QUICK HITS

- Wichita State opens the 2026 season and Year 15 of the **Kristi Bredbenner** era with the first of three straight tournaments in the Lone Star State.
- The Shockers begin in Waco, Texas at the Getteman Classic in 2015 when the Shockers went 2-3.
- The Shockers are 6-8 all time vs. Baylor, 0-1 vs. Mississippi State, 9-6 vs. New Mexico and 3-0 vs. Northwestern State.
- Wichita State is 23-25 in season openers and 11-3 under Bredbenner.
- The Shockers have won 11 of their last 12 season openers, including seven in a row.
- Wichita State is scheduled to face eight NCAA Tournament teams from a year ago (Mississippi State, Arkansas, Clemson, Miami (OH), Oklahoma State, Florida Atlantic, South Florida, Oklahoma).
- Wichita State was picked to finish 3rd by the league's coaches in the 2026 American Conference Preseason Coaches Poll. Florida Atlantic received 8 first place votes and was picked to win the league. South Florida came in 2nd.
- Seven Shockers return in 2026, led by 2025 American Conference Co-Freshman of the Year, **Ryley Nihart**.

• Wichita State welcomes 14 newcomers into the fold in the way of seven transfers, two junior college transfers and five freshmen.

• A pair of highly decorated McLennan Community College transfers hope to follow in **CC Wong's** footsteps. Wong, a former Wichita State All-American, spent two seasons at McLennan and was the 2022 Co-National Player of the Year. This season **Trinity Allen** and **Mickayla Tosch** bring their talents to Wichita. Allen was the 2025 NJCAA National Player of the Year and two-time All-American. Tosch was also a two-time NJCAA All-American and two-time Rawlings Gold Glove winner.

• Mississippi State head coach **Samantha Ricketts** was an assistant coach at Wichita State from 2012-14, helping the Shockers capture the 2014 Missouri Valley Conference regular season title.

SCOUTING BAYLOR

Baylor enters the 2026 campaign after going 27-27 last season, and 11-13 in the Big 12. Head coach Glenn Moore enters his 26th season leading the Bears with more than 1,000 career wins to his name. The Bears bring back 12 letterwinners, including six starters. The Bears return a strong group of veterans headlined by **Brooklyn Carter** who started 53 of 54 games a season ago, hitting .313 with 22 stolen bases in 25 attempts. **Amber Toven** is set to anchor the infield two years removed from a season ending injury that cost the Arizona transfer a majority of the 2024 campaign.

SERIES HISTORY

The Wichita State-Baylor series dates back to the first meeting in 1980 that Baylor won in dominant fashion, 10-0. Wichita State bounced back to win the next three meetings, two of those coming more than 16 years later. Eight of the 14 all time meetings have come on a neutral field. The Shockers are just 1-5 all time against the Bears in Waco. Baylor enters the matchup on a three-game win streak over Wichita State.

LAST MEETING VS. THE BEARS

It's been 11 years since Wichita State last faced Baylor, coincidentally it was at the 2015 Getteman Classic in Waco. The Bears came out on top, 7-4. Baylor built a 3-0 lead after 2.0 innings, but Wichita State answered with a 4-run third inning. Wichita State's lead would not survive the next half inning, as the Bears tied it on an RBI single. A three-run home run in the bottom of the fourth would be the final runs for either team the rest of the way.

SCOUTING MISSISSIPPI STATE

Mississippi State enters the 2026 campaign ranked in the Top 25 in all four major polls, as high as No. 21 by Softball America. The Bulldogs are coming off a 39-19 season in 2025 that included an NCAA Regional appearance. Mississippi State was eliminated in the Lubbock Regional Final by the eventual National Runner-Up Red Raiders. Head Coach **Samantha Ricketts** begins her seventh season at the helm with 198 career victories to her name. The former Shocker assistant coach brings back 13 letterwinners, including **Nadia Barbary**. Barbary is the top returning bat in the lineup after hitting .353 with 11 home runs, 13 doubles and 46 RBIs in 2025. Two of the top three home run hitters are back in Starkville along with **Kiarra Sells**. Sells tied with Barbary and **Sierra Sacco** with 11 homers last season. In the circle, **Delainey Everett** is the top returning arm for the Bulldogs. Everett was second on the team in innings last season at 74.1. She was 10-2 in 25 appearances with 49 strikeouts and just 15 walks. Her 2.92 ERA was best on the team.

SERIES HISTORY

This will be just the second all time meeting between the Bulldogs and Shockers. Mississippi State won the previous matchup in 2013, 4-0 at the Blues City Classic in Southaven, Miss.

LAST MEETING VS. THE BULLDOGS

Mississippi State pitcher **Alison Owen** struck out 15 Shockers and allowed just two hits in the 4-0 complete game shutout. The only Shocker to record a hit was **Brittany Fortner** on a pair of doubles.

SCOUTING NEW MEXICO

Nicole Orgeron enters her fourth season as the head coach of the Lobos. Orgeron oversees the pitchers and catchers, areas the Lobos have made significant strides under her leadership. This past season, the Lobo pitching staff finished with a 3.99 ERA, the lowest since 2005 with eight shutouts, the most since 2004. UNM's staff allowed 385 hits, the fewest since 2011 and 235 runs, the fewest since 2008. The 271 strikeouts were the fifth most in a single season in program history. The Lobos bring back their second leading hitter in **Allie Williams**. Williams hit .339 with 13 doubles and 24 RBIs, while starting all 52 games.

SERIES HISTORY

Wichita State and New Mexico have faced each other 15 times prior to this weekend, with the Shockers owning a 9-6 record vs. the Lobos. Fourteen of the 15 meetings have come on a neutral field, and all 15 have been competitive. The largest margin of victory is just six runs, coming in a 6-0 shutout by New Mexico in 1998.

LAST MEETING VS. THE LOBOS

The two programs haven't met since 2008 when the Shockers downed the Lobos, 8-6, in New Mexico's home tournament. Wichita State jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the first inning, only to see New Mexico fight back to take a 6-4 lead on a second inning grand slam. A **Cynthia Verhulst** three-run home run put Wichita State up for good in the fourth inning.

SCOUTING NORTHWESTERN STATE

Year 2 under head coach **Jenny Fuller** is set to begin in Natchitoches. The former Pittsburg State head coach looks to improve on a first year that saw the Lady Demons go 7-43. One of those seven wins came against No. 20 Mississippi State in Starkville. In three seasons at Pitt State, Fuller went 105-55, including a 53-8 season in 2024. Her first season was one of growth, both for her and her players, as she guided the youngest team in the country with 17 of the 18 players on the team classified as freshmen or sophomores. The first signature win of Fuller's tenure at NSU was made possible by the performance of one of the 12 freshmen on the team, pitcher **Brooklynn Stohler**, who threw her first career shutout in the win. Stohler went on to throw 155.0 innings in her first season, the sixth most by a freshman in NSU history and just the fifth pitcher in the past 10 seasons to toss more than 150.0 innings in a season.

SERIES HISTORY

Wichita State is 3-0 all time vs. the Lady Demons with two of those coming in 2023. All three meetings have come on a neutral field.

LAST MEETING VS. THE LADY DEMONS

Wichita State swept its way through the 2023 North Texas Invitational, which included a pair of wins over Northwestern State. The Shockers won the two games by scores of 7-1 and 5-2. In the opener, **Addison Barnard** belted a three-run home run to put the game away in the fourth inning. **Lauren Howell** tossed a complete game, allowing just one run on four hits and seven strikeouts. The next day Wichita State used home runs from **Zoe Jones** and **Lainee Brown** and a dominant outing out of the bullpen by **Alex Aguilar** to complete the sweep.

TOUGH SLEDDING

Wichita State has never shied away from playing a tough schedule, and that is no different in 2026. The Shockers are scheduled to play six teams ranked or receiving votes in the Preseason NFCA Top 25: No. 3 Oklahoma, No. 9 Arkansas, No. 13 Clemson, No. 22 Mississippi State and No. 24 Oklahoma State. Florida Atlantic received votes.

COLLECTING THE ACCOLADES

The Shockers had a First-Team All-Conference honoree for the 12th consecutive season in 2025. **Lauren Lucas** earned First Team All-Conference honors this season. The streak began in 2013 with **Erin Carney**.

SOMETHING TO CHEW ON

Head Coach **Kristi Bredbenner** started a new tradition in 2021 to reward players who hit home runs. Instead of a normal high-five for her players as they round the bases, Bredbenner began tossing a piece of Hi-Chew candy to her home run hitters. Former Shocker **Madison Espinosa** should be credited for introducing the chewy candy to Coach B at the first tournament of the season down in Conroe, Texas, and thus a new tradition was born. The tradition enters season No. 5 in 2025, so be on the lookout for flying candy.

THE BRED-WINNER

Kristi Bredbenner is the longest tenured head coach in Wichita State softball history, which has resulted in 421 wins in 15 seasons. Bredbenner has the second-highest winning percentage in school history (.574) behind current Florida softball coach **Tim Walton**. She is Wichita State's all-time wins leader after surpassing **Jim Maynard** on April 24, 2022.

CALL THE BOMB SQUAD

Over the last five seasons Wichita State has hit the fourth most home runs in all of Division I softball.

WICHITA STATE ANNOUNCES FACILITY MASTERPLAN FOR WILKINS STADIUM

Wichita State will embark on a \$7.3 million Phase 1 renovation of Wilkins Stadium, home of Shockers softball, that will be made possible in part through a substantial \$1.1 million estate gift from long-time Shockers athletic supporter and fan Linda Parke and a generous \$100,000 gift from Jeanie and Ricky Brotherton.

"Over the last 18 months, Wichita State University has strategically invested significant resources in our softball program, intending to maximize immediate support and compliment the competitive growth our coaches and student-athletes have worked so hard to achieve," said Wichita State Director of Athletics Kevin Saal. "From renewed commitments to Coach Bredbenner and her staff, to new batting cages, lights, future home dugout and synthetic grass surface (to be installed upon conclusion of the 2023 season), we have invested over two-million dollars in our softball program."

The Wilkins Stadium masterplan project will bring state of the art training and playing facilities to Wichita State softball student-athletes and coaches. The renovations include a 12,471 square-foot team complex which includes a locker room, coaches locker room, classroom, team room, athletic training room, staff offices, break room, work room, umpire locker rooms and laundry area. It will also include a 14,400 square-foot indoor practice facility that will feature a full indoor infield and batting cages along with storage areas and viewing areas for coaches. Turf was installed in the outfield and on the warning track, foul territory and apron areas at Wilkins Stadium in June of 2023.

Fan amenities include an enclosed concourse with a grand front entrance, berm outfield seating, a new scoreboard with videoboard, expanded seating areas, suites and press box, ticket office, concession stands, additional restrooms, merchandise store, fan netting and outfield suites. There will be a variety of seating options for 1,500 fans including chairback seating, bleacher seating and berm outfield seating as well as a new entryway into the parking lot connected to Wilkins Stadium.

The stadium renovation will also include a field technology area, spaces for the media, radio and TV booths, control room for the videoboard and a multi-use suite that can be used for multiple types of groups including recruiting events, team events, private companies, community members and other large groups.

The single-story team complex will be constructed on the southwest corner of Wilkins Stadium with the indoor practice facility built just north of the team complex.

"The investment the University is making into Wilkins Stadium and the softball program is phenomenal," said Head Softball Coach Kristi Bredbenner. "Fans of Wichita State athletics are one of the foundations of this athletic department and support outside of the cheers in the stands will give our student-athletes an opportunity to play and practice in a world-class facility. Over the last several years there has been a movement to support female sports. We are thrilled and thankful to have a lifelong female Shockers fan like Linda Parke provide a leadership gift in support of Phase 1 of the project. We cherish the relationship we have built with Ricky and Jeanie Brotherton and appreciate the investments they continue to make to the Shockers Softball program. The growth of Shockers Softball is a testament to all of the former and current student-athletes that have worked hard to leave the program better than they found it. I can't wait for each and every one of them to see the fruits of their labor and for our fans to pack the stadium to cheer on this program."

"Since July of 2022, and in parallel with our recent investments, Wichita State University and Shockers Athletics have engaged in a comprehensive facility master planning process for Wilkins Stadium," Saal said. "These efforts provide a definitive plan through which we intend to build a consistent championship-level softball program positioned to maximize student-athlete development, recruitment and retention. In the coming months, we will remain laser-focused on acquiring the resources necessary to fuel our bold and progressive plans for Shockers Softball."

Minimum estimates for the Wilkins Stadium masterplan project currently stand at approximately \$17.5 million. GLMV Architecture and facility planners are completing design concepts and planning to build in phases.

Phase 1 of the project would include the softball team facility and the indoor practice facility at \$7.3 million, Phase 2 would include the entrance/press box/ticket office and seating areas at \$1.9 million, Phase 3 would include the remodeling of existing facilities/seating/fan experience elements at \$3.5 million and Phase 4 would include the outfield area/event pavilions and paving at \$700,000.

Construction estimates place the total at \$13.4 million, with an additional \$3.4 million for project soft costs, and \$750,000 for the videoboard to put the total project at \$17.5 million.

Kristi Bredbenner is in her 15th season as the Wichita State head softball coach. To date, Bredbenner has led the Shockers to five NCAA Regional Appearances (2016, 2018, 2021, 2022, 2023) including the only NCAA Regional Final appearances in school history (2018, 2021).

The 2023 campaign was another one for the record books. Wichita State won 44 games, the second most in school history, defeated three Top 10 teams, including wins over No. 2 Oklahoma State in Wichita and No. 3 Oklahoma State in Stillwater and saw the Shockers reach the Top 20 in all four major polls for the first time in program history. Wichita State's victories over the Cowgirls marked the highest ranked wins in school history.

On April 24, 2022, Bredbenner became Wichita State's all-time winningest coach when she recorded her 314th career win.

For the first time in program history Wichita State punched its ticket to consecutive NCAA Regional appearances after earning an at-large bid to the 2022 NCAA Fayetteville Regional. The 2022 Shockers were among the nation's best offensive teams for a second straight season. Wichita State ranked second nationally in home runs, home runs per game, scoring, slugging percentage and on base percentage, while ranking third in batting average.

Bredbenner is also responsible for coaching the only four All-Americans in school history (Addison Barnard, Sydney McKinney, Lauren Lucas and CC Wong). Barnard crushed her way even more into the Wichita State record books, while also adding her name to the NCAA record books. McKinney became the first two-time All-American after another sensational season for the Black & Yellow.

The 2021 season will go down as one of the best seasons in school history. Under Bredbenner's guidance, Wichita State tied the school record with a 13-game win streak during the season; and broke several single season records. Wichita State shattered the single season record for home runs with 90, while also setting new marks in RBI, runs scored and total bases. Sydney McKinney was named the American Player of the Year, becoming the second Shock to earn that title. Addison Barnard was tabbed the Rookie of the Year and Kaylee Huecker took home Defensive Player of the Year honors. Additionally, the Shockers placed four on the All-Conference First Team (Barnard, McKinney, Madison Perrigan and Neleigh Herring). Bredbenner and her coaching staff also earned American Coaching Staff of the Year honors.

McKinney also became the program's first-ever NFCA All-American in 2021, earning third team honors after ranking third in the nation in hits and posting a school record .439 batting average.

Wichita State won six games vs. ranked opponents in 2021, including a win at No. 6 Oklahoma State, the highest ranked win in school history at the time. The Shockers also cracked the Top 25 in all four of the major polls for the first time in school history. Wichita State was ranked as high as No. 23 in the NFCA Coaches Poll. Under Bredbenner, 49 student-athletes have earned all-conference accolades and 21 NFCA All-Region honors.

During the 2018 season, Wichita State's inaugural season in the American Athletic Conference, Bredbenner led the Shockers to a tie for third position in the regular season, falling in the opening round of the conference tournament to the eventual champions. After scheduling the 9th toughest non-conference slate in the NCAA, the Shockers earned the program's second ever at-large bid in school history to the NCAA Tournament. While at the Fayetteville Regional the Shockers picked up two wins over Oklahoma State in back-to-back days to earn a spot in the Regional Championship for the first time in school history.

During conference play, the Wichita State bats dominated The American by leading the league in batting average, slugging percentage, runs scored, hits, RBI's, doubles, home runs and total bases.

Individually, six Shocker athletes were named All-Conference, including 2018 AAC Player of the Year Mackenzie Wright, who became the third WSU athlete in history to earn All-Conference honors all four years of their career. Laurie Derrico and Bailey Lange were also tabbed first team all-conference, while Ryleigh Buck and Paige Luellen were named to the second team. Bailee Nickerson earned a spot on the All-Rookie squad.

Wright also earned 2018 NFCA Central Region Second-Team honors. Under Bredbenner, 31 student-athletes have earned All-Conference honors including the six from the 2018 squad and 15 to the All-MVC First Team during WSU's time in the The Valley. Eight have also been named to the All-MVC Second Team while two have made the MVC All-Defensive team.

In her first three seasons, Bredbenner took the Shockers from a 15-40 record in 2012 to a 34-21 record in 2014, culminating in the first Missouri Valley Conference regular season championship in school history earning the entire Shock coaching staff the 2014 MVC Coaching Staff of the Year award.

As a team, the Shockers broke several then-team records in 2014 including the following: highest team batting average (.314 average)—was previously set at .305 in 1978, highest slugging percentage (.492 average)—was previously set at .446 in 1978, runs scored (314)—was previously set at 293 runs scored in 2005, most hits (472)—was previously set at 458 hits in 2005, and home runs (56)—was previously set at 52 home runs in 2005.
