### QUICK HITS

- The Yellow Jackets are coming off a spotless 6-0 week which featured four shutout wins and four run rule wins.
- Madalyn Johnson had an exceptional week with three starts, two complete games, two solo shut outs, 15.0 innings pitched, 15 strikeouts, and no a single run surrendered, earned or unearned.
- With 41 strikeouts in just 10 appearances so far this season, Johnson is already well over halfway to last year's total of 60 strikeouts in 19 outings.
- Johnson was named both the ACC Pitcher of the Week and an NFCA Top Performer on Tuesday.
- Alyssa Willer had an exceptional week as well as she finished the I-75 Tournament with a combined eight runs, seven hits, two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, 15 total bases, and three stolen bases.
- Tech's 52 total runs scored during the 2026 I-75 Tournament are the most since the 2024 season which saw the Yellow Jackets record 54 runs. Despite being shy of surpassing the 2024 tournament runs scored mark, Tech only surrendered seven runs while the 2024 team surrendered 20 runs across the six-game tournament.
- Tech is currently on its longest win streak of the season after winning all six games of the I-75 Tournament.
- At home, Tech boasts an 11-2 record so far this season with its only home losses at the moment being to No. 16 Alabama. Of it's 11 home wins so far, seven of the Yellow Jackets' wins have been earned after less than seven innings. The seven run-rule victories are the most since the 2024 season when the Yellow Jackets collected 10 run-rule wins.
- Mississippi State enters the contest with only one loss so far this season with that loss being a 1-0 finish against Belmont.
- The Yellow Jackets have competed in four-ranked match ups in just the first two weeks of the 2026 season after most recently playing No. 5 Florida in a pair of games at the Florida Classic which were Tech's first road tests of the season.

### THE TALE OF THE TAPE

- Tech trails 13-4 in the overall series against Mississippi State with only two wins while at home on The Flats.

- The Yellow Jackets most recent game against the Bulldogs was during the 2025 season when Tech fell 11-3 during the Snowman Tournament.

- Tech's most recent win over Mississippi State was during the 2022 season (4-1).

### BUZZ CLASSIC: THE 27TH EDITION

- Tech opened its season with the annual Buzz Classic Tournament at Mewborn Field in Atlanta, Ga. and saw a 4-2 record after taking on No. 16 Alabama, ECU, and Villanova two times each.

- The Yellow Jackets successfully defended Mewborn against Villanova (8-0 in six innings, 8-0 in five innings) and ECU (13-6, 6-2) but unfortunately came up short to the No. 16 ranked Crimson Tide (9-0, 7-2).

- Day one of the tournament saw transfer sophomore Madalyn Johnson collected her first win and shutout as a Yellow Jacket after tying her career high for strikeouts (9) in a career high tying 6.0 innings pitched. Seven Yellow Jackets rounded home plate to help Tech with the 8-0 win including Raegan Wall who tied her career high for runs with two on Thursday. The six-inning victory was Tech's first run-rule win since its 10-0 five-inning win over Penn State during the 2025 Bye Weekend Tournament.

- Day two of the tournament saw Tech go 1-1 after the quick five-inning 8-0 win over Villanova before falling 9-0 to no. 16 Alabama. The second day of action saw the Yellow Jackets compete in front of their first sold out crowd of the season. The Friday sellout crowd is the first since April of the 2025 season against Clemson. Tymber Harris had an exceptional showing in game one of Friday as she made her first career start and earned her first career win after throwing a career high five strikeouts across a career high 5.0 innings pitched. The 8-0 win on Friday marked back-to-back run-rule victories for Tech which hadn't happened since April of the 2024 season (9-0 in five innings vs. Alabama St., 8-0 in five innings vs. Louisville).

- Day three of the tournament was a short day as Tech once again took on No. 16 Alabama. Gailey hit her second home run of the season, 10th career home run. Tucker's first inning home run was her first of the season, 15th career home run. Madalyn Johnson made her second start of the season, facing 26 batters across 5.1 innings and recording five strikeouts. Kenley Hilleary saw her first action sporting White and Tech Gold after she relieved Johnson in the sixth inning. In her first appearance at Mewborn, Kenley faced eight batters across 1.2 innings and surrendered no runs.

- In the final day of the Buzz Classic. Tech took on ECU in a double header and walked away with two wins after a combined 19 runs and 21 hits finished game one 10-6 and game two 6-2. Tucker saw a career high three home runs in game one on Sunday along with her third career grand slam. Her nine RBI in game one were a new career high as were her 12 total bases. Emma Simona and Gracie King hit their first career home runs respectively. Sydnie Watts made her second start of the season in game two and was able to walk away with her first win of the season after facing 20 batters in 5.0 innings pitched and recording one strikeout. Tymber Harris collected her second win of the season after relieving Hilleary and pitching 2.57 innings in game one.

### EVERYONE BUT THE ACC

- Tech begins the 2026 season hosting the 27th Annual Buzz Classic, featuring Villanova, Alabama, and ECU Feb. 5-8 and finished opening week with a 4-2 record.

- The Yellow Jackets then hosted Kennesaw State in its first midweek game of the season and walked away with a 10-2 win in six innings, highlighted by Alyssa Willer with three runs on four hits, two of which were home runs.

- With a 5-2 record, Tech packed the bus for its first road tests of the season as competed against No. Florida, FIU, and Marshall in the Florida Classic in Gainesville, Fla.

### 2026 AT A GLANCE

- Tech begins the 2026 season hosting the 27th Annual Buzz Classic, featuring Villanova, Alabama, and ECU Feb. 5-8.

- The Yellow Jackets host their first midweek clash the following Tuesday, Feb. 10, against Kennesaw State. Georgia Tech will pack the bus for Florida to compete in its lone road tournament of the season against Florida, FIU, and Marshall Feb. 13-15.

- Tech returns home to serve as one host of the I-75 Tournament Feb. 19-22 which will feature six games at Mewborn Field, against four different opponents (College of Charleston, Georgia State University, Purdue, and Yale).
- The Yellow Jackets will host Mississippi State in a midweek match up before opening their ACC slate at home against Notre Dame Feb. 28- Mar. 1.
- The remainder of the season will see Tech host eight midweek contests against Troy (Mar. 3), UAB (Mar. 10), West Georgia (Mar. 24), Georgia State (Mar. 25), Mercer (Apr. 1), Jacksonville State (Apr. 7), Georgia Southern (Apr. 15), and Furman (Apr. 22). Tech will play only one more non-conference road contest against Georgia (Mar. 18).
- Tech's first road ACC series will take place in South Carolina against Clemson (Mar. 6-8) and will quickly be followed by another ACC road series against Virginia (Mar. 13-15).
- Following the back-to-back road series, Tech will welcome Duke to Mewborn Field (Mar. 20-22) before heading back out to take on Louisville (Mar. 27-29).
- The Yellow Jackets will host the Eagles of Boston College Apr. 3-5 before using their bye weekend to travel north-west to Iowa to take on Iowa and South Dakota State (Apr. 10-12).
- Tech will close out its conference road slate Apr. 17-19 against Virginia Tech before finishing the season at home against Florida State (Apr. 24-26).

### **RETURN OF THE JACKETS**

- Tech softball is set to return a core group for the 2026 season including infielders Gracyn Tucker and Addison Leschber along with outfielders Alyssa Willer and Paige Vukadinovich.
- In the circle, Tech fans can anticipate seeing the return of Makayla Coffield and Sydnie Watts as well as Reese Hunter behind the plate.
- The Jackets return to play following the 2025 season where Tech had three top-25 wins, including their first top-15 win since 2012, and punched its ticket to the NCAA Regionals for the first time since 2022.
- Ahead of the 2026 season, Tech softball has added nine freshman and four transfers, two from JMU, one from Kennesaw State, and even one from ACC opponent Cal.
- Morales returns for her ninth season on The Flats in 2025-2026 as assistant coaches Erin Dixon returns for her third season overseeing the pitching staff and Deven Boland resumes his assistant coach position, focusing on the Jackets' hitting.
- Assistant coach Megan Hill returns for her second season serving as the program's point of contact for recruiting, as does Mya Knuteson, who assumes the role of Director of Operations for the Yellow Jackets.

### **THE AMO SHOW**

- Coach Aileen Morales was inducted into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame for her playing career as part of the 2021 class.
- Morales was an all-American shortstop, three-time all-ACC selection, NPF draftee and leads the program in career games played, games started, at bats and stolen bases while placing top five in runs scored, hits, doubles, triples. She also leads the Jackets in stolen bases through a season, owning three of the top five marks while placing top five in seasonal games played, at bats and runs scored as well.
- Morales also earned her 100th win as the Yellow Jackets' skipper over Furman on Feb. 22, 2022.
- In 2021, she surpassed 200 career wins as a head coach and in 2024 she reached 300 wins in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament.

- The 2025 season saw Morales hit yet another milestone as she hit 200 wins as Georgia Tech's head coach and finished the season with 214 wins coaching Tech, 327 wins as a head coach.
- Morales also found her way onto the Softball on SI NCAA Division I All-Quarter-Century Team. Morales made the final cut out of 42 total shortstops across the last 25 years.
- Coach Morales earned her spot on the All-Quarter-Century Team in runaway fashion after collecting nearly 1,000 votes. Tech was one of eight teams to have a softball alumnus receive the honor and one of three schools to represent the ACC on the All-Quarter-Century-Team.

### **TECH'S NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY**

- Georgia Tech's 2025 Regional selection marked the 13th appearance in program history.
- Tech's first NCAA postseason action came in 2002 after winning its first ACC Tournament title, beginning a run of 11 straight Regional or better appearances from 2002-12.
- The Jackets won both the ACC regular season and tournament titles in 2005, 2009 and 2010, advancing to the White and Gold's lone Super Regional appearance in 2009.
- Tech was also crowned ACC regular season champions in 2011, followed by another ACC Tournament title in 2012, rounding out the totals to four regular season championships and five tournament titles.
- Tech returned to Gainesville, Fla. after visiting Gator territory for its 2022 Regional run that saw the Yellow Jackets defeat No. 3 seed Wisconsin, 2-1, in game one
- Overall, the Yellow Jackets hold a 3-8 record when their tournament run includes spending time in Gainesville, Fla.

### **IT'S GRAND TO BE A JACKET**

- Tucker is the first Yellow Jacket to see grand slams in back-to-back seasons since Mallorie Black (2023-24).

- The Jackets continued the Buzz Classic with yet another soldout crowd at Mewborn as it rematched No. 16 Alabama on Saturday with the highest attended game of the season so far as more fans took advantage of the offered standing room tickets.

Aileen Morales, one of the most decorated student-athletes in Georgia Tech softball history and a former highly successful assistant coach at her alma mater, returned to The Flats as the program's sixth head coach on June 7, 2017. She'll enter her ninth season in 2026.

During the 2025 season, Morales led Tech softball to the ACC Tournament Quarterfinals and the NCAA Tournament Regionals following a 27-24 season that saw three top-25 wins, including its first top-15 win since 2012. Under the direction of coach Morales, Tech softball saw three ACC post-season honors as well as three NFCA All-Region honors. The Tech alumni collected her 200th win as the head coach after a 2-1 win over NC State (3/7/25). Morales was also honored following the 2025 season as she was named to the Softball on SI NCAA Division I All-Quarter-Century Team after beating out 42 total shortstops across the last 25 years. She earned her spot on the All-Quarter-Century Team in runaway fashion after collecting nearly 1,000 votes. Tech was one of eight teams to have a softball alumnus receive the honor and one of three schools to represent the ACC on the All-Quarter-Century-Team.

Morales made her own history in her sixth season leading the Yellow Jackets, surpassing 150 wins as a head coach at Georgia Tech with 155 and 250 victories in her career with 268, remaining the fourth-winningest coach in softball history on The Flats. In conference wins, Morales also eclipsed 50, moving to 55, with a win over Virginia as she owns the second-best mark in program history. In terms of win percentages, Morales remains third in program history both overall at .535 and in ACC play at .426. As a unit, the Yellow Jackets earned a win in the ACC tournament for the fourth consecutive year as they went 26-27 overall, including a 7-17 conference record. The squad was among the nation's best defensively, turning in a .978 fielding percentage to rank 11th in the nation and second in the ACC.

In her fifth season on The Flats, Morales brought the Yellow Jackets back to national prominence by reaching their first NCAA Regional since 2012 and 12th in program history, earning a win in the first round. To get there, she led the White and Gold to a 38-18 overall record for the most wins and nonconference wins (27) since 2011. Tech's 84.4 nonconference win percentage and 24 home wins were also program bests. Morales' Jackets achieved a final RPI of No. 23, the highest since 2011 after tallying the eighth most wins and the 10th best win percentage all-time. Tech picked up a pair of ranked victories, including a thriller over Notre Dame and a mercy-rule triumph over Georgia marking the Jackets' largest margin of victory over the Bulldogs, their first win in the series since 2012 and the first on the road since 2007. Statistically, Morales guided Tech to rank fifth in the nation and second in the conference in walks as well as third in program history with a .395 on-base percentage. Georgia Tech also stood firm defensively to place second in the ACC and in single-season program history with a .975 fielding percentage. The Yellow Jackets went 6-0 against in-state opponents, compiling nine mercy rule wins and eight shutouts on the year. Morales also guided individual standouts to three all-ACC honors and two all-region selections on the way to one of the top turnarounds as a team in the country. On Feb. 22, Morales also earned her 100th win as head coach of the Yellow Jackets.

Tech returned to action in full capacity following the abbreviated 2020 year for Morales' fourth season on The Flats as the White and Gold finished 20-26 in the quarterfinal round of the ACC tournament. Morales achieved her 200th career win as a head coach during the season, also being selected into the Georgia Tech Hall of Fame as a member of the 2021 class for her playing career.

Year three for Morales was cut short due to Covid-19 as the Jackets remained above .500 at 12-11.

Morales followed her first season with more success in her second, coaching the team to its first ACC tournament win since 2012 with a decisive 8-0, five-inning run-rule win over Virginia in the opening round. She brought Tech over the 30 win mark for the first time since 2012, finishing with a 31-27 record, including the program's 1,000th win.

In her first year at the helm of the Georgia Tech softball program, Morales led the Jackets to their first postseason appearance since 2014. Tech recorded five ACC series wins for the first time since 2011, finishing sixth in the ACC. With 28 wins on the season, Tech surpassed with 25-win mark for the first time since 2013 and finished above .500 for the first time since 2012.

In her nine seasons as a student-athlete (2005-08) and assistant coach (2009-13) at Georgia Tech, she helped lead the Yellow Jackets to four Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season championships (2005, 2009-11), four ACC Tournament titles (2005, 2009-10, 2012), eight NCAA regionals (2005-12) and an NCAA Super Regional (2009). The Jackets averaged 43 wins per season during her nine years with the program.

Since leaving her alma mater following the 2013 campaign, she has added four seasons as a successful head coach to her resume, first at Young Harris College in Young Harris, Ga. (2014-15) and most recently at Radford University in Radford, Va. (2016-17).

After inheriting a program that won just 12 games in 2015, Morales engineered the biggest turnaround in NCAA Division I softball when she led Radford to a 35-26 record in her first season at the helm in '16. Despite beginning her collegiate career during what was scheduled to be her final high-school season, she hit .296 with five doubles, a triple, two home runs, 32 RBI and an ACC-best 44 stolen bases in 49 attempts as a freshman, en route to being named ACC co-Freshman of the Year and earning second-team all-conference recognition.

She went on to be a three-time all-ACC honoree as a middle infielder, earning first-team accolades as a junior and senior in 2007 and '08, and was also a three-time all-region selection. She earned third-team all-America honors.

She remains Georgia Tech's all-time leader in games played (265), starts (265), at-bats (850) and stolen bases (154) and ranks among the program's top 10 in runs (second – 216), hits (third – 261), doubles (fifth – 43) and triples (fifth – 10). She also holds three of the top five single-season stolen base totals in school history, including a school-record 46 as a senior in 2008.

Over the course of Morales' four-year playing career, Georgia Tech won 185 games, claimed the 2005 ACC regular-season and tournament championships and advanced to the NCAA postseason four times. She was inducted into the Georgia Tech Athletics Hall of Fame in 2020.

Following the end of her collegiate playing career, she was selected by the Chicago Bandits in the second round of the 2008 National Pro Fastpitch Draft. She played two seasons with the Bandits and helped lead the squad to the NPF championship as a rookie in 2008.

She also boasts international experience as a player and coach with the Puerto Rican national team. She competed internationally for Puerto Rico from 2007-10 and served as an assistant coach for the 2012 squad that finished eighth at the International Softball Federation World Championship, PR's best finish in more than a decade.

A three-time second-team academic all-district selection as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, Morales graduated with a bachelor's degree in business management in 2009. The Columbus, Ga. native earned a master's in sport management from Georgia Southern in 2013.

She remains Georgia Tech's all-time leader in games played (265), starts (265), at-bats (850) and stolen bases (154) and ranks among the program's top 10 in runs (second – 216), hits (third – 261), doubles (t-fifth – 43) and triples (t-fifth – 10). She also holds three of the top five single-season stolen base totals in school history, including a school-record 46 as a senior in 2008.

Over the course of Morales' four-year playing career, Georgia Tech won 185 games, claimed the 2005 ACC regular-season and tournament championships and advanced to the NCAA postseason four times. She was inducted into the Georgia Tech Athletics Hall of Fame in 2020.

Following the end of her collegiate playing career, she was selected by the Chicago Bandits in the second round of the 2008 National Pro Fastpitch Draft. She played two seasons with the Bandits and helped lead the squad to the NPF championship as a rookie in 2008.

She also boasts international experience as a player and coach with the Puerto Rican national team. She competed internationally for Puerto Rico from 2007-10 and served as an assistant coach for the 2012 squad that finished eighth at the International Softball Federation World Championship, PR's best finish in more than a decade.

A three-time second-team academic all-district selection as a student-athlete at Georgia Tech, Morales graduated with a bachelor's degree in business management in 2009. The Columbus, Ga. native earned a master's in sport management from Georgia Southern in 2013.


