» QUICK HITTERS

- Auburn enters the week as the only SEC team with five straight series wins.
- The Tigers haven't won six straight SEC series since doing so to end 2010 and begin 2011.
- Mississippi State represents Auburn's fourth of five straight top-10 opponents to end SEC play.
- The Tigers are 12-11 against ranked team this season, tied for the second most ranked wins in the league, and are 6-6 against ranked teams away from home.
- After homering 29 times in the first 34 games, the team has homered 31 times in the last 13 games, good for the second most in the league during the span (Tennessee, 35).
- The Tigers are 31-1 when outhitting the opponent this season and 135-17 in the last five years.
- The team is also 24-2 when scoring six or more runs this season and 146-29 in the last five years.
- Auburn's pitching staff is the national leader in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.99), WHIP (1.13) and walks allowed per 9.0 innings (2.68) while ranking second in ERA (3.33).
- The Tigers have allowed more than five runs just once in the last 15 games (11-4).
- Auburn is looking for its first series win in Starkville since 2017.

Butch Thompson enters his 11th season at the helm of the program in 2025, posting a record of 324-233-1 in his first 10 seasons. He has led the program to two College World Series appearances and four regional championships.

Butch Thompson was named Auburn's head baseball coach on October 22, 2015 and enters his 11th season at the helm of the program in 2026.

Recently hitting his 10-year mark with the program, Thompson is not only the third longest-tenured coach in program history, but also the third winningest with 324 wins.

After guiding the Tigers to a record-setting season in 2025 that saw multiple single-game and series attendance records as well as the fourth straight single-season attendance record and culminated with the first home Super Regional in program history, Thompson signed a contract extension that will keep him with the program through at least 2031.

A native of Amory, Miss., Thompson has coached 34 Division I All-Americans and 54 all-conference performers. He has seen 25 of his former pitchers called up to Major League Baseball, including 19 since 2014. Thompson has also turned 47 pitchers who went undrafted out of high school into MLB draft picks.

Along with his pitching pedigree, Thompson is also considered one of the top recruiters in the country. Since 2003, he has secured 18 recruiting classes that were ranked in the top 10 by either Baseball America or Perfect Game, including three straight top-10 classes from 2024-26 and four classes ranked in the top five on National Signing Day.

In 33 years of coaching at the collegiate level, including 24 in the Southeastern Conference, Thompson has coached nine College World Series participants, including leading the Tigers to the program's first trip to the College World Series in 22 years in 2019 and taking the team back for the second time in three postseasons in 2022. Thompson has also coached one national champion and a national runner-up, won nine conference championships and made 20 postseason appearances.

Following the previously mentioned 2025 season, Thompson was named the American Baseball Coaches Association Southeast Region Coach of the Year, joining Hal Baird (1994) as the only other coach in program history to earn the distinction. He has also been named the 2006 Fellowship of Christian Athletes SEC Coach of the Year while at Auburn and the 2014 Baseball America and ABCA National Assistant Coach of the Year while at Mississippi State.

Highlighting Thompson's 10 seasons at Auburn, he has led the Tigers to six NCAA Tournament appearances in the last eight postseasons, including the pair of College World Series appearances, and has taken the program to four of the five Super Regionals in program history (2018, 2019, 2022, 2025). His four regional championships are the most by a head coach in program history. Along with all of the postseason success, Thompson's teams have finished seven of the last nine seasons ranked in the top 25, including top-10 marks on four occasions.

After going 12-3 in league play at Plainsman Park in 2025 and finishing the regular season as one of four SEC teams to win seven or more conference series, the Tigers matched a program record by earning the No. 4 national seed for the NCAA Tournament, marking the third time in the last four seasons the program had been selected as a regional host. Auburn is one of seven programs in the country, including three from the SEC, to host at least three times in the last four years.

Including the team's 17-13 SEC record a year ago, which matched the 2023 team for the most SEC wins since 2010 (20), Thompson has guided Auburn to 15 or more league wins in five of the last eight seasons, including three of the last four.

Along with all of the on-field success, Thompson also played a pivotal role in the



planning, approval and completion of the newly-renovated Plainsman Park, a \$30 million project that was completed prior to the 2025 season. In its first season in the renovated and expanded ballpark that now features three premium club options and a standing room area on top of the War Eagle Wall in left field, Auburn welcomed more than 200,000 fans through the gates, ranking top 10 in the country both total attendance (201,703) and average attendance (5,603).

Thompson, who spent three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Auburn from 2006-08, returned to the Plains after seven seasons at Mississippi State as both associate head coach and pitching coach. In seven seasons at MSU, Thompson made four regionals, two super regionals, won the SEC Tournament and advanced to the College World Series, finishing as NCAA runner-up in 2013. In addition to his experience at Auburn and Mississippi State, Thompson also spent five seasons at Georgia from 2002-05, including a trip to the College World Series in 2004.

Thompson launched his coaching career as pitching coach and top assistant at Huntingdon College (Ala.) in 1993, before returning to his alma mater in Birmingham, where he helped lead the Panthers to back-to-back Southern States Conference championships and in 1995 coached BSC to its first NAIA World Series berth.

Thompson left BSC briefly to serve as head coach at Jefferson State Community College in Birmingham in 1997, where he was honored as the Regional Tournament Coach of the Year, the ABCA Alabama Junior College Coach of the Year and the Southeast Region Coach of the Year after guiding JSCC to a 39-21 mark, the AJCAA Region 22 State Championship and a third-place finish in the NJCAA Division II World Series.

He returned to Birmingham-Southern as top assistant the following season, beginning a four-year run during the most successful span in BSC baseball history, making three straight appearances in the NAIA World Series while winning the NAIA National Championship in 2001.

Thompson prepped at Amory (Miss.) High School and later starred as a pitcher at Itawamba (Miss.) Community College from 1989-90. On Oct. 25, 2014, Thompson was inducted into the ICC Athletic Hall of Fame. He was later inducted into the Mississippi Association of Community Colleges Conference (MACCC) Hall of Fame as a member of the class of 2021.

Thompson earned a bachelor's degree in history at BSC in 1992 and completed a master's degree in sports administration at UAB in 1996. He is married to the former Robin Ashe of Birmingham, Ala., and they are the parents of three daughters - Anna, Olivia and Madelyn Gail - and grandparents of Mary Gail and Hayes Grady Moreman.

SAMFORD STADIUM-HITCHCOCK FIELD AT PLAINMAN PARK

Auburn baseball's home for the past 76 seasons, an expanded and renovated Samford Stadium-Hitchcock Field at Plainsman Park shattered the single-season attendance record (201,703) in its debut season in 2025 and is back for an encore in 2026.

After undergoing a \$30+ million project, the ballpark now features premium club areas including the Broadway Club at Plainsman Park located at the top of the stadium behind home plate and the 984 Club located down the first base line to go along with the pre-existing Hall of Fame Club located at field level behind home plate, which opened prior to the 2024 season.

Along with the premium club areas, Plainsman Park now features multiple expanded general admission areas. The YETI Yard now includes three tiers of paved terrace space with the bottom tier featuring nine boxes equipped with soft seating and drink rail viewing areas, Traeger pellet grills, refrigerators and more. Additional general admission areas include the two-tiered standing room space atop the War Eagle Wall in left field and the expanded Plainsman Patio at concourse level down the first base line.

The new and improved ballpark, which continues to feature the timeless elements inspired by Camden Yards, Wrigley Field and Fenway Park that were included in the initial renovation spearheaded by former head coach Hal Baird nearly 30 years ago, has a capacity of 7,189. The design continues to combine the look of old-time ballparks with academic buildings on the Auburn campus to create a facade of brick and painted steel.

Kickstarted by the completion of the Josh Donaldson Hitting Facility prior to the 2021 season, Auburn baseball's player development areas also continue to take a step forward. Along with the hitting facility, the program has a new state-of-the-art locker room, bullpen and pitching lab, weight room and nutrition center, and coaches offices and team meeting space located on the second floor of the old Plainsman Park Rehab Center adjacent to the ballpark.

Plainsman Park, which has hosted seven NCAA Regionals (1978, 1999, 2003, 2010, 2022, 2023, 2025), including three in the last four seasons, and also had the privilege of hosting President George W. Bush on Oct. 24, 2002, has twice been named one of the best facilities in college baseball. Baseball America initially voted it the best facility in the country prior to the 2003 season, and D1 Baseball named it one of the top venues in the nation in 2016.

SCOUTING THE BULLDOGS

- Mississippi State enters the weekend with a 37-12 overall record and is tied with Auburn for fourth in the league with a 14-10 mark in SEC play.
- Offensively, the Bulldogs are hitting .310 as a team, good for the second best mark in the league, and leads the league with 113 doubles. The team average dips to .264 in SEC play but they rank top three in hits (224), doubles (45) and home runs (44). Ace Reese leads the team with 19 doubles, 17 home runs and 60 RBI, good for fourth in the SEC.
- On the mound, Mississippi State has turned in a 3.85 staff ERA with 549 strikeouts, second in the league, and 171 walks in 423.0 innings pitched. Game one starter Tomas Valincius ranks top five in the league in wins (7), ERA (2.37), innings pitched (68.1) and strikeouts (92).

- The 13-run margin of victory was the largest in conference play this season and the largest in a SEC road game since defeating Alabama 20-5 in game two of a doubleheader on Apr. 21, 2018.
- The series marked the first time Auburn won the first two games against a top-10 team on the road since doing so at No. 2 South Carolina Apr. 28-29, 2023.

- The duo started the week with two-run homers to spark Auburn's nine-run first inning vs. Samford and finished by going 13-for-24 with five homers and 13 RBI vs. Oklahoma.

BLASTING HIS WAY INTO THE 'BOOKS

- Bingaman homered three times in the finale against Oklahoma, becoming the first Auburn freshman in registered history to do so.
- His home run hat trick was just the fifth in a SEC game in program history, including the first since 2011, and the 10th all-time in program history, including just the third time since 1996.
- Bingaman's seven RBI in the rubber game were:
 - The most by an AU player since 2023
 - The most by an AU freshman since 2018
 - The most by an AU player in a SEC game since 2011
 - The most by an AU freshman in a SEC game since 1998
- He leads SEC freshman and ranks T-4th in the league with 24 RBI in 23 league games.
- In the last four series, Bingaman is hitting .395 (17-for-43) with 5 HR and 15 RBI.

GUEVARA HAS FOUND ANOTHER GEAR

- Guevara ranks fourth in the SEC with a .362 overall average and is sixth with a .363 mark in league play.
- He went on a 17-game hitting streak from Mar. 27-Apr. 24, the longest by an Auburn player since 2023.
- Coming off his 2-for-5 game with a HR and 3 RBI at UAB Tuesday, Guevara leads the team with 20 multi-hit games and 13 multi-RBI games. He has six games of three or more hits and three or more RBI.
- In the last 23 games, Guevara is hitting .404 (38-for-94) with 22 R, 6 2B, 7 HR, 23 RBI.
- In the last five SEC series he is hitting .413 (26-for-63) with 15 R, 4 2B, 3 HR, 10 RBI.
- After a couple of injury-plagued seasons he leads the team in AVG, H (64) and RBI (42) and ranks second in 2B (10), HR (11) and TB (107).

STRONG STARTS

- Through 47 games, Auburn starting pitchers are 23-10 with a 3.00 ERA and 293 strikeouts compared to 57 walks in 243.0 innings.
- In weekend series, starting pitchers are 17-7 with a 3.08 ERA and 240 strikeouts to go along with 43 walks in 198.2 innings pitched.
- Starting pitchers have turned in at least 5.0 innings in 33 of 47 games this season, including 28 of 36 on the weekend, with one of the occasions it didn't coming because of the rain delay in game three vs. Winthrop.

WINNING THE FREEBIE WAR

- Auburn walked just four batters in back-to-back series against Arkansas and Kentucky, marking the third series this season the team walked four or fewer (Winthrop, two).
- The pitching staff has walked six batters or fewer in seven of 12 series with two of the five it didn't do so being series losses.

RACKING UP Ks AT A RECORD RATE

- Auburn's pitching staff started the season by striking out 43 batters in three games vs. Youngstown State and hasn't slowed down since, marking the most strikeouts in a three-game series since at least 1992 and tied for the most in any three-game span since 1997.
- Through 47 games, the Tigers have registered 475 strikeouts while walking just 119.
- The totals are good for the second-most strikeouts and fewest walks allowed through 47 games in the stat crew era (1993-present).
- The 475 strikeouts are one fewer than the 476 through 47 games in 1997 and the 119 walks allowed are three fewer than the 122 through 47 games in 2002.

'DRE HAS BEEN DEALING

- Dating back to his last four appearances of 2025, Andreas Alvarez is 10-2 with a 2.02 ERA (17 earned runs) with 91 strikeouts and 23 walks in 75.2 innings pitched.
- He turned in his first complete game and struck out a career-high 11 batters in the series-opening run rule win at Texas A&M.
- The game marked his third double digit strikeout performance of the season and was the most by an Auburn pitcher in a SEC game since Casey Mize struck out 15 vs. Vanderbilt on May 4, 2018.

- Four of his seven SEC starts have been quality outings, including three of his first four being 7.0 innings with one run or less allowed.

- His 12 strikeouts opening weekend were the most by an Auburn pitcher since Tanner Burns matched the single-game record with 15 Ks vs. Cincinnati on Mar. 1, 2019.

PETRO'S POURING IT IN THERE

- Alex Petrovic was named the SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week after turning in a complete game shutout in the series finale vs. Kentucky.
- He has followed up his complete game with two more quality starts in rubber games at Florida and vs. Oklahoma.

- Petrovic's 7.2 innings were the most by an Auburn starting pitcher since Tommy Vail turned in 8.0 innings at Ole Miss in 2023.

SANDERS IS SHOWING

- Jackson Sanders was named the SEC Co-Pitcher of the Week after turning a career-best outing of 7.0 scoreless innings with 10 strikeouts in the series-clinching win vs. Winthrop (Mar. 7).
- He turned in his second straight 7.0-inning start in his first career SEC start at Missouri, striking out eight while walking one.
- Pitching in relief for the first time this season vs. Arkansas on Apr. 4, Sanders earned his first career save while turning in eight strikeouts in 4.0 scoreless innings.
- In four relief outings, Sanders has turned in a 1.32 ERA with 20 K in 13.2 IP and a .163 opponents average against.
- He has factored into the decision in all four appearances with one win and three saves, tied for the team high.

- He entered the series at Florida with back-to-back three-hit games after going 3-for-3 with three RBI in the series finale vs. Kentucky and 3-for-4 with a double, triple and two RBI vs. Alabama State.
- Rembert had multiple hits in eight of 12 games from Apr. 2-21 and hit .389 (21-for-54) with 11 RBI during the span.
- He has multiple hits in 12 of the last 19 games.
- He is hitting .328 (21-for-64) with three doubles and 10 RBI the last five SEC series.

FRALICK CAN FLAT OUT HIT

- As a freshman last year, Chase Fralick ended up starting 48 games behind the plate, including 27 of 30 SEC games.
- All 17 of Auburn's SEC wins came with Fralick behind the plate, and the freshman backstop raised his average to .343 in SEC play.
- He leads the team with 15 doubles, 12 home runs, including six in the last eight games, and 112 total bases while ranking second on the team with 59 hits and 38 RBI and third with a .331 average.
- A team-high seven of Fralick's 12 home runs have come in league play, including six in the last six SEC games.
- He reached base in 44 of the first 45 games of the season, including 26 straight games prior to the finale at Texas A&M.

BUB'S BIG SWING

- Bub Terrell hit a solo home run to lead off the second inning of the rubber game vs. Oklahoma and spark Auburn's six-homer and 14-run output against the Sooners.
- The home run was Terrell's team-best 10th of the season at the time.
- He has homered in five straight SEC series and has six home runs in the last 13 games after hitting five home runs in 57 games played last season.
- Terrell matched a season-high with three hits and three RBI at UAB Tuesday.

BRANDON IS BALLING

- Brandon McCraine ranks second on the team in average (.351) in his first 46 career games.
- In three series against Arkansas, Kentucky and Florida, McCraine hit .344 (11-for-32) with six runs, three doubles and seven RBI, including the game-winning two-run double in the series finale at Florida.
- McCraine went on a 12-game hitting streak (19-for-41) from Feb. 20-Mar. 10 and reached in his first 19 games played to start his career, including multiple times in 17 contests.
- Since 1993, he became the fifth true or redshirt freshman to reach base in each of the first 19 games of their Auburn career.

- Making his first SEC starts since Apr. 3, Mason McCraine hit .385 (5-for-13) with three homers and seven RBI at Florida en route to being named the SEC Freshman of the Week for the second time this season.
- McCraine was inserted into the leadoff spot for the middle game and proceeded to home three times with six RBI in the final two games of the series.
- He hit a leadoff homer in the series opener against Oklahoma, his fourth in a three-SEC-game span, and is hitting .333 (13-for-39) with four doubles, four homers and nine RBI in 10 games as the leadoff hitter.

- Ryan Hetzler's eight saves last year were tied for fourth in the league and tied for the third most in a season since 2013, trailing only Blake Burkhalter (16, 2022) and Cody Greenhill (12, 2019) in the category.
- Along with recording four saves at Cal Baptist in 2024 and two saves this season, Hetzler's 14 career saves are the second most among active SEC pitchers.
- He has factored into the decision in half of his 14 appearances this season, going 4-1 with two saves.
- Hetzler has turned in a 2.57 ERA in a team-high eight relief appearances in SEC play and ranks second among Auburn relievers with 14.0 innings pitched in league play.
- Since giving up three runs in the series opener vs. Nebraska on Feb. 27, He has allowed just four earned runs in 10 appearances and 15.0 innings pitched.

SEC-OPENING SWEEP

- Auburn's sweep at Missouri to open SEC play marked the team's first SEC road sweep since May 12-13, 2023 at Ole Miss and was the first road sweep on SEC opening weekend since 2010.
- The Tigers held Missouri to five runs and a .175 batting average in three games.

AIN'T OVER IN THE EIGHTH

- Auburn's win in the series finale at Florida on Apr. 18 marked the team's fifth this season when trailing or tied after eight innings.
- The Tigers entered the game with seven runs in the ninth inning this season but scored five runs in the frame to break a 3-3 tie and secure the series win.

GUTSY WIN IN GAINESVILLE

- The Tigers' series win at Florida marked the program's first in Gainesville since 2013 and was the first series win at Florida when dropping game one since 1997.
- After falling behind in the early stages of the middle game and playing the last seven innings with four freshmen in the lineup, the Tigers outscored the Gators 4-1 in the last six innings to even the series.

NEAR PERFECTION AT PLAINSMAN

- Auburn's quartet of Griffin Graves (3.0), Jett Johnston (2.0), Abe Chancellor (1.0) and Ethan Harden (1.0) held a perfect game until a one-out single in the seventh inning vs. Alabama State on Apr. 14.
- It would've marked the first seven-inning perfect game since Jason Johnson did so against LaGrange College on Apr. 30, 1991 and the first perfect game overall since Eric Bandon vs. Murray State on Mar. 2, 2002.

SCORELESS STREAK

- After allowing five runs in the first two innings of the middle game vs. Kentucky on Apr. 11, Auburn pitchers held the Wildcats scoreless in the last 14 innings of the series and followed up that performance with a shutout vs. Alabama State, marking 21 straight scoreless innings.
- The contest vs. Alabama State marked the team's sixth shutout of the season, good for the second most in the country and already the most in the last seven seasons.
- It marked the second time this season the Tigers have turned in back-to-back shutouts.

SEC TURNAROUND

- Auburn's nine-game SEC turnaround from 2024 (8-22) to 2025 (17-13) was the largest in the league since 2015-16 and tied for the seventh largest since the schedule expanded to 30 games in 1996.
- It was tied for Auburn's largest turnaround in program history, since going from 11 wins in 2009 to 20 wins and a SEC West Division Championship in 2010.

WINNING RECORD

- Auburn's 17 SEC wins last year were tied for the most in a conference season since 2010 (20), marking the fourth time in nine SEC seasons under head coach Butch Thompson the Tigers have turned in a winning league record.
- Auburn also turned in a 15-15 SEC record and went to game three of a super regional in 2018 and went 14-16 in league play while on its way to Omaha in 2019.
- Prior to Thompson's arrival, Auburn turned in a winning record in SEC play twice from 2001-15.

REGIONAL HOST REGULARS

- Auburn is one of seven programs nationally that has hosted a regional in at least three of the last four seasons, joined by Arkansas, Clemson, North Carolina, Oklahoma State, Oregon State and Tennessee on the short list.

THOMPSON'S TENURE

- The 2026 season marks head coach Butch Thompson's 11th season on the Plains, making him the third longest-tenured coach in program history and the fourth longest-tenured coach in the league.
- He surpassed the 350-win milestone with the team's 5-3 win at Florida on Apr. 17, joining Paul Nix (1963-84) and Hal Baird (1985-2000) as the only coaches in program history to reach the milestone.
- Under Thompson, Auburn has hosted back-to-back regionals for the first time in program history (2022-23), three regionals in four years for the first time in program history (2022-23, 25) and has made a NCAA regional in six of the last eight postseasons, including four Super Regional appearances (2018-19, '22, '25) and two College World Series appearances (2019, '22).

COACHING CAMARADERIE

- Auburn is one of two SEC programs with three coaches entering their ninth season together (Ole Miss).
- The 36 years of collective experience at Auburn are the fourth most among SEC coaching staffs at their current institutions.

- Playing in a newly-renovated Plainsman Park last year, the Tigers shattered the single-season attendance record for the fourth straight season and ranked in the top 10 in the country in both total and average attendance (5,603).

 - 2022: 127,947
- Through 28 home games this season, 163,455 total fans have already come through the turnstiles at Plainsman Park, the second highest total in program history.

AUBURN IN THE PROS

- Auburn enters the 2026 professional season with 36 players in professional baseball, including five currently on MLB rosters.
- Since 2020, the Tigers have had 13 players make their MLB debut, marking the third most in the SEC.
- Following the 2025 season, a program-record 11 Tigers got the opportunity to enter professional baseball.

GETTING DUDES DRAFTED

- In 10 years under Butch Thompson, Auburn has had 49 draft picks, including 25 in the top 10 rounds and 15 in the top five rounds.
- Both top-10 and top-five rounds totals are good for the most in a 10-year span in program history.
- The five top-10 rounds picks in 2025 was a program record, headlined by Ike Irish becoming the fifth highest player drafted in program history (19th overall, Baltimore).
