### LEADING OFF

Austin Peay returns to Starkville for midweek action against a very good No. 4 ranked Mississippi State, Tuesday. The Governors are coming off a 2-1 weekend, taking the series in their Sunday rubber match against Eastern Michigan. The Governors were out-hit in game one of the series, losing in a one-run game, 7-6. They came back and took game two in extra innings, thanks to graduate Trevor Conley's RBI single in the bottom of the 11th to walk-off the Eagles. Then senior Kade Shatwell paced the Gobs to a 6-1 win in game three, after throwing 5.2 innings of no-hit ball and striking out six.

Austin Peay begins will continue its 33-game road schedule -- the most in school history -- at Mississippi State, who is undefeated to begin the season, winning eight thus far.

### PRESEASON NODS

Infielder **Ray Velazquez** enters the season as the preseason favorite to win the Atlantic Sun Conference's Player of the Year honor. The league's head coaches along with D1Baseball.com tapped him for the preseason honor as well. Velazquez ranks as the No. 6 third basemen across Division I baseball, according to D1Baseball.com, and first amongst mid major programs. Velazquez joins **Cody Airington**, **Trevor Conley**, **Cole Johnson**, and **Kyler Proctor** on the preseason All-ASUN team. The coaches of the ASUN Gold Division picked the Governors as the league's preseason favorite in the coaches poll.

### GOVERNORS BULLPEN

The Governors have a team ERA of 5.77 coming out of their series against Eastern Michigan, lowering that number almost two points from the previous week at UNLV. Senior **Kade Shatwell** shined through 5.2 innings of no-hit work, as he led the Gobs to a win in the rubber match on Sunday.

- Redshirt senior **Chance Cox** made his first appearance of the season at UNLV opening weekend in Vegas, throwing 4.1 innings and matching his career-high six strikeouts. He was one of the main arms in midweek action last season, before entering the starting rotation in Atlantic Sun Conference play in 2025. The southpaw had an 8-1 record and 5.53 ERA a season ago.

### FIRST HACKS

- Infielder/designated hitter **Cole Johnson**, the 2025 ASUN Freshman of the Year and Freshman All-American is batting .111 to start the season after going 1-for-11 this weekend against EMU. He went 2-for-16 at UNLV, as he collected a triple and his first-career grand slam in the four-game series against the Rebels. He came into the season ranked 24th amongst all first basemen in Division I baseball, according to D1Baseball.com.
- Infielder **Ray Velazquez**, the Preseason Player of the Year in the ASUN, comes into the midweek matchup with a hot bat after hitting .308 against EMU over the weekend, and collecting his first long ball of the season. He ranked as the No. 6 third basemen across Division I baseball entering the season, according to D1Baseball.com, and is first amongst mid major programs.
- Infielder **Kyler Proctor** collected just one hit in the weekend series at home, and comes into the midweek batting .167. So far this season, he has collected a triple and six RBI. He ranked 39th amongst all second basemen in Division I baseball entering the season, according to D1Baseball.com.
- Catcher **Trevor Conley** was the man with the hot bat over the weekend, going 6-for-12 at the plate, while driving in six runs. His five-RBI day at the plate on Saturday bested his career high in a single game, and delivered the final blow with an 11th inning walk-off RBI single to center to force a rubber match. He was a First Team All-ASUN selection a season ago, and is on the 2026 preseason team this year.
- Infielder **Andres Matias** is second on the Gobs' roster batting .375. The shortstop went 5-for-12 at the dish over the weekend with a double and two RBI. He carries a four-game hit streak coming into midweek play, having three multi-hit games in the span.
- Utility player **Ty Wisdom**, had a redemption week at the plate against Eastern Michigan after only going 2-for-12 at UNLV the week before. The Kansas transfer batted .333 against the Eagles, going 4-for-12 with a pair of doubles and a stolen base.
- Outfielder **Paris Pridgen** continues to hit the ball well and produce runs for the Gobs, as he comes into Tuesday's game with a team-leading .409 batting average. He went 5-for-11 over the weekend with a double and a sacrifice fly, while swiping four bags in four attempts. He is averaging a stolen base per game, with seven on the season.
- Outfielder **Zion Taylor** also has continued his success at the plate, as he batted .333 over the weekend with a double and a pair of walks, while scoring four times. He is tied with Ty Wisdom on the season with three extra-base hits, as he is slugging .458.
- Catcher **Keaton Cottam** improved at the plate against EMU, as he helped lead the Gobs with timely hitting. Despite going 2-for-9 on the weekend, he was responsible for a base hit to move a runner into scoring position for Trevor Conley in the 11th inning of Saturday's walk-off thriller.

### 2025 ASUN BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2025 Atlantic Sun Conference Baseball Championship was played at Melching Field at Conrad Park, the home of the Stetson University Hatters.

The top four teams from each division qualified for the 2025 ASUN Baseball Championship.

The No. 1 seed from each division played the No. 4 seed from opposing divisions, while the No. 2 seeds from each division played the opposite divisions No. 3 seed for the opening round on Tuesday.

The tournament was in a double-elimination format, with the Championship Game taking place on Sunday.


Florida Gulf Coast beat Stetson 6-5 in a six-inning Championship Game after being called due to inclement weather to force an if necessary game. The championship would not be completed due to the weather. FGCU and Stetson were named co-champions, and Stetson was awarded an automatic qualifier.

The Hatters would move on to an NCAA Regional at Auburn, where they would go 1-2, and be eliminated by NC State 17-12 on June 1.

## 2025 SEASON RECAP

### 2025 REGULAR SEASON RECAP

#### COACH FANNING

- For the second-straight season, the third-year head coach was named the league's Coach of the Year following a Gold Division title and the best conference (26-4) and overall record (45-14) in the ASUN. Fanning led the Governors to their second Atlantic Sun Conference regular season title, as this year's team rewrote the record book after becoming the fastest team to reach both the 30 and 40-win marks. He becomes the fourth head coach to lead his team to a 40-win season. The Gobs also became the first in program history to win 43 games in a single regular season.
- The 2025 team recorded a program-record nine series sweeps, while also becoming the winningest team in conference play in Austin Peay history. The Governors had the second-fewest losses at home after going 26-4 at Raymond C. Hand Park. In addition, the team was inside the top five of multiple offensive categories across all Division I teams.
- Fanning also reached the 100 career wins milestone, becoming the fastest head coach in program history to reach the mark, doing so in just 164 games. The Coalgate, Oklahoma native is the first head coach in program history to be named the league's Coach of the Year in back-to-back seasons.

#### ALL-ASUN HAUL

- After piecing together one of the best seasons across Division I baseball this season, Austin Peay State University's baseball team matched a program-record 14 postseason awards following the end of the regular season.
- Joining Cameron Nickens and Cole Johnson on the First Team All-ASUN Team was catcher Trevor Conley, second baseman Kyler Proctor, third baseman Ray Velazquez, and outfielder John Bay. Second team honorees included starting pitcher Gavin Braunecker, starting pitcher Lyndon Glidewell, and first baseman Gus Freeman. The third team included shortstop Andres Matias.



## CAMERON NICKENS

- 2025 ASUN Player of the Year
- 2025 First Team All-ASUN

The Magnolia, Texas native did nothing more last year than play exceptional ball on the diamond. In a short amount of time, Nickens had put his name in the record books for what he did in just one season with the Governors after transferring from the University of Houston after last season. He matched Austin Peay's single-game program record for three home runs and 15 total bases in a game at North Alabama (April 11), tying 2024 ASUN Player of the Year Lyle Miller-Green's record from the 2024 season against Middle Tennessee.

Following the conclusion of the regular season, Nickens was fourth in the nation with a .426 batting average, seventh with 23 doubles, second with 95 hits –three behind the national leader – ninth with a .529 on-base percentage, 16th with 70 runs scored, 15th with 69 RBI, fourth with a .789 slugging percentage, and was the national leader with 176 total bases. Nickens also ranked second in the ASUN with 18 home runs. The senior slugger was also named a semifinalist for the 2025 Dick Howser trophy, presented by the NCBWA. Nickens is the eighth Governor to be named the conference's Player of the Year.

## COLE JOHNSON\*

- 2025 Freshman of the Year
- 2025 First Team All-ASUN
- 2025 All-Freshman Team

Johnson, a native of Austin, Texas, finished the regular season as the best freshman in the league, earning Freshman of the Year honors, as well as First Team All-ASUN honors as the top designated hitter in the league. The redshirt freshman finished the regular season leading all freshmen in the ASUN with a .356 batting average, a .582 slugging percentage, a 1.023 OPS, 48 runs scored, 74 hits, 18 doubles, nine home runs, and 67 RBI. He is just the third Governor in program history to be named the league's Freshman of the Year, and the first since Garrett Spain in 2019.

## TREVOR CONLEY\*

- 2025 First Team All-ASUN

The Mt. Carmel, Ohio native, Conley earned All-ASUN honors for the first time in his three-year career at Austin Peay. After starting the first two weeks of the 2025 season batting just .040, Conley showed grit throughout the remainder of the season, finishing the regular season batting .312 overall, and .378 in ASUN play, which ranked seventh in the league. Conley was named to the Buster Posey National Catcher of the Year Award Midseason Watchlist (April 25) after raising his offensive stats rapidly. He ranked ninth in league play with a .610 slugging percentage and a .470 on-base percentage. He also ranked seventh in league play with a 1.080 OPS. Conley started 40 games behind the plate last season and fielded .988 on the year, with 326 putouts, which ranked eighth in the ASUN.

## KYLER PROCTOR\*

- 2025 First Team All-ASUN

Proctor, a native of Silo, Oklahoma, earned First Team All-ASUN honors following an outstanding first season at Austin Peay after transferring from Oklahoma State. Playing in all 59 games at second base, the sophomore second baseman finished the season batting .320 overall and .314 in league play. He ranked third in the league with 81 hits, which included 14 doubles, a pair of triples, and six homers out of the leadoff spot. His speed also showed on the bases, where he took 14 bases in 19 attempts. Defensively, he ranked second in the league with 141 assists and tied for seventh in the league with 28 double plays.

## RAY VELAZQUEZ\*

- 2025 First Team All-ASUN

The junior native of Lowell, Massachusetts, Velazquez was one of the best bats in the country after the midseason point of the year. He finished the season with a .364 batting average, which ranked fourth in the league. He was third in the ASUN with a .728 slugging percentage, which ranked 15th in the nation. His .479 on-base percentage – which ranked fifth in the league – helped him reach a 1.207 OPS. That ranked third in the league and was 15th in the nation. He also ranked in the top 10 in the league with 54 runs scored, 57 RBI, and 18 home runs. Fourteen of his home runs came during league play, which led the ASUN.

## JOHN BAY

- 2025 First Team All-ASUN

For the second time in his career, the Shattuck, Oklahoma native, Bay earned First Team All-ASUN honors by unanimous decision amongst the league's coaches. The redshirt senior had a career year at Austin Peay, leading the ASUN with his 22 home runs, which ranked third in the nation. His 94 runs scored led the nation and ranked second across Division I with a .769 slugging percentage. Bay also was next to the national leaders with his five triples, ranking 16th in the NCAA. He had 173 total bases, which ranked second in the NCAA, and had a 1.276 OPS, which also ranked second in the NCAA. He was in the top 10 in 12 offensive categories in the ASUN, which included his .507 on-base percentage, 81 hits, 66 RBI, 48 walks, and 20 hit-by-pitches. He was 12-for-16 in stolen base attempts and had 26 multi-hit and 16 multi-RBI performances this year.

## ALL-ASUN SECOND TEAM

## GAVIN BRAUNECKER

- 2025 Second Team All-ASUN

The Effingham, Illinois native and southpaw transfer from Bellarmine, Braunecker was named to Second Team All-ASUN after a perfect 10-0 year on the mound. He led the league in wins and ranked 12th in the nation. His 35 runs allowed this season were the ninth fewest given up in the league, and his 17 walks allowed were tied for the fourth fewest in the league. In league play, Braunecker had the 10th-lowest opponent batting average of .246 and ranked seventh with 47 strikeouts.

## LYNDON GLIDEWELL

- 2025 Second Team All-ASUN

The native of Temecula, California, Glidewell was named to the Second Team All-ASUN after finishing the year with a 8-0 record and a 3.36 ERA, which ranked sixth in the league. His .216 opponent batting average ranked fifth in the league, and his eight wins were tied for third in the ASUN. He allowed 61 hits last year, which were the seventh fewest of any pitcher in the league, and his 29 earned runs allowed were tied for the fifth fewest.

## GUS FREEMAN

- 2025 Second Team All-ASUN

Freeman, a native of Leawood, Kansas, was named to the All-ASUN Second Team. The graduate finished the year with a .313 batting average and a .529 slugging percentage. He ranked fourth in the league with a .477 on-base percentage, which was supported by his 40 walks (7th in ASUN) and a program-record 28 hit-by-pitches, which led the league. His 434 putouts in the field ranked second in the league, and he fielded 32 double plays, which was tied for third in the league.

## ALL-ASUN THIRD TEAM

## ANDRES MATIAS\*

- 2025 Third Team All-ASUN

The native of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, Matias was named to his first career All-ASUN Team, making the third team. The senior shortstop finished the season with a .307 batting average, a .495 slugging percentage, and a .399 on-base percentage. Out of the bottom of the order, he was very productive as he drove in 43 RBI and scored 48 times. He was also a great situational hitter, laying down five sacrifice bunts, which tied for sixth in the league.

THE RUNDOWN

FACING THE BULLDOGS

SERIES HISTORY

The Governors and the Bulldogs have met nine times in the all-time series, with six meetings being in Starkville. The last time Austin Peay came to Starkville was in 2024, where the two teams played a two-game midweek series. The Governors took both games from Hail State winning the first game 3-2, and the second 13-10. A win Tuesday would tie the all-time series 5-5.

SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS

Head Coach, and 2024 Hall of Fame inductee and all-time winningest coach at Virginia, Brian O'Connor leads Hail State in his first season in Starkville. He has led the program to an 8-0 start to begin their 2026 campaign. The No. 4 ranked team in the nation began the season with a three-game series sweep before taking wins from Troy and Alcorn State in midweek action. They then took three games from Delaware in week two to complete their second sweep of the season.

AT THE PLATE

- As a team, Mississippi State is batting .341 coming into the Tuesday meeting. They are led currently by junior infielder Ace Reese, who comes into the series batting .500 with two home runs and an NCAA-leading seven doubles.

ON THE MOUND

- Hail State enters the contest with a team ERA of 2.61, and plan to start left handed pitcher William Kirk. Kirk has a 1-0 record and a 6.75 ERA in four innings of work across two appearances. The redshirt freshman threw a pair of innings in each appearance, with his last outing against Troy, where he struck out three and allowed three runs to score.

FANNING VS. THE SEC

Head coach Roland Fanning has collected three of his career wins against SEC opponents, with two coming at Mississippi State in 2024. His third was at Auburn later that year, when Austin Peay won 15-6. This season, the Governors face four SEC opponents in Hail State, Ole Miss, Alabama, and Tennessee.

Redshirt junior outfielder **Paris Pridgen** 🏆 opened the 2026 season with team-leading .364 batting average after going 4-for-11 at the dish, with a double, six walks, five runs, four RBI, and three-for-four in stolen base attempts.

## HITTERS HIT

### RAY "DIESEL" VELAZQUEZ

Redshirt-junior infielder Ray Velazquez, known by his teammates as "Diesel", was a First Team All-ASUN selection in 2025 in his first season as a Governor. The Lowell, Massachusetts native was ranked the No. 1 third basemen in division I amongst all mid-major programs, and 6th across all Division I programs, according to D1Baseball.com. He was also named a Fourth Team Preseason All-American by the NCBWA on Feb. 6. He is the fifth Gov in program history to earn the honor, and first since APSU Hall of Famer Parker Phillips in 2018. Last season, he hit a scorching .364, which ranked fourth in the ASUN. He ranked inside the top 10 of seven ASUN offensive categories, including a .728 slugging percentage (3rd), a .479 on-base percentage (5th), a 1.207 OPS (3rd), 54 runs scored (9th), 57 RBI (5th), and 18 home runs (T-2nd). 14 of his home runs came in ASUN play, which led the league.

### "BIG TEX" RAKES!

Redshirt sophomore, Cole Johnson - "Big Tex", returns to the Governors lineup after being named the 2025 ASUN Freshman of the Year, a First Team All-ASUN selection, a ABCA/Rawlings Second Team All-Southeast Region selection, and First Team Freshman All-American by the NCBWA. He led all freshmen in the ASUN with a .356 batting average, a .587 slugging percentage, a 1.205 OPS, 50 runs scored, 80 hits, 23 doubles, nine home runs, and 70 RBI.

### REPLACEMENT BATS ON TAP

Austin Peay returns roughly 59 percent of its offensive numbers from the totals of the 2025 season. Of the nine hitters with 100 or more at-bats last season, five return. Two power bats in the 2025 ASUN Player of the year, Cameron Nickens, and John Bay both leave Austin Peay after graduating and signing with professional teams. Nickens was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals in the 17th round on Day Two of the 2025 MLB Draft (July 14). Three days later, Bay signed a free agency deal with the New York Mets (July 17). Of the projected 2026 Opening Day starting lineup, just two players are first-year APSU student-athletes. One of which is a transfer from a Division I institution.

### "BIG TEX" NAMED 2025 ASUN FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Redshirt sophomore **Cole Johnson** 🏆 is the first Governor to be named ASUN Freshman of the Year, and third Gov named conference freshman of the year. He is the first since Garrett Spain in 2019. APSU Hall of Famer, Alex Robles, was the first to receive the honor in 2014.

### DOMINATING THE ASUN

Austin Peay's offense ranked among the nation's best once again, and that is reflected in the ASUN individual ranks where the Goves made up at least four of the Top 10 in nine offensive categories last year.

- 5 of 10: Slugging Percentage, OPS, Runs Scored, RBI, and Home Runs.
- 4 of 10: Batting Average, On-Base Percentage, Hits, and At-Bats.

### JUST WHAT THE PROCTOR ORDERED

Junior infielder Kyler Proctor returns to the lineup in 2026 after a huge first season with the Goves a season ago. Proctor started every game for the Goves in 2025 at second base, where he had the second-most assists (141) in the ASUN. He also led the order out of the leadoff spot, where he batted .320, with six home runs, 14 doubles, a pair of triples, and 42 RBI.

### "FOFO" MATIAS

Last year's lineup was known for its long ball presence, with players like Cameron Nickens and John Bay, who combined for 40 of the Governors' home runs through the season. But don't forget about the bottom of the order. Graduate Andres "FoFo" Matias was a threat in the nine-spot in the order. He finished the season with a .307 batting average, with eight homers, 12 doubles, and 43 RBI. He played in 56 games a year ago, starting 55.

### THE CON MAN

Graduate Trevor Conley was named to the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award Watchlist in 2025 after going on a tear at the plate. He started 40 games behind the dish, and finished the season with a .303 batting average, 13 doubles, a triple, and three home runs. Conley had the longest hitting streak on the Goves' roster at 19 games, spanning from March 1 to April 18, going 27-for-64 (.422) with three homers, eight doubles, and 21 RBI.

### LEADING THE NATION

In 2024, Austin Peay set the stage by making themselves a national threat offensively. The Governors ranked first in the nation in Division I baseball for batting average (.359), home runs per game (2.61), slugging percentage (.661), on-base percentage (.455) and scoring (10.9).

### LIGHT TOWER POWER

A season ago, Austin Peay hit a total of 112 home runs, which was the second-most in a season in program history. The Goves were 34 pumps shy of their record of 146, which was set by the 2024 team. The Governors return 40.2 percent of its home run total from last year. With this year's additions to the squad, it would be no shock if they reach the triple-digits again in 2026.
