TALKING POINTS

- ► MSU will be one of the most-experienced teams in college football this spring, with a total of 16 starters returning on offense and defense.
- ► The Bulldogs host Memphis for the return trip in a homeand-home series that began last year. That meeting was the first between the two programs in 10 years.
- Last fall, MSU was the only school in the country that faced six teams ranked in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 and was one of four teams with three wins against teams ranked in the final
- Mike Leach became the first MSU head coach, at least in the modern era, to beat three teams in one season who finished ranked in a final poll.
- Over the last five seasons, Mike Leach's teams have defeated nine opponents ranked inside the AP Top 25. Only two current SEC head coaches have more such wins in that span.
- ▶ The Bulldogs were one of four teams to rank inside the top 25 nationally in both total offense and total defense during the 2021 regular season, joining Alabama, Michigan and Coastal Carolina.
- ► State passed for 4,918 yards in 2021, marking the 20th consecutive season that Mike Leach's offense has eclipsed the 3,000-yard mark. That's every season of his head coaching career.
- ▶ Following the 2021 regular season, MSU was the third most improved scoring offense in the SEC and 10th most improved nationally at +9.5 from 2020 (21.4 ppg to 30.9 ppg).



Against Memphis last year, Will Rogers became the 12th passer nationwide with 50 completions in a game since 2000, breaking the SEC single-game record.

PROVEN WINNER

TALKING POINTS CONTINUED

- According to ESPN's FPI, MSU will play the second-toughest schedule in the nation in 2022.
- ▶ Mississippi State returns 72.2 percent of its receptions from a year ago, which trails only LSU (72.5 percent) in the SEC.
- ► Entering 2022, WRs Jaden Walley (33) and Austin Williams (35) are the SEC's returning leaders in receptions for a first down from a year ago. Both are among the top five active SEC players in career first-down receptions.
- ▶ Williams owns the lowest drop rate of any SEC wide receiver since 2019 (0.9 percent). His 92.3 hands grade from PFF ranked second in the FBS in 2021 and was the highest among players returning for 2022.
- ▶ Under **Mike Leach**, the Bulldogs are 7-0 when scoring at least 30 points and 8-2 when scoring first.
- WR Rara Thomas has caught five touchdown passes across his last five games.
- In 2021, OB **Will Rogers** became the first MSU quarterback to lead the SEC in passing yards per game (364.5). His 4,739 passing yards are the third most in SEC single-season history, and the two quarterbacks ahead of Rogers played in two more games than he did during their respective seasons.
- ▶ Rogers joined 2019 Heisman Trophy winner Joe Burrow of LSU as the only QBs in college football over the last 22 seasons to throw for 4,700+ yards and 35+ touchdowns while completing at least 73 percent of their passes.
- Rogers broke 25 records during his sophomore season one year after rewriting nearly every passing mark in MSU history as a freshman in 2020. Last season, Rogers broke Dak Prescott's records for single-season total offense, passing yards and passing touchdowns that Prescott set as a fourth-year junior and fifth-year senior.
- ▶ Mississippi State has ranked among the top five Power Five teams in the nation in yards after catch in back-to-back seasons under head coach Mike Leach. The Bulldogs led the nation in yards after catch in 2021, and State ranked second in the SEC and third nationally in 2020.
- ▶ WR Lideatrick Griffin finished the 2021 season averaging 32.8 yards per kickoff return which tied Eric Moulds' mark in 1994 for the highest single-season average in school history and was third in the FBS last year.
- State returns its 2021 leaders in tackles, tackles for loss, sacks, quarterback hurries, interceptions and pass breakups.
- ▶ LB **Jett Johnson** ranks third among returning linebackers in the FBS with a 74.7 overall defensive grade from PFF. He is the SEC's returning leader.
- ► MSU returns 79.1 percent of its defensive snaps from 2021. Of the 22 players on the defensive side of the two-deep, 17 have been playing for the past two years under defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett**. Three more have at least played a season in Arnett's system.
- Against SEC teams, Arnett's defense ranked third in total defense (352.3) in 2021 and fourth in total defense (380.3) in 2020 after ranking 11th (419.3) in 2019 before his arrival at MSU.
- ► Since 2020, MSU has allowed fewer than 150 rushing yards in 15 games, which trails only Alabama (26) and Georgia (24) in the SEC during that span. MSU is holding its opponents to just 124.5 rushing yards per game.
- ► State led the SEC in fewest first downs allowed in 2021 (219), and the Bulldogs were one of the best in the league at getting off the field as they allowed the second fewest total plays on the year (807).
- ► CB **Emmanuel Forbes** is the FBS active career leader in interception return touchdowns with three, which is tied for the most in school history and also has him ranked second nationally in overall defensive touchdowns entering 2022.

ENTERING YEAR 3 UNDER LEACH

- ▶ Mike Leach was hired as the 34th head coach in program history on Jan. 9, 2020. He previously spent eight seasons at Washington State where he was twice named Pac-12 Coach of the Year. In 2018, he was tabbed the AFCA National Coach of the Year for the second time in his career. Prior to his stint with the Cougars, Leach took Texas Tech to a bowl game in 10 consecutive seasons, setting a program record with 84 victories in his tenure.
- ▶ One of the most successful coaches in the history of college football, Leach's 150 career wins are the second-most among active SEC coaches and tied for the fourth-most among active Power 5 coaches. Leach is the only active Power 5 head coach to produce an 11-win season at two different programs since 2008 and one of two active FBS head coaches to win 50-plus games at multiple Power 5 programs.

RECORD RALLIES

- ▶ Mike Leach has led record-setting comebacks at Texas Tech, Washington State and now Mississippi State.
- ► The Bulldogs broke the school record for the largest comeback twice in 2021. In the season-opener against Louisiana Tech, MSU trailed by 20 points in the fourth quarter before securing a one-point victory. State then scored 40 straight points to erase a 25-point deficit at No. 17 Auburn.
- Leach's Texas Tech team overcame a 31-point deficit in the 2006 Insight Bowl, which is tied for the largest comeback in a bowl game in FBS history.
- WR Jamire Calvin played in the record-setting comebacks under Leach at both MSU and Washington State.

RIVALING THE RANKINGS

- Last fall, MSU was the only school in the country that faced six teams ranked in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 and was one of four teams with three wins against teams ranked in the final poll. **Mike Leach** became the first MSU head coach, at least in the modern era, to beat three teams in one season who finished ranked in a final poll.
- Over the last five seasons, Leach's teams have defeated nine opponents ranked inside the AP Top 25. Only two current SEC head coaches have more such wins in that span. Leach is tied for seventh in the nation since 2020 in wins over AP Top 15 opponents [3].
- ► Under Leach, State has already defeated four AP-ranked opponents in road or neutral site contests with wins at then-No. 6 LSU (2020), vs. then-No. 22 Tulsa (2020), at then-No. 15 Texas A&M (2021) and at No. 16 Auburn (2021).
- Leach's five total ranked wins are the most of any Bulldog head coach in his first two years, and his four away from Starkville are tied for the most by an MSU head coach in program history.
- Leach is tied for seventh in the nation since 2020 in wins over AP Top 15 opponents (3).

MATCHING UP WITH MEMPHIS

- ▶ Memphis entered last year's matchup as the nation's leader in total offense (633.5 yards per game), but State held the Tigers to just 246 total yards. MSU allowed just 12 first downs in the 2021 meeting, which was then tied for the seventh-fewest allowed by any **Mike Leach**-coached team.
- ▶ The Bulldogs meanwhile completed an MSU and SEC single-game record 50 passes on 67 attempts, which ranks second in school history. The 50 completions are tied for sixth-most by any Leach-coached team.
- ► The game started strong for State, which outgained Memphis, 241-89, in total offense in the first half alone. The Bulldogs ran 43 plays in the first half, while holding Memphis to just 20 snaps.

CHUNK PLAYS

- ▶ The Bulldogs were second in the SEC with 101 passes of 15 or more yards last year. 29 of those went for 25 yards or more.
- ▶ Defensively, MSU allowed just 48 runs to go for more than 10 yards, which was tied for second in the SEC. The Bulldogs allowed 84 rushing first downs, which was tied for 15th in the FBS.

50 BURGER

- ▶ With its 55-10 victory against Tennessee State on Nov. 20, 2021, Mississippi State has now scored 50+ points in at least one game in 11 consecutive seasons. The 55 points were MSU's most in a game since a 56-10 victory against Louisiana on Sept. 15, 2018.
- State has put up 50+ points six times since 2018, with three of those games coming against SEC opponents. MSU has scored 50+ points 19 times over the last 16 seasons and is 19-0 in those games.

REVIEWING ROGERS' RUN ON THE RECORD BOOKS

- ► In 2021, QB **Will Rogers** at only 20 years old became the first MSU quarterback to lead the SEC in passing yards per game (364.5). His 4,739 passing yards are the third most in SEC single-season history (the two quarterbacks ahead of Rogers played in two more games than he did during their respective seasons).
- ▶ Rogers joined 2019 Heisman Trophy winner Joe Burrow of LSU as the only QBs in college football over the last 22 seasons to throw for 4,700+ yards and 35+ touchdowns while completing at least 73 percent of their passes.
- After breaking nearly every freshman passing mark in MSU history in 2020, Rogers broke 25 more records, including Dak Prescott's records set as a fourth-year junior and fifth-year senior for single-season total offense, passing yards and passing touchdowns.
- ▶ Rogers passed for at least 300 yards with completing 70 percent of his passes and tossing three touchdowns in eight separate games in 2021, which was three more than any other Power 5 passer.

ON THE LINE

- MSU's offensive line has shuffled this year, with multiple linemen playing new positions.
- ► C **LaQuinston Sharp** is the only lineman returning to the same position he played in 2021. Sharp snapped the ball 1,002 times last year, and is the most-veteran of the group with 1,699 snaps across the line in his career.
- Last season, Sharp, who was named to the Rimington Trophy watch list, earned a career-best 83.8 percent pass blocking grade from PFF. He surrendered only two sacks in 786 passing snaps.
- The offensive line enters 2022 with 5,175 career snaps, but only 1,893 (36.6 percent) of those have been taken at their current positions.
- ► Head coach Mike Leach and offensive line tutor Mason Miller are no strangers to development on the line, however. In fact, with the first-round selection of OT Charles Cross in the 2022 NFL Draft, Leach and Miller are one of just three coaching tandems with a first-round offensive lineman in two of the last four Drafts.

- **NEW AIR**
- ▶ There have been 15 games of 400-plus passing yards in Mississippi State history. Eight of those performances occurred in the first 24 games of the Mike Leach era.
- MSU had thrown for 400-plus yards just seven total times in the previous 1,193 games prior to Leach's arrival in Starkville.
- ▶ The Bulldogs were second in the nation with six 400-yard passing games and one of 18 schools nationally and three SEC teams with multiple such games in 2021. State was one of five teams nationally with 11 300-yard passing games.
- State's most recent 400-plus passing yard performance came against Tennessee State on Nov. 20, 2021. OBs Will Rogers and Chance **Lovertich** completed 36 of 46 passes for 493 yards and five touchdowns in that game.
- Rogers is the eighth SEC quarterback to ever record a 4,000-yard passing season, ranks third in conference history and holds the MSU school record. He is the 10th different passer that Leach has coached to the 4,000-yard mark.

AIRING IT OUT

- ▶ QB Will Rogers completed a school-record and SEC-record 50 passes at Memphis last year Rogers holds eight of the top nine single-game marks in program history, including each of the top five.
- ▶ Rogers became the 12th passer nationwide with 50 completions in a game since 2000, and Mike Leach has coached five of the 12. The 50 completions at Memphis are tied for the sixth-most by any team under **Mike Leach** in his 20-year career.
- MSU passed for 493 yards against Tennessee State (Nov. 20), which ranks third in program history and is the second-highest Bulldog total under Leach
- State's 67 passing attempts against Memphis last year trail only its 70 attempts at Kentucky in 2020 and LSU's 69 attempts against Auburn in 1999 for the most in a single game in SEC history.

ROGERS ON A ROLL

- QB Will Rogers threw for at least 300 yards in ten straight games in 2021, while averaging 378.7 yards during the streak and completing 75.1 percent of his passes (402-of-535) with 30 touchdowns before the streak was snapped in State's bowl game.
- Since 2004, the only quarterbacks with a longer streak are Graham Harrell (16) and Gardner Minshew (11).
- Rogers has tossed a touchdown in 18 of his last 19 games with 44 scores in that span. Since 2020, Rogers has tossed multiple touchdowns in 11 different games, which is third among active SEC quarterbacks.

RECORDS FOR ROGERS

- ▶ QB **Will Rogers** broke 25 records during his sophomore season one year after rewriting nearly every passing mark in MSU history as a freshman in 2020. Last season, Rogers broke Dak Prescott's records for single-season total offense, passing yards and passing touchdowns that Prescott set as a fourth-year junior and fifth-year senior.
- ▶ In 2021, Rogers led the SEC in passing yards per game (364.5) and finished third in the FBS in total passing yards (4,739). His 4,739 passing yards were the third most in SEC single-season history, while he ranked second in the SEC and seventh in the nation in passing touchdowns (36).
- Rogers broke the school record with six passing touchdowns at No. 17 Auburn (Nov. 13, 2021).
- Against No. 12 Kentucky, Rogers broke MSU and SEC records for completion percentage with a 92.3 percent mark. The previous MSU record (min. 35 att.) was his 83.0 percent mark in the season opener against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4). The previous SEC mark (min. 30 comp.) was 91.2 percent by Josh Dobbs (Tennessee) vs. Vanderbilt (2016).
- ▶ Rogers enters the season as MSU's career leader in completion percentage: 72.3 percent (744-of-1,029).
- ▶ Broke his own MSU single-game record for consecutive completions twice against No. 12 Kentucky (Oct. 30, 2021) with two streaks of 15 completions. Previous: 14 at Vanderbilt (Oct. 23, 2021) and 12 vs. Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4, 2021).
- ▶ Broke his own MSU single-game-record with 50 completions at Memphis (2021), which stands as the SEC record (Previous MSU: 45 by Rogers, at Ole Miss, 2020; Previous SEC: 47 by Tim Couch, Kentucky, vs. Arkansas, 1998).
- Riding a 13-game streak with 30 or more completions.
- Now boasts 13 career 300-yard passing games, which is an MSU career record (Previous: 9 by Dak Prescott, 2012-15) and 17 career 30-completion games, also an MSU record (Previous: 5 by Dak Prescott, 2012-15).
- ► Through just 22 games and 19 starts, QB Will Rogers has moved to the top of State's career leaderboard in total offense. His 299.0 yards per game (6,577 total yards) currently leads all Bulldogs.
- ▶ Bulldog legend Dak Prescott held the record previously, averaging 242.8 yards per game of total offense (11,897 yards in 49 games), but Prescott recorded more than half of his career yardage in his senior season. With his senior year removed, Prescott averaged 155.1 yards per game (5,583 yards in 36
- ▶ In 18 career starts, Rogers has thrown just 12 interceptions despite having 959 passing attempts (1.25 percent).

SPREADING THE LOVE

- Last year, WR Makai Polk (105), RB Jo'quavious Marks (83), RB Dillon Johnson (65), WR Jaden Walley (55) and WR Austin Williams (52) gave State four 50-catch receivers in the same year for the first time in program history. The Bulldogs return four of the five.
- MSU had just four prior seasons with two 50-catch players: 2020 Marks and Jaden Walley, 2015 Fred Ross and De'Runnya Wilson, 1969 - Sammy Milner and David Smith.
- ▶ The Bulldogs had multiple 500-yard receivers for just the seventh time on record (since 1961) and saw three receivers reach that mark for the first time in program history: Polk, 989; Walley, 610 and Williams, 543.

- ▶ RB **Jo'quavious Marks** has the longest active streak at 24 games, which includes every game of his collegiate career. WRs Jaden Walley and Austin Williams have catches in 22 straight contests.

RACING FOR THE RECEPTIONS RECORD

► Entering 2022, RB **Jo'quavious Marks** and WR **Austin Williams** have cracked the MSU career top 10 for total receptions. Marks holds the career record for a running back.

MR. RELIABLE... ON AND OFF THE FIELD

- ► WR **Austin Williams** owns the lowest drop rate of any SEC wide receiver since 2019 (0.9 percent). His 92.3 hands grade from PFF ranked second in the FBS in 2021 and was the highest among players returning for 2022.
- ▶ Williams enters his final campaign following a career year in 2021 that saw him set new personal season highs with 52 catches for 617 yards and four touchdowns. He caught 52 of his 59 targets (88.1 percent), which ranked fifth in the nation among players with at least 40 targets.
- ▶ Williams tied the school record with three receiving touchdowns against Tennessee State (Nov. 20). He caught four passes for a career-high 75 yards, including 21-yard and 30-yard scores.
- ▶ Of his 116 career receptions, 63.8 percent have led to a touchdown or first down. He is now tied for 10th in MSU career history with 12 receiving touchdowns.
- ▶ Williams has excelled in the classroom, already completing a bachelor's degree in finance and his master's in business administration. He is working on a third degree and was a semifinalist for the NFF Campbell Trophy in 2021. This summer he became first reigning SEC H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award winner to represent his school at SEC Media Days.
- ▶ He is an outstanding example in the community, reaching the semifinalist stage for both the Wuerffel Trophy and Witten Man of the Year Award in 2021.

WALLEY WATCH

- ▶ WR Jaden Walley caught 55 passes for 628 yards and six touchdowns in 2021. He's the top returning MSU wide receiver in all three of those categories.
- ▶ Walley had a touchdown catch in six different games last season. His eight games with a touchdown reception are tied for second among active players in the SEC since 2020.
- ► Caught a season-high seven passes for a season-high 87 yards at No. 17 Auburn (Nov. 13, 2021) with four receptions for first downs.

MAKING HIS MARKS

- ▶ RB Jo'quavious Marks was named to the watch list for the Paul Hornung Award, which recognizes the most-versatile player in college football. He has not only proven he can pick up yardage by carrying the football but can also be an effective option in the passing game as both a blocker and receiver out of the backfield.
- Marks was second on the team with 83 receptions, which led all FBS running backs and broke his own MSU record for the most catches in a season by a running back. He totaled 502 yards through the air
- ► Marks' 106 rushes and six touchdowns on the ground were both team highs for the Bulldogs in 2021. He has rushed 176 times for 728 yards and nine touchdowns in his career.
- ▶ His 143 career receptions are fifth in MSU history, and he holds the MSU career record for receptions by a running back.

BALL HOGS

- ▶ Thanks in large part to its stout defense, Mississippi State dominated time of possession last year. The Bulldogs led the SEC and ranked 10th in the FBS at 33:12 of possession per game.
- MSU's defense allowed the fewest first downs in the SEC and played the second-fewest snaps in the conference. State's offense ran 975 total plays which was third in the SEC and 13th nationally.
- ► The Bulldogs average +6:53 in time of possession differential and 12.9 more plays per game than their opponent in 2021.

DAWG DEFENSE QUICK HITS

- ▶ Mississippi State returns its 2021 leaders in tackles (LB **Jett Johnson**), tackles for loss and sacks (LB **Tyrus Wheat**), quarterback hurries (DT **Jaden Crumedy** and DT **Randy Charlton**) and interceptions and pass breakups (CB **Emmanuel Forbes**).
- ► State led the SEC in fewest first downs allowed in 2021 (219), and the Bulldogs were one of the best in the league at getting off the field as they allowed the second fewest total plays on the year (807).
- ▶ In 2021, MSU held the following opponents to season lows: No. 12 Kentucky [216 yards of total offense), NC State [337 yards of total offense and 34 yards rushing), No. 15 Texas A&M [135 yards passing), Vanderbilt [9 yards rushing].
- ► State was third in the SEC and 12th in the nation in rushing defense (113.4).
- ▶ State allowed 148 plays of 10+ yards from scrimmage last season, which ranked second in the SEC.
- ▶ CB Emmanuel Forbes was tied for 13th in the SEC with eight pass defenses and S Jalen Green was tied for second among SEC safeties with six pass defenses in 2021.
- ▶ The Bulldog defense held consecutive SEC opponents to fewer than 50 total plays against Vanderiblt and Kentucky in 2021, marking just the third time since 2000 that an SEC team has held conference opponents to fewer than 50 plays in consecutive weeks. Kentucky did so in 2019 against Tennessee (Nov. 9) and at Vanderbilt (Nov. 16), and LSU did so in 2011 against Florids (Oct. 8) and at Tennessee (Oct. 15).
- ▶ Three Bulldogs posted career highs with double-digit tackles against No. 5 Alabama. It was one of two games last season that saw State have multiple players record 10 or more tackles in a game. The second came when four Bulldogs posted double-digit tackles against No. 9 Ole Miss (Nov. 25).

ANALYZING ARNETT'S DEFENSE

- Since his arrival in 2020, defensive coordinator Zach Arnett's defense has been one of the best in the country. In both 2020 and 2021 with Arnett at the helm of the defense, State finished inside the top five in the SEC in total defense, fewest first downs allowed, takeaways, rushing defense and yards allowed per rush.
- Against SEC teams, Arnett's defense ranked third in total defense (352.3) in 2021 and fourth in total defense (380.3) in 2020 after ranking 11th (419.3) in 2019 before his arrival at MSU.
- ► Since 2020, MSU has allowed fewer than 150 rushing yards in 15 games, which trails only Alabama [26] and Georgia (24) in the SEC during that span, MSU is holding its opponents to just 124.5 rushing yards per game, which ranks third in the SEC during that span.
- ► The Bulldogs are tied for fourth in the SEC in turnovers forced (34) since the start of 2020.

DAWG DEFENSE ONE OF THE MOST-EXPERIENCED

- ▶ MSU returns 79.1 percent of its defensive snaps from 2021. The Bulldogs played 807 snaps with 11 players on the field for a total of 8,877 snaps. Bulldog returners combined for 7,020 snaps last year.
- ▶ Of the 22 players on defensive side of the two-deep, 17 have been playing for the past two years under defensive coordinator Zach Arnett. Three more have at least played a season in Arnett's system.
- Only one projected starter was not on the roster last year, and nine of the 11 projected starters have been in the system since 2020.

STATE HAS A TAKEAWAY IN 44 OF ITS LAST 53 GAMES

- ▶ The Bulldogs have collected at least one takeaway in 44 of their last 53 games dating back to the 2017 season at Arkansas on Nov. 18. State has compiled 83 takeaways over the 53-game stretch and forced three or more turnovers 11 times in that span.
- ▶ In that span, the Bulldogs had a takeaway streak of 22 straight games (Nov. 18, 2017-Oct. 12, 2019) and a streak of nine games (Nov. 23, 2019-Nov. 7, 2020).
- ▶ MSU has forced multiple turnovers in 16 games since the start of 2019, going 12-4 when doing so.

MSU HAS AN INTERCEPTION IN 32 OF ITS LAST 49 **GAMES**

- ▶ State has collected an interception in 32 of its last 49 games dating back to Sept. 1, 2018 and has 46 total interceptions during that stretch. Six active players have collected 15 total interceptions in their careers.
- ▶ MSU has 11 multi-interception games since the start of 2018 going 10-1 in those.

HOLDING TEAMS TO FEWER THAN 200 YARDS RUSHING

- ▶ Since the start of the 2018 season, MSU has held 43 of its 50 opponents below the 200-yard rushing mark, which is the third-most in the SEC and tied for 11th in the nation during that stretch. 32 of those 43 games holding teams below 200 yards have been SEC games.
- ▶ In 2021, MSU held six opponents to fewer than 100 yards on the ground. MSU held opponents to 113.4 rushing yards per game, which was third in the SEC. Just 48 of opponents' 406 rushing attempts went for 10 or more vards in 2021.
- ▶ Only two teams rushed for 200+ yards on the Bulldogs in 2021 Arkansas (202) and Texas Tech (260).

HOLDING TEAMS TO FEWER THAN 100 YARDS RUSHING

- ▶ The Bulldogs have held 10 opponents to less than 100 rushing yards in 24 games under defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett**, which is the fourth-most games in the SEC and tied for 15th in the FBS.
- MSU held Vanderbilt (2021) to just six yards rushing, marking the lowest total under Arnett, surpassing an eight-yard performance at then-No. 13 Georgia (2020).
- ▶ State held six opponents, including three SEC teams, to fewer than 100 yards on the ground in 2021, and allowed just 101 yards in the season opener against Louisiana Tech.
- ▶ Since 1976, MSU has held opponents under 100 yards rushing in at least three straight games on five occasions. Prior to Arnett's arrival State had held three straight opponents under 100 yards rushing just three times - with the last coming in 2000 - and the Bulldogs have already done so twice under his leadership.

SAFETY STRENGTH

- ► State's safeties are flooded with experience. Seniors **Shawn Preston Jr.** and **Collin Duncan** bring 63 games and 27 starts to the table along with a combined 213 tackles, seven stops for loss, three interceptions, 18 pass breakups and a forced fumble during their careers.
- ▶ S Jalen Green began his career as a cornerback at Texas, but started 10 games at safety last fall. He finished as one of three Bulldogs with multiple interceptions last year.
- ► Green allowed a reception on just 51.4 percent of his targets in coverage which ranked 13th among SEC safeties and corners with at least 300 coverage snaps. He was third among such players in passer rating allowed (48.9).

NO FLY FORBES

- ▶ CB Emmanuel Forbes enters his third season at MSU as the FBS active career leader in interceptions returned for a touchdown with three, which are tied for the most in school history and also has him ranked second nationally in overall defensive touchdowns entering 2022.
- ▶ He has eight total picks in his two years in maroon and white a total that also puts him among the active career interceptions leaders in the SEC.
- Forbes has racked up 104 tackles across his two seasons including 5.5 tackles for loss, one sack, one forced fumble, eight interceptions and 19 pass breakups.
- ► He started every contest last fall and stacked up 60 tackles 46 of which were solo stops. He also added a career-best five tackles behind the line of scrimmage to go with one sack, eight pass breakups and a forced fumble. He led the team with three interceptions.
- ▶ SEC's active career leader with eight interceptions, which is tied for fifth in the FBS. Eight interceptions is fourth-most in the FBS since the start of the 2020 season. Fifth in the FBS in career interception return yards (216).
- ▶ Was named a Freshman All-American in 2020 after leading the nation in interception touchdowns (3) and leading the SEC in total interceptions (5). His five interceptions led all true freshmen nationally and were tied for third overall. He was also tied for third among FBS freshmen with 11 total pass defenses in 2020 and was 12th overall.
- First Bulldog with five or more interceptions in a season since Mark McLaurin tied the school record with six in 2017, and he is tied for eighth in MSU single-season history.

BOOKIE'S BEST

- ▶ LB **Nathaniel Watson** made a career-high 16 tackles against No. 5 Alabama (2021). That stands as the most tackles by a Bulldog in a single game since Brandon Wilson recorded 18 vs. Louisiana Tech on Sept. 24, 2011.
- ▶ Watson had a season-high nine tackles in the first half alone and recorded his second career sack.
- ► He was second on the team in total tackles (84), second in sacks (5.0) and tied for fourth in tackles for loss (6.0) last year.

TURN ON THE JETTS

- ▶ LB **Jett Johnson** stood as the MSU leader in tackles in 2021 with 87 total stops, including six tackles for loss. He also had an interception and a team-high two fumble recoveries.
- ▶ Returned his first career interception 48 yards against No. 9 Ole Miss (Nov. 25) while making a career-high 11 tackles.
- ► Recovered his first fumble against No. 12 Kentucky (Oct. 30) after having a previous recovery in that game erased upon review. Also recovered a fumble against Tennessee State (Nov. 20)
- Posted a then-career-high 10 tackles against No. 5 Alabama (Oct. 16).
- ▶ He posted a breakout game against NC State (Sept. 11) when he recorded a then-career-high nine tackles, more than any of his previous season totals. He entered 2021 with five career tackles and made five solo stops agains the Wolfpack. Johnson also forced his first career fumble and added a pass breakup in that game.

"TULU" TAKES IT BACK

- ▶ WR **Lideatrick Griffin** finished the 2021 season averaging 32.8 yards per kickoff return which tied Eric Moulds' mark in 1994 for the highest single-season average in school history and was third in the FBS last year.
- ► Griffin had three games with 100-plus kick return yards last season and four individual returns of 35 or more yards (100, 70, 38 and 35 yards). He boasts four 100-yard kick return games, which is tied for the MSU career record (since 1979) along with Leon Berry, Fred Reid, Derek Pegues and Pig Prather.
- ► Through the first two games of 2021, Griffin ranked second nationally in kickoff return yardage averaging 48.8 yards on his five returns. In the remaining eight games in which Griffin played, however, he only had nine more return opportunities as teams started kicking away from him.
- ▶ Of the 46 kickoffs in Griffin's final eight contests, 23 went for touchbacks, four were fair caught, one was an onside kick and nine were kicked to players other than him.
- ▶ In the 10 games in which he was the primary kickoff returner, the Bulldogs' offense started drives with an average field position at the 27.7 yard line and averaged beginning at the 35.1 yard line when he was the one actually returning the kickoff.
- ▶ He returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against NC State (Sept. 11). It was the fifth 100-yard kick return in program history and the first 100-yard return since Brandon Holloway did so against Southern Miss (Sept. 5, 2015).
- ► Griffin's kick return was the first time MSU had scored on its first kickoff return of a game since Jameon Lewis returned the second kickoff of the game 100 yards against 0le Miss on Nov. 24, 2012 following the Rebels' game-opening scoring drive. It was the first opening kickoff return for a touchdown since Kevin Prentiss returned the opening kick 91 yards at South Carolina on Sept. 26, 1998.

HONORING PIONEERS DOWSING AND BELL

- ▶ Mississippi State is set to honor its first African-American varsity football players Frank Dowsing, Jr. and Robert Bell by wearing a specially designed uniform from adidas against Bowling Green on September 24. Dowsing and Bell arrived at Mississippi State in 1969.
- ▶ MSU will don threads paying homage to Dowsing and Bell and commemorating the 50th anniversary of when the two last suited up in Maroon and White. The new uniforms showcase a unique look that hearkens back to the practice jerseys the groundbreaking players wore three years later in 1972.
- Dowsing was a First-Team All-American as a senior and earned two total All-Southeastern Conference defensive back selections at MSU. The Tupelo, Mississippi, native ended his career as the school's career leader in interceptions with 10 and still remains tied for eighth all-time entering the 2022 season.
- ▶ He also shined in the classroom and on campus. He was the first player in State history to earn the prestigious honor of National Football Foundation National Scholar Athlete. He was also voted Mr. Mississippi State in October of 1972. Dowsing died at the age of 42 in July of 1994.
- ▶ Bell was an inspirational leader on the Mississippi State defensive line who was a regular starter that garnered three letters for the Bulldogs. A fan favorite, it was common to hear chants from the Bulldog faithful of, 'Give 'em hell, Robert Bell.' A native of Meridian, Mississippi, Bell passed away in March of this year. He was 70 years old.

HOME RENOVATIONS

- ▶ The 2022 season brought multiple upgrades to Davis Wade Stadium. Most notably, the west side upper decks have been transformed with a first-of-its-kind premium seating area.
- ▶ In June, MSU revealed The Balconies at Davis Wade Stadium, located on both ends of the stadium's west side upper deck. The new, premier seating option that in many ways serves as an in-venue extension of a tailqating scene features 22 total spots that accommodate eight or more people each.
- ▶ All Balconies are customizable to a certain extent with some prohibited items including grills, cooking devices, tents and certain appliances. Approved furniture such as tables and chairs, fans and small refrigerators and personal coolers may be brought into the space the day before the game as long as they can be secured with a locked cable between games.
- ➤ State also replaced the panels in both of its large end zone video boards, going from a cluster of multiple boards, to one larger, zoned screen. In addition, the ribbon boards on the east and west sides of the stadium were replaced and are now be supplemented with three ribbon boards that wrap around the north end zone above the student section.

MSU and Memphis meet for the 46th time with the Bulldogs claiming more than 70 percent of the meetings (33-12) ... State holds a 16-5 advantage in Starkville ... Memphis won the previous meeting in 2020, but MSU has won 15 of the last 20 matchups ... Prior to the current home-and-home series, the teams last met in the 2011 season opener ... MSU won that meeting, 59-14, in what stands as its fifth-largest margin of victory in a road game ... State's offense totaled a then-school-record 645 yards in that matchup, which still stands as the third-highest total offense output in program history ... Late Surge Falls Short At Memphis

MSU scored a pair of touchdowns in the final minutes to nearly complete a late comeback, but the Bulldogs ultimately came up short and fell on the road to Memphis, 31-29. Down 28-17 with just over three minutes to play, **Will Rogers** bookended a Memphis field goal with a nine-yard touchdown pass to **Makik Heath** and a 36-yard scoring toss to **Makai Polk**. However, the Bulldogs failed on a potential game-tying two-point conversion attempt when Rogers' scramble came up about a yard short of the goal line. The State signal caller passed for 419 yards, which stands as the eighth-best single-game mark in MSU history. Rogers also threw for three touchdowns as he set new State single-game records in completions and attempts by connecting on 50 of his 67 passes. Polk set career highs in both catches and yardage, hauling in 11 passes for 136 yards. **Emmanuel Forbes** came through with his sixth career interception. **Martin Emerson** and **Jett Johnson** tied for the team Forbes came through with his sixth career interception. Martin Emerson and Jett Johnson field for the team lead with eight total tackles each. The Bulldogs scored 17 unanswered points following a Memphis 49-yard fumble return on State's first drive of the game. MSU first clawed into the Tiger lead by putting together its longest scoring drive of the season. Nolan McCord drilled a career-long 39-yard field goal to cap a 17-play series and pull State within four points at 7-3. Early in the second quarter, the Bulldogs surged ahead. Polk hauled in five receptions on MSU's go-ahead drive. With 9-58 left in the period, Dillon Johnson's three-yard run into the end zone put State in front 10-7. Less than five minutes of game action later, the Bulldogs added to their adventage when Pagars connected with Wallay on a six yard trueblegun pages that ut MSU up 17-7. The to their advantage when Rogers connected with Walley on a six-yard touchdown pass that put MSU up 17-7. The score held until the late in the third quarter. Memphis Seth Henigan threw a pair of touchdown passes – one in the third quarter and one in the fourth – to put the Tigers up 21-17. Then, Memphis later returned a punt 94 yards for a score to go up 28-17 with only 5:36 to play. Following State's failed two-point attempt with 1:32 left, MSU's chances were ended when the Bulldogs weren't able to an onside kick.

MIKE LEACH

Third Season @Coach Leach

34TH HEAD FOOTBALL COACH AT MISSISSIPPI STATE 2018 & 2008 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Mike Leach, a two-time national coach of the year, three-time conference coach of the year and the mastermind behind the NCAA record-setting "Air Raid" offense, was tabbed Mississippi State's 34th head football coach on January 9, 2020.

The accomplishments for Leach in his 21st year as a head coach are long and distinguished. He has compiled a 150-103 (.593) record, guided his squads to 18 bowl games, produced seven seasons of at least nine victories, captured two division titles, become the winningest coach in Texas Tech history and set school records for bowl appearances at both Texas Tech [10] and Washington State (6). During 10 of those 19 seasons, Leach's passing attack led the FBS – six at Texas Tech and four at Washington State.

One of the most successful coaches in the history of college football, Leach's 150 career wins are the second-most among active SEC coaches and tied for the fourth-most among active Power 5 coaches. Leach is the only active Power 5 head coach to produce an 11-win season at two different programs since 2008 and one of two active FBS head coaches to win 50-plus games at multiple Power 5 programs.

Of the 50 most productive passing yardage seasons in FBS history, 10 have come from quarterbacks coached by Leach since his hiring as head coach at Texas Tech in 2000. That includes one season by Kliff Kingsbury, one by B.J. Symons (2003), one by Sonny Cumbie, three by Graham Harrell (2006-08), one by Connor Halliday, one by Luke Falk (2015), one by Gardner Minshew II (2018) and one by Anthony Gordon (2019)

During Leach's second season in Starkville, MSU was the only school in the country that faced six teams ranked in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 and was one of four teams with three wins against teams ranked in the final poll. Leach became the first MSU head coach, at least in the modern era, to beat three teams in one season who finished ranked in a final poll.

In 2021, quarterback Will Rogers – at only 20 years old – became the first MSU quarterback to lead the SEC in passing yards per game (364.5). His 4,739 passing yards are the third most in SEC single-season history (the two quarterbacks ahead of Rogers played in two more games than he did during their respective seasons). Rogers joined 2019 Heisman Trophy winner Joe Burrow of LSU as the only 0Bs in college football over the last 22 seasons to throw for 4,700+ yards and 35+ touchdowns while completing at least 73 percent of their passes. After breaking nearly every freshman passing mark in MSU history in 2020, Rogers broke 25 more records, including Dak Prescott's records set as a fourth-year junior and fifth-year senior for single-season total offense, passing yards and passing touchdowns. It was the 20th consecutive

season that Leach's offense eclipsed the 3,000-yard passing mark (every season of his head coaching career).

The Bulldogs were one of four teams to rank inside the top 25 nationally in both total offense and total defense during the 2021 regular season, joining Alabama, Michigan and Coastal Carolina.

Following the 2021 regular season, MSU was the third most improved scoring offense in the SEC and 10th most improved nationally at +9.5 from 2020 (21.4 ppg to 30.9 ppg).

Leach, 59, arrived in Starkville after eight seasons at the helm at Washington State where he compiled a 55-47 (.539) record and was named the 2018 American Football Coaches Association National Coach of the Year and two-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year (2015, 2018). Leach spearheaded WSU to a school-record six bowl appearances and became the first coach in school history to lead the Cougars to five consecutive bowl games. They also led the nation in passing offense in four out of his last six seasons in charge.

The 2018 campaign saw Leach produce one of the finest coaching performances as WSU posted its first 11-win season in school history and a share of the Pac-12 North Division. The Cougars were ranked in the top 13 of each College Football Playoff rankings, including four consecutive weeks at No. 8. WSU capped the season with a win over lowa State in the Alamo Bowl and finished No. 10 in the Associated Press and Coaches polls. Senior quarterback and Mississippi native Minshew captivated the nation, leading the FBS in passing yards per game (367.6).

Leach previously spent 10 seasons as head coach at Texas Tech (2000-09) where his squads produced bowl appearances all 10 years. He compiled a school-record 84 victories, a school-record five bowl wins and eight consecutive seasons of at least eight victories.

The architect of the most prolific passing offense in the country, Leach received three national coach of the year awards in 2008 - the Woody Hayes Award, Howie Long/Fieldturf Coach of the Year and George Munger Award. Leach's offense captured six NCAA passing titles and three total offense titles during his 10 seasons in Lubbock.

Leach led Texas Tech to one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2008 as the team set a program record with 11 regular-season wins en route to an 11-2 record. The win total tied the mark, set previously by the 1953 and 1973 Red Raider squads. Numerous accolades poured in from across the country as an unprecedented four players earned first-team All-America status, in addition to Leach's three coach of the year honors. Harrell, offensive tackle Rylan Reed and offensive guard Brandon Carter each garnered first-team honors, while wide receiver Michael Crabtree was honored as a unanimous All-American for the second-straight season.

State's Season Concludes With Liberty Bowl LossPlaying in a postseason game for the 12th straight season, Mississippi State saw its 2021 campaign

Playing in a postseason game for the 12th straight season, Mississippi State saw its 2021 campaign concluded with a 34-7 loss to Texas Tech in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl. The Red Raiders put together a scoring drive on the game's opening series and the Bulldogs played from behind the rest of the evening. Texas Tech built itself a 10-0 lead through one quarter before State answered. Early in the second quarter, the Bulldogs constructed a 10-play, 75-yard drive that was capped off by a 17-yard touchdown pass from **Will Rogers** to **Rara Thomas**. That cut the State deficit to 10-7, but it ended up being MSU's lone score of the day. The Red Raiders added a field goal later in the period to take a 13-7 lead into halftime, then added on after the intermission. In the third quarter, Texas Tech found the end zone twice to increase its advantage to 27-7. A fourth quarter Red Raider touchdown capped the scoring. Rogers led the Mississippi State offense with 282 passing yards with a touchdown. Along the way, he became MSU's new single-season record holder for total offense, eclipsing Dak Prescott's previous high. Rogers was selected as MSU's Outstanding Offensive Player of the Game. **Makai Polk** also made history on Tuesday. He hit the 100-catch mark for the season, becoming only the fifth player in Southeastern Conference history to do so. On the defensive side, **Fred Peters** was chosen as State's Outstanding Defensive Player of the Game. The safety finished the Liberty Bowl with a teamhigh 12 tackles, including a quarterback hurry and a pass breakup.
