LSU SERIES HISTORY VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE

• Mississippi State leads the overall series with LSU, 212-199-1; however, LSU has won 14 of the last 18 SEC regular season series with the Bulldogs, including a three-game sweep in Baton Rouge last season (March 27-29) ... prior to last season, Mississippi State had captured two series in a row over the Tigers – the Bulldogs won two of three games over the Tigers on May 11-13, 2023, in Baton Rouge, and MSU won two of three over LSU on March 15-17, 2024, in Starkville, Miss. ... LSU posted nine straight series wins over MSU from 2007-15, and the Tigers have won five of the last nine series meetings from 2016-25 (no series in 2020).

ABOUT THE TIGERS

• LSU has won **eight national championships** (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000, 2009, 2023, 2025), the second-most in NCAA history ... LSU has the **highest all-time NCAA Tournament** winning percentage (.714, 187-75) ... the Tigers have made 20 College World Series appearances, all since 1986.

• The 2026 LSU pitching staff is **No. 1 in the nation** in strikeouts per nine innings (12.6) and in total strikeouts (508) ... LSU has finished No. 1 in the nation in strikeouts in each of the past two seasons with 733 in 2024 and 760 in 2025.

• Junior shortstop **Steven Milam** has a current reached-base safely streak that has stretched to 19 games, and he is also riding an eight-game hitting streak ... Milam batted .385 (5-for-13) last weekend in the Texas A&M series with one double, two homers, two RBI and three runs scored ... he is batting .387 (12-for-31) in LSU's last eight games with four doubles, two homers, five RBI and five runs scored ... Milam has committed just one error all season in 148 chances, producing a .993 fielding percentage.

• Sophomore right-hander **Deven Sheerin** recorded the longest outing of his LSU career last Sunday versus Texas A&M, working 4.1 innings and limiting the Aggies to one run on three hits with no walks and nine strikeouts ... he threw 61 pitches in the outing, 47 for strikes, a strikes rate of 77 percent ... for the entire week in his two appearances versus Northwestern State and Texas A&M, Sheerin pitched 6.0 innings, allowing just one run on three hits with no walks, 13 strikeouts and a .143 opponent batting average ... Sheerin is 3-0 this season with a team-best 2.84 ERA and three saves ... he has recorded 12 walks and 45 strikeouts in 25.1 innings, and he is limiting opponents to a .157 batting average.

• Sophomore centerfielder **Derek Curiel** leads LSU in batting average at .349, and he has produced eight doubles, two triples, five homers, 39 RBI and 44 runs scored ... Curiel is No. 3 in the SEC in base hits (58), No. 5 in the league in triples (2) and No. 9 in runs scored (44).

• The LSU bullpen recorded a 3.21 ERA in 14.0 innings versus Texas A&M last weekend, holding the Aggies to five runs on 11 hits with eight walks and 25 strikeouts ... the LSU relievers limited Texas A&M to a .204 cumulative batting average in their outings.

- Freshman right-hander **Marcos Paz** delivered an impressive relief effort on Saturday versus Texas A&M, firing 2.0 shutout innings while allowing just one hit with one walk and three strikeouts ... sophomore left-hander **Danny Lachenmayer** made two appearances in the Texas A&M series, firing 1.1 scoreless innings with one hit, no walks and three strikeouts ... Lachenmayer on Tuesday night versus New Orleans recorded a season-high five strikeouts in 1.2 innings with no runs, no hits and one walk.

- Catcher/DH **Cade Arrambide** was named SEC Co-Player of the Week on April 6 after he batted .600 (6-for-10) in three games with four homers, eight RBI, six runs, three walks and a .692 on-base percentage ... he led LSU to a series victory at Tennessee (April 3-5), establishing the school single-game home runs record by smashing four homers on April 5 in the Tigers' series-clinching 16-6 win over the Vols ... Arrambide became just the fourth player in SEC history to hit four homers in a game ... he was 5-for-6 on the day with seven RBI, three solo homers and a grand slam that highlighted LSU's 10-run outburst in the top of the 12th inning.

- LSU hit seven home runs in its April 5 win over Tennessee, marking the first time the Tigers hit seven dingers in a game since March 7, 2009, when they homered seven times against Illinois in Baton Rouge ... Sunday's home run output included three solo shots and a grand slam by catcher/DH **Cade Arrambide**, solo homers by third baseman **John Pearson** and by second baseman **Seth Dardar**, and a two-run blast by shortstop **Steven Milam**.

- LSU recovered from deficits of three runs or more – including a seven-run deficit and two five-run deficits – to win four of five games during a stretch from March 29-April 5 ... the Tigers trailed Kentucky, 7-0, entering the bottom of the third inning on March 29 before rallying for a 17-10 victory over the Wildcats ... the comeback win over UK marked LSU's largest since May 24, 2024, when the Tigers overcame an 8-0 deficit in an SEC Tournament game against South Carolina to record a 12-11 victory ... LSU trailed Southern, 6-1, entering the bottom of the third inning on March 31 and rallied for a 16-6 victory ... the Tigers trailed Tennessee, 4-1, on April 3 entering the top of the eighth inning and erupted for five runs in the eventual 7-5 win ... LSU trailed Tennessee, 5-0, on April 5 entering the top of the fifth inning, fought back to send the game into extra innings, and secured a 16-6 victory by scoring 10 runs in the top of the 12th inning.

- LSU's 10 runs in the top of the 12th inning on April 5 at Tennessee are the most in an extra-inning frame in LSU Baseball history ... the previous high was seven runs in an extra-inning frame, which LSU had accomplished twice – on May 6, 1994, at Auburn (top of 10th inning), and on May 25, 1997, versus Long Beach State (top of 11th inning, LSU was the visiting team in an NCAA Regional in the original Alex Box Stadium).

- Second baseman **Seth Dardar** was named SEC Co-Player of the Week on March 30 after he led LSU to an SEC series victory over No. 19 Kentucky, batting .600 (6-for-10) with four doubles, one homer, five RBI, four runs, three walks and a .692 on-base percentage ... Dardar's three-run homer

in the sixth inning of Game 3 versus Kentucky erased a 10-8 deficit and gave LSU a lead it would not relinquish as the Tigers clinched the series win ... Dardar also contributed an RBI double in the Game 3 series-deciding victory ... Dardar in Game 1 versus Kentucky tied the LSU single-game record for doubles with three, and he added one RBI in the contest ... he walked three times and scored twice in the Tigers' Game 2 win over the Wildcats.

- LSU's 8-0 start to the 2026 season marked the best eight-game start for coach Jay Johnson in his five-season LSU tenure ... the 8-0 start was LSU's best through eight games since the 2019 team also began its season 8-0.

- LSU claimed the Live Like Lou Jax College Classic title February 20-22 with three straight wins in Jacksonville, Fla., over Indiana, Notre Dame and UCF ... the Tigers hit .388 (40-for-103) as a team in the tournament with seven doubles, one triple and three home runs ... LSU outscored its opponents, 34-11, in the three contests in Jacksonville.

- **Jay Johnson** is the fastest coach to win multiple CWS championships during his tenure at a single school. The previous mark was set by Jim Morris, who claimed NCAA trophies in 1999 and 2001 within his first eight seasons at Miami (Fla.). Johnson has developed 32 Major Leaguers during his collegiate coaching career, including four MLB players in five seasons at LSU.

- LSU junior outfielder **Jake Brown** has been named by USA Baseball to the 2026 Golden Spikes Award Midseason Watch List. The announcement of the watch list continues the process of identifying the best amateur baseball player in the country for the 2026 season. Brown, a product of Sulphur, La., tied the LSU single-game record with three homers on March 6 vs. Sacramento State, as he was 4-for-5 at the plate with three homers, a single, six RBI and four runs.

- LSU sophomore catcher **Cade Arrambide** has been named to the Buster Posey Award Midseason Watch List. The award is presented each season by the Wichita (Kan.) Sports Commission to the nation's outstanding collegiate catcher. Arrambide was named SEC Co-Player of the Week on April 6 after leading LSU to a series win at Tennessee and setting the school single-game record with four homers in Game 3 against the Vols.

- LSU junior shortstop **Steven Milam** has been named as one of 50 semifinalists for the 2026 Brooks Wallace Award. The award is presented annually by the College Baseball Foundation to the nation's best collegiate shortstop. Milam, a product of Las Cruces, N.M., was named to the 2025 College World Series All-Tournament Team and he hit .385 (15-for-39) in LSU's 11 NCAA Tournament games last season with five doubles, one homer, a team-high 13 RBI and 13 runs scored. Milam committed only five errors at shortstop over the entire 2025 season, posting a .979 fielding percentage in 234 chances

LSU BASEBALL HEAD COACH

A phenomenal record of postseason success, explosive lineups, elite pitching development and highly-ranked recruiting classes make LSU's Jay Johnson the best college baseball coach in the nation. He has made a significant impact at every program he's led, and he is one of the most energetic, innovative and focused coaches in America.

At the helm of one of the nation's most storied college baseball programs for the past four seasons, Johnson has enhanced LSU's elite legacy by guiding the Tigers to the 2023 and 2025 College World Series titles, marking the seventh and eighth National Championships in school history.

Entering the 2026 season, Johnson has a 507-249 (.671) record in 13 seasons as a college head coach, including a 190-77 (.712) mark in four seasons at LSU. He has a 43-16 record in NCAA Tournament games, including a 26-7 mark with the Tigers.

He has developed 32 Major Leaguers during his collegiate coaching career, including right-hander Paul Skenes of the Pittsburgh Pirates, a two-time MLB All-Star Game starting pitcher and the 2024 National

League Rookie of the Year, and outfielder Dylan Crews of the Washington Nationals, who made his MLB debut in August 2024.

Johnson is the fastest coach to win multiple CWS championships during his tenure at a single school. The previous mark was set by Jim Morris, who claimed NCAA trophies in 1999 and 2001 within his first eight seasons at Miami (Fla.).

The 2025 Tigers posted a 53-15 overall record and finished the year on an eight-game win streak, culminated by a two-game series sweep of Coastal Carolina June 21-22 in the College World Series Finals.

The LSU pitching staff, featuring All-America hurlers Kade Anderson and Anthony Eyanson, finished No. 1 in the nation in total strikeouts (760), No. 4 in strikeouts per nine innings (11.7), No. 6 in hits allowed per nine innings (7.27), No. 7 in team ERA (3.73) and No. 12 in strikeout to walk ratio (2.83).

Anderson led the nation with 180 total strikeouts, and Eyanson finished No. 3 in the nation with 152 total Ks. Right-hander Casan Evans also received All-America recognition, posting five wins, seven saves and a 2.05 ERA

The LSU hitters, led by All-Americans Jared Jones and Derek Curiel, completed the season No. 6 in the nation in runs scored (536), No. 7 in bases on balls (360), No. 8 in hits (671) and No. 9 in doubles (136).

Jones, LSU's first baseman, finished eighth in the nation with 22 home runs, and he increased his career total to 64 homers, the third-highest mark in LSU history. Curiel, the Tigers' leftfielder, batted a team-high .345 and was named 2025 National Freshman of the Year by D1 Baseball.

The 2025 Tigers also played defense at a remarkable level, establishing a school record for fielding percentage at .981.

In just his second season at LSU, Johnson directed the Tigers to the 2023 National Championship as their drive to the title was culminated with an 18-4 win over Florida in Game 3 of the College World Series Finals.

He was voted 2023 National Coach of the Year by D1 Baseball, the American Baseball Coaches Association and by Collegiate Baseball newspaper.

LSU was the nation's consensus No. 1 team for the first 12 weeks of the 2023 regular season, and the Tigers finished the year at the pinnacle of college baseball.

LSU was No. 1 in the nation in runs scored (634) and in shutouts by its pitching staff (12). The Tigers finished No. 2 in the nation in homers (144), walks received (413), hit-by-pitches (143), on-base percentage (.432) and strikeouts pitched per nine innings (11.7).

LSU completed the year No. 5 in the nation in slugging percentage (.554); No. 6 in hits allowed per nine innings (7.67) and No. 8 in scoring (8.9 runs per game).

The pitching staff recorded a school-record 798 strikeouts, eclipsing the previous mark of 682 set in 1997.

The 2023 Tigers featured three First-Team All-Americans – centerfielder Dylan Crews, the Golden Spikes Award winner; right-handed pitcher Paul Skenes, the Dick Howser Trophy recipient; and third baseman Tommy White, the nation's leader in RBI (105).

An SEC-record 13 LSU players were chosen in the 2023 MLB Draft, including five in the first three rounds. Skenes and Crews made MLB history by becoming the first players from the same school to be drafted Nos. 1 and 2 overall.

Johnson was named the head coach at LSU on June 25, 2021, after guiding Arizona to the Pac-12 championship and a berth in the College World Series. Johnson led Arizona to two College World Series appearances – including a Championship Series berth in 2016 – over five

full seasons, regularly producing the nation's most potent lineups and signing top players from across the country.

Johnson worked as the head coach at Nevada for two seasons (2014-15), and he was the associate head coach at San Diego from 2006-13.

Johnson's coaching career began at his alma mater, Point Loma Nazarene, where he served as an assistant coach from 2002 to 2004 before accepting the head coaching position in 2005. He finished his playing career at Point Loma in 2001, hitting .326 as a senior and earning a Gold Glove as the team's second baseman.

A native of Oroville, Calif., Johnson is the 26th head coach in LSU baseball history. Johnson and his wife Maureen, a former University of Arizona soccer player, were married in 2016.
