QUEENS BASEBALL HEADLINES

QUEENS VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE

Queens and Mississippi State are set to meet for the first time ever this weekend. The Royals have played multiple Power Four programs over the last three seasons, including North Carolina, NC State, South Carolina, Tennessee, and West Virginia. In those games, the Royals are 0-10 and being outscored 111-28. Mississippi State opened the year ranked No. 18 in the D1Baseball Preseason Poll, but have since dropped out. This season, Queens will face five programs ranked in the Preseason Top 25, including three squads ranked in the top 10 in Tennessee, North Carolina, and Georgia.

QUEENS BASEBALL HEADLINES

- Strength of Schedule**
Queens is set to embark on one of the most challenging schedules in the country with 10 opponents coming off of NCAA Tournament appearances and five ranked in the D1Baseball Preseason Top 25. The Royals will square off against four SEC programs and two ACC squads while also tackling four Big South opponents and elite talent from the Big 12, Sun Belt, Ivy League, and SoCon.
"I love our schedule," said head coach Jake Hendrick. We wanted to put together as challenging a schedule as we could. Being in big games and big environments is something we want to expect out of ourselves in the future, and what better time than now to get those types of games on the schedule."
- Path to the Draft**
Queens will look to replace the powerful bat of Dillon Lewis after he was drafted in the 13th round of the 2024 MLB Draft by the New York Yankees. The Charlotte native put together a historic 2024 campaign starting all 55 games and hitting .371 with 14 doubles, 22 home runs, 63 RBIs, and 20 stolen bases. Lewis broke the program's single-season home runs, hits, runs, and RBI record as he was named First Team All-Conference. Lewis was one of two players last season to hit 20 home runs and steal 20 bags (Vance Honeycutt/North Carolina) Royals in the Pros:

- Freshman Phenom Returns**
Coming off an ASUN All-Freshman Team season, Jake Barbour returns after starting all 50 appearances and hitting .249 with seven doubles, eight home runs, 31 RBIs, and 42 runs scored. The Raleigh native tied former Queens star Dillon Lewis for the most home runs in a single-season by a true freshman. Through four weeks of the 2025 season, Barbour is hitting .319 with four doubles, one home run, and six RBIs while reaching safely in 11-of-12 games. The sophomore ranks top 25 in the ASUN this season in batting average, hits, and doubles.
- Welcome to the Queen City**
Queens added 17 newcomers to the roster after losing 20 players from a season ago to graduation or the portal.
The Royals also added Conrad Felks Jr. to the coaching staff. Felks Jr. spent the last six seasons on staff at Coastal Carolina. During that span, the Chanticleers made five NCAA Tournament Regional appearances and won a pair of Sun Belt Tournament titles.
"Conrad spent the last six years at Coastal Carolina working under former head coach Gary Gilmore," said head coach Jake Hendrick. "Coach Gilmore could not have said more positive things about Conrad and his work ethic and organization."
- Mr. Friday Night**
After starting every Friday night outing last season, RHP Landry Jurecka returns to the same role. The junior tossed 74.1 innings, the third most by a Royal in a single-season in school history. Additionally, Jurecka fanned 75 batters which was the second-most in a season by a Queens pitcher. Against Lehigh, Jurecka struck out 10 batters across 6.2 dominant innings. Jurecka presents a lower 90's fastball with a mix of slider, curveball, and changeup.
- Justin's Juice**
Butler Community College transfer Justin Hudson will be a middle of the lineup bat as he brings incredible athleticism to play multiple positions. The junior is coming off a campaign in which he hit .346 with 14 doubles, 15 home runs, and 54 RBIs. Hudson was named Second Team All-Conference as a freshman at Butler CC. In the opening weekend against Appalachian State, Hudson blasted three home runs across the doubleheader on Sunday.
- Bombs Away**
Queens is coming off a season in which they broke the single-season school record for home runs with 89. The mark was also good for the second most in the ASUN as three Royals posted double digit blasts. Senior Will Budnick returns after belting 10 home runs last season, the most in a season by the Charlotte native.
- Total Package**
Newcomer Anibal Rivera is expected to be a top of the order bat as he brings a dynamic skillset. The Butler Community College transfer is coming off a season in which he hit .346 with 14 doubles, two triples, eight home runs, and 51 RBIs. Rivera was a force on the bases swiping 15-of-16 attempts and scoring 73 runs. Defensively, Rivera brings a smooth ability to flash the leather and is expected to make a statement from shortstop.
- Mr. All-American**
Monroe University transfer Adrian Quezada joined the Royals starting rotation this offseason following an All-American season at the JUCO level. The right-hander has a team-best 3.60 ERA across three starts and is coming off back-to-back efficient starts against Yale and West Virginia.
