Cincinnati earned its ninth NCAA Regional bid, and first No. 2 seed, following yet another strong finish under Jordan Bischel. More on UC and Bischel's postseason history can be found on Page 4.

The Bearcats are also 21-8 in May regular-season games in his tenure, as well as 13-14 against ranked teams (5-3 this year). The Bearcats have only 13 upperclassmen, and five of their top six hitters in their first or second year of college.

DH/C **Enzo Infelise** was named the Big 12 Freshman of the Year. Three Bearcats were named to the **First Team**: Quinton Coats, Nathan Taylor and Enzo Infelise, while Adam Buczkowski and Jack Natili made the **Second Team**. Connor Blue and Ryan Tyranski joined Infelise on the All-Freshman squad.

Taylor broke the UC single-season strikeout record in his final home start, earning a standing ovation. The junior is now eight away from tying the career record, and he set the Bearcats' career wins record with his 22nd in the NCAA opener against Louisiana.

Coats is fourth nationally in home runs (28), fifth in total bases (182) and sixth in RBIs (79), padding the school record in the first two. He tied the RBI record with an RBI single against Louisiana. The three-time Big 12 Player of the Week recently homered and doubled three times apiece against Texas Tech, hitting .568. He has reached safely in 29-straight games.

Natili is one of 16 semifinalists for the Buster Posey Award. He is the only player nationally with three separate three-home run games this season, totaling 19 on the year with 64 RBIs and a .347 batting average. He has also helped the pitching staff to back-to-back seasons of strikeout records and now the No. 3 ERA in the Big 12. He holds a 3.6 GPA in industrial management and was rated No. 71 among MLB Draft prospects by ESPN last week.

The bullpen has been carried by Buczkowski (27 appearances). He holds a 4-1 record with six saves, and five of those have been for more than an inning. The high-leverage bullpen ace has also limited opponents to a miniscule .174 batting average.

Cincinnati's six homers against Louisiana gave it 90 on the year, breaking the 1991 team's record of 88. UC is also about speed, as its 119 steals lead the Big 12 by 20 and rank fifth among the Power 4. It had a school-record 134 last year.

UC leads the Big 12 with 91 HBP's following 75 in 2025 and a program-record 91 in Bischel's first year. **Jackson Smith** has drawn a league-high 22 HBP's (second in program history), and Tyranski is sixth in the Big 12 with a .462 on-base percentage.

Cincinnati is 22-5 when scoring in the first inning and 29-6 when scoring six or more runs.

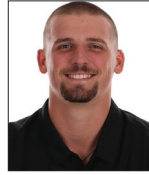

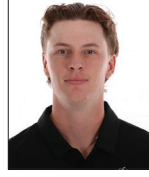

BACK TO THE REGIONALS (AND STARKVILLE)

Cincinnati earned its eighth postseason appearance, which includes its first of back-to-back seasons and third since 2019.

This trip to the Magnolia State is also a familiar sight to Jordan Bischel, who took his first Central Michigan team there in 2019. The 47-14 Chippewas beat Miami (Fla.) in the opener before falling to the host Bulldogs, 7-2, following an early deficit and going up against Ethan Small, the National Pitcher of the Year. The Chips fell to Miami in the Sunday rematch.

Bischel's 2021 squad reached the South Bend final after eliminating Michigan and UConn out of the loser's bracket.

His 2022 CMU squad fell to host Florida, defeated Liberty in 12 innings and lost to the Gators in the ninth inning.

Cincinnati's No. 2 starter, Logan Knight, has unique experience in the NCAAAs as well. Last year, he led North Dakota State to its 21st win of the season with 6 1/3 innings and two earned runs against No. 23 Kansas in Fayetteville.

CINCINNATI'S POSTSEASON HISTORY

The Bearcats showed no trepidation in last year's Knoxville Regional opener, jumping out to an 8-0 lead in the second inning. Then-freshmen Quinton Coats and Derrick Pitts homered, while Nate Taylor struck out seven over six innings in an 11-6 win.

The following night saw Tennessee lead 2-0 in the first before Pitts' diving catch (his first of three career #SCTop10 appearances) stranded the bases loaded. UC fought back, but the Vols scored four runs in the sixth to pull away, 10-6.

The 2019 season, which featured an improbable 4-game sweep of the AAC Tournament (complete with a 22-5 win over UConn in the title game) witnessed the greatest upset in program history. The Bearcats stunned defending national champ Oregon State, 7-6, in the opener, and it featured a bases-loaded intentional walk of star Adley Rutschman.

RANKED!

Following a 4-1 week and boasting a 19-8 record, Cincinnati was ranked No. 25 in the Baseball America Top 25 on Monday, March 23.

It marked the second time in as many seasons that the Bearcats have been nationally ranked following last year's appearances in the D1Baseball Top 25.

Cincinnati found its way back in on April 27 after back-to-back series wins at No. 21 UCF and No. 12 WVU at home, then moved up to No. 20 in Baseball America's poll the following week. The No. 17 ranking heading into the Big 12 Tournament is the program's highest since 1971.

UC'S 20TH, 100TH WINS MAKE HISTORY

The Friday night shutout of Kansas saw the quickest the program has ever achieved its 20th win in a season. Twenty-eight games would best the previous mark by one game, as the 2000 squad won 20 of its first 29 games to start the year 20-9.

STATEMENT MADE AGAINST NO. 12 WVU

Nearly 5,000 fans packed Clifton over the weekend, Cincinnati's highest for any all-time series. UC, which moved to 5-2 against ranked opponents this season, also earned its highest-ranked series win since 2015 (No. 6 UCF).

Friday's game was suspended in the 12th inning due to rain. When it picked up Saturday afternoon, West Virginia scored four runs in the top of the 13th and stranded the bases loaded for a 9-5 win. Following a brief intermission, the Bearcats responded with a 5-2 win in the nightcap behind gutsy long-relief performances by freshman Chad Brown and bullpen ace Adam Buczkowski.

Sunday's rubber game was where it all happened. The Bearcats trailed 5-2 with only three hits entering the bottom of the eighth. Five-straight hits, including a two-run single by All-Big 12 catcher Jack Natili for his third hit of the game, keyed the five-run rally and eventual 7-5 victory.

BEARCATS ON THE BIG (12) STAGE

When the University of Cincinnati officially joined the Big 12 Conference on July 1, 2023, the move brought the Bearcats Baseball program into one of the three best leagues in all of college baseball. The numbers say that UC has stood up to the task.

HOME SWEET HOME

The Bearcats have enjoyed playing at home under head coach Jordan Bischel. Under his watch, Bischel's Bearcats have claimed a home field advantage that is hard to ignore. UC is 55-21 at home under Bischel since he took over the program has won 12 of 15 Big 12 series at home since the start of the 2024 season.

Cincinnati also averaged 8.7 runs per game in its friendly confines for 2026.

BEARCATS' SERIES ATTENDANCE RECORD

Cincinnati's series win over No. 12 West Virginia didn't come without a little help from its friends.

The program set its all-time weekend series attendance record, and it featured some of the more unique promotions yet.

Friday's game saw Jordan Bischel buy the first 200 student beers (school ID and driver's license required, of course), and Sunday's win included the pep band's first-ever baseball appearance.

QUINTON COATS' AWARDS

Quinton Coats has deservedly received several awards and recognitions this season, including being named Big 12 Player of the Week on March 23 for the second time this season. He also earned Perfect Game's National Player of the Week award following his mammoth Utah performance.

Coats had another outstanding week for Cincinnati, hitting .450 with four home runs and nine RBI to help UC go 4-1 and capture its first Big 12 series win of the year. He hit three home runs in game two vs. Utah, tying the single-game school record for homers in a game. And Coats doesn't just go up there and swing out of his shoes either, as he had more walks (six) than strikeouts (five) and added two stolen bases as well.

Coats was also named to the Baseball America National Team of the Week for the third straight week on March 24. He is also a Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist.

Coats was unbelievable during the week of March 2-8. In five games, all Cincinnati wins, he hit .500 (11-for-22) with seven home runs, and 17 RBI. Coats slugged a ridiculous 1.545 and homered at least once in every game.

Coats earned his third Big 12 Player of the Week honor following his .538 weekend against Texas Tech,

BISCHEL BALL!

Head Coach Jordan Bischel's teams have an easily identifiable style of play: they run the bases well and aggressively, they are expert bunters, they work to make things hard on the opposing pitchers and defenses, and they play with the three E's: Energy, Enthusiasm, and Excitement. The numbers are there to back it up, too.

Bischel Ball has been a catalyst for the Bearcats this year once again. On Opening Day, UC logged seven stolen bases and a pair of bunt hits. In the win at No. 9 Auburn, Cincinnati laid down three bunt hits and stole four bases en route to the 8-0 win.

The Bearcats are 115-of-133 on stolen base attempts this season, which ranks high among Power Four programs:

NATHAN TAYLOR = WORKHORSE

Now in his third season at Cincinnati, junior right-handed pitcher Nathan Taylor has become one of the best starting pitchers in the Big 12.

Taylor tied his career high in strikeouts during his start vs. UC San Diego, punching out 11. He ranks third in the Big 12 with 115 K's this season and 10th nationally, which includes five double-digit K games this year.

For his career, Taylor now has 276 strikeouts, making him third in school history and the seventh with 200+ career K's. The all-time school record is 284, held by Carmine Lemma (1958-61).

Taylor was UC's Opening Day starter this season, the first time he's earned that distinction in his college career.

He has been named honorable mention All-Big 12 each of the last two seasons. He started 15 games on the mound last year and recorded 91 strikeouts, which are tied for fifth-most in a season in school history. Taylor became the first UC pitcher with at least 90 K's in a season since 1999, and had eight starts with at least seven strikeouts. He earned the start in Cincinnati's NCAA Tournament win vs. Wake Forest, punching out seven in six innings of work.

One of Taylor's biggest starts last year came on May 2 at #25 Kansas. Pitching against preseason Big 12 Pitcher of the Year Dominic Voegele, Taylor struck out seven across eight innings to help lead UC to a win that set the tone for a series sweep and set the stage for the program's at-large NCAA Tournament berth.

Taylor was terrific in his first season in 2024 and was named honorable mention All-Big 12 and earned a spot on the all-freshman team. He made 16 starts and two relief appearances, posting an 8-2 record with 70 strikeouts in 72.2 innings pitched. His eight victories were tied for second in the Big 12 and tied for ninth-most in a season in school history.

NATILI'S POWER LEADS 'CATS AT UCF

A contentious rubber match at No. 21 UCF on Sunday, April 19 was put on ice by Jack Natili's second three-homer game.

His first came in the sixth to cut the UC deficit to 9-6. His two-run shot in the seventh tied it at 9, then he followed Derrick Pitts' game-winner with two outs in the ninth with a back-to-back solo shot for an 11-9 lead.

POWER PAIR

In game two of the Utah series on Saturday, March 20, Quinton Coats and Jack Natili accomplished something truly special. Both players hit three home runs in the game, tying the single-game school record.

Prior to this, the last time two DI teammates hit three home runs in the same game came on May 4, 2024 when Louisiana Tech's Ethan Bates and Jorge Corona did so against New Mexico State.

The last player to hit three home runs in a game was Kerrington Cross last season at Kansas.

Coats and Natili are two of seven Big 12 players to accomplish that feat.

Cincinnati joins Campbell, FDU, LSU Illinois State, Northeastern, Texas State and Virginia as teams with two different 3-HR hitters in a game this season.

QUINTON COATS TAKES FLIGHT

Few in the country are slugging quite like sophomore Quinton Coats. The Olathe, Kan. native has started every game at first base and is third in NCAA Division I for three categories: homers (28), RBI (78) and total bases (180), claiming the school record in the first and third. Incredibly, Coats enters play this weekend with more home runs than 20 Division I teams.

On March 24, Coats was ranked No. 3 in D1Baseball's Top 50 First Basemen rankings.

His three home runs vs. Utah on Saturday, March 20 tied the single-game school record.

Coats has been named Big 12 Player of the Week three times and has earned Perfect Game National Player of the Week and NCBWA Dick Howser Trophy Co-National Hitter of the Week honors once each. He has been named to Baseball America's National Team of the Week three times and is a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy.

Coats homered in five straight games from March 3-8, a stretch that included the WKU game and all four vs. UC San Diego, and he homered twice in the BYU series.

His biggest swing of the season was a walk-off home run on Feb. 27 that beat Austin Peay. He also hit a grand slam at Jacksonville State, the first for Cincinnati since April 1, 2025.

In addition to his propensity for hitting home runs, Coats has a love of aviation and plans to be a pilot when his baseball career is over. Last fall, he was gifted a flying lesson and flew over UC's campus.

Last year, Coats hit a game-tying, pinch hit home run in the bottom of the ninth inning vs. Arizona State on April 13, which proved to be a seminal moment for him. After that game, he made 23 starts and ranked third on the team with a .330 batting average while adding five home runs and 13 RBI.

BACKSTOP EXTRAORDINAIRE JACK NATILI

Junior catcher Jack Natili earned a pair of Preseason All-America honors from Perfect Game and NCBWA.

Natili was one of three Big 12 position players to earn Preseason All-America honors from both outlets, joining TCU outfielder Sawyer Strosnider and Kansas first baseman Brady Ballinger.

He has also been named a Buster Posey Award semifinalist. He was recently ranked No. 5 on D1Baseball's Top 50 catcher rankings, released on March 24, and he ranked 71st among MLB Draft prospects on May 18.

Natili etched his name into the Cincinnati Baseball record book when he hit three home runs vs. Utah on Saturday, March 20. He tied the single-game school record for home runs in a single game.

Natili is hitting .336 with 37 free bases, having walked 29 times and eight HBP. He's added 16 home runs and 59 RBI, ranking second on the team

in both.

Natili received second team All-Big 12 honors last year, his first season as a Bearcat, after hitting .338 with nine home runs, 53 RBI, 14 doubles, 36 runs scored, and 13 HBP. He drove in 30 runs during Big 12 play, which ranked second on the team. Natili's .451 on-base percentage ranked sixth in the Big 12 and first among all catchers in the conference. He went on a tear in the month of May, hitting .464 with four homers, 20 RBI, and six doubles while helping Cincinnati reach its first NCAA Tournament since 2019.

Natili was named to the Big 12 All-Tournament Team and earned Player and Newcomer of the Week honors on May 12 last year. He hit .556 (10-for-18) across four games that week with two home runs

and nine RBI.

Natili joined the program from Rutgers, where he spent the 2024 season and started 44 games. Coming out of high school, he was the No. 16-ranked prospect in Pennsylvania and the top prep catcher in his class from the state according to Perfect Game.

DERRICK PITTS: THE MOST EXCITING MAN IN THE OUTFIELD

Sophomore outfielder Derrick Pitts not only brings the most energy to the ballpark, but he brings as much talent as anybody as well.

Pitts has started every game in the outfield, the bulk of his starts coming in right field. Scan the QR code to see all three of Pitts' SportsCenter appearances.



In the third game of the BYU series, Pitts made an incredible leaping grab to rob a home run in right field that made quite a stir on social media and ranked No. 3 on SportsCenter's Top 10 plays that night. He rejoined the Top 10 for the second time this year with a flying catch slammed against the wall against West Virginia.

His first entry into SportsCenter's top recognition came as a freshman in the 2025 Knoxville Regional, robbing the Vols of multiple runs with a two-out, bases-loaded diving catch in the first inning.

He also notched two assists in the opener versus Kansas on flyouts to right field, doubling off the same runner each time.

Pitts is third on the team with a .347 batting average with six homers, 40 RBI and 17 stolen bases. An exemplary defender, Pitts has played errorless defense in the outfield and threw a runner out at home in the 3-0 win vs. Austin Peay on Feb. 28.

Pitts took over a starting spot in center field on

April 23 last year, and hit three home runs with 16 RBI, 16 runs scored, and played flawless defense in the outfield, including a diving catch on a bloop at Tennessee in the regional to silence the home crowd. He also homered in the win over Wake Forest the previous day.

PITTS' JOURNEY TO CINCINNATI

The sophomore sensation was an 11th-hour connection with the Bearcats.

It all began his last summer tourney of high school. Assistant coach Kyle Pettoruto reached out on Twitter, and it was on Derrick's way home from a minor league baseball game with friends where he got a call from UC offering him a spot. The message was "we're gonna take a chance on you," and he says that's all he needed.

Pitts believes in UC's mentality, and that it's a "kids game": Get dirty, dive, yell with the guys. Bischel's 3 Es in the program (Energy, Enthusiasm, Excitement) are about creating an impact on the game.

JACKSON SMITH GETS ON BASE

Nobody on the Bearcats has done as good of a job as sophomore infielder Jackson Smith has at getting on base this season.

He reached base safely in the first 21 games he played in.

Smith has walked 39 times and has been hit by a pitch 22 times, comfortably leading the Big 12 all year. He has been plunked multiple times in a game four times this season, including a high of three on Opening Day at Jacksonville State.

He came to Cincinnati from Bradley, where he spent his freshman season in 2025. Smith hit .301 in 38 games, making 36 starts for the Braves.

RYAN TYRANSKI'S WILD RIDE AROUND THE BASES

Redshirt freshman Ryan Tyranski homered in back-to-back games at Utah Valley, his second and third home runs of the year, but his first home run of the season was truly special.

He pulled off one of the rarest feats in baseball in Cincinnati's home opener: an inside-the-park home run. Tyranski ripped a ball into center field that was a tough play for BG's outfielder, who dove to make a play but couldn't. The ball rolled all the way to the wall, giving Tyranski enough to scamper all the way around the bases.

It was Tyranski's first-career collegiate home run, and the first inside-the-park homer by a Bearcat since Paul Komistek on Feb. 29, 2020 vs. Oakland.

He moved into the leadoff spot for the first time in the Miami (OH) win, and two days later tied the school record with three doubles in an 11-1 victory over Baylor, then led off UC's home game against Xavier with a homer.

Tyranski redshirted last season, but his abilities are well-regarded by the coaching staff. In high school at Bloomfield Hills, he helped lead his team to a runner-up finish at the state tournament as a senior in 2024. His brother, Mitchell, played at Michigan State and is a member of the Chicago Cubs organization.

He posted a 14-game hit streak entering the Houston series as well.

CARSON MARSH: BIG BULLPEN LOSS

Junior Carson Marsh was Cincinnati's most-used pitcher the last two seasons, combining to pitch in 60 games over his first two collegiate seasons. He left the Kansas finale with a season-ending injury (March 29).

Marsh pitched in a then-team-high 12 games already this year and had 16 strikeouts to just four walks in 19.0 innings pitched. He earned the win in the upset victory at No. 9 Auburn and notched his first save of the year at Western Kentucky.

Last year, Marsh ranked second on the team with 24 appearances, making nine starts.

Marsh was thrust into a high-leverage bullpen role as a true freshman in 2024 and responded about as well as one could hope for a true freshman. He appeared in 24 games and posted a 4.30 ERA in 44.0 innings of work, striking out 52 while walking 15. The local product made his collegiate debut on Opening Day last season and came up big in one of the most important wins of the season, striking out four in 2.2 scoreless frames against Texas in the Big 12 Tournament.

CONLAN DANIEL COMES BACK HOME

One of the prizes out of the transfer portal for Cincinnati was outfielder Conlan Daniel.

Daniel has started 40 games in center field and started his Bearcat career off with a bang. He had a triple on Opening Day and stole two bases in game two at Jax State, eventually scoring both times he was on base.

Daniel had his best game as a Bearcat at Houston. His career-high four hits included a homer and home run robbery to appear in SportsCenter's Top 10 Plays (plus a diving catch the next inning).

A sophomore outfielder, Daniel played in 36 games for Wright State last season, hitting .314 with six home runs, 18 RBI, and 14 stolen bases. He was the starting center fielder in all four of the Raiders' NCAA Tournament games, homering against No. 1 seed Vanderbilt in their first game of the tournament.

A Cincinnati native, Daniel starred at Moeller High



School, helping the team win a state championship in 2023. He was high school teammates with current Bearcats Carson Marsh and Charlie Niehaus.

Daniel's father, Cary, played baseball at Cincinnati as well (1996-97) and is currently the head coach of Indian Hill High School. Cary was an outfielder at UC and hit .307 his senior year, second on the team. He also led the Bearcats with 13 stolen bases and 42 talks that season.

SEFCIK BROTHERS REUNITE IN CLIFTON

Neither Luke nor Cal Sefcik began their career at Cincinnati, but both of them will enjoy their second season together as Bearcats in 2026.

Cal was one of Cincinnati's best hitters last season, slugging seven home runs while adding 43 RBI, 29 walks, 32 runs scored, and nine doubles. He has been dealing with a lower body injury and made his season debut as a pinch hitter in game one of the doubleheader vs. Austin Peay. Cal started three of four games vs. UC San Diego and appears to have not missed a beat, hitting .615 (8-for-13) with three doubles.

Luke started his collegiate career at Central Michigan and followed Jordan Bischel to Cincinnati prior to the 2024 season. Cal was a freshman at Indiana in 2024 before transferring to UC in 2025.

Luke and Cal shared a cool moment on Opening Day last year when they hit back-to-back in the Bearcats' order. Luke hit sixth and started at second base, while Cal hit seventh and started at DH.

Kevin Sefcik, father of Cal and Luke, spent seven years in the big leagues, six with the Philadelphia Phillies. Kevin coached Cal and Luke at Marist High School in suburban Chicago as well.

CHRISTIAN MITCHELLE NAMED TO JOHN OLERUD TWO-WAY PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR

Senior Christian Michelle is one of the most versatile players on the diamond whenever he takes the field, and he was recognized by the College Baseball Foundation once again by his selection to the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award watch list for the third straight season.

Mitchelle had a terrific first week of March, hitting .500 (8-for-16) with four home runs and 10 RBI to help lead UC to five victories. He has a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11th inning vs. UC San Diego on March 8 to cap a four-game series sweep.

Mitchelle has started 45 games this year, largely at third base. He started 46 games last year at five different positions, and he also pitched in nine games. He hit up and down the order, hitting in the three, five, six, seven, eight, and nine spots in 2025.

Mitchelle received second-team All-Big 12 distinctions in 2024 as a two-way threat. He started 42 games (25 at SS, 11 at DH, six at 2B) and pitched in 22 games out of the bullpen. Michelle hit .319 at the dish with four home runs, 22 RBI, 34 runs scored, and nine stolen bases. Out of the bullpen, he led UC with six saves and totaled 39.1 innings of work.

CHARLIE NIEHAUS BLOSSOMING INTO STELLAR SHORTSTOP

After redshirting in 2024, shortstop Charlie Niehaus grabbed the reins of the position last year and served as a steady presence in the Bearcats' lineup.

Niehaus was rewarded with a spot on the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List last season.

Head coach Jordan Bischel has stated that he thought Niehaus had a terrific fall. The shortstop posted a 26.2% barrel rate this fall, which ranked third on the team.

Niehaus started 48 games at shortstop last season and ranked among the team leaders in batting average, runs scored, and stolen bases. Earlier in the season he had a stretch of 107 total chances at shortstop with just one error.

NOTES

ENZO INFELISE MAKING BIG IMPACT

Freshman catcher Enzo Infelise may be behind Preseason All-American Jack Natili on the depth chart at catcher, but his bat is giving him plenty of opportunities to play so far this season.

In his first season as a college athlete, the Big 12 Freshman of the Year has led UC with a .374 batting average, including nine homers and 10 doubles. He also posted a 30-game reached-safely streak.

Infelise had a coming out party of sorts in the Evansville game, hitting two home runs, the first two of his college career. He entered the game as a pinch hitter in the fourth inning and hit his first home run, then clubbed a three-run shot in the bottom of the eighth that proved to be the game-winner.

Infelise was terrific in the win at No. 9 Auburn, going 3-for-5 at the plate with an RBI, and he stole a base as well.

Ranking No. 40 on D1Baseball's Top 150 Impact Freshmen list, Infelise had the team's highest barrel rate in the fall, second-highest hard-hit rate, and three of the top ten exit velocities.

A native of New Lenox, Ill., he helped lead Providence Catholic to a state title in 2024 (where he was teammates with 2B Jackson Smith) and was a two-time all-conference performer in high school.

SCHEDULE SHUFFLING

Cincinnati started the year on an eight-game road trip and returned for what was supposed to be a 10-game homestand. The weather had other ideas, wreaking havoc on UC's schedule from Feb. 24-March 8.

During that stretch, they only played one game on their scheduled day or time due to weather conditions, that being the Evansville game on Tuesday, March 10.

UC's home opener was scheduled for Feb. 24, but pushed back one day to Feb. 25. Last weekend's series vs. Austin Peay was altered to include an earlier game on Friday and a doubleheader Saturday to avoid chilly weather on Sunday. The March 3 home game vs. Western Kentucky was moved to Western Kentucky because of rainy weather in Cincinnati.

Finally, the weekend series vs. UC San Diego saw game one delayed three hours due to rain, games two and three merge into a doubleheader played on Friday, March 6, and the final game of the series was moved up to accommodate UCSD's travel plans.

NOTING XAVIER GAME

Cincinnati visited rival Xavier on Tuesday, March 24 and wound up on the losing end of a 4-3 game.

- Quinton Coats hit a solo homer out deep to center field in the third inning, at the time his 19th home run of the season.
- Adam Buczkowski tied his season highs in innings pitched (2.1) and strikeouts @.
- Logan Knight threw 0.2 innings out of the bullpen, the first relief appearance of his career.

NOTING UTAH SERIES

Cincinnati captured its first Big 12 series of the year vs. Utah, taking two out of three:

- The Bearcats scored 20 runs in their game two victory, the first time they have reached the 20-run plateau in a game since March 20, 2021 at Xavier.
- Cincinnati scored at least 10 runs in every game of a series since May 20-22 vs. Tulane, when it accomplished that feat in a four-game series.
- Quinton Coats and Jack Natili both hit three home runs in game two, meaning each player tied the single-game school record for home runs in the same game.
- The series was the first time Cincinnati and Utah ever met on the diamond.

NOTING UTAH VALLEY GAMES

Following its weekend series at BYU, Cincinnati stayed out west and played at Utah Valley on Monday-Tuesday, March 16-17, winning both games:

- The two-game set marked the first time Cincinnati and Utah Valley had ever played.
- The first game was an 11-1 run-rule victory, the fourth time this year that UC has run-ruled an opponent.
- Ryan Tyranski hit a grand slam in game one, the third by a Bearcat this year.
- In game two, Quinton Coats hit his 15th home run of the season, which gave him sole position of the national lead at the time.

NOTING BYU SERIES

Cincinnati opened Big 12 play March 12-14 at BYU, dropping two out of three against the Cougars:

- The Bearcats' third year in the conference started in familiar fashion: on the road. Since they joined the league prior to the 2024 season, their first conference series of the year has been on the road each time.
- Conlan Daniel and Charlie Niehaus hit back-to-back home runs in game two, then Quinton Coats and Jack Natili went back-to-back in the first inning in game three.
- Entering the weekend, Cincinnati was tied for second-to-last in the Big 12 in fielding percentage, but committed just one error all weekend long to post a .990 fielding percentage.

NOTING EVANSVILLE WIN

UC improved its winning streak to seven games with a wild 13-11 win vs. Evansville on March 10:

- Cincinnati trailed 11-4 heading into the bottom of the seventh before scoring three runs that inning and six the next to come all the way back.
- Enzo Infelise, who hit the ball harder than almost anyone else during fall ball, hit the first two home runs of his career. He entered the game as a pinch hitter in the fourth inning and homered, then hit another home run in the bottom of the eighth. His second home run was a three-run shot that served as the game-winner.
- Infelise's two-home run game made him the third Bearcat in three games to have multiple home runs. Quinton Coats and Christian Michelle had two homers each in the second game of the doubleheader vs. UC San Diego.
- Joel Pineiro earned the save with a scoreless ninth inning, the first save of his career in his 45th career game.

NOTING UC SAN DIEGO SERIES

Cincinnati stayed hot and swept UCSD in a four-game series on March 5-8 in dominant fashion, posting two run-rule victories:

- The weekend showed some similarities to last year's four-game series vs. Canisius, which UC also swept. Cincinnati held UC San Diego to a .186 batting average on the weekend, and last year it held Canisius to a .181 team batting average.
- The Bearcats slugged 11 home runs during the series with Quinton Coats @ and Christian Michelle @ providing the bulk of them. Jackson Smith and Jack Natili also homered.
- Michelle's walk-off home run in the finale was the second walk-off home run in an eight-day span for the Bearcats. Prior to that, their last walk-off home run came back in 2023.
- Cincinnati's pitching was outstanding as well, striking out 44 in 34.0 innings while walking just 10 and posting a 2.38 ERA.

NOTING WESTERN KENTUCKY WIN

Cincinnati won a midweek contest at Western Kentucky on Tuesday, March 3 by a score of 5-2:

- The game was supposed to be held at UC, but it was announced two days before that it would be moved to WKU due to weather.
- Quinton Coats hit his team-leading sixth home run of the season and Christian Michelle hit his first homer of the year.
- Carson Marsh notched his first save of the season.

NOTING AUSTIN PEAY SERIES

Cincinnati hosted its first home series Feb. 27-28 and took two out of three vs. Austin Peay:

- The series pitted two teams that won a combined 78 games last year, as UC won 33 while the Governors won 45 in 2025.
- The Bearcats' pitchers combined for a 1.93 ERA over the course of the series, striking out 33 while allowing just six walks.
- In game one, Quinton Coats ended things with a walk-off homer in the bottom of the 10th inning. It was UC's first walk-off homer since Kameron Guidry did it vs. Miami on April 11, 2023.
- It was Cincinnati's first walk-off win of any kind since April 13, 2025 against Arizona State.
- After dropping game two, Cincinnati bounced back in game three to win, 3-0, for its second shutout of the year.
- The 3-0 win marked the first time that the Bearcats had two shutouts in the month of February in program history.

NOTING BOWLING GREEN WIN

Cincinnati defeated Bowling Green 11-1 by run rule in its home opener on Feb. 25:

- It was Cincinnati's first run-rule victory since April 23 last year vs. Milwaukee.
- A former MAC coach himself at Central Michigan, head coach Jordan Bischel is now 10-1 against MAC teams at Cincinnati. BGSU is the sixth MAC coach he has defeated while at UC (Ball State, Northern Illinois, Akron, Miami, Toledo).
- In the top of the fifth inning, Ryan Tyranski made a sliding catch in left field, then outdid himself in the bottom half. Tyranski hit an inside-the-park home run, the first by a Bearcat since Paul Komistek did so vs. Oakland on Feb. 29, 2020.
- Freshman Connor Blue made the start and was outstanding, striking out three in four innings and did not walk anybody, allowing just one run.

NOTING UAB SERIES

Despite losing the first two games at UAB, Cincinnati bounced back to win games three and four to earn a series split:

- The four-game series in Birmingham was the renewal of a rivalry of sorts. UC and UAB had faced each other 58 times entering the series and played nearly every year from 1992-2005, serving a significant chunk of that time as Conference USA foes.
- The ball was flying out of the yard during the series, as both teams combined for 16 home runs.
- Both Derrick Pitts and Jack Natili had 10 hits apiece, leading the Bearcats in that category.
- Once again, Cincinnati caused havoc on the basepaths. It was 19-for-20 on stolen bases attempts at UAB and had six in the series opener.
- After logging six total extra-base hits in the previous four games, Cincinnati had at least four XBH in three of the four games at UAB.

NOTING AUBURN WIN

The Bearcats captured a huge road win on Feb. 17, beating No. 9 Auburn 8-0 at Plainsman Park. The biggest non-conference test for UC turned into one of its most impressive wins in recent memory.

They never trailed, scoring the first run of the game in the top of the first inning, and kept Auburn hitless with runners in scoring position (0-for-9). The Tigers were coming off a 17-run outburst in their last

game on Sunday and UC's pitchers held them to just five hits on Tuesday.

Below are a few notes about the win:

- It's the highest-ranked opponent UC has beaten since a 13-12 win vs. No. 5 Louisville in 2021.
- The win is also tied for the highest-ranked opponent Cincinnati has ever defeated on the road, matching an 11-10 win at No. 9 Houston in 2002.
- The win was also Cincinnati's first against an SEC team since a 2-1 victory at No. 25 Tennessee on March 10, 2017.
- The last time UC shut out a ranked opponent was 2018, a 1-0 win vs. No. 24 UConn.
- Cincinnati's win was the first of several upsets in midweek action on Feb. 17. Other unranked teams to win against ranked opponents included: College of Charleston beating No. 6 Coastal Carolina (4-3); UT Arlington beating No. 7 TCU (11-8); and Morehead State beating No. 18 Kentucky (8-6).

NOTING JACKSONVILLE STATE SERIES

Cincinnati opened the 2026 season on the road at Jacksonville State, taking the first two games before dropping game three.

- UC has now won its season-opening series in back-to-back seasons after taking two out of three at #11 Duke to open to 2025 season.
- Game one vs. Jax State was a perfect showcase for Cincinnati's brand of baseball. They combined to draw 15 walks and HBP, stole seven bases, and had two bunt base hits.
- UC's 11 runs in the first game were its most on Opening Day since an 11-5 win vs. Ohio State in 2011.
- Jack Natili must have instilled some fear in the Jax State pitching staff, as he drew five walks and was plunked twice over the course of the weekend.

CINCINNATI EARNS PAIR OF PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12 HONORS

Jack Natili and Nathan Taylor were both named Preseason All-Big 12 prior to the start of the season.

2025 IN REVIEW

The 2025 season was one of the best in Cincinnati history. UC won 33 games and earned an at-large NCAA Tournament berth, its first tournament trip since 2019 and first at-large berth since 1974. Some highlights and notes from last season:

- The 33 wins gave the program back-to-back 30-win campaigns for the first time since 1999-01.
- Cincinnati also won six games against ranked opponents, the most in a season in school history.
- After opening the year with a series win at No. 11 Duke, the Bearcats were ranked No. 25 in the D1Baseball Top 25 the following week. It was the first time UC was ever ranked by D1Baseball, and it rose to No. 23 in the next poll.
- Cincinnati's third win against a ranked opponent came on March 25 at home vs. No. 18 Louisville, a 12-2 triumph over the Cardinals.

- The Bearcats' first Big 12 series win came at the end of March, a series sweep of UCF. They would go on to win their next three conference series.
- After spending some time on the NCAA Tournament bubble, Cincinnati went on the road and swept No. 25 Kansas in emphatic fashion, its first sweep of a ranked opponent since at least 2000. UC combined to score 40 runs in the sweep in Lawrence, the most since scoring 40 in a three-game series sweep vs. Georgetown in 2006.
- The Bearcats' NCAA Tournament berth landed them in the Knoxville Regional as the No. 3 seed. They came out and defeated No. 2 seed Wake Forest, 11-6, in the opening game, bashing three home runs in the victory.
- Cincinnati was led by 2025 Big 12 Player of the Year and All-American Kerrington Cross. Cross turned in a remarkable 2025 season, hitting .396 with 12 homers, 50 RBI, 65 runs, 50 walks, and a .647 slugging percentage.

GET TO KNOW THE BEARCATS

The University of Cincinnati Department of Athletics competes at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics with the vision to reach Next Level Success for all 18 varsity teams and more than 450 student-athletes.

The Bearcats have a proud athletics history, winning eight national championships and 118 conference titles. The Cincinnati men's basketball team is among the 15 winningest programs all-time, while the football team became the first non-Power Five program to compete in the College Football Playoff in 2021.

Olympic gold medalist volleyball player Jordan Thompson, NBA Hall of Famer Oscar Robertson and MLB legend Sandy Koufax are among several luminaries who have competed as Bearcats.

The Bearcats entered a new era as a Power Five School on July 1, 2023 when they officially joined the Big 12 Conference, positioning Cincinnati among the nation's premier athletics programs.

Off the field, UC student-athletes continue to find success, collectively posting a department-record 3.54 GPA in fall 2025 with 897% earning spots on the Honor Roll.

Under the leadership of Director of Athletics John Cunningham, and supported by more than 150 full-time staff members, UC Athletics' mission is to connect our community, enhance our university and impact the lives of student-athletes as they prepare to change the world on and off the field.

BISCHEL INKS CONTRACT EXTENSION THROUGH 2031 SEASON

Following an outstanding season that ended with an at-large NCAA Tournament berth, Cincinnati baseball head coach Jordan Bischel announced a contract extension on August 26, 2025.

"Extending Coach Bischel's contract was a top priority for our department," Director of Athletics John Cunningham said. "We believe we have the ideal leader for Cincinnati Baseball. The culture Jordan has established and the buy-in from his student-athletes has been remarkable, and the energy around the program these past two years has been undeniable. With Coach Bischel at the helm, this is only the beginning of what's ahead for Bearcats Baseball."

"Cincinnati has quickly become home for Katie, myself and our family," Bischel said. "Along with our coaching staff, I am incredibly excited about the trajectory of our baseball program and athletics department. This agreement is a reflection of a shared vision of President Pinto, John Cunningham and his team, and our baseball staff. I am incredibly grateful and excited to be leading our baseball program for years to come."

PUTTING IN THE WORK IN THE CLASSROOM

Not only have the Bearcats been getting it done on the field, they've gotten it done in the classroom as well. UC received its 10th straight ABCA Team Academic Excellence Award last summer.

Even better, the fall semester saw a cumulative 3.5768 GPA, the highest semester GPA in program history. Thirty-six players earned a spot on the Honor Roll with a GPA of 3.0 or higher, 28 made the Dean's List at 3.5 or higher, and four earned a perfect 4.0 semester GPA.

In addition, Jack Natili, Joel Pineiro, Brandon Scheurer, and Carson Marsh all earned CSC Academic All-District honors last summer.

COACHING STAFF TIES

Bischel has a long history with assistants Tom Winske and Kyle Schroeder, having spent a lot of time with both of them at different institutions.

Winske and Schroeder were both on staff at CMU with Bischel from 2019-23, helping the Chippewas win four Mid-American Conference championships and earn three NCAA Tournament berths.

Schroeder also coached under Bischel for four years at Northwood University (2015-18) and for two seasons at Midland University (2013-14).

Winske was a successful coach at St. Norbert College in De Pere, Wis. from 1999-2018 and coached Bischel as a player from 2000-03. Bischel also served as an assistant coach under Winske from 2007-09.

WINSKE INDUCTED INTO ST. NORBERT COLLEGE ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

Assistant coach Tom Winske's former school, St. Norbert College, inducted him into its athletics hall of fame last fall, a much-deserved honor for the former head coach.

Winske, who coached at St. Norbert from 1999-2018, compiled a career record of 444-287-1 and led the program to five NCAA Division III berths. His 444 career wins were the most in the history of the Midwest Conference at the conclusion of his tenure, and he was named Midwest Conference North Division Coach of the Year nine times. Winske led St. Norbert to conference titles in 2003, 2012, 2014, and 2017.

BEARCATS SIGN HIGHEST-RATED RECRUITING CLASS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

For the second consecutive season, Cincinnati signed its highest-rated recruiting class in program history.

Led by the efforts of assistant coaches Kyle Pettoruto and Tayler Sheriff, UC signed the No. 26-ranked class according to Perfect Game.

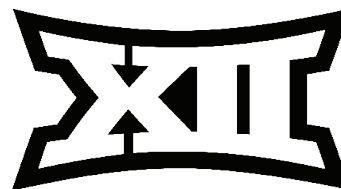

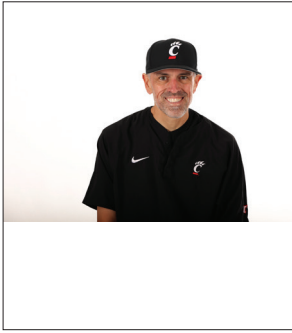

THIRD SEASON • ST. NORBERT '03**

The 2026 season will be Jordan Bischel's third as the head coach at the University of Cincinnati. It was announced on August 26, 2025 that Bischel agreed to a contract extension through the 2031 season.

UC ended the 2025 season with a 33-26 overall record and

earned an at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament, the seventh tournament trip in program history and the first at-large berth since 1974. The Bearcats were the No. 3 seed in the Knoxville Regional and won their opening game against No. 2 seed Wake Forest, 11-6.

Cincinnati reached the 30-win plateau for the second straight season, the first time the program had won at least 30 games in consecutive seasons since doing it three straight years from 1999-2001. UC also captured six ranked wins, the most in a season in school history.

Under his watch, Bischel's Bearcats have reclaimed a home field advantage that is hard to ignore. UC is 38-14 at home under Bischel since he took over the program has won eight of 10 Big 12 series at home since the start of the 2024 season.

Bischel's preferred style of play has become a calling card for Cincinnati, which led all Power Four programs in bunt hits and ranked second in stolen bases. UC was one of the most successful teams on the bases, posting a 90.5% success rate on stolen bases (134-for-148). The 134 stolen bases broke the previous single-season school record set in 2008, and the pitching staff tallied 496 strikeouts, breaking the single-season mark from 2019.

Individually, Bischel helped mentor 2025 Big 12 Player of the Year and Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist Kerrington Cross to one of the best seasons ever by a Bearcat. Cross was one of six players to earn all-conference honors, joining second-team selection Jack Natili, all-freshman team pick Quinton Coats, and honorable mention winners Landyn Vidourek, Kellen O'Connor, and Nathan Taylor.

The 2024 season was Bischel's first at Cincinnati, and he led the Bearcats to a terrific year in their inaugural Big 12 campaign. UC posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. Cincinnati finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Bischel helped coach seven All-Big 12 players in 2024, including first-team selection Josh Kross. Christian Mitchell was named to the second team while Nathan Taylor, Lauden Brooks, Kerrington Cross, Josh Hegemann, and Tommy O'Connor were all honorable mention.

In his first year at UC, Bischel successfully implemented his style of play and saw his players buy in as well. The Bearcats were among the national leaders in walks (320, most in school history) and stolen bases (109) and ranked atop the league in HBP (91). Cincinnati's ability to get on base and take extra bases led to an average of 7.4 runs per game, which ranked fourth in the league.

Bischel was announced as the 33rd head coach in program history on June 18, 2023.

The Green Bay, Wis., native came to UC from Central Michigan, where he served as head coach for five seasons. He also spent four seasons as head coach of Northwood, an Division II program in Midland, Mich., and two seasons at the helm of NAIA program Midland University in Fremont, Neb.

He has previously won eight conference championships: four at Central Michigan, four at Northwood.

"Jordan Bischel is the perfect fit to lead the University of Cincinnati baseball program and we are thrilled to welcome he and his family to UC," Cunningham said. "As a head coach, he has won conference championships and consistently guided his teams to the postseason. He's a proven program builder and winner who has found success at every level. He is a leader who will demand the best on and off the field of our student-athletes. We couldn't be happier to have him as our head coach."

Bischel led the Chippewas to four Mid-American Conference (MAC) championships -- two regular season and two tournament -- and three NCAA Regionals. The Chippewas

went 177-80 (.689) during Bischel's tenure.

"I couldn't be happier and more excited to be the head baseball coach at the University of Cincinnati," Bischel said. "I'm honored to be part of this incredible athletic department. I'm looking forward to building this program and contending for championships in the Big 12. I was impressed right away by John Cunningham's overall vision and have always loved everything about this city. It was going to take an incredibly special opportunity for our family to leave Central Michigan. This is that opportunity."

In five seasons as head coach at CMU, Bischel had a 102-32 MAC record and posted three consecutive 40-win full seasons for the first time since 1986-88. Bischel's teams won a combined 132 games in 2019, '21 and '22, marking the winningest three-year stretch in program history.

Bischel's CMU teams went a combined 31-8 against the five other Michigan Division I programs, Michigan, Michigan State, Eastern Michigan, Western Michigan and Oakland, and Bischel led his Chippewas to 12 victories over opponents from Power 5 conferences.

In 2022, the Chippewas finished 43-19, including 30-7 and in second place in the MAC. They made a remarkable run to the league tournament crown, starting 1-1 and then winning three consecutive elimination games, the final two against host and regular season champion Ball State.

That put the Chippewas in the NCAA Tournament for the third straight season, where they went 1-2 and bowed to No. 13-ranked Florida in the Gators' home stadium in Gainesville.

The Chippewas posted a 42-18 ledger in 2021, capped by a 2-2 finish in the NCAA Regional in South Bend, Ind. The Chippewas were the No. 4 seed in the four-team tournament and posted victories over No. 2 Michigan and No. 3 UConn.

Bischel electrified CMU baseball from the word go in 2019, leading it to its first MAC Tournament championship and its first NCAA Tournament berth since 1995. The 2019 squad posted a 47-14 mark -- an 18-win improvement over the 2018 squad -- and a dramatic 6-5 victory over Miami (Fla.) in an NCAA Regional game in Starkville, Miss. It was CMU's first NCAA Tournament victory since 1988.

The Chippewas earned their first MAC regular season title since 2015, tied the program record for victories in a season (47), and its .770-win percentage was fifth best in the nation.

Prior to his time at CMU, Bischel was the head coach of Northwood from 2014 to 2018. The Timberwolves posted a combined 137-76 record and won two Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Championships as well as two GLIAC Tournament titles. Over his last two seasons, Northwood won 84 games -- the best two-year stretch prior to Bischel's arrival featured 55 wins (1989-90).

Before Northwood, Bischel coached at Midland University in Fremont, Neb., for two seasons, leading the Warriors to a combined 74-45 record. In his first year at Midland, the

Warriors won 31 games, an 18-victory improvement over the previous year.

Bischel also coached in the Northwoods League for five seasons, four with the Green Bay Bullfrogs and one with the Wisconsin Woodchucks. He also served as the pitching coach for three seasons at Northwest Missouri State and was an assistant coach at John Carroll University in Ohio and at St. Norbert College in Wisconsin.

Bischel was an academic all-conference first baseman and pitcher at St. Norbert from 2000 to 2003. He earned all-conference honors and served as the team captain as a senior.

Bischel and his wife Katie have three sons, twins Luke and Parker, and Chase.

ASSISTANT COACH (PITCHING)

Taylor Sheriff is entering his third season at Cincinnati in 2026. He was promoted to serve as the team's pitching coach in August 2024 after spending the previous season as the director of pitching development.

Sheriff mentored a pair of 2025 All-Big 12 pitchers in Nathan Taylor and Kellen O'Connor. Taylor, who earned his second straight all-conference nod, was 7-2 with a 3.93 ERA in 87.0 innings pitched. O'Connor, in his first year with the program, totaled 70.2 innings pitched and logged 60 strikeouts.

UC broke the single-season school record for strikeouts in 2025, racking up 496 K's. Taylor accounted for 91 strikeouts, the first Bearcat pitcher with at least 90 strikeouts in a season since 1999.

During his first season with the Bearcats in 2024, the team posted a 32-25 overall record and a 17-13 mark in conference play, the program's first 30-win season since 2019. UC finished the regular season in fifth place in the Big 12 after being picked to finish in last in the preseason coaches poll.

The Bearcats claimed six series wins in conference play including series vs. TCU, West Virginia, and UCF, and also posted an 18-8 record at home.

Working with the pitching staff, Sheriff helped mentor freshman right-hander Nathan Taylor to an All-Big 12 campaign. Taylor was named to the league's all-freshman team and was an honorable mention all-conference selection.

In addition to Taylor, Sheriff helped two-way player Christian Michelle to a Second-Team All-Big 12 accolade. Michelle appeared in 22 games on the mound and totaled six saves, while throwing 39.1 innings for the Bearcats.

Cincinnati also saw its team ERA drop by nearly a full run in 2024 from the previous season, and it posted its lowest single-season ERA since 2019.

Sheriff came to UC from Western Illinois where he served as interim head coach of the baseball program for the 2023 season. He was the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator during the 2022 season, which was his first with the program.

In his first season, the Leathernecks saw an improvement in overall wins, Summit League victories and conference finish. Western Illinois also had improvements in nearly every major statistical category.

Prior to joining Western Illinois, Sheriff spent three years working for the baseball program at Spalding University as a pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. He oversaw three pitchers who were named All-SLIAC in 2019.

In 2017-18, Sheriff contributed as a volunteer assistant coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Prior to that, he worked nearby at Penn State - New Kensington as an assistant coach.

Since 2014, Sheriff has spent his summer days functioning as a general manager and head coach for Paul Carpenter Capital Advisors AAABA Baseball in his home state of Pennsylvania. He started his coaching career in 2015 with United High School in Armagh, Pa.

**KYLE PETTORUTO**

ASSISTANT COACH (INFIELD/RECRUITING)

Kyle Pettoruto is entering his third season with the Bearcats in 2026.

His roles include overseeing the recruiting efforts of the program, instructing infield play, and assisting in all areas of the offense.

In his role as recruiting coordinator, Pettoruto has helped bring top-level talent to Cincinnati. Each of the last two transfer portal classes have ranked in the Top 30 (15th in 2024, 29th in 2025) and the last two recruiting classes have been the highest-ranked ever in school history as well. The class signed in the fall of 2025 was ranked 26th nationally according to Perfect Game. Pettoruto's eye for talent has helped him coach and/or recruit 27 MLB Draft selections in his 12 years as a college coach.

The Bearcats were the top fielding team in the Big 12 in 2025 and one of the best in the country. UC's .979 fielding percentage led the league and ranked 20th in the nation.

Pettoruto coached Jack Natili and Landyn Vidourek to excellent 2025 campaigns. Natili, who transferred to UC prior to the season, was a second team All-Big 12 performer, and Vidourek earned honorable mention all-conference honors. Vidourek was drafted in the third round by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 2025 MLB Draft.

Pettoruto's helped mentor Big 12 Player of the Year and Golden Spikes Award and Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist and 2025 MLB Draft seventh-round selection Kerrington Cross to one of the best seasons ever by a Bearcat. Freshman Quinton Coats also took over the starting duties at first base midway through the season and earned Big 12 All-Freshman Team honors, and shortstop Charlie Niehaus was named to the Brooks Wallace Award midseason watch list, an award that annually honors the top shortstops in the country.

In total, Pettoruto has coached three Bearcats to MLB Draft selections, with first team all-conference honoree Josh Kross being taken in the sixth round by the St. Louis Cardinals in 2024.

Six UC hitters earned All-Big 12 honors in 2024, including first-team selection Josh Kross. Two-way player Christian Michelle was named to the second team while Lauden Brooks, Kerrington Cross, Josh Hegemann, and Tommy O'Connor were all honorable mention.

Under his tutelage, UC scored 423 runs in 2024, the highest single-season total since the 2008 campaign. UC averaged 7.4 runs per game, which ranked fourth in the Big 12. The Bearcats were also among the national leaders in walks (320, most in school history) and stolen bases (109) and ranked atop the league in HBP (91).

Pettoruto officially joined the Cincinnati baseball program on July 11, 2023. He came to UC after following a four-year stint as the hitting coach/assistant coach for Rutgers (2020-23).

He helped lead Rutgers to back-to-back top-5 league finishes, rebuilding a program that had not finished better than 10th in its entire Big Ten history prior to his arrival. The Scarlet Knights went 77-38 (.670) overall and 31-17 (.646) in the Big Ten over the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

Eleven players Pettoruto recruited to come to Rutgers went on to be drafted. That includes third-rounder Josh Kuroda (2024), 16th-rounder Nick Cimillo (2022), and 19th-rounder Tony Santa Maria (2024), who he coached while with the program.

Prior to his time at Rutgers, Pettoruto spent six seasons at Bryant and was a part of six straight Northeast Conference regular season championships and two NCAA Tournament appearances.

He played a role in producing 40 All-NEC selections, 46 All-New England selections, six ABCA All-Northeast selections, two NEC and New England Players of the Year, four NEC Rookies of the Year, two New England Rookies of the Year, one Collegiate Baseball Freshman Player of the Year and four Freshman All-Americans in his six seasons at Bryant.

While at Bryant, he coached six players who went on to be MLB Draft selections: Matt Albanese (2016, 7th Round), Ryan Ward (2019 8th Round), Carl Anderson (2014, 19th Round), Tom Gavitt (2014, 19th Round), Jimmy Titus (2019, 22nd Round), and Mickey Gasper (2018, 27th round). Six others that he recruited to come to Bryant went on to be drafted as well.

Prior to Bryant, Pettoruto worked as an assistant coach with the North Shore Navigators in the Futures Collegiate Baseball League in the summer of the 2012. Following the summer, Pettoruto was hired as an assistant coach at Merrimack. He worked with the outfielders and the hitters, helping the Warriors set a school record for wins in the spring of 2013.

Pettoruto was a four-year letterwinner at the University of New Haven and helped the Chargers earn a spot in the 2010 NCAA Tournament.

**TOM WINSKE**

ASSISTANT COACH (OUTFIELD/BASERUNNING)

The 2026 season will be Tom Winske's third as an assistant coach at Cincinnati. He works with the Bearcat catchers and outfielders as well as overseeing bunting and baserunning.

Under Winske's tutelage, Cincinnati led all Power Four programs in bunt hits and ranked second in stolen bases. UC was one of the most successful teams on the bases, posting a 90.5% success rate on stolen bases (134-for-148). The 134 steals broke the previous single-season school record set in 2008.

Outfielder Landyn Vidourek earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors and was an incredible 39-for-40 on stolen bases, leading the Big 12 and ranking third among Power Four players in steals.

Catcher Jack Natili had a terrific season as well, earning Second Team All-Big 12 honors and Big 12 All-Tournament Team distinctions. Natili hit .338 with nine home runs, 53 RBI, 14 doubles, and a .451 on-base percentage.

Winske helped mentor one of the most exciting offenses in the Big 12 in 2024. The Bearcats were among the national leaders in walks (320, most in school history) and stolen bases (109) and ranked atop the league in HBP (91). Cincinnati's ability to get on base and take extra bases led to an average of 7.4 runs per game, which ranked fourth in the league.

His work with outfielder Josh Hegemann led to an honorable mention all-conference accolade for the senior, one of seven Bearcats to earn All-Big 12 honors in 2024.

Winske was hired as an assistant coach on July 11, 2023, resuming his longtime affiliation with head coach Jordan Bischel when the latter was named to lead the Cincinnati baseball program.

Winske came to Cincinnati from Central Michigan, where he served as a volunteer assistant coach from 2019 to 2023. He combined with Bischel to lead the Chippewas to four Mid-American Conference (MAC) championships -- two regular season and two tournament -- and three NCAA Tournament berths.

With Winske on the coaching staff, the Chippewas compiled an 102-32 MAC record and posted three consecutive 40-win full seasons for the first time since 1986-88. They won a combined 132 games in 2019, '21 and '22, marking the winningest three-year stretch in program history.

Winske came to CMU after a highly successful two-decade run as the head coach at NCAA Division III St. Norbert College in De Pere, Wis. He amassed a 444-287-1 career mark from 1999 to 2018 and is the Midwest Conference's all-time leader in both conference and overall wins. In January 2025, he was inducted into the St. Norbert College Athletics Hall of Fame.

Winske was named the Midwest Conference North Division Coach of the Year nine times in his 20 years at St. Norbert and led the Green Knights to four conference championships and five NCAA Tournament berths. His 2017 team won 30 games, the most victories in a season by any men's athletics team in St. Norbert history.

Bischel, a pitcher, played for Winske at St. Norbert from 2000 to 2003 and served as an assistant under his mentor from 2007-09.
