STORYLINES

No. 25 MSU, No. 14 LSU Clash In Primetime Home Opener

No. 25 Mississippi State opens its 2015 home and SEC slate as No. 13 LSU visits Davis Wade Stadium for an 8:15 p.m. CT kickoff live on ESPN.

- MSU opened the year with a 34-16 win at Southern Miss last Saturday, outscoring the Golden Eagles, 20-6 in the second half. **Dak Prescott** racked up 309 yards of total offense and accounted for three touchdowns while **Brandon Holloway** returned a kickoff 100 yards for a score.
- **Dan Mullen**, the 2014 National and AP Coach of the Year, is in his seventh season as head coach. At 47-31, he is in third place in MSU all-time wins. Mullen owns the highest winning percentage as a coach at MSU since College Football Hall of Famer Allyn McKeen from 1939-48 (.764). Prior to Mullen's arrival, MSU was 21-42.
- LSU leads the all-time series, 71-34-3, but MSU recorded its first win in Baton Rouge since 1991 last season by a score of 34-29. That victory ignited a streak of three straight wins over Top 10 teams, which eventually propelled the Bulldogs from unranked to No. 1 quicker than any team in history.
- **Dak Prescott**, a Heisman Trophy candidate, owns a 15-6 record as a starter and he has shattered 18 school records. For his career, the senior has scored 35 TDs (32 rush, 3 receiving) and been responsible for a school-record 75 TDs (43 passing, 32 rushing). Dak is 22 completions away from tying the MSU career record of 462 held by Wayne Madkin. Prescott has accounted for 607 yards of total offense in his career against LSU, including 386 in the win last season in Baton Rouge.
- Only once have the Bulldogs put up less than 420 yards of total offense when **Dak Prescott** starts (21 times) a game (South Carolina, 2013 with 385).
- MSU has produced at least 420 yards of total offense in 15 straight games dating back to 2013.
- The Bulldogs were picked to finish seventh in the SEC by the media. Three straight years and four out of six times under **Dan Mullen**, MSU has finished higher than the projection.
- This is the first of potentially six or seven games against ranked opponents for MSU. The Bulldogs were 3-3 vs. the ranked last season, including a 2-0 mark at home.
- Jr. DE **A.J. Jefferson**, in his first career start last week, racked up career highs in tackles (7) and sacks (2). Jefferson also stuffed USM at the goal line on fourth down late in the first half.
- Jr. LB **Richie Brown** was MSU's leading tackler in Week 1 with 11 tackles and one interception.

DAN MULLEN

No one has had more of a profound impact on shaping Mississippi State football into a national contender than Dan Mullen. The 2014 National and Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year, Mullen begins his seventh season in Starkville after guiding the Bulldogs into unprecedented territory, including the fastest ascent from unranked to No. 1 in college football history.

Seven years into his tenure, Mullen (47-31, .602) owns the highest winning percentage as a State coach since the late Allyn McKeen from 1939-48 (.764), and he is third in school history in victories (47). Prior to Mullen's arrival, the school record for consecutive bowl game appearances was three. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs have been to a school-record five consecutive bowl games, including their first Orange Bowl berth in 73 years in December 2014.

No coach in school history had ever been a finalist for a national coach of the year honor until Mullen won the Maxwell Football Club's National Coach of the Year award in 2014. He also claimed the Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year award that same fall.

The 2014 season was arguably the best in school history as Mullen's group won 10 regular season games for the first time and 10 overall for just the third time. The Bulldogs claimed six SEC wins -- the most by MSU since 1999 -- while finishing second in the difficult SEC West.

Mullen developed a team that went from unranked to No. 1 quicker than any in college football history (five weeks; Ohio State made the move in six weeks in 1964). The Bulldogs were the nation's No. 1 team for the first time in 80 years of Associated Press polls following wins over No. 6 Texas A&M and No. 2 Auburn during a raucous stretch in Davis Wade Stadium. MSU became the first team since 1983 Auburn to defeat three consecutive top-10 ranked teams. The Bulldogs also became the first squad to hold the No. 1 ranking in the inaugural College Football Playoff poll.

The year was capped with a berth in the Orange Bowl for the first time since 1941. Mullen's squad rewrote the MSU record books in 2014, shattering 22 single-season records, including 10 by National Player of the Year finalist Prescott. The Bulldogs led the SEC in total offense for the first time since 1982, putting up a school-record 513.8 yards per game. State earned its highest Associated Press poll finish since 1940 (No. 11), and it tied its highest finish ever in the USA Today Amway Coaches poll (No. 12).

MSU has shattered 67 team or individual single-season and career statistical records under Mullen. The Bulldogs have also produced a first-team All-America selection in five straight years. Linebacker Benardrick McKinney became the latest recipient in 2014 before being selected in the 2015 NFL Draft.

Player development has been key in Mullen's six previous seasons. Eighteen MSU players have been chosen in the NFL Draft under Mullen's watch since 2010. The five selections in 2015 were the most through the first six rounds of a draft in school history and the most overall in a draft since a school-record five went in 1995. Of the five Bulldogs drafted, three earned "two stars" in high school, while two were "three-star" recruits before arriving in Starkville. An additional school-record seven players signed NFL free agent contracts following the 2015 NFL Draft.

Off the field, Mullen's players are constant achievers in the classroom and the community donating countless hours to the Starkville area and state of Mississippi. Twenty Bulldogs were named to the 2014 SEC Academic Fall Honor Roll. During Mullen's entire six-year tenure at MSU, 110 players have earned the distinction of SEC Honor Roll recipient.

Mullen has helped the program improve its NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) nearly every year in his tenure, including the SEC's fourth-best football APR with a score of 974 in 2013. During the historic run to No. 1 in 2014, the Bulldogs' 2.76 grade point average was the program's highest ever while 20 of the 21 seniors have earned undergraduate degrees.

THE SERIES: MSU VS. LSU

MSU and LSU are meeting for the 109th time ... The Bulldogs have played LSU and Ole Miss more than any SEC opponent dating back to 1896 (108 times) ... The Tigers lead the all-time series 71-34-3 but MSU won the last meeting by a 34-29 decision in Baton Rouge on Sept. 20 last season ... That was the Bulldogs' first win over MSU since Oct. 23, 1999 in Starkville and first victory in Baton Rouge since Nov. 16, 1991 ... MSU became just the third team to beat LSU on Saturday night in Tiger Stadium in the Les Miles era (since 2005) ... The other two were No. 1 ranked teams (Florida, 2009; Alabama, 2012) ... MSU is 6-14-1 vs. LSU in Starkville ... The Bulldogs are seeking to defeat LSU in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1990-91.

THE LAST MEETING

MSU **34** Sept. 20, 2014 • Tiger Stadium

Dak Prescott accounted for 373 yards of total offense, rushed for a touchdown and threw for two more to lead MSU to its first win over LSU in Baton Rouge since 1991 by a score of 34-29. The Bulldogs never trailed, jumping out to a 17-3 lead at the half. Prescott got MSU on the board in its first drive on a 9-yard touchdown pass to **De'Runnya Wilson**. Two possessions later, the Bulldogs went 98 yards, culminating with a Josh Robinson 3-yard TD run. Following a fumble recovery for a TD by LSU's Danielle Hunter, Prescott quieted the crowd with a spectacular 56-yard TD scamper through the heart of the Tiger defense that put MSU up 24-10 with 12:44 remaining in the third quarter. The Bulldogs extended the lead when Prescott extended a play with his feet and found Jameon Lewis for a 74-yard TD pass down the sideline. LSU responded with 19 unanswered points in the final 12:34 and the Bulldogs held on for the win when **Will Redmond** intercepted a Hail Mary pass at the goal line as time expired. Robinson finished with a career-best 197 yards and one touchdown.

THE NOTEBOOK

MSU, LSU TIES

MSU co-offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach **Billy Gonzales** spent two seasons as the passing game coordinator/wide receivers coach at LSU under Les Miles from 2010-11. Gonzales was a member of the Tigers' 2011 SEC Championship team and 2012 BCS Championship Game squad, coaching the likes of NFL standouts Odell Beckham Jr., Jarvis Landry and Rueben Randle ... Both starting quarterbacks in this game MSU's **Dak Prescott** and LSU's Brandon Harris hail from the Shreveport, La., area. They grew up within 15 miles of each other.

DAK PRESCOTT VS. LSU

Few SEC quarterbacks have had the kind of success **Dak Prescott** has had against LSU. Prescott, a Haughton, La., native has racked up 607 yards of total offense and rushed for back-to-back 100-yard games against the Tigers.

- Last season, he became the first quarterback to rush for 100 yards and throw for over 200 yards against LSU in the same game since at least 1993. By comparison, Auburn's Cam Newton only had one 100-yard rushing game against LSU, while Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel never did it.
- Prescott is the only player to register multiple 100-yard rushing games against LSU since 2008. The last player with multiple 100-yard rushing games in a career against the Tigers was Arkansas' Darren McFadden in 2006 and 2007.
- Prescott is seeking to become just the fifth starting quarterback to defeat LSU in back-to-back seasons in the past 15 years (since 2000). Alabama's A.J. McCarron did it three in a row from 2011 BCS title game to 2013; Ole Miss' Jevan Snead 2008-09; Arkansas' Casey Dick 2007-08 and Florida's Rex Grossman 2000-01.

GRADUATES & SCHOLARS

Four players on the 2015 MSU roster have already received their undergraduate degrees and all four are starters: CB **Taveze Calhoun** (interdisciplinary studies), OG **Justin Malone** (criminology), QB **Dak Prescott** (educational psychology) and OT **Justin Senior** (political science). Both Malone and Prescott earned their degrees last December prior to the Orange Bowl. Calhoun graduated in the spring, and Senior is MSU's most recent graduate in August 2015. Prescott is on pace to receive his master's degree in workforce leadership this December. Calhoun, a four-time SEC Honor Roll recipient, is a National Football Foundation scholar-athlete nominee with a 3.5 grade point average. Junior linebacker **Richie Brown** currently owns a 3.8 GPA in industrial technology. In the fall of 2014, MSU's 2.76 team grade point average was its highest ever.

EIGHT-GAME HOME WINNING STREAK

State brings an eight-game home winning streak into the LSU contest, which is the sixth-longest in school history. The streak is the longest by MSU since winning 16 in a row from 1998-2000. Last season, the Bulldogs completed the first undefeated home season since 1999 and tied the school record for home wins (7, 1999 as well). The current home win streak began on Nov. 28, 2013 with a victory over Ole Miss. The Bulldogs have not lost a home game since Nov. 16, 2013 (20-3, #1 Alabama). MSU is outscoring opponents 312-124 during the current home streak. The Bulldogs are 18-3 in the last three seasons at home and 28-13 all-time in Davis Wade Stadium under **Dan Mullen**. All three losses were to top-16 ranked teams.

RECORD 50,000+ SEASON TICKETS SOLD

MSU has sold over 50,000 season tickets for the first time in school history. The previous high for was 45,575 last year, and prior to that was 43,894 in 2013. Last August, a \$75 million expansion and renovation of Davis Wade Stadium was completed. With the net increase of 6,255 seats, the capacity now sits at 61,337. In 2014, the Bulldogs set attendance records in single-season total attendance (427,892), single-game average attendance (61,127) and single-game attendance (62,945).

IN THE POLLS

MSU moved into the Associated Press Top 25 at No. 25 on Tuesday and is the first team receiving votes in the Amway Coaches Poll. The Bulldogs finished the 2014 campaign No. 11 in the AP

rankings - its highest finish since No. 9 in 1940 and second-highest finish ever -- and No. 12 in the Coaches poll. It tied the 1999 squad as its highest Coaches poll finish ever. The Bulldogs spent five straight week's as the nation's No. 1 ranked team last season. Following a 38-23 win over then-No. 2 Auburn, the Bulldogs vaulted to No. 1 in the polls on Oct. 12 for the first time in the 115-year history of the program. The Bulldogs were the first team in the Associated Press poll's 78-year history to go from unranked to No. 1 in five weeks. The previous mark was six weeks by Ohio State in 1954. MSU has been ranked in 11 out of the last 12 polls.

MULLEN THIRD IN MSU ALL-TIME WINS WITH 47

Dan Mullen, the 2014 Maxwell Football National Coach of the Year and Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year, has spearheaded Mississippi State to unprecedented success in now his seventh year. With a 47-31 (.602) record, the 43-year-old is just the third coach in school history to win 47 games and the quickest to do it since Allyn McKeen in 1944. McKeen, a College Football Hall of Famer, and Mullen are the only two coaches in school history to post 45 wins and own a winning percentage over .500. Mullen has led MSU to five consecutive bowl games for the first time in school history while recording a school-record three bowl wins.

MSU IN HOME, SEC OPENERS

MSU is 86-26-2 (.761) in home openers and 27-52-2 (.340) in SEC openers all-time. This is the 16th time the Bulldogs open the home slate against an SEC team and they are 9-6 in those previous contests. State has won three straight SEC home openers and is 5-1 in home openers under **Dan Mullen**. The only loss in that stretch was to No. 3 LSU on Sept. 15, 2011.

BRANDON HOLLOWAY, ALL THE WAY

At 5-foot-8, he is the shortest player on the team but **Brandon Holloway's** impact was felt in a big way in the season-opener at Southern Miss. With 4.4 speed, Holloway showed it, returning a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown to put the Bulldogs on the board with 5:26 to go in the first quarter.

• It tied the school record for longest kickoff return and was the fourth 100-yard kickoff return in school history. Others to do it: Jameon Lewis vs. Ole Miss (Nov. 24, 2012), Fred Reid vs. Memphis (Oct. 11, 2003) and Glen Young (Nov. 15, 1980).

• Holloway had the only kickoff return for a TD by an SEC player in week 1 and was one of only three FBS players in week 1 with a 100-yard kickoff return for a TD. Others to do it: Burns of Kansas State and Phillips of Western Michigan.

• The junior became the only player in school history with multiple kickoff returns of 95 yards or more in a career. He tallied a total of 135 total yards on his first two touches of the opener.

10 FIRST-TIME STARTERS

A total of 10 Bulldogs made their first career start in the season-opener at Southern Miss: **A.J. Jefferson** (DE), **Nick James** (DT), **Zach Jackson** (LB), **Richie Brown** (LB), **Kivon Coman** (FS), **Tolando Cleveland** (DB), **Rufus Warren** (LT), **Jamaal Clayborn** (C), **Ashton Shumpert** (RB) and **Gus Walley** (TE).

15 BULLDOG DEBUTS

Fifteen Bulldogs made their MSU debuts in the season-opener at Southern Miss (three junior college transfers, nine redshirt freshmen and three true freshmen): **LB Gerri Green** (RFr.), **S Brandon Bryant** (RFr.), **S Jamal Peters** (Fr.), **CB Chris Rayford** (RFr.), **DE Will Coleman** (Junior College Transfer), **WR Malik Dear** (Fr.), **DE Johnathan Calvin** (Junior College Transfer), **OG Deion Calhoun** (RFr.), **WR Donald Gray** (Junior College Transfer), **TE Justin Johnson** (Fr.), **WR Jesse Jackson** (RFr.), **RB Aeris Williams** (RFr.), **RB Dontavian Lee** (RFr.) and **QB Nick Fitzgerald** (RFr.) and **OT Elton Jenkins** (RFr.). Johnson, in his first collegiate game as a true freshman, caught a 5-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter.

JUSTIN SENIOR ONLY CANADIAN IN THE SEC

Justin Senior, MSU's most experienced offensive lineman with 15 career starts, is the SEC's only current football player who hails from Canada. Senior is one of 14 Canadian natives who are currently playing in the Power 5 Conferences. Senior grew up in Montreal, Quebec, before attending Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Virginia. Senior started all 13 games last season at right tackle.

RETURN OF THE DAK: PRESCOTT SET FOR ENCORE

Dak Prescott delivered the most prolific season by a quarterback in State history in 2014. He elected to return for his senior season where he hopes to make more history. Prescott owns a 15-6 record as a starter and is a candidate for every National Player of the Year award. Dak finished eighth in the Heisman Trophy vote last season, marking the highest finish by an MSU player in the award's storied history.

- Dak is seeking to become the second player in SEC history to rush for 40 touchdowns and throw for 40 touchdowns in a career. Another **Dan Mullen** protege is the record holder (Tim Tebow). Prescott is eight rushing TDs shy of achieving the feat. He has rushed for 32 scores and thrown for 43.
- Prescott is attempting to become only the third FBS quarterback in the last 20 years to rush for 10 touchdowns in three straight seasons. Tebow and former Nevada QB/current San Francisco 49er Colin Kaepernick both did it.

DAK PRESCOTT, MSU SCHOOL RECORD HOLDER

QB **Dak Prescott** has broken 18 MSU school records (12 single-season and six career), and he is closing in on more:

- The latest record fell in the season-opener at Southern Miss. With his two passing touchdowns, Dak eclipsed Tyler Russell's school career record mark of 42. Prescott has thrown 43 in his career.
- Dak is **516** yards shy of tying the MSU career record for passing yards owned by Wayne Madkin (1998-2001). Prescott has thrown for 5,820 yards in four seasons.
- Dak is **22** completions away from tying the MSU career record, also owned by Madkin. Prescott is 440-of-730 during his career.
- Dak moved up to 18th all-time in SEC career touchdowns responsible for, and he is **8** shy of cracking the top 10. Tim Tebow, another **Dan Mullen** protege, owns the record with 145.
- Dak is **275** rushing yards away from tying John Bond's (1980-83) MSU career record for rushing yards by a quarterback. Prescott is 962 yards from tying Tebow's SEC record. Dak has rushed for 2,005 yards during his career, which is fifth in SEC history. He is **164** rushing yards away from tying fourth-place owned by Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel.
- Prescott already own school career records for touchdowns responsible (75), total offense (7,825), completion percentage (.603), 200-yard passing games (18), interception percentage (.0260) and passing touchdowns (43).

MANNY DIAZ RETURNS TO STARKVEGAS

A familiar face will be roaming the sideline as Bulldog defensive coordinator and linebackers coach in 2015. **Manny Diaz**, who spent the 2014 campaign as DC at Louisiana Tech, returns to Mississippi State after serving in the same role in 2010. Diaz developed 10 players on that 2010 Bulldog team who went on to sign NFL contracts, including six who were in the 2015 NFL playoffs. Diaz' 2014 Louisiana Tech team led the nation in turnovers gained (40). MSU's 2010 defense ranked among the top 25 nationally in scoring defense, rushing defense and tackles for loss. Diaz replaces Geoff Collins, who is currently defensive coordinator at Florida.

RETURNING FROM INJURY

MSU welcomed the return of several players who saw their 2014 seasons be cut short due to injury. S **Kendrick Market**, the leader of the secondary, ruptured his Achilles tendon in the first half of last November's Egg Bowl matchup against Ole Miss. After a diligent rehab and sitting out the spring, the senior Market made the start at Southern Miss. CB **Cedric Jiles**, who played as a true freshman in 2012 and a sophomore in 2013, missed the 2014 campaign after suffering a season-ending hamstring injury during a camp scrimmage in August 2014. He came off the bench against USM. LB **Dezmond Harris** played in the first six games of the 2014 season before suffering a torn ACL against Auburn on Oct. 11, 2014. He missed the final seven games of the year. OT **Damien Robinson**, a sixth-year senior, was slated to start at tackle in 2014 but tore his ACL during August 2014 camp.

ONE OF THE SEC'S BEST CORNERBACK TANDEMS

State will boast one of the SEC and nation's top cornerback tandems in 2015. Seniors **Will Redmond** and **Taveze Calhoun** have played a combined 59 career games. Calhoun is in his third year as a full-time starter. Calhoun tied for the team lead and ranked eighth in the SEC in pass breakups last season with nine. Both are ranked among the top senior cornerback prospects for the 2016 NFL Draft. ESPN's Mel Kiper ranks Redmond as the top senior cornerback in the nation.

DEEP RECEIVING CORPS

Co-offensive coordinator **Billy Gonzales** calls the 2015 MSU receiving corps one of the deepest he has ever had in his career. Bulldog receivers accounted for 2,608 yards through the air last season and 81.1 percent of that returns in 2015. MSU led the nation in number of players with a touchdown reception last season with 12. All-American candidate **De'Runnya Wilson** leads the way after a sophomore season in which he caught 47 passes for 680 yards and nine touchdowns. Wilson tied for the national lead and led the SEC in third-down touchdowns with five in 2014. The Birmingham, Alabama, native has recorded 100-yard receiving games in two out of the last three contests. He has 117 at Ole Miss and 105 in the Orange Bowl to close out last season.

MISSISSIPPI STATE OF MIND

Of the 105 players who make up Mississippi State's roster, 60 of them hail from the state of Mississippi (57.1 percent of the roster). 111 of MSU's 176 signees since 2009 (63 percent) are Mississippi natives. By comparison: Southern Miss is 39 percent and Ole Miss 37 percent.

MSU Pulls Away From Southern Miss, 34-16

Dak Prescott threw for two touchdowns, rushed for another and accounted for 309 yards of total offense as Mississippi State pulled away from a much-improved Southern Miss squad, 34-16, in the first meeting between the two teams in Hattiesburg since 1989. **Brandon Holloway** got the scoring going for the Bulldogs, answering a USM field goal with a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown with 5:26 remaining in the first quarter. Trailing 10-7 midway through the second quarter, Prescott found true freshman **Justin Johnson** for a 5-yard TD strike. The Bulldogs held USM short of the goal line on four straight plays from inside the 3-yard line to take a 14-10 lead into the half. Prescott culminated a nine-play, 95-yard drive escaping and finding **Gus Walley** for a 4-yard touchdown pass with 12:15 to go in the third quarter. The big play of the drive was Prescott's 49-yard scamper down the sideline to set up the score. **Westin Graves** booted the first made field goals of his career to tack on the lead and Prescott closed the scoring with a 7-yard TD run with 5:55 remaining. Prescott finished with 72 yards on the ground and 237 yards through the air. **Richie Brown** was MSU's leading tackler with 11 and one interception. A.J. Jefferson notched seven tackles, including two sacks. Jefferson provided the crucial fourth down stop that prevented the Golden Eagles from scoring before the first half. **Will Redmond** added an interception.
