NO. 1 UCLA TRAVELS TO LONE STAR STATE FOR AMEGY BANK COLLEGE BASEBALL SERIES

The No.1-ranked UCLA baseball team will take on three teams from the SEC at the Amegy Bank College Baseball Series beginning on Friday, Feb. 27 at 1 p.m. PT at Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas with a contest against Tennessee. Saturday's game versus Texas A&M is slated for 5 p.m. PT start, and Sunday's tilt against Mississippi State is set for a 12:30 p.m. PT first pitch. The three contests will be available to watch on FloSports. Fans can also follow along with live stats (StatBroadcast) and X/Twitter updates (@UCLABaseball).

THE RUNDOWN

- UCLA enters the season as the preseason No. 1 ranked team (D1Baseball.com)
- The Bruins are coming off a perfect 4-0 week, defeating Tulane before sweeping No. 7 TCU at home
- UCLA out-scored No. 7 TCU 30-8 over the weekend
- Roch Cholowsky and Will Gasparino are tied atop the NCAA Division I home run charts with six homers each
- As a team, the Bruins ranks sixth in the nation with 17 total home runs
- Cholowsky and Gasparino each enjoyed two multi-homer games last week
- Wylan Moss dazzled in his relief appearance on Saturday, striking out 10 batters with nine straight to end the ballgame
- Gasparino was named Perfect Game's National College Player of the Week
- Gasparino (Player of the Week) and Moss (Pitcher of the Week) each garnered Big Ten weekly honors
- UCLA's Big Ten weekly honors were its first since joining the conference
- UCLA made its sixth appearance at the CWS and fourth under Head Coach John Savage in 2025
- The Bruins swept through postseason play to advance to the College World Series
- UCLA took two of three games from UC San Diego on opening weekend
- Mulivai Levu leads the team in hitting, posting a .412 average with one home run and 11 RBIs
- Ian May has emerged as one of UCLA's top bullpen arms, posting a 2.08 ERA over four appearances with 12 strikeouts
- The Bruins were selected as the No. 15 national seed and hosted its first NCAA Super Regional since 2019
- UCLA earned its seventh super regional berth and sixth under Coach Savage
- The Bruins returned to the postseason for the 15th time in the last 21 seasons
- UCLA won eight of its 10 conference series to earn a share of the Big Ten Conference regular season title
- Roch Cholowsky was named Big Ten Player of the Year, the league's defensive player of the year, and received a First Team nod
- UCLA's 48 wins are its most since 2019 and fifth-most in program history
- UCLA claimed its first conference title since 2019
- HC John Savage secured his fifth conference championship at UCLA in 2025
- Six different Bruins received All-Conference honors: Cholowsky (1st), Levu, Barnett, Martin, Salgado (2nd), and Moss (FT)
- The program has earned 16 winning records in 21 seasons under HC John Savage
- UCLA won 13 of its 15 weekend series last season and won every series played at Jackie Robinson Stadium
- UCLA went 31-7 at Jackie Robinson Stadium last season
- UCLA's team fielding percentage of .982 ranked seventh nationally and first in the Big Ten last season
- UCLA collected five weekend sweeps, including four during Big Ten play in 2025
- Cholowsky was named Player of the Year and a First Team All-American by four outlets (ABCA/Rawlings, BA, D1B, PG)
- Cholowsky also won the Brooks Wallace Award, honoring him as the nation's top shortstop
- According to data compiled by 643 charts, Cholowsky led the nation in wins-above-replacement (WAR) at 6.49 in 2025
- Cholowsky's 23 home runs was the most by a Bruin since 2000 (Forrest Johnson)
- Dean West broke the single-season HBP record with 22 last season
- Mulivai Levu ranked second in the nation and led the Big Ten with 85 RBIs in his sophomore campaign
- Levu and Cholowsky have combined for the most RBIs (159) by a UCLA duo since 1997
- In 2023, the Bruins welcomed the top signing class in the country
- The Bruins were picked to finish first in the Big Ten Preseason Poll
- Transfer pitcher Logan Reddemann (San Diego) and Will Gasparino (Texas) headline the incoming transfer portal class

WEEKEND RECAP

No. 1 UCLA dominated all weekend, sweeping No. 7 TCU behind explosive offense and overpowering pitching. In Friday's opener, Roch Cholowsky's two-homer, five-RBI outburst and Logan Reddemann's 10-strikeout gem fueled a 10-2 rout. The Bruins clinched the series Saturday with a 5-1 win, highlighted by Michael Barnett's steady start and Wylan Moss's electric four-inning save featuring nine straight strikeouts, while Will Gasparino homered and drove in three. UCLA finished the job Sunday with a 15-5 run-rule victory, launching four home runs, including two more from Gasparino and another from Cholowsky, who tied him for the national lead, while freshman Elai Iwanaga impressed in his debut.

ABOUT THE OPPONENTS

Tennessee opened its week with a midweek win over UNC Asheville, but the Volunteers dropped their weekend series to unranked Kent State despite a strong Saturday outing from sophomore righthander Landon Mack, who struck out 11 over 6.2 innings. Texas A&M swept Penn in a tightly contested series highlighted by elite pitching discipline, as the Aggies' staff didn't issue a single walk across three games, with Aiden Sims fanning 10 in a dominant Sunday start. Meanwhile, third-ranked Mississippi State rolled through a five-game slate, overwhelming Troy, Alcorn State, and Delaware by a combined 58-12 margin, led by Ryan McPherson's six-inning, 11-strikeout gem that continued his strong early-season form.

RETURNING PRODUCTION

In an era of college baseball defined by heavy transfer-portal movement, UCLA has taken a different path by retaining its core talent and reaping the rewards. No program in Division I returns more production for 2026, with the Bruins bringing back an impressive 83 percent of their overall output. That includes 85 percent of last season's plate appearances and 78 percent of the innings pitched, giving UCLA one of the most stable and experienced rosters in the country.

GASPARINO AND MOSS EARN B1G WEEKLY HONORS

Will Gasparino and Wylan Moss swept the Big Ten's weekly awards after powering the No. 1 Bruins to a 4-0 week capped by a sweep of No. 7 TCU, marking the program's first conference honors since joining the league. Gasparino delivered one of the nation's most dominant offensive stretches, going 7-for-13 with five home runs, 13 RBIs, and a staggering 1.769 slugging percentage while playing flawless defense. Moss was equally electric on the mound, striking out 10 over four scoreless innings in Saturday's win, including an incredible streak of nine consecutive punchouts to close the game.

BRUIN BOMBERS

Will Gasparino and Roch Cholowsky have formed one of the most dangerous duos in college baseball to start the season, combining for 12 home runs, 27 RBIs, and 63 total bases across UCLA's first eight games. Cholowsky is slashing .400/.513/1.100 with six homers, 12 RBIs, and 14 runs scored, while Gasparino sits right beside him at .346/.500/1.154 with six homers, 15 RBIs, and 10 runs.

BRUINS' PRESEASON BUZZ

UCLA baseball placed two standouts on Baseball America's Preseason All-America teams. Junior shortstop Roch Cholowsky was selected as the outlet's preseason Player of the Year in addition to his First Team nod. Junior first baseman Mulivai Levu secured a spot on the Third Team. Cholowsky enters 2026 as one of the nation's premier players after assembling one of the most accomplished individual seasons in UCLA history. Levu returns as one of the conference's most productive run producers after a breakout 2025 season. Cholowsky and Levu were also named to the Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List. UCLA has now seen 19 total players named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List, with Cody Schrier being the Bruins' last inclusion in 2023. Logan Reddemann was recognized on D1Baseball's Preseason Pitcher of the Year Watch List while newcomers Angel Cervantes and Dominic Cadiz were featured on the outlet's Preseason Freshman of the Year Watch List.

ROCH AND THE ADVANCED STATISTICS

Roch Cholowsky was undoubtedly been one of the nation's most valuable players in 2025, and the advanced statistics prove it. According to data compiled by 643 charts, Cholowsky led the nation in wins-above-replacement (WAR) with a mark of 6.49. UCLA's shortstop has particularly stood out defensively with a defensive-runs-saved (DRS) mark of 18.30 and defensive WAR of 1.42. At the plate, Cholowsky was equally impressive, leading the country in offensive WAR at 5.087 and offensive runs-above-replacement (ORAR) of 67.69.

RECORD-BREAKING ROCH

Roch Cholowsky has etched his name all over the UCLA record books in 2025. Cholowsky:

- He scored 80 runs - just one shy of program record of 81, set by Chase Utley in 2000.
- Had 179 total bases last season - this is second all time for an individual in a single season in the Super Regional Era, behind Bill Scott in 2000 (204). Cholowsky is 7th all-time in program history for total bases in a single season for an individual; the record was set by Troy Glaus in 1997 with 227 total bases.

OFFENSIVE SUPERLATIVES

- Roch Cholowsky and Mulivai Levu combined 159 runs-batted-in on the season. This is second in a single season to the program record, 182, set by Troy Glaus and Eric Valent in 1997.
- Before the 2025 season, the individual record of hit-by-pitches in a single season was 19, set by Ethan "Duce" Gourson in 2022. Last season, three Bruins, Roch Cholowsky, Dean West, and Roman Martin have surpassed this mark. West currently holds the top spot with 22 hit-by-pitches and Cholowsky is right behind him with 21. Martin, has also surpassed the former record set by Gourson with 20 HBPs last year.

DAZZLING DOUBLE PLAYS

The UCLA defense turned 66 double plays last season which was the top mark in the country. The Bruins also led the country in double plays-per-game, averaging exactly one double play per contest. It is worth noting that nearly all the double play turns took place the infield as first baseman Mulivai Levu has been involved in 65 of the 66 twin killings. The Bruins were excellent defensively in 2025, posting a fielding percentage of .982 which ranked seventh nationally. Levu has been fantastic playing his position at first base, making just one error in 545 total chances (.998 fielding percentage).

IN ELITE COMPANY

Head Coach John Savage recently reached a significant milestone, eclipsing the 800-win mark for his career with a win at Illinois. With 730 wins at UCLA, he ranks second all-time, trailing only Gary Adams (1975-2004) who finished his career with 984 wins. Savage began his head coaching career at UC Irvine, where he notched 88 wins in his first three seasons, bringing his career total to 818, which ranks 23rd among active Division I coaches and first among active Big Ten coaches. His winning percentage of .602 with the Bruins is the highest among UCLA coaches with over 100 games coached.

FRIENDLY CONFINES

UCLA clinched its 10th consecutive season with a winning record at Jackie Robinson Stadium in 2025. The Bruins have had a losing record at home just twice over the last 21 seasons, last occurring in 2014 (11-20). UCLA posted a 31-7 overall record at JRS during last season's campaign.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

UCLA added 16 newcomers ahead of the 2026 season, including 12 freshmen and four transfers. Coach Savage has bolstered his pitching staff with two pitchers joining via the transfer portal. Logan Reddemann (San Diego) will look to occupy a spot in the starting rotation after posting a 2.29 ERA in his nine starts a season ago, earning back-to-back First Team All-WCC awards in 2024 and 2025. Jake Swenson (Linfield University) joins the Bruins after winning Northwest Conference Pitcher of the Year honors at his previous institution. Will Gasparino (Texas) returns to his hometown after the power-hitting outfielder mashed 25 home runs and received SEC All-Defensive Team honors in Austin.

HIGHLY-TOUTED FRESHMEN

UCLA has added two elite talents to its 2026 roster, as commits Angel Cervantes and Dominic Cadiz have elected to forego professional contracts and enroll at UCLA as freshmen this fall. Cervantes, a right-handed pitcher from Lynwood, Calif., was selected No. 50 overall in the second round of the 2025 MLB Draft by the Pittsburgh Pirates. Widely regarded as one of the top arms in the country, he is ranked the No. 2 right-handed pitcher in the nation by Prep Baseball and the No. 5 overall prospect in California. He also competed at the USA Baseball U18 National Team training camp and was named Area Code Games Pitcher of the Week on Aug. 16. Cadiz, an infielder from Sherman Oaks, Calif., was drafted in the 15th round (No. 445 overall) by the Milwaukee Brewers. The Notre Dame High School product is ranked as the No. 4 third baseman in California and the No. 76 overall prospect in the class.

BRUIN BULLPEN BRIGADE

UCLA saw four Bruins named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Preseason Watch List: Chris Grothues, Easton Hawk, Jack O'Connor, and Cal Randall. Grothues returned from a series of injuries to enjoy a solid redshirt junior campaign, logging 32.2 innings pitched, which was the most among UCLA's full-time relievers, posting a 4.96 ERA and 31 strikeouts. Hawk emerged as the team's closer in an impressive freshman season on the mound, collecting eight saves while allowing just one earned run over his last 13 appearances. O'Connor led all qualified pitchers with a 1.67 ERA in his 27 relief appearances. Randall impressed in his true sophomore season with a 3.08 ERA and 10.59 K/9 ratio, which ranked second on the team.

NOTES ON UCLA HEAD COACH JOHN SAVAGE

• Savage was named the 2019 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, the second time he's taken home the award in his career. He was previously named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year in 2015 after leading the Bruins to a league title. He was also named National Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2013. After the 2019 season, he was named the ABCA West Region Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (2013) and was also honored as the National Pitching Coach of the Year by Collegiate Baseball.

• Savage helped UCLA reach college baseball's pinnacle in 2013, as the Bruins won their first-ever NCAA baseball title. Under his guidance, UCLA has advanced to the NCAA Tournament 14 times in 20 seasons and has hosted a regional seven times, including four straight from 2010 through 2013.

• In the summer of 2017, Savage was the manager of the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team after being an assistant coach in 2000. He led the U.S. to a 15-5 record over the summer, including 11-4 during international play. The United States won all three international series it competed in, including going 4-0 against Chinese Taipei and 3-2 versus both Cuba and Japan. The win over Cuba marked the third-straight series win, while also improving to 23-18 in 41 all-time series against Japan.

• 17 of his 20 recruiting classes have been nationally ranked in the top-25 by Baseball America. UCLA's incoming class in the fall of 2012 was rated No. 2 nationally, by Baseball America. UCLA's incoming group in the fall of 2006 was ranked No. 5, followed by No. 13 (fall 2007), No. 7 (fall 2008), No. 7 (fall 2009), No. 19 (fall 2010), No. 3 (fall 2011), No. 2 (fall 2012), No. 7 (fall 2014), No. 3 (fall 2015), No. 16 (fall 2016), No. 16 (fall 2017), and No. 4 (fall 2018), No. 5 (fall 2019), No. 3 (fall 2020), and No. 1 (fall 2021, 2023)

• Savage was named the 2013 National Coach of the Year by Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America, the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) and Perfect Game USA. His work with UCLA's pitching staff that season was no more evident than with the success of starting pitchers Adam Plutko, Nick Vander Tuig and Grant Watson. Plutko and Vander Tuig capped their UCLA careers in 2013 as the winningest pitching tandem in school history (56 total wins in three seasons).

• Under Savage's guidance, UC Irvine posted a 88-84-1 overall record and the Anteaters broke through with an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2004. That season, UC Irvine went 34-23-1 and competed at the NCAA Notre Dame Regional. The Anteaters earned their highest national ranking at the time, climbing to the No. 7 spot in Collegiate Baseball's weekly rankings in April 2004. At season's end, Savage was tabbed a finalist for National Coach of the Year honors by CollegeBaseballInsider.com.

• As pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at USC from 1997-2000, Savage helped the Trojans produce consecutive Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year selections in Seth Etherton, Rik Currier and eventual American League Cy Young Award winner Barry Zito. Also under Savage's mentorship was former Chicago Cubs right-hander Mark Prior. As the Trojans' recruiting coordinator, Savage helped facilitate the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1999-2000, as ranked by Collegiate Baseball. He was honored as Collegiate Baseball's Assistant Coach of the Year in 1998, following the Trojans' run to the College World Series title. USC advanced to the NCAA Super Regional in 1999 and back to the College World Series in 2000.

John Savage is in his 25th season as a head coach in 2025. He has guided UCLA to four College World Series appearances, including winning the program's first national championship in 2013.

ELITE COMPANY

John Savage is one of just six head coaches in college baseball history to have guided his team to a College World Series title, produced the first overall pick in the MLB Draft (Gerrit Cole, 2011), and coached at least one Golden Spikes Award winner (Trevor Bauer, 2011). Also included in that illustrious group are former head coaches Skip Bertman (LSU) and Jim Brock (Arizona State) and Augie Garrido (Cal State Fullerton, Texas) and current head coaches Tim Corbin (Vanderbilt) and Jim Morris (Miami).

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

In 14 trips to the postseason at UCLA, Savage has compiled a 51-29 record (.638 winning percentage), recording the most postseason victories of any head coach in program history.

With Savage at the program's helm, UCLA advanced to the College World Series in 2010, 2012, 2013, and 2025. UCLA reached the best-of-three championship series in 2010 and 2013. UCLA defeated Mississippi State, two games to none, at the 2013 College World Series. In 2010, the Bruins advanced to the championship series for the first time in school history, falling two games to none to South Carolina.

BRUINS IN THE PROS

Savage's strong work with UCLA's program has been equally evident in player development and the MLB Draft. Over his 21 seasons in Westwood, UCLA has produced 130 draft selections with 49 players being drafted within the first 10 rounds. Under Savage, the Bruins produced a first-round MLB draft pick in three consecutive years for the first time in program history (2019-21). In addition, he has coached 30 players at UCLA that have competed in the major leagues.
