OPPONENT NOTABLES

Memphis' 901 Classic saw the Tigers' final two games rained out last weekend; however, Memphis did pick up a one-run win in its last game against Evansville. The Tigers include a pair of national team players as Paris Briesenne competes for Sweden, and Taylor Caton is a member of the 18U Canadian National Team. Memphis leads the American Athletic Conference in stolen bases per game (1.25) and sacrifice bunts (11). The Tigers have stolen 10 bases, and speed has been a factor as they've also picked up six triples. Nineteen of the Tigers' 54 hits (35.2 percent) have gone for extra bases.

LEADING OFF

FROM THE TOP: Morgan Stiles is riding a 14-game reached-base streak dating back to last season that has seen her hit .543 with a 1.313 OPS. She has reached safely in nine of 16 innings she has led off and has reached to open the ballgame in seven of 10 games.

BULLPEN BULLETS: The Bulldogs are one of nine teams nationally allowing less than 2.00 runs per game, and their mark of 1.30 runs allowed per game is third behind only No. 1 Tennessee and No. 8 Alabama. State also leads the nation in fielding independent pitching (1.04) and ranks fourth in ERA (1.20).

HIGH WATER MARK: State checks in at No. 14 in this week's NFCA Coaches' Poll, which is its highest ranking in that poll in program history. Previously, the Bulldogs had climbed as high as No. 15 in 2008. State's highest ranking in any poll was at No. 11 in the Softball America poll in 2024.

STRONG START: The Bulldogs are one of eight remaining undefeated teams nationally. State's 10-0 start is the program's best since 2016 and just the fifth season-opening 10-game win streak in school history.

A+ FOR AG: Abby Grace Richardson has been the early breakout performer. After just six at-bats last year, she is leading the team in slugging percentage (.810) with six of her seven hits going for extra bases. She is third on the team with seven RBIs.

KEEP IT CLEAN: State's .996 fielding percentage ranks second nationally, and the Bulldogs have made just one error. MSU's .971 team fielding percentage in 2025 was its third-highest in program history.

ROUND TRIPPERS: MSU has homered in all but two games this season and scored 25 of its 74 runs via the long ball (33.8 percent). Eight different players have already homered this season.

THE MAGIC NUMBER: The Bulldogs have scored five or more runs in all but one game this year, and they are 160-20 under **Samantha Ricketts**.

WEEKLY WINNER: Kinley Keller was named the SEC Co-Freshman of the Week after hitting .667 (8-for-12) with four doubles last week. She scored seven times in six games.

SOFTBALL MEDIA PORTAL

Mississippi State has created an online portal for media members covering the Bulldogs' softball program. To access the portal, visit hailst.at/ **SBMedia**. The Softball Press Box Page of HailState.com includes links to credential request forms, media guides, quick facts, game notes, box scores, recaps and team and staff headshots.

CREDENTIALS

Working media must apply for single-game credentials at least 24 hours in advance by visiting hailst.at/SBCreds. Seats will be assigned to credentialed media members. Space is limited inside the Nusz Park press box. Indoor seating priority will be given to team staff, broadcast personnel, production staff and those media members who regularly cover the program. Auxiliary seating is located at the top of Section 104.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot around Nusz Park in approved areas. Those wishing to shoot a game should meet with Brian Ogden in the press box before the game to be granted field access.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

A complete NCAA box score and pertinent game facts are available to members of the working media following the conclusion of each game. Media members also have access to game notes, statistics, lineups and rosters prior to the start of each game upon request. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

The press box is divided into four separate work areas, with each equipped with high-speed internet and telephone access. It is also set up to accommodate television and team video personnel.

RADIO BROADCASTS

The Nusz Park press box houses radio lines to support home and visitor radio broadcasts. For more information on the phone lines, please contact Brian Ogden in the Communications office.

NUSZ PARK

FAST FACTS

- » Since 2016, MSU is 204-82 in Nusz Park (.713).
- » Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader.
- » Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- » The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- » MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- » State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- » Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- » On May 27, 2022 the largest college softball crowd in the history of the state of Mississippi descended on Nusz Park for the Bulldogs' Super Regional with Arizona (2,209). The next day the record was again broken (2,299) where it now stands today.
- » State broke the single-season attendance record in 2024 with 22,349 fans.

The Mississippi State locker room and field dugouts are off-limits to the media. Media members must be escorted by a member of the MSU Athletics Communications staff while inside the Softball Fieldhouse.

MSU PLAYER/COACH AVAILABILITY

Players and coaches will be made available to the media upon request. Those wishing to set up an interview must contact Brian Ogden via phone or e-mail. On gameday, players and coaches are only available postgame.

For post-practice interviews, media members should contact Brian Ogden no later than 10 p.m. the night before. In most cases, players will be available for a brief time before and after practices. A weekly schedule is available in each set of game notes.

Telephone interviews can also be scheduled with players on a call-back basis during the week with arrangements made through Brian Ogden.

Media members are NOT permitted to contact student-athletes on their own at any time. This includes phone, Email, text or through social media platforms. Student-athletes' contact information will not be given out.

TEAM NOTES

QUICK HITS

- » Mississippi State was the only team in the nation to play each of the final four teams at the Women's College World Series three times in 2025.
- » MSU's team batting average (.314), slugging percentage (.534) and on-base percentage (.407) ranked second in single-season school history, and all three were within 10 points of the existing record.
- » **Morgan Stiles** is riding a 14-game reached-base streak dating back to last season that has seen her hit .543 with a 1.313 OPS.
- » **Nadia Barbary** ranks ninth in school history with 38 career doubles.
- » State's .996 fielding percentage ranks second nationally, and the Bulldogs have made just one error.

PITCHING POINTS

- » Since the start of 2025, **Peja Goold** has struck out five or more batters in 29 appearances, earning the win in 26 in those games. Goold is just two strikeouts away from 500 for her career.
- » **Alyssa Faircloth**'s 14 strikeouts vs. New Mexico (Feb. 7) were a career high and fourth-most in a game in MSU history. She now ranks sixth nationally in strikeouts per seven innings (12.50) and leads the nation in called strike plus whiff rate with a strike on 43.1 percent of her pitches. She is seventh in fielding independent pitching (0.47).
- » **Leila Ammon** ranks ninth nationally in whiff rate per 643Charts, getting a swing and miss on 52.9 percent of pitches that batters have swung at.
- » As a team, State's 49.3 percent whiff rate is second nationally, and the Bulldogs lead the nation in called strike plus whiff rate (40.0 percent).
- » State also leads the nation in fielding independent pitching (1.04).
- » The Bulldogs are one of nine teams nationally allowing less than 2.00 runs per game, and their mark of 1.30 runs allowed per game is third behind only No. 1 Tennessee and No. 8 Alabama.
- » **Delainey Everett** more than doubled her win total (4 to 10) and innings (27.2 to 74.1) last year.
- » She reduced her walks and ranked second in the SEC and among the top 40 nationally with just 1.41 walks per seven innings.

HIGH WATER MARK

- » Mississippi State checks in at No. 14 in this week's NFCA Coaches' Poll, which is its highest ranking in that poll in program history. Previously, the Bulldogs had climbed as high as No. 15 in 2008.
- » The Bulldogs also achieved their highest rank in the D1Softball poll this week at No. 14.
- » State's highest ranking in any poll was at No. 11 in the Softball America poll in 2024.

BULLDOG BICENTENNIAL

- » **Samantha Ricketts** became the fastest Bulldog softball head coach to win 200 career games at State in the win over Northwestern State on Feb. 6, needing just 319 games.
- » She is just the 14th Mississippi State head coach in any team sport to win 200 career games in Maroon and White and the seventh-fastest.
- » Ricketts already was the fastest in MSU softball history to 100 wins, needing just 155 contests.

GOING GLOBAL

- » Head coach **Samantha Ricketts** was named the head coach of the American Samoa Women's National Team on Feb. 3. Her mother, Carol, traces her lineage to the village of Leone on the island.
- » Former Bulldog Chloe Malau'ulu played with American Samoa at the 2025 Pacific Mini Games, winning gold. Current players **Kiarra Sells** and **Kalani Sells** would also be eligible for the team along with graduate assistant Matalasi Faapito and alumni Fa Leilua and Sarai Niu.
- » State saw former All-American and current graduate manager **Sierra Sacco-Ferrie** play with the U.S. Women's National Team in Australia in January, and assistant coach **Zac Shaw** won two medals in 2025 with the U.S. Men's National Team at the WBSC World Cup and the World Games.
- » **Peja Goold** pitched for Colombia at the 2025 Pan American Championships, throwing 37.0 innings and striking out 41 batters.

TAKING DOWN TOP TEAMS

- » **Samantha Ricketts** broke the program record for career ranked wins by a head coach in 2025. Twenty-five of her 45 ranked wins (55.6 percent) have come since the start of the 2024 season.
- » The Bulldogs defeated then-No. 1 Texas on March 28, their first win over a No. 1 since 2015 and only their third in program history.
- » State has 17 top-five wins in school history, and Ricketts has led the Bulldogs to five of those victories.

BARBARY'S BIG YEAR

- » **Nadia Barbary** earned her first career All-SEC honors on the Second Team last year and picked up All-Defensive Team recognition at third.
- » She batted .400 with runners on base, which was second on the team and led the team with 22 RBIs in SEC play, which ranked sixth in school history.
- » Barbary posted single-season career highs in hits (65), homers (11), RBIs (46) and total bases (113). Her slugging percentage was 147 points higher than it has been in any prior season of her career.

PINCH-HIT PAIGE

- » **Paige Ernsts** was 9-for-28 (.321) with five extra base hits and eight walks as a pinch hitter last year.
- » All six of her RBIs came as a pinch hitter. Most notably, she hit a walk-off RBI double to defeat No. 1 Texas (March 28) and launched a three-run homer against North Texas (Feb. 14).

CALL THE BOMB SQUAD

- » MSU has homered in all but two games this season and scored 25 of its 74 runs via the long ball (33.8 percent).
- » State scored 139 runs off homers in 2025. That amounted to 37.6 percent of State's scoring last season and 41.0 percent of its RBIs.
- » The Bulldogs broke the school record with six grand slams last spring.
- » Eight of nine regular starters hit a home run last year, and four players reached double-digits. Eight different players have already homered this season.

THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- » Since Ricketts arrived in 2015, the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs five times, and each of the top seven marks in school history have come under her watch.
- » Last year's team again shattered the single-season record with 74 homers, and Ricketts has been on staff for all four 70-homer seasons in school history.
- » Under Ricketts, State has homered in 55.9 percent of its games (344 of 615) and gone 254-90 in such contests.

RUNNING IT UP

- » State has 33 run-rule victories since the start of 2024, and the past two seasons rank first and second in program history for most in a year. MSU has four run-rule wins so far this season.

- » This season, **Abby Grace Richardson** has been the early breakout performer. A junior college transfer, Richardson had just six at-bats last year and collected one hit, a triple.
- » So far this year, she is leading the team in slugging percentage (.810) with six of her seven hits going for extra bases. She is third on the team with seven RBIs.

- » Last year, only Raelin Chaffin, who went on to a professional career in the AUSL, reached the 120.0-inning mark for State.
- » State's seven arms boast a combined 881.0 career innings and tossed 577.1 combined innings last year, which leads the SEC.

THE TARYNE TREATMENT

- » In three seasons under pitching coach **Taryne Mowatt-McKinney**, the Bulldogs have thrown 50 complete games. State totaled 28 over the three seasons prior to her hiring (2021-23).
- » Mowatt-McKinney has coached State pitchers to four national weekly honors. Prior to her arrival, MSU had seen just one pitcher bring home a national weekly honor (Alison Owen, 2013).
- » She has coached players to three SEC Pitcher of the Week awards in her short tenure, which is as many as the Bulldogs had won in the eight years prior to her arrival.

TEAM NOTES

DEFENSIVE DETAILS

- » MSU's .971 team fielding percentage in 2025 was its highest since 2014 (.976) and third-highest in program history.
- » This year, State boasts a .996 fielding percentage, which is second nationally.
- » **Kiarra Sells** recorded five outfield assists in 2025, which was tied for the 10th-most in a season in MSU history, and she is tied for 11th in MSU career history [5].
- » Only seven players in program history have recorded double-digit outfield assists in their career.
- » Sells boasted the fifth-highest Wins Above Replacement (WAR) among SEC right fielders a year ago [3.64].
- » **Nadia Barbary** ranked third among SEC third basemen in Defensive Runs Saved last year [12.09]. She was one of only 13 third basemen across the nation to post a DRS greater than 12.00.

HISTORIC SEC SEASON

- » Mississippi State finished above .500 in conference play (13-11) for the first time since 2001 (19-11).
- » The 13 wins were State's highest total since going 13-14 in 2008, and MSU won five series for the first time since 2007.
- » Last year marked the first time State finished with a .500 record in league play since going 14-14 in 2007, and the Bulldogs won three road series for the first time since the SEC switched to the current 24-game schedule in 2013.

SPREADING THE NUSZ

- » Since the start of 2024, the Bulldogs are 46-14 at home while outscoring opponents, 430-176, in those games.
- » In its 2025 SEC home opener, MSU set a regular-season attendance record with 1,903 fans in attendance for a victory over then-No. 18 Auburn.
- » State closed 2025 with the second-largest regular-season crowd on record with 1,870 fans on May 3 against then-No. 17 Ole Miss.

OUR STATE

- » The Bulldogs are 31-6 against teams from the state of Mississippi under **Samantha Ricketts**, while outscoring in-state foes, 266-84.
- » State has won three consecutive series with rival Ole Miss.
- » This year's meeting was the first time in series history that both teams were ranked in the NFCA poll when they meet on the field. State won the series with a walk-off homer in Game 1 and a shutout in Game 2.
- » MSU won the 2024 series by taking the first two games, including a no-hitter in the clinching matchup.
- » The Bulldogs outscored the Rebels, 22-11, in the 2022 series, and capped the three-game set with a shutout in the finale.

#STATETOTHESHOW

- » **Sierra Sacco** and Raelin Chaffin both received Golden Tickets into the 2025 AUSL College Draft. MSU was one of two teams nationally with multiple draftees.
- » They were teammates together on the Talons, winning the inaugural AUSL Championship. This season, Sacco was taken in the Expansion Draft by the Portland Cascade, and Bulldog legend Mia Davidson was chosen by the same franchise in the Allocation Draft as a free agent.
- » MSU now boasts 28 professional players in its history. Of those, 16 were coached by Ricketts for at least one season at MSU.
- » Nine Bulldogs have gone on to pro careers in the six years since she was named the program's head coach, and at least one player has signed a professional contract in each of the last five seasons.

STARKVILLE SAMOANS



- » With head coach **Samantha Ricketts** set to serve as the head coach of the American Samoa Women's National Team, additional light has been shed on State's lineage of players with Samoan heritage.
- » The Bulldogs have seen at least one Samoan on the roster in every season of the past decade, and have boasted multiple players with Samoan heritage every year since 2019 with as many as four such players at the same time in 2023.
- » MSU's first Samoan player was **Sarai Niu** (2016-19), who was joined by **Chloe Malau'u** (2019-23) and **Fa Leilua** (2019-21) in her senior year. **Matalasi Faapito** (2022-24), **Leilani Pulemu** (2022-24), **Kiara Sells** (2023-pr.) and **Kalani Sells** (2025-pr.) have all followed.
- » Ricketts herself traces her heritage to the island through her mother Carol, from the village of Leone.
- » The Bulldogs began holding Samoan Heritage Day at the ballpark as early as 2019, and this year it will be celebrated on **April 26** against LSU.

NATIONAL TEAM NOTES



- » MSU has been well-represented on national teams recently.
- » Student coach and former MSU All-American **Sierra Sacco** (2024-25), played with the U.S. Women's National Team at the 2026 Team USA Down Under series in Brisbane, Australia, hitting two homers in four games.
- » **Peja Goold** pitched for Colombia at the 2025 Pan American Championships, throwing 37.0 innings and striking out 41 batters.
- » Assistant coach **Zac Shaw** captained the U.S. Men's National Team at the 2024 WBSC Men's World Cup Group Stage and 2025 WBSC World Cup Final Stage.
- » He has won two World Cup bronze medals with the Americans in 2023 (New Zealand) and 2025 (Canada).
- » Head coach **Samantha Ricketts** will serve as the head coach of the American Samoa Women's National Team in the lead up to the 2028 Olympic Games. State alum **Chloe Malau'u** (2019-23) won gold with American Samoa at the 2025 Pacific Mini Games, and **Kalani Sells** (2025-pr.), **Kiara Sells** (2023-pr.), **Matalasi Faapito** (2022-24) and **Fa Leilua** (2019-21) would all be eligible for the team.
- » Former Bulldog **Mia Davidson** (2018-22) won a silver medal at the 2024 WBSC Women's World Cup Final. Davidson also played with the U.S. Women's National Team at the 2022 Pan American Championships (Guatemala), 2023 WBSC World Cup Group Stage (Ireland) and 2023 Pan American Games (Chile).
- » MSU alum **Iybia McMichael** (2001-04) is currently serving as an assistant coach on the U.S. U-15 Girls' National Team where she guided the team to the 2023 Utsugi Cup championship and a gold medal at the 2023 WBSC Americas Qualifier. In her playing days, McMichael won the 2003 Canada Cup with Team USA.

PORTAL PICKUPS

- » Mississippi State's transfer class was ranked No. 3 in the nation by 6-4-3 Charts, which based its rankings on the total number of Wins Above Replacement (WAR) each school added. State's 17.43 WAR added was tied for the most in the SEC with Tennessee.
- » State made a big splash at both the pitcher and catcher positions.
- » Bulldog catchers finished with a combined 6.07 Defensive Runs Saved (DRS) in 2025. **Anna Carder** and **Des Rivera** combined for 10.42 DRS last season. That stands as the largest defensive upgrade (+4.35 DRS) at any position on the team this year, and it's the second-largest improvement by a catching unit in the SEC (Kentucky, +6.32).
- » MSU's bullpen saw its combined Wins Above Replacement total climb from 5.68 to 11.17 (+5.49) with the additions of **Peja Goold**, **Alyssa Faircloth** and **Leila Ammon**. That's the second-largest WAR improvement of any position group on any team in the SEC and the best by any SEC bullpen.
- » Five of the six transfers earned all-conference honors last spring.

PLANTING THE FLAG



- » The Bulldogs wear the flags of their home states on the back of their batting helmets, a tribute started in 2025.
- » **Samantha Ricketts** has expanded the Bulldogs' recruiting reach in recent years. She is responsible for recruiting the first softball student-athletes in MSU history from the states of Arkansas, Kentucky, Maryland, New Jersey, New York and West Virginia.
- » **Brinkley Moreton** (Arkansas), **Taylor Troutman** (Kentucky), **Gabby Schaeffer** (New York) and **Gretta Grassel** (Wisconsin) are all just the second players in school history from their states.

PLANNED PROMOS



- » State's Salute to Service game on **March 13** means a little bit more to **Nadia Barbary**, whose parents both served in the Air Force. She was born on Lackland Air Force Base. **Leila Ammon**'s father is in the Marine Corps.
- » Mississippi State will hold its fifth annual First Responder Home Run Derby between the Starkville Fire and Starkville Police Departments on **March 15** following the Bulldogs' series finale with Tennessee. The firefighters have won all four prior years.
- » A number of players have first responders in their families including **Morgan Stiles** and **Delainey Everett**.
- » Everett's father passed away suddenly and unexpectedly two weeks before the start of the 2025 season. His badge number is embroidered on Everett's pitching towel.
- » The Bulldogs' Think Pink game is set for **April 10** against Arkansas.
- » State's annual Bark in the Park game is scheduled for **April 12** against Arkansas. Traditionally, each player's headshot on the video-board is replaced with their own submitted photos of their pets.
- » The final home weekend against LSU on **April 24-26** is packed with promos honoring State's senior class. On-field graduation ceremonies are scheduled for Friday night with Senior Day on Saturday. Samoan Heritage Day wraps up the home slate at Nusz Park, recognizing senior **Kiara Sells** and her sister, sophomore **Kalani Sells**.

ALL FOR ALEX



- » **Alex Wilcox** was a member of the Bulldogs' 2018 team who inspired the nation with her courageous fight against ovarian cancer. That fight ultimately took her life that summer at the age of 18.
- » MSU immortalized Wilcox by retiring her No. 8 jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the first female student-athlete in MSU history to have her jersey retired.
- » State's annual February Freezer tournament was rebranded in 2019 as **The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial**.
- » The **All For Alex** campaign was started in 2021 as a joint effort of LSU head coach **Beth Torina** and MSU head coach **Samantha Ricketts**.
- » All 15 SEC schools unite to wear teal or teal accents for one day each year to recognize her impact on the softball community and raise awareness of the disease. All For Alex Weekend is **April 11, 2026**.

ALL ABOUT ATHLETE ENGINEERING



- » In the summer of 2024, former Bulldog pitcher **Hosanna Lindblade** and student manager **Rachel Barber** interned with the athlete engineering institute on Mississippi State's campus and developed a hitting platform that integrates force plates to capture data in real-time while a batter is working on their swing in the cages.
- » Designed, developed and constructed by Lindblade, Barber and their supervisors across campus, the product was delivered in January 2025 and is being used in the Bulldogs' practices and workouts.
- » Engineered to the exact measurements of the batter's box and home plate, the platform was made out of honeycomb core filler used in rockets covered by aircraft skin, making it incredibly durable yet light enough that one person can move the three pieces by themselves.
- » MSU's athlete engineering institute is a first-of-its-kind collaboration between campus researchers and athletic department staff and coaches. The multidisciplinary department brings together engineers, kinesiology researchers, strength and conditioning coaches, athletic trainers and nutritionists to create groundbreaking research methods and wearable technology.
- » Lindblade stepped away from softball following her sophomore year to pursue her career goals and serve more actively in her church community, while Barber graduated in May 2025.

MAROON AND WHITE

- » Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019.
- » Has coached 16 Bulldogs who went on to professional careers, nine of whom were selected in a professional draft. Five of her proteges are currently playing professionally (Raelin Chaffin, Mia Davidson, Chloe Malau'ulu, Sierra Sacco and Aspen Wesley).
- » Has coached multiple players to All-Region honors in each of the last seven seasons, including a school-record six players in the 2025 campaign.
- » Broke the school record in 2025 with her 45th coaching victory against an NFCA-ranked opponent.
- » The Bulldogs have finished SEC play better than predicted by the Preseason Coaches' Poll in four of five full seasons under her guidance.
- » In 2025, MSU finished above .500 in conference play (13-11) for the first time since 2001 (19-11) and won five series for the first time since 2007. Along with 2024 (12-12), the Bulldogs posted their first back-to-back years with at least a .500 record since 1998-99. The prior year, she guided State to its highest SEC finish since the shift to a 24-game SEC schedule.
- » Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- » Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20) at that time.
- » Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0) and became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10-game start by a head coach in program history.
- » Won 66 of her first 100 games, the best total of any Bulldog head coach and third among active SEC coaches in their first 100 contests.
- » Led State to its first Super Regional appearance in 2022, upsetting No. 2 Florida State twice in Tallahassee to advance.
- » Guided MSU to its highest final ranking on record (No. 19) in 2022.
- » Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, eight NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career.
- » Served as an assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach.
- » Since her arrival, MSU has hit at least one home run in 55.5 percent of its games (336 of 605) and gone 246-90 in those games through 2025.
- » The top six single-season home run totals in program history have all come under her watch, and she has coached eight of the top 11 players in MSU history in career home runs along with seven of the top 10 individual season totals on record.
- » In 2019, MSU was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs.
- » For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans in 2019 (Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson).
- » Davidson went on to break Rafael Palmeiro's mark for the most home runs in a career by a Bulldog baseball or softball player along with shattering the SEC softball career record.
- » In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional and Caroline Seitz became the first Bulldog to earn First Team All-SEC honors since Chelsea Bramlett in 2010.
- » During the 2016 season, she led Kayla Winkfield to an SEC-leading six triples, which ranked among the nation's top 10.
- » In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416).

WICHITA STATE UNIVERSITY

- » Served as assistant coach at Wichita State from 2012-14, working with the team's hitters and consistently improving their production.
- » Her last spring at WSU saw the Shockers increase their overall win total by 15 from 2013 to 2014 and win the program's first regular-season conference title.
- » Part of the 2014 MVC Coaching Staff of the Year, helping to improve the Shockers from the ninth place in 2012, to eighth place in 2013, to MVC champs in 2014.
- » Produced five starters who each hit better than .300 in 2014 after the squad did not have a batter hit over .300 in 2013.
- » The Shockers scored 138 more runs, smashed 26 more home runs, hit 11 more doubles and added seven more triples from the previous season.
- » Overall, the 2014 team established program single-season records for batting average, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, runs scored, hits, doubles, home runs, runs batted in and total bases.
- » Led Cacy Williams to an NFCA All-Midwest Region First Team selection in 2014 as well as MVC Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year, becoming the first student-athlete in MVC history to receive both in the same year.
- » Williams broke the Wichita State single-season records for batting average (.424), slugging percentage (.812), on-base percentage (.531), total bases (138), runs scored (57), home runs (16) and RBIs (47).

ADDITIONAL COACHING EXPERIENCE

- » Served as assistant coach for the USSSA Florida Pride of the NPF as the team claimed the regular season championship, and the staff was recognized as Coaching Staff of the Year.
- » Began coaching career as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma from 2010-11.
