When Chris Lemonis stepped to the podium on June 25, 2018 at Dudy Noble Field to become the 18th head baseball coach in Mississippi State's storied history, a journey of nearly 40 years came full circle. The son of a 1973 State graduate, Lemonis resided in Starkville as a child and now returned to lead one of the perennial powerhouses in college baseball.

One of the top recruiters and player development coaches in the country, Lemonis has seen success at every coaching stop. After helping his alma mater, The Citadel, to five NCAA Regional appearances in 12 seasons as an assistant coach, Lemonis joined college teammate Dan McDonnell's staff at Louisville and quickly turned the Cardinals into a consistent Omaha contender. After helping Louisville to seven postseason berths in eight years, the 2013 American Baseball Coaches Association/Baseball America Assistant Coach of the Year headed to Indiana University to take his first head coaching job in 2015.

In his first season at the helm of Indiana, the Hoosiers found themselves in the NCAA Tournament and, after finishing third in the Big Ten standings during his second season, Lemonis became the first coach in program history to take IU to back-to-back NCAA Tournaments in years three and four. The 2018 Hoosiers took the No. 2 seed into the NCAA Austin Regional, falling in the regional final to eventual College World Series participant Texas. Three of IU's eight appearances in the NCAA Tournament came under Lemonis' watch.

Overall, Lemonis enters his 25th season as a collegiate coach in 2019, making three College World Series appearances as a coach, earning 15 NCAA tournament berths and aiding in three 50-win seasons. His pupils have earned 25 All-America honors, 12 Freshman All-America laurels and 65 have signed professional baseball contracts, with 14 getting the call up to Major League Baseball.

Owning a head coaching record of 141-91-2, Lemonis was also a part of nearly 800 wins as an assistant coach. During his time at Indiana, Lemonis' teams averaged 35.3 wins per season, including a 40-win campaign during his final season in Bloomington. He averaged 39.2 victories per year during his career in an assistant role, bolstered by a 44.9 wins-per-season average at Louisville. The Cardinals were college baseball's winningest program during that eight-year span.

Lemonis' 15 postseason appearances have spanned all three of his coaching stops, with five coming as an assistant at The Citadel, seven during his assistant coaching tenure at Louisville and three as the head coach at Indiana. The Cardinals advanced to the Super Regionals on four occasions, punching a ticket to Omaha three times.

Along with his success on the field, Lemonis has always held academics to the highest standard, as well. In his final season at Indiana, a program-record 16 baseball student-athletes were named to the Big Ten Spring Academic Honor Roll, while 26 Cardinal baseball student-athletes earned ACC Honor Roll selections during his final season in Louisville. Already at Mississippi State, Lemonis has shown his dedication to his student-athletes in the classroom, as the program posted a 3.04 GPA during the fall semester.

Lemonis not only understands what it takes to get to Omaha as a coach but also as a player. A 1992 graduate of The Citadel, Lemonis added a 1990 appearance in the College World Series as a student-athlete. The appearance makes the Bulldogs one of just three school in Southern Conference history (Duke, Wake Forest) and only current member of the conference to advance to Omaha.

A two-time All-Southern Conference honoree, Lemonis led The Citadel in home runs three times. During his senior season, Lemonis led the Bulldogs with a .367 average, 19 doubles, 52 runs, 10 home runs and 66 RBIs. The largest on-campus facility in college baseball, Dudy Noble Field will see the 53rd season of Mississippi State baseball at its current site in 2019. With nearly 1,600 games played at the venue, the Diamond Dawgs bring a .726 winning percentage into the brand new \$68-million facility.

The field is named in honor of longitime MSU baseball coach, athletics director and ABCA Hall of Famer Clarke Randolph "Dudy" Noble. On April 27, 1998 the facility was renamed Dudy Noble Field, Polk-DeMent Stadium, honoring another ABCA Hall of Famer, former Bulldog skipper Ron Polk, and the late Gordon DeMent, a successful businessman and longitime fan of the Diamond Dawgs from Indianola, Mississippi.

#### The Origin

From 1929 until 1964, Mississippi State hosted its baseball games at the original on-campus venue, Hardy Field, which was located several hundred yards to the south of the Bulldogs' home football venue, Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field. The baseball field was closed following the 1964 season to make way for the construction of Dorman Hall and for the next two seasons the Diamond Dawgs played their home games at Redbird Park in Columbus, Mississippi, capturing SEC titles both seasons at their temporary home.

The tin-roofed grandstand and 2,000-seat bleachers from the original Dudy Noble Field were transported to the stadium's present site, which became playable for the 1967 season. Since that time, facility enhancements have followed at a steady pace to make the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball" one of the finest all-around facilities on the road to Omaha. Among with numerous upgrades, the current site has seen two complete demolitions and reconstructions, the latest occurring during a three-year span from 2017-2019 and opening prior to the start of the 2019 campaign.

#### Leading the Attendance Boom

With a laundry list of legendary names on its all-time roster, it comes as no surprise that Mississippi State ranks among the nation's attendance leaders year in and year out. The Dudy Noble Field faithful have sold out the reserved seating allotment every season since 1987.

Along with routinely hosting some of the largest crowds in the SEC, 10 of the last 12 three-day Super Bulldog Weekend series have drawn more than 25,000 fans.

MSU eclipsed the 200,000 mark in paid attendance at Dudy Noble Field for six-straight seasons between 2012-17, marking the first such occurrence in the program's history. In 2013, the Diamond Dawgs' five-millionth fan walked through the turnstiles at Dudy Noble Field. Since home attendance figures were charted starting in 1976, the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball" has seen 6,250,621 fans rush through the gates.

In 18 of the last 19 seasons, Mississippi State has averaged 6,000 fans per game, including a record average of 8,127 during the 2014 campaign. Overall, State has eclipsed the 200,000-fan mark 11 times since 2002, with a school-record 302,558 viewing the 2016 home schedule.

Of the top 25 all-time college baseball on-campus attendances, Dudy Noble Field finds itself on the list 17 times, most notably owning the all-time on-campus attendance record of 15,586 on April 12, 2014. The Bulldogs own 14 of the top 15 marks in NCAA on-campus history and are the only NCAA basebrogram to boast on-campus attendances of 14,000 or more. The four largest NCAA Super Regional crowds have assembled in Starkville, Mississippi, as well.

From April 11-13, the Bulldog faithful flooded the gates at Dudy Noble Field to the tune or 39,181 fans for a three-game series versus Ole Miss. The nearly 40,000 fans on the weekend set an NCAA on-campus attendance record for a three-game series.

Dudy Noble Field has ushered in crowds of 10,000 or better 57 times, including 2007 NCAA Super Regional-record draws of 13,715 and 12,620 for nationally-televised, late-morning games against Clemson. With the stadium

under construction in 2018, State added a 10,000-plus crowd to the tally, drawing 10,147 fans for the final date against Arkansas on April 21.

Mississippi State has hosted 25 postseason events at the facility, including three NCAA District III Tournaments (1973, 74 & 75), five SEC tournaments (1979, 1981, 1983, 1988 & 1995), 14 NCAA Regionals (1979, 1984, 1985, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, 1997, 2000, 2003, 2013, 2016 & 2019) and three NCAA Super Regionals (2007, 2016 & 2019).

#### The Left Field Lounge

The aura of Mississippi State baseball at Dudy Noble Field is certainly not confined to the loyal legions in the impressive grandstand, pro-style luxury sky suites or luxurious Left Field Lofts.

In fact, some of the more highly-prized seats at Bulldog Baseball games are found beyond the outfield fence in the Left Field Lounge™. Waiting lists greet those seeking to purchase one of the 96 outfield lounges in the iconic two-level outfield tailgate.

Once a colorful assortment of pickup trucks, motor homes, and trailers — most equipped with barbecue grills — lined the outfield fence, completing a circle of humanity at Dudy Noble Field. Now, the permanent lounge spaces are connected to the concourse, allowing everyone to stroll through and experience the iconic lounne culture.

What began in the late 1960s as a popular gathering spot for baseball-loving MSU supporters now forms college baseball's largest tailgate party.

#### The "New Dude"

The second demolition at the current site occurred following the 2017 season and the \$68 million facility opened its gates for the 2019 campaign. Architect Wier Boerner Allin, along with consultants Populous and famed stadium architect/State alum Janet Marie Smith designed the project, while construction manager ICM and general contractor JESCO Construction. Inc. oversaw the construction.

Covering 12 acres of land on the Mississippi State University campus, the 230,000 square foot facility carries on Dudy Noble Field's legacy as the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball." Installation of the second largest scoreboard in college baseball, measuring 43 feet wide by 60 feet high, started the project in 2017. The board, which was the largest in college baseball upon instillation, is larger than boards owned by three Major League Baseball teams. The addition of 96 permanent Left Field Lounge rigs encircling the outfield followed during the fall of 2018.

The concourse and lower-level grandstands were in place for the 2018 season, with the Diamond Suites, upper-deck reserved seating area and three unique club areas — Farm Bureau Triple Crown Club, Charlie and Dana Stephenson Omaha Club and The Rooftop Club—were completed prior to the 2019 campaign. The newest version of Dudy Noble Field also features increased restroom facilities and concession points of sale.

The player spaces also received an upgrade, expanding to cover 18,000 square feet underneath the facility. The fully-equipped Bruce and Julie Martin Locker Room includes an embedded equipment room, houses 40 wooden lockers and features an oversized, dimensional halo-lit '85 Script Mississippi State sign is suspended overhead in the middle of the room.

The more spacious locker room includes an attached training room with whirlpool and fully-functional fueling station. The Mitch Moreland Hitting Tunnel, which is equipped with HitTrax, and Turner & Gloria Wingo Team Lounge are easily accessed from the home dugout, with the eye-popping player entrance and Hassell H. Franklin Omaha Room greeting players as they enter the facility. The Pitching Lab is also housed under the stadium, featuring arm care and conditioning equipment, one oversized turfed mound with three pitching rubbers and state of the art video equipment.





#### Raking in the Ks

- Redshirt-junior Ethan Small became just the 18th Mississippi State pitcher to record at least 100 strikeouts in one season during the 2018 campaign moved past the 100-strikeout mark in his 10th start of 2019.
- After missing the 2017 season due to injury, Small sat down 122 batters via strikeout in 2018, the eighth-highest total in State history. MORE ON PAGE 12 SIDE BAR
- With his sixth strikeout at No. 10 Arkansas, Small moved his named into rare company as the sixth Bulldog pitcher to strikeout 100-plus batters twice in a career.
- The other five Bulldogs to posted multiple 100-plus strikeout seasons in program history; Jeff Brantley (1984, 85), Eric DuBose (1995, 96, 97), Matt Ginter (1998, 99), Konnor Pilkington (2017, 18) and B.J. Wallace (1991, 92).
- Overall, Small has 302 career punch outs in 49 appearances. His season total sits at 160 in 16 starts (10.00 per start).

## Fanning Double-Digits

- In his third season on the mound for State, Ethan Small
  opened the 2019 campaign with a then-career-high 11
  strikeouts versus Youngstown State, including the first five
  batters he faced.
- He followed that up with a then-career-best 13 strikeouts in seven one-hit innings against No. 21 Southern Miss. He didn't walk a batter for the second-straight contest.
- He produced a career-best 15 Ks versus Alabama on April 12 in only six innings of work, with 15 of 18 outs ending at the plate.
- Small also has double-digit strikeout performances versus Maine (10) on March 8, at No. 4 Florida (11) on March 15, against LSU (10) on March 28, at Tennessee (11) on April 5, versus No. 3 Georgia (11) on April 26, at Ole Miss (10) on May 10, versus Vanderbilt (11) on May 23 in the SEC Tournament and versus Central Michigan (10) on June 1.
- Of his 12-career double-digit strikeout games, 11 of those have come in 2019.

#### **SEC Pitcher of the Week**

- After not allowing a hit in seven scoreless innings at No. 15
  Texas A&M on May 3, redshirt-junior Ethan Small earned his
  first-career SEC Pitcher of the Week honor.
- The conference honor is the first pitcher of the week accolade earned by a Diamond Dawg since the 2016 season, when Dakota Hudson earned the award on three occasions.
- Against the nationally-ranked Aggies, Small retired the first 19 batters he faced in the series opener on his way to seven hitless, shutout innings. The left-hander posted eight strikeouts, allowing just two base runners in the contest.
- Small was perfect six innings, but after recording the first out of the seventh inning, he lost his perfect game with a hit-by-pitch and followed that with a walk. He then got a flyout and struck out the final batter he faced in his sixth win of the season.

#### K to BB

- While the strikeout numbers have been impressive for redshirt-junior Ethan Small, he has also held down the walk numbers throughout his career.
- In 207 2/3 career innings pitched, Small has walked only 70 batters to 302 strikeouts. That equates into a 4.31 K-to-BB ratio.
- To start the 2019 campaign, Small went 80-straight plate appearances before issuing his first walk.

#### Gordon's Scoreless Streak

- Graduate Cole Gordon nearly equaled the MSU record for consecutive scoreless innings pitched, as he ran a streak of 25 innings without giving up a run.
- Gordon's streak was just shy of Jonathan Holder's 27
  1/3 innings of scoreless work during the 2012 season and
  ranks third in program history, just shy of Bobby Reed's 25
  1/3-straight scoreless innings in 1988.
- The streak began with a scoreless ninth inning against Oklahoma in the fourth game of the 2018 Tallahassee Regional and ended with a one-out sacrifice fly versus Maine on March 10, 2019.

- After appearing in 12 games during the 2018 campaign and throwing just 13 innings, Liebelt has enjoyed a breakout senior season.
- His 2018 campaign featured 21 runs (19 earned) on 21 hits. He walked eight batters and struck out seven.
- In 2019, Liebelt surpassed his strikeout total from the previous season by appearance No. 5 and enters the week with 28 appearances.
- On the season, the right hander has 30 strikeouts and just seven walks in 45 innings He has allowed just 42 hits.

#### Putting Up 20

- Mississippi State piled up 21 hits and scored 20 runs in a seriesclinching win on Sunday, March 24 against Auburn to mark the first 20-run game since scoring 27 against Alcorn State on April 20, 2010 in a 27-4 win.
- The 20-run outburst was the largest in an SEC contest since ranking up 20 runs against Florida in a 20-7 win on May 5, 2000.
- The 35 combined runs were the most in a game since MSU and Kentucky scored 39 runs on April 19, 2009.
- The Diamond Dawgs later scored 24 runs against South Carolina in the series opener, to mark just the second time in program history that an MSU team posted multiple 20-run games in SEC play (1997).

- While the "Freshman 15" may be truer for some more than others, it is not often that a freshman comes into college baseball and strikes out 100 batters in his first season.
- Freshman JT Ginn, however, reached the 100-strikeout mark in his 15th start of the season versus LSU (5/24) in the SEC Tournament.
- Ginn joins Eric Dubose (109; 1995) as the only Mississippi State freshmen to ever reach the 100-stikeout mark during a rookie season. MORE ON PAGE 12 SIDEBAR
- Ginn is also the 17th Diamond Dawg to reach the 100-strikeout mark in a season, with his 100th strikeout marking the 24th 100-strikeout season in program history.

- The Bulldogs are just the eighth MSU team since 1970 to win four Southeastern Conference road series in a single season, which is tied for third-most in program history.

#### **Best Start Since...**

- Through its first 26 games, MSU piled up an 23-3 record with eight wins against teams ranked in the Baseball America Top 25.
- State toppled No. 21 Southern Miss (twice), No. 8 Texas Tech No. 14 East Carolina, No. 4 Florida (twice) and No. 16 Auburn (twice) to that point in 2019.
- The 23-3 record was the best 26-game start since 1979, when the Diamond Dawgs started the year 29-3.
- The 2019 start included a 14-game winning streak that ran from Feb. 23-March 16. The streak is tied for the fourthlongest run in program history;

#### Lemonis Wins No. 1

- Head coach Chris Lemonis earned his first Mississippi State victory in his first game as head coach, joining eight other Bulldog skippers to accomplish the feat.
- Lemonis joins John Cohen, Jimmy Bragan, Paul E. Gregory, S.L. Robinson, F.P. Plass, S.A. Jehl, S.W. Scales and G.C. Creelman, who each won their first games as the Maroon and White's head coach.
- Ron Polk won the first game of his second stint as the MSU skipper in 2002. However, Polk dropped his MSU debut, 2-1, to louisiana Tech in 1976
- Of the nine coaches to win their first game, Lemonis joins Creelman and Robinson as the only three to start 4-0 or better.
   Creelman won his first 14 games over five seasons and was 15-0-3 before suffering his first loss, while Robinson started 6-0 in 1919. Lemonis began the season 4-0.

#### First-Year Success for Lemonis

- Head coach Chris Lemonis guided the Diamond Dawgs to the 43rd win of the season in his 53rd game as the program's top dawg.
- The 7-3 victory over Louisiana Tech on May 14 made Lemonis

#### Fastest to 30

- Mississippi State was the first Division I program to win 30 games during the 2019 season, claiming with No. 30 on Saturday, April 13 versus Alabama.
- The next afternoon, State claimed win No. 31 on the season and ended week No. 9 as the only 30-win program in the country.
- Winning the 30th game of the year in overall contest 36 equals the 1989 squad as the fastest team to 30 wins in a season in program history.
- Winning the following day against the Crimson Tide gave the 2019 edition of the Diamond Dawgs the best 37-game start in school history at 31-6.

## Starting with a Sweep

- Mississippi State opened the 2019 season with a three-game sweep of Youngstown State, marking the first time since 2015 the Bulldogs swept a series to open a season.
- In all, State has opened a season with a perfect home weekend on 13 occasions since 1990, when most college teams began starting the season with weekend series.
- More recently, State was unblemished on the first weekend of a season at home in 2015 (Cincinnati/Miami (Ohio)), 2013 (Portland), 2011 (Akron/Lamar) and 2010 (Rhode Island).
- Other seasons include; 2007, 2006, 2005, 2004, 2001, 1999, 1995, 1994.
- Of the 30 seasons since 1990, State has opened the year at home on 22 occasions.

# Voice of the Diamond Dawgs Enters Year 41

- Long-time MSU radio broadcaster Jim Ellis enters his 41st season as the play-by-play announcer for Mississippi State baseball, with his first season having been 1979.
- Ellis is tied for the second-longest tenured broadcaster in the Division I college baseball, trailing only Dave Nitz at Louisiana Tech (45 seasons). Ellis' 41 years are tied with Ole Miss' David Kellum and Southern Miss' John Cox.
- The new Dudy Noble Field features home and visiting radio booths inside the Jim Ellis Radio Suite, named for the iconic "Voice of the Diamond Dawgs.

# 2019 MLB Draft

Mississippi State heard program-record-tying 11 names of current student-athletes called over the three days of the 2019 Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft, marking the third-highest total among NCAA Division I programs in the 2019 event.

The 11 draft picks in 2019 are tied for the program-record with the 2016 team. All time, there have been 159 different Diamond Dawgs selected in the MLB Draft (since 1965) for a total of 208 picks.

The 11 Diamond Dawgs drafted were **Ethan Small** (1st: Milwaukee), Jake Mangum (4th; New York Mets), Colby White (6th; Tampa Bay), Trysten Barlow (16th round; Colorado), Dustin Skelton (18th round; Miami), Jared Liebelt (20th; Arizona), Keegan James (25th; Colorado), Marshall Gilbert (29th; Pittsburgh), Peyton Plumlee (31st; Houston), Cole Gordon (32nd; New York Mets) and Tanner Allen (34; Colorado).

Four of the 11 Bulldogs drafted on the final day of the MLB Draft already own their degrees: Barlow, Gordon, James and Liebelt.

Small was selected by the Milwaukee Brewers with the 28th overall pick in the first round and is the 15th Diamond Dawg in program history to hear his name called in the first round. His selection in the fist round marks the fifth MSU student-athlete drafted in the first round in the last eight years, joining Brent Rooker (2017), Dakota Hudson (2016), Hunter Renfroe (2013) and Chris **Stratton** (2012).

Small is the fourth MSU left-handed pitcher to be taken in the first round, with the Lexington, Tennessee native joining Paul Maholm (2003), Eric DuBose (1997) and B.J. Wallace (1992) as southpaws taken in the first round.

Mangum became the first MSU baseball student-athlete to be drafted in three different draft cycles, as he was selected in the fourth round by the New York Mets.

# Four Earn All-America Honors from CBN

- As the Diamond Dawgs are amidst one of the most successful seasons in program history, Collegiate Baseball Newspaper honored the quartet of sophomore Tanner Allen, sophomore Justin Foscue, senior Jake Mangum and redshirt-junior Ethan Small as All-Americans.
- The four All-America selections mark the most from a single publication in program history and are the second-most All-Americans in a single season behind the 2013 edition's five All-Americans.
- The group is highlighted by Small's selection to the first team. Foscue was named to the publication's second team, while Allen and Mangum each earned a spot on the third team.
- Mangum becomes the seventh Mississippi State baseball student-athlete to earn multiple All-America honors from the major reporting publications of college baseball. Along with his third-team selection from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper this season, Mangum was a second-team All-American during his freshman season from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and third-team honoree from the American Baseball Coaches Association.
- Mangum joins MSU's only three-time All-American Rafael Palmeiro, along with two-time All-Americans Will Clark, Eric **DuBose**, **Paul Maholm**, **Tommy Raffo** and **Pete Young** as multiple national award selections.





# **Honor System**

#### **SEC Awards Rolling In**

- Mississippi State has earned six SEC weekly awards in 2019, with Elijah MacNamee, Jake Mangum and Jordan Westburg each garnering SEC Player of the Week, Ethan Small taking home SEC Pitcher of the Week and JT Ginn grabbing a pair of SEC Freshman of the Week honors.
- The six weekly honors are tied for the most in program history for a single season;
  - 6 2016 (2 Player, 3 Pitcher, 1 Freshman) 2019 (3 Player, 1 Pitcher, 2 Freshman)
  - 5 2012 (3 Pitcher, 3 Freshman)
  - 4 2007 (1 Player, 1 Pitcher, 2 Freshman) 1985 (4 Player)
- With MacNamee, Mangum and Westburg each earning SEC Player of the Week, it marks the first time in school history that three different Diamond Dawgs win the SEC's Player of the Week award in the same season.
- With MacNamee and Westburg winning the award in backto-back weeks, it marked the fourth time in program history a MSU student-athlete won the award in consecutive weeks;
  - 1985 Brantley (March 12), Will Clark (March 19 & 26)
  - 2013 Hunter Renfroe (April 15), Nick Ammirati (April 22)
  - 2017 Brent Rooker (April 7 & 12)
- For Ginn, he is just the third Diamond Dawg since the SEC began awarding the FOTW award in 2006 to claim multiple awards, joining;

Brandon Turner (2007) Daryl Norris (2011)

#### **Small Earns SEC Pitcher of the Week**

- After not allowing a hit in seven scoreless innings at No. 15
  Texas A&M on May 3, redshirt-junior Ethan Small earned his
  first-career SEC Pitcher of the Week honor.
- The conference honor is the first pitcher of the week accolade earned by a Diamond Dawg since the 2016 season, when Dakota Hudson earned the award on three occasions. MORE ON PAGE 19 SIDEBAR

#### MacNamee Earns SEC Player of the Week

- Senior Elijah MacNamee collected multiple hits in each of his four starts during the fifth week of the season, as he earned Southeastern Conference Player of the Week.
- MacNamee helped the Diamond Dawgs to a 3-1 week, including a SEC-opening series win over a top-five Florida program on the road.
- The senior opened the week with a five-RBI showing against Grambling, including a sixth-inning grand slam.
- In the series opener at Florida, MacNamee made two of the biggest plays in the game, running down a flyball for the final out of the eighth to save a run from scoring. He then belted a two-RBI double in the ninth, which would account for the eventual game-winning runs. He contributed a career-hightying three hits in the first game of a doubleheader, including a home run and a double and chipped in a pair of singles in the finale.
- The player of the week honor is the first for a Diamond Dawg since the 2017 season, when **Brent Rooker** claimed the award on three occasions.

#### Westburg Earns SEC Player of the Week

- Sophomore Jordan Westburg hit .583 to help Mississippi State to a series win over No. 16 Auburn and for his efforts was named the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week.
- In five total games between March 18-24, Westburg led the Diamond Dawgs with a .556 batting average and reached base in all five games to help MSU to a 4-1 week.
- His .571 on-base percentage for the week was tied for tops on the team and he piled up 11 RBIs. Westburg posted multiple hits in four of the five contests and ran his reached base streak to nine games after finding his way on base in all five games.
- He opened the week with a three-hit contest, scoring twice and driving in two runs against Little Rock, before reaching base just once at Samford — via walk
- The New Braunfels, Texas had a monster weekend against Auburn, hitting .583 (7-of-12) to lead the Bulldogs in the threegame series and reached base at a .647 clip. He had multiple hits in each game versus the Tigers and reached base at least three times in each contest.
- He posted at least one extra base hit in all three games versus Auburn, including a double and home run in each of the final two contests. To cap his impressive weekend, Westburg drove in the eventual game winning run with an RBI double in the eighth inning to break a 15-15 tie and give MSU its second-straight SEC series win.

#### Mangum Earns First SEC Player of the Week Honor

- Senior Jake Mangum helped Mississippi State to a perfect 4-0
  week against ranked opponents and became the SEC's career
  hits leader during a series sweep over then-No. 3 Georgia to
  earn his first-career SEC Player of the Week honor.
- Mangum broke an SEC record that stood for nearly 21 years on Saturday (April 27) versus Georgia with his 353rd career hit.
   That hit broke the conference's career hits record, which was previously held by LSU's Eddie Furniss (352; 1995-98). Most impressive, Mangum accomplished his 353rd hit in his 239th game, while Furniss did so in 265 games.
- Mangum became the SEC's career hits leader with his second
  of three hits in the middle game of the series with Georgia.
  The senior reached base three times in each game versus the
  Bulldogs, while finding himself on base twice in his fourthstraight Governor's Cup victory on Tuesday. Mangum also
  scored a run in each game of the week.
- After reaching twice in the midweek tilt with Ole Miss, Mangum found himself on base in his first eight plate appearances on the weekend (five singles, two walks and one fielder's choice), scoring four times. He tied his career high with two walks in both the series opener and series finale.
- In the middle game of the series, Mangum's second-inning single gave him 353 hits for his career, which pushed him past Furniss on the SEC's career hits list. He added two walks and a base hit in the series finale, scoring twice. He also stole his 20th base of the year, moving into a tie for 12th on the MSU single season charts.

# Ginn Grabs Back-to-Back SEC FOTW Honors

- Freshman JT Ginn grabbed back-to-back Southeastern Conference Co-Freshman of the Week honors in weeks two and three of the 2019 season.
- The rookie collected victories over back-to-back ranked opponents, defeating No. 21 Southern Miss and No. 8 Texas Tech.
- He fired off seven innings of three-hit, two-run baseball to earn a victory over Texas Tech on Saturday, March 2. Ginn fanned eight batters and walked only one in the outing. The Red Raiders were averaging 11.2 hits and 9.3 runs per game entering the weekend, but Ginn was able to scatter three hits, as he retired 12-straight batters from the second inning to the sixth inning.
- Against Southern Miss, Ginn tossed seven shutout innings and allowed just two hits and walked one batter. He struck out a careerhigh nine and didn't face more than four hitters in any inning.

#### **Skelton on Posey Watch List**

- Junior catcher **Dustin Skelton** is one of 79 Division I catchers named to the Buster Posey Award Watch List, which is awarded by the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission.
- Skelton is among the initial candidates for the National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award, formerly the Johnny Bench Award, which honors the nation's top Division I catcher as voted on by head coaches and sports information directors.
- Former MSU catcher Edward Easley won the prestigious award following a stellar 2007 campaign, which also saw him drafted in the first round of the Major Leaque Baseball Draft.

#### **Trio Earns Midseason Honors from Perfect Game**

- Perfect Game honored three Diamond Dawgs with midseason awards, as freshman JT Ginn earned the publication's Midseason National Freshman of the Year, while senior Jake Mangum was a first-team midseason All-American pick and sophomore Jordan Westburg earned second-team midseason All-American.
- After winning his first six starts on the mound, Ginn was named top freshman at the season's mid-way point by Perfect Game. The rookie started seven games on the mound during the first half of the season, with four of those quality starts
- Among the victories that made up his 6-1 overall mark at the middle point of 2019, the right hander posted four wins over ranked foes, including No. 21 Southern Miss, No. 8 Texas Tech, No. 4 Florida and No. 16 Auburn.
- Arguably the best leadoff hitter in the NCAA, Mangum posted 53 hits through the first half of 2019. Mangum is the NCAA active leader in hits, while he is chasing the Mississippi State and Southeastern Conference hits records.
   Westburg hit the mid-way point of the season having already surpassed his career totals for hits (44), runs (35), RBIs (33), doubles (13), triples (2), home runs (5) and walks (15). He had also been hit-by-pitch seven times.
- He carried a pair of double-digit reached base streaks during the first half of 2019, with a 14-game stretch to start the season and a current 14-game streak.

#### **Three Earn Frisco Classic Honors**

- After finishing the Frisco Classic at 2-0, three Diamond Dawgs were honored with all-tournament honors, as JT Ginn was named the MVP of the event, and Justin Foscue and Elijah MacNamee each earned all-tournament nods.
- Ginn fired off seven innings of three-hit, two-run baseball in his third career start to improve to 3-0 with a victory over No. 3 Texas Tech on Saturday afternoon. The right hander fanned eight batters and walked only one in the outing.
- Foscue led MSU with a .500 (4-for-8) average at the event. His
  four hits were the most for a Bulldog and he scored the gamewinning run vs. Sam Houston State after leading off the eighth
  inning with a double down the left-field line.
- MacNamee hit .333 (2-for-6) at the Frisco Classic, but owned a .556 on-base percentage with two walks and a hit-by-pitch. He scored two runs and drove in one RBI on the weekend.

# Allen Earns National POTW Honors

- Sophomore Tanner Allen opened the 2019 season with a bang against Youngstown State to earn national honors from a pair of publications.
- Allen had a monster opening weekend for the Diamond Dawgs, hitting .538 with five extra base hits and 13 RBIs versus Youngstown State. Of his seven hits, five went for extra bases, including the two home runs, to account for 16 total bases on the weekend.
- For his efforts, Allen earned Perfect Game National Hitter of the Week and was named to the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper National Player of the Week Honor Roll.

# Gordon's Graduate Award

Already with undergraduate degrees in business administration and marketing from Mississippi State University, graduate student **Cole Gordon** spent the 2018-19 academic year working as a Graduate Service Assistant in the Office of the Graduate School, and for his efforts was named the Masters Graduate Service Assistant of the Year.

Working towards a Master of Business Administration degree, Gordon was nominated, and ultimately selected for the award by a faculty committee. One graduate is awarded per year, with Gordon earning the distinction in 2018-19. Recognized for his outstanding contributions and significant productivity and growth of Mississippi State University through his service in the Office of the Graduate School, he was recognized at the annual Graduate Student Association Awards Banquet.

Gordon is on pace to complete his MBA in Summer 2019. A fivetime President's Scholar (3.80 GPA of higher) and three-time Dean's Scholar (3.50-3.79 GPA), Gordon is a three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll selection, while also earning SEC First Year Honor Roll as a freshman.



#### **Mangum Earns Second Ferriss Trophy**

- Senior student-athlete Jake Mangum has been a trendsetter during his entire collegiate career, and on May 20 he became the first two-time winner of the C Spire Ferriss Trophy, given to the top collegiate baseball player in the state of Mississippi.
- Finalists and the ultimate winner of the award are chosen by the state's college baseball coaches and a panel of Major League Baseball professional scouts, along with fan voting, which accounted for a weighted 10 percent of the award.
- Mangum was the leading vote getter in the fan vote, received 3,923 votes, while teammate Ethan Small finished second with 2,273 votes. Of the nearly 8,500 votes cast by fans, the Mississippi State duo accounted for nearly 6,200 of the votes, or over 70 percent.
- Mangum and Small became the third set of MSU teammates to earn finalist recognition in the 16-year history of the award.

#### **Ferriss Trophy Duo**

- Senior Jake Mangum and redshirt-junior Ethan Small have each been named a finalist for the 2019 Ferriss Trophy.
- The Ferriss Trophy, first awarded in 2004, is given to the best collegiate baseball player in the state of Mississippi by the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame
- The award is named after former Mississippi State and Boston Red Sox pitching great David M. "Boo" Ferriss, who was a member of the inaugural class of the Ron Polk Ring of Honor when the new Dudy Noble Field was opened in February of 2019
- In the 15-year history of the award, six Diamond Dawgs have earned the C Spire Ferriss Trophy. Brent Rooker (2017), Mangum (2016), Hunter Renfroe (2012), Chris Stratton (2012), Ed Easley (2007) and Thomas Berkery (2006) have each walked away as Ferriss Trophy winners.
- The 2019 event marks just the third time in the history of the award that State has had multiple finalists. In 2014, *Jacob Lindgren* and *Ross Mitchell* were both finalists, while in 2016 the trio of *Dakota Hudson*, *Reid Humphreys* and Mangum all earned finalist honors.

#### Two For the Spikes

- Senior Jake Mangum and redshirt-junior Ethan Small added another honor to the list, as the duo was tabbed as two of the 25 semifinalists for the 2019 Golden Spikes Award, presented by USA Baseball in partnership with the Rod Dedeaux Foundation.
- Mississippi State's history with the Golden Spikes Award began in 1984, when Rafael Palmeiro was named a finalist for the award. In 1985, Will Clark produced the only Golden Spikes Award-winning season in program history.
- Since the award began naming semifinalists in 2007, only
  three other Diamond Dawgs have been named semifinalists
  for the award. *Dakota Hudson* (2016), *Brent Rooker* (2017)
  and *Chris Stratton* (2012) have each earned the semifinalist
  distinction, with Rooker being named just the third finalist in
  program history, joining Clark and Palmeiro.

#### **Duo on Howser Trophy List**

- Senior Jake Mangum and redshirt-junior Ethan Small added another honor to the list, as the duo was tabbed as two of the 25 semifinalists for the 2019 Golden Spikes Award, presented by USA Baseball in partnership with the Rod Dedeaux Foundation.
- Mangum and Small add to Mississippi State's recent history
  with the award, giving the Diamond Dawgs six studentathletes that have earned semifinalist distinction; Hunter
  Renfroe (2013), Dakota Hudson (2016), Brent Rooker
  (2017) and Chris Stratton (2012).

#### Allen Earns SEC All-Tournament

- Sophomore Tanner Allen earned SEC All-Tournament Team following the conclusion of the event, leading all first basemen in batting average (.313) and extra base hits (2).
- The all-tournament selection is the first for Mississippi State since 2016, when pitcher Zac Houston earned a spot on the team. That season, Houston pitched a career-best 8 2/3 innings, allowing just four hits, in a 4-1 win over Alabama.
- Allen is the fourth first baseman to earn SEC All-Tournament honors, joining *Tim Weisheim* (1979), *John Mitchell* (1987) and *Tommy Raffo* (1990) as Diamond Dawgs to earn alltournament honors at first base.

#### Six Earn NCAA Starkville Regional All-Tournament Honors

- Six Diamond Dawgs earned NCAA Starkville Regional All-Tournament honors following Mississippi State's three-game sweep to advance to the NCAA Super Regional round.
- Sophomore Rowdey Jordan headlined the list by earning NCAA Starkville Regional Most Valuable Player. It is the 16th time that a Diamond Dawg earned NCAA Regional MVP.
- Junior Dustin Skelton (C), sophomore Tanner Allen (1B), sophomore Justin Foscue (2B), sophomore Josh Hatcher (DH), Jordan (LF) and redshirt-junior Ethan Small (P) all earned the nod to the all-tournament team.
- The total ties for the third-most all-time behind the 1985 and 2011 teams that each garnered seven.

# Quite the Haul for MSU

After winning 45 regular season games and claiming a share of the Southeastern Conference Western Division title, the Mississippi State baseball program took home an unprecedented haul from the conference office on Monday (May 20) as redshirt-junior **Ethan Small** was tabbed SEC Pitcher of the Year and rookie **JT Ginn** earned SEC Freshman of the Year, to go along with four first-team All-SEC selections.

Small was joined on the All-SEC first team by senior centerfielder **Jake Mangum**, sophomore first baseman **Tanner Allen** and sophomore second baseman **Justin Foscue**. Mangum was also named to the SEC's All-Defensive Team, while Ginn earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman Team, as well.

The two specialty awards mark the first time in program history that a Bulldog team earned multiple conference specialty awards in one season, as both Ginn and Small are the second MSU student-athlete to win their respective awards.

Small joins *Chris Stratton* (2012) as the only SEC Pitcher of the Year winners in program history, with the award first handed out in 2003. The first SEC Freshman of the Year award was given out in 2000, with Ginn and **Mangum** (2016) the only Diamond Dawgs to garner the honor.

MSU placed at least one student-athlete on the All-SEC first team for the fourth-straight season, which is the longest active streak in the conference. The four first-team honorees are tied for the fourth-most in program history, behind the five honorees from the 1949, 1971 and 1977 teams. The four first-team honors are the most since the 2016 team also had four.

The four first-team honorees were tied for the most in the conference with Vanderbilt. Arkansas had the most overall honorees, with six student-athletes on the list, all earning second-team honors.

**Small** enjoyed one of the most dominant seasons on the mound in program history to earn SEC Pitcher of the Year and a spot on the All-SEC first team. He worked 83 innings and finished the year with an 8-1 record. A conference-high-tying seven of those wins came in conference play. His 139 strikeouts were the most in the SEC and ranked No. 2 nationally in the regular season.

His 1.84 ERA was third in the SEC, while he limited the opposition to just a .158 batting average against on the year. Small issued only 28 free base runners, walking 22 and hitting six. In his 83 innings of work, the left-hander allowed 45 hits and 19 runs, only 17 earned.

**Ginn** tied the Mississippi State freshman record for pitching victories during the 2019 campaign, as he posted an 8-3 overall mark. His eight victories equal the total by Paul Maholm (2001). He struck out 95 batters in 75.0 innings of work to rank No. 10 in the conference. His 3.12 ERA, along with his.217 batting average against both ranked among the top-15 in the conference.

In the 75 innings of work on the mound, Ginn walked just 16 batters and of his 62 hits allowed, only 11 went for extra bases all season. He also limited the opponent to just 62 hits and 29 runs, just 26 earned.

Enjoying one of the storied careers in Southeastern Conference history, Mangum capped his final trek through the regular season with his third first-team All-SEC selection. He becomes the first Diamond Dawg to ever earn three, first-team All-SEC honors and is the only MSU baseball student-athlete to ever garner four selections to the All-SEC team, grabbing second-team honors as a sophomore.

**Mangum** paced the conference in hits (95), ranked second in batting average (.375) and stolen bases (21), and third in runs scored (65) and doubled (20).

During the regular season, Mangum moved his name atop the Mississippi State and Southeastern Conference all-time hits charts. He passed *Jeffrey Rea* (335; 2004-07) for the MSU record and LSU's *Eddy Furniss* (352; 1995-97) for the SEC career record, moving into a tie for No. 6 on the NCAA's all-time list with 370 career hits entering the postseason. Mangum also ranks among the top-10 in Mississippi State history in batting average, at bats, runs, doubles, triples, total bases stolen bases and games played.

**Allen** enjoyed a career year at the plate, while also anchoring the Bulldog infield with 56 starts at first base. He posted career-high numbers at the plate in average (.348), runs scored (51), doubles (20), home runs (6), RBIs (59) and walks (32). He ranked among the top-five in the SEC in hits, RBIs and doubles, while his .348 average was sixth highest in the conference.

**Foscue** had a breakout sophomore year, playing two positions on the infield during the 2019 campaign. In starts at third base and second base, the right-handed hitter boosted his batting average over 100 points during his second season and his 14 home runs are the most in a single season since **Brent Rooker** hit 23 in 2017. He posted career highs in average (.348), runs scored (58), doubles (21), home runs (14), hits (81), RBIs (56) and total bases (144). Overall, he ranked among the top-10 in average, slugging percentage (.618), runs scored, hits, RBIs, doubles, home runs and total bases in the conference.
