
- Played several matches with Tyler Junior College before signing an offer to play with Mississippi State volleyball





# Head Coach • Second Season @MSUCoachFatch

With only one year leading the Maroon and White under his belt, David Mc-Fatrich has already cemented himself as one of the greatest coaches in Mississippi State volleyball history.

McFatrich, who directed Central Arkansas to NCAA Tournament appearances in two of his four seasons as head coach, was named the 11th head coach in Mississippi State volleyball history on January 12, 2015 and since then has led the Bulldogs to one of the most successful seasons in over a decade.

When MSU athletic director Scott Stricklin announced the hire of McFatrich, he knew success was imminent for the volleyball Bulldogs.

"David possesses all of the characteristics of a successful coach," said Stricklin. "He has an aggressive style with high energy and connects well with his student-athletes. He has the vision to be great. He's also a man of good values, and we are excited to have him as a part of the Mississippi State family."

In his first season at the helm, McFatrich led the Bulldogs to a 17-15 record, posting the first winning season at State since 2006 and becoming the first head coach in MSU history to finish with a winning record in their first year. His 17-15 record also matched the finish in his first year at Central Arkansas and marks the best season by a head coach in their first year with the volleyball Bulldogs.

The 17 wins marked the most for MSU since 2006, while the six SEC wins were the most since winning seven conference games in 2011.

McFatrich's Bulldogs started off the season on a hot streak, winning six of their first seven matches and 10 of their first 13, both the best starts since 2006. During that hot start, MSU captured the Maroon Classic and Tiger Invitational championships, marking the first time since 2010 that the Bulldogs won multiple non-conference titles in a season. Included in the Maroon Classic title was McFatrich's 100th-career victory, which came in a sweep of Stetson on Sept. 4.

State kept the good times rolling in Oxford, as McFatrich's squad snapped a six-match losing streak to Ole Miss with a 3-0 victory. The sweep again pointed back to the success in 2006, which is the last time the Bulldogs had done so against the Rebels. It was also only the third time in school history that State had swept its in-state rivals in Oxford, the other two coming in 2005 and 1975.

McFatrich led his squad to a number of other historical accomplishments during the rigorous SEC slate. MSU's sweep of Georgia on Oct. 11 snapped an eight-match losing streak to UGA and marked the first sweep of Georgia for MSU since 1979. McFatrich and his Bulldogs would go on to sweep Georgia later in the season, marking the first season sweep and back-to-back wins against Georgia since 2006-07. It was also State's first win in Athens since 2010 and only the fifth in school history.

The Bulldogs would close the season with three-straight SEC wins, the first time MSU has won three-straight league matches since 2007. A 3-0 home win against LSU marked the first time in school history that State has defeated LSU in Starkville two-straight times. The season-ending 3-1 win against Ole Miss gave MSU its first back-to-back wins against the Rebels since 2009.

McFatrich's team was also dominant on the non-conference side of the schedule. Along with it's two non-conference titles, the Bulldogs finished the non-SEC part of the schedule with 11 wins, the most single-season non-conference wins since earning 13 in 2000.

With his high-energy style of play, McFatrich helped MSU improve greatly in seven different offensive categories. After posting 1,269 kills (10.57 K/S) in 2014, McFatrich's up-tempo offense improved State's numbers to 1,393 kills (12.55 K/S) in 2015. McFatrich's leadership also helped State make major jumps in its setting and serving games, going from 1,184 assists (9.87 A/S) and 115 service aces (0.96 SA/S) in 2014 to 1,308 assists (11.78 A/S) and 158 service aces (1.42 SA/S) in his first season.

State made its biggest showing from the service line, where its 1.42 aces per set stood second in the SEC and its 158 total aces finished fourth. Leading the way for State from the service line was Evie Grace Singleton, one of McFatrich's Central Arkansas stars who made the jounrey to Starkville with him. Singleton

led MSU with 46 aces (2nd SEC, 26th NCAA) and a 0.43 aces per set average (1st SEC, 20th NCAA). Mc-Fatrich's star junior also stood top 10 in the SEC in kills (378, 6th), kills per set (3.53, 6th), points per set (4.13, 6th) and points (441.5, 8th).

McFatrich's influence can be seen in the classroom as well, as the leader of the Bulldogs constantly preaches relentless effort in all aspects of life. The Bulldogs landed five players on the All-SEC Academic Honor Roll in his first season, which is the most on the team since MSU placed five in 2011. The Bulldogs posted a 3.44 GPA in the spring, which set a number of impressive marks, including the highest GPA amongst all MSU sports for the 2015-16 year. The spring semester GPA, led by seven players who posted career-best GPA's in that span, also marked the fourth-best semester in program history.

One Bulldog landed on the 4.0 List (Riley Duzenack), while four earned President's List honors (Duzenack, Emily Howard, Katie Nicholson and Ellen Stuart) and two placed on the Dean's List (Savannah Cressman and Chelsea Duhs).

McFatrich has also made an impact off the court. On the recruiting trail, McFatrich and his staff have signed a number of talented stars that will join the Maroon and White, including seven Bulldogs that played important roles during the successful 2015 season. The Bulldogs' home, Newell-Grissom Building, has also seen a number of improvements since McFatrich's arrival. State's locker room and playing



court underwent major renovations and included the addition of a team film room.

In his four seasons at the helm of the Sugar Bears, McFatrich showed no fear in going toe-to-toe with the nation's elite, annually facing programs such as Penn State, Washington, Florida State, Kansas and Oklahoma. Over the past four years, he has amassed an overall record of 96-36 (.727) with a Southland Conference record of 56-11 (.839).

Also upon his arrival in 2007, UCA's RPI was in the 240's. Since then, the Sugar Bears climbed up to an RPI as high as 44th nationally.

Arriving at UCA in 2007 as an assistant, McFatrich earned a promotion to head coach of the Sugar Bears in 2011. In his eight total seasons, he saw UCA capture nearly 200 victories, a rate of 25 per season.

McFatrich saw his biggest success the last three years, tallying a record of 46-6 (.885) and a Southland Tournament record of 9-2 (.818). The Sugar Bears averaged nearly 27 wins per season, while piling up numerous championships to help build McFatrich's legacy as one of the nation's up-and-coming coaches.

In his eight years at UCA, McFatrich, the 2013 Southland Coach of the Year, produced four Southland Conference Regular Season Championships, two Southland Conference Tournament Championships and four Southland East Division crowns. Individually, McFatrich has produced one ESPN Academic All-American, five Southland Conference Players of the Year, two Southland Liberos of the year, three Southland Freshman of the Year and five Southland Setters of the Year

In addition, Sugar Bear players have captured numerous conference player of the week awards. Twenty-two UCA players have been named All-Southland Conference, with 19 of those earning first-team laurels.

Most recently, McFatrich faced a tall task in 2014 after the graduation of six players, but took the challenge head on. The Sugar Bears played for a berth in the NCAA Tournament for the third-straight season in the Southland Conference tournament finals and reached the 20-win milestone for the seventh time in his eight years with the program.

In 2014, McFatrich's Sugar Bears extend the program's conference winning streak to 38-consecutive matches dating back to 2012, which stands as the longest such streak in Southland Conference history.

McFatrich and UCA finished out 2013 in grand style as the Sugar Bears won their second-straight Southland Conference regular season title, their second-straight conference tournament championship and made their second-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament. UCA posted a 29-4 record, highlighted by a victory against No. 9 Kansas. That squad became the first Southland team in 23 years to capture the regular season and tournament titles in back-to-back years.

Along the way, the Sugar Bears boasted one of the longest winning streaks in the nation at 22 matches, while also finishing the regular season ranked No. 17 in the Volleyblog Seattle Poll and No. 44 in the RPI.

In 2012, McFatrich led UCA to a 30-5 ledger and Southland Conference regular season and tournament titles. The season saw UCA capture a win against Big 12 foe Texas Tech and earn the program's first trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Spanning from 2012-14, McFatrich led the Sugar Bears to 38-straight victories in conference play, the longest such record in Southland Conference histo-



ry. Also, McFatrich's 59 total victories between the 2012-13 seasons stood only second to NCAA national champion Penn State for wins during that span.

Success in the classroom has also been prevalent in McFatrich's time at Central Arkansas. From 2011-13, UCA volleyball earned a perfect NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) of 1,000. In that time, UCA has also placed a number of players on the Southland All-Academic team, including the 2012 Student-Athlete of the Year, which recognizes the top student-athlete both on and off the court.

Prior to being named head coach at Central Arkansas, McFatrich spent four seasons as an assistant coach of the Sugar Bears under three-time Southland Coach of the Year, Steven McRoberts. From 2007-10, McFatrich oversaw a number of successes at UCA, as the program was elevated into the national spotlight. The year before McFatrich arrived at UCA, the Sugar Bears finished 19-17. In his four seasons as an assistant, UCA went 103-27. Also in that time, UCA saw 14 All-Southland honors, 12 Academic All-Southland honors, three Southland Players of the Year, three Southland Freshmen of the Year and the 2009 ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-American.

McFatrich is the former Captain & Setter for the 1988 Athletes In Action International Volleyball Team. Touring throughout Latin America, he helped lead the team to a 23-2 record. He has four gold and two silver medals as a member of the Canada Masters Volleyball Team (2009-present), which competes in the U.S. Open each summer. They also finished fifth in the World Masters Games in the summer of 2013.

McFatrich, a graduate of the University of Arkansas, earned a Bachelor's of Science in business

administration in 1986 and a Master's Degree in exercise science in 1988. A native of Woodbridge, Va., he and his wife Sonya have three children, Luke (18), Elle (15) and Sami (11).

Since entering coaching in 2010, Brittany Newberry has experienced nothing but success on and off the court. Her first year at Mississippi State was no different.

The DeSoto, Texas, native helped lead the Bulldogs to a 17-15 record in 2015, posting the first winning season at State since 2006. The 17 wins marked the most for MSU since 2006, while State's six SEC wins were the most since winning seven conference matches in 2011.

While serving as the Bulldogs' coordinator of travel and camps, as well as the teams Adidas contact, Newberry has been instrumental to the development of the team on the court as well.

Along with husband John Newberry and head coach David McFatrich, Newberry and the Bulldogs got off to a hot start, winning six of their first seven matches and 10 of their first 13, both the best starts since 2006. That impressive stretch to start the season also included two non-conference tournament titles (Maroon Classic and Tiger Invitational), marking the first time since 2010 that MSU had won multiple non-conference tourneys in a season.

With the help of Newberry, the Bulldogs accomplished a number of impressive feats in SEC play, with the sweetest coming in the two matches against in-state rival Ole Miss. MSU first traveled to Ole Miss and snapped a six-match losing streak to the Rebels, claiming a sweep for the first time since 2006 against Ole Miss and for only the third time in Oxford (1975 and 2005). The Bulldogs wrapped up the year with even more success against it's foe to the north, ending the season with a 3-1 victory against Ole Miss to clinch the winning season and marking the first back-to-back wins against the Rebels since 2009.

Between Newberry's extensive knowledge of the game and passion for her players, there was no doubt that the Bulldogs would improve from the 2014 campaign. With the help of Newberry and the State coaching staff, the Bulldogs made significant jumps in seven offensive categories.

The Newberry effect can be seen in the classroom as well, as the Bulldog assistant has relentlessly pushed her players to achieve greatness both on and off the court. The Bulldogs landed five players on the All-SEC Academic Honor Roll in her first season, which is the most on the team since MSU landed five in 2011. The Bulldogs posted a 3.44 GPA in the spring, which set a number of impressive marks, including the highest GPA amongst all MSU sports for the 2015-16 year. The spring semester GPA, led by seven players who posted career-best GPA's in that span, also marked the fourth-best semester in program history.

Newberry came to Starkville after spending the previous three seasons on David McFatrich's staff at Central Arkansas. In that time, the Sugar Bears made consecutive NCAA Tournaments in 2012-13 and won back-to-back Southland Conference regular season and tournament championships, the first team in the league to do so in 23 years.

In that two-year span, UCA also went 59-9, the second-most wins in Division I during that period behind only the NCAA National Champions Penn State.

During her time on the bench at UCA, the Sugar Bears defeated several Top 25 teams, broke into the Top 45 nationally in RPI and maintained perfect Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores. Individually, she helped produce two Southland Conference Players of the Year, one Student-Athlete of the Year, two Setters of the Year, one Libero of the Year and seven First Team All-Southland selections. Last season saw UCA earn its first AVCA All-American in program history.

Newberry brings over 15 years of volleyball experience to the Maroon and White. Her coaching career began at the middle school level, leading to her being named the head volleyball coach at Conway Christian High School in January of 2010. In only her second season at the helm, Newberry led CCHS to a conference runner-up finish and a third-place finish in the state tournament. Both stand as the best finish the program has ever achieved.

As a player, Newberry was a member of the prestigious Texas Advantage Volleyball Club in Arlington, Texas, for three years. In her final season, she earned a spot on the 18's National Team.

A native of DeSoto, Texas, Newberry graduated from UCA in 2008 with a bachelor's degree in business administration and completed her master's degree in teaching in 2014. Brittany is married to current MSU volleyball assistant coach, John Newberry.

# Graduate Assistant Coach • Second Season @MarCollins3

One of the most decorated players in Central Arkansas volleyball history, Marissa Collins is in her second season as a graduate assistant coach under her former head coach David McFatrich at Mississippi State.

Collins helps oversee the Bulldogs practices and gameplanning for matches, while helping run the day-to-day operations of the program, making sure the players and coaches are fully equipped for success.

In her first season in Starkville, Collins helped the Bulldogs to one of the most impressive seasons the program has had in recent years. MSU finished the 2015 campaign with a 17-15 record, the first winning season in school history since the 2006 season. Of those 17 wins, 10 came within the friendly confines of the Newell-Grissom Building, tying for the most in program history (2006).

Under the leadership of Collins and the entire Bulldog staff, State was able to reel off a number of impressive wins, including a season sweep of in-state rival Ole Miss and the other Bulldogs in the Southeastern Conference, Georgia.

Her work with MSU's setters helped the Bulldog offense best the 2014 squad in seven different offensive categories as McFatrich worked to install an up-tempo and aggressive style of play in Starkville.

Collins rejoined McFatrich after playing for him for three seasons from 2011-13, where she earned numerous honors while also setting a number of records along the way. She also rejoinsed assistant coaches John and Brittany Newberry, whom she played under from 2012-13.

Collins began her UCA career playing under 10-time conference coach of the year Steven McRoberts, with McFatrich as his top assistant. Collins played and started in all 36 matches that season, earning First Team All-SLC honors and becoming the first player in SLC history to win Southland Conference Freshman of the Year and Setter of the Year in the same season. She finished the year leading UCA and standing 15th in the nation with 11.54 assists per set and recorded the second most assists in a season in school history with 1,419.

In McFatrich's first season at the helm of the Sugar Bears, Collins kept her success rolling, making 27 starts and playing in 29 matches. She chalked up 1,448 assists and average 10.4 per set, which stood second in the conference, earning her All-Southland Second Team honors. She also reached the 60-assist mark in three matches that season, with a season high of 61 against McNeese State (Oct. 13, 2011).

Her junior campaign saw her play and start in 35 matches, as she led the SLC and was third in the nation with 12.42 assists per set (1,577 total), helping lead UCA to Southland Regular Season and Tournament titles and the school's first NCAA Tournament showing. Her success on the court earned her the 2012 Southland Setter of the Year honor, while also landing her on the 2012 All-Southland First Team and All-Tournament Team. She was also the SLC Offensive Player of the Week in back-to-back weeks.

Collins capped her UCA career in stellar fashion, highlighted by becomign the first player in SLC history to land the Southland Player of the Year and Setter of the Year awards in the same season while leading the Sugar Bears to their second-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. Her 12.07 assists per set led the Southland Conference and was good for fourth in the NCAA. The senior led UCA to a perfect 18-0 league record, helping the Sugar Bears earn their second-straight SLC Regular Season and Tournament championships.

The Pearland, Texas, native went on to play professionally in Sweden after her career at UCA came to a close. Collins was a two-time All-TGCA All-State selection for Pearland High School before taking to the collegiate ranks. The daughter of Tim and Lisa Collins, Marissa was born on March 18, 1992.

1992 and 1993 were banner years for **Ashlye Davis**, as she landed in several season top-five categories, including holding the record for most block assists in a year with 120 in 1992.







#### | FACILITIES | NEWELL-GRISSOM BUILDING



The Newell-Grissom Building, with a colorful and varied history as a campus landmark that spans seven decades, is in its 19th year as the home for Mississippi State's Volleyball Bulldogs in 2015.

The spacious facility has served as the Bulldogs' on-campus volleyball home since 1997. Mississippi State played Georgia (October 3, 1997) in the first volleyball match at the Newell-Grissom Building. Now, 18 years later, first-year head coach David McFatrich will lead the Bulldogs in a total of 16 home matches, which also includes hosting the Bulldog Invitational and the Maroon Classic to start the season.

Including nearly 600 maroon chair back seats installed in the arena's east stands prior to the start of the 2006 campaign, the volleyball-exclusive facility, featuring 12,000 square feet of hardwood flooring, has arena seating for more than 2,000.

Nine of the ten most-attended volleyball events at the Newell-Grissom Building have occurred in the last five years. MSU eclipsed the 1,000-mark in attendance twice in 2011, including a facility-record 3,021 that packed the arena August 26 for a season-opening match against Southern Illinois. MSU and Florida were the only SEC teams to eclipse the 3,000 attendance mark in a regular season match in 2011.

In 2013, the Bulldogs posted four of the top ten attendance figures. MSU had the second-highest attendance in program history as well in 2013, when 1,633 packed State's home venue in an ESPNU broadcast

against in-state rival Ole Miss. Last season, MSU posted three attendance showings in The Griss' top 15.

Located adjacent to State's football stadium, Davis Wade Stadium, the Newell-Grissom Building has undergone a myriad of significant transformations since its arrival on the MSU scene in the early 1950s.

Since 2004, the facility has seen the addition of an air conditioning system, chair back seating and a new sound system. The locker rooms and team areas have undergone renovations, a concession facility has been added to service the needs of a growing fan base, and a new sound system and scoreboard have been installed to enhance the game experience.

In 2012, The Griss saw the installation of a new lighting system that improves the illumination of volley-ball-exclusive markings on a resurfaced court and colorful decorative interior and exterior banners that have been installed to give the facility an added Mississippi State flavor.

Most recently, The Griss received a number of upgrades, including one of the few gray courts, as the Newell-Grissom floor was stripped and resurfaced. Other upgrades included new graphics inside and outside of the facility, new paint jobs throughout the building and renovated locker rooms.

As its early nick name, "the cow barn" indicates, the Newell-Grissom Building was designed primarily as a facility for rodeos, livestock shows and equestrian competitions. But it eventually developed into the

campus and regional center for concerts and other entertainment events, and the building's size and central location on campus also made it a natural for graduation ceremonies, class registration operations and other university functions.

In 1978, the arena was formally named in honor of two long-time leaders in MSU's animal science department, Paul F. Newell (1910) and E.E. Grissom (1932). The structure went largely unused in the 1980s and early 1990s and gradually fell into disrepair.

Faced with an expensive "tear it down or fix it up" proposition, the university, partnered with the MSU Athletic Department, embarked in early 1995 on a million dollar renovation project. That initial project included reroofing, the installation of a hardwood floor and a lighting system, the construction of locker rooms and team meeting areas, and the addition of public rest room facilities. The renovated Newell-Grissom Building initially served as an auxiliary practice site for volleyball and both the men's and women's basketball teams at Mississippi State in 1996 while Humphrey Coliseum served as the primary on-campus competition site for all three teams.

The Newell-Grissom Building is the third on-campus home in 40 seasons of intercollegiate volleyball at Mississippi State University. MSU's first volleyball teams competed in McCarthy Gymnasium prior to moving to Humphrey Coliseum in the 1970s.

## THE UNIVERSITY

Mississippi State is a comprehensive doctoral-degree-granting institution offering a diverse student body a wide range of opportunities and challenges for learning and growth.

The largest university in the Magnolia State, MSU has a statewide enrollment of more than 21,000 students. and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Calleges to award baccalaureate, masters, specialists and doctorate degrees.

Established in 1878 as the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Mississippi, the university has traditional strengths in engineering and scientific agriculture but has evolved into a comprehensive institution with a diverse array of programs in teaching, research and service.


The University began as The Agricultural and Mechanical College of the State of Mississippi, one of the national Land-Grant Colleges established after Congress had passed the Morrill Act in 1862. It was created by the Mississippi Legislature on February 28, 1878, to fulfill the mission of offering training in "agriculture, horticulture and the mechanical arts . . . without excluding other scientific and classical studies, including military tactics."

The College received its first students in the fall of 1880 in the presidency of Confederate General Stephen D. Lee. In 1887 Congress passed the Hatch Act, which provided for the establishment of the Agricultural Experiment Station in 1888. Two other pieces of federal legislation provided funds for extending the mission of the College: in 1914, the Smith-Lever Act called for "instruction in practical agriculture and home economics to persons not attendant or resident," thus creating the state-wide effort which led to Extension offices in every county in the State; and, in 1917, the Smith-Hughes Act provided for the training of teachers in vocational education.

By 1932, when the Legislature renamed the College as Mississippi State College, it consisted of the Agricultural Experiment Station (1887), the College of Engineering (1902), the College of Agriculture (1903), the School of Industrial Pedagogy (1909), the School of General Science (1911), the College of Business and Industry (1915), the Mississippi Agricultural Extension Service (1915), and the Division of Continuing Education, (1919). Further, in 1926 the College had received its first accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

By 1958, when the Legislature again renamed the College, as Mississippi State University, the Office of Graduate Studies had been organized (1936), doctoral degree programs had begun (1951), the School of Forest Resources had been established (1954), and the College of Arts and Sciences had been created (1956).

The College of Architecture admitted its first students in 1973. The College of Veterinary Medicine admitted its first class in 1977, and the School of Accountancy was established in 1979.





## POINTS OF PRIDE AT MSU

- The Federal Aviation Administration has selected MSU to operate a new National Center of Excellence for Unmanned Aircraft Systems.
- MSU's Maroon Volunteer Center connects nearly 5,000 students, faculty and staff volunteers to 60 community and campus pertners, performing more than 14,700 community service hours each year.
- One of the world's leading aerospace companies, Boeing Co., has selected MSU to host its Stitched Resin Infused Composite Research Center.



## **ACADEMICS AND STUDENT LIFE**

Mississippi State students consistently earn honors such as the prestigious Harry S. Truman Scholarship, awarded for those who will enter public service, and, with 16 Truman Scholars to date, the university has been recognized as one of 38 Truman Honor Institution.

Recently initiated programs are providing opportunities to develop leadership potential and global study options.

The university's Global Leadership Continuum provides "cradle-to-CEO" programming designed to develop leadership across a "global" spectrum that begins with high school and continues through the university experience and into professional life. Included are the Young Guns Leadership Camp for rising high school seniors; the Day One Leadership Community for incoming freshmen, focusing on shared academic and service experiences; and the highly competitive Appalachian Leadership Honors Program for sophomores and juniors.

To complement these efforts, the university has launched a minor in leadership studies open to students in all majors. A university honor code adopted in 2007 institutionalizes a campus culture of integrity and personal responsibility in academic studies. Through the Global Leadership Program, students may experience significantly expanded study abroad opportunities.





# 2015-16: HIGHEST DIRECTORS' CUP FINISH IN SCHOOL HISTORY

- Behind a banner campaign that saw seven teams finish among the Top 25 of their respective sports, Mississippi State Athletics earned its highest Learfield Directors' Cup finish ever by taking 44th for the 2015-16 athletic year.
- The 44th-place finish eclipsed the Bulldogs' previous best of 49th in 2012-13 and was the second Top 50 finish in school history. The Bulldogs have scored in the Top 55 for a school-record four straight years.
- In total, eight sports reached NCAA postseason play with four of those setting or tying a school record NCAA Championship finish. Five sports secured Top 16 finishes, a first in MSU history.
- The 44th place was also the highest finish ever by a Division I school in the state of Mississippi.
- In 2015-16, MSU broke school single-season total and/or average attendance records in five sports: soccer, football, women's basketball, softball and baseball.
- Three teams women's basketball, women's tennis and baseball set program records for most SEC victories in a season.



Marta Freitas was crowned the 2016 NCAA Outdoors 1500m national champion, helping the Bulldogs to their highest NCAA Championships finish ever (13th). Freitas also qualified for the 2016 Summer Olympics for her country of Portugal.



Women's basketball reached the NCAA Sweet 16 for the second time in program history and set a school record for victories with 28 as record crowds packed Humphrey Coliseum.



Football recorded back-to-back seasons of at least nine wins for the first time in school history, capping the year with a Belk Bowl trophy after defeating NC State.



## THE BULLDOGS

Mississippi State University's athletic teams are called Bulldogs, a name earned and maintained over the decades by the tough, tenacious play of student-athletes wearing the Maroon and White. The official school mascot is an American Kennel Club registered English Bulldog, given the inherited title of 'Bully'.

As with most universities, Mississippi State University teams answered to different nicknames through the years. The first squads representing Mississippi A&M College were proud to be called Aggies. When the school officially became Mississippi State College in 1932, the nickname Maroons, for MSU's uniform color, gained prominence. Bulldogs became the official title for State teams in 1961, not long after State College was granted university status.

Yet references to school teams and athletes as Bulldogs actually go back to early in the century, and this nickname was used almost interchangeably with both Aggies and Maroons, since at least 1905.

On November 30 of that year, the A&M football team shut out their arch-rivals from the University of Mississippi 11-0 in Jackson, Miss. The campus newspaper, The Reflector, reported: "After the game, filled with that emotion that accompanies every great victory, there was nothing left for the cadets to do but to complete the great victory by showing sympathy for the dead athletic spirit of the University, by having a military funeral parade.

"A coffin was secured, decorated with University colors and a bulldog pup placed on top. It was then placed on the shoulders of a dozen cadets, and the procession started down Capitol Street, preceded by the brass band playing a very pathetic funeral march."

Other newspaper reports of the victory commented on the 'bulldog' style of play by the A&M eleven, and the Bulldog was soon publicly accepted as a school athletic symbol. Accounts of a 1926 pep rally in Meridian, Miss., had another bulldog parading with students.



## **BULLY XXI**

At Super Bulldog Weekend 2015 this past April, the Bulldog family celebrated the passing of the harness, as Bully XXI, known as "Jak," accepted mascot duties from his father Bully XX, fondly called "Champ."

Jak's formal name is "Cristil's Golden Prince," and the American Kennel Club registered English Bulldog was born in October 2014, soon after the legendary Jack Cristil passed away. Naming the newest Bully for the legendary Voice of the Bulldogs who called football and basketball games for 58 years was a fitting choice.

While Jak enters the 2015 season less than a year old, Champ turns 10 around the 2015 season opener. When mascot handlers realized Bully was getting toward retiring age, though he's still in good health, a female bulldog was selected based on her pedigree and history. Following the female's selection, litter of mascot-sired puppies were evaluated.

Jak's responsibilities will be similar to those of previous mascots, she said.



## **OFFICIAL MASCOT IN 1935**

Use as an official game mascot began in 1935 when coach Major Ralph Sasse, on 'orders' from his team, went to Memphis, Tenn., to select a bulldog. Ptolemy, a gift of the Edgar Webster family, was chosen and the Bulldogs promptly defeated Alabama 20.7

A litter-mate of Ptolemy became the first mascot called 'Bully' shortly after Sasse's team beat mighty Army 13-7 at West Point that same year - perhaps the greatest victory in MSU football history. But Bully I earned other fame the hard way, in 1939 when a campus bus cut short his career.

Days of campus mourning followed, as Bully lay in state in a glass coffin. A half-mile funeral procession accompanied by the Famous Maroon Band and three ROTC battalions went to Scott Field where Bully was buried under the bench at the 50-yard line. Even Life magazine covered the event. Other Bullys have since been buried by campus dorms, fraternity houses, and also at the football stadium.

For years Bully was a target for kidnappers, the last incident occurring prior to the 1974 State-Ole Miss game. The Bulldog team won anyway, 31-13. While early Bullys once roamed campus freely or lived in fraternities, today the official university mascot is housed at the School of Veterinary Medicine when not on duty at State home football games. For all their fierce appearance and reputation, today's mascot bulldogs are good-natured, friendly animals and favorites with children.

A student wearing a Bulldog suit, also answering to Bully, is part of the MSU cheerleading team and assists in stirring up State spirit at games and pep rallies.







#### THE COWBELL

The most unique and certainly the most resounding symbol of Mississippi State University tradition is the cowbell. Despite decades of attempts by opponents and authorities to banish it from scenes of competition, diehard State fans still celebrate Bulldog victories loudly and proudly with the distinctive sound of ringing cowbells.

The precise origin of the cowbell as a fixture of Mississippi State sports tradition remains unclear to this day. The best records have cowbells gradually introduced to the MSU sports scene in the late 1930s and early 1940s, coinciding with the 'golden age' of Mississippi State football success prior to World War II.

The most popular legend is that during a home football game between State and archrival Ole Miss, a jersey cow wandered onto the playing field. Mississippi State soundly whipped the Rebels that Saturday, and State College students immediately adopted the cow as a good luck charm.

Students are said to have continued bringing a cow to football games for a while, until the practice was eventually discontinued in favor of bringing just the cow's bell.

Whatever the origin, it is certain by the 1950s cowbells were common at MSU games, and by the 1960s were established as the special symbol of MSU. Ironically, the cowbell's popularity grew most rapidly during the long years when State football teams were rarely successful. Flaunting this anachronism from the 'aggie' days was a proud response by students and alumni to outsider scorn of the university's 'cow college' history.

In the 1960s two MSU professors, Earl W. Terrell and Ralph L. Reeves, obliged some students by welding handles on the bells so they could be rung with more convenience and authority. By 1963 the demand for these long-handled cowbells could not be filled by home workshops alone. So, at the suggestion of Reeves, the Student Association bought bells in bulk and the Industrial Education Club agreed to weld on handles. In 1964, the MSU Bookstore began marketing these cowbells with a portion of profits returning to these student organizations.

Today many styles of cowbells are available on campus and around Starkville, with the top-of-the-line being a heavy chrome-plated model with a full Bulldog figurine handle. But experts insist the best and loudest results are produced by a classic long-handled, bicycle-grip bell made of thinner and tight-lv-welded shells.

Cowbells decorate offices and homes of Mississippi State alumni, and are passed down through generations of Bulldog fans. But they were not heard at Southeastern Conference games - not legally, at least - since the 1974 adoption of a conference rule against 'artificial noisemakers' at football and basketball games. On a 9-1 vote, SEC schools ruled cowbells a disruption and banned them. The ban was lifted prior to the 2010 season.

The ban did little harm to the cowbell's popularity, or to prevent cowbells from being heard outside stadiums in which the Bulldogs are playing. They are now heard at non-conference football contests, as well as other sporting events on campus.



## MAROON & WHITE

Maroon and White are the distinctive colors of Mississippi State University athletic teams, dating back over a century to the very first football game ever played by the school's student-athletes.

On November 15, 1895, the first Mississippi A&M football team was preparing for a road trip to Jackson, Tenn., to play Southern Baptist University (now called Union University) the following day. Since every college was supposed to have its own uniform colors, the A&M student body requested that the school's team select a suitable combination.

Considering this choice to be an honor, the inaugural State team gave the privilege to team captain W.M. Matthews. Accounts report that without hesitation Matthews chose Maroon and White.

# DR. MARK KEENUM UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

Dr. Mark Everett Keenum became Mississippi State's 19th president Jan. 5, 2009, following a distinguished public service career.

In his eighth year of tenure, Dr. Keenum has guided Mississippi State to unprecedented heights. The university has experienced record enrollment growth to more than 21,000 students and a freshman class for fall 2016 of over 3,600. Mississippi State has awarded more than 4,000 degrees at all levels for five straight years.

The campus has expanded and improved on Keenum's watch. Chief among those projects has been The Mill at MSU – a modern conference center housed in the former Cooley Building. Construction of a new classroom building with built-in parking and two new residence halls including Nusz Hall (which will house the G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Center for America's Veterans), and a fourth-floor expansion to Mitchell Memorial Library to house the Ulysses S. Grant Presidential Library. New projects launching over the next two years includes a new Department of Music building and the completion of an Animal and Dairy Science/Poultry Science complex for the Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine.

Fundraising has reached all-time record levels. MSU's current Infinite Impact capital campaign reached its \$600 million goal this year, three years ahead of schedule. Due to that unprecedented success, the university announced a new private endowment goal—\$1 billion by 2020—the largest campaign goal ever for an educational institution in Mississippi. During his tenure, Dr. Keenum has been instrumental in expanding the MSU Promise Program, which provides need-based scholarship assistance to Mississippi students whose families have limited financial means.

Mississippi State is ranked by the National Science Foundation as a "Top 100" research institution. The most recent research success has been MSU's designation as the Federal Aviation Administration's National Center of Excellence for Unmanned Aircraft Systems and Boeing's decision to locate a composite research center at MSU's Raspet Flight Research Laboratory.

Dr. Keenum travels frequently to Washington, D.C., meeting with Congressional leaders and federal agency heads to pursue research opportunities and broaden the university's influence on the national level. He has also worked closely with state leaders in support of higher education in Mississippi.

Keenum serves as chairman of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools' Commission on Colleges' Executive Council. SACS-COC is the recognized regional accrediting body in the 11 U.S. Southern states (Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia) and in Latin America for those institutions of higher education that award associate, baccalaureate, master's or doctoral degrees.

In 2016, Keenum was elected president of the Southeastern Conference where he is a member of the SEC Executive Committee and continues to serve on the SEC's Content Committee that oversees the SEC Network. He also represents the SEC as a member of the College Football Playoff's (CFP) Board of Managers.

A graduate of Mississippi State with degrees in agricultural economics, Keenum's interest in international food security has strengthened the university's contributions to global economic sustainability. In 2014, he was appointed vice chairman of the Foundation for Food and Agricultural Research by U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Thomas J. Vilsack. That same year along with other university presidents, he signed the Presidents' Commitment to Food and Nutrition Security at the United Nations in New York City. This marks the first time universities around the world began to share a collective focus on ending food insecurity.

Dr. Keenum began his career at MSU as a faculty member with the Extension Service and the Department of Agricultural Economics. He went on to serve as chief of staff to U.S. Senator Thad Cochran in Washington, D.C., and was Under Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture prior to returning home to Mississippi State.

He graduated from Corinth (MS) High School and earned an associate of arts degree from Northeast Mississippi Community College in Booneville and was a member of the Northeast Tigers football team.

Dr. Keenum is married to the former Rhonda Newman of Booneville, also an MSU graduate. They have four children: Rett, Mary Phillips, Katie and Torie.

# SCOTT STRICKLIN DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Scott Stricklin has overseen a period of unprecedented success in Bulldog Athletics since being named Director of Athletics at Mississippi State in 2010. With a focus on the student-athlete, a commitment to great integrity, and a dedication to promoting MSU aggressively, Stricklin has facilitated a stretch of unparalleled milestones in academics, postseason play, fan attendance and fundraising, and marketing innovation.

With an investment of nearly \$140 million in facilities, a strong roster of successful coaches, and significant increases in Bulldog Club membership and donations, MSU Athletics has achieved the highest-ever Learfield Director's Cup finish (44th in 2015-16) for any school from the Magnolia State, while consistently seeing the majority of its teams compete in post-season championships.

In an era that has seen 30-consecutive sellouts at Davis Wade Stadium and impressive football facility enhancements, Coach Dan Mullen's team has played in six-consecutive bowl games, while the Bulldogs spent five-straight weeks in 2014 ranked No. 1 in the polls for the first time in school history.

The sports of tennis, baseball, basketball, softball, men's and women's golf and track and field have each excelled and advanced to NCAA postseason play under Stricklin's leadership.

In 2015-16, eight sports advanced to NCAA postseason play, with seven finishing ranked in the Top 25. Eleven first- or second-team All-America honors were won, while MSU broke single-season total and/or average attendance records in five sports (soccer, football, women's basketball, softball and baseball). Two sports – baseball and women's basketball – earned the opportunity to host NCAA postseason play. In addition, MSU won individual track and field national titles with Curtis Thompson (javelin) and Marta Freitas (1500m run).

All this success unfolded after Mississippi State sports advanced 11 teams to NCAA postseason play in 2014-15, with eight earning Top 25 rankings during the season, including the women's golf team, which ascended all the way to No. 1 in the fall. The year was capped by All-American Rhianwedd Price winning the 1500-meter run at the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships in Oregon, one year after Brandon McBride claimed the crown in the 800-meter run and two years removed from the baseball team playing for the national championship in Omaha.

In addition, 2014-15 also saw two MSU coaches earn SEC Coach of the Year honors in Mullen and Vic Schaefer, who led the Bulldogs to a school record 27 wins en route to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

In the classroom, Bulldog students continue to excel. In the 2015-16 academic year, Mississippi State's men and women athletes posted a combined GPA of 2.99 (second highest in school history), while 182 of the 340 Bulldog student-athletes had a 3.0 or better. Also in 2016, Bulldog students again excelled in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate, with all 16 sports far exceeding the minimum standard, with eight teams posting a perfect score.

Stricklin, who was named Under Armour's Athletics Director of the Year in April 2016, has overseen record fundraising for Bulldog Athletics, which has produced new facilities such as the \$11.7 million Mize Pavilion at Humphrey Coliseum, the \$25 million Leo W. Seal Jr. Football Complex, as well as \$75 million in expansion and upgrades to Davis Wade Stadium that were completed prior to the start of the 2014 campaign.

The Davis Wade Stadium expansion and renovation pushed capacity to 61,337. In addition to innovative premium seating options, a new brick facade and updated west concourse, renovated restrooms and concessions, now greets fans attending games at historic Scott Field.

This past Spring, a \$6 million renovation concluded on both the tennis and softball complexes, with Nusz Park playing host to the SEC Softball Tournament.

Next June, a massive \$55 million upgrade to Dudy Noble Field will begin, making it the premier ballpark in all of college baseball.

In addition, construction is nearly completed for the new \$2.2 million Mississippi State Golf Center at Old Waverly, one of the South's premier golf courses. The project includes a 6,300-square foot team clubhouse with locker rooms, players' lounge, coaches' offices and indoor putting center, along with a 2,431-square foot indoor hitting bay.

Stricklin's vision also drew attention when he announced the university was making fiscal education for student-athletes a priority as part of the department's Life Skills curriculum

His attention to detail has also proven to be vital in the hiring process, as he received rave reviews with the hiring of men's basketball coach Ben Howland, who comes to MSU after leading Northern Arizona, Pittsburgh and UCLA to the NCAA Tournament, including 3 straight Final Four appearances with the Bruins.

In addition to engaging with Bulldog fans through personal interactions and social media, Stricklin has also emerged as a regional and national leader in college athletics. He serves as chair of the SEC's Working Group on Fan Experience, and has served as the SEC's representative on the NCAA Division I Leadership Council.

Stricklin certainly wasn't a stranger to the Bulldog family or college athletics when he took over the reins at State in 2010.

A 1992 graduate of Mississippi State, the Jackson, Miss., native's resume is highlighted by 28 years of experience on the collegiate level in various capacities at five different universities. In the two years prior to becoming athletic director, he served as Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs at his alma mater, overseeing fundraising, football and men's basketball scheduling, managing MSU's all-sport agreement with Adidas, facility planning, and serving as the administrative sport liaison for men's basketball and softball.

It was those types of day-to-day tasks that prepared the personable Stricklin to take over the top seat in the Mississippi State athletic department. Yet it's a journey that started during his formative days as a dedicated and tireless worker in the Mississippi State media relations department that has led to his highly-respected career coming full circle.

Prior to graduating, Stricklin's stint in the MSU media relations office included three seasons (1990-92) as the media contact for the nationally-renown baseball program. Upon graduation, he was named Assistant Media Relations Director at his alma mater.

In 1993, he was named Associate Media Relations Director at Auburn, where he served from 1993-98. In 1998, Stricklin left Auburn to become Assistant Athletics Director at Tulane, where he served as the primary media contact for the Green Wave's 1998 12-0 football team. Next came a four-year run in the Big 12 Conference at Baylor (1999-2003) as Assistant AD for Communications and Marketing.

In 2003, Stricklin returned to the Southeastern Conference at Kentucky and spent five seasons as the Associate AD for Media Relations, where he oversaw the day-to-day publicity of the tradition-rich Wildcat basketball program. It was his last stop before returning to Mississippi State in the spring of 2008.

Stricklin, 46, is married to the former Anne Howell, the youngest daughter of Basketball Hall of Fame member Bailey Howell. The couple has two daughters, Abby and Sophie.
