RED RAIDERS ARE BOWLING FOR 39TH TIME

- Texas Tech will make its 39th bowl appearance in school history Dec. 28 when the Red Raiders face Mississippi State in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis. This will be Tech's first-ever trip to the Liberty Bowl as the Red Raiders are 14-23-1 all-time in bowl games after wins in nine of their last 13 contests.
- Texas Tech has historically ranked among the most frequent bowl participants in college football history as the Red Raiders currently rank tied for 21st nationally and tied for third in the Big 12 for all-time postseason appearances.



RECORD BOOK WATCH FOR LIBERTY BOWL

- Texas Tech will be keeping an eye on the record book throughout the AutoZone Liberty Bowl as several Red Raiders could potentially place their name among the all-time greats in school history. In particular, Austin McNamara could snap the Tech single-season mark for punting average as he enters the bowl averaging an impressive 48.4 yards per attempt.
- On the defensive side, linebacker Colin Schooler needs two solo tackles to move into the top five in NCAA FBS history as he enters the bowl game ranked seventh with 307 solo stops. Riko Jeffers, meanwhile, is six tackles shy of becoming the 15th Red Raider in history to record 300 career stops.



ONE FINAL TIME FOR TECH SENIORS

- Texas Tech will say goodbye to several seniors following the AutoZone Liberty Bowl as the matchup with Mississippi State will be the final contest for the likes of Colin Schooler, Riko Jeffers, Dawson Deaton, DaMarcus Fields and Josh Burger, among others.
- With a win over Mississippi State, Texas Tech will send its seniors out by clinching its first winning season since 2015 when the Red Raiders finished 7-6 overall after a loss in the Texas Bowl. The Red Raiders are making their first bowl appearance since 2017 when Tech fell to South Florida in the Birmingham Bowl.

TEAM NOTEBOOK

TEXAS TECH, MISSISSIPPI STATE SET FOR FIRST MEETING IN 50 YEARS

- Texas Tech and Mississippi State will face each other for the first time since 1970 at the Liberty Bowl in what will be only the eighth all-time meeting between the two schools. Mississippi State controls the series with a 4-2-1 advantage entering the bowl game.
- This will be the first time the two schools have ever met in a bowl game as Mississippi State becomes the 34th different postseason opponent for the Red Raiders in program history.
- The Liberty Bowl will mark the first meeting between the two schools in more than 50 years as Texas Tech and Mississippi State last met in 1970 to wrap a four game home-and-home series. The Red Raiders were 0-3-1 against the Bulldogs during that stretch with each of the two road games taking place in Jackson, Mississippi, south of the Starkville campus.
- Texas Tech topped No. 18 Mississippi State, 27-20, in the first-ever meeting between the two schools in 1953. The victory was part of an 11-1 season for the Red Raiders, who set the school record for wins that season following a victory over No. 17 Auburn in the Gator Bowl. That bowl appearance is best remembered by the debut of the Masked Rider as Joe Kirk Fulton led Texas Tech onto the field in what is still one of the most-memorable entrances in college football history.

TEXAS TECH VERSUS THE SEC

- Texas Tech will be facing an opponent from the Southeastern Conference for the first time since 2018 when the Red Raiders opened the season against Ole Miss in the AdvoCare Texas Kickoff at NRG Stadium in Houston. It will be only the 11th time the Red Raiders have faced an SEC opponent since becoming a Big 12 Conference member in 1996.
- The Red Raiders are 6-17-2 all-time against members of the SEC, excluding former Big 12 Conference members Missouri and Texas A&M, who both departed the league following the 2011 season. Missouri faced the Red Raiders only one time as non-conference foes - a 41-14 rout for Texas Tech early in the 1995 season - before joining the Big 12 prior to the 1996 campaign. Texas A&M and Texas Tech, meanwhile, were longtime Southwest Conference and Big 12 rivals from 1960 up until the Aggies leaving the Big 12 in 2011. The two in-state rivals met 18 times prior
- The Red Raiders are 3-8 against SEC members since joining the Big 12 with two of those three victories coming against Ole Miss. Texas Tech swept a home-and-home agreement with the Rebels during the 2002 and 2003 seasons and then topped Arkansas in Fayetteville early in the 2015 campaign.
- This will be the ninth time in history where the Red Raiders have faced an SEC opponent in a bowl and the first time since 2015 when Texas Tech fell to No. 22 LSU in the AdvoCare Texas Bowl. The Red Raiders are 2-5-1 all-time in bowl games against SEC foes with their two wins coming in the 1953 Gator Bowl versus No. 17 Auburn and then the 1973 Gator Bowl over No. 20 Tennessee.

TEXAS TECH ALL-TIME IN BOWL GAMES

- The Red Raiders advanced to a bowl game for the 39th time in school history with its thrilling victory over Iowa State on Nov. 13 that was capped by a 62-yard field goal from **Jonathan Garibay** as time expired. Texas Tech ranks tied for 21st among NCAA FBS programs and tied for third with West Virginia among Big 12 schools in all-time bowl appearances. The Red Raiders trail only fellow Big 12 members Texas (57) and Oklahoma (54) in all-time bowl appearances. Oklahoma will be making its 55th all-time bowl trip this season.
- Texas Tech is 14-23-1 all-time in bowl games with wins in nine of its last 13 contests. The Red Raiders are making their first bowl appearance since 2017 when Tech fell to USF in the Birmingham Bowl.
- The AutoZone Liberty Bowl becomes the 17th different bowl game Texas Tech has attended in its history and the first in the state of Tennessee. The Liberty Bowl joined the Big 12 Conference rotation of bowl ties starting with the 2014 season.
- This will be just Texas Tech's 17th bowl appearance outside the state of Texas. Of the Red Raiders' 16 bowl appearances since 2000,

Recap: Sonny Cumbie was the offensive coordinator for the Red Raiders the last time Texas Tech entered a bowl game with an interim head coach, which came at the 2012 Meineke Car Care Bowl. Cumbie and interim head coach Chris Thomsen pushed the Red Raiders to a 34-31 come-from-behind victory over Minnesota, which was sealed by a 28-yard field goal from Ryan Bustin as time expired. Seth Doege threw for 271 yards and a touchdown and rushed for one other to earn MVP honors.

Texas Tech is 2-0-1 all-time on Dec. 28 as the Red Raiders also recorded a memorable win over No. 20 Duke in the 1989 All-American Bowl hosted at Legion Field in Birmingham, Alabama. Ironically, that was also the site for Texas Tech's last bowl appearance, which came at the 2017 Birmingham Bowl.

only six were located outside the state of Texas (2002 Tangerine, 2004 Holiday, 2006 Insight, 2007 Gator, 2013 Holiday, 2017 Birmingham-ham). The Red Raiders are a combined 5-1 in those games during that span with the lone loss coming in the 2017 Birmingham Bowl. Tech is 9-6-1 in its history in bowl games located outside the state of Texas.

■ This will be the third time in school history where an interim head coach will lead the Red Raiders in a bowl game. **Ruffin McNeil** previously led the Red Raiders to a 41-31 victory over Michigan State in the 2009 Alamo Bowl, while **Chris Thomsen** did the same with a 34-31 win over Minnesota in the 2012 Meineke Car Care Bowl. Ironically, **Sonny Cumbie** was involved with both of those wins as he was promoted from a graduate assistant to an assistant coach for the Alamo Bowl in 2009 and then was the offensive coordinator for Texas Tech's win in Houston a few years later.

TEXAS TECH-MISSISSIPPI STATE CONNECTIONS

■ There are several significant ties between the two schools in the Liberty Bowl, none more immediately recognizable than the connection between the two head coaches. Mississippi State will be led by **Mike Leach**, who served as Texas Tech's head coach from 2000-09 and coached the Red Raiders' interim head coach **Sonny Cumbie** for the duration of his college career. Leach remains the winningest head coach in program history as he compiled an 84-43 record with a bowl appearance in each of his 10 seasons.

■ Leach is the first former head coach to face Texas Tech from the opposing sideline since **David McWilliams** did so with Texas during the 1987-91 seasons. McWilliams was the head coach at Texas Tech for only one season (1986) prior to accepting the role at Texas.

■ Speaking of bowl appearances, Cumbie led the Red Raiders to one of their most memorable wins in school history to wrap his career in 2004 as Texas Tech downed No. 4 Cal, 45-31, in the Holiday Bowl. Cumbie, with Leach as his head coach and offensive coordinator, threw for a Texas Tech bowl record of 520 yards and three touchdowns in the win, which came over a Cal program that featured future NFL greats in Aaron Rodgers and Marshawn Lynch.

■ Overall, the Liberty Bowl will have five graduates of Texas Tech University on either of the two staffs as Texas Tech's features interim head coach **Sonny Cumbie** (2004) and outside receivers coach **Joel Filani** (2006), while Mississippi State's staff includes former Red Raider great **Darcel McBath** (2008). Texas Tech also has two other support staff members that are alumni in Associate A.D. for Football Administration **Antonio Huffman** (2006) and assistant director for player development **Sammy Morris** (1999).

■ Huffman, in particular, is an experienced former member of Leach's staff as he served as Director of Player Personnel during his first stint on the Texas Tech staff from 2008-09 before later working as the Director of Football Operations under Leach at Washington State from 2012-18. Filani was also on the Washington State staff in 2015 as he served as an offensive quality control coach.

■ In addition to being former teammates, Filani and McBath worked alongside each other for one season at North Texas in 2016. Filani was the outside receivers coach for the Mean Green that season, while McBath was serving in his first coaching position as a defensive quality control coach following five seasons playing in the NFL after his Texas Tech career.

■ On the Mississippi State sideline, the Bulldogs have two staff members who previously worked at Texas Tech in special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach **Matt Brock** and Senior Associate A.D. for Football **Dave Emerick**. Brock was a defensive quality control assistant for the Red Raiders from 2013-15, briefly serving as the interim inside linebackers coach for the final nine games of the 2014 season. Emerick, meanwhile, was on the Texas Tech staff from 2004-09 under Leach, rising to Chief of Staff his final two seasons.

■ Mississippi State running backs coach **Eric Mele** has worked alongside both Huffman and Filani as he was an offensive quality control assistant at Washington State from 2012-14 before being promoted to a full-time assistant for 2015-19.

■ Texas Tech boasts only one player on its roster from the state of Mississippi in junior defensive back **Cam White**, who hails from Flora, which is roughly 120 miles from the Mississippi State campus. White previously played at Northwest Mississippi before transferring to Texas Tech prior to the 2020 campaign.

HEADING HOME

■ The trip to the Liberty Bowl was a welcome selection for one Memphis native on the Red Raider football roster, junior defensive back **Rayshad Williams**. A product of Whitehaven High School in Memphis, Williams will be playing in his hometown for the first time as a college student-athlete as he previously starred at UCLA prior to transferring to Texas Tech this offseason.

■ Williams, an honorable mention All-Big 12 selection after starting in 11 games at cornerback this season, has been tabbed "Jazzy" as a nickname by defensive coordinator **Keith Patterson**, who cited his hometown as the reason. Williams was a top-25 recruit in the state of Tennessee as part of the 2018 class following a memorable high school career where he helped lead Whitehaven to the Class 6A state title as a junior in 2016.

■ While it may not be their hometown, Texas Tech does have two staff members who previously resided in the birthplace to rock 'n' roll as associate head coach and secondary coach **Derek Jones** was on the University of Memphis staff as the cornerbacks coach in 2007, while defensive line coach **Paul Randolph** served in a similar role for the Tigers from 2016-18 prior to accepting his position at Texas Tech.

CUMBIE, PATTERSON NAMED HEAD COACHES AT LA TECH, ACU

■ When the AutoZone Liberty Bowl is finished, both of Texas Tech's two coordinators will resume head coaching duties elsewhere as **Sonny Cumbie** was named the head coach at Louisiana Tech following the completion of the regular season, while **Keith Patterson** was tabbed to lead the football program at Abilene Christian. It is the first collegiate head coaching opportunity for both in their respective careers, although both have served in the role on an interim basis.

■ Cumbie is wrapping his first stint as an interim head coach, a role Patterson knows well himself after leading Pitt in the 2011 BBVA Compass Bowl and then the Red Raiders in the 2020 season finale against Kansas. He is 1-1 in his career following Texas Tech's 16-13 victory over the Jayhawks a year ago as he was subbing in for Matt Wells, who was in COVID-19 protocols.

■ Cumbie earned his first career win as a head coach against Iowa State as the Texas Tech alumnus led the Red Raiders to a dominating first half versus the Cyclones, building a 17-point lead before eventually winning the game on a 62-yard field goal from **Jonathan Garibay** as time expired.

■ Texas Tech Director of Athletics **Kirby Hocutt** announced Oct. 25 a change in leadership for the Red Raider football program after head coach **Matt Wells** was relieved of his duties, effective immediately. Hocutt tabbed Cumbie to serve as interim head coach for the remainder of the season. He has continued in his role as offensive coordinator during this transition. Hocutt tabbed former Baylor associate head coach **Joey McGuire** as the 17th head coach in program history on Nov. 9.

■ Over its now 96 seasons of football, Cumbie is only the third interim head coach in program history, joining both **Ruffin McNeil** and **Chris Thomsen**. McNeil and Thomsen both led the Red Raiders to a victory in their only games as head coach, which came at the 2009 Alamo Bowl as well as the 2012 Meineke Car Care Bowl of Texas. Cumbie was an assistant on the Tech staff in both of those seasons and was the Red Raiders' play-caller for its win over Minnesota in 2012. Cumbie is the first head coach in the history of the program who took over in the middle of the season.

■ Texas Tech will have nine of its 10 assistant coaches from the regular season available for the bowl game as former special teams coordinator **Mark Tommerdahl** is the only coach who will not make the bowl trip. In his place, running backs coach **DeAndre Smith** will oversee the special teams efforts with various assistant coaches splitting individual units. The list of assistant coaches available includes **Jake Brown**, who was promoted to a full-time assistant coach after Cumbie was named interim head coach in late October.

RANDOM TIDBITS HEADING INTO BOWL WEEK

- With a win over Mississippi State in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, Texas Tech will clinch its first winning season since 2015 when the Red Raiders finished 7-6 overall after a loss in the Texas Bowl. The Red Raiders advanced to a bowl in 2017, finishing 6-6 in the regular season before a loss to South Florida in the Birmingham Bowl.
- Texas Tech needs to hit the 30-point mark against the Bulldogs to average at least 30.0 points per game for the 19th time in the past 20 seasons. The Red Raiders, who averaged only 29.1 points per game in 2020, have not been held under 30.0 points per contest in consecutive seasons since a five-year run from 1996-2000.
- Texas Tech is 7-6 during the month of December as Big 12 Conference members (since 1996).
- Texas Tech will be making only its second appearance in the state of Tennessee as the Red Raiders previously opened the 1997 season at No. 5 Tennessee. The Red Raiders have faced the Vols twice in its history as the two schools also met in the 1973 Gator Bowl. Tech has also faced fellow Tennessee school Vanderbilt once, which ended in a 6-6 tie in the 1974 Peach Bowl.
- A victory over Mississippi State would mark Texas Tech's fourth away from home this season as the Red Raiders previously opened the season with a neutral site win at Houston followed by road wins at both West Virginia and Kansas. The Red Raiders have not secured four wins away from home in a season since 2017 when Tech headed home with victories over Houston, Kansas, Baylor (AT&T Stadium - Arlington) and Texas.
- Texas Tech is 8-14-1 all-time in bowl games against unranked opponents, which includes a 6-5 mark as a Big 12 Conference member. This will be the sixth time Tech has faced an unranked opponent in its last eight bowl appearances as the Red Raiders are 3-2 during that stretch with wins over Minnesota (2012 Meineke Car Care), Northwestern (2010 TicketCity) and Michigan State (2009 Alamo).
- The victory over Iowa State followed Texas Tech's only open weekend of the 2021 season as the Red Raiders improved to 18-13 during the Big 12 era in the week following an open date. The Red Raiders have now won three of their last five games following an open date after topping West Virginia during both the 2019 and 2020 seasons. Tech also had losses to No. 8 Texas and No. 23 Oklahoma State last season during that span.
- Texas Tech's first two conference wins this season came on the road as the Red Raiders won at West Virginia and Kansas. It marked the first time Tech has secured back-to-back Big 12 road wins since 2018 when the Red Raiders opened their league slate with a 41-17 rout of No. 15 Oklahoma State and then followed with a 17-14 victory at TCU.
- Texas Tech's kickoff unit will once again face a tough task in the Liberty Bowl as Mississippi State enters the game ranked fifth nationally, averaging 29.0 yards per return this season. The Red Raiders currently ranks 31st in the FBS for kickoff return defense as Tech is giving up only 18.7 yards per attempt this season.

TEXAS TECH LANDS SIX RED RAIDERS ON ALL-BIG 12 TEAMS

- Texas Tech senior place kicker **Jonathan Garibay** was named a first team All-Big 12 selection while five others were picked for the second team and 11 held nods for honorable mention, the league announced following the regular season. Selections are made by the league's 10 head coaches, who are not permitted to vote for their own players.
- Joining Garibay on the All-Big 12 teams were seniors **Dawson Deaton** (OL), **Colin Schooler** (LB), **DaMarcus Fields** (DB), junior **Erik Ezukanma** (WR) and sophomore **Austin McNamara** (P), who were all second team honorees.
- Additional accolades included honorable mention nods for senior offensive linemen **Josh Burger** and **T.J. Storment**, senior tight end **Travis Koontz**, junior defensive tackle **Jaylon Hutchings** and junior defensive end **Tyree Wilson**, senior linebacker **Riko Jeffers** and junior defensive backs **Dadrion Taylor-Demerson**, **Reggie Pearson Jr.** and **Rayshad Williams**. Also earning honorable mentions distinctions were Deaton for Offensive Lineman of the Year, Garibay for Special Teams Player of the Year, **Kaylon Geiger Sr.** for Offensive Newcomer of the Year and Williams for Defensive Newcomer of the Year.

NO FLAGS TO BE SEEN THIS SEASON

- With a strong performance against Mississippi State, Texas Tech could potentially wrap one of its best seasons in recent memory when it relates to penalties as the Red Raiders currently rank 23rd nationally in fewest penalty yards (530), 25th for both fewest penalties (62) and fewest penalty yards per game (44.2) and then 31st for fewest penalties per game (5.2).
- As it stands now, Texas Tech needs to commit four or fewer penalties in the Liberty Bowl to mark its fewest in a season dating back to the start of the 2000 campaign. The Red Raiders were flagged only 67 times during the 2020 campaign, a season that featured only 10 games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Tech was also penalized for 577 yards during that season. In a normal season that features at least 12 games, Tech's previous best performances by total penalties came in 2019 when the Red Raiders were flagged 75 times and then 2001 when they had 674 penalty yards.
- When it pertains to penalties on a per game basis, Texas Tech can ensure its best season pertaining to flags since 2000 by drawing 15 or fewer flags and 132 penalty yards against the Bulldogs. The Red Raiders' best two seasons during that span previously came in 2010 when Tech averaged just 6.0 flags per game and then 2002 with 51.0 penalty yards per game.
- Texas Tech was flagged only one time for five yards at Kansas as a false start penalty in the fourth quarter pushed **Jonathan Garibay** back for a 48-yard field goal attempt. It marked a school-record fifth time the Red Raiders were only penalized one time as Texas Tech also had only one flag in 1988 versus Arkansas, 1991 versus Rice, 1992 against Texas A&M and 2016 at TCU. Texas Tech's school record for fewest penalty yards also came in three of those games previously with the lone exception being the 1991 contest with Rice.
- The performance against Kansas followed similar disciplined approaches against both West Virginia (2 penalties, 20 yards) and TCU (4 penalties, 25 yards) where the Red Raiders combined for only six flags for 45 yards. Texas Tech was flagged 12 times for 90 yards over a four-game stretch against West Virginia, TCU, Kansas and Kansas State before committing only three for 38 yards in the regular-season finale at Baylor.

DEGREES IN HAND

- Texas Tech entered the 2021 season with 16 student-athletes who are current college graduates, including seven who earned their undergraduate degrees in Lubbock. The list of Tech graduates included **Seth Collins**, **Dawson Deaton**, **Riko Jeffers**, **McLane Mannix**, **DaMarcus Fields** and **Nelson Mbanasor**. In addition, nine other Red Raiders transferred to Texas Tech after earning their degrees at various other universities. That list features **Brandon Bouyer-Randle** (Michigan State), **Josh Burger** (Wofford), **Eric Monroe** (LSU), **Jacob Morgenstern** (Duke), **Colin Schooler** (Arizona), **Chadarius Townsend** (Alabama), **Marquis Waters** (Duke), **Tyler Shough** (Oregon) and **T.J. Storment** (Colorado State) and **Matthew Young** (New Mexico State).
- Texas Tech added to that number in recent weeks as **Austin Brougham**, **Patrick Curley**, **Kosi Eldridge**, **Adrian Frye**, **Jonathan Garibay**, **Jaylon Hutchings**, **Travis Koontz**, **Parker McNeil** and **Weston Wright** were all awarded their undergraduate degrees during the fall commencement ceremonies. That gives Tech a total of 25 graduates entering the Liberty Bowl.
- In addition to the nine Red Raiders who earned their undergraduate degrees, Texas Tech also had six student-athletes who completed their master's studies in **Brandon Bouyer-Randle** (Sport Management & General Business), **Josh Burger** (Interdisciplinary Studies), **Seth Collins** (Interdisciplinary Studies), **Riko Jeffers** (Interdisciplinary Studies), **Colin Schooler** (Interdisciplinary Studies) and **Casey Verhulst** (Interdisciplinary Studies).

WOMBLE FOOTBALL CENTER



Texas Tech Athletics announced prior to the TCU game a \$20 million gift from Board of Regents member Dustin R. Womble to fund construction of a new football training facility. It marks the largest one-time gift to the athletics department in its history. The lead gift will help Texas Tech continue to reshape its athletics facilities with the help of Womble, who already provided more than \$10 million to fund a state-of-the-art basketball practice facility in his name, the Dustin R. Womble Basketball Center that opened this past May across from United Supermarkets Arena.

Once completed, Texas Tech will boast one of the largest investments into its football program in history as construction of the Womble Football Center is expected to be a \$40-50 million project. The two-story complex will remain in its same location adjacent to both Jones AT&T Stadium and the Sports Performance Center, which has earned rave reviews since its unveiling in 2017 as one of the premier indoor football facilities in the country. As part of the project, Texas Tech will more than double its physical space in the Womble Football Center, which is slated to begin construction in early 2022 in anticipation of opening prior to the 2023 season. The state-of-the-art complex will house a nearly 14,000-square foot weight room and a 7,000-square foot locker room as well as coaches offices, position rooms, a players' lounge and space for nutrition, athletic training and recruiting.

The Womble Football Center is the second project in Texas Tech's three-part master plan for its football program, which also includes future renovations to the south end zone of Jones AT&T Stadium. The projects are among the final items for The Campaign for Fearless Champions, which has transformed Texas Tech's facilities since its inception. Overall, the campaign has funded 25 athletic facility projects to date and has invested more than \$200 million into the athletics department, including critical student-athlete resources such as scholarship endowments, nutrition and the J.T. and Margaret Talkington Leadership Academy.

To date, Womble has gifted his alma mater with more than \$30 million as part of The Campaign for Fearless Champions, placing him historically among one of Texas Tech University's largest individual donors and the largest athletics donor. He joins the ranks of other generous supporters such as Jim Sowell, Ed Whitacre and Jerry Rawls.

A NEW EXPERIENCE FOR MANY

- The trip to a bowl game will be a new experience for the majority of the Texas Tech roster as only two Red Raiders saw action in their last postseason appearance at the 2017 Birmingham Bowl. **DaMarcus Fields** earned the start at corner for the Red Raiders in the loss as he made four stops to go along with a fumble recovery. **Riko Jeffers**, meanwhile, added three tackles from his linebacker position.
- The bowl experience was a key talking point for **Sonny Cumbie** when he took over as interim head coach. During one of his first team meetings in the role, he asked the Red Raiders to raise their hands if they had played in a bowl game previously. When the majority of the room kept their hands down, Cumbie signaled that would be the goal for the remainder of the season, one the Red Raiders ultimately achieved with their win against Iowa State.
- In addition to both Fields and Jeffers, an additional 13 Red Raiders have been part of a bowl-bound program prior to transferring to Texas Tech. That list includes transfers **Tyler Shough** (Oregon), **Eric Monroe** (LSU), **Henry Colombi** (Utah State), **Jacob Morgenstern** (Duke), **Chadarius Townsend** (Alabama), **Tyree Wilson** (Texas A&M), **Malik Dunlap** (N.C. State), **Jesiah Pierre** (Florida), **T.J. Stormont** (TCU), **Marquis Waters** (Duke) and **Brandon Bouyer-Randle** (Michigan State), **McLane Mannix** (Nevada) and **Colin Schooler** (Arizona).

THE NEXT INVESTMENT: TEXAS TECH RECEIVES \$45 MILLION FOR FOOTBALL

- Texas Tech has now received \$45 million in contributions to The Campaign for Fearless Champions in the past two months alone after fellow Board of Regents member Dustin Womble provided \$20 million in October. That contribution was the lead gift for construction of the Dustin R. Womble Football Center, a roughly \$40-50 million project that will be the new day-to-day home for the football program. Womble, the largest individual donor in athletics history, has gifted his alma mater more than \$30 million to date after previously donating the \$10 million lead gift for the Dustin R. Womble Basketball Center.
- Texas Tech Athletics announced in early December it has received a \$25 million gift from Board of Regents member and former football letterwinner Cody Campbell that will kick off fundraising for the final project in its three-part master plan for the Red Raider football program, the south end zone to Jones AT&T Stadium. Texas Tech is currently in the design stage of the south end zone project, but has discussed various concepts such as a field-level club, additional premium seating options, recruiting space and a letterman's lounge, among others. Texas Tech has not yet developed a cost estimate for the south end zone facility.
- In recognition of the gift, Texas Tech will name the Jones AT&T Stadium playing field Cody Campbell Field in honor of the largest one-time contribution in the history of the athletics department. Campbell, the co-chief executive officer and co-founder of Double Eagle Energy Holdings, is a fourth-generation Red Raider who earned multiple All-Big 12 and Academic All-Big 12 honors during his playing career as a Texas Tech offensive lineman from 2001-04. He later spent two seasons (2005-06) with the Indianapolis Colts in the NFL following his collegiate career.

BIG 12 RELEASES 2022 FOOTBALL SCHEDULE

- Texas Tech will host seven games inside the friendly confines of Jones AT&T Stadium as part of its 2022 football schedule that was unveiled Dec. 1 by the Big 12 Conference office. As part of the schedule, the Red Raiders will play three of their first four games under new head coach **Joey McGuire** at home as Tech will host Murray State (Sept. 3) and Houston (Sept. 10) during its non-conference slate before in-state rival Texas arrives in town two weeks later (Sept. 25) to open Big 12 play. In between, the Red Raiders will travel to N.C. State on Sept. 17 for the first meeting between the two schools since 2003.
- Tech will follow the Texas game with road trips to Kansas State (Oct. 1) and Oklahoma State (Oct. 8) early in league play. The Oklahoma State game preludes Tech's lone open week on the 2022 schedule as the Red Raiders will start a two-game homestand Oct. 22 by welcoming West Virginia followed by Baylor (Oct. 29) the following weekend.
- The month of November begins with a trip to Fort Worth to face TCU (Nov. 5), one of two road contests during the final few weeks of the regular season as the Red Raider will also head to Iowa State on Nov. 19. That game is sandwiched around a pair of home contests featuring Kansas on Nov. 12 and then the regular-season finale against Oklahoma on Nov. 26.

YOU'RE ON SCHOLARSHIP

- Four Red Raiders closed preseason camp by hearing the three words every walk-on dreams of: "you're on scholarship." The Texas Tech staff gave that opportunity to four different Red Raiders prior to the season as sophomore offensive lineman **Aaron Castro**, sophomore linebacker **Bryce Ramirez**, junior tight end **Henry Teeter** and senior defensive lineman **Troy Te'o** were all recognized for their hard work.
- The presentation was set up, in part, by now interim head coach **Sonny Cumbie**, a former walk-on himself who discussed his journey to eventually earning a scholarship and then becoming the Red Raiders' starter behind center. Cumbie remains one of the most successful walk-ons in school history after leading the Red Raiders to a memorable win at the 2004 Holiday Bowl to close his career.
- Texas Tech has made it a habit to reward at least one walk-on with a scholarship in recent years, a list that includes three other current Red Raiders in senior wide receiver **Dalton Rigdon** (presented in 2019), junior place kicker **Trey Wolff** (honored following 2019 season) and junior running back **Xavier White** (earned in 2020).

CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE

■ Texas Tech has three members of its program with national championship rings in former Alabama running back **Chadarius Townsend** and LSU safety **Eric Monroe**. Townsend was a redshirt on Alabama's 2017 national championship team and later played in the Crimson Tide's College Football Playoff run in 2018. Monroe, meanwhile, saw action in 12 games during the 2019 campaign, including both of LSU's victories in the CFP. Texas Tech linebackers coach **Kevin Cosgrove** was also part of LSU's national championship run in 2019 as he was a senior defensive analyst for the Tigers.

NEW TO TOWN BUT NOT TO THE GAME

■ Texas Tech has 17 scholarship transfers on its 2021 roster, the bulk of which have arrived from power-five schools. In total, 14 players have transferred to Texas Tech after playing in the ACC, Big 12, Big Ten, SEC or Pac-12. Seven of Texas Tech's transfer additions for this season came from power-five schools as the Red Raiders signed the likes of **Malik Dunlap** (N.C. State), **Reggie Pearson Jr.** (Wisconsin), **Jesiah Pierre** (Florida), **Tyler Shough** (Oregon), **T.J. Stormont** (TCU), **Marquis Waters** (Duke) and **Rayshad Williams** (UCLA).

■ A few have garnered notice from the Athletic's Max Olson and Bruce Feldman as part of their College Football Transfer Portal Top 100 that was released prior to the season: **Tyler Shough** (No. 21), **Marquis Waters** (No. 49), **T.J. Stormont** (No. 74).

A NEW TERM FOR 2021 - SUPER SENIORS

■ Media and fans alike have likely heard a new term throughout the 2021 season - Super Seniors. The phrase describes many of the seniors across the country who decided to utilize the extra year granted by the NCAA for the 2020 season.

■ The defense was the greatest benefactor of the Super Senior movement, retaining a collective 156 career starts between seven players entering this season. The group is led by **Colin Schooler**, the team's most veteran player, who owned 41 career starts between his playing time at Arizona (33) and Texas Tech (9), entering 2021.

■ The offense boasts five Super Seniors who owned a collective 58 starts among them entering this season. The most experienced of that group is shared by a pair of transfers in Kaylon Geiger (19) and T.J. Stormont (19), who each arrived in Lubbock as Super Seniors.

■ For Texas Tech, the Red Raiders lead the Big 12 Conference with 12 super seniors according to preseason research by the Associated Press. The list of returnees includes nine players that were on Tech's roster this past fall as well as three others in **T.J. Stormont**, who transferred to join the Red Raiders this spring following one season at TCU, **Kaylon Geiger Sr.**, a veteran wide receiver from Troy, and **Marquis Waters**, who started in 35 games over his career at Duke.

■ According to the Associated Press' research this past spring, Texas Tech is tied for fifth among power-five programs with 12 super seniors as the Red Raiders only trail the likes of Illinois (17), Arizona State (14), USC (14) and Rutgers (13) and are tied with Pittsburgh (12). The arrival of Geiger pushed the Red Raiders ahead of Arizona (11), Utah (11) and Tennessee (11).

TEXAS TECH FOOTBALL HELPS ESTABLISH LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP

■ The Texas Tech football program, in conjunction with 100 Black Men of West Texas, established a community scholarship this summer that will benefit a local student each year that plans to attend the university. The scholarship will cover all tuition and fees for one full year, providing a life-changing opportunity for a local student. The scholarship recipient will be selected each year by a committee comprised of representatives from the 100 Black Men of West Texas organization as well as Red Raider football student-athletes.

TEXAS TECH AMONG NATION'S MOST ACTIVE TEAMS IN COMMUNITY

■ Texas Tech continues to be recognized at the national level as the Red Raider football programs recently learned it ranked second this past year in community-service hours among FBS schools that utilize the Helper Helper app. The Red Raiders completed more than 1,200 hours of community service this past year, which ranked only behind Boston College among FBS football programs. Texas Tech was No. 10 in community service hours served a year ago, a steady increase of 350 hours that saw the Red Raiders volunteer for 39 different opportunities with 19 organizations.

■ The Special Spectator program is a cornerstone of Texas Tech's community outreach as it provides a two-day experience, in normal years, at a football practice, a tour of the Football Training Facility and Sports Performance Center as well as on-field recognition prior to the start of a selected home football game.

POLICE CHIEF, TONY BRADFORD JR.

■ In the midst of a national conversation regarding social injustice in this country, Texas Tech has found a voice with a unique perspective - junior defensive lineman **Tony Bradford Jr.**, who desires to join law enforcement once his playing career is over. Bradford's goal is to one day rise to the role of police chief in a major city where he says he "can make real change."

■ Bradford has received a crash course in his future profession over the last year as he has served as a security guard with the Texas Tech Police Department. Bradford chose to spend his 2020 Spring Break with TTPD in what was expected to be a one-week internship but was extended through June due to the COVID-19 pandemic that ultimately canceled spring practice. Bradford returned to TTPD this past spring and summer, occasionally even working other Texas Tech athletics events.

MAKING IT LOOK E-Z

Erik Ezukanma has established himself as the Big 12's top wide receiver over the past two-plus seasons as he has caught 138 passes for 2,165 yards and 15 touchdowns over his career. Ezukanma became the 15th Red Raider since 2000 to reach 2,000 yards for his career against Oklahoma as he currently leads all active Big 12 players with 2,117 receiving yards since the start of the 2019 season alone.

Ezukanma hit the 100-yard mark for the third time this season against Oklahoma after catching a career-high eight passes for 123 yards and a touchdown. Ezukanma, who now has five 100-yard outings in his career, notched the second multi-touchdown performance of his career as he caught two touchdowns in the win over Iowa State. His other outing with two receiving touchdowns came in the 2020 meeting at Oklahoma State.

OFFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

THOMPSON CONTINUES TO MOVE UP SCHOOL RECORD BOOK

- Texas Tech has turned to a reliable option out of the backfield this season as **SaRodorick Thompson** has found the end zone a team-leading nine times despite missing the first two games of the year. Thompson has three multi-touchdown performances this season as he scored twice on the ground against both West Virginia and Kansas State and then three times versus TCU. He now has 11 multi-touchdown games during his career, which trails **Taurean Henderson's** 14 among Red Raiders dating back to 2000.
- Thompson's three touchdowns versus the Horned Frogs marked a career-high and was the most for a Red Raider since **Ta'Zhawn Henry** found the end zone four times against Houston early in the 2018 season. He is the 10th Red Raider since 2000 to rush for at least three touchdowns in a game.
- Thompson's 13-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter against Iowa State pushed him to 32 for his career, moving him into a tie with **Bobby Cavazos** (1951-53) for sixth all-time in program history. With another rushing touchdown in the bowl game, he will move into a tie for fifth alongside **Shannon Woods** (2005-08), who had 33 during his Red Raider career.
- Thompson could potentially further add to his legacy against the Bulldogs as he is 100 rushing yards shy of reaching 2,000 for his career. To date, Texas Tech has had 13 players in school history eclipse the 2,000-yard mark. Thompson would be only the fifth Red Raider to do so since 2000, joining the likes of **DeAndre Washington** (2011-15), **Taurean Henderson** (2002-05), **Baron Batch** (2006, 2008-10) and **Shannon Woods** (2005-08). In addition to those already ranked in the top 10, the following three Red Raiders also rushed for 2,000 yards during their respective careers: Woods (2,249), **Doug McCutchen** (2,222; 1970-72) and **Bobby Cavazos** (2,137; 1951-53).
- Following his 2020 sophomore campaign, Thompson became the first Red Raider to lead the team in rushing back-to-back years since **DeAndre Washington** during the 2014-15 seasons. Thompson is only the sixth Red Raider all-time to lead the team in rushing yards as both a freshman and sophomore, joining an elite list that includes two Doak Walker Award winners in **Byron "Bam" Morris** (1991-92) and **Byron Hanspard** (1994-95) as well as **James Gray** (1986-87), **Ricky Williams** (1997) and **Taurean Henderson** (2002-03).
- Thompson could become the first Red Raider to lead Texas Tech in rushing yards over three-consecutive seasons since **Baron Batch** from 2008-10. If he and **Erik Ezukanma** once again lead the team in rushing and receiving yards, respectively, it would mark the first time Tech has had the same two players lead each category over three-straight years since the school began tracking yearly leaders in 1951.

YES, WE RUN THE BALL HERE AT TEXAS TECH

- Texas Tech has been a force on the ground this season as the Red Raiders have totaled 1,808 rushing yards, which is already the most for the Red Raiders in a season since totaling 1,832 in 2017. With at least 32 rushing yards against Mississippi State, Tech will secure its fourth-highest season rushing total of the Big 12 era as the Red Raiders also totaled 3,005 yards on the ground in 1996, 2,219 yards in 1998 and then 2,487 yards in 2015.
- Texas Tech's success on the ground has been particularly noticeable in the red zone as the Red Raiders have rushed for 27 touchdowns this season, which is tied for 27th currently in the FBS. Tech is tied for second in the Big 12 for the category, only one back of Baylor.
- The Red Raiders totaled eight touchdowns on the ground over a two-game stretch with four against both TCU and Kansas. Texas Tech had not previously found pay dirt four times on the ground in back-to-back weeks since early in the 2018 season against Lamar and Houston. It marked the first time Tech had done so versus Big 12 foes since the final two regular-season games of the 2015 season against Kansas State and Texas.
- Texas Tech rushed for 207 yards in the win over Iowa State, marking the third time this season and the eighth time since 2019 that the Red Raiders have hit the 200-yard mark. It was only the fourth time since 2000 where the Red Raiders have rushed for at least 200 yards at least three times in a season as Tech did so six times in 2015, four times in 2014 and then three times in 2020.
- Texas Tech rushed for a season-high 244 yards in the win at Kansas as the Red Raiders used 10 different rushers in the win, marking its most in a game since utilizing the same amount in the 2017 season opener against Eastern Washington.
- Texas Tech's final touchdown against Kansas - a 2-yard pass from **Henry Colombi** to **Travis Koontz** - snapped a streak of 11-consecutive scores that came via the ground. It was the longest such streak for the Red Raiders since 1977 when Tech put together a similar streak from its final touchdown against Arizona to two of its next three games against Rice and TCU.





SMITH SET FOR LIBERTY BOWL START

Donovan Smith is slated to make the fourth start of his still young career against Mississippi State as he will be only the third Red Raider quarterback in school history and the second in the Big 12 era to start a bowl game. Smith, who made his first career start in Texas Tech's victory over Iowa State that made the Red Raiders bowl eligible, joins a list of freshmen quarterbacks to earn the nod in a bowl games that includes Davis Webb (2013 Holiday Bowl) and Zebbie Lethridge (1994 Cotton Bowl).

Texas Tech is 1-1 all-time in bowl games where a freshman has started at quarterback as Webb led the Red Raiders to a memorable 34-23 victory over No. 16 Arizona State to cap a successful true freshman season in the Holiday Bowl. Webb was named the Offensive MVP of the Holiday Bowl, making him the only freshman in school history to garner MVP honors. Lethridge, meanwhile, was on the receiving end of a 55-14 setback to No. 21 USC to wrap his freshman season in the Cotton Bowl.

SMITH PUTS TOGETHER WINNING FORMULA IN FIRST CAREER START

- **Donovan Smith** shined in his first career start against Iowa State as the redshirt freshman completed 25-of-32 passes for 322 yards and three touchdowns in the win. He became the ninth Red Raider since 1999 to throw for at least 300 yards in his starting debut, joining a list that includes **Nic Shimonek**, **Davis Webb**, **Baker Mayfield**, **Steven Sheffield**, **Taylor Potts**, **Graham Harrell**, **Cody Hodges** and his offensive coordinator **Sonny Cumbie**. Of that group, only Sheffield (2009 vs. Kansas State) and Webb (2013 versus Iowa State) were able to do so against Big 12 foes.
- Smith was the seventh Texas Tech freshman to make his first career start at quarterback during the Big 12 era, joining **Kliff Kingsbury** (1999), **Seth Doege** (2009), Mayfield (2013), Webb (2013), **Patrick Mahomes II** (2014) and **Alan Bowman** (2018). Among that group, Smith was the fifth quarterback to make his first career start against a Big 12 foe as Texas Tech is now 4-1 in those games.
- Smith's 322 passing yards ranked second only to Webb's 415 yards and three touchdowns among freshmen who were making their first career starts in a Big 12 game. Webb's performance, ironically, also came in a win over Iowa State. Smith also rushed 14 times for 50 yards in his starting debut.
- This is the fifth-consecutive season where the Red Raiders have debuted a new quarterback who was making his first career start. It is also the third time in the past four years where Texas Tech has utilized three different starting quarterbacks in a season and the fifth-consecutive year multiple signal callers have garnered at least one start behind center.
- Since the Iowa State win, Smith has gone against the Big 12's top-two defenses, nearly leading the Red Raiders to a victory over eventual Big 12 champion Baylor. Smith, who had been inserted for pass-option situations earlier in the season, saw his first significant time behind center at Oklahoma where he played the entire second half. He is completing 63.4 percent of his passes this season as he is 71-of-112 overall for 930 yards and six touchdowns, all while rushing 52 times for 124 yards and a pair of scores.

CUMBIE KNOWS THE QUARTERBACK POSITION

- A record-setting signal caller himself, there's little doubt **Sonny Cumbie** knows the quarterback position. During his time at TCU, he coached several of the Horned Frogs' top quarterbacks in school history, namely **Trevone Boykin**, who was a two-time All-American and a two-time finalist for the Davey O'Brien Award. Boykin, the 2014 Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, finished fourth in the Heisman Trophy voting as a junior in 2014 and then ninth as a senior a year later.
- Cumbie helped push TCU to the Big 12 Championship game and a top-10 ranking in his first year as play-caller in 2017 as the Horned Frogs closed the year at 11-3 overall following a 39-37 victory over No. 13 Stanford in the Valero Alamo Bowl. **Kenny Hill** set the TCU single-season mark for completion percentage (67.2) while leading the FBS for third-down completion percentage (67.3).
- **Max Duggan** blossomed into the latest successful Cumbie protégé in 2019 as he broke the TCU true freshman records with 2,077 passing yards and 15 touchdowns after earning the starting nod in only the third game of the season. In his two seasons under Cumbie, Duggan threw for 3,872 yards and 25 touchdowns, while also rushing for an additional 1,081 yards and 10 touchdowns. He was an honorable mention All-Big 12 pick following his true freshman season.

FUTURE IS BRIGHT IN THE QUARTERBACK ROOM

- **Sonny Cumbie** entered this season feeling the future is bright in the quarterback room thanks to a pair of freshmen in **Donovan Smith** and **Behren Morton** to go along with experienced veterans such as **Tyler Shough** and **Henry Colombi**. Smith, the son of running backs coach **DeAndre Smith**, arrived at Texas Tech prior to the 2020 season out of nearby Frenship High School in the Lubbock area. He threw for more than 3,000 yards and 25 touchdowns as a senior after previously starring at Bishop Gorman High School in Las Vegas.
- Prior to making his first career start against Iowa State, Smith's role continued to grow in the offense in recent weeks as he has relieved **Henry Colombi** at various moments, giving the Red Raiders a heavy pass-run option behind center. He came off the bench at Oklahoma to play the entire second half, completing 17-of-22 passes for 192 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing seven times for 22 yards. Smith previously rushed six times for 37 yards and a touchdown while also completing 4-of-5 passes for 70 yards at Kansas two weeks earlier. It marked the first time he has attempted a pass this season. He has 52 rushing attempts for 124 yards and two touchdowns now on the season.
- Morton, meanwhile, is the highest-rated quarterback to ever sign with the Red Raiders after totaling more than 8,800 passing yards and 84 touchdowns in three seasons at Eastland High School. He was a consensus four-star prospect, ranking sixth nationally among pro-style quarterbacks. Morton grew up in Lubbock for part of his youth as his father was the head football coach at Monterey High School in Lubbock for 11 years.
- Texas Tech has already announced that its next offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach will be **Zach Kittley**, who will return to his alma mater after a record-setting year directing the offense at Western Kentucky. Under Kittley, Western Kentucky quarterback **Bailey Zappe** snapped the NCAA FBS single-season records for passing yards (5,967) and passing touchdowns (62) following its win in the Boca Raton Bowl. Zappe actually snapped the longstanding FBS record of Texas Tech's own B.J. Symons in the win as he previously threw for 5,833 yards as a senior in 2003.

RED RAIDERS IN THE NFL



SPORTS LARGEST CONTRACT

- There isn't a bigger star in the NFL currently than Texas Tech's own **Patrick Mahomes II**. The one-time Red Raider gunslinger has transformed the NFL in only four professional seasons, claiming NFL MVP honors in 2018 before leading the Kansas City Chiefs to back-to-back Super Bowl appearances, including a win in 2020.
- With his Super Bowl win over the San Francisco 49ers, Mahomes became the youngest player in history to be named NFL MVP and also win a Super Bowl. Mahomes, who at only 24 years of age, was tabbed Super Bowl MVP after leading the Chiefs to only their second Super Bowl title in history and their first since 1970.
- In July 2020, Mahomes signed the richest contract in NFL history as he and the Chiefs agreed on a 10-year extension worth up to \$503 million. It marked the second time in school history where a Red Raider has signed the richest NFL contract as Ring of Honor member **Donny Anderson** previously did so with the Green Bay Packers upon being drafted in 1965.
- Dating back to his time as a Red Raider, the 2016 Sammy Baugh Trophy winner is the only quarterback in history to throw for 5,000 yards at both the collegiate and NFL levels.

CUMBIE SUCCESSFUL IN TURNING RED RAIDERS INTO BALANCED ATTACK

- Through the regular season, the Red Raiders, known for various versions of the Air Raid offense since 2000, have actually attempted more rushes (392) to passes (362) to this point. Barring a complete dedication to the passing game in the Liberty Bowl, Texas Tech is on pace to end a season with more rushing attempts than passes since 1999, the final year under head coach **Spike Dykes**.
- Texas Tech's success on the ground this season placed the Red Raiders in a rare circumstance against Kansas State as Texas Tech attempted nearly twice as many rushes as passes. In fact, it marked the first time since the 1999 regular-season finale against Oklahoma where the Red Raiders completed 10 or fewer passes and had under 20 pass attempts.
- A native of nearby Snyder, Texas, Cumbie helped TCU boast the Big 12's second-best conference record (38-25) and third-best overall mark (58-30) over his seven seasons, which coincided with six bowl appearances. He oversaw the Horned Frogs' quarterbacks throughout his tenure and served as the sole offensive play-caller each of his final four years. He was named the next head coach at Louisiana Tech on Dec. 1.
- Once the quarterback in one of Texas Tech's biggest bowl wins, Cumbie threw for 4,742 yards as a senior in 2004, the sixth-highest total in school history and one of the top-25 marks in NCAA history. Cumbie, who waited patiently as a former walk-on quarterback to finally lead the prolific Tech offense, twice led the Red Raiders to 70-point games that season en route to garnering honorable mention All-Big 12 accolades as well as Academic All-Big 12 first team honors.
- Cumbie might be best remembered, however, for his 520 passing yards in Texas Tech's 2004 Holiday Bowl victory over (then) No. 4 California, capping off an 8-4 season. Cumbie was tabbed the Holiday Bowl MVP for his performance as he still owns the Holiday Bowl and the Tech bowl records for most passing yards.

POTENT NOTABLES (OFFENSE EDITION)

- Texas Tech has been among the most explosive teams in the country this season as the Red Raiders are tied for second in the Big 12 and 10th in the FBS after totaling 22 plays of at least 40 yards. Tech also ranks tied for seventh for plays of 50 yards or longer with 13 to this point and then tied for 14th with four plays of at least 70 yards.
- Texas Tech has put points on the board in 90.9 percent of its red zone appearances this season (40-of-44), which ranks 14th in the FBS and fourth in the Big 12 entering bowl season. The Red Raiders have found the end zone in 31 of those red zone appearances as Tech has failed to put points on the board only four times - via an early fumble against Houston, a fourth-down stop versus both TCU and Iowa State and then the end of the half at Oklahoma.
- **McLane Mannix's** final reception against Baylor pushed him to 2,002 receiving yards for his career, giving Texas Tech three 2,000-yard receivers entering the Liberty Bowl as he joins fellow wideouts **Erik Ezukanma** (2,165) and **Kaylon Geiger Sr.** (2,149).
- **Myles Price** had a career day versus Iowa State as the sophomore hauled in nine passes for 175 yards and a touchdown. His nine catches in the win marked the most by a Red Raider this season and the most since KeSean Carter hauled in 11 in the 2019 season finale at Texas. Price, who ranks third on the team with 35 receptions for 451 receiving yards this season, nearly snapped his career-high by 100 yards as his previous high mark was his 79 yards last season versus West Virginia.
- **Kaylon Geiger Sr.** has two 100-yard performances this season, giving him 11 now for his career between his time at Troy and Texas Tech. Since the start of the 2019 season, Geiger ranks tied for fifth among FBS receivers for 100-yard performances, trailing only the 17 from Purdue's David Bell, the 13 from UTEP's Jacob Cowing and the 12 from former Alabama standout DeVonta Smith (currently with Philadelphia Eagles) and Memphis' Calvin Austin III.
- **Eric Ezukanma** has found the end zone via the ground game twice this season as he scampered nine yards to score at Kansas on Oct. 16 before going 45 yards on Oct. 23 against Kansas State. He is the first Red Raider wide receiver to rush for at least two touchdowns twice in a season since **Jakeem Grant** had the same total to close his career in 2015. He has 138 rushing yards as a receiver this season.
- **Travis Koontz** hauled in his fourth touchdown of the season in the regular-season finale against Baylor as he took a screen pass 75 yards to the end zone. Koontz is now tied for the team-high with four touchdown catches this season as he is looking to become the first Red Raider tight end to share at least the team-high for receiving touchdowns since Texas Tech moved to a spread offense in 2000.
- Texas Tech posted season highs for yards per play (7.9) and explosive plays of at least 20 yards in the win over Iowa State despite facing a Cyclones defense that entered the game allowing 18.2 points per game and only 282.4 yards per game.

BROOKS BACK IN THE MIX TO BOOST RUNNING GAME

- **Tahj Brooks** put together his best performance against Iowa State since returning from an injury that caused him to miss the first four games in Big 12 play. The sophomore carried nine times for 80 yards and a touchdown and also hauled in two catches for 21 yards in the win. Brooks now leads the Red Raiders with 461 rushing yards this season, 41 more than teammate **SaRodorick Thompson**.
- Brooks was the breakout star for the Texas Tech offense early this season as he has carried 35 times for 284 yards and four touchdowns over the first three games. Brooks finished with a career-high 134 rushing yards against Houston and then added 103 on the ground versus SFA, marking his first two games to reach the 100-yard mark.
- Brooks had been explosive in finding the end zone, scoring on touchdown runs of 41 and 44 yards against Houston before breaking loose on a 67-yard scamper against SFA and a 51-yard rush against Iowa State. He is tied for ninth nationally with four rushes this season of at least 40 yards, a category he ranks third in among Big 12 rushers.

EXPERIENCE ALONG OFFENSIVE LINE BENEFITING RED RAIDERS

- Texas Tech has relied on its experience along the offensive line this season as four of five starters boast at least 30 starts now over their respective careers. **Josh Burger** leads the group with 47 starts during his collegiate career, including 22 during his tenure as a Red Raider after transferring from Wofford prior to the 2020 season. Texas Tech boasts 125 career starts as a Red Raider among its offensive line and 125 career starts when you factor in a pair of transfers such as **Josh Burger** and **T.J. Stormont**.
- **Dawson Deaton** has powered the unit up the middle as he has 34 starts over his career. Deaton was tabbed a second team All-Big 12 honoree for the second-consecutive season by the conference coaches, while Burger, who will be playing in his 60th collegiate game versus Mississippi State, and fellow super senior Stormont received honorable mention accolades.

DEFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

POTENT NOTABLES (DEFENSE EDITION)

- Seven different Red Raiders have picked off a pass so far this season as Texas Tech currently ranks fifth in the Big 12 with nine interceptions. **Dadrion Taylor-Demerson** leads the group with three after picking off his third pass of the season against Iowa State. The Red Raiders haven't had seven different players with an interception in a season since 2017 when 10 players picked off a pass.
- Texas Tech's nine interceptions this season are already four more than its entire total from the 2020 campaign. It took the Red Raiders a total of 10 games for its five interceptions a year ago.
- The Red Raiders have found multiple ways to find the end zone this season as Texas Tech currently ranks tied for 23rd nationally with two defensive touchdowns, which have come from interceptions by both **Riko Jeffers** and **Marquis Waters** over the first three games. Baylor, TCU and Oklahoma State are the only other Big 12 programs with multiple defensive touchdowns so far this season. Tech made a knack for finding the end zone via its defense during the 2020 season as the Red Raiders ranked tied for seventh in the FBS and second in the Big 12 with three defensive touchdowns. It marked the most defensive touchdowns in a season by the Red Raiders since the 2017 campaign when Tech had four over 13 games.
- Texas Tech is giving up 410.1 yards of total offense per game, which, at this time, marks the lowest for the Red Raiders in a season since 2012 when opposing offenses averaged only 367.3 yards per game.
- Texas Tech's improved depth defensively has been evident this season as only four Red Raiders have started in all 12 games. That list defensively includes linebackers **Colin Schooler** and **Riko Jeffers** as well as defensive linemen **Jaylon Hutchings** and **Tyree Wilson**.
- **Eric Monroe** and **Reggie Pearson Jr.** both recorded career highs for tackles in the regular-season finale against Baylor as Monroe led the team with 13 stops followed by Pearson with 11. It marked the fourth career outing with 10 or more tackles for Monroe, all of which have occurred at Texas Tech. Pearson recorded his second-career game with at least 10 stops as he previously had 10 against Nebraska in 2019 while still at Wisconsin.
- Monroe will look to close his most-successful collegiate season in style at the Liberty Bowl as his 80 tackles this season are one shy of his career total entering this year. Monroe currently ranks second on the team with 80 tackles this season, trailing only **Colin Schooler's** 97. He has compiled 49 of his 80 tackles over the last five games, which leads the team.
- **Tyree Wilson** has recorded 7.5 of his 11.5 tackles for loss in the last seven games as he set a career-high 2.0 against both Kansas and Kansas State. Both of his tackles for loss against Kansas went for sacks, giving him a team-leading 5.0 now on the season. It marked the first time in Wilson's career where he had two solo sacks in a game. Among his Big 12 counterparts, Wilson ranks tied for 11th in the league with his 11.5 tackles for loss.
- The Texas Tech secondary stepped up in a big way against Kansas, limiting the Jayhawks to only 128 passing yards a week after surrendering just 104 in the loss to TCU. It marked the first time the Red Raiders had kept a Big 12 opponent under 130 passing yards in consecutive games since facing Oklahoma State (94 yards) and Oklahoma (118 yards) late in the 2005 season. The Red Raiders matched their season-high with seven pass breakups against Kansas.
- Speaking of the secondary, Texas Tech boasts three of the top-five leaders currently in the Big 12 for passes defended as **DaMarcus Fields** and **Dadrion Taylor-Demerson** rank tied for second in the league with 10 followed by **Rayshad Williams** in a tie for fourth overall with nine of his own. If Williams is able to break up a pass against Mississippi State, it would mark only the second time since 2005 where the Red Raiders had three different players in double digits as Tech also did so in 2008 with the likes of **Daniel Charbonnet**, **Jamar Wall** and **Darcel McBath**.

RED RAIDERS RELYING ON STRONG RUSHING DEFENSE

- If the season ended today, Texas Tech would have, statistically, accomplished one of its better seasons in recent memory in stopping the run as opponents are only averaging 143.7 yards per game on the ground. That average would rank as the Red Raiders' lowest since giving up only 135.1 yards per game in 2009. Tech currently boasts its sixth-lowest rushing defense average of the Big 12 era, trailing only the marks from 1996 (141.9), 1997 (137.4), 1998 (118.9), 2008 (140.4) and 2009.
- Texas Tech recorded its seventh game of the season where its opponent rushed for less than 100 yards against Iowa State as the Cyclones were limited to only 89 yards on the ground just two weeks after the Red Raiders held Oklahoma to just 72 rushing yards. Dating back to 2000, it marks the first time during that span that the Red Raiders had six or more games in a season where the opponent posted 100 rushing yards or less in a game.
- Among teams nationally, Texas Tech is one of 14 FBS schools currently to hold opponents to 100 rushing yards or less seven times already this season, joining the likes of San Diego State (10), Alabama (9), Georgia (9), Iowa (8), Pittsburgh (8), Wisconsin (8), Appalachian State (7), Houston (7), Ohio State (7), Oklahoma State (7), UAB (7), Utah (7) and UTSA (7).
- Texas Tech is 5-2 this season when keeping its opponent under 100 rushing yards as the Red Raiders' two losses came versus Kansas State and then at No. 4 Oklahoma. The Red Raiders limited Kansas State to only 81 rushing yards on Oct. 23 - roughly half the Wildcats' season average entering the game.
- Kansas totaled 62 of its 145 rushing yards late in the fourth quarter after Tech had turned to many of its developmental players. The Red Raiders allowed only one explosive play of 20 yards or longer against Kansas, marking the first time Tech has done so this season.

JEFFERS CLOSING IN ON 300-CAREER TACKLES

- **Riko Jeffers** needs six tackles against Mississippi State to become the newest member of the 300-tackle club as he has 294 over his five seasons entering the Liberty Bowl. Jeffers, who ranks third on the team with 67 tackles this season, would become the 15th Red Raider in school history to notch at least 300 tackles in a career and the seventh during the Big 12 era. The list of defensive standouts with 300 career tackles during the Big 12 era includes the likes of **Montae Reagor** (1995-98), **Lawrence Flugence** (1999-02), **Kevin Curtis** (1998-01), **Ryan Aycoc** (2000-03), **Cody Davis** (2009-12) and his former teammate **Jordyn Brooks** (2016-19).
- Jeffers currently ranks third on the team with 67 tackles this season as he is approaching his third season with 70 or more stops. He previously had 71 tackles as a true sophomore in 2018 and then a career-high 76 stops as a junior in 2019.

FIELDS TO THE PROS

- Not many defensive backs in the Big 12 yet alone the country have likely seen as much playing time as **DaMarcus Fields** the past five seasons. Fields, in his sixth and final season as a Red Raider, leads the team with 48 career starts at Texas Tech from his spot at cornerback where he has recorded 221 tackles, four interceptions and 48 passes defended over his career.
- For his career, Fields ranks second among active FBS players with his 48 passes defended, which trails only the 56 of Devin Taylor from Bowling Green. He is one of only seven active FBS players with at least 40 passes defended over their respective careers.
- His pass breakup against Kansas State pushed him past **Jamar Wall** (2006-09) for the most passes defended by a Red Raider since 2000. Fields previously passed **Justis Nelson** (2013-16) during the SFA game as he had 39 over his respective career.
- Fields became the first member of his family to receive a college degree this summer as he graduated in May as a public relations major. Fields said at the time he elected to come back for a final year in order to obtain that degree.

FIGHT LIKE LUKE



Texas Tech will wear a special helmet sticker throughout the 2021 football season in honor of the late Luke Siegel, who passed away Aug. 19 at only 15 years of age. The son of former Texas Tech men's tennis coach Tim Siegel and his wife Jenny, Luke Siegel suffered a traumatic brain injury following a golf cart accident in July 2015. Not guaranteed to survive the original accident, Siegel continued to fight in the six years since, beating the odds one time after another in his recovery. Texas Tech Athletics has established the Luke Siegel Fund to honor his memory.

ONE OF THE BEST IN FBS HISTORY

Texas Tech boasts the nation's active leader in career tackles in Colin Schooler, who arrived in Lubbock as a graduate transfer from Arizona in the weeks leading up to the 2020 season. Schooler, who currently leads the Red Raiders with 97 tackles this season, hit the 400 career tackles milestone against Texas. He joins three other Red Raiders in program history who have recorded 400 career tackles at the FBS level as Schooler joins the likes of Lawrence Flugence (1999-02), Brad Hastings (1983-86) and Kevin Curtis (1998-01).

MORE ON SCHOOLER...

■ **Colin Schooler** placed his name in the FBS record book against Iowa State as he registered his 56.5 career tackle for loss. Schooler, who is playing his fifth season overall and second as a Red Raider, matched the totals of Cincinnati's Antwan Peek (2000-02) and Michigan's Brandon Graham (2006-09) to move into a tie for 24th all-time in FBS history. Schooler has moved back into 25th place all-time in FBS history after Western Kentucky's DeAngelo Malone passed him on the active TFLs list with the Hilltoppers' recent win at the Boca Raton Bowl.

■ Schooler is already a member of the NCAA record book with 307 solo tackles over his career, which currently ranks seventh all-time in FBS history after he passed North Carolina's Dexter Reid during the Baylor game. Schooler previously moved past another former Red Raider in safety **Cody Davis** (2009-12) against Oklahoma. Davis is currently in his ninth NFL season as a member of the New England Patriots. Schooler could push into the top five during the Liberty Bowl as he needs only two solo stops to move past the totals of E.J. Henderson of Maryland and UCLA's Eric Kendricks, who are tied for fifth currently in FBS history.

■ Schooler has now forced a fumble in two of the last five games, giving him three now for the season. He is one of 51 players in the FBS with at least three forced fumbles this season as he ranks tied for 21st nationally in forced fumbles per game (0.27). It marks the most forced fumbles in a season by a Red Raider since **Justus Parker** had four in 2017. He notched his first interception as a Red Raider and the fifth of his career against Iowa State.

■ The Oklahoma game marked the 50th start of Schooler's collegiate career as he previously made 33 during his three seasons at Arizona and then 20 now during his tenure as a Red Raider.

■ Schooler leads the Red Raiders with 97 tackles this season entering the Liberty Bowl. With three stops against Mississippi State, he will become the 10th Red Raider since 2000 to finish with at least 100 tackles in a season, joining a list that includes **Lawrence Flugence** (2000-02), **Ryan Ayccock** (2002), **Dwayne Slay** (2005), **Bront Bird** (2010), **Cody Davis** (2012), **Will Smith** (2013), **Micah Awe** (2015), **Dakota Allen** (2017) and **Jordyn Brooks** (2019).

■ This would be potentially the second time in Schooler's career where he has recorded at least 100 tackles as he previously had 119 stops as a sophomore in 2018. He has had at least 90 tackles in four of his five collegiate seasons with 95 as a true freshman in 2017 and then 98 as a junior in 2019. All three of those totals were during his time at Arizona. Schooler finished with 63 stops over nine games during Texas Tech's COVID-19 shortened 2020 campaign.

■ Schooler enters the Liberty Bowl ranked fourth in the Big 12 for both solo tackles per game (5.2) and total tackles per game (8.1). He is also 19th nationally for solo stops per game heading into his final collegiate contest.

■ Over his career, Schooler has reached double digits for tackles an impressive 18 times, which leads all active Big 12 players entering bowl season and ranks third nationally among active players, trailing only Colorado's Nate Landman and his 19 as well as Troy's Carlton Martial, who has 20 over his respective career.

■ Schooler hails from a football family as his father, Tom, played at Eastern Michigan, while his older brother, Brendan, played at Oregon before transferring to Texas. His mother, Christine, was also a collegiate athlete as part of the Cal State Los Angeles volleyball program.

PLENTY OF EXPERIENCE FEATURED ON DEFENSE

■ The Texas Tech defense brought back eight starters as well as the majority of its two-deep in 2021. Overall, this season's defensive roster currently features 12 players with 10 or more starts over their respective careers and four players with at least 200 tackles for their career.

■ Between returning linebackers **Colin Schooler** and **Riko Jeffers** and newcomer **Marquis Waters**, the Red Raiders had three players with a wealth of experience as all three recorded more than 200 tackles for their careers entering the season. In fact, Texas Tech was the only FBS program in the country at the start of the season with three players on its 2021 roster that boasted 225 or more tackles.

■ Texas Tech added another member to the 200-tackle club against Kansas State as **DaMarcus Fields** recorded seven stops in the loss, giving him 202 at the time for his career as a Red Raider.





GARIBAY, THE BIG 12'S TOP KICKER

Jonathan Garibay earned All-Big 12 first team honors this season after ranking among the top kickers nationally from both an accuracy and ability to make key kicks in the final moments. Garibay is 13-for-14 on field goal attempts with his lone missing coming from 53 yards out at Baylor. He is an impressive 21-of-25 on field goal attempts over his career and has connected on three game-winning attempts in his two seasons, none more memorable than his 62-yarder to win the game as time expired.

Garibay's 62-yard field goal marked the longest by an FBS kicker this season and was the longest in Texas Tech history, snapping the school record of 57 yards by **Bill Adams** against Texas A&M in 1977. As seen below, it is one of only six field goals from 62 yards or longer to find the uprights since 1988.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

GARIBAY CONNECTS ON LONGEST GAME-WINNER IN FBS HISTORY

- **Jonathan Garibay** was tabbed the conference's top special teams performer for the second time this season and the third time in his career Nov. 15 as he was previously honored following each of his other two game-winning field goals, which came earlier this year at West Virginia and in 2020 after a win over Baylor. He is only the second Red Raider in program history to garner Special Teams Player of the Week honors three times in a career, joining **Wes Welker**, who earned the accolade four times over his Hall of Fame career from 2000-03.
- The Lou Groza Award semifinalist matched the second-longest kick in Big 12 history as it was only the fourth successful try of 60 yards or longer all-time among conference kickers. In addition, it was the longest for a kicker all-time in a game between two Big 12 schools. It was the longest game-winning field goal all-time in FBS history (less than a minute remaining).
- Garibay, who has found the uprights in 13-of-14 attempts this season, matched the Texas Tech record for consecutive field goals with his 46-yarder early in the Baylor game. He matched the consecutive successful field goals that was previously set by **Clayton Hatfield** during the 2018 season. Hatfield, who was also successful in 13-consecutive tries, remains the most-accurate kicker in program history after making 84.7 percent of his attempts from 2015-18, which is just higher than Garibay's 84.0 current mark.
- Garibay became only the third place kicker in Texas Tech history to garner All-Big 12 first team accolades, joining a list that includes Hatfield (2018) and **Alex Trilica** (2007).
- Garibay connected on the second game-winning field goal of his career at West Virginia as the senior found the uprights from 32 yards out with only 18 seconds remaining. He was named the Big 12 Co-Special Teams Player of the Week the following Monday for his efforts.
- Garibay previously pushed the Red Raiders to a victory in the final seconds against Baylor late in the 2020 season as he drilled a 25-yard attempt as time expired. It was one of four field goals on the day for Garibay, who became the first Red Raider to connect on four field goals since **Ryan Bustin** had the same amount in a 2013 victory over Kansas. The performance earned him Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week honors for that week as well. Prior to his kick against Baylor, the Red Raiders had not previously walked off with a game-winning field goal since Bustin drilled a 28-yarder in the closing seconds of the 2012 Meineke Car Care Bowl versus Minnesota.
- Garibay was inserted into the kicker role for the first time in his Red Raider career against Baylor as he is only the sixth kicker in Big 12 history to make four field goals in his career debut as the primary field goal specialist and just the second to do so versus a league opponent, joining Colorado's Jeremy Aldrich in 1998 against Nebraska.

RECORDS CONTINUE TO FALL WITH MCNAMARA

- **Austin McNamara** has become accustomed to breaking records during his time as a Red Raider as the junior snapped another one against Oklahoma State after bombing eight punts of at least 50 yards. The performance broke the previous FBS record of seven that was set by Colorado's Mark Mariscal in a 2002 home game against Southern California.
- McNamara averaged 56.4 yards per punt overall against the Cowboys, which finished just shy of the Texas Tech single-game record of 57.0 yards an attempt that was set by **Alex Reyes** in a 2004 win versus Baylor (only three attempts). It marked the second-highest average for an FBS punter in a game this season and the third-highest for any punter with at least nine attempts in a game dating back to 2000, trailing only the clips from Wake Forest's Dom Maggio in a 2019 contest at Clemson (57.7) and San Diego State's Matt Araiza and his 56.8 average earlier this year versus New Mexico State.
- McNamara has quickly become a fixture in the Texas Tech record book in only two-plus seasons as the junior punter already owns two of the top five single-season averages in program history as well as the longest punt by any Big 12 player in league history. McNamara is on pace to place his name among the all-time greats once again as he is averaging an impressive 48.4 yards per punt this year, which would potentially break the Tech single-season record of 46.8 that was set by **Mark Bounds** in 1991. McNamara wrapped the 2020 season averaging an impressive 46.3 yards per punt, the second-highest clip in school history behind only the average compiled by Bounds. He previously averaged 45.0 yards per punt as a true freshman in 2020, which now ranks fifth in program history. He is the only Red Raider with two of the top-five punting averages currently in the school record book.
- McNamara is currently second in the Big 12 currently entering this weekend for punting average as he trails only Oklahoma's Michael Turk (51.3). He led the Big 12 in the category a year ago and ranked fourth nationally among punters who played in at least five games.
- McNamara is on pace to snap the Texas Tech career record as he is averaging 46.3 yards per punt through two-plus seasons. **Taylor Symmank** is the current career record holder as he averaged 43.7 yards per attempt from 2012-15.
- Behind McNamara, Texas Tech currently ranks fifth nationally in net punting average with a 44.0 clip. The Red Raiders previously ranked fourth in the category during McNamara's 2019 true freshman season with a 42.5 average.
- McNamara set social media on fire midway through the 2020 season with his booming 87-yard punt against West Virginia, which marked the longest by an FBS kicker since 2017 and the longest in Texas Tech and Big 12 history. McNamara broke the Texas Tech single-game record for the longest punt that was previously set by **R.W. Moyers** in 1945 against West Texas State. Moyers launched an 85-yard punt in the win, which is the only other punt of 80 yards or longer in school history.

**HEAD COACH JOEY MCGUIRE**

Joey McGuire, a 2020 inductee into the Texas High School Coaches Association Hall of Honor, has been named the 17th head football coach in Texas Tech history, Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced Nov. 8. McGuire, who has spent the previous five seasons helping build Baylor into a Big 12 title contender following a legendary career at Cedar Hill High School, will join the Texas Tech athletics department immediately and will assume head coaching duties immediately following the 2021 football season. Sonny Cumbie will continue to serve as Texas Tech's interim head coach for the remaining regular-season games and the bowl appearance.

"We are excited for this new chapter in Texas Tech Football under the direction of Coach McGuire," Hocutt said. "Our search committee was impressed from the outset not only with his significant ties throughout the state of Texas but his enthusiasm and desire to serve as the head coach at Texas Tech. We are thrilled to be able to welcome Coach McGuire and his wife Debbie to our Red Raider family."

During his five seasons in Waco, McGuire's ties throughout the state helped develop a Baylor program that appeared in the 2019 Big 12 Championship game and the Allstate Sugar Bowl, one of three times the Bears have secured bowl eligibility during his tenure. McGuire has served as Baylor's associate head coach each of the last three seasons.

McGuire made the jump to Baylor after a legendary run as head coach at Cedar Hill High School in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex. Over his 14 seasons, he took a Cedar Hill program that hadn't won a playoff game prior to his tenure and led the Longhorns to 12-consecutive playoff appearances and three state championships, including back-to-back titles in 2013 and 2014.

Cedar Hill was an impressive 141-42 during McGuire's tenure as the Longhorns also claimed the state title in 2006, only his fourth season as head coach. Cedar Hill was the state runner-up in 2012, starting a run where the Longhorns were among the most-dominant programs in Texas. Cedar Hill won nine bi-district titles and seven district crowns overall during McGuire's tenure.

McGuire and his wife, Debbie, have two children, a daughter Raegan and a son Garret. Garret was a quarterback at Baylor from 2017-20 before joining the coaching profession as a member of the Carolina Panthers prior to the 2021 season. Raegan is a graduate of Texas Tech University.

MCGUIRE'S MANTRA

"You are going to hear this out of my mouth every single day, and the guys will understand it, we are going to have a brand - We are going to be the toughest, hardest working, most competitive team in the country. That is our brand. Tough teams are hard to beat."

COORDINATOR HIRES UNDER MCGUIRE

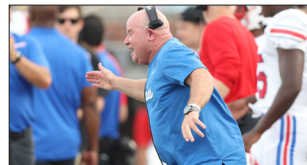
Joey McGuire quickly built an impressive staff since his hire as the 17th head coach in program history as he has tabbed Tim DeRuyter as his defensive coordinator, Zach Kittley as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach and then Kenny Perry as his associate head coach and special teams coordinator. All three boast significant experience in the state of Texas with Perry leading that group as one of five full-time coaches who have previously served in the Texas high school ranks.

DeRuyter arrives in Lubbock having served as a defensive coordinator or a head coach in each of the past 20 seasons, including each of the past five years in the Pac-12 where he led the defenses for California (2017-20) and Oregon (2021). Prior to that, he was the head coach at Fresno State for four-plus seasons, leading the Bulldogs to two Mountain West titles. Oregon is ranked No. 14 in the final College Football Playoff poll after finishing 10-3 this season with an appearance in the Pac-12 Championship game. The Ducks, who will play in the Valero Alamo Bowl, boast one of the nation's most opportunistic defenses as Oregon currently ranks fourth in the FBS with 17 interceptions and 18th nationally with 22 total takeaways. DeRuyter compiled a 30-30 overall record with two Mountain West titles during his four-plus seasons at Fresno State.

**ZACH KITTLEY | OFF. COORDINATOR**

This will be Kittley's second stint on the Texas Tech coaching staff after previously serving in various roles on Kliff Kingsbury's staff from 2013-17, rising from a student assistant to graduate assistant and assistant quarterbacks coach his final three seasons. Kittley worked alongside Kingsbury in the development of Patrick Mahomes II as a graduate assistant, tutoring the future NFL MVP into becoming the nation's leading passer in 2016 and an eventual top-10 selection by the Kansas City Chiefs. Kittley, 30, returns to his alma mater after a record-setting season at Western Kentucky averaged an impressive 44.2 points per game and 535.3 yards of total offense per game. Under Kittley, Bailey Zippe set the NCAA FBS single-season records for passing yards (5,967) and touchdown passes (62), both categories he led in nationally.

**KENNY PERRY | ASSOC. HC/STC**

No stranger to the state of Texas, Perry brings a similar background as head coach Joey McGuire as both were successful head coaches in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex before joining the collegiate ranks. Perry will serve as associate head coach under McGuire while overseeing the Red Raider special teams units. Perry arrives at Texas Tech after spending the previous two seasons at SMU where he was a special teams quality control analyst his first year before being promoted to special teams coordinator for the 2021 campaign. Prior to joining the collegiate ranks, Perry built a reputation as one of the top high school coaches in the state of Texas with successful runs at Sam Houston (2000-03), Haltom City (2004-05) and Arlington Bowling (2006-12). Perry compiled a 67-22 record during his seven seasons at Bowie alone.



TECH LANDS STRONG START TO 2022 CLASS

Texas Tech reaped the benefits of head coach Joey McGuire's ties throughout the state of Texas as the Red Raiders officially signed 16 high school prospects to National Letters of Intent to start the early signing period.

Since his hire in early November, McGuire and his staff quickly assembled one of the top signing classes in recent memory as Texas Tech currently ranks inside the top 40 nationally by both Rivals and 247Sports. McGuire had just over a month to finalize the star-studded list, which currently ranks as the highest-rated class for the Red Raiders since 2015 by 247Sports and 2012 by Rivals.

"Today was a great day for the future of Red Raider Football," McGuire said on Signing Day. "This class will be the cornerstone of our future success here at Texas Tech, and we are so fortunate that these signees and their families chose to be Red Raiders. We can't wait to get each of these kids to campus to start working on building a championship program our fans and supporters can be proud of each time we take the field."

The class of high-school prospects adds to the three transfer signees announced Tuesday in wide receiver Brady Boyd (Minnesota), linebacker Dimitri Moore (Missouri State) and defensive back Tyler Owens (Texas). All three will enroll at Texas Tech at semester alongside high school signees Joseph Adedire (Arlington, Texas), Landon Hullaby (Mansfield, Texas), Ty Kana (Katy, Texas), Kaden Weatherby (Aurora, Colo.) and Trevon McAlpine (Saraland, Ala.).

Texas Tech leaned heavily on the defensive side of the ball with 11 high school signees set to join new coordinator Tim DeRuyter's scheme. The class positioned the Red Raiders for depth in the trenches as the Red Raiders inked three offensive linemen and four on the defensive front to go along with a trio of linebackers.

McGuire and his staff will add to the class further in the coming months through additional transfer signees and high school prospects. The spring signing period kicks off Feb. 2 for high school and junior college signees.

THE STATE OF TEXAS' TOP ATHLETICS DEPARTMENT

- With all the talk of conference realignment in the air, it's important to remember Texas Tech has led all schools in the state of Texas in the Capital One Cup men's standings in two of the last three complete athletic seasons after finishing third nationally in 2018-19 and then 14th for the 2017-18 athletic year. Below are several other facts regarding Texas Tech's success in competition.
- Since 2017, Texas Tech has had 15 of its 17 athletic programs compete in the NCAA postseason or a bowl game.
- Texas Tech has had six different programs finish among the top-10 teams nationally in their respective sport since 2014 alone.
- The Red Raiders have appeared in 38 bowl games in their history, which ranks tied for third among Big 12 programs and among the top-25 teams in college football history.
- Texas Tech claimed the 2019 Men's Outdoor Track and Field National Championship under head coach Wes Kittley.
- Texas Tech played in the 2019 NCAA Championship Game as well as in two-consecutive Elite Eights (2018-19). The Red Raiders are one of four men's basketball programs in the country with multiple Elite Eight appearances over the last three NCAA Tournaments.
- Texas Tech has advanced to the Men's College World Series four times in recent years (2014, 2016, 2018, 2019), which is tied for the most trips to the hallowed grounds in Omaha among teams nationally since 2014.
- Lady Raider Basketball remains one of the top programs in women's college basketball history as Texas Tech ranks 19th all-time among power-five programs with its 925 victories. Backed by the legendary Sheryl Swoopes, the Lady Raiders claimed the NCAA National Championship in 1993, the first team national championship in school history.
- Since joining the Big 12 as a charter member in 1996, Texas Tech has won 27 conference titles, with 11 of those coming in the past six years alone.
- In addition to its athletics success, Texas Tech has unveiled several new facilities in recent years with the opening of the \$48 million Sports Performance Center in 2017, the Cash Family Sports Nutrition Center in 2020 and the \$32.2 million Dustin R. Womble Basketball Center this past May.

THE NATION'S MOST DEDICATED FANS

- Texas Tech boasts one of the most rabid fan bases in all of college athletics as Red Raider fans have traditionally traveled in droves for bowl trips as well as to basketball games in locations like New York City, Anaheim (CA) and Minneapolis for the Final Four as well as to Omaha for the Men's College World Series.
- To date, Texas Tech has played in the highest-attended games for three bowl games, including two prominent ones in the state of Texas: the Goodyear Cotton Bowl (Dallas), the Academy Sports + Outdoors Texas Bowl (Houston) and the Holiday Bowl (San Diego).
- The Red Raiders had 88,175 fans on tap for the 2009 Cotton Bowl when the Red Raiders faced Ole Miss in the bowl's final game at historic Fair Park. It remains the highest-attended contest in the bowl's history even with the move to AT&T Stadium in Arlington, which can reach over 100,000 fans in capacity.
- Additionally, Texas Tech helped set the Texas Bowl attendance record in 2015 when the Red Raiders faced LSU in NRG Stadium. The bowl drew 71,307 fans that night to see a pair of future NFL standouts in Texas Tech's Patrick Mahomes II and Jakeem Grant.
- At home, Texas Tech has sold out of season tickets for its baseball program over seven-consecutive seasons now and will likely be looking at another sellout in 2022 after the Red Raiders advanced to the NCAA Super Regional round this past June.
- Texas Tech has sold out of season tickets in each of its last two men's basketball seasons, giving the Red Raiders the premier homecourt advantage in college basketball at 15,000-seat United Supermarkets Arena. The Red Raiders averaged a conference-leading 14,057 fans per game during the 2019-20 basketball season.
- On social media, Texas Tech student-athletes earned the highest engagement rate on their posts among peer power-five institutions over the past athletic year. Texas Tech's social media accounts accumulated over 35 million combined video views during the 2020-21 year alone.
- Texas Tech's brand has the ability to reach the nation through its creative social media usage. Texas Tech currently boasts the fifth-highest TikTok following by athletics accounts in the nation.
- Texas Tech is annually one of the top-performing schools among the Collegiate Licensing Company's (CLC) partner institutions, ranking 19th nationally in royalties generated this past year.

A PREMIER RESEARCH INSTITUTION

- Texas Tech University is the flagship institution, with a Moody Aa1 rating, of the five-member Texas Tech University System.
- Texas Tech is one of 16 universities designated as a Carnegie Very High Research Activity Institution and a Hispanic Serving Institution.
- Texas Tech has been named Higher Education Excellence in Diversity award winner in each of the last nine years. The university currently boasts 42 percent of its students identifying as racial-ethnic minorities.
- Texas Tech is a five-star Campus Pride Institution, one of two in Texas, and No. 25 on the Campus Pride Index.
- Texas Tech has awarded over \$170 million in scholarships recently with over 50 percent of students receiving scholarship support.
- Texas Tech boasted more than \$192 million in research expenditures in 2020 alone.

TEXAS TECH BOWL HISTORY

Texas Tech will be making its 39th postseason bowl appearance at the Liberty Bowl, which ranks among the top-25 programs all-time in bowl games played. The Red Raiders rank tied for third among current Big 12 Conference programs in bowl appearances.
