Baseball Plays A Neutral Site Midweek Against No. 3 Mississippi State in Biloxi on Tuesday

- The Tulane baseball team (9-7) plays a neutral site contest in Biloxi, Miss. against No. 3 Mississippi State (14-2) on Tuesday, March 10, starting at 6 p.m. at Kessler Federal Park. The team is in the stretch of four straight games against ranked opponents after playing three against No. 17 TCU over the weekend.

Media

- The game against Mississippi State will be broadcasted on the SEC Network +. Corey Gloor, the Voice of the Green Wave, will call the action on the Tulane Sports Network from Learfield on 88.3 WRBH -FM/Varsity Network on Tuesday. Airtime for the radio/stream for the game is 15 minutes before first pitch.

Pitching Matchup

- Tulane is slated to start junior righty Jack Brafa. Brafa is 1-0 on the year with 4.00 ERA. This will be his sixth appearance and his second start. In

nine innings worked he has struck out 13 while limiting opponents to a .167 batting average against. He is in his first year at Tulane after transferring from Tennessee Tech.

- Mississippi State is slated to start left-handed pitcher Charlie Foster. Foster is making his fifth appearance of the season and third start. He has struck out 12 in 6.2 innings worked with a 4.05 ERA.

Scouting Mississippi State

- Mississippi State comes in ranked in each of the four polls. They moved up to No. 3 in both D1 Baseball and the USA Today Coaches Poll this week.

- The team swept Lipscomb over the weekend by a combined score of 43-7.

- The only two losses the Bulldogs have suffered this season came to fellow ranked opponents in then No. 1 UCLA and then No. 10 Southern Miss by a combined two runs.

- Reed Stallman leads the club with his .452 batting average. He has seven extra base knocks (four doubles and three home runs) on his 14 hits plus has driven in 16

- Bryce Chance is hitting .429 with 18 runs scored, 18 hits, four doubles, and 10 RBIs.

- Ace Reese is also hitting over .400 (.406) with 24 runs, 26 hits, 10 doubles, four home runs, 21 RBIs and 48 total bases.

- Noah Sullivan leads the team with his five home runs and 11 walks.

- Tomas Valincius is 3-0 on the campaign with 26 strikeouts in 20.2 innings worked.

- Ryan McPherson is also 3-0 on the year. He has 28 strikeouts in 23 innings worked.

- Duke Stone is the third member of starting staff with a 3-0 mark. He also has fanned.

- Jack Gleason has been the top reliever with a 1-0 record and 17 strikeouts in 9.1 innings thrown.

- The program is coached by Brian O'Connor. O'Connor is in his first year in charge of the Bulldogs after working as the head man at the University of Virginia the last 22 years. He won the 2015 Men's College World Series during his time with the Cavaliers.

Series History

- Mississippi State leads the all-time series with Tulane by a 77-34 count since the first game of the series in 1904 with the Green Wave falling by 5-0 and 8-2 scores. The last time the

two teams met saw Tulane win two-of-three from the Bulldogs in 2022 at home (3/4-6/22). The Green Wave won the final two games of the set by scores of 11-10 and 5-4.

Against the SEC

- Tulane is 158-287 all-time against current members of the Southeastern Conference (SEC). Many of those games came when Tulane was still a member of the SEC. The most wins for the Green Wave against the SEC has come at the expense of Ole Miss with 39. Tulane first faced an SEC opponent in 1897 against Alabama. The only school in the SEC that Tulane has never faced off with is Kentucky.

Coming In On A Streak

- Jason Wachs, despite seeing his hitting streak snapped at 23 games following the opening game of the season against LMU, has still now reached base safely in 42 consecutive games dating back to the end of last season.

Who's Hot in the Last Five Games

- Hugh Pinkney is hitting .444

- Jason Wachs sports a .375 batting average with four runs, six hits, two doubles, six RBIs, and five walks.

- Matthias Haas is hitting .313 with five hits, a home run, a double, and four RBIs.

- Jake Toporek has thrown 3.2 innings with three strikeouts.

- Tom Vincent has appeared in three games. He unscored upon with a 1-0 record and a save.

Trends

- Dating back to the end of last season, three of last four hits that James Agabedis III has are home runs.

- Jason Wachs has reached base





safely in all 16 games this season

- Matthias Haas has reached base safely in each of the last 12 games.

- Nate Johnson is hitting .462 with nine RBIs in games her starts.

- Tulane is 7-2 this year in games that Hugh Pinkney starts behind the plate.

- The program is also 3-0 in games that Matthias Haas starts as the designated hitter.

- Haas has started at four different positions this season with five games at first, five games at third, three games in right field and three games as the designated hitter.

- After leading the American Conference last season with 131 doubles as team, Tulane is again leading the league in two-baggers with 39 in the first 16 games.

- The program's pitching is averaging an impressive 9.4 strikeouts per game to place fifth in the American Conference. Tulane ranked second in the league in strikeouts a year ago with an average of 9.8 per contest.

- Of the 23 new players on the roster this season, 19 have already made their Tulane debuts following the first 16 games of the season. The only newbies that haven't appeared in a game yet this season are RHP Max Mazinter, OF Cole Berge, OF/3B Matthew Major, and RHP Owen Geiss.

- Tanner Chun leads the American Conference in hit by pitches (8). He is second in walks (15) and stolen bases (9).

- Jason Wachs is second in the league in RBIs (22) and doubles (7).

- Jack Frankel leads in complete games with one.

- J.D. Rodriguez leads the conference in wins (3).

- Jude Abbadessa, Rodriguez, and Sam Larson are tied for fifth in appearances (7).

- Kaikea Harrison is fifth in the league in runs scored (19).

- Tye Wood is fifth in sacrifice flies (3).

- Chun, AJ Groeneveld and Nate Johnson are tied for third in triples (1).

- Tom Vincent is third in the conference in saves (2).

- Trey Cehajic is seventh in strikeouts (25).

- Cehajic, Beau Sampson and Frankel are tied for the lead in starts (4).

Notables From TCU Series - 3/6-8

- The Horned Frogs were ranked 17th nationally in D1 Baseball's Top 25 and 21st in USA Today's Coaches Poll.

- The victory in the first game of the doubleheader against No. 17 TCU (3/8) was the team's first ranked victory since defeating then No. 6 ECU during the regular season of the 2024 campaign (5/12/24).

- The doubleheader played against TCU (3/8) was the first for the program since playing a pair against Loyola Marymount last season (2/25/25)

- Jay Uhlman won the 100th game of his Tulane career in the 8-4 Sunday (3.8) victory over the Horned Frogs. He is just the sixth Tulane baseball coach to ever reach the triple digit victory mark following Rick Jones - 818, Joey Brockoff - 641, Travis Jewett - 130, Milt Retif - 123, and Claude Simons Jr. - 102.

- Jacob Moore made his season debut with 0.2 innings worked in the first game of the series against the Horned Frogs (3/6).

- Tulane's all-time record against current schools in the Big 12 is now 162-139.

Harrison Named to the 2026 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch List

- Kaikea Harrison has been named to the 2026 Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Watch List, the College Baseball Foundation announced recently

- The award honors the nation's top shortstop and will be presented by the College Baseball Foundation later this year. It is named for former Texas Tech shortstop Brooks Wallace, who played for the Red Raiders from 1977 to 1980. Wallace died of leukemia at the age of 27.

Notables From Nicholls Game - 3/3

- Kaikea Harrison had a pair of hits including a three-run home run. The home run was his second of the season, third during his time at Tulane and fourth of his career.



- The loss ended an eight-game winning streak over the Colonels as the last loss came during the 2019 season at home (5/7/19) by a 5-3 margin.

- The last time Tulane lost to the Colonels in Thibodaux dates back to the 2016 season (3/15/16) by a 2-1 score.

- The loss was the first time that Coach Uhlman had lost to Nicholls as he had been 6-0.

- The Green Wave are now 69-28 all-time against Nicholls and 308-168 all-time against current Southland Conference opponents.

- Freshman Bryson Ayala made the first start of his career against the Colonels, second base, in this year's matchup and picked up his first career hit, a double.

Notables From EKU Series - 2/27 - 3/1

- Tulane was able to take the third weekend series of the season with a 5-4 victory on Friday and an 11-3 win on Sunday against Eastern Kentucky

- The wins improved Tulane to 18-5 all-time against current teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference.

- The games against EKU were the first for the programs since 1986.

- Trey Cehajic had a career-game in earning the 5-4 victory over EKU on Friday with seven innings pitched, 11 strikeouts, one hit and no runs allowed.

- Kaikea Harrison hit his first home run of the season, second at Tulane and third of his career in the first game against the Colonels (2/27) to lead off the contest.

- Matthias Haas tied his career high with four RBIs in the third game against EKU (3/1). He previously had four RBIs against Texas Southern (4/2/24) and Omaha (2/15/25).

- The two victories improved Tulane to 5-1 in home games this season.

Cehajic Honored By the American

- Trey Cehajic was named the American Conference's Weekly Pitcher of the Week following the third week of the season (3/2/26).

- Cehajic, a graduate student from Shreveport, Louisiana, had a career day in earning the 5-4 victory over Eastern Kentucky on Friday, Feb. 27. He threw 7.0 innings with one hit and no runs allowed while striking out 11. Both

his innings pitched and his strikeout totals are career highs. Cehajic's seven innings are also tied for the longest outing by a Tulane starting pitcher this season along with Jack Frankel. Additionally, the seven innings thrown are also tied for the longest outing by a pitcher in the American Conference this season. Of the 11 strikeouts, nine came looking. His 11 strikeouts were the most for any pitcher in the American Conference this season. Cehajic's 11 strikeouts are also the most for a Tulane pitcher since Michael Lombardi also struck out 11 against Florida Atlantic in the first round of the 2025 American Conference Baseball Championships.

- He is the first Tulane pitcher to take home the weekly honor since Michael Lombardi (4/7/25)

Notables From South Alabama Game - 2/25

- Tulane's pitching staff came within one out of throwing the team's first no-hitter since the 2020 season (2/28/20 - against Middle Tennessee State) and the third since 2005.

- The 15 runs scored in the 15-2 victory over South Alabama was the most for the program since scoring 20 against East Carolina last season (4/25/25)

- Nate Johnson's six RBIs were a career high and the most for the program in a game since Connor Rasmussen also knocked in six during the 2024 season against Memphis (5/3/24).

- James Agabedis' grand slam was the first for the program since Gavin Schulz hit one against Florida Atlantic last season (5/2/25). Schulz's grand slam was one of six that Tulane hit last season as a team.

- The program now trails the all-time series with South Alabama by a 27-24 count.

- The win improves Tulane to 204-160 all-time against current Sun Belt Conference members.

Notables From UNO Game - 2/24

- Tulane has now lost four straight games to the Privateers and have not defeated them on the road since the 2024 campaign (4/9/24).

- Caden Tarango (2.0 IP) and LuisPablo Navarro (1.1 IP) both made their Tulane debuts in the game.

- The Green Wave are now 97-75 all-time against its in-city rival.

- The game against UNO was the first of seven the team will play against Southland Conference (SLC) opponents





this season.

- Tulane is 308-107 all-time against the SLC.

Chun and Frankel Honored By the American

- Tanner Chun and Jack Frankel were both named to the American Conference's Weekly Honor Roll following the second week of the season (2/23/26).

- Chun, a sophomore outfielder from Honolulu, Hawaii, sparked the Tulane offense as he hit .556 with six runs scored, two doubles, two extra base hits, a slugging percentage of .778, six stolen bases, and an on-base percentage of .750. He also totaled five hits, four RBIs and seven total bases while reaching base safely in all four games.

- Frankel, a sophomore pitcher from Plano, Tex., allowed just one run on seven hits in a complete game seven inning victory over Harvard. His seven innings thrown was the team's first complete game since April 25, 2025. His seven innings on the mound was the most for a Tulane pitcher since Michael Lombardi also went seven frames against Florida Atlantic in the American Baseball Conference Tournament (5/20/25). Frankel also struck out three without walking a man.

- This is the first weekly conference recognition for both Chun and Frankel during their careers at Tulane and for the program this year. Overall, the program has been recognized by the conference 12 times the last two seasons.

Notables From Harvard Series - 2/20-22

- The three-game sweep improved Tulane to 3-1 all-time against Harvard.

- The series was the first time the teams have met on the diamond since 1998 in the NCAA South II Regional in Baton Rouge.

- The pitching staff's 14 strikeouts on Friday, Feb. 20, was the fourth time this season that the staff has reached double figures in strikeouts.

- The three-game sweep of the Crimson was the first for the program since beating Rice in all three games of that series last season (4/4-5/25).

- The three-game sweep in non-conference action was the first for the team since the opening series of last season against Omaha (2/14-16/25).

- The 11 runs in back-to-back games was the first time

that Tulane has scored in double digits in consecutive games since putting up 10 runs against Loyola Marymount last season (2/22/25) followed up by 13 runs against Nicholls (2/25/25).

- The team's three straight victories is the longest streak of wins since last May (5/20-24/25) when Tulane won the squad's first three games in the American Conference Tournament.

Notables From UCLA Game - 2/17

- Tulane's game against No. 2 ranked (Coaches)/No. 1 (D1 Baseball) UCLA was the first time that the program has faced a ranked opponent since squaring off with No. 13 Southern Miss last season. The previous last time that Tulane faced a top 10 ranked opponent was against then No. 6 Oregon State in the Corvallis Regional (5/31/24). The last time Tulane defeated a top 10 opponent was earlier that season when the program swept then No. 6 ECU at home by scores of 6-5, 7-3 and 10-9 (5/10-12/24).

Notables from the LMU Series - 2/13-15

- Tulane hit .275 as a team in the three-game set with 30 hits including 15 extra base hits.

- The team's pitching staff recorded 44 strikeouts in 26 innings worked.

- The team's three starting pitchers in the series: Trey Cehajic, Beau Sampson, and Jack Frankel combined to throw 11.2 innings with 19 strikeouts.

- Both of the team's victories were earned by members of the bullpen in J.D. Rodriguez and Jack Brafa.

- Jude Abbadessa appeared in two of the first three games of the series with both of his appearances coming in the ninth inning. He threw 1.2 scoreless with two strikeouts.

- The Green Wave bullpen only allowed a total of two earned run in 14.1 innings of use in the opening series while also registering 25 strikeouts.

- The Tulane pitching staff registered double digit strikeouts in every game of the series (14 - Gm 1, 11 - Gm 2 and 19 in Gm 3).

- The Green Wave's 19 strikeouts as a pitching staff in the series finale against LMU was the most for the program in 54 years and tied for third all-time at the



school with the 2023 team's 19 strikeouts against Penn. The team last struck out more than 19 when 21 strikeouts were recorded against Cornell of Iowa in 1972. The 1965 team struck out 20 against Ole Miss.

- Of the team's top pitching strikeout totals in school history, six have been achieved since the start of the 2023 season (19 at LMU - 2/15/26, 19 vs. Pennsylvania - 3/10/23, 17 vs. Rice - 4/5/25, 16 at Southeastern Louisiana - 2/19/25, 16 at Southeastern Louisiana - 3/12/25, and 16 vs. Northwestern - 2/16/24)

Green Wave Chosen For Fourth and Has Two Named Preseason All-Conference

- In a vote of the league's coaches, Tulane was picked for fourth and had two players selected as American Preseason All-Conference.

- The Green Wave were chosen for fourth overall with 57 points.

- The team also saw outfielder Jason Wachs and designated hitter Matthias Haas chosen as Preseason American All-Conference.

The 2026 Schedule

- The Green Wave hosts 27 games at Greer Field on Turchin Stadium, along with one neutral-site game in Mississippi and 28 road contests in 2026.

- Tulane will compete across seven states, including matchups in California, Alabama, Texas, Mississippi, Kansas, Florida, and North Carolina.

- Notable opponents include seven teams that participated in the 2025 NCAA Tournament: Southern Miss (2 games), UTSA (3), Creighton (3), East Carolina (3), TCU (3), Mississippi State (1), UCLA (1), and LSU (1).

The 2026 Schedule - Part Two

- Tulane is playing games against five teams this season that are ranked in the USA Today's Preseason Coaches Poll in No. 1 LSU, No. 2 UCLA, No. 6 Mississippi State, No. 10 TCU, and No. 20 Southern Miss.

Uncommon Road Start

- Tulane's start on the road this season was the first for the program since 2023 and only the 11th time since 1979 that the program has not started the season with games in New Orleans (1979, 1980, 1982, 1993, 2002, 2006, 2013, 2015, 2023, and 2026)

2025 Trends

- The Green Wave went 20-11 last season in non-

conference.

- The program accumulated a 7-2 mark in the month of February.

- Tulane was a combined 13-5 in one or two-run games.

- The Green Wave had a 29-16 record against right-handed starting pitching.

- Jason Wachs batted in every spot in the lineup last season except seventh.

JAY UHLMAN

HEAD COACH | 100-104 Fourth Season | Nevada, 1997

Jay Uhlman was named the 25th head coach of the Tulane Baseball Program on June 7, 2022. He was named to the post after three seasons where he filled the jobs of assistant coach, recruiting coordinator, and interim head coach.

A veteran with more than 27 years of experience in four different conferences including the PAC12, BIG12, AAC, and the WAC, the Redondo Beach, California native was promoted after he led the Green Wave to the AAC Tournament Semifinals to close the 2022 campaign.

Looking to continue the momentum from the 2023 season, the 2024 version of the Green Wave posted the second-best turnaround in NCAA Division 1 Baseball by winning 16 more games than the previous season which was only surpassed by Florida State who improved by 17 games.

Tulane made history by winning its second-straight American Athletic Conference Tournament Championship, a feat that had not been accomplished by any other program in the conference. Tulane's run through Clearwater also extended its tournament win streak to 6 games, an AAC record, and ensured the program its second-straight trip to the NCAA Regionals.

It was the first time since 1998-99 that Tulane had captured back-to-back conference championships and the first time since 2015-16 that the Wave has appeared in back-to-back Regionals. When Tulane defeated Nicholls 3-0 in the Corvallis Regional, it marked the programs first NCAA postseason victory since 2016.

During the regular season when Tulane swept #6 ECU at home it represented the highest ranked team the Wave had swept since 1991 and its first sweep against ECU since 2005. In addition to winning the Pelican Cup against longtime inter-city rival UNO, the Wave also won a series against Rice for the first time in school history.

The 2025 season was another banner year for the program as Tulane advanced all the way to the American Conference Championship game for the third straight season. A feat that had never been accomplished in the history of the league. The program totaled five All-Conference selections in Michael Lombardi (relief pitcher - 1st Team), Connor Rasmussen (second base - 1st Team), Gavin Schulz (designated hitter - 2nd Team), Jason Wachs (All-Freshman), and Tanner Chun (All-Freshman). The team also picked up three American All-Tournament selections in conclusion of the event in Gavin Schulz, Tayler Montiel, and Theo Bryant IV. For the fourth straight season under Uhlman's watch the team had players selected in the Major League Draft in Michael Lombardi (Kansas City Royals - second round), Tayler Montiel (Arizona Diamondbacks - 12th round), and Connor Rasmussen (Kansas City Royals - 15th round). It marked the 14th straight year that a Tulane player has been selected in the MLB Draft.

Individually, five players earned All-Conference honors in 2024 to go along with six named to the All-AAC Championship team, including tournament MVP Jackson Linn, who hit .545 with nine RBIs and four homers, including the walk-off, tournament-clinching blast against Wichita State. In the NCAA Regional both Colin Tuft and Luc Fladda were named to the All-Regional team for their efforts.

In 2023, Uhlman rallied his troops with a dynamic run from the bracket's seven seed in the American Athletic Conference Tournament, culminating with the program's first AAC tourney title (ninth overall) and 16th overall conference championship. The Olive and Blue became the lowest seed to ever win the AAC Tournament. The following weekend, Tulane took part in its 22nd NCAA Regional, this one coming in Baton Rouge. At season's end, the Green Wave saw pitcher Dylan Carmouche selected in the 15th Round by the San Francisco Giants and received the ABCA Academic Excellence Award. Tulane was one of just 11 teams in Division I to receive the honor for seven consecutive years.

He is responsible for the 2020-2021 class ranked 25th by Perfect Game, the highest-ranked class at Tulane since 2003, 36th by Collegiate Baseball.

Uhlman has spent time coaching in the junior college ranks while also having stints in the Western Athletic Conference, Pac 12, Big 12 conferences before settling into the AAC. During his career, Uhlman has coached and recruited 122 all-conference honorees, 29 All-Americans, eight conference players of the year, 29 big leaguers and 13 USA Collegiate National Team alumni.

Uhlman made the move to the Big Easy in July of 2019. In his first season on the Green Wave staff, Uhlman helped guide Tulane to a 15-2 mark during the 2020 campaign - Tulane's best start to a season since 1972. Tulane's 15 wins at the end of the shortened season were tied for the most in the American Athletic Conference. In addition, Tulane had five players with a batting average of .300-or-better.

Uhlman arrived at Tulane after spending the previous nine seasons as a member of the University of Oregon staff where he was the associate head coach for the last three seasons. During his time in Eugene, the Ducks accumulated 328 wins, with 136 coming over Pac 12 opponents, to post a .606 overall winning percentage.

During his tenure with the Ducks, Uhlman was a part of a program that won 60 percent of their games, including a three-year stretch with 40-plus victories from 2012-14. In 2013, Oregon won a program-record 48 games and finished second in the league with a 22-8 record, as the Ducks qualified for the NCAA Tournament for four consecutive years, twice being selected as an overall national seed and hosting an NCAA Super Regional in 2012.

In six of his nine seasons with Oregon, Uhlman's classes were consistently ranked in the top 40 by Perfect Game, including bringing in a host of players that went on to earn 16 All-America and 39 All-Pac 12 honors. During that time Oregon had a player named as a finalist for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year three times, two semifinalists for the Dick Howser Trophy, and three semifinalists for the Golden Spikes Award.

Fifty-seven (57) of Uhlman's Oregon players went on to play professionally, with two being first-round picks in the MLB Draft. Fifteen (15) of those have gone on to play in the majors.

For one season in 2011, Uhlman served as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Kansas, helping pull in a class that Perfect Game ranked 32nd nationally. He served as the Jayhawks' hitting coach and worked on the offense, as four players earned All-Big 12 honors and six were Big 12 All-Academic picks and six were drafted one went on to reach the big leagues.

Uhlman began his tenure at Oregon in the summer of 2009, when he served as the Ducks' volunteer assistant coach, working with the hitters and organizing on-campus recruiting efforts. In the program's second year as a varsity sport after being dormant for 28 years, Oregon tied the NCAA record for turnaround wins in a season, going from 14 in that first year back in 2009, to 40 in 2010. Oregon also went from winning four games in conference to 13, qualifying for the NCAA Storrs Regional.

In 2001, Uhlman returned to Nevada, his alma mater, as an assistant. He served as the hitting and infield coach while assisting with recruiting efforts. Nevada qualified for the WAC Tournament for four straight years, from 2006-2009, finishing second in the league three times.

Forty-two (42) Wolf Pack players were All-WAC selections, five were tabbed All-Americans, with three players earning WAC Freshman of the Year to go along with two others earning WAC Player of the Year. During his stint, 41 players went on to play professionally, with 13 receiving the call from a major league club.

Uhlman finished his degree from Nevada in 1998 while serving as a graduate assistant for the Wolf Pack. He then moved on to be an assistant coach at L.A. Harbor Junior College. In 1999 he became the head coach for two seasons at LAHC, eventually finishing with an overall record of 61-22-2 and 35-15 in the South Coast Conference.

In 2001 Uhlman's Seahawks went 33-6-1 on the season and 20-4 in the SCC to claim the league and regional championship, as he was named the conference's coach of the year. 24 total players were named All-SCC, including having the conference pitcher of the year among six All-California Community College Athletic Association picks and two All-Americans.

An All-CIF performer at Redondo Union High School, Uhlman culminated his prep career by being drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays. Uhlman moved on to LAHC where he was a two-time all-conference and All-Southern California shortstop.

He then finished his collegiate career playing at Nevada in 1995 and 1997. Uhlman was an honorable mention All-Big West Conference selection as a shortstop in 1997. The Wolf Pack led the NCAA in double plays and double plays per game during Uhlman's senior season advancing to the Lubbock Regional before the NCAA tournament expanded to 64 teams.


