About the Opponents

The Gaels represent the three-seed in the four team Eugene Regional, and will open up play against the two-seed Mississippi State. The Bulldogs enter the tournament with a 38-18 record, but went just 9-15, good for 10th in the 15 team SEC. Seventh year head coach Samantha Ricketts has now guided her team to five NCAA Regionals in her tenure, and will look to take her team back to the Super Regional for the first time since 2022. The offense has been hot and cold for the Bulldogs this year, but the pitching and defense has been elite, with their staff ERA of 2.24 ranking eighth in the country and their 0.985 fielding percentage ranking second. Senior pitcher Peja Gould has led Mississippi State from the circle all year long, going 15-10 with a 2.12 ERA and 169 strikeouts while allowing opponents to hit just 0.177 against her. The Gaels are 1-0 all-time against the Bulldogs, with their lone matchup coming way back in 1997. Awaiting the Gaels in game two and beyond in the Eugene Regional are host Oregon and four-seed Idaho State. The Ducks, led by eighth year head coach Melyssa Lombardi, enter the tournament at 40-12, with half of those wins coming in Big 10 play, good for a second place finish. The Ducks are led by slugger Elon Butler, who leads her team in just about every offensive category. The Gaels are no stranger to Butler, who began her collegiate career at Cal. The Gaels are 3-19 all-time against Oregon. Idaho State will make its first NCAA Regional Appearance in program history. Fifth year head coach Andrew Rich was the man to take them to these new heights, and is one win away from a new program record win tally. A team built purely on offensive prowess, the Bengals are led by senior Sydney Day with her 19 homers and 61 RBI. The Gaels saw Idaho State four times a year ago, taking three of four wins against the Bengals, and moving their all-time record against ISU to 10-4

Gaels Clean Up for Annual WCC Awards

For the third consecutive year, the Saint Mary's softball team has had at least eight student-athletes honored by the West Coast Conference as all-conference performers, headlined by 2026 WCC Pitcher of the Year Odhi Vasquez and 2026 WCC Coach of the Year Sonja Garnett. In total, eight different Gaels were honored with All-WCC recognition, just one shy of the program record of nine set in 2024, and two shy of the conference record of 10 set by BYU in 2022.

Saint Mary's Softball has achieved unprecedented success this year, and pulling all the strings is Head Coach Sonja Garnett. Now in her eighth season at the helm, Garnett smashed her previous record of most wins in a single season, which previously sat at 30, with 40 wins (and counting) this year. Leading the Gaels to their third WCC Title in as many years, Garnett's 68 wins over the last two seasons and 98 wins over the last three are the most by a Saint Mary's coach in those time spans. With 168 wins in her tenure, Garnett is the second-winningest coach in program history, and holds the highest win percentage of any coach in program history. This is her second WCC Coach of the Year award, also earning this honor in 2024. She is the fourth coach in West Coast Conference history to earn this honor multiple times.

In Saint Mary's Softball history, no player has picked up more wins in the circle as Odhi Vasquez. The cherry on top of her illustrious Gael career has been a 19-4 season with a WCC-best 141 strikeouts and 2.36 ERA, earning her her second WCC Pitcher of the Year honor. Vasquez led the WCC this year in several categories including wins (19), saves (7), complete games (13), strikeouts (141), ERA (2.36) and WHIP (1.23), becoming the Gaels' winningest pitcher in program history, now with a career record of 50-25. She became just the second pitcher in program history to record 400 strikeouts, and was five times named as the WCC Pitcher of the Week, including a National Pitcher of the Week nod after recording three victories over ranked opponents at the Stanford Round Robin. In conference play, Vasquez was dominant as ever, going 6-2 with a 1.95 ERA and a 1.22 WHIP, appearing in 14 of the Gaels 18 WCC contests. She becomes the third over WCC student-athlete to earn the Pitcher of the Year award multiple times in her career, and also earns her second career first team All-WCC nod. After earning second team All-WCC honors as a freshman and sophomore, Vasquez is the conference's second-ever four-time All-WCC honoree.

Joining Vasquez as first team All-WCC honorees are

Sam Buckley, Alex Cutionilli and Hannah Ferguson. This is the first time in program history that Saint Mary's has had more than two student-athletes honored as first team All-WCC selections. Buckley earned her third consecutive first team nod after hitting .352 this year and leading the WCC with a .521 on-base percentage. Only a junior, Buckley broke the program home run record this year, as her 11 blasts this season ran her tally to 29 for her career. Cutionilli was named an honorable mention All-WCC honoree as a freshman, and now makes her debut on the first team as a junior. A massive bat in the middle of the Gael lineup this season, Cutionilli hit .323 with 18 extra-base hits and 41 RBI. Her 41 RBI tied for the second most in single-season program history. Rounding out the group of first team honorees is Hannah Ferguson. Returning from an injury that kept her sidelined all of last year, Ferguson was a stalwart at the top of the Gaels' order, leading the team with a .422 average, leading the conference with 50 runs scored (a new single season program record) and leading the country with 10 triples (also a new single season program record). Ferguson also shattered the program career triples (15) and stolen base (62) records. This is Ferguson's second first team nod, and third All-WCC honor overall after being named to the second team as a freshman.

Earning second team All-WCC honors are Braxton Brown and Victoria Castillo. Brown put together the best numbers of her three year Gael career, earning her first all-conference nod. The Benicia native smashed the program single season RBI record that sat at 41 to begin the year with 53 RBI this season, still with at least two games to go. Her 14 doubles also led the team and ranked in the top-five in the WCC. Senior Victoria Castillo earned her second straight second team All-WCC nod after continuing to be a model of consistency for the Gaels. She is batting .347 in her final season of competition, and set new career marks for hits, home runs, RBI and walks.

Rounding out the group of honorees are Madeline Haun, who was named both to the All-Freshman team and an honorable mention All-WCC honoree, and Camille Lara, who earned an honorable mention nod. Just a true freshman, Haun solidified herself as the Gaels' number two starter behind Vasquez. Amassing a record of 9-3 her debut season, Haun performed well beyond her freshman status as a trusted arm for Coach Garnett. Lara continued her trajectory as one of the top of the order hitters in the WCC, batting .307 with her second straight 50+ hit season. She also played a stellar left field, making countless highlight reel plays.

SONJA GARNETT



The 2024 and 2026 West Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Garnett is in her eighth season after being hired on during the summer of 2018. She led Saint Mary's to their second 30 win season in program history in 2024, and their first 40 win season in 2026 as the Gaels earned their first three WCC Titles in program history (2024, 2025, 2026). Coach Garnett was honored as the WCC Coach of the Year in each of those seasons. Overall, Coach Garnett has amassed a record of 168-200-1, moving her to second all-time in program history for wins at the helm of the Gaels program, trailing only 14 year Head Coach Jessica Hanaseth (278 wins). Her 0.457 winning percentage stands as the best of any

coach in program history.

After missing the NCAA Tournament in 2025, the Gaels came back with a vengeance in 2026, becoming just the second ever team in Saint Mary's history amongst all sports to record 40+ wins. The Gaels won the West Coast Conference by a hefty four game margin, becoming the first ever WCC program to earn a 15 win conference season. The Gaels rattled off their longest win streak at 12 in a row, featuring a pair of ranked wins over No. 14 Washington and also logged a win over 24th ranked Stanford. After clinching the WCC crown outright, the Gaels made their way back to an NCAA Regional for the third time in program history, and achieved a program best RPI ranking of 59.

2025 showed that the Gaels conference title a year prior was no fluke. The Gaels were crowned back-to-back to WCC Champs for the first time in program history, going 28-23, and winning eight of their final nine contests to secure their second straight conference title. A large portion of the Gaels success was due to their pitching staff, Coach Garnett's specialty, who finished second in the conference in strikeouts, strikeout-to-walk ratio and WHIP. The offense and defense also shined for Coach Garnett's squad, as they did the year prior, as the Gaels led the WCC in fielding percentage for the second straight year, while leading the WCC in home runs and slugging percentage for the first time under her tutelage. Seven Gaels earned All-WCC nods, including two first players (Sam Buckley and Odhi Vasquez) for the second straight season. The 58 wins amassed by the Gaels over the 2024 and 2025 campaigns were the most for any Gaels team over a two year stretch.

The 2024 campaign was not only the Gaels best under Garnett, but also served as their best season since the formation of WCC Softball in 2014. Saint Mary's reached the 30 win mark for only the second time in program history, earning their first WCC Title in program history. Odhi Vasquez was named WCC Co-Pitcher of the Year, while Sam Buckley was named WCC Freshman of the Year. In total, nine Gaels were honored as All-WCC selectees, the most ever in program history.

The 2023 campaign marked the Gaels best under Garnett's tutelage at the time. Saint Mary's reached the 20 win mark for the first time since 2016, and finished in the top-three of the WCC for the first time since 2014. The Gaels landed six on the All-WCC team, also the most since 2016, and had a player earn first-team honors for the third consecutive year (Avrey Wolverton). Six Gaels took home WCC All-Academic Honors, while Bry Waters earned CSC Academic All-District Honors

The Gaels won 16 games in 2022 under Garnett, the most they've won in her tenure in a single season. The Gaels landed five players on the All-WCC team during that year, including the second year in a row with a player on the first team (Marissa Nishihara). Eight Gaels took home academic All-WCC awards from the conference, and seven more were named academic All-Region by the NFCA.

During the 2021 season, the Gaels showed improvement across the board under Garnett, with their best winning percentage since 2017. Six Gaels found themselves on the All-WCC team come the end of the season, the most in program history since the WCC began sponsoring softball in 2014. Indya Smith was named first team, with three others earning second team honors. In addition, Sofia Earle was named All-Region by the NFCA and six Gaels earned scholar-athlete awards through the WCC.

The team compiled a 14-37 record in Garnett's first season but made enormous strides under their new skipper. After winning only three WCC games in both 2017 and 2018, the Gaels went 7-8 in conference action and earned the most wins at home since 2013. Garnett helped two Gaels achieve All-WCC status as Dylan Linton and Kimiko Zapanta each earned Second Team honors.

In a pandemic shortened 2020 season, Saint Mary's went 7-18-1 in Garnett's second season. Transfer Maddie Gallagher and freshman Alex Casas were among the team's leaders on offense as SMC scored 98 runs, just 20 fewer than the previous season in half as many games. Halle Sullivan was named to the WCC's All-Academic Team while five more Gaels earned honorable mention nods.

Garnett came to Saint Mary's after an impressive run at Div. II Academy of Art. In her four years at the helm of the Urban Knights, Garnett accrued a 110-103-1 record, including an impressive 70-58 record in PacWest Conference play.

In 2018, Garnett was named PacWest Coach of the Year after her team produced six All-Conference Team honorees, including the school's first All-American in freshman pitcher Brooke Larsen, and rattled off two double-digit win streaks en-route to 40 total victories, a program best. The team also broke a plethora of single-season program records including runs scored, doubles, walks, ERA, shutouts, and batting average against.

Prior to the Academy of Art, Garnett served as an assistant coach at CSU Monterey Bay, Whittier College, and San Francisco State. While at Monterey Bay, the Otters reached the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time in school history, recorded their most single-season wins ever (48), and were ranked as high as 11th in the NCAA DII Top-25 poll.

As a student-athlete, Garnett starred at San Francisco State from 2003-06 and was an All-American and CCAA Pitcher of the Year in three consecutive seasons. Garnett ranks among the all-time leaders in DII softball history in appearances (5th), innings pitched (7th), complete games (10th), and shutouts (25th). She has been inducted into the San Francisco State Athletics Hall of Fame (individually, and her 2005 team) and into the CCAA Hall of Fame.

Post-graduation, Garnett spent six years overseas playing professional softball in Australia, Germany, and Italy. She led the Morley Eagles to their first state title while in Australia and guided the Mannheim Tornados to two national titles in Germany.

In 2006, Garnett graduated from SFSU with a degree in Liberal Arts and earned her master's of Arts in Kinesiology from Cal State Long Beach in 2011. She now resides in El Sobrante, California with her wife Vanessa and their daughters Maisyn and Zoey.

Post-graduation, Garnett spent six years overseas playing professional softball in Australia, Germany, and Italy. She led the Morley Eagles to their first state title while in Australia and guided the Mannheim Tornados to two national titles in Germany.
