## QUICK HITS

Penn State softball opens its 60th anniversary season the weekend of Friday through Sunday, February 7 through 9, as the Nittany Lions travel to the Sunshine State and the Eddie C. Moore Complex for the NFCA Division I Leadoff Classic. The Nittany Lions will battle five opponents over the weekend, beginning with No. 7 Duke and No. 13 Texas Tech on Friday, followed by another doubleheader with Kennesaw State and Mississippi State Saturday with the finale against Notre Dame set for Sunday morning. All games will stream live to a worldwide audience for free via the GameChanger app. PSU is anchored by the return of right-handed sophomore pitcher Bridget Nemeth, who was named a Second Team Preseason All-American by both Softball America and D1Softball. The Nittany Lions also welcome back their 2024 home run and RBI leader with the return of senior utility Maddie Gordon, who was named the nation's No. 7 utility/designated player by D1Softball. The Blue & White are fresh off one of the most memorable seasons in program history in 2024, with PSU reaching the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011 while rattling off the third-winningest season in Happy Valley all-time with a 35-20 effort.

#### INTRODUCING THE FIELD

- Fresh off the most successful season in Duke softball history, head coach Marissa Young leads the eighth iteration of the Blue Devils into action following the program's first WCWS appearance and a 52-9 overall record. The Blue Devils will be anchored on the field by the return of .390 hitter D'Auna Jennings in addition to 1.31 ERA-wielding pitcher Cassidy Curd running things in the circle.
- After being the first team left out of the NCAA Tournament in 2024, Texas Tech enters the first year of the Gerry Glasco era as one of the nation's most anticipated teams. The Red Raiders brought in one of the strongest portal classes in Division I, highlighted by the incoming transfer of defending National Player and Pitcher of the Year NiJaree Canady from Stanford.
- Under the direction of head coach Tripp MacKay, Kennesaw State enters its first season as a member of Conference USA following a 16-37 season in 2024 with an 8-13 mark in its final year of Atlantic Sun competition. The Owls are led by returning .248 hitter Ava Guzowski in addition to returning pitcher Kenley Hilleary's 3.66 ERA.
- Led by head coach Samantha Ricketts, Mississippi State heads into the 2025 season following an NCAA Regional bid a year ago with a 34-20 overall record and a 12-12 mark in SEC action. The Bulldogs welcome back .347 hitter Sierra Sacco at the plate in addition to returning pitcher Josey Marron, who booked a 3.68 ERA season in the circle paired with nine victories individually.
- Notre Dame enters a new era under the direction of first-year head coach Kris Ganeff, who will look to steer the Fighting Irish to instant success following a 27-23 mark overall in 2024 with a 9-15 ACC ledger. Second baseman Addison Amaral boasts the best batting average and home run total among ND returners, while staff ace Alexis Laudenslager returns following a 9-8 season with 131.2 innings pitched.

#### STORY OF THE SERIES: NFCA LEADOFF CLASSIC

- One of Penn State's youngest non-conference series, the Nittany Lions will face off against Duke for the sixth time in history. The Blue Devils lead the all-time series by a 4-1 margin with all five prior meetings coming on the Duke campus in Durham.
- The Nittany Lions will challenge Texas Tech for the fifth time since the inaugural meeting of the two teams in 1999, with the series split 2-2. All four prior meetings have come in neutral site competition, with PSU taking the first two meetings in Las Cruces, New Mexico.
- Penn State and Kennesaw State will challenge one another in softball for the sixth time in program history since the first meeting in 2010, with PSU leading 4-1. Penn State has challenged the Owls in Clearwater previously, winning 5-0 in the first all-time meeting.
- The Blue & White will battle Mississippi State for the eighth time ever in a series that dates to 2000, with the Bulldogs leading 5-2. Penn State leads 2-1 in neutral site competitions but has gone 0-4 in competitions hosted on the MSU campus in Starkville.
- Notre Dame and Penn State will battle for the sixth time since the first meeting in Tampa back in 1994, with the Fighting Irish boasting a narrow 3-2 advantage. Sunday's test marks the fourth fixture in Florida for the two sides, with all five prior contests coming in neutral action.

#### THE ROAR FROM 2024

- Penn State softball booked one of its strongest seasons in program history in the 2024 campaign, with the Nittany Lions amassing the third-winningest season in program history with a 35-20 effort and pairing that with the program's first NCAA Tournament Regional appearance since hosting a Regional in 2011.
- The Blue & White mustered a victory in the 2024 NCAA Tournament, downing the UAlbany Great Danes in a 9-3 contest from Davis Diamond in Bryan-College Station, Texas. The win marked PSU's first national postseason victory since besting the Fordham Rams in extra innings during the 2011 University Park Regional.
- Penn State has booked 30-win seasons in each of the last three years, marking the first stretch of three consecutive 30-win campaigns in Happy Valley since notching five such seasons from 1999 to 2003. Penn State will seek consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since back-to-back berths in 2005 and 2006.

## RANK AND FILE

- Penn State boasts the No. 25 national ranking according to both D1Softball and Softball America, with the Nittany Lions garnering preseason national attention in the receiving votes category in both the NFCA Coaches Poll and USA Softball Top 25.
- The Nittany Lion softball program seeks its first official national ranking in the NFCA/GoRout Coaches Poll in the 2025 campaign. The Blue & White have received votes on at least 15 occasions including PSU's preseason RV nod, with five of those 15 appearances on the fringe of the Coaches' Poll coming since February of last year.
- Penn State's national recognition from both D1Softball and Softball America in the preseason rankings was paired with recognition as preseason regional teams according to both organization's early bracketologies. D1Softball projects PSU as the No. 3 seed in the Tuscaloosa Regional, while Softball America projects the Nittany Lions as the No. 2 seed in Gainesville.

## SCHEDULING SHENANIGANS

- The Nittany Lions will embark on one of the most challenging schedules the program has ever faced in 2025, with PSU gearing up for a 51-game slate that includes 15 games against 10 opponents that reached the 2024 NCAA Division I Softball Tournament.
- PSU will battle three Super Regional teams from last year's tournament in addition to a pair of Women's College World Series teams in Duke and Oklahoma State. The Nittany Lion schedule features opponents from all four power conferences in addition to a trio of defending 2024 conference champions in ACC champion Duke, Big East victor Villanova and NEC titlist Saint Francis.
- In the preseason NFCA/GoRout Coaches Poll, released on January 28, the Nittany Lions saw nine opponents that were either ranked or receiving votes ahead of the 2025 season, including Oklahoma State (#4), Duke (#7), LSU (#10), Texas Tech (#13), Virginia Tech (#17), Northwestern (#21), Washington (#22), Mississippi State (#24) and Indiana (RV).

## ON THE OFFENSIVE

- Penn State is fresh off one of the most dominant offensive seasons in program history, with the Blue & White setting single-season program records for home runs, doubles and total bases while climbing team leaderboards in multiple additional offensive categories.
- The Nittany Lions racked up an eye-popping 92 doubles in the 2024 campaign, amounting to 1.67 doubles per game. PSU ranked second in the Big Ten Conference and eighth in all of Division I in total doubles while mustering the third-most doubles per game in the B1G and the sixth most in the nation.
- Penn State was a force to be reckoned with in terms of extra-base hitting, cranking the third-most triples in a single season in school history with 17, amounting to 0.31 triples per game. PSU ranked third in the Big Ten and 18th in the nation in that category last year.
- The Nittany Lions additionally set the single-season program record with 53 home runs in last year's NCAA Tournament run. PSU surpassed the previous program record of 49 homers set during the 2019 campaign. Penn State's dominant offensive year culminated in a program record 689 total bases.

## KNOW THE NEMETH

- Sophomore pitcher Bridget Nemeth returns to Happy Valley following the most dominant freshman season in Penn State history. Nemeth was the first Nittany Lion to garner an individual B1G accolade, becoming Penn State's first Big Ten Freshman of the Year.
- The Glendora, California, native was the first Nittany Lion to be named a Freshman All-American, landing those accolades from D1Softball and Softball America. She was additionally a unanimous First Team All-B1G Selection and All-B1G Freshman Team choice.
- In the circle, Nemeth finished as the B1G statistical champion in innings pitched (210.0), victories (23) and saves (four) while booking the second-best ERA in the conference and the No. 36 mark in the nation in that category with a 1.77 measure in that stat. Her 23-8 individual record marked the winningest single pitching season in Penn State history, while her 202 strikeouts ranked fifth all-time in Happy Valley for K's in a single year.
- Nemeth was named to the USA Softball National Player of the Year Watch List earlier this spring, picked up a pair of Second Team Preseason All-America laurels from D1Softball and Softball America, was named the No. 2 player in the Big Ten and No. 12 pitcher in the nation by D1Softball and secured honors as a B1G Player to Watch.

## GORDON'S GREATNESS

- Senior utility Maddie Gordon returns to Happy Valley for her fourth and final season of eligibility as one of the nation's most dominant offensive threats and versatile defensive contributors. A native of Shenandoah, Virginia, Gordon is fresh off a breakout season that culminated in Second Team All-Big Ten recognition in the postseason.
- In the batter's box, Gordon was a powerful force in 2024, launching the eighth-most home runs in the B1G with a Penn State-leading 13 long balls that amounted to the fourth-most in a single season in program history. Gordon also contributed 16 doubles, the sixth-most in a single season at PSU, while logging 47 runs scored, 41 RBI and 117 total bases to sit inside the top 10 in Happy Valley in each of those statistical categories for single-season production.
- Gordon garnered a wide array of preseason accolades in January, securing the No. 7 utility/DP ranking from D1Softball, adding honors as the No. 16 player in the B1G and No. 99 player nationally according to D1. Softball America rated Gordon as the No. 92 player in the nation, also logging B1G Player to Watch status.

## POWER TO THE PORTAL

- Penn State welcomed a trio of transfer prospects to Happy Valley in the 2024-25 offseason, including Pittsburgh infielder Jordan George, FGCU infielder Meagan Ricks and Saint Francis infielder Kaylie Walters.
- George, a native of New Albany, Ohio, arrived in Happy Valley from Pitt after a productive season that included a .333 batting average highlighted by a pair of home runs and two additional doubles. Her 1.026 first-year OPS led the Panther roster last season, and she paired that effort with a trio of RBI.
- Hailing from Winter Haven, Florida, Ricks arrives following four seasons at FGCU that featured a First Team All-Conference nod in 2023 as well as a conference tournament title and NCAA regional bid a year ago. She registered 74 total hits while amassing 49 career runs scored and 32 stolen bases during her time with the Eagles.
- A reigning First Team All-NEC selection during her time at Saint Francis, the Philadelphia-native Walters arrives in Happy Valley after contributing heavily to Saint Francis' NEC Regular Season and Tournament Championship runs. Walters started and played in all 55 games for the Red Flash, adding 42 hits, 41 runs scored, an eye-popping 45 walks and a dominant 29-steal season on the basepath. Walters joined teammates Nemeth and Gordon as a selection to the Big Ten Players to Watch List in the preseason.

## ROOKIE CARDS

- In addition to the program's trio of incoming transfers, Penn State hauled in a three-member freshman class for the 2025 season that features some of the nation's premier individual prospects. The incoming Nittany Lion freshman class garnered the No. 24 national ranking and is comprised of pitcher Abigail Britton, catcher Macy Chamberlin and rounded out by outfielder Natalie Lieto.
- PSU's freshman class picked up a wide array of individual accolades during high school, with Britton landing the Maryland Gatorade Player of the Year Award, Chamberlin securing the Johnny Bench Award as the best catcher in the state of Ohio, and Lieto guiding Masuk High School to four straight Connecticut state titles.
- The Nittany Lion rookies have already garnered national preseason attention from both D1Softball and Softball America, appearing on the D100 Freshman to Watch List as well as the Softball America Freshman Watch List alongside some of the nation's star first-years.

## UP NEXT

- Penn State softball returns to the Sunshine State and the Tampa metro area in one week's time, as the Nittany Lions prepare to take part in The Fonseca Memorial Tournament at USF hosted by the University of South Florida at the USF Softball Stadium. The tournament will feature round-robin play against St. John's, USF and Loyola Chicago with semifinals and a final to round out the five-game slate the weekend of Friday through Sunday, February 14-16.

## NITTANY LION SOFTBALL PARK & BEARD FIELD

A facility years in the making, state-of-the-art and second to none – that is what Nittany Lion Softball Park and Beard Field provides to the Penn State athletic community. With numerous donations and the Penn State Board of Trustees' approval, construction of the \$10.2 million complex was completed in time for the 2011 season. The facility houses the Nittany Lion softball team and allows the program to compete with the best in the country.

The complex features 1,084 permanent seats with fantastic sight lines, accessible seating, concession stands, permanent bathrooms and merchandise areas for fans. On the softball side of things, the field with irrigation, dugouts, batting cages and tunnels, bullpens, scoreboard and a state-of-the-art lighting system make Nittany Lion Softball Park a collegiate softball gem.

The complex consolidates the team's resources into one area with new training rooms, media center, video room, study space, locker rooms and coaches' offices all housed at the softball park. A new press area behind home plate was constructed, which further enhanced the amenities of the stadium.

Key benefactors of the project allowed Nittany Lion Softball Park to take shape and get off the ground. The playing field was named Beard Field in recognition of a generous donation from Lee and William Beard in October 2009. The Penn State locker room was named the Fran Vanden Locker Room, recognizing a gift from George and Frances Vanden. Another major donation came from the James M. and Margaret V. Stine Foundation to name both the Softball Office Complex and Media Center in honor of the Stine Family. Art and Paige Nagle also contributed to the project and one of the assistant coaches' offices dons their names.

Penn State's first game in its new home was March 26, 2011, a thrilling 8-5 victory over Wisconsin. Plenty of firsts were delivered that afternoon and none more memorable than Lisa Akamine's inside-the-park home run as Penn State overcame a three-run deficit to win the inaugural game. For the season, Penn State boasted an 11-8-1 record on Beard Field in its first campaign. It was the first winning season at home since 2007 for the Nittany Lions, which coincided with PSU's last trip to the NCAA Tournament before 2011.

The stadium paid dividends immediately for the Nittany Lion program as Penn State hosted the 2011 NCAA University Park Regional.

The event marked the first time PSU hosted NCAA Softball in 28 years as Oregon, Fordham and Albany competed with Penn State for the right to go to the NCAA Super Regionals. In the three-day event, nearly 1,900 fans streamed through the turnstiles. Oregon would eventually advance, but not before an exciting 16-inning midnight thriller between Penn State and Fordham. The Nittany Lions prevailed, 5-2, in the second-longest game in PSU history.

As if the NCAA event wasn't exciting enough, Penn State then hosted the PIAA Softball Championships. Four games in one day on a sparkling afternoon in mid-June had nearly 3,000 fans attend. The first game of the day featured local powerhouse Philipsburg-Osceola and Brandywine Heights with a standing room-only crowd of 1,800 spectators. The PIAA is still a committed partner of Penn State Athletics, as Nittany Lion Softball Park and Happy Valley Hospitality earned rave reviews. Penn State's University Park campus has played host to the PIAA Championships in every season since Beard Field opened in 2011.

Nittany Lion Softball Park is located on the corner of Park Avenue and University Drive, facing the Bryce Jordan Center, Mount Nittany and Beaver Stadium to the southeast, providing spectacular views and a gorgeous setting for all who attend softball games.

"Bill and I are both very pleased to be a small part of this very impressive facility. For us, the decision to give to this facility, to this program, was easy because one of our big passions is certainly the students of this university, but in particular the softball program. Our passion to help the softball program is because we've watched this program grow. There are some common links to this group [of donors]: Fran and George [Vanden], the Stine Family, Peter and Ann Nagle, Bill and I all have in common a link in believing that this is a program that deserves the typical Penn State, first-class facility to be successful."

Then-Penn State University Vice President for Athletics Sandy Barbour named Clarisa Crowell as the eighth head coach of the Nittany Lion softball program on August 3, 2020. Crowell enters her fifth season at the helm of the Blue & White in the 2025 campaign.

Crowell's most recent season in Happy Valley was one of the most successful on record at PSU, as the Nittany Lions rolled to a 35-20 overall record and 12-11 mark in Big Ten play while making the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2011 at the 2024 Bryan-College Station Regional. The Blue & White recorded the third-most overall victories in school history and the fourth-most B1G wins in a single year, finishing at or above .500 in conference play for the third-straight season. PSU booked three consecutive 30-win seasons for the first time since rattling off five straight from 1999 to 2003, while recording three straight B1G campaigns at or above .500 for the first time in school history.

PSU's return to the NCAA Tournament saw the Blue & White record a 1-2 record in Texas A&M's regional, dropping an opening-round decision to Texas State before defeating UAlbany in the first elimination game of the bracket. Penn State's 9-3 win over the Great Danes featured multiple home runs, including a go-ahead grand slam from senior Liana Jones to ensure the NCAA Tournament victory. The Nittany Lions recorded their first NCAA Tournament win since 2011 in the process. Under Crowell's direction, PSU's 60th varsity team brought the all-time Nittany Lion record in the NCAA Division I Softball Tournament to 13-22, winning at least one game in a national postseason tournament for just the eighth time in program history.

Crowell also directed one of the most decorated seasons in Nittany Lion history, with multiple student-athletes picking up All-Big Ten and NFCA All-Region recognition highlighted by the 2024 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Bridget Nemeth. A native of Glendora, California, Nemeth cemented herself as one of the most successful first-year athletes in Nittany Lion softball history under Crowell's tutelage, becoming the first Freshman All-American in school history according to both D1Softball and Softball America. The right-handed pitcher delivered the first individual award from the B1G league office in program history, becoming the first individual award winner at Penn State since Nan Sichler earned the Atlantic 10 Most Valuable Player and Pitcher awards in 1988. Additionally, Nemeth's breakout season was duly recognized on the Penn State campus in 2024, with the freshman earning Penn State's Female Athlete of the Year award, the second softball student-athlete to land that honor in three seasons.

A trio of Nittany Lion athletes earned NFCA All-Great Lakes Region accolades in the postseason, with Nemeth garnering a First Team nod while Maddie Gordon appeared on the Second Team and Gaby Garcia rounded out the Third Team. Nemeth additionally landed unanimous First Team All-B1G accolades and All-Freshman honors while Garcia, Gordon and Kaitlyn Morrison secured spots on the league's Second Team. Penn State's decorated student-athletes led the way in one of the most productive two-way campaigns in school history, with the Nittany Lion offense hitting the most doubles and home runs in a single season while accumulating the most total bases in a year in program history. PSU pitching accounted for the third-most overall victories in the circle in a single season in program history, with four student-athletes contributing to that impressive statistic.

In the classroom, Crowell's squad posted yet another year with a 1,000 NCAA Academic Progress Rate, signifying the program's success at developing student-athletes on and off the field. Thirteen different Nittany Lions picked up Academic All-Big Ten distinction, while five more Penn Staters garnered B1G Distinguished Scholar status in the 2024 postseason. Senior Amanda Mack rounded out the postseason Big Ten accolades, picking up the Big Ten Sportsmanship

award in recognition of her outstanding leadership on and off the field. Finally, a quintet of Nittany Lions landed College Sports Communicators Academic All-District laurels for the second year in a row, with Garcia, Gordon, Jones, Morrison and Emily Maddock landing that distinction.

In 2023, Crowell led the Blue & White to their second consecutive 30-win season, the first instance of back-to-back 30-win campaigns at PSU since the 2005 and 2006 teams accomplished that feat. Penn State published a 31-16 overall record at season's end and mustered an 11-11 record in Big Ten Conference play, ensuring that the Nittany Lions would finish at or above .500 in the league in consecutive seasons, also for the first time since 2005-06.

Under Crowell's direction, the Nittany Lions saw continued success on the Big Ten's biggest stage in 2023, winning a conference tournament game in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 2016 and 2017 squads did so. PSU also recorded consecutive postseason appearances for the first time in five seasons, reaching back-to-back Big Ten Tournaments for the first time since the Nittany Lions appeared in five straight from 2013 to 2017.

As the program's pitching coach, Crowell directed the most effective pitching staff in the Big Ten Conference that season. The Nittany Lions finished as the conference's leader in overall earned run average, rounding out the year with a 2.18 mark. The Blue & White also recorded the third-best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the league and 15th-best nationally, striking out 3.59 batters for every walk surrendered. Crowell's pitching direction also culminated in multiple program records being shattered by fifth-year left-hander Bailey Parshall, who set PSU records in career strikeouts (783) and shutouts (21).

In the classroom, PSU published a perfect Academic Progress Rate of 1,000 and saw 18 Nittany Lion student-athletes land Academic All-Big Ten honors. Penn State also mustered 12 Easton/NFCA Scholar Athletes, seven Big Ten Distinguished Scholar honors and five College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-District accolades, reflecting Crowell's commitment to comprehensive excellence on and off the field.

In recognition of her exemplary record in the classroom and on the diamond, senior first baseman Lexie Black secured two of the highest honors bestowed by the Big Ten Conference in 2023. Black, a native of Omaha, Nebraska, landed the Big Ten Postgraduate Scholarship in preparation for her continuing education in veterinary medicine at the University of Nebraska. Additionally, Black garnered the Big Ten Medal of Honor, bestowed upon one male and female graduating student-athlete from each B1G member institution.

Penn State finished the 2022 campaign with a 25-win improvement from the previous season, marking the largest single-season turnaround for a team in NCAA Division I. The Nittany Lions also reached the 30-win mark and finished above .500 in Big Ten Conference play for the first time since 2016. Penn State completed the campaign with 32 wins, which at the time marked the most wins for PSU in a season since 2008. As a result of the program's meteoric rise to prominence, Crowell was honored as the 2022 ECAC Coach of the Year.

On the defensive side, the Blue and White registered 12 shutouts on the year, the most by any Nittany Lion squad since the 2008 team accomplished that feat. At the dish, the Nittany Lions' 75 doubles ranked tied for second in program history, while their 43 home runs and 207 RBI ranked third in program history.

Parshall led the way on an individual basis, earning NFCA All-America Third Team honors to go along with NFCA First-Team All-Region and First-Team All-Big Ten accolades. Parshall was selected as the Female Penn State Athlete of the

Year for the 2021-22 academic year as a result. Parshall became just the fifth NFCA All-American in program history and the first Penn State pitcher to earn All-American recognition since Ashley Esparza did so in 2005. Parshall was dominant in the circle in 2022, posting a 22-9 individual record with a 1.68 ERA and nine shutouts in 212.1 innings pitched.

In addition to Parshall's nationally acclaimed statistical season, junior catcher Cassie Lindmark collected NFCA All-Region Third Team and All-Big Ten Second Team laurels. Lindmark provided and immediate offensive pop for the Nittany Lion lineup, hitting .400 in the leadoff spot in addition to building a striking .508 on-base percentage. She became just the sixth Nittany Lion to hit .400 in a season and ranked tied for sixth on the program's single-season batting average leaderboard.

The Nittany Lions maintained consistent success in the classroom, tying a then-program record by placing 16 student-athletes on the Academic All-Big Ten team for the second consecutive year. Six student-athletes were designated as Big Ten Distinguished Scholars. Fourteen student-athletes made the Dean's list during spring semester and the squad compiled a 3.45 GPA, posting the highest cumulative GPA for the program in at least a decade. Under Crowell's leadership, Claire Swedberg was selected as the 2022 Big Ten Postgraduate Award winner, a recipient of the Fulbright grant and was also selected to be the Grand Marshal for the Penn State Health and Human Development Department.

In her first season at the helm in Happy Valley in 2021, Crowell led the Nittany Lions to a win over No. 23 Minnesota, the program's first victory over a ranked opponent since 2017. Penn State also had wins over four other Big Ten programs in a COVID-maligned conference-only calendar during the 2021 spring semester, including three-straight wins and a series victory over Rutgers. The consecutive victories against the Scarlet Knights marked the first time Penn State won three consecutive Big Ten contests since 2017.

Crowell also mentored Parshall in her ongoing success in the circle, as the then-junior pitcher recorded two double-digit strikeout games and moved into sixth all-time in the Penn State record books with 396 career strikeouts and third all-time with seven career saves. In the classroom, a program-record 16 student-athletes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in Crowell's first season of leadership, immediately setting the tone for multiple seasons of academic excellence that followed.

Prior to her arrival at Penn State, Crowell spent eight years as head coach at Miami (Ohio). Crowell and the RedHawks made a MAC Tournament appearance every season in which a tournament was held, winning the league tournament title and making an NCAA Regional appearance in 2016.

Crowell coached 12 student-athletes to first team All-MAC honors, 10 to second-team honors, nine All-MAC Freshman Team recipients and six National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-Region honorees. RedHawk student-athletes also excelled in the classroom with 40 Easton/NFCA Scholar-Athletes and 32 Academic All-MAC honorees during Crowell's tenure in Oxford.

In the COVID-19 shortened 2020 season, Crowell's RedHawks were selected as the MAC preseason favorites. Junior pitcher Courtney Vierstra ranked fifth nationally and first in the conference in strikeouts with 140 over 18 appearances. Crowell's tutelage of Vierstra saw the junior star finish fifth nationally in strikeouts per seven innings with 12.5 at the season's suspension mark.

In the spring of 2019, Crowell led Miami to a 35-16 overall record and a 16-4 ledger in conference play, as the RedHawks captured their first MAC regular-season title in program history. Miami posted 10-straight wins against MAC opponents, the longest win streak in conference play in the

history of the RedHawk program. The team also ranked first in the MAC for pitching and team defense with an overall ERA of 2.55 coupled with a .972 fielding percentage. Crowell was named the 2019 MAC Coach of the Year while seven student-athletes earned All-MAC selections and two more were named NFCA All-Region honorees. Vierstra headlined the list of All-Region recipients after boasting the third-best strikeouts-per-seven innings ratio in the country (10.3).

Crowell's 2017 team excelled offensively, ranking second all-time in Miami history for runs scored (265), runs per game (5.00), RBI (235), doubles (74) and home runs (47). Crowell led Michaela Schlattman to NFCA All-Region recognition, marking the third-straight season a RedHawk player garnered regional accolades. The RedHawks went 29-24 in 2017, highlighted by a dominant 16-2 record at home.

In 2016, Crowell led Miami to a 35-23 overall record and 15-7 record in MAC competition, finishing just half a game short of the MAC regular-season title. The RedHawks made up for that with a perfect 4-0 record in the MAC Tournament to earn the program's fourth conference tournament crown and a spot in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2012. Miami went on to beat No. 23 Notre Dame, 3-2, in the opening game of the Ann Arbor Regional.

The 2016 RedHawks broke six offensive school records, including runs (302), runs per game (5.21), RBI (274), doubles (83), home runs (56) and walks (200). Miami also held a .977 fielding percentage, a school record, and the seventh-best fielding percentage in the nation. Crowell coached senior outfielder Taylor Shuey to become the first softball player in school history to be named MAC Player of the Year after breaking Miami's career RBI record with 114. Senior pitcher Amber Logemann was also named the MAC Tournament MVP after going 4-0 individually with a domineering 0.65 ERA in 32.1 innings pitched.

Crowell's third season in 2015 saw senior outfielder Tiyona Marshall garner NFCA All-Mideast Region First-Team honors after Marshall set school records in hits (86), runs scored (50) and batting average (.446).

Prior to Miami, Crowell spent six seasons as an assistant coach at Oklahoma State where she primarily worked with the pitchers and catchers. In 2010, both of her pitchers earned spots on the All-Big 12 and NFCA All-Midwest Region teams. In 2011, Crowell coached catcher Courtney Totte to an All-Big 12 first-team appearance and recognition as a Third Team All-American. Crowell helped lead the Cowgirls back to national prominence, as Oklahoma State returned to the Women's College World Series for the first time since 1998 in the 2011 campaign. The coaching staff also hauled in NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year accolades at season's end.

Crowell's previous stop at Syracuse as an assistant coach in 2006 saw the Orange land four players as NFCA All-Region designees and five players secure All-Conference honors. All-American and Big East Player of the Year Alexis Switenko led the way, while Tonye McCorkle, the Big East Co-Rookie of the Year, published a dominant season of her own. Crowell began her collegiate coaching career at Ohio University, where she served as an assistant for two years.

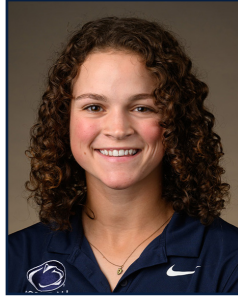
