LEADING OFF

Fresh off its season-opening series victory, Austin Peay State University's baseball team gears up for a midweek test when it faces Mississippi State in a pair of 4 p.m. midweek outings, Tuesday and Wednesday, on Dudy Noble Field at Polk-Dement Stadium.

PRESEASON NODS: Pitcher/outfielder Lyle Miller-Green enters the year as the preseason favorite to win the Atlantic Sun Conference's Player of the Year honor. The league's head coaches and D1Baseball.com tapped him for the pre-season honor in early February. In addition, outfielder Clayton Gray was named to the Preseason All-ASUN team by the league's coaches. The coaches picked Austin Peay to finish sixth in the league's preseason poll.

SILKY SMOOTH SHORTSTOP: Jon Jon Gazdar may not have earned a spot on the Preseason All-ASUN team, but the shortstop did not go without recognition. D1Baseball.com listed the Walnut Creek, California product among its Top 50 shortstops nationally – the only ASUN shortstop listed. Miller-Green (No. 83) and Gray (No. 90) also were listed on the website's Top 100 Outfielder list.

BIG OFFENSE ON TAP: Austin Peay returns nearly all the regulars off an offense that posted one of the best seasons in program history. Of the nine hitters with 100 or more at-bats last season, only one will not return. Outfielder Garrett Martin is the Gobs' lone departure after graduation and signing as a free agent with the New York Yankees. *Offensive Breakdown on page 4.*

FLIPPING THE MOUND: While the offense returns the bulk of its output, the situation on the mound will be drastically different. Austin Peay saw 10 letterwinners depart from last season's pitching staff, leaving only six returnees. Each of those six returnees supplied 27 or more innings in 2023. Eleven newcomers bolster the Gobs' bullpen, including five transfers from other Division I programs. *Pitching Breakdown on page 5.*

CLIMBING THE HILL

- **Lyle Miller-Green** looks toward his first start of the 2024 campaign to opening the series against the Bulldogs. He is one of the Gobs' two returning pitchers with 10 or more starts in 2023. Miller-Green made 13 starts last season, pitching in all three weekend spots.

FIRST HACKS

- Center fielder **John Bay** saw seven of his eight base hits go for extra bases, with five doubles and two home runs. His 4-for-4, 5 RBI outing in Game 2 included two doubles and two home runs and he walked in his fifth plate appearance.
- **Harrison Brown** started all three games at first base in his return from an injury that cut his 2023 season short. He reached base safely in all three games and drove in a run in the first two games.
- Infielder **Jaden Brown** started Games 1 and 3 at second base but got off to a slow start at the plate, going 0-for-5 against Western Illinois.
- Catcher **Trevor Conley** started Game 2 of the WIU series and scored after being hit by a pitch before handing over catching duties to Keaton Cottam in the seventh.
- Catcher **Gus Freeman** started Games 1 and 3 behind the plate. After a hitless season opener, he rebounded with a 1-for-2 outing that included an RBI double and a RBI walk.
- Shortstop **Jon Jon Gazdar** also had a four-hit outing in Game 2 of the WIU series and opened the season with seven hits, including a double in each game of the series. He also struck out only once in his 15 plate appearances.
- Right fielder **Clayton Gray** went 5-for-14 against WIU with a hit in all three games of the series. He had a double and home run in Game 1 and notched his second double in Game 2.
- Infielder **Andres Matias** got the nod for a Game 3 start at third base after entering the series' first two games as a late defensive replacement. He went 1-for-4 in his starting debut.
- **Lyle Miller-Green**, the ASUN Preseason Player of the Year, opened the season with three home runs in his first six at-bats and was 4-for-8 in the series with four intentional walks.
- **Justin Olson** was the Gobs' designated hitter for all three games of the WIU series. He was limited to two walks in the season opener, but hit his first home run in Game 2 of the series before posting two RBI in the series finale.
- Infielder **Paris Pridgen** used his speed to great effect in Game 3 of the WIU series. In his lone at-bat, he reached on a bunt attempt with two out in the eighth inning and advanced to third after a throwing error. He eventually scored the game-winning run on John Bay's double.
- Infielder **Brody Szako** started the season's first two games at third base. He had four RBI in Game 2 with a two-run double that gave the Gobs the lead for good in the first and a third-inning two-run single.
- Infielder **Ambren Voitik** started at second in Game 2 of the WIU set. However, he had an RBI in all three games of the series, including a solo home run in Game 2.

In the event seating inside the press box is not available, every effort will be made to provide adequate seating.

PHOTOGRAPHERS ACCESS: Photographers have access to the areas outside the wall down the baselines on both sides of the field, but not inside the field of play. Shots also may be taken from almost any position in the stands. As usual, photographers should be aware of their surroundings as baseballs can leave the field of play at a high rate of speed!

INTERVIEWS: All interview requests should be submitted at least 24 hours in advance to the Austin Peay Athletics Communications Office.

- **HEAD COACH:** Head coach Roland Fanning typically will be available during the week for interviews, preferably Mondays, as arranged through the Athletics Communications Office.
- **STUDENT-ATHLETES:** All interviews with student-athletes will be scheduled to occur before or after practice to accommodate student-athletes' academic schedules. No interviews will be granted on the day of a game. Student-athletes should not be contacted directly by the media.

BULLDOGS BRIEFING

- Mississippi State looks to rebound following a 27-26 record in 2023 that saw them miss the SEC Tournament with a 9-21 league mark.
- Mississippi State was picked to finish seventh in the SEC West Division.
- The Bulldogs opened 2024 with a three-game series victory against Air Force. MSU won the season opener, 8-4, before dropping a 3-2 pitchers' duel on Saturday. The Bulldogs rebounded with a 10-2 Sunday win to clinch the series.
- Outfielder Dakota Jordan was named to the Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List and the Pre-season All-SEC Second Team. He opened 2024, batting .417 against Air Force with two home runs and three RBI.
- Cam Schuelke was named to the NCBWA Pre-season Stopper of the Year Watch List. He picked up the save in MSU's season-opening win, striking out two of the six batters he faced in a two-inning outing.

IN STARKVILLE: MSU leads, 4-0
NOTABLY: The Govs and Bulldogs meet for the first time in more than a decade after meeting seven times in a nine-season span (2005-13) during the height of the Govs early 2000s success. Famously, Austin Peay swept a midweek pair from Mississippi State at Raymond C. Hand Park in 2008 during a season that saw both teams reach the NCAA Tournament. Three years later, the teams met in the winner's bracket of the 2011 Atlanta Regional hosted by Georgia Tech.

LAST MEETING, NOTABLY

- MARCH 26, 2013 ■ MSU 13, APSU 5**
- Austin Peay's baseball team saw an upset opportunity melt away in the late innings of a 13-5 loss to nationally-ranked Mississippi State at Dudy Noble Field.
 - Austin Peay matched Mississippi State for six and a half innings and was tied 5-5 after left fielder Cody Hudson's RBI single in the top of the seventh.
 - Mississippi State broke the game open with three runs in the bottom of the seventh and a five-run eighth inning. The Bulldogs took advantage of two walks and three consecutive hits in the seventh inning. First baseman Wes Rea, designated hitter Trey Porter and catcher Nick Ammirati each drove in a run.
 - Rolando Gautier posted his second consecutive three-hit outing, finishing 3-for-4 with a RBI. Harper added a 1-for-4, two RBI performance. The Govs offense notched nine hits and earned six walks against the Bulldogs pitching staff.
 - Freshman Jared Carkuff started the contest and faced eight batters in the first inning, allowing four runs, but the Govs battled back and tied the game after his departure. Freshman Hunter Lindley (0-1) allowed three runs in the eighth and was tagged for the loss.

GAZDAR AN ASUN ALL-ACADEMIC PICK

APSU shortstop **Jon Jon Gazdar** 🏆 became the first Austin Peay baseball player to earn ASUN Conference All-Academic recognition. He finished his first year at APSU with a 4.00 grade-point average while majoring in General Studies and Organizational Administration. He was one of 13 ASUN student-athletes named to the team, which was headlined by ASUN Scholar-Athletes of the Year Jesse Barker (UCA) and Riley Cheek (Queens).

HAND HOMER MARK

Sunday's big battle against Western Illinois was at the Governors bat rack as the offense broke out for 12 extra base hits in Game 1 of the doubleheader. That included six home runs which tied the record for most home runs in a game at Raymond C. Hand Park. Lyle Miller-Green and John Bay each belted two shots – LMG tagging one for 438 feet – with Justin Olson and Ambren Voitik each adding a solo home run.

**MILLER-GREEN, MARTIN TAPPED FOR SECOND TEAM ALL-ASUN**

APSU designated hitter/starting pitcher **Lyle Miller-Green** was joined by outfielder Garrett Martin as a Second Team All-ASUN selection with outfielder Clayton Gray nabbing third team honors. LMG finished the season ranked eighth among ASUN home run leaders (16). He led the Gobs all season in batting average, ending the season with a .354 batting average, with his 84 hits ranking 13th in program history.

DOUBLES FOR DAYS

Austin Peay closed 2023 with 139 doubles, the second most in program history behind only the vaunted 1996 squad. APSU enters the postseason ranked No. 5 in total doubles and No. 8 in doubles per game (2.45).

Outfielder Clayton Gray and infielder Jon Jon Gazdar led all ASUN hitters in doubles. In addition, the duo finished the season ranked 11th among Division I hitters in doubles. Before last season, only four Governors had at least 24 doubles in a season.

K IS FOR KIMBEL

The fresh influx of talent is one of the pitching headlines for 2024. A change at pitching coach is the other. During the summer, head coach Roland Fanning turned over the reins of the pitching staff to assistant coach Kierce Kimbel after Jake Hendrick left to lead the Queens University baseball program. Kimbel, who was a pitcher for the Governors, previously served as a pitching coach at Evansville.

RETURNING WINNERS

Five pitchers return after posting victories in 2023. Jacob Weaver leads the group with four wins, followed by Davin Pollard's three relief victories. Campbell Holt supplied a two-win campaign, while Lyle Miller-Green and Jackie Robinson chipped in a win each.

WAXING WEAVER

Jacob Weaver closed the 2023 season as part of the Govs' weekend rotation, starting each of the final nine weekends. He posted a 4.03 ERA in those nine starts and struck out 26 batters in 38 innings. Three of his four wins also came during the closing stretch, including victories in six-inning outings against Central Arkansas and Jacksonville State.

STRANGE CASE OF MILLER-GREEN

Lyle Miller-Green was a critical two-way guy for the Governors in 2023, making 13 starts and pitching in each of the three weekend spots. He made six starts where the offense supplied fewer than six runs during a season that saw APSU post a 2-22 record when scoring less than six runs in 2023.

**WINNING WEAVER**

Pitcher **Jacob Weaver (#14)** 📸 moved into the Govs weekend rotation May 16 against Queens and dazzled with a 3.71 ERA in seven starts against ASUN Conference opposition. He was the starting pitcher in each of the Govs final two wins, holding North Alabama to one run over 5.2 innings and following that with a six-inning outing against Jacksonville State in the ASUN Conference Championship.

HAMPU SOLID OUT OF THE PEN

Tyler Hampu proved himself a key part of the Govs' bullpen in 2023, finishing second on the team with 23 relief appearances. Nine outings saw him provide at least an inning of relief without allowing an earned run, including six such outings where he did not allow a baserunner.

500 K!

Davin Pollard's strikeout to send the Govs to the ASUN Tournament was APSU's 500th strikeout in 2023, making the 2023 pitching staff the second in program history to record 500 Ks, joining the 2019 team, which recorded 556 strikeouts. Austin Peay's 516-strikeout campaign was 65th among Division I teams, and its 9.39 strikeouts per nine innings was 56th nationally.

ONE DOWN WITH ROOM TO GROW

Austin Peay's 2023 pitching staff posted a 6.95 ERA, an improvement of over a run per game versus the 8.00 ERA of the 2022 pitching staff. Looking ahead to 2024, the Govs will seek to improve its walk rate (5.99 BB/9) and opponent's on-base rate (.409 OBP), which were the highest marks in those categories since 1992 and 1991, respectively.

FIRST-TIME FOES

Three first time foes do the Gobs' 2023 schedule with a three-game series against Maryland-Eastern Shore, a rare Monday game against Gonzaga, and a four-game set at UTRGV. APSU was 9-10 against its six first-time foes in 2023.

LONG TIME NO SEE

In addition to the six first-time foes, Austin Peay will see three programs for the first time in 15-plus years. The Gobs renew their series against Southern Indiana for the first time since the 1999 season, and a visit from North Florida will be the Ospreys' first trip to Clarksville and revives a series last played in 2006. Central Arkansas returns to The Hand for the first time since helping the Gobs open their 2007 championship season, the only previous meeting between the Bears and Gobs.

ON THE OUTSIDE, LOOKING IN

The ASUN Coaches picked Austin Peay to finish sixth in their preseason coaches poll. They chose the Gobs ahead of North Alabama, Bellarmine, and Queens, while North Florida (ninth) and Central Arkansas (10th) edged out the Gobs.

11 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Austin Peay claimed 11 championship seasons during their tenure in the OVC. The Gobs claimed eight regular-season titles (1971, 1984, 1996, 2003, 2004, 2007, 2011, 2012) and six tournament titles (1996, 2005, 2007, 2011, 2012, 2013).

GOVS IN THE PROS

Nine Governors have reached the majors in program history, with current San Francisco Giants reliever Tyler Rogers the program's lone representative entering the 2024 season. Since 2003, Austin Peay has had five alumni reach the Major Leagues – third-most among Tennessee's two- and four-year collegiate programs.

RELATIVE DIMENSION AND SPACE

Long-time fans of Governors baseball will notice the latest change to Joe Maynard Field at Raymond C. Hand Park. For the first time in its more than 50-year history, APSU updated its outfield dimensions prior to the 2023 season. The most significant change was in center field, where the wall moved 392 feet to 380 feet from home plate. In addition to that move, the fence in center field is going up – way up – with a 30-foot wall to protect the shorter field. Meanwhile, the right field wall at The Hand moved in from 321 feet to 300 feet to accommodate a new student seating area, making for a tempting target for left-handed hitters who only have to best a five-foot wall in that corner.

**ROBLES, ROGERS GET THE CALL**

In February, Austin Peay baseball alumni Alex Robles and **Tyler Rogers** 🏆 joined the Austin Peay Athletics Hall of Fame. They became the 17th and 18th Governors alumni inducted into the Hall of Fame and it is the third consecutive class to include at least one Governors baseball player. Jordan Hankins ('12) was a member of the 2023 class and Reed Harper ('13) was inducted in 2022.


