,000 square-foot building serves the entire athletic department, houses the Athletic Academics offices and staff, and includes individual computer rooms, tutor work areas, a large open study area and a 300-seat dining facility with a fully-functioning kitchen.

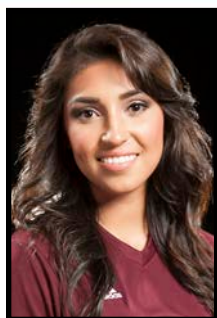

When Mississippi State Director of Athletics Scott Stricklin was searching for the fourth head coach in Mississippi State soccer history, one name that repeatedly came up in his search was Aaron Gordon.

Hailed by many as one of the top up-and-coming coaches in the nation, Gordon was tabbed to take the reigns of the Bulldog soccer program on Nov. 27, 2012.

Gordon, 43, brings experience at nearly every level of soccer, having coached at the collegiate, club and professional levels during his career.

Gordon makes the move to Starkville

following six seasons on the staff at Texas Tech University, where he was named associate head coach of the Red Raiders on Feb. 15, 2012, after five seasons as an assistant at the school.

His time in Lubbock helped prepare him for his first college head coaching opportunity, as he oversaw all areas of the program, including recruiting, scouting, team training and video match analysis.

During his six-year tenure as a member of head coach Tom Stone's staff, the Red Raiders became a regular fixture around the top of the Big 12 Conference table.



The 2012 season, his final at Texas Tech, was a record-setting one for the Red Raiders. The team won a school-record 16 games, advanced to the semi-finals of the Big 12 Tournament for the first time, and made its first trip to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the second round.

The 2012 Red Raiders tallied 130 points behind 46 goals and 38 assists, and defensively registered an 0.97 goals-against average while posting 10 shut-outs.

Texas Tech's 16-win campaign was the school's third-straight double-digit win

season, another first for the program. During his time in Lubbock, Gordon helped the Red Raiders to more overall (60) and conference (23) wins than the previous nine years combined, and a spot in the Big 12 Tournament all six seasons.

He helped mentor seven players to Big 12 All-Freshman honors, including the Big 12 Freshman of the Year two of the past three seasons, and five to first team All-Big 12 accolades. During his tenure, he also helped mentor a pair of players that were selected to United States youth national teams.

Gordon stayed in the state of Texas following a three-year stint with his hometown FC Dallas of Major League Soccer. With the team, he served as the director of coaching for the second-largest youth club program in North Texas.

Gordon moved back to the Lone Star State following a tenure as the top assistant for the Atlanta Beat of the WUSA. While there, he coordinated the daily training schedule and served as head of scouting and video analysis among other duties.

He joined the Beat following a stint as director of coaching for Dallas Inter Soccer Club, where he oversaw a program that won numerous state and regional championships. In addition to his duties at Dallas Inter, Gordon also served as head

Ashley Gordon, who has enjoyed tremendous success as both a coach and player, joins the Mississippi State soccer program working alongside her husband, head coach Aaron Gordon.

The Gordons will work to build a championship program at Mississippi State after helping make Texas Tech a contender in the Big 12 Conference the past six seasons. Their hard work in Lubbock culminated in 2012 with the Red Raiders winning a school-record 16 games and ending the season with a No. 25 national ranking by the NSCAA, the program's first national ranking.

Tech's historic season included a trip to the semifinals of the Big 12 Tournament and a second-round appearance in the program's first NCAA Tournament.

The 16-win season was a third-straight campaign with double-digit wins for the program, a first for the Red Raiders. As a member of Tom Stone's staff, she helped the Red Raiders to the conference tournament each season, and more overall (60) and conference (23) victories than the previous nine years combined.

In addition to recruiting and operations duties, Gordon primarily worked with TTU's forward and midfielders, leading the squad to 130 points behind 46 goals and 38 assists last season.

During her time at Texas Tech, Gordon helped tutor six NSCAA All-Central Region

selections and the program's first NSCAA All-American in freshman Janine Beckie. Beckie, who scored the program's most goals since 1996, earned TTU's second Big 12 Rookie of the Year in three seasons while also garnering Top Drawer Soccer Freshman Team of the Year accolades. Gordon helped mentor five All-Big 12 First Team selections and seven Big 12 All-Freshman honorees.

While at Tech, Gordon continued an outstanding coaching career in the Olympic Development Program ranks. Since 2001, she has served as a Region III staff coach, and from 2008-2011 she was an NTSSA West Texas ODP coach.

Gordon was named the Region III '94 Team assistant coach in 2011 after serving as assistant coach for the '89 squad in 2004. This summer she was tabbed the assistant coach of the ODP Region III '96 team, and she will coach the squad over the Thanksgiving holiday at the ODP inter-regional tournament in Boca Raton, Fla.

Gordon joined her husband in Lubbock a year after she guided Richland College to the NJCAA Division III national championship. In addition to being named NJCAA Coach of the Tournament, she was also named the NSCAA Coach of the Year.

In addition to coaching Richland, she also served four years as a staff coach for FC Dallas (2003-07), where Aaron Gordon was the Director of Coaching.

It was the first of two stints with FC Dallas, as she also worked alongside her husband with the program from 1998-2001. As a staff coach with FC Dallas, she helped guide her squads to a number of state and regional championships.

Between stops with FC Dallas, Gordon worked with the Cobb Futbol Club in Atlanta as the girls' technical director from 2001-03. In her role with the club, she served as director of the Girls Academy Development Program.

A USSF "A" licensed coach, Gordon's success in the coaching ranks can be attributed to a successful playing career.

An all-state performer who won the 1990 state title at Duncanville High School, Gordon went on to a stellar career at Southern Methodist University. As a four-year starter for the Mustangs, she helped her team to three NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the Round of 16.

After earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology and a minor in history in 1994, she went on to play semi-pro soccer for the W-League's Dallas Lightning (1995-98) and the Texas Heat (1999). Mississippi State soccer coach Aaron Gordon completed his coaching staff with a club and college coaching veteran in Phil Casella.

The Bayside, N.Y., native spent 2011 and 2012 as head coach of the New York Fury in the Women's Premier Soccer League, the largest women's soccer league in the world.

As a head coach of the Fury, he took a squad consisting of professional players from Women's Professional Soccer and semi-professional leagues to the 2011 East Region semifinals as well as the East-Mid Atlantic Conference regular season title.

While coaching the Fury in the WPSL, Casella also coached the Albertson Fury Soccer Club.

Casella coached the Albertson Fury '91 from 2007-11, guiding the club to numerous championships, including three-straight Eastern New York State Cup titles from 2009-11. His 2010 edition finished the year ranked No. 4 in the nation.

Casella served as interim head coach of the '92 and '93 Elite Club National League squads. Under his guidance, the '93 Fury won the Eastern New York State Cup and went on to finish fifth in the prestigious ECNL national championship.

After taking the '92 Fury to the 2010 ECNL national "Flight B" runner-up, the 2011 squad advanced to the Region 1 semifinals before taking runner-up in the Eastern New York State Cup.

Casella's collegiate coaching career consists of assistant coaching stints at Fordham (2006-07) and his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson (2000-06).

In his lone season at Fordham, he helped lead the Rams to a 14-7 overall record and the finals of the Atlantic 10 Conference Tournament.

Casella was a part of Fairleigh Dickinson's move to NCAA Division I in the first of his six seasons at the school. In just the third season, the Knights posted a 7-2-1 Northeast Conference record and advanced to the semifinals of the league tournament.

A year after winning the 2003 ECAC championship, Casella helped guide the Knights to the NEC regular-season title with an unbeaten 6-0-3 record.

During his college coaching tenures, he also worked with the Eastern New York Youth Soccer Association's Olympic Development Program, assisting the U14 and U17 squads from 1999-2002.

He took the head coaching reigns of the U14 squad from 2003-05 before managing the U17 squad the 2005-06 campaigns.

Along with the different levels of coaching, Casella also brings different levels of playing experience. He played at Fairleigh Dickinson from 1992-95 before graduating with a degree in communication and advertising.

Casella continued his playing career in 1996 with the North Jersey Imperials of the United States Inter-regional Soccer League, the second division to Major League Soccer in the United States. He helped guide the Imperials to the semifinals of the Sizzling Six National Championship Tournament and the 1996 Northeast Division title.

Casella is a United States Soccer Federation nationally-licensed coach.

FOURTH SEASON

Robbie Kröger, a Johannesburg, South Africa, native, brings over 20 years of playing experience into his fourth season working with State's goalies and assisting with some of the program's summer camps.

In his first three seasons working with the Bulldog soccer program, he helped develop Skylar Rosson into one of the SEC's top goalies.

In 2010 Rosson posted 110 saves, fifth-most in MSU single-season history. A year later she posted a conference-best and NCAA ninth-most 131 saves while cutting her goals allowed tally nearly in half.

Under his guidance, Rosson stopped 337 career shots, second-most in MSU history, while setting a new Bulldog standard with 12 career blank sheets, including two against No. 20 Auburn and No. 11 Florida in 2011. Rosson's blank sheet against the Gators earned her Soccer America Team of the Week accolades as well as SEC Defensive Player of the Week.

Prior to focusing on his academic career, Kröger played on several provincial teams.

His first taste of elite soccer action came as a member of the U12 and U14 Eastern Transvaal

Provincial teams. A couple of years later he earned a place on the Southern Regional Schools U16 squad in his native Johannesburg.

During 1995 and 1996 he enjoyed a stint playing for VFL Michelstadt in the Hessen Regional Liga, Germany.

In 1996, Kröger also had the opportunity to play for Balfour Park in Johannesburg's U19 Premier Soccer League. Kröger earned Goalkeeper of the Club honors as he helped Balfour Park claim the Preseason Cup, Premier League title and the Premier Cup.

His play for Balfour Park helped earn him a professional trial with Wits University, a team in South Africa's Premier Soccer League.

Kröger's passion for goalkeeping stayed with him during his transition to the United States.

Upon his arrival in Starkville, he had the opportunity to train the goalkeepers for both Starkville Academy and Starkville High School. Kröger also provides private goalkeeper training for aspiring net-minders in the area.

Kröger takes pride in developing quality goalkeepers because he believes that they "hold the heart of the team on their sleeve, and that good training, awareness and ath-

letic skills translate to team confidence and positive playing mentality on the pitch."

When not on the soccer field instructing State's goalkeepers, Kröger is instructing students in the classroom as an Assistant Professor in Mississippi State's Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Aquaculture.

Kröger, born July 28, 1978, in Rio De Janeiro, Brazil, came to Starkville after earning a Ph.D in Biology from the University of Mississippi.

Prior to continuing his studies in the Magnolia State, Kröger attended the University of Witwatersrand in South Africa, obtaining Bachelor of Science degrees in Botany and Environmental Conservation Biology and a Master of Science in River and Wetland Ecology.

Kröger is married to the former Lisa Blair Sloan of Memphis, Tenn. The pair welcomed a son - Leo James Kröger - on Dec. 19, 2011, and recently added a second son to the family - Eli Thomas Kröger.

FIRST SEASON

This season will see former Bulldog midfielder Amy Hoover transition from the pitch to the coaching staff as a student assistant coach under Gordan.

In her role on the coaching staff, Hoover will be helping with the day-to-day organization of the program, including practice planning and video breakdown during road trips.

Hoover moves to the sideline following a sensational three-year career that saw her score six goals and assist on two more for 14 points.

The Brookhaven, Miss., native played in 39 career contests, starting 26 times and logging 2,007 minutes.

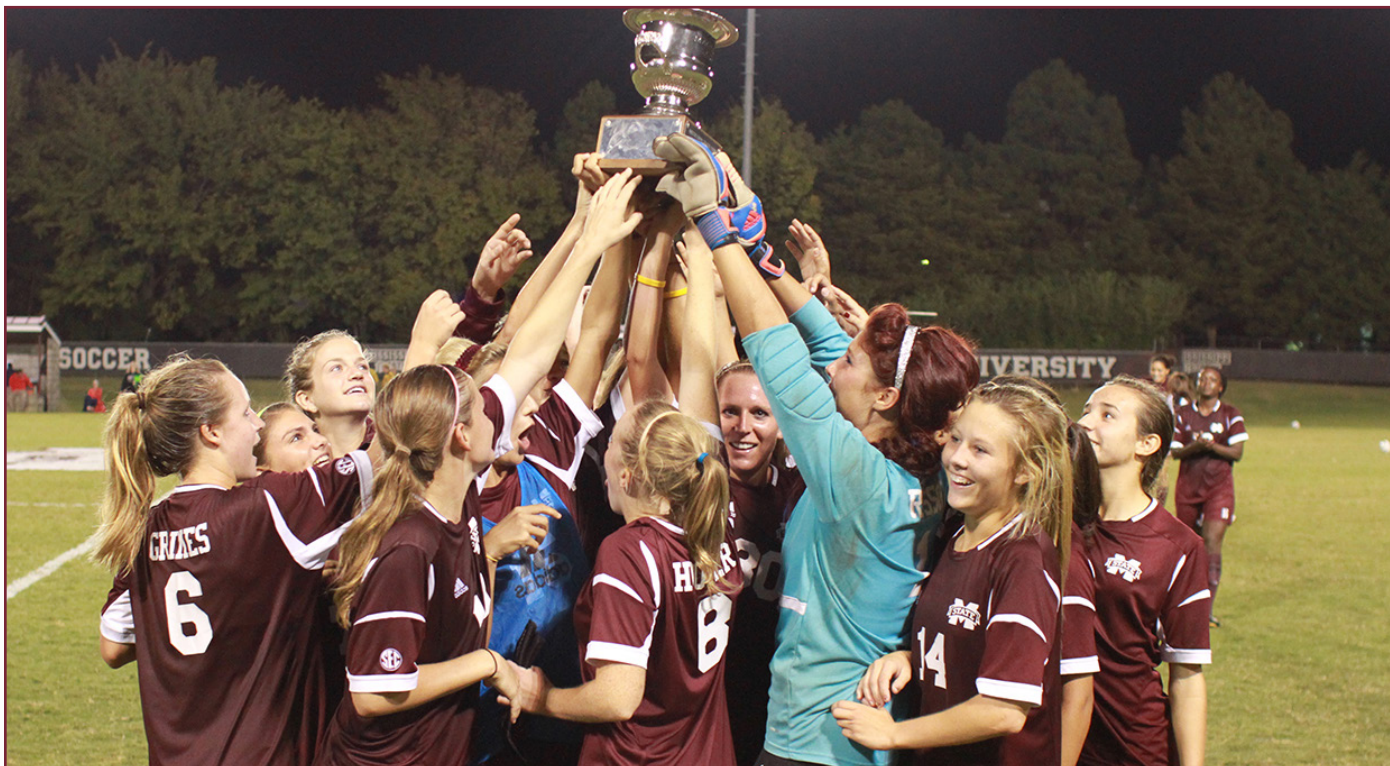

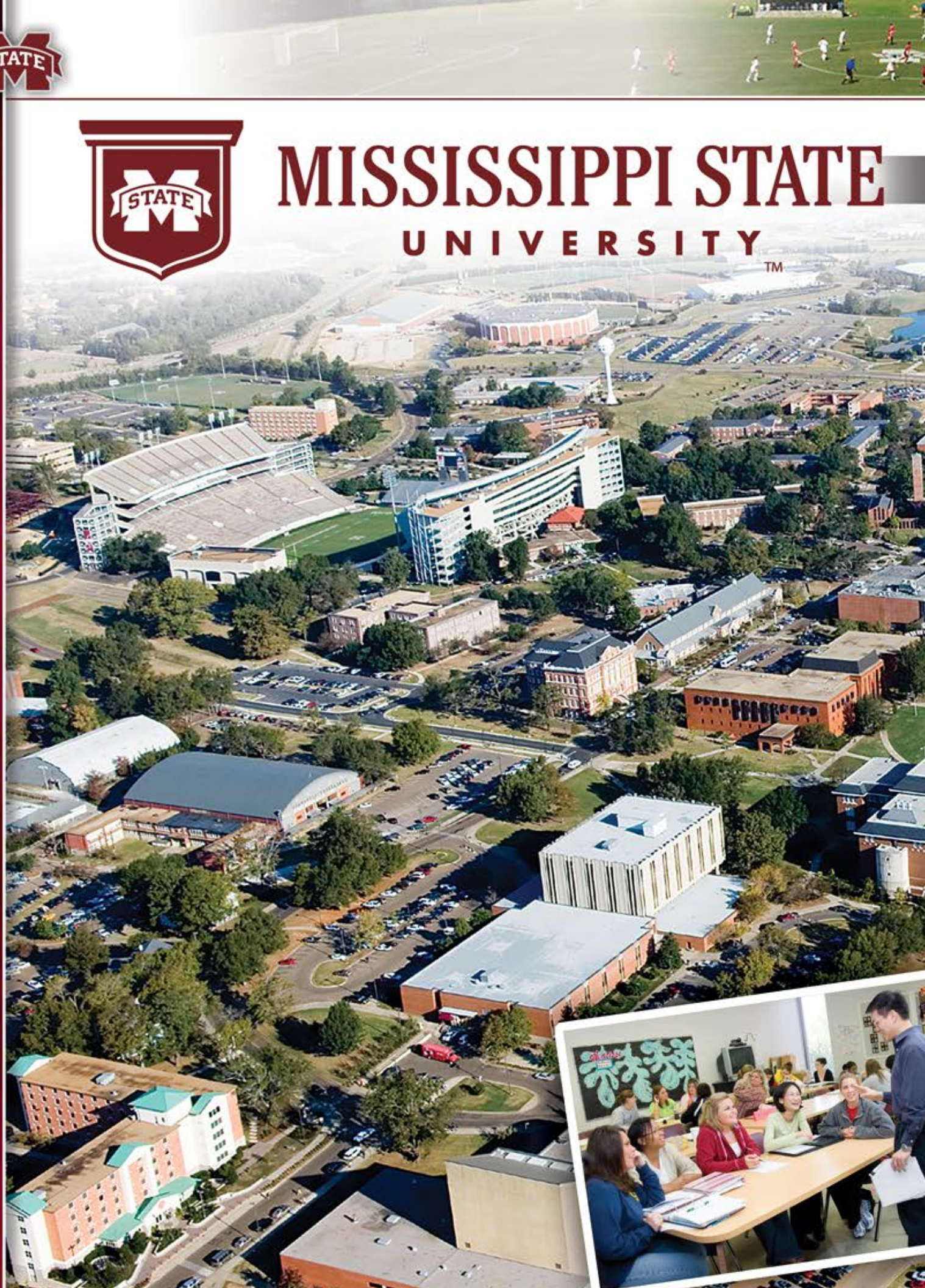

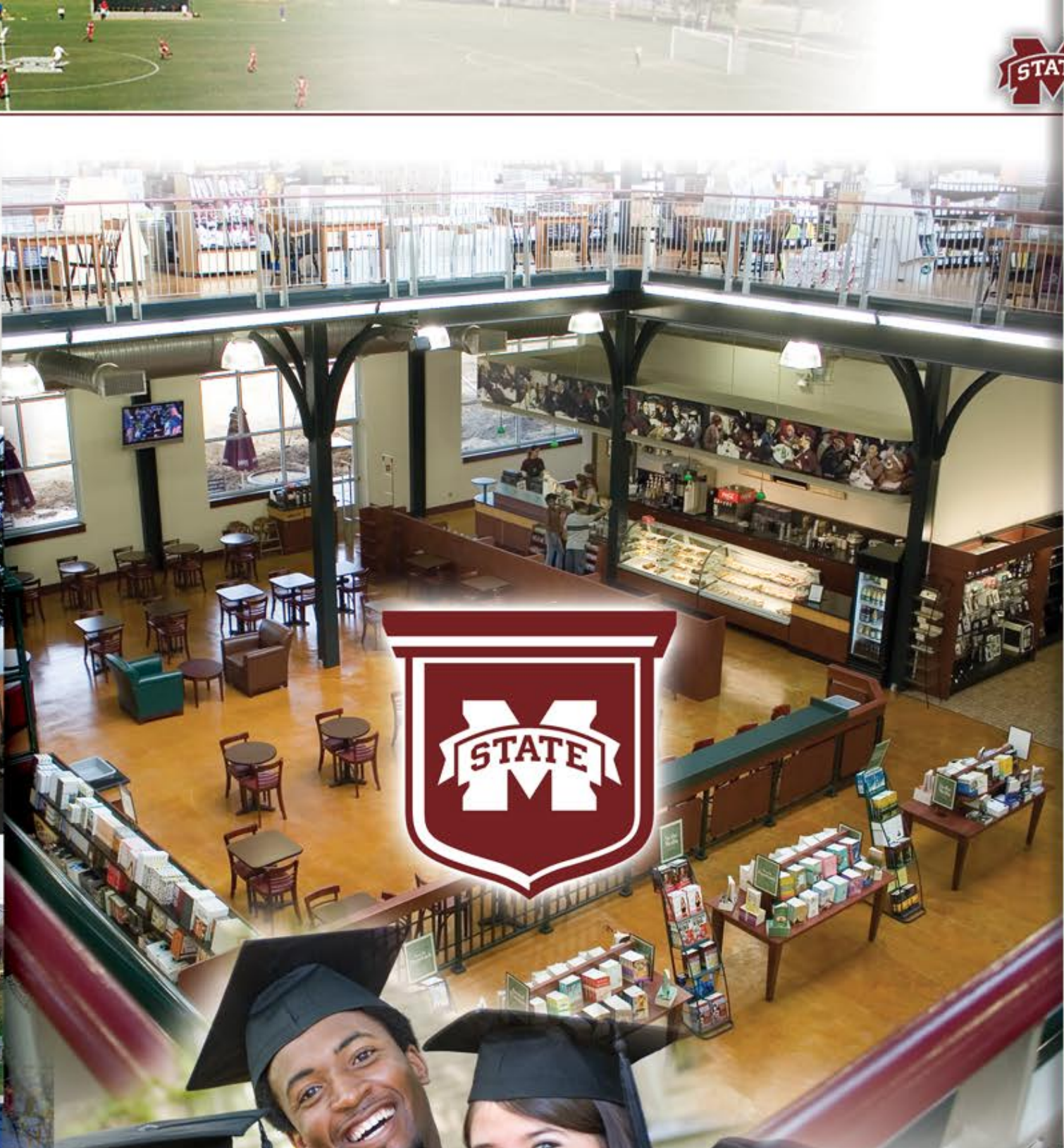

SCOTT STRICKLIN

Director of Athletics Mississippi State, 1992

Using more than two decades of intercollegiate experience in communications, development and marketing, Scott Stricklin has built a wave of momentum within the Mississippi State fan base over during his tenure as the director of athletics.

From his first day on the job as Mississippi State's Athletic Direc-

tor in May 2010, Stricklin, integrating the department's three foundations of focus on student-athletes, possessing great integrity and aggressively promoting Mississippi State University, has overseen a stretch in which the Bulldogs enjoyed both on and off the field successes unparalleled in more than a decade. During the 2012-13 year, Mississippi State athletics posted its highest-ever finish in the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup, placing 49th overall.

The Bulldog football team has advanced to bowl play each of the last three seasons. Record attendance, including a streak of more than 20-consecutive sellouts, has prompted a \$75 million renovation and expansion of Davis Wade Stadium. The football program has recently moved into the \$25 million Leo W. Seal, Jr. Football Complex.

Spring sports, including baseball, softball, men's and women's golf and track and field have each excelled and advanced to NCAA postseason play under Stricklin's guidance. In the 2012-13 academic year, 10 Mississippi State sports advanced to NCAA postseason play with six earning Top-25 rankings during the season.

Stricklin has overseen coaching changes in men's and women's basketball along with soccer and softball. Each coach possesses the passion and excitement along with intelligence and discipline required to lead Bulldog athletic programs.

In the classroom, Bulldog student-athletes continue to excel. In the fall of 2012, for the second time in three semesters, Mississippi State's men and women athletes established their best-combined grade point average with a 3.04 for the term. In the spring of 2013, women's sports posted an overall GPA of 3.25 and every female sports team earned a GPA over 3.0.

In 2013, Bulldog student-athletes again excelled in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, with all 16 sports far exceeding the minimum standard.

Stricklin has overseen record fundraising for Bulldog Athletics, which has produced new facilities such as the \$11.7 million Mize Pavilion at Humphrey Coliseum, a new \$25 million football practice and training complex as well as \$75 million in expansion and upgrades to Davis Wade Stadium. The Bulldog Club has solicited gifts totaling more than \$25 million for the football facility, including a record \$12 million gift from the Seal Family Foundation.

The Bulldog Club has initiated the most ambitious fundraising drive in the athletic department's history - an initiative called "Today, Tomorrow, Forever" - to generate funding for new construction and upgrades to existing facilities.

Supporters are responding at the turnstiles as well. In 2012, Mississippi State fans packed Davis Wade Stadium for every game, buying all available season tickets for the third-consecutive season and the third time in school history. Capacity crowds have become the norm as 23-consecutive home games have been sold out, and the school has created a waiting list that has topped 1,000 requests for season-ticket purchases.

Stricklin certainly wasn't a stranger to the Bulldog family or college ath-

letics when he took over the reins at State.

A 1992 graduate of Mississippi State, the Jackson, Miss., native's resume is highlighted by 23 years of experience on the collegiate level in various capacities at five different universities. In the two years prior to becoming athletic director, he served as Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs at his alma mater, overseeing fundraising, football and men's basketball scheduling, managing MSU's all-sport agreement with Adidas, facility planning and serving as the administrative sport liaison for men's basketball and softball.

It was those types of day-to-day tasks that prepared the personable Stricklin to take over the top seat in the Mississippi State athletic department.

Yet it's a journey that started during his formative days as a dedicated and tireless worker in the Mississippi State media relations department that's led to his highly-respected career coming full circle.

Prior to graduating, Stricklin's stint in the MSU media relations office included three seasons (1990-92) as the media contact for the nationally-renowned baseball program. Upon graduation, he was named Assistant Media Relations Director at his alma mater.

He continued his climb up the ladder of success when he was named Associate Media Relations Director at Auburn, where he served from 1993-98. In 1998, Stricklin left Auburn to become Assistant Athletics Director at Tulane, where he served as the primary media contact for the Green Wave's 1998 12-0 football team. Next came a four-year run in the Big 12 Conference at Baylor (1999-2003) as Assistant AD for Communications and Marketing.

In 2003, Stricklin returned to the Southeastern Conference at Kentucky and spent five seasons as the Associate AD for Media Relations, where he oversaw the day-to-day publicity of the tradition-rich Wildcat basketball program. It was his last stop before returning to Mississippi State in the spring of 2008.

Stricklin, 43, is married to the former Anne Howell, the youngest daughter of Basketball Hall of Fame member Bailey Howell. The couple has two daughters, Abby and Sophie.

DR. MARK KEENUM

University President Mississippi State, 1984

Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

Despite difficult economic times, Dr. Keenum has guided Mississippi State to new heights. His quick action to address budget shortfalls put

the university in position to meet those challenges and maintain the highest level of academic excellence. The university has experienced record enrollment growth, which includes students with the highest ACT average of any university in our state. Increased enrollment has also spurred new construction on campus, with two new residence halls completed and opened this August. The Mize Pavilion, a state-of-the-art basketball practice facility, was dedicated in 2011. The Leo W. Seal Jr. Football Complex was occupied in January 2013. Plans in the immediate future include construction of another new residence hall, a new classroom building, a new dining facility, and renovation of historic Lee Hall. The ongoing expansion and improvements at Davis Wade Stadium should be completed by August 2014.

Since 2009, fundraising has reached all-time record levels. Giving by alumni and friends has surpassed \$300 million over that period, including the highly successful StatePride initiative that is providing scholarships for students and support for MSU faculty.

Dr. Keenum has also been instrumental in expanding the MSU Promise Program, which provides need-based scholarship assistance to Mississippi students whose families have limited financial means. Through the Sonny Montgomery Center for America's Veterans, he has also led initiatives to make Mississippi State one of the most veteran-friendly universities in the nation.

Mississippi State has strengthened its role as the flagship research university in the state. The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching classified MSU as a university with "very high research activity," the only such designation in Mississippi. Dr. Keenum travels frequently to Washington, D.C., meeting with Congressional leaders and federal agency heads to pursue research opportunities and broaden the university's influence on the national level. He has also worked closely with the governor, lieutenant governor and Mississippi Legislature in support of higher education in our state.

Keenum recently was elected to a term on the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools' Commission on Colleges' Executive Council. SACS is the recognized regional accrediting body in the 11 U.S. Southern states (Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia) and in Latin America for those institutions of higher education that award associate, baccalaureate, master's or doctoral degrees.

He was also recently elected to a term on the American Public Land-Grant Universities Board of Directors. Based in Washington, D.C., the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities (APLU) is a research and advocacy organization of public research universities, land-grant institutions, and state university systems with member campuses in all 50 states, U.S. territories and the District of Columbia.

A graduate of Mississippi State University with degrees in agricul-

tural economics, Dr. Keenum began his career at MSU as a faculty member with the Extension Service and the Department of Agricultural Economics. He went on to serve as chief of staff to U.S. Senator Thad Cochran in Washington, DC and was Under Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture prior to returning home to Mississippi State.

He graduated from Corinth (MS) High School and earned an associate of arts degree from Northeast Mississippi Community College in Booneville and was a member of the Northeast Tigers football team.

Dr. Keenum is married to the former Rhonda Newman of Booneville, also an MSU graduate. They have four children: Rett, Mary Phillips, Katie and Torie.
