LSU Travels To Face Mississippi State in SEC Opener

LSU (1-1) opens its Southeastern Conference slate on Saturday when the 14th-ranked Tigers travel to face Mississippi State (2-0) in Starkville. Kickoff is set for 11 a.m. and will be televised on ESPN with Joe Tessitore (p.x.p), Jesse Palmer (analyst) and Katie George (sideline) on the call. LSU is coming off a 72-10 win over Grambling, while the Bulldogs posted a 31-24 overtime win over Arizona. Last year, LSU beat Mississippi State, 31-16, in Tiger Stadium in Brian Kelly's first SEC game. LSU enters the contest ranked No. 14 in the nation in both the AP and Coaches polls. LSU has won two straight and four its last five against Mississippi State with its only loss coming in the 2020 season-opener by a 44-34 count. It's the second straight 11 a.m. start for LSU-Mississippi State in Starkville. LSU beat the Bulldogs, 28-25, in an 11 a.m. kickoff in 2021. Last year, LSU played a pair of 11 a.m. games – falling to Tennessee (40-13) in Tiger Stadium and beating Arkansas (13-10) in Fayetteville. LSU has won 3 straight and 9 of its last 10 games away from Tiger Stadium that have started during the 11 a.m. hour. Against Grambling, LSU scored touchdowns on 10 consecutive offensive possessions – the longest such streak in modern day school history. In the win over Grambling, LSU scored 5 TDs rushing and 5 receiving, only the third time in school history to accomplish such a feat. Offensively, the Tigers are averaging 48 points and 540.5 total yards (207.5 rushing, 333.0 passing) per game. Defensively, LSU is allowing 27.5 points and 407 total yards (149.0 rushing, 258.0 passing) a contest. QB Jayden Daniels leads the SEC in total offense (354.0). He's completed 40-of-61 passes for 615 yards, 6 TDs and 1 interception. He's also rushed for 93 yards. Logan Diggs leads the Tigers in rushing with 115 yards and a TD, while LSU's top two receivers are Brian Thomas (13 rec., 220 yards, and 3 TDs) and Malik Nabers (11-154-1). S Major Burns and CB Zy Alexander are LSU's top 2 tacklers with 13 apiece, while D Jordan Jefferson leads the Tigers in both tackles for loss (2) and sacks (1).

LSU Coach Brian Kelly: Winningest Active Coach In College Football

Brian Kelly is in his second with the Tigers and has guided LSU to an 11-5 overall mark through 16 games. After inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players, Kelly quickly turned LSU into a 10-win team in his first season in 2022 as the Tigers went 10-4 overall, beat Top 10 teams in Ole Miss and Alabama and won the SEC Western Division. Kelly became the most accomplished hire in LSU football history when he was named to the position in December of 2021. He joined the Tigers after 12 years and 113 wins at Notre Dame. He's 295-102-2 overall (32 years) and is the winningest active coach (all divisions) in college football. His coaching resume includes 11 10-win seasons at the FBS level (7 at Notre Dame, 3 at Cincinnati, 1 at LSU), along with 14 bowl/CFP playoff appearances and 3 National Coach of the Year honors (2009 at Cincinnati, 2012 and 2018 at Notre Dame). Kelly's record includes a 113-40 mark at Notre Dame, where he's the winningest coach in school history; 34-6 at Cincinnati (4 years), 19-16 at Central Michigan (3 years) and 118-35-2 at Grand Valley State (13 years). He won two Division II National Championships at Grand Valley State. Kelly is 1-0 against Mississippi State.

QUICK NOTES

- LSU enters the Mississippi State contest coming off its most productive offensive performance in 36 years with 72 points, 627 total yards and 10 TDs. The 72 points were the most for LSU in a game in regulation since scoring 77 vs. Rice in 1977. It's also the first time LSU rushed for 5 TDs and passed for 5 TDs in same game since the Rice contest in 1977.
- LSU topped the 300-yard mark in both rushing and passing yards against Grambling. It marked only the fourth-time in school history – and first since the Furman contest in 2013 – the Tigers have rushed and passed for 300+ yards in the same game. LSU won all 4 games.
- With 45 career starts, senior QB Jayden Daniels ranks No. 3 among active FBS quarterbacks in games started. He trails only Bo Nix (Oregon) with 49 and Sam Hartman (Notre Dame) with 46. Daniels has started 16 straight games at LSU (11-5) after starting 29 at Arizona State from 2019-21.
- Daniels has 708 yards of total offense through 2 games, including his LSU-best 411 yards (347 passing, 64 rushing) against Florida State. Last week vs. Grambling in playing only the first half, Daniels accounted for 298 yards (269 passing, 29 rushing). Daniels has 2 games at LSU with 400+ yards of total offense – the other coming in win over UAB last year (408 total yards – 297 passing, 111 rushing).
- Daniels set a career-high with 5 passing TDs in the win over Grambling. It marked the third time in his LSU career that he's accounted for at least 5 TDs in a game (6 at Florida, 2022; 5 vs. Ole Miss, 2022).
- All 5 starters on LSU's offensive line have at least 12 career starts to their credit with C Charles Turner leading the way with 16. He's followed by LT Will Campbell (15), RG Miles Frazier (15), RT Emery Jones Jr. (14) and LG Garrett Dellinger (12). The group has combined for 72 career starts.
- RB Logan Diggs (Notre Dame transfer) rushed for 115 yards and a TD in his first start (and appearance) as a Tiger. Diggs became the

- first running back to rush for 100+ yards in his LSU debut since 1997 when Cecil Collins had 172 yards in a 24-9 win over Mississippi State in Starkville.
- Junior WRs Brian Thomas and Malik Nabers are both off to fast starts, combining for 24 receptions for 374 yards and 4 TDs. Thomas leads the Tigers with 13 catches for 220 yards and 3 TDs, while Nabers has 11 receptions for 154 yards and a TD.
- Junior WR Malik Nabers ran his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 20 vs. Grambling State after hauling in 5 passes for 87 yards and a TD. In 27 career games, Nabers has caught 5 passes or more 12 times. He led the SEC in receptions in 2022 with 72.
- Senior RB Noah Cain rushed for his 12th touchdown as a Tiger on a 1-yard run vs. Grambling. Dating back to last year, Cain has a combined 8 rushing TDs in LSU's last 6 games.
- Daniels has rushed and passed for a TD 15 times during his career (6 at LSU, 9 at Arizona State). LSU is 6-0 in games in which he accounts for a rushing and passing TD.
- LSU's defense held Grambling scoreless and to only 36 yards of offense in the second half.
- Three of LSU's top 4 tacklers on defense are transfers – CB Zy Alexander (SE Louisiana) 13 tackles, S Andre Sam (Marshall) 10 tackles, and LB Omar Speights (Oregon State) 9 tackles.
- P Jay Bramblett is averaging 45.0 yards on 3 punts, all coming against Florida State. Two of his 3 punts vs. the Seminoles were downed inside the 20, including one inside the 1-yard line. He didn't punt against Grambling.
- LSU has won 13 straight games when rushing for 200 yards. The Tigers are 1-0 in 2023 when rushing for 200 yards after posting a 6-0 mark in 2022 when eclipsing the mark. The last time LSU rushed for 200 yards on lost came at Texas A&M in the 7OT game in 2018 (215 yards).

When Brian Kelly was hired away from Notre Dame in December of 2021, LSU announced at the time that "the search for LSU Football's next championship head coach is over."

The most accomplished hire in program history, Kelly wasted little time in making his impact felt, leading the Tigers to a 10-win season and the SEC Western Division title. Despite inheriting a roster with only 39 scholarship players remaining from the 2021 season, Kelly guided the Tigers to Top 10 wins over Ole Miss and Alabama along with road victories over Auburn, Florida and Arkansas.

The Tigers capped the season with a resounding 63-7 win over Purdue in the Citrus Bowl completing one of the biggest turnarounds in college football a year ago.

Kelly, who has more victories than any active coach in major college football, was named LSU's 34th head football coach on December 1, taking over a program that has won four national championships.

Kelly's 10 wins at LSU in 2022 ran his career win total to 294 in 32 years as a head coach and it marked the 11th time he led a team to 10 or more wins in a season at the FBS level. Overall, Kelly has had teams reach double-figure wins 17 times with his teams winning nine games on five other occasions. His coaching career includes 13 seasons at Grand Valley State, three at Central Michigan, four at Cincinnati, 12 at Notre Dame and one at LSU.

His overall mark of 295-102-2 puts him ahead of Alabama's Nick Saban (286) and North Carolina's Mack Brown (270) on the list of most victories by an active FBS head coach. Only twice during Kelly's 32-year coaching career has he had a team finish below .500.

Kelly is also one of only five active FBS coaches who have guided their programs to multiple undefeated regular seasons since 2009 and he's led teams to one berth in the BCS National Championship Game and to a pair of College Football Playoff appearances. Overall, his teams have appeared in bowl games 14 times.

Prior to taking over at LSU in 2022, Kelly spent 12 years as the head coach at Notre Dame where he became the school's winningest coach with 113 victories, moving past legendary Knute Rockne for the top spot on the list. Kelly left Notre Dame with a 113-40 overall mark and his teams averaged 10 wins a season over his last five years – 54-9 during that span – with Irish.

During his Notre Dame career, Kelly led the Irish to the 2012 BCS national title game as well as College Football Playoff appearances in 2018 and 2020. He was named National Coach of the Year by numerous outlets in 2012 and 2018. He's the only coach to win the Home Depot Coach of the Year Award more than once, and he's done it three times (2009,

2012, and 2018).

In 12 seasons at Notre Dame, Kelly's teams won at least 10 games seven times, including 2021, as the Irish posted an 11-1 mark and were ranked as high as No. 5 in the nation during his final season in South Bend. Kelly's final five seasons at Notre Dame saw the Irish win at least 10 games each year, including a 12-1 mark in 2018 and 11-2 in 2019.

Individually, Notre Dame players claimed eight consensus All-America honors playing for Kelly, while the Irish had players win nine national awards during that span. Kelly's Notre Dame teams produced 55 NFL Draft picks since 2012, including 10 in the first round.

Academically under Kelly, the Irish had eight players earn the prestigious CoSIDA Academic All-America honor, and three were selected as National Football Foundation Scholar-Athletes. As a team, Notre Dame consistently ranked among the nation's top four in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate.

Prior to joining the Irish, Kelly transformed Cincinnati into a football powerhouse, winning Big East titles in 2008 and 2009. In three years at Cincinnati, the Bearcats won 34 games and appeared in the Orange and Sugar Bowls. In 2007, Kelly led Cincinnati to the school's first-ever 10-win season with a 10-3 mark and a win in the PapaJohns.com Bowl. In his final season at Cincinnati, Kelly's team posted a 12-0 regular season mark and earned a berth to the Sugar Bowl.

Kelly's first Division I head coaching position came in 2004 when he took over at Central Michigan. In three years with the Chippewas, Kelly's teams won 19 games, claimed the Mid-American Conference title in 2006 and appeared in a bowl game for the first time in 12 years.

Kelly's first head coaching job came at Division II Grand Valley State in 1991, a position he held for 13 years. In 13 years at Grand Valley, Kelly won 118 games, won five straight conference titles and made six Division II playoff appearances. He led the Lakers to back-to-back national titles in 2002 and 2003, going 14-0 and 14-1, respectively. He won 41 games during his final three years in Allendale.

A native of Everett, Mass., Kelly was a four-year letterwinner at linebacker and two-time team captain at Assumption College in Worcester, Mass. He graduated from Assumption in 1983 with a degree in political science.

Kelly and his wife Paqui have three children – Patrick, Grace and Kenzel. The Kellys are active in community outreach and have established the Kelly Cares Foundation which has donated nearly \$8 million to support causes related to the fight against breast cancer since its founding in 2008.

LSU Opens SEC Play Against Mississippi State

LSU will meet Mississippi State to renew one of the longest-standing rivalries in the SEC when the teams square off at 11 a.m. on Saturday in Starkville. LSU has played Mississippi State more than any other SEC opponent with Saturday's meeting the 117th time the teams have played. LSU is 77-36-3 against Mississippi State, which included a 17-7-1 mark in Starkville. The first meeting between LSU and Mississippi State came in 1996 in Baton Rouge with the Tigers winning, 52-0. Saturday's game will serve as LSU coach **Brian Kelly's** first game in Starkville and the first time in 32 years as a head coach that he will coach a game played in the state of Mississippi.

LSU In SEC Openers

LSU will open SEC play against Mississippi State for the fourth straight year. LSU is 55-30-5 all-time in SEC openers, which includes a 15-2-1 mark against Mississippi State. LSU won last year's contest against the Bulldogs, 31-16, in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers defeated Mississippi State in Starkville in 2021 by a 28-25 count.

LSU in 11 a.m. Starts Away From Tiger Stadium

For the second straight time in Starkville, LSU and Mississippi State will kickoff at 11 a.m. In 2021, LSU posted a 28-25 win over the Bulldogs in an 11 a.m. start on ESPN. Overall, LSU is 13-9 in games away from Tiger Stadium that kickoff during the 11 a.m. hour. Last year, the Tigers had a pair of 11 a.m. starts - lost to Tennessee in Tiger Stadium, 40-13; defeated Arkansas in Fayetteville, 13-10. LSU has won 3 straight and 9 of its last 10 games away from Tiger Stadium that have started during the 11 a.m. hour with the only loss during that span coming at Missouri by a 45-41 count in 2020. LSU-Mississippi State Series: LSU leads 77-36-3

LSU has won two straight and four its last five games against the Bulldogs. Last year, the Tigers posted a 31-16 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium for **Brian Kelly's** first SEC victory. LSU has won the past two games in Starkville - 28-25 in 2021 and 36-13 in 2019. Mississippi State's last win over LSU came in the 2020 season-opener, 44-34, in Tiger Stadium. LSU is 17-7-1 in games played in Starkville. Dating back to 2000, LSU has a 20-3 mark against the Bulldogs. LSU won 14 straight in the series from 2000-13. LSU enters the Mississippi State game ranked in the Top 25 for the first time since being ranked No. 6 for the 2020 matchup. Prior to the 2021 meeting when the Tigers were unranked, LSU had entered the Mississippi State contest ranked in the Top 25 for 19 consecutive meetings between the teams.

Up Next: LSU Hosts Arkansas

LSU returns to Tiger Stadium next Saturday when the Tigers host Arkansas. Kickoff is scheduled for 6 p.m. and will be televised on ESPN.

LSU's Mississippi State Ties

Two players on the Mississippi State roster started their career at LSU before transferring to the Bulldog football team. Center Cole Smith played the 2018 season at LSU before transferring in 2019, while DB Ray'Darious Jones played at LSU from 2019-22.

Diggs Joins Cecil "The Diesel" In Rare LSU Company

When transfer **RB Logan Diggs** rushed for 115 yards in his LSU debut on Saturday vs. Grambling, he became the first Tiger running back to go over 100 yards in his debut since Cecil "The Diesel" Collins did it in 1997. Collins rushed for 172 yards on 22 carries in a 24-9 win over Mississippi State in week 2 of the 1997 season. Collins didn't play in the season-opener that year against Texas-El Paso.

Emery Back In Action on Saturday

LSU Senior **RB John Emery** will make his 2023 debut on Saturday against Mississippi State after sitting out the first 2 games. **Emery** rushed for 375 yards and 6 TDs last year. He added 13 receptions for 129 yards and a pair of touchdowns. For his career, the St. Rose, La., native has rushed for 941 yards and

13 TDs on 190 carries. He's appeared in 30 games with 5 starts, including 2 in 2022. Last year, he set a career-best with 3 rushing TDs against Texas A&M. His top rushing outing came in 2020 at Vanderbilt with 103 yards.

LSU's Running Back Room Features 3 Who Have Rushed for 100 Yards In A Game

With the return of **John Emery** to the field this week against Mississippi State, LSU's running back room features 3 players who have a 100-yard rushing game to their credit. Notre Dame transfer **Logan Diggs** was the most recent to reach the 100-yard mark with 115 yards and a TD in the win over Grambling in what was his LSU debut. **Emery** and **Josh Williams** both have 100-yard games to their credit. Brian Thomas Off To A Fast Start

Junior **WR Brian Thomas** is off to the best start to a season in his career, leading the Tigers in every receiving category through 2 games. **Thomas** has 13 receptions for 220 yards and 3 TDs. He's averaging 16.9 yards a catch and scored a career-long 75-yard TD against Florida State. **Thomas** opened the season with the first 100-yard game of his career (7 rec., 142 yards, 1 TD) and followed that with 6 catches for 78 yards and a pair of TDs vs. Grambling. It was the first multi-TD game of his career. Now 27 career games, Thomas has 72 receptions for 940 yards and 10 touchdowns.

LSU Scores TDs On Modern Day School-Record 10 Straight Possessions Against Grambling

LSU opened the Grambling game by scoring touchdowns on its first 10 possessions, a first in modern day school history. **QB Jayden Daniels** directed LSU on 6 TD drives in the first half before giving way to **Garrett Nussmeier**, who then directed the Tigers on 3 more scores. True freshman **Rickie Collins** guided LSU on the 10th and final scoring drive before the Tigers eventually turned the ball over on downs on their next possession.

LSU Goes Over 300-Yards Both Passing and Rushing vs. Grambling

LSU accomplished another rare feat against Grambling as the Tigers went over the 300-yard mark in both rushing and passing yards in the win over the G-Men. LSU finished the game with 302 yards on the ground and 320 yards through the air. It's the first time since 2013 vs. Furman, and only the fourth time in school history, that the Tigers managed to top the 300-yard mark in both categories. Daniels Has Third Game Accounting For 5 TDs; Ranks No. 2 in LSU History To Only Joe Burrow

Senior **QB Jayden Daniels** accounted for 5 TDs in a game for the third time of his LSU career vs. Grambling. All 5 of **Daniels's** TDs came through the air. Last year, **Daniels** became the first player in LSU history to rush for 3 TDs and pass for 3 TDs in a game decided in a regulation when he did it in the win over Florida. The following week against Ole Miss, **Daniels** rushed for 3 TDs and passed for 2 more in the LSU victory. **Daniels'** 3 games of accounting for at least 5 TDs ranks second in LSU history to only Heisman Trophy quarterback Joe Burrow, who did it 7 times in his 2 years with the Tigers.

Daniels 1 of 4 LSU Quarterbacks With 5 Passing TDs in a Game

With 5 TD passes against Grambling, **QB Jayden Daniels** joined Joe Burrow, Max Johnson and Zach Mettenberger as the only players in school history to reach that total in a single-game. Burrow holds the school-record with 7 against Oklahoma in the CFP Semifinal and he has the most games with at least 5 TD passes at 6. Johnson did it against Central Michigan in 2021, while Mettenberger was the first Tiger to reach the mark against UAB in 2013.

In LSU's 72-point performance against Grambling, the Tigers had 9 players record either receiving, rushing or passing touchdowns. **Jayden Daniels** led the way with 5 passing touchdowns, becoming the fourth Tiger to do so in a game. Furthermore, all 5 of his touchdowns came through the air as he joined Joe Burrow (7 vs. Oklahoma in the first half of the 2019 Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl) as the only other LSU QB with at least 5 in one half. **Logan Diggs** (1), **Kaleb Jackson** (2), **Noah Cain** (1) and **Garrett Nussmeier** all had rushing touchdowns. **Brian Thomas Jr.** (2), **Malik Nabers** (1), **Kyren Lacy** (1) and **Mason Taylor** (1) recorded receiving touchdowns. Daniels Keeps Adding to His List of LSU Records

Jayden Daniels, one of the most dynamic quarterbacks in college football, is back for his second season as the starter for the Tigers after leading LSU to a 10-4 mark and the SEC Western Division title in 2022. A first-team preseason All-SEC by both the media and the SEC Coaches, **Daniels** opened 2023 with 411 yards of total offense (347 passing, 64 rushing) against Florida State. A year ago, **Daniels** set LSU records for rushing yards (875) and rushing TDs (11) by a quarterback. He also became the first player in LSU history to run for 3 TDs and pass for 3 TDs in the same game (at Florida in 2022). **Daniels** was one of only 2 quarterbacks (other was John Ryhs Plumlee of UCF) in FBS to rush for 800 yards (885) and throw for at least 2,500 yards (2,913).

Here's a look at some of **Daniels'** notable accomplishments in his 15-games with the Tigers:

LSU Starts Same Group On Offensive Line In First 2 Games of Season - A First Since 2014

LSU's starting 5 on the offensive line remained intact for the Grambling game as the Tigers used the same starting 5 for the first 2 games of the season. It's the first time since 2014 LSU has opened a season with the same starting offensive line in the first two games. This year's LSU offensive line has combined for 72 starts and all 5 starters have at least 12 career starts to their credit with **C Charles Turner** leading the way with 16. He's followed by **LT Will Campbell** (15), **RG Miles Frazier** (15), **RT Emery Jones Jr.** (14) and **LG Garrett Dellinger** (12).

Dual-Threat Daniels

Jayden Daniels is one of the most prolific dual-threat quarterbacks in the country. He opened the season by leading the Tigers in both rushing (64) and passing yards (347) against Florida State. Now in his second season at LSU, **Daniels** has led the Tigers in rushing yards in nine games. The 347 passing yards vs. Florida State was the most as a Tiger and also marked the third time he's gone over the 300-yard mark during his LSU career. His 411 total yards in the Florida State game marked his most total yardage in a LSU uniform. In 2 games, **Daniels** has racked up an SEC-leading 708 yards of total offense (615 passing, 93 rushing).

The Return of Tre Bradford

Sophomore **RB Tre Bradford** returned to the field after a 2-year absence against Florida State and made an immediate impact, hauling in a 55-yard reception on the first play of the game against the Seminoles. **Bradford** scored his first rushing TD as a Tiger in the first quarter, tying the game at 7-7 on a 1-yard run. The TD was the second of his career, and the first since catching a 4-yard TD pass from Max Johnson against Florida in December of 2020. **Bradford** did not play vs. Grambling.

Cain Runs TD Mark To 12 Against Grambling

Senior **RB Noah Cain** scored his 12th touchdown as a Tiger when he found the endzone from 1-yard out in the fourth quarter against Grambling. **Cain** led all LSU running backs with 10 rushing TDs in 2022. He has now scored a rushing TD in 4 straight games dating back to last year. In his last 6 games, **Cain** has scored 8 rushing TDs (3 vs. UAB, 1 vs. Georgia, 2 vs. Purdue, 1 vs. Florida State, 1 vs. Grambling).

BK and Dietzel Only Coaches In LSU History To Lead Tigers to 10 Wins After Dropping Opener

Last year, **Brian Kelly** joined Paul Dietzel as the only coaches in LSU history to lead their teams to a 10-win season after dropping the season-opener. In 2022, **Kelly** and the Tigers fell to Florida State, 24-23,

in New Orleans and then went on to win 10 games, including victories over Ole Miss and Alabama, along with a berth in the SEC Championship Game. In 1961, fifth-ranked LSU fell to unranked Rice, 16-3, in Houston and then reeled off 10 straight victories to go 10-1 overall and win the SEC title. LSU won its 10th game that year in the Orange Bowl, beating No. 7 Colorado, 25-7.

Brian Kelly's Won At Least 10 Games For Six Straight Seasons; Nation's Third-Longest Active Streak

LSU coach **Brian Kelly** brings a 6-year streak of winning at least 10 games into the 2023 season. In his first year at LSU, **Kelly** guided the Tigers to a 10-4 mark and the SEC Western Division title. **Kelly's** streak of at least 10 wins goes back to 2017 at Notre Dame when the Irish were 10-3 overall. He followed that with a 12-1 mark in 2018, 11-2 in 2019, 10-2 in 2020, and 11-1 in 2021. His six consecutive seasons of at least 10 wins trails only Nick Saban (15) and Dabo Swinney (12).

Brooks, Campbell, Daniels and Wingo Named LSU Captains for 2023

LSU coach **Brian Kelly** announced Tuesday of Florida State game week that **Jayden Daniels**, **Will Campbell**, **Mekhi Wingo** and **Greg Brooks** will serve as team captains for the Tigers in 2023. The four captains were voted to their leadership role by their teammates. All four players are entering their second season with the Tigers and they were all starters on last year's team that won 10 games and claimed the SEC Western Division crown.

LSU's Won 13 Straight When Rushing for 200 Yards

LSU goes into the Mississippi State game riding a streak of 13 consecutive wins when rushing for 200 yards. LSU did it for the first time against Grambling with 302 yards in the 72-10 victory. Last year, LSU went 6-0 when reaching the 200-yard mark in rushing yards with wins over Southern (230 yards), Mississippi State (207 yards), New Mexico (219 yards), Ole Miss (252 yards), UAB (266), and Purdue in the Citrus Bowl (220). The last time LSU rushed for 200 yards and lost came in the 7 OT contest at Texas A&M on November 24, 2018. LSU rushed for 215 yards in that game and lost 74-72.

Perkins Headlines List of 3 Tigers on AP Preseason All-America Team

LSU sophomore **LB Harold Perkins Jr.** is one of 3 Tigers named to the AP Preseason All-America Team. Perkins is a first-team selection, while **DT Mekhi Wingo** and **WR Malik Nabers** were both named second-team. Here's how the three players have fared in LSU's first two games of the season:

Wingo To Wear No. 18 In 2023

Junior defensive tackle **Mekhi Wingo** will wear No. 18 for the Tigers this year. He was presented the jersey by head coach **Brian Kelly** following practice on Saturday in Tiger Stadium. "The number 18 has great historical significance with our program," **Kelly** said. "It's a number that has national championship significance with Matt Mauck wearing it in 2003 and leading LSU to its first national title since 1958. He passed it on to Jacob Hester who won a national championship in 2007. "It's worn by a player who represents the traits and spirit associated with a successful program and that's Mekhi." **Wingo** quickly established himself as a leader for the Tigers on and off the field after transferring to LSU prior to the 2022 season. Last year, he earned third-team AP All-America honors as well as being a member of the SEC Football Leadership Council and a nominee for the AFCA Good Works Team. He also was one of three players to represent LSU at SEC Football Media Days in July. In May, **Wingo** was one of 11 LSU players who traveled to Africa as part of the program's first Study Abroad initiative. "This means a lot to me and I want to thank BJ (Ojulari) for showing me how to properly wear this number," **Wingo** told the team after practice. "I'm going to play my heart out and represent this number and all those who have worn it before me the right way."

Tigers Overcome 13-0 Deficit To Beat Mississippi State, 31-16

Jayden Daniels passed for 210 yards and a TD and rushed for 93 yards and a score as LSU overcame a 13-0 first half deficit to beat Mississippi State, 31-16, in Tiger Stadium. The Bulldogs grabbed an early 7-0 lead following a 9-play, 87-yard drive. LSU punted on four of its first five possessions and lost a fumble on another possession as the Tigers helped spot Mississippi State a 13-0 lead following a TD with just over two minutes remaining in the first half. LSU found its offense just before the half, going 75 yards on seven plays, capped with an 8-yard TD pass from Daniels to Jaray Jenkins. A Damian Ramos 35-yard field goal pulled LSU to within 13-10 at the 10:56 in the third quarter. MSU kicked a field goal on its next possession, stretching the advantage to 16-10 at the 6:31 mark in the third quarter. LSU's defense dominated the fourth quarter, holding the Bulldogs to no points and only 52 yards, setting the stage for the comeback. Daniels scored on a 3-yard run with 14:11 left to play to give the Tigers their first lead of the game at 17-16. Josh Williams scored on a 7-yard run to increase the lead to 24-16 with 6:53 to go and the Tigers put the game out of reach at 31-16 on a 47-yard TD run by Armoni Goodwin with 4:50 left in the contest. LSU held Mississippi State to 289 yards of offense, while the Tigers racked up 417 total yards (207 rushing, 210 passing).

Series Notes: LSU will meet Mississippi State in football for the 117th time when the teams square off Saturday in Starkville. This marks the fourth year in a row that LSU has opened up SEC play by facing Mississippi State. LSU is coming off a 72-10 win over Grambling State last week, while Mississippi State posted a 50-20-1 overtime win over Arizona. It will mark the first meeting between LSU coach Brian Kelly and MSU coach Zach Arnett. Last year, LSU beat the Bulldogs, 31-16 in Baton Rouge. LSU holds a 77-36-3 advantage in the all-time series and holds a 50-20-1 advantage when playing in Baton Rouge. The first meeting came in 1896 in Baton Rouge as LSU came out victorious 52-0. LSU is 55-30-5 all-time in Southeastern Conference opening games.

Campbell Awarded No. 7 Jersey; Will Wear Patch On His No. 66 Uniform

Sophomore left tackle **Will Campbell** was awarded the No. 7 jersey for the 2023. **Kelly** presented **Campbell** with his jersey following practice on Saturday in Tiger Stadium. As an offensive lineman, the rules of college football prevent **Campbell** from actually wearing the No. 7 jersey so instead his No. 66 jersey will be accompanied by a No. 7 patch. **Campbell**, a native of Monroe, was a day 1 starter on the offensive line for the Tigers in 2022, becoming the first true freshman in school history to be the everyday starter left tackle. He capped his rookie season earning second-team All-SEC honors as well as being a Freshman All-America. "The (number) 7 has an interesting history that starts with Patrick Peterson," **Kelly** said when presenting **Campbell** his jersey. "He was an outstanding player. Prolific playmakers have worn (number) 7. I wanted to take a spin and make it about Louisiana. That's my spin. This year we wanted to highlight the group that doesn't get much notoriety. We went with Louisiana bred **Will Campbell**. I like the significance of the left tackle because he is a playmaker who must protect the quarterback every play." Outside of Billy Cannon's retired No. 20 jersey, the Nos. 18 and 7 are two of the most iconic LSU football numbers and have been worn by some of the all-time greats in school history.

Josh Williams Nominated for NFF Scholar-Athlete Award

Senior running back **Josh Williams** has been nominated for the prestigious Campbell Trophy, the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award. **Williams** graduated with a 3.4 grade point average in marketing and is currently pursuing a Master's in business administration. He's a 3-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll. A former walk-on, **Williams** led all LSU running backs in rushing yards with 532 to go along with 6 TDs.

BK Joined Miles and McElwain As First-Year SEC Coaches To Reach League Title Game

LSU coach **Brian Kelly** joined a small group of only two other SEC coaches to take their team to the league's title game in their first season in the conference last year. **Kelly** joined Les Miles (2005) and Jim McElwain (2015 at Florida) as the only three first-year SEC coaches to reach the championship game.

2022 Tigers: From Cellar to Championship Game In Just One Season Under Brian Kelly

In 2022, LSU joined Arkansas in 1995 and Auburn in 2013 as the only teams to reach the SEC title game a year after finishing last in its division. LSU finished last in the SEC Western Division in 2021 with a 3-5 league mark and advanced to the 2022 SEC Championship Game with a 6-2 conference record. Arkansas was the first to do it, going 2-6 in 1994, followed by a division-winning mark of 6-2 in 1995. Auburn was next to accomplish the feat, going 7-1 in 2013 after finishing last in the SEC West in 2012 with an 0-8 mark.

11 Tigers Studied Abroad in Senegal In May

The mission of LSU's football under **Brian Kelly** is to "Graduate Champions". One area **Kelly** has emphasized for the players is to build and identity outside of football. He wants them to be more than just football players and to create a brand and image that compliments what they are doing on the field. As he did for many years at Notre Dame, **Kelly** has implemented a "Study Abroad" program for LSU football players. In its first year, 11 players traveled to Senegal for 10 days in May to have an educational experience outside of the United States. "One of the things that I have tried to do since coming to LSU is to not only set the standards and the process of building a program that graduates champions, but to help our players establish an identity outside of football," **Kelly** said. "To get the opportunity to study abroad is an experience that student-athletes really don't get the chance to do so for our players to be able to participate in this unique educational program is something that I think will have a lifelong impact on them. I want our players to have the opportunity to see things from a different perspective and to really take ownership in their studies and to understand that there's much more out there than just being a football player. The opportunities of being an LSU football player go far beyond the field so I want to use the study abroad program to help them understand that. This is one of those pieces that we can continue to build on as we work with their identity outside of football and they are excited about it."

Football Drops Season Opener to Florida State, 45-24

Fifth-ranked LSU held a 17-14 halftime lead over No. 8 Florida State, but the Seminoles scored 31 unanswered points in the second half to post a 45-24 win over the Tigers. FSU quarterback Jordan Travis threw for 342 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Seminoles to the season-opening victory. Wide receiver Keon Coleman caught nine of Travis' passes for 122 yards and three touchdowns, while wide receiver Jonny Wilson added seven catches for 104 yards. LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels completed 22-of-37 passes for 347 yards and one touchdown, marking his second-highest yardage total in two seasons with the Tigers. Wide receiver Brian Thomas caught seven passes for 142 yards, including a 75-yard TD from Daniels. The Tigers drove to the FSU one-yard line on the opening possession of the game; however, LSU could not convert the 61-yard march into points. Florida State grabbed a 7-0 lead when Travis completed a 40-yard touchdown pass to Coleman midway through the first quarter, but the Tigers quickly answered when running back Tre Bradford capped a 75-yard drive with a one-yard TD plunge. LSU surged ahead with 6:02 remaining in the first half when running back Noah Cain's one-yard dive culminated a 51-yard possession, and the Seminoles tied the contest at 14-14 at the 1:01 mark when Travis connected with Coleman on a 21-yard scoring pass. Daniels led an efficient 67-yard drive over the last minute of the half, and Damian Ramos nailed a 36-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 17-14 advantage at intermission. Florida State placekicker Ryan Fitzgerald tied the game at 17-17 with a 33-yard field goal at the 9:19 mark of the third quarter, and the Seminoles followed with four consecutive touchdown drives to seize control of the game.

Football Dominates Grambling in Home Opener, 72-10

LSU quarterback Jayden Daniels fired five touchdown passes to lead the 14th-ranked Tigers to a 72-10 win over Grambling State in Tiger Stadium. LSU improved to 1-1 on the season, while Grambling dropped to 0-2 in the historic first meeting between the schools on the gridiron. LSU's 72 points marked its highest scoring total in a four-quarter game since September 24, 1977, when the Tigers blanked Rice, 77-0, in Death Valley. Daniels completed 18 of 24 passes for 269 yards and a career-high five touchdowns, all in the first half, as LSU bolted to a 42-10 halftime advantage. He became the fourth Tiger to throw for at least five TDs in a single game, joining Zach Mettenberger (one time in 2013), Joe Burrow (six times in 2019) and Max Johnson (one time in 2021) as LSU quarterbacks to accomplish the feat. Daniels' outing increased his total number of passing touchdowns at LSU to 23 and to 55 for his entire collegiate career. Brian Thomas Jr. led all of LSU's receivers with six receptions for 78 yards and two touchdowns. Running back Logan Diggs, a transfer from Notre Dame, saw action for the first time in an LSU uniform and led the Tigers with 115 yards rushing and a touchdown on 15 carries. The LSU defense blanked Grambling in the second half and limited the GSU offense to just 61 yards after halftime. Cornerback Zy Alexander and linebacker West Weeks each recorded six tackles to lead the Tigers. Linebacker Greg Penn III intercepted a pass with 12:29 left in the third quarter, marking the junior's first career interception. LSU did not record a punt in the game, marking the eighth time since 1960 the Tigers were not forced to punt for an entire contest.
