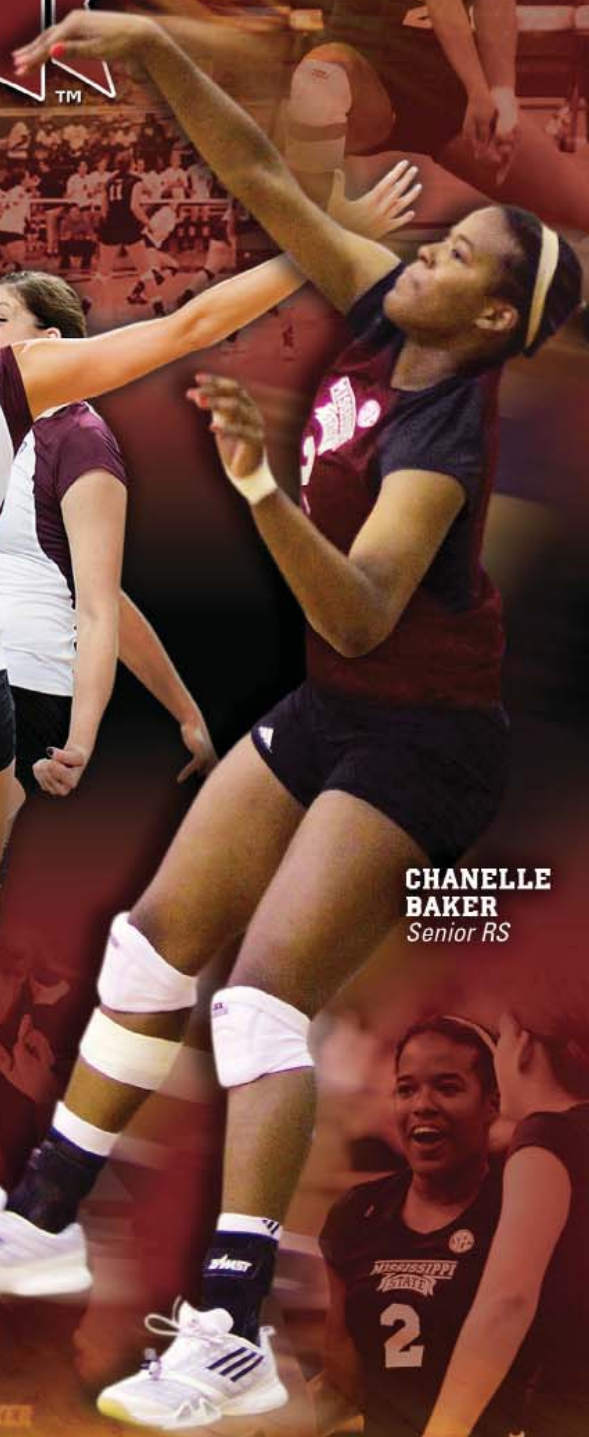

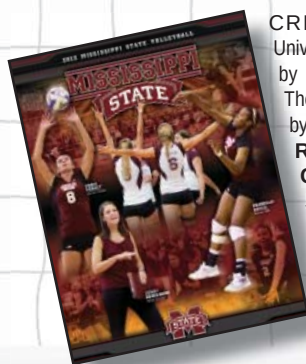

Bulldogs stronger, more athletic in 2012

Mississippi State has in successive seasons increased the Ws and reduced the Ls in the first three years of **Jenny Hazelwood's** tenure as head volleyball coach.

Last year's 12-17 edition, powered by All-SEC performer **Caitlin Rance**, finished with a 7-13 conference worksheet. State's sixth-place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference play was the team's highest since 1984, and the seven-win SEC showing was one shy of the school record.

In 2012, featuring a blend of battle-tested veteran talent and an impressive cast of gifted newcomers, State takes aim on a break-through campaign in 2012 targeting the program's first winning season since 2006.

"We're going to be a much better all-around volleyball team in 2012," said Hazelwood. "We're a much stronger and more athletic team, and we'll start the season playing at a higher level than we have in the past."

With six freshmen on board, the challenge for Hazelwood and staff will be to quickly incorporate the newcomers into the MSU system.

"We are young. All but three of our players are freshmen or sophomores," she continued. "But these new players are talented, and as they gain experience on the court, this team will get better and better. I think our fans will enjoy watching them play."

THE VETERANS

Rightside hitter and team co-captain **Chanelle Baker** (Carrollton, Texas) is the lone senior and the most experienced of the returning seven Bulldog veterans. Baker, who began her career as a middle blocker, enters her final collegiate campaign with a staff-leading 424 career kills and 126 total blocks. She's seasoned with 300 sets played and 57 starts in 94 career matches played. That court-wise maturity will be counted on during the development of the younger players.

As is often the case, much of the weight of a volleyball team's success rests on the shoulders of its "quarterback", the setter. In that respect, the Bulldogs find themselves in good shape, as junior setter **Paris Perret** (Frisco, Texas) returns to run the MSU attack. A starter in 58 of MSU's 60 matches the past two seasons, Perret is steadily scaling State's career assists charts. She turned in her second consecutive 1,000-assist season as a sophomore and begins her junior campaign with 2,040 kill-producing passes, sixth-most at State.

MSU's other junior, outside hitter **Dani McCree** (Rialto, Calif.), provides depth as an outside hitter. She is looking to play a bigger role in 2012 as she recovers from an ankle injury.

MSU's four-player sophomore class is led by talented middle blocker **Lainey Wyman** (Plainfield, Ill.). Last fall Wyman became the third Bulldog rookie in as many seasons and the fourth overall to garner **SEC All-Freshman Team** honors. Wyman, one of two Bulldogs to start all 29 matches, registered 247 kills and 108 blocks as a rookie, the most by an SEC freshman.

All three of the other sophomores saw match-opening playing

time last fall. Defensive specialist **Alex Scott** (Madison, Ala.) hit the court in 19 matches, seven of those against SEC foes, while right-side **Sarah Temperilli** (Tomball, Texas) drew five starts in her eight matches played. Setter **Rachel Williams** (Madison, Ala.) also saw duty as prime backup to starting setter Paris Perret.

THE ROOKIES

Hazelwood and staff are eager to see the six-player freshman class in action this fall. Some of those newcomers are expected to quickly assume starting roles for the Bulldogs.

That group includes outside hitters **Katie Enright** (Novi, Mich.), and **Taylor Scott** (Claremont, Calif.), setter **Taylor Hackemack** (Plant City, Fla.), middle blockers **Sarah Nielsen** (Cypress, Texas) and **Alex Warren** (San Antonio, Texas), and libero **Roxanne McVey** (Magnolia, Texas).

THE SCHEDULE

The Bulldogs' 29-match schedule for 2012 includes appearances in three early-season non-conference tournaments and a 20-match slate of Southeastern Conference matches.

Mississippi State opens its 38th season of volleyball hosting the **MSU Maroon Classic** Aug. 24-25, welcoming 2011 NCAA entrant Jackson State, first-time foe Kennesaw State and ULM to the Newell-Grissom Building.

MSU hits the road the next two weekends, joining host Southern California, Boston College and Northern Iowa Aug. 31-Sept. 1 in the **Luxe City Center Trojan Invitational** in Los Angeles, Calif. The Bulldogs then wrap up their non-conference schedule Sept. 7-8 in New Orleans, La., taking on Sam Houston State, Pittsburgh and host Tulane in the **Allstate Sugar Bowl Collegiate Classic**.

The addition of Missouri and Texas A&M to the SEC family has led to a new 20-match scheduling format. MSU will play home-and-away series against SEC West foes Auburn, LSU, Ole Miss as well as SEC East teams Florida, Georgia, Missouri, South Carolina and Tennessee and single matches at home against Alabama, Arkansas and single road matches against Kentucky and Texas A&M.

WHAT'S NEW AT MSU

There's plenty that's new within the Bulldog volleyball program for 2012.

In addition to the six freshmen players, the MSU coaching staff includes a new assistant and a returning assistant with a new name.

Taylor Evans joins the staff this fall, replacing **Branden Higa**, now head coach at California Baptist. MSU's other assistant coach, Lindi Bankowski, is now **Lindi Sallach** after her off-season marriage to MSU assistant football coach **Scott Sallach**.

Caitlin Rance, who completed a stellar playing career at State last fall, has joined the MSU staff as a student assistant coach.

There's plenty of illumination of the newcomers at State, thanks to a new lighting system that has more than tripled the foot-candle lighting rating at MSU's home court.

After leaving left her mark on the Mississippi State volleyball record book during a sterling four-year career as a player, **Jenny (Head) Hazelwood** is well underway with MSU record book revisions in her fourth season as MSU's head volleyball coach.

Hazelwood starred as a setter on the volleyball courts at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum and the Newell-Grissom Building from 1996 to 1999 and rejoined the Mississippi State family in January 2009 as the 10th volleyball head coach in the 38-year history of the Bulldog program. Seasoned with nine years as a head volleyball coach on the collegiate level, the Pearland, Texas, native returned to her alma mater following a successful two-year stint as head coach at **Austin Peay State University** in Clarksville, Tenn.

In her first three seasons at the helm of the MSU program and despite a spate of injuries to key athletes, Hazelwood has moved the Bulldog program forward in virtually every area. The Bulldogs finished with a flurry in 2009, winning four of their final five league matches en route to a 9-22 campaign and have bettered that overall and league win total each year since. Her third MSU edition finished with seven conference wins, tying for the second-most in program history, and finished sixth in the rugged Southeastern Conference, State's highest league finish since 1984. Among those was a shutout win over No. 25 Kentucky, the first win in program history over a ranked opponent.

Along the way Hazelwood-coached Bulldog players have earned conference and national honors for their success on the court and in the classroom. State's 2009 unit earned AVCA Academic All-America team honors, the fourth such honor for the MSU program, and matched a school record with nine SEC Academic Honor Roll selections. Libero **Kayla Woodard** in 2010 became the third player at Mississippi State to earn **CoSIDA Academic All-America** team honors. Also in 2010 **Ashley Newsome** became MSU's first **All-SEC** honoree in 10 seasons and a year later **Caitlin Rance** joined that growing list of All-SEC performers at Mississippi State. Waiting in the wings for **All-SEC** honors is **Lainey Wyman**, who in 2011 became the second MSU player all-time named to the **SEC All-Freshman** honor squad.

Hazelwood has also overseen dramatic improvements to the Bulldogs' home court in three seasons. The addition of new sound and lighting systems and a new scoreboard, an upgrade of locker room and team areas and the installation of colorful banners to both the interior and exterior areas of the facility are among the latest enhancements at the Newell-Grissom Building.

Fan support for Bulldog volleyball has mirrored State's steady climb under Hazelwood's guidance. The top five and eight of the top 10 attendance marks at the Newell-Grissom Building have come during Hazelwood's term as head coach. State eclipsed the 1,000-mark twice in 2011, including a facility-record 3,024 for the Bulldogs' season-opener. Later in the same season in a match played in Humphrey Coliseum State established a **state collegiate volleyball attendance mark** when 4,525 fans cheered the Bulldogs on to a program-first win over No. 25 Kentucky.

Hazelwood has been on a fast track in the pursuit of her goal to coach volleyball on the collegiate level.

Upon graduation from Mississippi State in the spring of 2000, she stayed in the Magnolia State to launch her coaching career, serving for two seasons as head volleyball coach at NCAA Division III member **Mississippi College** in Clinton, Miss. While directing the Choctaws' program, she was responsible for recruiting players that garnered American Southwest Conference East Division Freshman of the Year honors in 2000, 2001 and 2002.

She continued her coaching career in 2002 at **Centenary College** in Shreveport, La., the smallest of the nation's NCAA Division I members. During five seasons at Centenary her teams took on the likes of Virginia and Southeastern Conference foes Mississippi State, Ole Miss and Tennessee and though often-times out-matched, compiled a 48-138 worksheet. She guided her initial Centenary team, with but two returning players from a three-win club, to a 13-win campaign. That feat earned her **Independent Coach of the Year** national honors in 2002. Two players from her 2006 team earned Mid-Continent Conference (now Summit League) All-Freshman team honors, the first all-conference honors ever accorded a Centenary volleyball player.

Hazelwood accepted the head coaching post at **Austin Peay State University** in 2007, guiding a team that returned just six letter-winners and three starters to an 8-25 finish in her first season coaching the Lady Govs. Her second APSU edition drew national attention when it produced a 14-win improvement and rated as college volleyball's most dramatic turnaround that fall. That Lady Gov team, picked to finish ninth in the 10-team Ohio Valley Conference, compiled a 22-11 worksheet and surprised league foes with a third-place finish and a win out of first place.

One of Hazelwood's prized recruits, junior outside hitter Stephanie Champine, was accorded first-team All-OVC and OVC All-Newcomer team honors and became the first

Austin Peay player to receive AVCA All-Region Team honors.

Additionally, her 2008 team was selected by the league's coaches and

players for the Ohio Valley Conference Sportsmanship Award.

Hazelwood set the stage for her coaching career with a remarkable four-year playing career at Mississippi State University.

She stepped in as a freshman and claimed the role as State's starting setter, establishing the school single-season mark as a rookie in 1996 with 1,541 assists. It was a tough act to follow, but she managed to register three of MSU's top four best assist totals, concluding her career with a school-record 5,505 career assists, then the fourth-most in SEC history. She claimed the single-match assist mark in the opening competition of her senior campaign in 1999 when she dished out a school-best 83 assists in a five-set win at UNC-Charlotte.

In addition to quarterbacking the Volleyball Bulldog offense, Hazelwood also starred on defense during her MSU career with 1,107 digs and at the net with 211 total blocks. At Mississippi State Hazelwood played for head coaches **Samye Johnson** (1996) and **Brenda Bowlin** (1997-99). And during her career, MSU volleyball moved into its current home, the Newell-Grissom Building (1997), set a school record for conference wins (1998) and established the home single-match attendance record (1999). Hazelwood's success was not limited to the volleyball court. She excelled in the classroom, becoming the first Bulldog volleyball

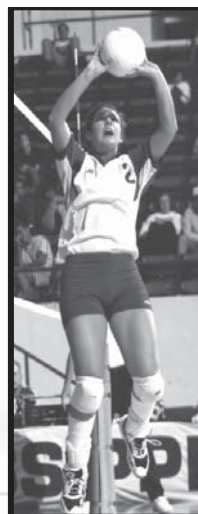
player to earn SEC Academic Honor Roll honors all four of her collegiate years. Additionally, she was honored as the recipient of MSU's Newsom Award for athletic and academic excellence.

MSU volleyball's tradition of academic success has continued in Hazelwood's first three seasons at State, where MSU players have earned a combined 26 berths on the SEC Academic Honor Roll and SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

Hazelwood is married to Clinton, Miss., native Brian Hazelwood, a two-time All-Southeastern Conference placekicker during his football career at Mississippi State (1995 to 1998). He later played four seasons as a placekicker in the arenafootball2 league, earning second-team all-league honors in three of his four seasons and in 2011 joined the Volleyball

Bulldog staff as a volunteer assistant coach.

The Hazelwoods are the parents of two children, **Allison** and **Andrew**.



During her four-year MSU volleyball career at **Jenny Hazelwood** established school records for the most assists in a match, a season and a career. Her 5,505 career assists mark still ranks fifth among the SEC's all-time career leaders.

Michigan native **Lindi Sallach** is in her fourth season as an assistant volleyball coach at Mississippi State University and her sixth year in association with MSU head volleyball coach **Jenny Hazelwood**.

She joined the MSU staff in the spring of 2009 following a three-year coaching term at **Austin Peay State University** she served briefly as interim head coach and the next two seasons as the top assistant on Hazelwood's volleyball coaching staff at APSU.

Her primary responsibilities with the Volleyball Bulldogs include the coordination of team travel, camps, video exchange, community service projects, and managing the team's equipment. On the court Sallach works with MSU's setters and oversees the team's overall defensive strategy.

The Mississippi State assistant is a native of Temperance, Mich., and a graduate of **Bedford High School**, where she enjoyed a stellar prep career in volleyball and played on coach **Jodi Manore's** BHS teams that captured state championships in 1998 and 2001.

Sallach continued her volleyball career on the NCAA Division I level, playing for coach **Kelley Hartley Hutton** at **Indiana-Purdue Fort Wayne**. She was a stand-out setter during her four-year career (2001-04) at IPFW, establishing school career (4,650), season (1,296) and match (56) records for assists and the single-season digs mark (1,085). She was honored as IPFW's female athlete of the year following her freshman and senior seasons and twice during her career was accorded first-team All-Independent honors.

She earned her bachelor's degree in secondary education at IPFW in 2005 and launched her coaching career at schools in Temperance, Michigan, and Toledo, Ohio. She also directed successful summer volleyball camps at Bedford (Mich.) High School and Wyandotte (Mich.) High School.

Her career coaching path led to Clarksville, Tenn., and **Austin Peay State University** in 2006. She served as an assistant coach on the staff of **Corey Carlin** and as interim head coach following Carlin's departure after the 2006 season. She remained on staff at APSU when **Jenny Hazelwood** was named head coach of the Lady Govs, serving for two seasons as Hazelwood's first assistant. During that span Sallach helped engineer one of college volleyball's biggest one-season turnaround in 2008. That season saw the Lady Govs post a 22-11 record, a nation-leading 14-win improvement over their 8-25 finish in 2007.

Sallach was recognized in March 2008 as one of the nation's top young volleyball coaches by the **American Volleyball Coaches Association** as one of the inaugural winners of the AVCA's **Thirty Under 30 Award**.

She is married to **Scott Sallach**, who coaches tight ends as an assistant football coach at Mississippi State.

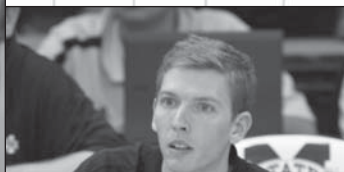
Evans, 31, joined the MSU staff in 2012 after having served as an assistant volleyball coach at the **University of Denver** in 2011-12 on the staff of **Beth Kuwata**. During the 2011 campaign the Pioneers knocked off 19th-ranked Colorado State in the program's first win over a ranked opponent.

His previous coaching experience includes a year as a volunteer assistant coach to **Beth Launier** at the **University of Utah**, where he helped train the 2010 Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year. He also served three seasons (2006-08) in a similar capacity on the staff of **Barry Goldberg** at **American University** in Washington D.C., where he assisted in the Eagles' advancement to Patriot League titles and a pair of NCAA Tournament berths.

Evans earned a bachelor's degree in economics at **Brigham Young** in 2006. While at BYU he helped found and served as codirector of the **Utah Elite Volleyball Club**. His volleyball experience also includes a stint playing volleyball professionally in Europe in 2008-09.

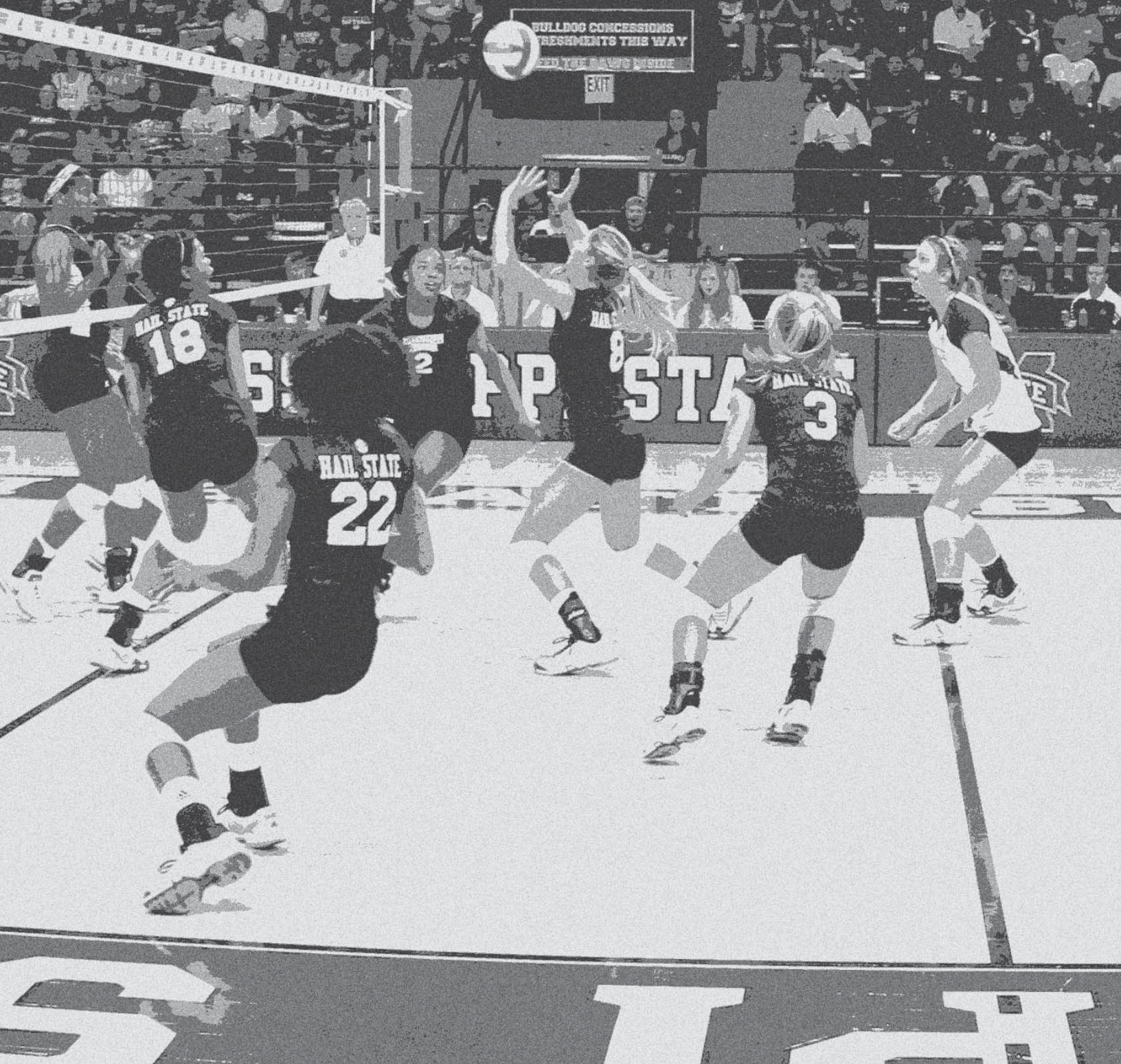

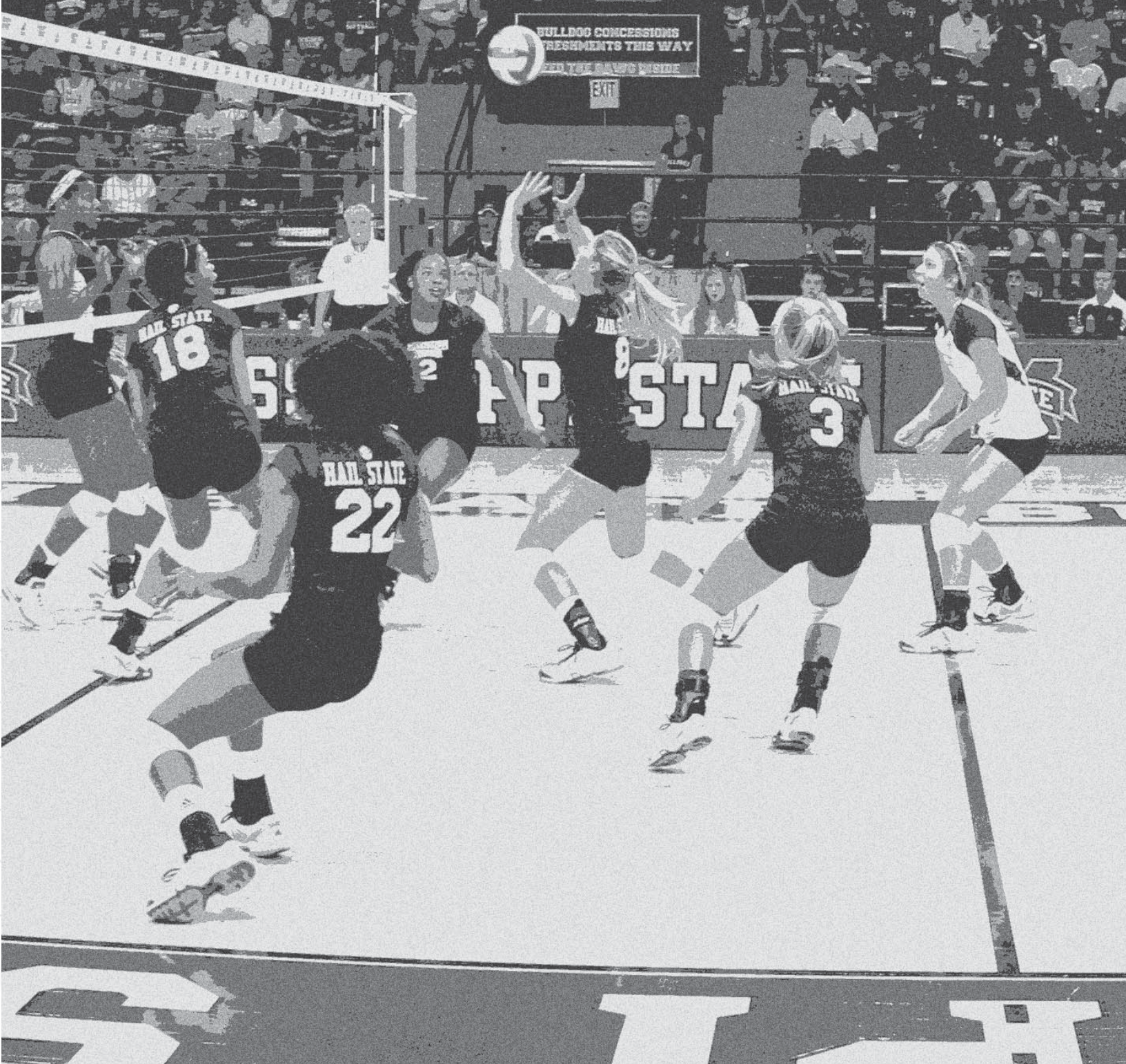

Mississippi State University is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference, a pioneer in the integration of higher education and athletic competition and a national leader in intercollegiate athletics.

The SEC, with an impressive legacy of more than eight decades of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of any intercollegiate athletic league in the nation since the conference's inception in 1933. Headquartered since 1948 in Birmingham, Ala., the Southeastern Conference is comprised of 14 universities that span an 11-state area, conducting championships in 21 sports - 12 women's sports and nine men's sports.

In 2011-12, SEC teams captured nine national champions, posted seven runner-up finishes and placed 42 athletes on **Capital One Academic All-America** teams.

The SEC family expands by two member institutions in 2012-13 with the addition of Missouri and Texas A&M. It's the league's first expansion since Arkansas and South Carolina joined the SEC in 1991.

The member schools, 14 strong, are split into two seven-team divisions. **Mississippi State University** teams with Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, Louisiana State, instate rival Ole Miss and newcomer Texas A&M to former the SEC's Western Division. The SEC's Eastern Division features Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Missouri, South Carolina, Tennessee and Vanderbilt. All but Arkansas, Missouri, South Carolina and Texas A&M were among 13 charter members of the SEC.

Since the Southeastern Conference conducted its first volleyball championship tournament in 1979, the sport has enjoyed steady growth in both popularity and strength in the league and over the past two decades has blossomed into a formidable force on the national scene.

Nearly half of the SEC's volleyball teams are ranked (**No. 13 Kentucky**, **No. 15 Tennessee** and **No. 18 Florida**) or received votes (**LSU**, **Texas A&M** and **Missouri**) in the AVCA's preseason coaches poll.

At least two teams have represented the SEC in the NCAA Tournament in each of the last 22 seasons. That includes a league-high seven teams that advanced to the NCAA's field of 64 in 2006 and six teams that reached postseason play in 2010. Florida, Kentucky and Tennessee represented the SEC in the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The league has had a team reach the NCAA Final Four 10 times in the last 22 seasons.

The Southeastern Conference crowned its first volleyball champions in 1979, with Kentucky claiming the initial tournament title. Regular season league competition began in 1983 when six teams --- Georgia, Kentucky, LSU, **Mississippi State**, Ole Miss and Tennessee played a limited five-match schedule. The number of volleyball-playing schools in the league grew in the ensuing years, climbing to 10 in 1991 after Arkansas and South Carolina

joined the SEC, and to the present 13-team field.

Divisional play in the SEC made its debut in 1995, and other changes followed. In 1999, the league adopted an eight-team format for its three-day single-elimination conference tournament. In 2002 the SEC began a 16-match regular season league scheduling format, and four years later that scheduling plan evolved further into a 20-match, double round-robin format. That expanded regular schedule in 2006 also brought to an end the league's 27-year old postseason tournament. The regular season league champion now earns the Southeastern Conference's automatic qualifying berth for the NCAA Tournament.

With the addition of Missouri and Texas A&M to the SEC family

in 2012-2013, the league has adopted a new volleyball scheduling format that features home-and-away series against eight opponents and single meetings at home or away with the other four teams.

Television exposure has helped spark SEC volleyball's steady growth in popularity and interest. That exposure received a major boost in 1995 when in-season SEC volleyball made its debut on SEC-TV (FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and Sun Network) on a tape-delay basis. That coverage has in recent years expanded to include live weekly telecasts of regular season matches.

In 2009, the SEC entered into an unprecedented TV agreement with ESPN that significantly broadened television exposure for SEC athletics, including volleyball. In the arrangement, SEC volleyball is now broadcast on three platforms: **ESPN**, **FOX Sports** and **Comcast Sports Southeast**. That coverage can now reach 73 million homes nationwide on ESPN, 25 million homes on the FOX Sports system and 10 million home on Comcast Sports Southeast.

More about SEC Volleyball

- All 11 of the SEC's volleyball teams posted double-digit win totals in 2011, and three approached the 30-win mark --- champion Tennessee (28-4) and runners-up Kentucky (27-6) and Florida (27-6). For Florida it was its nation-leading 21st consecutive 25-win season.
- In the 2010 NCAA Tournament, the Florida Gators became the first school in SEC volleyball history to capture the No. 1 national seed.
- Four SEC student-athletes --- Kelly Murphy and Kristy Jaeckel (Florida), Kelsey Robinson (Tennessee) and Stephanie Klefot (Kentucky) earned AVCA All-America honors in 2011, bringing to 60 the number of SEC players all-time accorded AVCA All-America honors.
- Tennessee claimed the 2011 SEC Volleyball Championship, its first outright league title and second overall.

Florida has won 17 outright crowns and shared two in the past 21 years. • Players representing seven SEC teams were included on the 2011 All-SEC team.

SEC VB ON TV

For the second consecutive year, 18 Southeastern Conference volleyball matches will be televised as part of the league's television package with national cable sports giant ESPN and the SEC's regional sports television partners FOX SportSouth, Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast (CSS) and Cox Sports Television (CST).

In conjunction with a ground-breaking 15-year, \$2.5 billion agreement with the Southeastern Conference, ESPNU will televise eight SEC volleyball matches this fall. The 18-match TV schedule and eight-match ESPNU lineup begins Sept. 12 when defending SEC champion Tennessee visits Missouri, one of two league newcomers for 2012-13.

All 13 SEC volleyball teams are included in the 2012 SEC volleyball television package.

Mississippi State is scheduled to make three appearances on the SEC TV package this fall with a trio of Sunday road matches in October. The Bulldogs visit Texas A&M (Oct. 7, SportSouth), Missouri (Oct. 14, ESPNU) and LSU (Oct. 28, Cox Sports Television). The 2012 TV appearances bring to 19 the number of televised MSU volleyball matches in 15 seasons.

The SEC telecasts on ESPNU reach more than 73 million homes while coverage reaches 25 million households on FOX Sports Net telecasts, more than 11 million homes on Comcast telecasts and two million on Cox Sports TV.

2011 SEASON IN REVIEW

Senior Rance, rookie Wyman guide Bulldogs to highest SEC finish since '84



The Southeastern Conference has no such official designation. But Mississippi State's Volleyball Bulldogs could stake a claim to being the most improved team in the Southeastern Conference in 2011.

Picked by the conference's head coaches to finish sixth in the SEC Western Division and at the bottom of the 11-team volleyball league, Mississippi State posted a 12-17 record that included a 7-13 SEC worksheet. When the dust settled on State's 37th season of volleyball, the Bulldogs had racked up seven league wins (one shy of matching the school record) and finished tied for sixth in SEC, State's highest finish since 1984.

State claimed a five-set thriller over Texas-El Paso in the championship match of the Lamar Tournament in Beaumont, Texas, and in similar fashion claimed 3-2 wins in league play over South Carolina, Ole Miss and Auburn.

The Bulldogs' most significant win of the campaign and one of the program's biggest all-time came October 14 in Humphrey Coliseum. Playing in conjunction with the opening of basketball practice, the Bulldogs registered a straight-sets win over the 25th-ranked Kentucky Wildcats. It was the first win over a ranked foe in 37 years of Bulldog Volleyball.

The season wasn't without close calls that fell the other way. One of State's toughest setbacks of the year came two weekends after the big win over Kentucky when the Bulldogs raced to a 2-0 match lead in the Newell-Grissom Building over defending SEC West champion LSU only to see the Tigers battle back for a closely-contested five-set decision.

State won its final two Sunday matches of the campaign, blanking Auburn on the road before wrapping up the season with a 3-1 win over Alabama that provided another program-first. It marked the first time the Bulldogs had swept the two-match season series against both Auburn and Alabama in the same season.

Mississippi State's two seniors, outside hitter **Caitlin Rance** and middle blocker **Hannah Wilkinson**, played leading roles in the success of coach **Jenny Hazlewood's** third Mississippi State edition.

Rance piled up a career-high 443 kills, second most in the Southeastern Conference in 2011 and third-most in a season at Mississippi State. The Kingwood, Texas, product also registered 11 double-doubles and set career highs with 260 digs and 50 total blocks en route to **second-team All-SEC honors**. Rance, a six-time all-tournament team selection during her MSU career, completed her four-year collegiate career with 1,138 kills, seventh-most in a season at Mississippi State.

Wilkinson, from Elk Point, S.D., enjoyed her most productive year as a Bulldog in 2011. She ranked second on the team with 87

total blocks and backed her 154 kills with .311 hitting, ninth-best in the SEC.

State's improved play at the net showed up in the final Southeastern Conference statistics, where MSU's 2.30 blocks-per-set average ranked as the fourth-best in the league.

Freshman middle blocker **Lainey Wyman** of Plainfield, Ill., played no small role in the Bulldogs' blocking success in 2011. As a rookie Wyman registered 108 total blocks, fourth-most in the SEC. She also led all of the league's freshmen in both blocks and kills (247). She earned a berth on the **2011 SEC All-Freshman team**.

Sophomore setter **Paris Perret**, one of 14 players to draw game-opening court duty for the Bulldogs in 2011, staked her claim as one of the program's top all-time setters. With 1,016 kill-producing sets, the Frisco, Texas, native notched her second consecutive 1,000-assist season, raising her two-year career total to 2,040, sixth-best all-time at Mississippi State.

MORE ACADEMIC HONORS

Mississippi State Volleyball added to its tradition of excellence in the classroom in 2011 when nearhalf of the team earn Southeastern Conference academic honor roll status.

Chanelle Baker, **Hillary Parker**, **Paris Perret**, **Caitlin Rance** and **Faith Steinwedell** represented Mississippi State University on the **2011 SEC Academic Honor Roll** while freshmen **Alex Scott** and **Rachel Williams** carried the Bulldog banner on the MSU **2011-12 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll**. For senior Caitlin Rance, it was her fourth academic all-conference honor, making her the 11th MSU volleyball player to earn that status.

RECORD-SETTING ATTENDANCE

The 2011 campaign was a record-setter at the gate for Mississippi State volleyball.

MSU eclipsed the 1,000 mark in attendance a school-best three times in 2011. The Bulldogs drew 3,024 fans to their opening day match with Southern Illinois, a Newell-Grissom Building volleyball attendance mark.

Later in the campaign in their SEC home opener State hosted the seventh-ranked Florida Gators with a crowd of 1,009 looking on.

But the big turnout of the year took place October 14 in Humphrey Coliseum as the opening act of "Maroon Madness". Mississippi State established a collegiate volleyball attendance mark for the state with 4,525 cheered the Bulldogs on to a straight-sets win over No. 25 Kentucky. It was the first win over a ranked opponent.

MSU averaged 972 fans for its 12 home dates, establishing school marks for average (972) and total (11,665) home attendance.

Dr. Mark E. Keenum

President

Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi Mark E. Keenum became the 19th president of Mississippi State University on January 5, 2009. An MSU alumnus, he returned to Starkville following a distinguished public service career.

Keenum earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in agricultural economics at Mississippi State and joined the faculty in 1984 as a marketing specialist with the MSU Cooperative Extension Service. Two years later, he became a research associate with the Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station at MSU. He completed his doctorate in agricultural economics at Mississippi State in 1988. He then joined the faculty of that department as an assistant professor/economist.

In 1989, Dr. Keenum was named to the Washington, D.C., staff of U.S. Senator Thad Cochran as legislative assistant for Agriculture and Natural Resources. He worked on wide-ranging issues affecting U.S. agriculture, including the 1990, 1996, and 2002 Farm Bills. From 1996-2006, he served as Senator Cochran's chief of staff. In that role, he was the chief adviser to the senator on political, legislative and appropriations issues. He managed all administrative and legislative functions of Sen. Cochran's Washington, D.C., office and three Mississippi offices. He also had oversight of the U.S. Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry and the Committee on Appropriations. He left Capitol Hill in 2008 to become Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture in the George W. Bush Administration. He held the post for two years, leading the Farm Service Agency, the Risk Management Agency and the Foreign Agricultural Service.

While at USDA, Dr. Keenum headed initiatives to combat world hunger and promote capacity-building in developing countries. For his work, he earned the Hunger's Hope Award for Distinguished Public Service from America's Second Harvest, the nation's leading hunger relief charity. At MSU, Dr. Keenum has continued the focus on this issue, creating an International Institute in 2011 to coordinate university involvement in academic and research activities on a global scale. The initiative complements the university's broader service and outreach efforts in communities across Mississippi, the region and the nation.

Under Keenum's leadership, Mississippi State has strengthened its role as the flagship research university in the state. The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching in 2011 classified MSU as a research university with "very high research activity," one of just 108 in the nation and the only such designation in Mississippi.

Dr. Keenum is presiding over a period of record growth at MSU, with enrollment figures setting all-time highs. The totals also include record numbers of freshmen, who report the highest grade point averages in school history.

A \$100 million fund raising campaign was launched in 2009 to secure the resources to provide scholarships for students and for MSU faculty support. Called StatePride, the effort had reported more than \$65 million by Summer 2011 in gifts and pledges. The first awards were distributed in Fall 2010. Dr. Keenum has also led efforts to expand funding for the MSU Promise Program, which provides scholarship assistance to students whose families have limited financial means.

A graduate of Corinth (Miss.) High School, Dr. Keenum earned an associate of arts degree from Northeast Mississippi Community College in Booneville and was a member of the Northeast Tigers football team.

He is married to Rhonda Newman Keenum, a native of Booneville and an MSU graduate. They have four children, including triplets Katie, Mary Phillips and Rett, and Torie.



Scott Stricklin

Director of Athletics

A lifelong dream was fulfilled on May 7, 2010, when Scott Stricklin was formally introduced as Mississippi State's director of athletics, the 16th in school history.

As Stricklin begins to enthusiastically tackle his new job of leading the MSU athletic department, he certainly isn't a stranger to the Bulldog family or college athletics.

A 1992 graduate of Mississippi State, the Jackson, Miss., native's resume is highlighted by 22 years of experience on the collegiate level in various capacities at five different universities. The last two years, he's faithfully served as Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs at his alma mater, overseeing fundraising, football and men's basketball scheduling, managing MSU's all-sport agreement with Adidas, facility planning, and serving as the administrative sport liaison for men's basketball and softball.

It was those types of day-to-day tasks that prepared the personable Stricklin to take over the top seat in the Mississippi State athletic department.

Yet it's a journey that started during his formative days as a dedicated and tireless worker in the media relations department that's led to his highly-respected career coming full circle.

Prior to graduating, Stricklin's stint in the MSU media relations office included three seasons (1990-92) as the media contact for the highly successful and nationally-renowned baseball program. Upon graduation, he was named assistant media relations director at his alma mater.

He continued his climb up the ladder of success when he was named associate media relations director at Auburn, where from 1993-98 he served as the primary baseball contact and the secondary football contact. He also

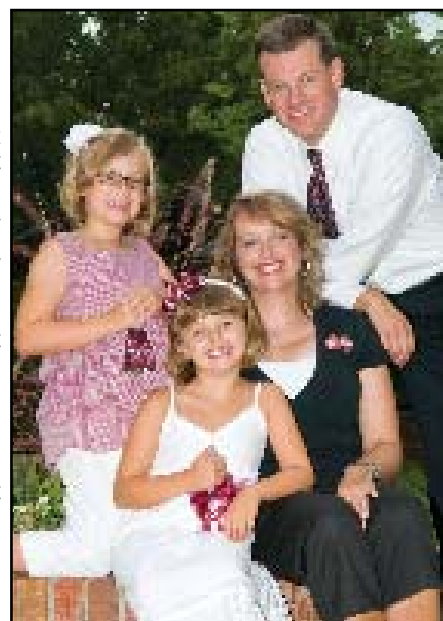
spent the 1993-94 season handling the publicity for the Tigers' nationally-ranked women's basketball team.

In 1998, Stricklin left Auburn to become Assistant Athletics Director at Tulane, where he served as the primary media contact for the Green Wave's 1998 12-0 football team.

Next came a four-year run in the Big 12 Conference at Baylor (1999-2003) as Assistant AD for Communications and Marketing.

Stricklin returned to the Southeastern Conference in 2003 at Kentucky and spent five seasons as the Associate AD for Media Relations, where he oversaw the day-to-day publicity of the tradition-rich Wildcat basketball program. It was his last stop before returning to Mississippi State in the spring of 2008.

Stricklin, 40, is married to the former Anne Howell, the youngest daughter of Basketball Hall of Fame member Bailey Howell. The couple has two daughters, Abby and Sophie.

The Newell-Grissom Building, with a colorful and varied history as a campus landmark that spans seven decades, is in its 16th year as the home for Mississippi State's Volleyball Bulldogs in 2012.

The spacious facility has served as the Bulldogs' on-campus volleyball home since 1997. Current State head coach Jenny Hazelwood was a member of the Mississippi State team that played Georgia (October 3, 1997) in the first volleyball match at the Newell-Grissom Building. Her fourth MSU volleyball edition is scheduled to play 13 matches at the Newell-Grissom Building this fall, including the season-opening MSU Maroon Classic.

Including nearly 600 maroon chair back seats installed in the arena's east stands prior to the start of the 2006 campaign, the volleyball-exclusive facility, featuring 12,000 square feet of hardwood flooring, has arena seating for more than 2,000.

The five most-attended volleyball events at the Newell-Grissom Building have occurred in the last two years. MSU eclipsed the 1,000-mark in attendance twice in 2011, including a facility-record 3,021 that packed the arena August 26 for a season-opening match against Southern Illinois. MSU and Florida were the only SEC teams to eclipse the 3,000 attendance mark in a regular season match in 2011.

Located adjacent to State's football stadium, Davis Wade Stadium, the Newell-Grissom Building has undergone a myriad of significant transformations since its arrival on the MSU scene in the early 1950s.

Since 2004, the facility has seen the addition of an air conditioning system, chair back seating and a new sound system. The locker rooms and team areas have undergone renovations, a concession facility

has been added to service the needs of a growing fan base, and a new sound system and scoreboard have been installed to enhance the game experience.

The latest round in a continuing parade of improvements at the Newell-Grissom Building includes the 2012 installation of a new lighting system that improves the illumination of volleyball-exclusive markings on a resurfaced court and colorful decorative interior and exterior banners that have been installed to give the facility an added Mississippi State

flavor.

As its early nick name, "the cow barn" indicates, the Newell-Grissom Building was designed primarily as a facility for rodeos, livestock shows and equestrian competitions. But it eventually developed into the campus and regional center for concerts and other entertainment events, and the building's size and central location on campus also made it a natural for graduation ceremonies, class registration operations and other university functions.

In 1978, the arena was formally named in honor of two long-time leaders in MSU's animal science department, **Paul F. Newell** (1910) and **E.E. Grissom** (1932). The structure went largely unused in the 1980s and early 1990s and gradually fell into disrepair.

Faced with an expensive "tear it down or fix it up" proposition, the university, partnered with the MSU Athletic Department, embarked in early 1995 on a million dollar renovation project. That initial project included reroofing, the installation of a hardwood floor and a lighting system, the construction of locker rooms and team meeting areas, and the addition of public rest room facilities. The renovated Newell-Grissom Building initially served as an auxiliary practice site for volleyball and both the men's and women's basketball teams at Mississippi State in 1996 while Humphrey Coliseum served as the primary on-campus competition site for all three teams.

The Newell-Grissom Building is the third on-campus home in 38 seasons of intercollegiate volleyball at Mississippi State University. MSU's first volleyball teams competed in McCarthy Gymnasium prior to moving to Humphrey Coliseum in the 1970s.
