## Notables

- For the third time in Mississippi State history the Diamond Dawgs have posted back-to-back 45-win seasons, joining the 1984-85 (45 & 50) and 1989-90 (54 & 50) squads. The 46 wins are currently tied for No. 7 all-time in MSU history.
- The Diamond Dawgs own the nation's longest streak to CWS appearances at three and have been to five straight NCAA Super Regionals, which is an NCAA-best streak.
- Mississippi State improved to 2-0 at the College World Series with a 6-5 come-from-behind win over Virginia. It is the fourth time in program history that MSU started its CWS stay with two wins, joining the 1985, 2013 and 2018 clubs.

# CHRIS **LEMONIS**

**HEAD COACH** (THRID SEASON) **MYRTLE BEACH, S.C.** 

ALMA MATER: **THE CITADEL, 1992** 



After arguably the most successful first year by a Southeastern Conference head baseball coach in conference history, Chris Lemonis begins his third season as the leader of the Mississippi State baseball program.

The 18th head coach in the storied history of the program, a journey of nearly 40 years came full circle when he was introduced on June 25, 2018 on Adkerson Plaza inside Dudy Noble Field. The son of a 1973 State graduate, Lemonis resided in Starkville as a child and now leads one of the perennial powerhouses in college baseball.

In his first season at the helm of the Diamond Dawgs, Lemonis became the winningest first-year head coach in SEC history and in the process led the 2019 edition to the second-most victories in program history at 52 (54; 1989). The 40 victories over MSU's first 50 games marked the third-most in the first 50 games of a season in program history and set the tone for State's second straight trip to the College World Series.

Lemonis became one of just three SEC head coaches to advance to the College World Series in their inaugural season in the conference, joining Jake Gibbs (Ole Miss, 1972) and fellow Diamond Dawg skipper Pat McMahon (Mississippi State, 1998).

Over his first two seasons, five Diamond Dawgs earned All-America honors and a trio of pitchers have garnered national specialty awards. Left-handed pitcher Ethan Small was tabbed the 2019 National Pitcher of the Year (College Baseball Foundation; American Baseball Coaches Association), while right-handed pitcher JT Ginn (2019) and left-handed pitcher Christian MacLeod (2020) earned back-to-back National Freshman of the Year honors. Ginn and Small each earned specialty awards from the SEC, as well, grabbing the conference's Freshman and Pitcher of the Year, respectively, in 2019.

After a school-record-tying 11 Diamond Dawgs heard their names called in the 2019 Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft, State tied for the most players drafted in the first two rounds of the 2020 MLB event. Small became the 15th Diamond Dawg taken in the first round of the MLB Draft in 2019, while Justin Foscue and Jordan Westburg each went in the first round of the 2020 event.

Owning a head coaching record of 205-110-2, Lemonis was also a part of nearly 800 wins as an assistant coach and three trips to the College World Series. During his time at Indiana, Lemonis' teams averaged 35.3 wins per season, including a 40-win campaign during his final season in Bloomington. He averaged 39.2 victories per year during his career in an assistant role (784 wins), bolstered by a 44.9 wins-per-season average at Louisville. The Cardinals were college baseball's winningest program during that eight-year span and made the program's first three trips to Omaha.

Lemonis not only understands what it takes to get to Omaha as a coach but also as a student-athlete. A 1992 graduate of The Citadel, Lemonis added a 1990 appearance in the College World Series as a student-athlete. The appearance makes The Citadel one of just three schools in Southern Conference history (Duke, Wake Forest) and only current member of the conference to advance to Omaha.

One of the top recruiters and player development coaches in the country, Lemonis has seen success at every coaching stop. After helping his alma mater, The Citadel, to five NCAA Regional appearances in 12 seasons as an assistant coach, Lemonis joined college teammate Dan McDonald's staff at Louisville and quickly turned the Cardinals into a consistent Omaha contender.

After helping Louisville to seven postseason berths in eight years, the 2013 American Baseball Coaches Association/Baseball America Assistant Coach of the Year headed to Indiana to take his first head coaching job with the Hoosier program in 2015.

In each of his head coaching stops, Lemonis has led his team to the NCAA postseason in his first season at the helm. He helped the Hoosiers into the NCAA Tournament field during his initial season in Bloomington, before he guided Mississippi State to the College World Series in 2019 — his first season in Starkville.

Overall, Lemonis enters his 27th season as a collegiate coach in 2021, making one College World Series appearance as a head coach, taking three trips to Omaha as an assistant, earning 16 NCAA tournament berths and aiding in four 50-win seasons. His pupils have earned 30 All-America honors, 15 Freshman All-America laurels and 82 have signed professional baseball contracts, with 17 getting the call up to Major League Baseball.

#### RECRUITING AND DEVELOPMENT

Widely regarded as one of the elite recruiters and developers of talent in all of college baseball, a total of 95 student-athletes have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft under Lemonis' watch, with 17 of those reaching the highest level of professional baseball.

Since arriving at Louisville for the 2006-07 academic year, Lemonis has been a part of 13 nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including his first three classes at MSU. His initial Bulldog recruiting class was tabbed as the No. 12 class nationally by Baseball America and Perfect Game, while it earned the No. 9 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. In 2019, he and his staff brought in another top-10 ranked class, finishing as high as No. 6 by Baseball America.

Over his first two seasons in Starkville, Lemonis has tutored 14 picks in the MLB First Year Player Draft, including three first rounders and one second rounder. Sixteen of Lemonis' Indiana players were taken in the MLB Draft in his final four years in Bloomington and 14 signed professional contracts. He also recruited and coached nine of the Hoosier's school-record 10 MLB Draft choices in 2019.

From 2007-14, Lemonis saw seven-straight classes ranked among the top-30 nationally, including the No. 12 national class for the 2011 recruiting cycle. In 2017, Baseball America revisited the Cardinals' 2013 class, re-ranking it No. 2 in the nation after the on-field success under Lemonis' watch. In 2018, the publication tabbed an un-ranked 2014 recruiting class — which included 2015 National Freshman of the Year and 2017 Golden Spikes Award winner Brendan McKay — as the No. 1 class in the publication's re-rankings.

Lemonis mentored and or recruited 47 student-athletes that signed professional contracts after being selected in the MLB Draft during his eight years as the top assistant and recruiting coordinator at Louisville, including a school-record 10 selections in the 2010 MLB Draft. He helped produce 10 first or second round draft choices over a seven-year span.

To date, 15 Cardinals who were recruited by and played for Lemonis have gone on to reach the big leagues. Those players include Nick Burdi, Adam Duvall, Chris Dominguez, Cody Ege, Adam Engel, Chad Green, Dean Kiekhefer, Matt Koch, Trystan Magnuson, Justin Marks, Kyle McGrath, Brendan McKay, B.J. Rosenberg, Nick Solak and Tony Zych. Over \$28 million in signing bonuses were accrued by Lemonis' Louisville draftees.

## MISSISSIPPI STATE

Inheriting a team that is coming off of a trip to the College World
Series doesn't always translate into immediate success, but Lemonis was
able to build off of that momentum as he began writing his chapter in
Mississippi State history.

The 2020 squad was off to a 12-4 start with two wins each over Oregon State and No. 2 Texas Tech, before the season was shut down due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Though many publications didn't hand out postseason honors, Collegiate Baseball Newspaper tabbed left-handed pitcher Christian MacLeod the Co-National Freshman of the Year.

Along with the second-most single-season victories (52) during the 2019 season, his team also posted the second-best 20-, 30- and 40-game starts (18-2, 25-5, 32-8) in program history. He joined Pat McMahon as the only two Diamond Dawg dugout bosses to lead the program to the College World Series in their initial campaign and his 52 wins were the most by a first-year SEC head coach in the conference's history.

State saw four student-athletes earn first-team All-SEC, tying for the fourth-most selections in a single season in program history behind the five selections in 1949, 1971 and 1977. Ethan Small posted one of the most dominant seasons on the mound in program history, leading the nation in strikeouts and earning National and Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Year honors. Right-handed pitcher JT Ginn was tabbed National Freshman of the Year and Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year.

Along with Small, Tanner Allen, Justin Foscue and Jake Mangum each earned top honors from the SEC, and Foscue, Mangum and Small each grabbed at least one first-team All-America honor. Small became Mississippi State's seventh unanimous first-team All-American, joining Jeff Brantley (1985) and Chris Stratton (2012) as the only pitchers to accomplish the feat.

On the team side of things, State's offense led the nation in doubles to mark the first time in program history the Diamond Dawgs led the NCAA in an offensive or pitching category. The 166 doubles set a school record and rank No. 4 all-time in SEC history.



#### **Scouting The Opponent**

- Texas enters after winning a pair of elimination games the NCAA College World Series to push its record to 49-16 overall. The Longhorns defeated Tennessee, 8-2, and Virginia, 6-2, to set up the rematch with MSU.
- As a team, the Longhorn pitching staff leads the nation in earned run average at 2.88 and the offense is tops in walks with 366 on the season
- Mitchell Daly paces UT with a .320 batting average, while Ivan Melendez is the only other Longhorn hitting over .300 at .318 Melendez also leads the Longhorns with 12 homers.
- Zach Zubia leads the club with 60 RBIs, while 32 of Cam Williams' 59 hits have gone for extra bases.
- Longhorn ace Ty Madden owns a 2.24 earned run average over 17 starts to go with a team-best 129 strikeouts.
- Out of the bullpen, Cole Quintanilla boasts a team-best 1.23 ERA through 25 appearances.
- Texas starters had three of the top seven ERAs in the Big 12 this season, as Pete Hansen (1.88) and Tristan Stevens (3.22) joined Madden on the list.

- On Sunday, June 20 on college baseball's biggest stage,
   Will Bednar and Landon Sims made there first career appearances at the College World Series and promptly broke a College World Series record.
- The pair combined for 21 strikeouts to break the record for most strikeouts by a team in a CWS game. The previous mark was 20 by Ohio State in 1965 during a 15-inning game.
- The maroon and white clad duo needed just nine innings as 21 of the 27 outs came via punchout. Bednar racked up 15 strikeouts in six innings, while Sims fanned six in his three innings.
- Bednar's 15 punchouts set an MSU record for a single CWS game and moved him into No. 3 on the CWS career charts at Mississippi State.
- Against Virginia, Mississippi State tied the record for most pitchers used in a single game with eight, which has now happened nine times.

#### 20K Club

- With a College World Series record 21 strikeouts against Texas
  on June 20 at TD Ameritrade Park, Mississippi State's pitching
  staff fanned 20-plus batters for the second time in 2021.
  MORE IN NOTE ABOVE
- It is the fourth 20-plus strikeout game in the programs modern history and ranks No. 2 all-time at Mississippi State. The only game better came in 1909 at LSU, when Willie Mitchell fanned 26 of 27 Tiger batters.

- The accomplishment hadn't happened in 19 years before the Bulldog pitching staff fanned 20 Southern Miss hitters on March 3 in a neutral site game at Trustmark Park in Pearl, Mississippi.
- That night, Houston Harding (9), Preston Johnson (6), Cam
   Tullar (2) and Stone Simmons (5) combined to reach the mark.
- Prior to that, State last racked up 20 strikeouts exactly 19 years
  prior on March 3, 2002 against Jacksonville State. That day,
  Joey Collums (15) and Jonathan Papelbon (5) helped MSU reach
  the 20 K mark.

#### Bednar's Best

- Will Bednar was at his best in the biggest moment to this
  point of his career in the College World Series opener against
  Texas.
- The right-hander threw 108 pitches, 65 for strikes and 15 that ended an at-bat with a strikeout. He didn't allowed a run over six innings and walked just one.
- His 15 strikeouts are the most by a Bulldog at the event and sit tied for No. 6 on the all-time NCAA CWS list for a nine-inning game.
- In holding the Longhorns scoreless, Bednar joined Don Mundie in 1981 (9.0 IP; Michigan) and JT Ginn in 2019 (6.0; Louisville) as the only MSU pitchers to throw six or more scoreless innings in a College World Series game.

#### 400-RBI Club

- While pitching has been a storyline this season for Mississippi State, the offense has been just as good for the Maroon and White in 2021.
- With two RBIs against Texas, the Diamond Dawgs moved past the 400-RBI mark for the 16th time in program history. It is also the second straight season with 400-plus RBIs.
- The Diamond Dawgs are closing in on the No. 13 spot after a six-RBI night against Virginia and will have work to do to catch the 1979 squad's 426 RBIs at No. 12.

- With Rowdey Jordan and Tanner Allen reaching doubledigits in the home run column during the Super Regional, MSU has five hitters with double-digit home runs in 2021.
- The last time Mississippi State had five student-athletes with 10-plus home runs came during the 1998 season: Richard Lee (19), Brian Wieese (14), Jon Knott (13), Brad Freeman (11) and Travis Chapman (10).
- This season, Logan Tanner (14), Kamren James (11) and Luke Hancock (11) are joined by Allen (11) and Jordan (10) in the double-digit home run club.
- State has clubbed 72 home runs in 2021 to mark the first 70-home run season since 1999. The total ranks tied for No. 9 on the all-time list at MSU.

 Nine of the 10 games have come in NCAA Regional play, with a 15-1 win over Georgia Southern coming at the 1990 College World Series.

#### In the Last 10 Games...

- State owns a 7-3 mark over its last 10 games, which includes the SEC Tournament and eight NCAA postseason games.
- Offensively, State is averaging 8.5 hits per game and 3.5 walks per game for a .343 on-base percentage. The Dawgs have averaged 6.2 runs per game over that span.
- Rowdey Jordan paces the offense with a team-best .386 average over the last 10 games. Tanner Allen (.361), Kamren James (.308) and Brad Cumbest (.300) are also hitting .300 or better during that span.
- Allen and James pace the club in RBIs with 12 and 11, respectively, while Luke Hancock has added eight RBIs.
- State has fanned 110 batters to 34 walks over the last 10 games, while limiting the opposition to a .262 batting average.
- On the flip side of MSU's pitching staff strikeout numbers, the State offense has struck out just 56 times to 35 walks.
- The quartet of Will Bednar, Houston Harding, Christian MacLeod and Landon Sims have combined for 77 of MSU 110 strikeouts in 56 2/3 of 85 1/3 of MSU's innings pitched.

#### SEC Streaking

- Earlier in 2021, the Mississippi State baseball program rattled off seven straight SEC wins thanks to series sweeps against Kentucky and at Auburn and a series-opening win over Ole Miss.
- Overall, the seven game streak is the longest by an SEC program in conference play this season.
- State then won five straight conference games between a sweep of Texas A&M and two victories over South Carolina to start the series in Columbia.
- It is the first time since 2000 and the seventh time in program history that MSU has two five-game conference winning streaks in the same season.

#### **Filling the New Dude**

- Mississippi State opened the new Dudy Noble Field in stying, averaging a school-record 8,899 fans over 41 home dates in 2019.
- With attendance restrictions early in the season, the Diamond Dawgs continue to sit among the national leaders in attendance, even topping the 10,000 mark on seven occasions.
- The three 10,000-plus crowd against Ole Miss in April and 10,011 fans against VCU in the NCAA Starkville Regional pushed the program's total to 65 all-time at Dudy Noble Field.
- The 13,338 fans that entered the gate for the Saturday, April 17th contest versus Ole Miss ranks No. 11 in program history and give MSU 16 of the top 17 on-campus crowds in NCAA history.
- Super Regional weekend versus Notre Dame helped break the NCAA three-game series record and mark the first time in an on-campus venue that a program topped 40,000 fans for a three-game series.
- The 14,385 fans for the Super Regional opener marked the fifth largest crowd in school history and the biggest to witness an NCAA postseason event on campus. That was followed by 13,971 (No. 7 all-time in MSU and NCAA history) on Sunday and 11,784 on Monday to push the series total to 40,140.

# A Dawg Among Dawgs: Tanner Allen

#### **Allen Among Elite SEC Hitters**

- Tanner Allen finished SEC play with a league-bests .411
  batting average in conference play and averaged nearly one
  run per game, 1.7 hits per game and 1.1 RBIs per game in 30
  conference games.
- He also led the SEC in conference-only games in total bases (87), RBIs (34) and was the only SEC hitter with 50-plus hits (51). He was No. 2 in slugging percentage (.702) and No. 3 in slugging percentage (.472).
- In 10 SEC weekend series, Allen hit .300 or better against eight
  of the 10 opponents, including a .400 average on five SEC
  weekends. He hit .615 in three games at South Carolina.
- Allen is the only SEC hitter to rank among the top 10 in batting average, runs scored, hits and RBIs overall in 2021 and was one of two Power 5 hitters to finish the regular season with 70 hits, 50 runs scored and 50 RBIs (Braden Boissiere, Arizona).

#### Allen in Rare Air

- Tanner Allen has hit from the moment he showed up at Mississippi State and joined a couple of exclusive clubs in Diamond Dawg history.
- Along with ranking among the career leaders in doubles and triples, Allen became the second student-athlete in MSU history to produce 50 doubles, 20 home runs and 10 triples in a career.



# Mr. Jordan Gets Rowdey

#### Auburn Made

- Rowdey Jordan grew up on The Plains, attended games at Plainsman Park and graduated from Auburn High School, so there is a level of comfort when he sees the blue and orange threads.
- Now at Mississippi State, Jordan has played some of his best baseball against his hometown team, with a career .351 batting average in nine games versus Auburn.
- In his first two seasons in Starkville, Jordan used the Auburn series as a springboard to Freshman All-America honors in 2018 and then a second trip to Omaha in 2019.
- In 2020, Jordan made his final trip to his hometown and guided MSU to a series sweep.
- Jordan's numbers against the Tigers are below:
   2018: .375/.625/.375, 3-for-8, 1 R, 1 RBI, 2 2B
   2019: .360/.529/.421, 6-for-17, 4 R, 6 RBIs, 3 2B
   2021: .333/.500/.529, 4-for-12. 6 R, 1 RBI, 2 2B
- In 2018, Jordan hit .392 following the Auburn series and, in 2019, finished on a .345 clip after playing the Tigers.

#### Rowdey in the Record Books

- Junior Rowdey Jordan is quietly putting together one of the most noted careers in Mississippi State baseball history, as ranks among the top Diamond Dawgs in a bevy of career categories.
- Jordan sits tied for No. 9 in program history in doubles at 52 twobaggers and needs just one more to equal former Diamond Dawg outfielder and current MSU Director of Athletics John Cohen.

#### Streaking at the Plate

- Since 2002, there have been nine reached base streaks of 30 games or longer. That list includes Rowdey Jordan's streak of 38 games in 2021.
- The streak for Jordan began on March 14 against Eastern Michigan and ended against Florida at the SEC Tournament.
- It included 13 multi-hit games and 28 games in which he reached base at least twice. He scored a run in 25 games and owned an RBI in 20 of those contests.
- Of his 49 hits, 29 went for extra bases, and he was walked 22 times and hit-by-pitch 15 times.

#### Regional Rowdey

- Mississippi State has made five straight NCAA Super Regional appearances and a big part of the last three has been junior Rowdey Jordan.
- Jordan is just the fourth Diamond Dawg to ever earn three NCAA Regional All-Tournament honor in a career, joining *Burke Masters* (1987-89-90), *Travis Chapman* (1997-99-2000) and *Jake Mangum* (2016-17-18).
- In his career, Jordan is hitting .500 in regional play (25-for-50) with 16 runs scored, eight doubles, three home runs and 12 RBIs.
- Jordan was named the MVP of the 2019 NCAA Starkville Regional after leading the tournament in RBIs.

# **Every Day is Bump Day**

#### Sims Shutting 'Em Down

- Bases loaded, no outs is never an ideal situation for a reliever to enter the game, however that is the situation Landon Sims started his season with.
- The second-year freshman proceeded to strike out the side against No. 9 Texas and retired all 12 batters he faced in four perfect innings of work. Of his 12 outs, 10 were strikeouts, and he hasn't slowed that pace down since.
- Then, in a tie game versus Texas A&M in the series opener, Sims entered in the 10th and allowed just one base runner - a one-out walk in the 11th - and struck out seven of nine batters to earn the win.
- In 50 2/3 innings pitched, 92 of his 152 outs have come via strikeout (60%) and he has surrendered just nine runs on 28 hits. His strikeouts per nine innings sits at 16.3.
- He owns a 4-0 record with 12 saves and has been a part of three shutouts, including State's first no-hitter since 1999.
- His 12 saves rank tied for No. 5 in a single season at MSU with Adam Larson (2000) and Caleb Reed (2011).
- Opponents are hitting just .157 against the reliever.

#### Ks for Days

- The Mississippi State pitching staff struck out 43 batters in its second weekend series of 2021 against Tulane to mark the second time in as many weekends it reached the 40 K mark.
- The 43 strikeouts of Green Wave batters are tied for the most in a three-game series for MSU since at least 2005, which equaled the total against Youngstown State to open 2019.
- State then equaled that total against Arkansas during the opening weekend of SEC play. MSU fanned 13 in the series opener, 19 in the middle game and 13 in the finale.
- In all, MSU struck out 40-plus batters in three weekend series, while reaching the 30-strikeout mark in all 14 regular season weekends.

#### All-Regional Mound Men

- In 39 NCAA Regional appearances, Mississippi State has seen 22 pitchers earn NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team, including the pair of Will Bednar and Houston Harding during the 2021 NCAA Starkville Regional.
- Of those 22, Bednar and Harding became just the third set of pitchers to earn the honor at the same regional.
- They joined the 2011 duo of *Evan Mitchell* and *Nick Routt* and the 1985 pair of Gene Morgan and Regional MVP Jeff Brantley.
- Bednar punched out eight and walked one over seven innings of work to earn the win over Samford in the Regional opener.
- Harding came on in relief and fanned 10 batters in five innings of work to grab the victory in the Regional-clinching game against Campbell.


#### Scoreless Streaking

- · On Saturday, March 12 the Mississippi State pitching staff closed out a 14-0 shutout of Eastern Michigan to mark its fourth straight shutout.
- State's four shutouts ran from March 7-12 and the overall scoreless innings streak spanned five games. It ultimately ended at 39 innings to set the school record for consecutive shutout innings.
- The streak included 65 strikeouts and just 21 base runners only four of which reached third base.
- Only the 1909 team owned a longer streak, with five straight shutouts, and it is the 10th time in program history MSU put together three-or-more straight shutouts on the mound:

# 10 Ks in 21 Straight

- Mississippi State piled up double-digit strikeouts in program-record 21 straight games from March 24-May 1, including at least 12 strikeouts in 16 of those games.
- The 21-game streak featured 190 innings pitched and just 170 hits allowed to go along with 272 strikeouts (12.8 sopg). State walked just 89 and owned a .234 batting average against.
- That streak is 11 more than the previous mark of 10, which occurred twice. Earlier in 2021, State fanned at least 10 batters in 10 straight from February 26 against Tulane to March 12 versus Eastern Michigan.
- over 10 straight games of 10-plus Ks. MSU recorded 56 percent of the outs via strikeout. Of the 270 total outs, 150 of those came via strikeout for 15.0 strikeouts per nine innings.
- The 10 straight games equaled a streak from the 2001 pitching staff from April 11-22. That staff struck out 119 batters in 92 innings of work, an 11.6 strikeout per nine innings ratio.







#### **Rookies Rack Up Punchies**

- In one of the most unique years in college athletics, pitchers Will
  Bednar and Christian MacLeod became the first set of freshmen
  teammates to reach the 100-strikeout mark in the same season.
- In Mississippi State history, only four freshman pitchers have reached the century mark in strikeouts, with three of them coming over the last two full seasons.
- MacLeod and Bednar hold the top two spots on the rookie strikeout charts, both passing *Eric DuBose* (109; 1995).

- MacLeod redshirted in 2019, then the pair each had the 2020 season cut short by the COVID-19 pandemic.

# No-No Against the Flashes

- For the ninth time in program history, MSU spun a no-hitter on the mound, as the quartet of Jackson Fristoe (6 IP), Landon Sims (1 IP), Mikey Tepper (1 2/3 IP) and Cam Tullar (1/3 IP) combined for the first no-hitter at Mississippi State since 1999.
- A seventh inning error and walk, along with a ninth inning free pass were the only blemishes on the scorecard.
- The 1999 no-hitter came on March 16 against Alcorn State in a 21-1 victory, as Scott Polk, Justin Estel and Brian Compton combined on the feat.
- Against the Braves, Polk allowed an unearned run over six innings with two walks and nine strikeouts. Estel fired one inning and walked one, while Compton walked one and struck out three in two innings of work.

#### 100K Duo

- Only five times in program history has Mississippi State seen two pitchers reach 100 strikeouts in the same season, with three of those in the last three full seasons, inclduing 2021.
- The 2021 edition of the Mississippi State pitching staff added to that history in the NCAA Starkville Regional, as Will Bednar and Christian MacLeod each reached the mark.
- Bednar and MacLeod are the first set of freshmen to each eclipse the 100-strikeout mark in the same season.

 Landon Sims is close to reaching the mark, as well, at 91 strikeouts on the year. No MSU team has ever had three student-athletes reach the 100 mark in the same season.

# Strikeout Kings

- In Scott Foxhall's first season at Mississippi State, his pitching staff helped State to the second-most wins in a single season and punched out a then-school-record 718 batters in 67 games.
- That season was the first in Mississippi State history that a pitching staff eclipsed the 700-strikeout mark and bested the previous mark by 63 punchouts (655; 1997).
- In 2021, his pitching staff became the second staff to fan 700 batters, and in the Super Regional opener against Notre Dame established itself as the top strikeout staff in school history.
- At the College World Series, MSU's arsenal of arms set the NCAA single-season mark for strikeouts with its 766th punchout of the season. That moved the past 0le Miss (765; 2021). Prior to 2021, the previous record was 732 by Arizona State in 1972 (70 games).
- Mississippi State also leads the nation with 12.4 strikeouts per nine innings, which would be the best mark in NCAA history by over 1.0 strikeouts per nine innings pitched.
- The 12.4 strikeouts per nine innings are on pace to become the most in a single season in NCAA history, with the organization only listing the stat since 2006.
- The highest K/9 prior to 2021 was 11.1 by Ball State during the 2019 season.

# **Dudy Noble Field**

#### Biography

The largest on-campus facility in college baseball, Dudy Noble Field hosted its 55th season of Mississippi State baseball at the current site in 2021. With over 1,600 games played at the venue, the Diamond Dawgs own a .730 winning percentage at the facility, which recently received a \$68-million upgrade.

The field is named in honor of longtime MSU baseball coach, athletics director and ABCA Hall of Famer Clarke Randolph "Dudy" Noble. On April 27, 1998 the facility was renamed Dudy Noble Field, Polk-DeMent Stadium, honoring another ABCA Hall of Famer, former Bulldog skipper Ron Polk, and the late Gordon DeMent, a successful businessman and longtime fan of the Diamond Dawgs from Indianola, Mississippi.

#### The Origin

From 1929 until 1964, Mississippi State hosted its baseball games at the original on-campus venue, Hardy Field, which was located several hundred yards to the south of the Bulldogs' home football venue, Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field. The baseball field was closed following the 1964 season to make way for the construction of Dorman Hall and for the next two seasons the Diamond Dawgs played their home games at Redbird Park in Columbus, Mississippi, capturing SEC titles both seasons at their temporary home.

The tin-roofed grandstand and 2,000-seat bleachers from the original stadium were transported to the stadium's present site, which became playable for the 1967 campaign. Since that time, facility enhancements have followed at a steady pace to make the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball" one of the finest all-around facilities on the road to Omaha. Among with numerous upgrades, the current site has seen two complete demolitions and reconstructions, the latest occurring during a three-year span (2017-19) and opening prior to the start of the 2019 campaign.

#### Leading the Attendance Boom

With a laundry list of legendary names on its all-time roster, it comes as no surprise that Mississippi State ranks among the nation's attendance leaders year in and year out. The Dudy Noble Field faithful have sold out the reserved seating allotment every season since 1987.

Along with routinely hosting some of the largest crowds in the SEC, 11 of the last 13 three-day Super Bulldog Weekend series have drawn more than 25,000 fans.

MSU eclipsed the 200,000 mark in paid attendance at Dudy Noble Field for six-straight seasons between 2012-17, marking the first such occurrence in the program's history. In 2013, the Diamond Dawgs' five-millionth fan walked through the turnstiles at Dudy Noble Field. Since home attendance figures were charted starting in 1976, the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball" has seen 6,955,666 fans rush through the gates.

In 21 of the last 22 seasons, Mississippi State has averaged 6,000 fans per game, including a record average of 8,899 during the 2019 campaign. Overall, State has eclipsed the 200,000-fan mark 13 times since 2002, with a school-record 373,784 viewing the 2019 home schedule.

Of the top 25 all-time college baseball on-campus attendances, Dudy Noble Field finds itself on the list 20 times, most notably owning the all-time on-campus attendance record of 15,586 on April 12, 2014. The Bulldogs own 18 of the top 19 marks in NCAA on-campus history and is the only NCAA baseball program to boast on-campus attendances of 14,000 or more. The seven largest NCAA postseason crowds have all assembled in Starkville, Mississippi, as well.

From June 12-14, 2021, the Bulldog faithful flooded the gates at Dudy Noble Field to the tune or 40,140 fans for a three-game Super Regional series with Notre Dame. The over 40,000 fans on the weekend set an NCAA on-campus attendance record for a three-game series, with the previous record sitting at 39,181 from MSUS 2014 regular season series versus Ole Miss.

Dudy Noble Field has ushered in crowds of 10,000 or better 68 times, including an NCAA Super Regional-record crowd of 14,385 against Notre Dame in the opening game of the 2021 event. In 2019, the first season of the "New Dude," the Diamond Dawgs garnered crowds of 10,000-plus a school-record 10 times.

Mississippi State has hosted 27 postseason events at the facility, including three NCAA District III Tournaments (1973-75), five SEC tournaments (1979, 81, 83, 88 & 95), 15 NCAA Regionals (1979, 84-85, 87-89, 90, 92, 97, 2000, 03, 13, 16, 19 & 21) and four NCAA Super Regionals (2007, 16, 19 & 21).

#### The Left Field Lounge

The aura of Mississippi State baseball at Dudy Noble Field is certainly not confined to the loyal legions in the impressive grandstand, pro-style luxury sky suites or luxurious Left Field Lofts.

In fact, some of the more highly-prized seats at Bulldog baseball games are found beyond the outfield fence in the Left Field Lounge™. Waiting lists greet those seeking to purchase one of the 96 outfield lounges in the iconic two-level outfield tailgate.

Once a colorful assortment of pickup trucks, motor homes, and trailers — most equipped with grills — lined the outfield fence, completing a circle of humanity at Dudy Noble Field. Now, the permanent lounge spaces are connected to the concourse, allowing everyone to stroll through and experience the iconic lounge

What began in the late 1960s as a popular gathering spot for baseball-loving MSU supporters now forms college baseball's largest tailgate party.

#### The "New Dude"

The second demolition at the current site occurred following the 2017 season and the \$68 million facility opened its gates for the 2019 campaign. Architect Wier Boerner Allin, along with consultants Populous and famed stadium architect/State alum Janet Marie Smith designed the project, while construction manager ICM and general contractor JESCO Construction, Inc. oversaw the construction.

Covering 12 acres of land on the Mississippi State University campus, the 230,000 square foot facility carries on Dudy Noble Field's legacy as the "Carnegie Hall of College Baseball." Installation of the second largest scoreboard in college baseball, measuring 43 feet wide by 60 feet high, started the project in 2017. The board, which was the largest in college baseball upon instillation, is larger than boards owned by three Major League Baseball teams. The addition of 96 permanent Left Field Lounge rigs encircling the outfield followed during the fall of 2018.

The concourse and lower-level grandstands were in place for the 2018 season, with the Diamond Suites, upper-deck reserved seating area and three unique club areas — Farm Bureau Triple Crown Club, Charlie and Dana Stephenson Omaha Club and The Rooftop Club —were completed prior to the 2019 campaign. The newest version of Dudy Noble Field also features increased restroom facilities and concession points of sale.

The player spaces also received an upgrade, expanding to cover 18,000 square feet underneath the facility. The fully-equipped Bruce and Julie Martin Locker Room includes an embedded equipment room, houses 40 wooden lockers and features an oversized, dimensional halo-lit '85 Script Mississippi State sign suspended overhead in the middle of the room.

The more spacious locker room includes an attached training room with whirlpool and fully-functional fueling station. The Mitch Moreland Hitting Tunnel, which is equipped with HitTrax, and Turner & Gloria Wingo Team Lounge are easily accessed from the home dugout, with the eye-popping player entrance and Hassell H. Franklin Omaha Room greeting players as they enter the facility. The Pat McMahon Pitching Lab is also housed under the stadium, featuring arm care and conditioning equipment, one oversized turfed mound with three pitching rubbers and state of the art video equipment.




