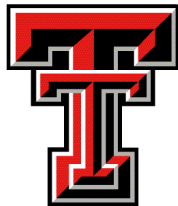

FOUR THINGS TO KNOW

1

The Red Raiders picked up the No. 1 transfer class in the offseason headlined by reigning National Player of the Year NiJaree Canady. Along with Canady, Glasco added Makayla Garcia (UT-Tyler), Lauren Allred, Victoria Valdez, Alexa Langeliers, Mihyia Davis, Chloe Riassetto (all from ULL), Alana Johnson (Washington) and Katie Lott (OSU).

Each of these players have postseason experience and eight of them were named to All-Conference or NFCA All-Region teams at one point in their careers.

Along with their highly-touted transfer class, Glasco and staff were able to retain the No. 2 recruiting class in the country, according to Extra Innings Softball. Pitchers Brenlee Gonzales, Samantha Lincoln and Bailey Lindemuth look to add depth behind Canady and Riassetto.

Position players Sydney Shiller, Anya German, Hailey Toney, Cassie Johnson and Kiley Huffman also make up the class. Toney and Lincoln were also named to D1Softball's D100 Freshman Watch List ahead of the season and Gonzales and Lindemuth joined those two on Softball America's Freshman Watch List.

With all the new faces, one thing that gets lost is the return of three productive starters from last season's team that was on the doorstep of getting Texas Tech back into postseason play.

Raegan Jennings, Logan Halleman and Demi Elder remained in the scarlett and black after posting impressive numbers last season. Jennings and Halleman were named to the All-Big 12 Freshman Team last season. Elder had a career year last season, posting highs in batting average, runs, hits, doubles, triples, home runs, RBI, total bases, slugging percentage, on-base percentage and walks.

Four new coaches joined the staff this offseason headed by Gerry Glasco. Glasco comes to Tech after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Lafayette where he amassed a record of 300-88 and went to at least the NCAA Regional round all eligible seasons (COVID-19). Glasco brought along Hunter Veach who helped the Ragin' Cajuns lead the country in double plays, his daughter Tara Archibald who has a great track record with pitchers and was the head coach at Eastern Illinois and Kayla Kowalik who was an All-American at Kentucky.

- July 16**
- Tech signs Lubbock native and UT-Tyler transfer Makayla Garcia.
- July 22**
- Tech signs Louisiana-Lafayette transfer Alexa Langeliers.
- July 25**
- Tech signs reigning National Player of the Year NiJaree Canady to roster.
- August 2**
- Glasco makes final addition to team with the signing of freshman Anya German to the roster.
- September 3**
- Glasco finalizes coaching staff with the hiring of assistant coach Kayla Kowalik and adding Maddy Wright as a graduate assistant.
- December 16**
- Tech Athletics announces the selling out of season tickets for softball. This was the first season they were offered and soldout within a week.

OFFSEASON FOR THE BOOKS

You would be hard pressed to find a program across the NCAA that had as much of a turnaround in one offseason than Texas Tech Softball. The team was the first team out of the 2024 NCAA Tournament but only three players from that team remain. Head Coach Gerry Glasco was hired on June 20 and has done nothing but work since. He put together the best transfer portal class in the country headlined by reigning Player of the Year NiJaree Canady and Sun Belt Player of the Year Mihyia Davis along with bringing in four top-tier assistant coaches to his staff.

For a program that has made just six postseason appearances and hasn't advanced past the Regional round, the expectations are unprecedented and exciting.

PRESEASON HONORS

It comes as no surprise that the reigning National Player of the Year would be racking up preseason honors. Softball America and D1Softball ranked NiJaree Canady as the No. 1 player in the country and SA named her a Preseason First Team All-American. Canady also recieved the honor of being USA Today's Kansas Woman of the Year.

Outfielder Mihyia Davis came in at No. 66 on Softball America's list and No. 46 on D1Softball's list while also being ranked the No. 15 best outfielder in the country.

Freshmen Samantha Lincoln and Hailey Toney garnered national attention being named to D1Softball's D100 Freshman Watch List. Lincoln and Toney were also named to Softball America's Freshman Watch List along with teammates Bailey Lindemuth and Brenlee Gonzales.

Second baseman Alexa Langeliers was named the No. 9 best second baseman in the country by D1Softball.

ROSTER REPORT

So, we all know about Canady and Davis, but who else makes up Glasco's 2025 roster? Along with the aforementioned players, Tech welcomes in 10 players who have made either All-Conference or NFCA All-Region at one point in their career. The Red Raiders also welcome in nine freshmen that make up the No. 2 recruiting class in the nation according to Extra Innings Softball.

Returners Demi Elder, Raegan Jennings and Logan Halleman played a lot of softball last season as Jennings and Halleman were named to the All-Big 12 Freshman Team.

Along with Davis, five players followed Glasco from Louisiana including Lauren Allred, Victoria Valdez, Alexa Langeliers and Chloe Riassetto. These five were a core part of the Ragin' Cajuns' Super Regional run last season that included wins over the likes of Oklahoma, LSU and Baylor.

Alana Johnson comes from Washington where she racked up 20 career home runs and is a versatile defender.

Katie Lott, a versatile defender in her own right, comes from intraconference rival Oklahoma State where she slashed .370/.485/.537 her freshman year and is one of the most impressive student-athletes in the country as she was given the NCAA Elite 90 Award for having the highest cumulative GPA across all softball athletes.

Makayla Garcia, a Lubbock native, returns to her

hometown after spending a season at UT-Tyler where she helped the Patriots win the DII World Series under newly-minted NFCA Hall of Famer Mike Reed. Garcia was named the Lone Star Conference Freshman of the Year and was on the All-Lone Star Conference Second Team.

The freshman class has loads of talent including Lincoln and Toney who were named to the D100 Freshman Watch List. Bailey Lindemuth is a two-way player that impressed Glasco and staff all throughout fall ball and was starting at third base for most of the time. Brenlee Gonzales had an excellent fall as well. Gonzales played travel ball under softball legend Cat Osterman and it shows in the circle as she allowed just one earned run.

Outfielders Sydney Shiller and Kiley Huffman were the 18th and 19th ranked outfielders in the 2024 class and showed flashes during the fall season. The last addition to the roster was Anya German who was a three-year starter at James Bowie High School in Austin, Texas and played her way into the lineup during fall ball. Cassie Johnson, the 10th ranked player in the 2024 class according to Perfect Game also makes up the class, but will be redshirting this season.

Briana Jones and Taryn Martin also make up the roster. The two players are walk-ons, Jones was a standout player in Abilene at Tuscola High School while Martin was a standout herself at Prosper High School, but in soccer.

'OUR SHOT AT FOREVER'

The Red Raiders have not shyed away from the expectations put on them this season and are choosing to embrace them. Based on a book "One Shot at Forever" by Chris Ballard, the team has taken on the motto 'Our Shot at Forever.'

The book covers the 1971 Macon High School baseball team from Macon, Illinois - about three hours from where Glasco grew up - that was led by an English teacher and how they went on to defy the odds to win a State Championship.

SCHEDULE STRENGTH

Gerry Glasco is known for scheduling tough games for his team early and this year is no exception even after making the move to the Big 12.

Tech will play 24 games against 11 teams that made the NCAA Tournament last season. Of those 11 teams, four made the Super Regionals and two advanced to Women's College World Series.

UNCHARTED TERRITORY

Softball America ranked Tech No. 9 in its Preseason Top 25 poll, that is the highest ranking the Red Raiders have ever recieved with the previous high being No. 10 by USA Softball in 2019.

Along with that historic ranking, Tech was also ranked No. 13 by D1Softball and the NFCA and No. 10 by USA Softball.

A LEAGUE OF HER OWN - NIJAREE CANADY

In his opening press conference as Texas Tech's new head coach, Gerry Glasco said he expected the Red Raiders to compete at a national level beginning with his first season.

Glasco's projection received a significant boost when NiJaree Canady, the reigning USA Softball National Player of the Year, formally signed an athletic scholarship agreement to join the Red Raiders for the 2025 season. Tech signed the nation's top player to go with an already nationally-ranked signing class.

"NiJaree is obviously a tremendous softball player," Glasco said. "But I came to realize, during the recruiting process, that she is an excellent student and an outstanding person with extremely high character. She is patient, kind and thorough, and everything that she did during this process reflected that. It is an honor and a privilege to be able to know that we will be sharing the same field and dugout in the coming years."

Canady's resume speaks for itself as she has been presented several honors during her career, including being named the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year this past season. Canady was also recognized as the Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year and an NFCA first team All-American in 2024 as well as an All-Pac 12 first team honoree and All-Pac 12 defensive team selection. Canady, who was a two-time NFCA National Pitcher of the Week pick, also excelled in the classroom, earning NFCA first team Academic All-America accolades.

Canady's dominance in the circle showed to the tune of a nation-leading 337 strikeouts and otherworldly 0.73 ERA, which also led the nation. She was 24-7 overall in the circle this past season and an impressive 41-10 with an 0.67 ERA over her two seasons at Stanford as she helped push the Cardinals to the final four teams each year at the Women's College World Series. Canady also represented the U.S. this summer in the 2024 Japan All-Star Series.

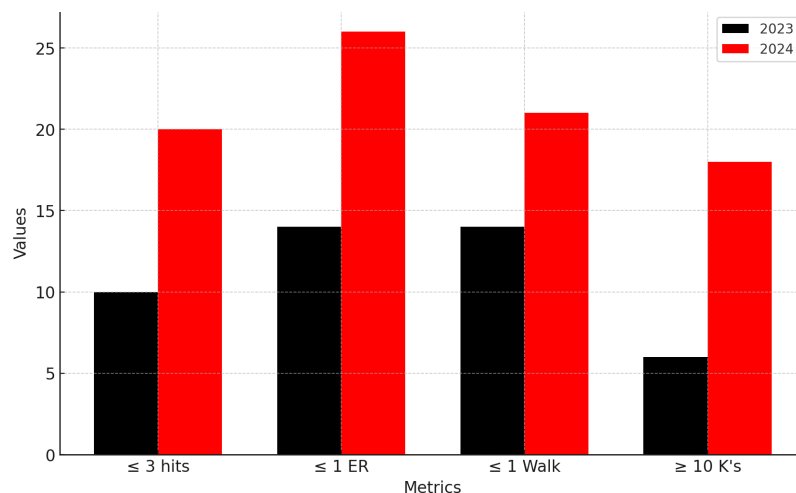
Canady, a native of Topeka, Kansas, was recognized with the prestigious Honda Sport Award this past season. The honor, presented by the Collegiate Women's Sports Awards, is given to the top women athletes in each sport and voted on by administrators from over 1,000 NCAA schools.

GERRY GLASCO

HEAD COACH · 1st SEASON · Illinois '80 · Crab Orchard, Illinois

Gerry Glasco was named the head coach of the Texas Tech Softball program on Thursday, June 20, 2024.

Glasco previously led the Louisiana softball program where he built the Ragin' Cajuns into a perennial top-25 team that boasted an impressive .773 winning percentage (300-88) during his seven-year tenure. Louisiana captured five Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles under Glasco and was selected to an NCAA Regional in all six eligible seasons (excludes COVID-shortened 2020 campaign), advancing to the Super Regional round in 2023.

Glasco, who coached the previous nine seasons prior to Louisiana in the Southeastern Conference, is considered one of the nation's top offensive coaches and recruiters. He helped lead Georgia to a pair of final four finishes at the Women's College World Series, assisted in Texas A&M's rise in the SEC culminating with a trip to Oklahoma City in 2017 and served as associate head coach at Auburn in fall 2017.

Glasco's résumé includes achievements at all levels of softball. He has coached 15 All-Americans, 29 All-SEC honorees, 37 All-Sun Belt performers and 49 All-Region selections. As a collegiate coach, he has been a part of 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, six NCAA Super Regionals and three Women's College World Series. He also engineered three championships in the National Pro Fastpitch League, most recently in 2019 with USSSA Pride, and a national championship at the 18U level in travel ball. During his tenure at Louisiana, the Ragin' Cajuns have continued their streak of consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and 40-win seasons, both streaks at 24 straight seasons following the 2023 season.

Glasco's most momentous occasion to date with Louisiana occurred in the 2023 season when the Ragin' Cajuns captured a berth into the NCAA Super Regional round - realizing the accomplishment for the first time in his tenure - following a Championship Sunday doubleheader sweep of rival LSU at Tiger Park in Baton Rouge.

He directed one of the program's best seasons ever in 2019 as Louisiana recorded its first 50-win season since 2012 (with only four defeats entering NCAA postseason play), swept the Sun Belt Conference's regular season and tournament championships, boasted a Top 10 national ranking for 10 consecutive weeks leading up to postseason play, turned in only the second undefeated Sun Belt mark in program and conference history, established a school-record 29-game win streak and posted a Top 10 national finish in nine statistical categories.

Glasco and his staff continued building momentum in the COVID-19 shortened 2020 season, leading the program to its first Top 10 finish in the major national polls since 2014. The Ragin' Cajuns scored ranked wins over Louisiana State, Oklahoma State, Texas and Florida (twice) in addition to two victories over Ole Miss, leading the squad to a No. 1 ranking in the lone RPI ranking of the year.

During the 2021 season, Louisiana reached 40 wins in the regular season by winning 25 of the final 29 games. Glasco steered the squad to repeat honors as Sun Belt regular season and tournament champions highlighted by an 11-1 record, regular season and tournament combined, against the league's other three NCAA Tournament participants (Texas State, Troy and South Alabama). The Ragin' Cajuns advanced to Championship Sunday of an NCAA Regional for the third time under Glasco's watch, extending the program's streak of reaching the final round of a regional to 13 consecutive appearances.

The 2022 season marked the debut of Glasco's 2021 recruiting class, which was ranked No. 1 by Extra Inning Softball and included the No. 4-rated recruit in pitcher Sam Landry and the No. 15-ranked prospect in Louisiana native Maddie Hayden. Glasco directed and mentored a lineup that featured at most two upperclassmen and as many as five freshmen, and developed them into a championship and NCAA Tournament team - despite the youthfulness, advancing to Championship Sunday of the NCAA Clemson Regional.

The Ragin' Cajuns continued to thrive under Glasco's guidance in 2022, placing a conference-high nine players on the All-Sun Belt team, recording a program-record .351 season batting average and generating the most home runs in Glasco's tenure (82).

During the 2023 season, Louisiana collected its fourth consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular season and tournament championships under Glasco's guidance, posted the program's first 50-win season since 2019 (50-16, 22-2 SBC) and advanced to the Super Regional round of the NCAA Tournament. The Ragin' Cajuns also continued impressive streaks of consecutive Sun Belt series won (now 81 straight) and consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances (now 24 straight) and attained a No. 9 RPI rating and Top 20 rankings across all major national polls.

Louisiana ended the regular season with 43 wins against a Top-10 rated strength of schedule (which finished at No. 7) facing Top 100 RPI competition in 38 out of 56 games overall and captured marquee road wins over UCF (no-hitter), LSU and Florida (three-hit shutout). Individually, Karly Heath and Mihyia Davis earned NFCA All-American accolades and Davis was awarded the NFCA's Golden Shoe Award after leading the D1 softball ranks with 52 stolen bases.

The Crab Orchard, Illinois, native has raised the level of offensive production of each team he's been associated with since his collegiate coaching career began. He coached at Georgia from 2009-2014 and at Texas A&M from 2015-2017.

Glasco helped Georgia to a 282-92 mark as the team hovered near the top of the NCAA and SEC rankings in almost all offensive categories and set over 20 team offensive records during his six-year stay. The Bulldogs belted 85 home runs his first season (up from 26 the previous season) and later led the SEC in home runs during his final two seasons.

Georgia captured the program's first SEC Tournament championship (2014) and twice reached the final four of the Women's College World Series (2009, 2010) with Glasco on staff.

In three seasons at Texas A&M, Glasco restructured the offense and helped guide the Aggies' rise to the top of the SEC, culminating with a third-place finish in 2017. His clubs tallied 465 extra-base hits, including 213 home runs, and scored 6.1 runs per game. In his final two seasons, the Aggies were the SEC's home run leaders in regular season conference play.

Eight offensive records were broken under Glasco's watch at Texas A&M, highlighted by the 2016 season when the Aggies broke school records for runs scored (429); on base percentage (.437); RBI (401); total bases (852); and OPS (.988).

Glasco spent seven seasons as the assistant softball coach at Johnston City (Illinois) High School before taking his first collegiate job at Georgia. In his last season, he led the junior high team to a state title.

During his time at Johnston City High, Glasco founded the Illinois Southern Force Softball organization and served as the head coach of the Southern Force Gold from 2001-2008. The team finished in the Top 20 four times at ASA Gold Nationals and won the 2004 18U Gold National Championship. That year, Glasco and his staff were named the National Coaching Staff of the Year by the NFCA for travel softball.

Glasco and wife Vickie have three daughters who have shared their father's passion for the sport: Tara (Archibald), who is currently the associate head coach here at Texas Tech, Erin and the late-Geri Ann who was named Gatorade National Player of the Year her senior year of high school, SEC Freshman of the Year and played both at Georgia and Oregon.

Glasco is a 1976 graduate of Crab Orchard (Illinois) High School, where he lettered in baseball and basketball. He graduated from the University of Illinois with a bachelor's degree in agricultural economics in 1980.
