Who to Contact?

The Mississippi State Media Relations Department is here to serve the media throughout the 2016 Bulldog soccer season. Media members in need of assistance can contact Tyson Rodgers in the Media Relations office at (662) 325-6259 or by cell at (662) 418-2982.

MSU Player/Coach Availability

Players and coaches will be made available to the media upon request. Those wishing to set up an interview must contact Tyson Rodgers via phone or e-mail. On gameday, players and coaches are only available postgame.

For post-practice interviews, media members should contact Tyson Rodgers no later than 10 p.m. the night before. In most cases, players will be available for a brief time before and after practices which are scheduled during the morning hours of 8-10:30 each weekday.

Telephone interviews can also be scheduled with players on a call-back basis during the week with arrangements made through Tyson Rodgers.

Postgame Interviews

Requested MSU players, along with head coach Aaron Gordon, will be available for interviews approximately 10 minutes after all games near the midfield sideline opposite of the dugouts.

The Mississippi State locker room and field dugouts are off limits to the media.

Press Box Services

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following the end of the first half and at the conclusion of each game. Media members also have access to game notes, statistics, lineups and rosters prior to the start of each game upon request. A pregame meal is also served in the press box around 45 minutes prior to each game.

Photographers/Videographers

Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot around the MSU Soccer Field in approved areas. Those wishing to shoot a game must contact Tyson Rodgers the day before the game to be granted access.

Radio Broadcasts

The MSU Soccer Field press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Tyson Rodgers in the Media Relations office.

MISSISSIPPI STATE SOCCER FIELD

Home to the Mississippi State soccer team since 1995, the Mississippi State Soccer Field gives the Bulldogs one of the finest playing surfaces in the Southeast.

Located on the north side of the Mississippi State University campus, the MSU Soccer Field is situated in the heart of the University's impressive physical plant. It joins the Mike Sanders Track Compex, Dudy-Noble Field/Polk Dement Stadium (baseball), Nusz Park (softball) and the A.J. Pitts Tennis Centre to give Mississippi State one of the finest Olympic sport venues in collegiate athletics.

The facility features a main grandstand area which accommodates more than 500 people, while the grass hillsides that bookend the stands can seat up to 1,000 fans for any given contest. The atmosphere is enhanced with a 15'x10' LED-based video



board, which is situated behind the north goal.

The new scoreboard came a year after the program debuted a 2,600 square-foot brick facility in 2008 which houses a concession stand, men's and women's restrooms and a spacious press box.

The press facility is divided into four separate work areas, with each equipped with hi-speed internet and telephone access. It is also setup to accommodate television and team video personnel. The MSU Soccer Field also includes covered dugouts for participating teams.

Hailed as one of the top playing surfaces in the Southeastern Conference, the field stretches 114 yards long and 74 yards wide. The regulation NCAA Championship field features Mississippi Pride grass - developed by researchers on the Mississippi State campus - making it home to one of the finest playing surfaces in the country.

Lights were added just after the conclusion of the 2002 campaign, equipping the facility for evening competition and giving it an added amenity that can only translate into better atmospheres.

The atmosphere at the facility has grown over the years, with MSU setting seven of the Top 10 attendance marks since 2012. The Bulldogs claimed a new stadium attendance record in the 2013 season against Florida, only to eclipse that mark at the start of the 2014 campaign with 1,010 on hand to watch the opener against lowa State. The mark was surpassed again in 2014, this time against Ole Miss with a crowd of 1,235 on hand.

MISSISSIPPI STATE SOCCER CLUBHOUSE

Games this fall at the MSU Soccer Field will have a different feel as head coach Aaron Gordon and the Bulldogs prepare to open the 2016 season in a new home.

The MSU Soccer Clubhouse, a \$1.8 million facility covering nearly 3,000 square feet adjacent to the soccer field, gives the Maroon and White one of the best buildings of its kind in all of college soccer.

The facility, which has an expected completion date on Sept. 1, features a 1,000-sqaure-foot player locker room, shower area and bathroom, a 600-foot film room/lounge, a 500-foot treatment area, a 300-foot laundry/equipment room, a 300-foot coaches locker/conference room and a 250-foot kitchen to top it all off.

"This season our players will have access to an on-field locker room, something no other team here has had, and I think they're very appreciative of that," Gordon said. "We've been planning for this facility for a very long time and we're excited to see it finally come to fruition."

Past teams had to dress and get treatment at the Humphrey Coliseum, before crossing College View Drive to gain access to the field.

Dale Partners Architects, out of Jackson, Miss., is overseeing the construction.

ith only three players lost from last season's roster, expectations will be high for head coach Aaron Gordon and the Mississippi State soccer team. The once youthful and inexperienced squad from a season ago has grown into a talented and battle-tested squad entering the 2016 campaign, with only one thing on its mind: winning.

In 2015, MSU earned its first ranked win in over four years, its first SEC win in over three years and its first win ever in Fayette-



ville. The Bulldogs turned in a 5-10-3 record overall and a 3-5-2 record in league action. The five results in conference play were the most by any Bulldog club since 2004. To say 2015 was a step in the right direction is an understatement.

This season, Gordon's squad has its sights set on the next rung up the ladder as the Bulldogs aim even higher in 2016. The next step in maturation

as a program for MSU would be to reach the SEC Tournament, something no Bulldog club has done since 2004.

To reach that goal, the Bulldogs will have to navigate through a tough schedule as MSU faces 12 teams coming off of winning seasons. Furthermore, of the 18 teams on this year's schedule, eight clubs reached the NCAA Tournament in 2015.

The majority of this year's squad is sophomores and juniors, with 18 of the 29 players on the roster having one of those two classifications. Three seniors and eight newcomers bookend the lineup as the Bulldogs prepare for the 2016 season. Returning captain Mallory Eubanks will be pivotal to State's



success this year, as the junior enters the year after an offseason of training with the U-19 U.S. Women's National Team. Eubanks led the team in points (10) and assists (4) in 2015, while earning two-game winners against SEC foes Arkansas and Alabama.

Scoring will obviously be important for the Bulldogs to take the next step, as the Maroon and White will be looking to improve their goal output from a year ago. Last season MSU was 12th in the league in goals scored, after scoring 17 times. State was 0-3-1 when scoring just one goal in 2015 and 5-0-0 when scoring two or more times.

Freshman MaKayla Waldner could be the answer for the Bulldog offense this season, as the Dexter, Mo., native enters 2016 with the possibility of scoring goals in bunches. The four-star recruit, who was the gem of Gordon's 2016 signing class, will be tasked with providing another offensive option on the field opposite of Eubanks.

Another scoring threat for MSU will be goal-leader Kennadi Carbin, who scored four goals in limited action with the Bulldogs. The sophomore showed flashes of greatness last season, as she used her speed and length as a dangerous 1-2 punch. The forward will join Eubanks and Waldner as MSU's top weapons in 2016.

Although she didn't get into the scoring column last season, it was evident that senior Ari Holmes was a valuable weapon for the Bulldogs. The defender took the majority of throw ins and free kicks for State, as she wowed crowds at the MSU Soccer Field and around the league with her range and power. After seeing the senior nail a free kick from midfield this season, it will be clear why she's called "Tank."

Holmes joins an excellent back line for the Bulldogs, which held opponents to only 25 goals last season. Along with Holmes, sophomore Courtney Robicheaux and juniors Khalyn Harmon and Hannah Smith made up the 2015 defensive back four. This season the defenders will be shuffled, with junior Smith coming off an injury during the spring.

The iron woman of the squad is sophomore Carly Mauldin. The midfielder started in all 18 games for the Bulldogs, as she went the distance in all but one contest last season. The Laurel, Miss., native played in a team-high 1,663 minutes in her first season with the Bulldogs.

At goal MSU will start junior Tanya de Souza. The Paris, France native led the team in saves, as she stopped 60 shots for MSU. The goals allowed average for State last year ranked eighth overall in the league. Behind de Souza, will be sophomore Courtney Tompkins, who stepped in for two matches in de Souza's absences, going 1-1 in the two contests.

The tough 2016 slate kicks off in Charleston, S.C., on Friday, Aug. 19, as the Bulldogs face College of Charleston before facing NCAA-qualifier Virginia Tech on Sunday. The Bulldogs will return to Starkville the following weekend to open the home slate, as State takes on Lipscomb on Friday and UT-Martin on Sunday.

Continuing the non-conference schedule on Sept. 2 and Sept. 4, the Bulldogs will travel to Mobile and Hattiesburg as MSU faces conference champion South Alabama and instate foe Southern Miss.

MSU kicks off the SEC season on Friday, Sept. 9 against Arkansas, as the game will feature a special pregame recognition to the 2001 SEC Western Division Championship team. State will host Louisiana-Lafayette on Sunday, Sept. 11 at 1 p.m., with the game serving as "Senior Day" for three Bulldogs. Alabama (Sept. 30), South Carolina (Oct. 6), LSU (Oct. 14) and Texas A&M (Oct. 27) to the MSU Soccer Field in 2016. The trio of USC, LSU and Texas A&M all earned winning seasons on their

State's SEC road contests feature a return of Ole Miss to the schedule on (Sept, 22), before the Bulldogs travel to Missouri (Sept. 25), Auburn (Oct. 9), Tennessee (Oct. 20), and Florida (Oct. 23). I

If the Bulldogs can survive the 2016 gauntlet, they will travel south to Orange Beach, Ala., for the SEC Tournament which is held on Oct. 31-Nov. 6. Looking past that rung on the ladder would be somewhere no MSU team has every reached, the NCAA Tournament, set to begin on Nov. 11.

AARON GORDON

Head Coach 4th Season at MSU | North Texas '94



When Mississippi State Director of Athletics Scott Stricklin was searching for the fourth head coach in Mississippi State soccer history, one name that repeatedly came up in his search was Aaron Gordon.

Hailed by many as one of the top up-and-coming coaches in the nation, Gordon was tabbed to take the reigns of the Bulldog soccer program on Nov. 27, 2012. Entering his fourth year at the helm, Gordon continues MSU's rise as a soccer program. Under the tutelage of Gordon, the Bulldogs have had three players earn postseason honors, including one SEC All-Freshman Team honor.

In 2015, Gordon led the Maroon and White to one of its most successful seasons in over a decade as the Bulldogs earned three wins and two draws in conference play. The season was filled with many accomplishments, with the first coming in Fayetteville as the Bulldogs downed Arkansas on the road for the first time in school history. Gordon's squad followed up that accomplishment by earning a pair of draws with Tennessee and Missouri, which was a first against either team in the series history. The highlight of 2015 came against Kentucky however; as the Bulldogs downed the 20th-ranked Wildcats, 3-0, for MSU's first ranked win since 2011.

Gordon made the move to Starkville following six seasons on the staff at Texas Tech University, where he was named associate head coach of the Red Raiders on Feb. 15, 2012, after five seasons as an assistant at the school. His time in Lubbock helped prepare him for his first college head coaching opportunity, as he oversaw all areas of the program, including recruiting, scouting, team training and video match analysis.

During his six-year tenure as a member of head coach Tom Stone's staff, the Red Raiders became a regular fixture around the top of the Big 12 Conference table.

The 2012 season, his final at Texas Tech, was a record-setting one for the Red Raiders. The team won a school-record 16 games, advanced to the semifinals of the Big 12 Tournament for the first time, and made its first trip to the NCAA Tournament, where it advanced to the second round. The 2012 Red Raiders tallied 130 points behind 46 goals and 38 assists, and defensively registered an 0.97 goals-against average while posting 10 shutouts.

Texas Tech's 16-win campaign was the school's third-straight double-digit win season, another first for the program. During his time in Lubbock, Gordon helped the Red Raiders to more overall (60) and conference (23) wins than the previous nine years combined, and a spot in the Big 12 Tournament all six seasons. He helped mentor seven players to Big 12 All-Freshman honors, including the Big 12 Freshman of the Year two of the past three seasons, and five to First Team All-Big 12 accolades. During his tenure, he also helped mentor a pair of players that were selected to United States youth national teams.

Gordon stayed in the state of Texas following a threeyear stint with his hometown FC Dallas of Major League Soccer. With the team, he served as the director of coaching for the second- largest youth club program in North Texas. Gordon moved back to the Lone Star State following a tenure as the top assistant for the Atlanta Beat of the WUSA. While there, he coordinated the daily training schedule and served as head of scouting and video analysis among other duties.

He joined the Beat following a stint as director of coaching for Dallas Inter Soccer Club, where he oversaw a program that won numerous state and regional championships. In addition to his duties at Dallas Inter, Gordon also served as head coach of the Women's Texas Lightning team of the W-League, guiding the program to back-to-back United States Amateur Championships.

The Dallas native prepped at Lake Highlands High School before going on to Hardin Simmons University. He transferred to the University of South Carolina-Spartanburg before coming back to his home state in 1997 to receive his B.S. in Kinesiology from the University of North Texas. After college, Gordon played professionally in the USL, where he led the indoor league in goals in 1996.

Gordon, who holds a USSF "A" License and a USSF Goal-keeper Diploma, spent a tenure as the head coach for the 93 Region 3 ODP team.

Gordon and his wife Ashley, an assistant coach at MSU the past four seasons, have two daughters, Addison (16) and Avery (12).

ASHLEY GORDON



Assistant Coach 4th Season at MSU | Southern Methodist '97

Ashley Gordon, who has enjoyed tremendous success as both a coach and a player, joined the Mississippi State soccer program in November of 2012. The Dallas native joins MSU working alongside her husband, head coach Aaron Gordon.

Gordon, who enters her fourth season with the Bulldogs, aided in MSU's most successful season in over a decade after MSU defeated three teams, while tying two more, in conference play during the 2015 campaign. MSU earned the program's first win in Fayetteville, after the Bulldogs downed Arkansas, 2-1. State also picked up its first ranked win since 2011, following the 3-0 win against No. 20 Kentucky.

While at Texas Tech, Gordon helped build the Red Raiders into a Big 12 contender during her six seasons with the program. In 2012, the Red Raiders won a school-record 16 games and ended the season with a No. 25 national ranking by the NSCAA, the program's first national ranking. Tech's historic season included a trip to the semifinals of the Big 12 Tournament and a second-round appearance in the program's first NCAA Tournament.

The 16-win season was a third-straight campaign with double-digit wins for the program, a first for the Red Raiders. As a member of Tom Stone's staff, she helped the Red Raiders to the conference tournament each season, and more overall (60) and conference (23) victories than the previous nine years combined.

In addition to recruiting and operations duties, Gordon primarily worked with TTU's forward and midfielders, leading the squad to 130 points behind 46 goals and 38 assists last season.

During her time at Texas Tech, Gordon helped tutor six NSCAA All-Central Region selections and the program's first NSCAA All-American in freshman Janine Beckie. Beckie, who scored the program's most goals since 1996, earned TTU's second Big 12 Rookie of the Year in three seasons while also garnering Top Drawer Soccer Freshman Team of the Year accolades. Gordon helped mentor five All-Big 12 First Team selections and seven Big 12 All-Freshman honorees.

While at Tech, Gordon continued an outstanding coaching career in the Olympic Development Program ranks. Since 2001, she has served as a Region III staff coach, and from 2008-2011 she was an NTSSA West Texas ODP coach.

Gordon was named the Region III '94 Team assistant coach in 2011 after serving as assistant coach for the '89 squad in 2004. This summer she was tabbed the assistant coach of the ODP Region III '96 team, and she will coach the squad over the Thanksgiving holiday at the ODP inter-regional tournament in Boca Raton, Fla.

Gordon joined her husband in Lubbock a year after she guided Richland College to the NJCAA Division III national championship. In addition to being named

NJCAA Coach of the Tournament, she was also named the NSCAA Coach of the Year.

In addition to coaching Richland, she also served four years as a staff coach for FC Dallas (2003-07), where Aaron was the Director of Coaching. It was the first of two stints with FC Dallas, as she also worked alongside Aaron with the program from 1998-2001. As a staff coach with FC Dallas, she helped guide her squads to a number of state and regional championships.

Between stops with FC Dallas, Gordon worked with the Cobb Futbol Club in Atlanta as the girls' technical director from 2001-03. In her role with the club, she served as director of the Girls Academy Development Program.

A USSF "A" licensed coach, Gordon's success in the coaching ranks can be attributed to a successful playing career.

An all-state performer who won the 1990 state title at Duncanville High School, Gordon went on to a stellar career at Southern Methodist University. As a four-year starter for the Mustangs, she helped her team to three NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the Round of 16.

After earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology and a minor in history in 1994, she went on to play semi-pro soccer for the W-League's Dallas Lightning (1995-98) and the Texas Heat (1999). During her playing career, she was also tabbed to the 1990 U.S. National Pool Team, 1993 Olympic Festival team and the Olympic regional team (1988-96).

PHIL CASELLA



Assistant Coach 4th Season at MSU | Fairleigh Dickinson '94

The Bayside, N.Y., native, who enters his fourth season at Mississippi State, has overseen the Bulldog goalkeepers during his tenure in Starkville. Assistant coach Phil Casella's goalkeepers held opponents to 25 goals with a 1.34 goals against average in 2015. The totals were the lowest recorded by Bulldog keepers since 2003. Also during 2015, which was MSU's most successful season in over a decade, Casella aided the staff to MSU's most conference wins since 2004, while helping the Bulldogs down their first ranked opponent since 2011 after State defeated No. 20 Kentucky at home.

Casella spent 2011 and 2012 as head coach of the New York Fury in the Women's Premier Soccer League, the largest women's soccer league in the world. As a head coach of the Fury, he took a squad consisting of professional players from Women's Professional Soccer and semi-professional leagues to the 2011 East Region semifinals as well as the East-Mid Atlantic Conference regular season title.

While coaching the Fury in the WPSL, Casella also coached the Albertson Fury Soccer Club. Casella coached the Albertson Fury '91 from 2007-11, guiding the club to numerous championships, including three-straight Eastern New York State Cup titles from 2009-11. His 2010 edition finished the year ranked No. 4 in the nation.

Casella served as interim head coach of the '92 and '93 Elite Clubs National League squads. Under his guidance, the '93 Fury won the Eastern New York State Cup and went on to finish fifth in the ECNL national championship. After taking the '92 Fury to the 2010 ECNL national "Flight B" runner-up, the 2011 squad advanced to the Region 1 semifinals before taking runner-up in the Eastern New York State Cup.

Casella's collegiate coaching career consists of assistant coaching stints at Fordham (2006-07) and his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson (2000-06). In his lone season at Fordham, he helped lead the Rams to a 14-7 overall record and the finals of the Atlantic 10 Conference Tournament.

Casella was a part of Fairleigh Dickinson's move to NCAA Division I in the first of his six seasons at the school. In just the third season, the Knights posted a 7-2-1 Northeast Conference record and advanced to the semifinals of the league tournament. A year after winning the 2003 ECAC championship, Casella helped

guide the Knights to the NEC regular-season title with an unbeaten 6-0-3 record. During his college coaching tenures, he also worked with the Eastern New York Youth Soccer Association's Olympic Development Program. From 1999-2002 he assisted with the U14 and U17 squads. He took the head coaching reigns of the U14 squad from 2003-05 before managing the U17 squad the 2005-06 campaigns.

Along with the different levels of coaching, Casella also brings different levels of playing experience. He played at Fairleigh Dickinson from 1992-95 before graduating with a degree in communication and advertising. Casella continued his playing career in 1996 with the North Jersey Imperials of the United States Inter-regional Soccer League, the second division to Major League Soccer in the United States. He helped guide the Imperials to the semifinals of the Sizzling Six National Championship Tournament and the 1996 Northeast Division title.

Casella is a United States Soccer Federation nationally-licensed coach.

Born on June 11, Casella hails from Bayside, N.Y.

Athletic Trainer 2nd Season at MSU | LSU '11

Entering his second season at Mississippi State as MSU soccer's certified athletic trainer is Matt Rabalais. Rabalais handles all team medical needs, as he is tasked with the responsibility of keeping Bulldogs healthy and injury free.

Rabalais graduated from Louisiana State University in 2011, with a bachelor of science in kinesiology. From there, Rabalais earned his masters in human resource development at Clemson University in 2013. While with the Tigers, Rabalais worked with the football and women's volleyball teams, as well as the swimming and diving team.

Before making the journey to Starkville, Rabalais worked in Spartanburg, S.C., for the Regional Health System. During his time in Spartanburg, he was tasked with covering all sports at Converse College from 2013 until his departure in 2015.

Rabalais was hired with the Bulldogs in 2015, assigned to the women's soccer and women's golf teams at MSU.

A native of Baton Rouge, La., Rabalais was born on Jan. 14, 1987. He is married to Courtney Rabalais, who is also from Baton Rouge.

2015 SEASON REVIEW | 2016 HAIL STATE SOCCER

In the third season under head coach Aaron Gordon, the Mississippi State soccer program turned in one of its best seasons in over a decade as the young Bulldogs showed great promise and fight throughout the year. The season saw MSU earn its first ranked win in over four years, its first conference win in over three years and its first win ever in Fayetteville. MSU turned in a 5-10-3 record, while the five decisions in the Southeastern Conference were the most by any Bulldog club since 2004.

Heading into the season the Bulldogs were a youth-heavy and inexperienced squad, with only one senior and three juniors (two of which were transfers) on the roster. Although they lacked experience the young pups weren't short on talent. Leading the charge was sophomore Mallory Eubanks, who was named to the SEC All-Freshmen Team a season before. The Lexington, Ky., native joined lone senior Shelby Jordan as the team captains, as the pair led by example on and off the field.

The season kicked off at home, as the Bulldogs faced South Alabama, a knockdown, drag out game with the Jaguars result in a narrow defeat as MSU fell, 1-0. On short rest, MSU faced Murray State two days later. The Racers, edged out the Bulldogs, 2-1, as Murray State picked up a win in its season opener.

State traveled to Florida the following weekend, facing Florida Gulf Coast and South Florida in Tampa. MSU was held scoreless in both affairs as the Bulldogs fought hard through the humid and wet conditions. All four of the Bulldogs first four foes ended the season with winning records, as the four clubs also reached the NCAA Tournament in 2015.

Gordon's squad was winless in August, but September would be wrapped in Maroon and White as the Bulldogs picked up three wins and two draws over the month. MSU would inflict a scoring barrage on visiting Nicholls State to begin September, as the Bulldogs ran away, 4-0, to earn their first win of the season. After a tie with instate foe. Southern Miss the Bulldogs would travel to Nashville for their first SEC game of the season.

How 2015 Foes Faired

A rainy night and near misses resulted in a win for the Commodores, but the Bulldogs wouldn't leave Nashville without a win as MSU downed Lipscomb two days later, 2-0. One of the highlights of 2015 came in Fayetteville the following week, after captain Mallory Eubanks knocked in a goal as time expired to down Arkansas. The win was MSU's first victory in Fayetteville.



In the last weekend of September, the Bulldogs would earn their first draws in program history against Tennessee and Missouri. The scoreless draw and 1-1 tie brought the Bulldogs record to 3-5-3 on the season.

October began with a pair of road trips, the first to College Station and the second to Athens. MSU fell to Texas A&M and Georgia, as the Bulldogs were unable to score against both clubs' stout defense. A return home to face 20th ranked Kentucky resulted in MSU's biggest win of the season, as State knocked off the Wildcats 3-0. The ranked win was MSU's first since 2011.

A visit from another ranked foe would not end the same way for the Bulldogs however; as MSU's valiant effort fell short against the Gators. State fell to UF 2-1, as a record 1,327 fans came out the to the MSU Soccer Field in support of the Bulldogs.

In the last road weekend of the season the Bulldogs split a pair of games as State lost to LSU and downed Alabama. The win against the Tide was thanks to another Mallory Eubanks game-winner, as the sophomore earned her third goal of the season. Auburn visited the MSU Soccer Field to cap the season, with senior night on the team's mind the Bulldogs put up a great fight but couldn't overcome the Tigers.

The 2015 season ended with MSU just missing the SEC Tournament by a point, the closest the Bulldogs have come since last making the tourney in 2004. MSU was led in goals by two freshmen, Kiley Martens and Kennadi Carbin, as the pair score four each. Sophomore Eubanks led the team in points (10) and assists (4) on her way to another successful season on the pitch.

- Drafted in the fourth round by the National Women's Soccer League's Portland Thorns, MSU's first drafted player.
- Earned Second Team All-SEC honors her last two seasons, the first for a Bulldog since Meredith Riekert in 1995 and 1997.
- Four-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection in elementary education.
- Led State in goals all four years of her career.
- Set Mississippi State's records for career goals and points with 39 and 92, respectively.
- Claimed the Bulldogs' single-season goals record with 16 her senior season, breaking the mark with 1:30 remaining in her final collegiate match against rival Ole Miss.
- Tallied 34 points in 2013, third in school history, after claiming a fourthmost 28 as a junior.
- Tallied all but seven of MSU's goals in 2013.
- Tied for third in the SEC in goals and seventh in points her senior season.
- Claimed new MSU top marks with eight multiple-goal games and eight game-winning assists.
- Tallied eight of her 16 goals in SEC play her senior season.
- Opened her senior campaign with goals in the first four matches and a school record six-straight with a goal going back to 2012.



- Tallied State's first hat trick since 2001 and added an assist for seven points, second-most in single-game history, in 2013.
- Rated fourth in the SEC in points (28) and goals (12) as a junior.
- Capped 2012 by claiming the MSU career scoring record with the golden goal against rival Ole Miss.
- Named SEC Player of the Week after her two-goal effort against the Rebels.
