Florida is **6-1** in its last seven home games dating back through October of 2024, including **four-straight** wins against SEC opponents in The Swamp. Three of those victories (def. No. 9 Texas, No. 9 Ole Miss, No. 21 LSU, Kentucky) were against ranked foes. The Gators boast a plus-118-point differential across their last seven home tilts (223-105, **+16.9** PPG). Over the team's four-game, home win streak against the SEC, Florida has a plus-54 differential (128-74, **+13.5** PPG). Florida's last home SEC loss was over one year ago against Texas A&M on Sept. 14, 2024 (L, 33-20).

THE STORYLINE

- Florida is coming off its first four-game stretch against four top-10 opponents in team history, as the Gators became the first team in college football to do so since Northwestern and Illinois in 1968.
- Three of Florida's remaining five games after Week 8 are against AP Top-11 opponents.
- Week 8 marks the 57th meeting between Florida and Mississippi State including the 29th matchup in Gainesville.
- Florida has won two games in a row vs. the Bulldogs after a 45-28 win in Starkville on Sept. 21 of last season, featuring wins in 16 of the last 17 in Gainesville.
- The Gators last hosted MSU on Oct. 16, 2010 (MSU 10, Florida 7). Prior to that, Florida won 16-straight home games in the head-to-head series spanning from 1966 to 2005 (No. 13 Florida 35, MSU 9).
- Across the last 15 meetings (1987-2024), Florida is 11-4 against MSU and is averaging 28.7 PPG to MSU's 16.1 PPG.
- The Gators have won 15 of the last 20 meetings overall since 1982, including wins in four of the last five since 2005.
- The first ever matchup between Florida and MSU occurred in Jacksonville in 1923, ending in a 13-13 tie.
- This is the second meeting between UF **HC Billy Napier** and MSU HC Jeff Leiby as head coaches (more on Page 9).
- Florida has won four-straight home games in conference play and are 8-4 at home vs. SEC foes under Napier.
- Week 8 is Florida's 2025 Homecoming game. Last season, the Gators defeated Kentucky, 48-20, to win its sixth-straight HC matchup. The Gators are 30-5 across their last 35 HC games and own a 72-26-2 all-time record on HC.
- Despite a 2-4 record, Florida has a plus-15-point differential this season (134-119), holding opponents to 19.8 PPG while averaging 22.3 PPG on offense.
- Playing together for the first two times in Weeks 6-7, true freshmen **WR Vernell Brown III** and **WR Dallas Wilson** have combined for 18 receptions, 280 yards and three touchdowns over the last two games (more on Page 5).
- Florida is the only FBS team to start two true freshman wide receivers in the same game this season as well as the only FBS squad to be led by true freshmen in receptions, receiving yards and touchdown catches.
- In Week 6 vs. No. 9 Texas, Florida knocked off its third-straight, top-25 opponent in The Swamp.
- Napier's Gators have now won five games vs. AP Top 25 teams while unranked including three against the AP Top 10: 2022 vs. No. 7 Utah, 2023 vs. No. 11 Tennessee, 2024 vs. No. 21 LSU, 2024 vs. No. 9 Ole Miss, 2025 vs. No. 9 Texas.
- The UF defense has been borderline elite through six games, ranking 33rd in the FBS in total defense (315.8 YPG) and 38th in scoring defense (19.8 PPG). Additionally, the UF defense ranks 12th in the FBS in first down defense (88), 34th in rushing defense (113.3), 46th in interceptions (five) and 51st in passing defense (202.5).
- As a result, Florida enters Week 8 boasting the No. 31 overall defense in the FBS per PFF with a 90.2 grade, featuring the seventh-best run defense grade (92.6) and 11th-highest tackling grade (86.6) in the nation.
- The Gators are one of four teams in the FBS with a top-12 tackling and run defense grade, and one of two in the SEC (the others being Georgia, Indiana and Texas Tech). Florida is the only member of that group not in the AP Top 10.
- Florida's all-time, NCAA-record scoring streak currently sits at 467-consecutive games dating back to 1988.

The Communications Office will not give out phone numbers for any student-athletes, and student-athletes may not be contacted directly by phone, text, e-mail, or social media. Members of the media are not permitted in team areas. Team locker room, training room and strength complex are considered private areas. These areas, as well as student-athletes' housing (campus and off-campus) are off limits to media representatives.

- DOMINANCE IN THE SWAMP -

- Florida has now won each of its last three games against ranked opponents in The Swamp with an average margin of victory of 8.7 points (27-16, 24-17, 29-21) after upsetting No. 9 Texas in Week 6.
- Napier's Gators won three games vs. AP Top 25 teams while unranked in the last two seasons alone, upsetting No. 21 LSU and No. 9 Ole Miss in consecutive weeks in 2024 before the Week 6 win vs. No. 9 Texas.
- The first two victories marked the first time UF posted back-to-back upset wins over AP Top 25 opponents (No. 21 LSU, No. 9 Ole Miss) as an unranked team since Oct. 11-18, 2003 (No. 6 LSU, No. 11 Arkansas).
- The Gators are 7-3 at home since the start of last season. In the last nine, Florida is 7-2 with a plus-143 scoring differential (288-145, +15.9 PPG). In the last seven, UF is 6-1 at plus-118 (223-105, +16.9 PPG).
- Florida has been dominant in its three-straight wins vs. top-25 opponents in The Swamp:

- TACKLING KEY FOR 2025 GATORS -

- Florida averaged 10.1 missed tackles per game in 2022, 9.6 in 2023 and 11.0 in 2024.
- This season, the Gators are averaging 6.7 missed tackles per game.
- As a result, Florida has the No. 11 tackling grade in the country (per PFF).
- UF has never finished with a top-40 tackling grade under Napier, finishing as low as 112th in the FBS in 2023.

- THE LAGWAY FILE -

- QB DJ Lagway** enters Week 8 having completed 125-of-188 passes (66.5%) for 1,233 yards, nine touchdowns and seven interceptions for a 129.9 rating through six games this season.
- He is 8-5 as the starting quarterback of the Gators, posting his third top-25 upset as a starter in Week 6.
- Lagway has thrown a touchdown in five of six games this season including multiple in three contests.
- Eclipsing 3,000 career pass yards in Week 7, Lagway has thrown for 200 yards in four of the last five games.
- Lagway has posted a QB rating above 130.0 in 10 of his last 12 games.
- Lagway ranks sixth in the SEC in completion percentage (66.5%), rising to third amongst SEC quarterbacks with at least 170 passing attempts (behind only Beau Pribula and Ty Simpson).
- In the 13 games started by Lagway, UF has posted 8.1 yards per pass to opponents' 6.5, 68 points off turnovers to 41, 21 passing TDs to 12, 61.1% completion to 55.2% and 27.8 PPG to 17.8 PPG.
- In the Week 6 win, Lagway went 21-for-28 to finish with a completion percentage of at least 75% percent for the second time in six starts this season. He also posted the third-best QB rating (180.8) of his career.
- Lagway's 75% completion percentage in Week 6 is tied for the second-highest in SEC play this season while his 180.8 rating is the third-best of any SEC quarterback in conference play this year.
- Lagway is the *only* SEC quarterback to complete 75% of his passes while throwing for over 250 yards and tossing multiple touchdowns in a conference game this season.
- Against the Longhorns in Week 6, Lagway delivered a 150.0-plus rating for the eighth time in his career.
- With 60- and 55-yard completions in Week 6, Lagway has 15 completions of 40-plus yards in his career.
- In Week 3, Lagway had the most completions (33) and attempts (49) by a UF quarterback since Kyle Trask (33-for-49) vs. Tennessee in 2020. Those totals are tied for third and fourth by a UF quarterback since 1996.
- With a 194.3 rating in Week 1 vs. LIU, Lagway posted the second-highest rating of his career and the fourth-best rating of any UF quarterback in the Napier era (2022-25).
- Lagway led all FBS true freshman quarterbacks with at least 125 pass attempts with a 154.9 rating last season - 10.9 points higher than the next-closest true freshman passer (Marcel Reed, Texas A&M).
- Lagway finished with the 12th-best passer rating in team history last season at 154.9 (true FR record).
- Lagway ranked third among FBS passers with a 95.8 passing grade on deep throws in 2024 per PFF (20-plus yards), behind only Syracuse's Kyle McCord and Ohio State's Will Howard.
- Lagway's six wins in 2024 tied Chris Leak (6-3, 2003) for the most ever by a UF true freshman quarterback.
- Making his first-career start in the Week 2 win over Samford in 2024, Lagway passed for the most yards ever (456) by a Florida true freshman quarterback, breaking Chris Leak's mark of 269 vs. Kentucky in 2003.

- GRADING THE OFFENSIVE LINE -

- Entering the 2025 season, Florida's offensive line boasted 223 combined games played, which ranked 11th in the FBS and fourth in the SEC behind Auburn (236), Texas A&M (235) and Mississippi State (227).
- The Florida O-line also entered with 109 career starts, which ranked 14th in the FBS and fifth in the SEC.
- Returning starters include All-American **C Jake Slaughter** (13 starts), Preseason First Team All-SEC **OL Austin Barber** (13), **OL Damieon George Jr.** (10) and **OL Knijeah Harris** (13), who combined for 49 starts last season.
- Florida enters Week 8 ranking third in the SEC and 35th in the FBS in run blocking, per PFF.
- Across the last 10 games, the Gators have allowed 54 tackles for loss and 19 sacks.
- The Gators allowed zero sacks and just three tackles for loss in the Week 6 win over Texas.
- Florida also limited the Longhorns to a season-low six quarterback pressures.
- The Gators have surrendered one or zero sacks in three of six games this season.
- Barber ranks second on Florida with the 34th-best run blocking grade (73.9) among all FBS tackles.
- George Jr. has allowed zero QB sacks or hits and just four QB hurries in 290 snaps for a 98.7% win rate.
- Slaughter, George Jr., Harris, **OL Bryce Lovett** and **OL Roderick Kearney** have yet to allow a sack.
- Despite playing just two games, **OL Mark Faircloth** has the best overall grade (82.0) on the UF offensive line, ranking first on the Gators in run blocking (79.8) and second in run blocking (82.5).
- UF offensive linemen did not allow a QB hit in Week 1 while ranking No. 12 in the FBS in run blocking (76.3).
- Florida has allowed 88 sacks in 44 games under **HC Billy Napier**, which ranks eighth in the SEC.
- In 2024, the Gators allowed just 20 sacks all season, which ranked third in the SEC and 40th nationally.

- SLAUGHTERING THE COMPETITION -

- All-American **C Jake Slaughter** has allowed two QB pressures and zero sacks this season for a 99.5% block rate in 369 snaps, ranking as Pro Football Focus' No. 12 center in the FBS through Week 7 with a 74.0 grade.
- Slaughter has posted a 100% block rate and zero QB pressures in four of six games.
- Slaughter ranks seventh among FBS centers in pass blocking (85.2) and 12th in run blocking (72.3).
- His PFF grade has increased every season: 2021 (59.0), 2022 (69.4), 2023 (78.4), 2024 (82.0).
- Slaughter has allowed just 14 hurries, three sacks and three QB hits across 1,766 career snaps from 2021-25 for a 98.7% success rate.
- Slaughter was named a 2024 First Team All-American by the AP, ESPN and PFF after finishing with the sixth-best PFF grade in the FBS at the position (82.0).
- As Florida's first-ever First Team All-American center, Slaughter joined Gators Bill Carr (1966) and Maurkice Pouncey (2009) as UF All-Americans at the position.
- Slaughter ranked top-20 nationally in both run blocking (eighth, 80.1) and pass blocking (17th, 84.2) in 2024.

- THE BAUGHLIN' BELLCOW -

- After leading Florida in carries and rush yards as a true freshman in 2024, **RB Jadan Baugh** has started all six games this season with 94 carries for 461 yards, three touchdowns and 17 receptions for 94 yards.
- Despite being limited to 65 rush yards and 10 receiving yards in Week 7 at Texas A&M, Baugh had an unbelievable 67 yards after contact and forced seven missed tackles.
- Baugh's 34 missed tackles forced rank sixth in the FBS and third in the SEC behind Ahmad Hardy and Kewan Lacy.
- Baugh caught multiple passes (three) for the fourth-straight game in Week 7 at Texas A&M, marking the first-four games of his career with multiple receptions.
- As a result, Baugh boasts the most receptions (17) among SEC running backs, ranking 21st in the FBS.
- Baugh is averaging 4.9 YPC and 76.8 rush YPG after posting marks of 5.1 YPC and 51.8 YPG in 2024.
- He is one of eight FBS players (only in SEC) with 15+ catches, 450+ rush yards and at least three rushing scores.
- Baugh ranks eighth in the SEC in rush yards per game and 17th in yards per carry (15th among running backs).
- Baugh has 332 yards after contact this season, equating to 72.0% of his net rushing total.
- In his career, an astounding 759 of Baugh's 1,134 rushing yards have come after contact (66.9%).
- Baugh eclipsed 1,000 career rush yards and 10 rushing TDs in the Week 6 win vs. Texas, running for a career-high 107 yards while adding one touchdown on 27 carries for his third-career, 100-yard rushing game.
- Baugh's seven receptions at LSU in Week 3 were the most by a UF running back in 25 years – since Robert Gillespie's 10 catches vs. Tennessee on Dec. 1, 2001.
- Baugh is the third UF running back (Gillespie, Earnest Graham) with seven-plus catches in a game since 1996.
- Baugh is the only active SEC running back who had at least 130 rush attempts, seven rushing touchdowns and at least one receiving score while averaging at least 5.0 yards per carry last season.
- Baugh delivered a five-touchdown game in his first-career start vs. Kentucky in 2024 and tied the school record for the most in a game (Trey Burton vs. UK in 2010, Tim Tebow vs. South Carolina in 2007).



- TRUE ROOKIE RECEIVERS AND THE CORPS -

- Florida is replacing each of its top-two pass catchers from last season in WR Elijah Badger and WR Chimere Dike, who represented the only FBS receiving duo to both post over 700 receiving yards and 18.0 YPC.
- Florida's returning wide receiver contingent consists of **WR Eugene Wilson III**, **WR Aidan Mizell**, **WR Tank Hawkins** and **WR TJ Abrams**, among others.
- Eighteen Gators have a reception through Week 7 highlighted by 15 different players in Week 1 alone.
- Despite the returning experience at receiver, true freshman **WR Vernell Brown III** leads Florida in receiving yards (368) and receptions (27). He is still looking for his first-career touchdown.
- Another true freshman, **WR Dallas Wilson**, paces UF with three receiving touchdowns in just two games played this season. That makes Florida the only FBS team to be led by true freshmen in all three categories.
- In Week 7 at Texas A&M, D. Wilson and Brown III became the first two true freshman wide receivers to start in the same game in program history.
- In two games played together from Weeks 6-7, D. Wilson and Brown III combined for 18 receptions for 280 receiving yards and three touchdowns.
- D. Wilson is the only UF true freshman receiver in team history to catch three touchdowns in his first two games, and the first Florida receiver (any year) to do so in his first two games since Carlos Alvarez in 1969.
- Florida and Washington are the only FBS teams with two true freshman receivers with over 130 receiving yards apiece.
- Among FBS true freshmen, Brown III ranks second in receptions (27), second in receiving yards per game (61.3), second in receiving yards (291) and sixth in yards per catch (13.6).
- Brown III is the *only* FBS true freshman with at least 20 receptions, 13.0+ YPC and 60.0+ YPG.
- Making his collegiate debut in Week 6, D. Wilson set records for a Gators true freshman wide receiver making his first-career start with six receptions, 111 yards receiving and two touchdowns (all records). His 111 yards broke Brown III's record set five weeks prior in the season opener (79).
- D. Wilson became the second Gator all-time with 100 receiving yards in his collegiate debut, joining Carlos Alvarez in 1969 vs. No. 7 Houston (coincidentally Florida's highest-ranked win over a Texas school). He also became the first UF freshman wide receiver with a 100-yard game since Tyrie Cleveland vs. LSU in 2016.
- Another 100-yard game would make D. Wilson the third UF true freshman to record multiple 100-yard receiving games in the same season (Antonio Callaway - 3 - 2015, Reidel Anthony - 2 - 1994).
- D. Wilson became the 18th true freshman wide receiver to start in UF program history, marking the fourth season all-time in which two different UF true freshman receivers have started (2025, 2016, 2012, 2000).
- Brown's 60-yard catch in the third quarter of the Week 6 win over Texas marked Florida's longest pass play of the season and longest since E. Wilson III's 85-yard touchdown reception against Samford on Sept. 7, 2024.
- Brown III became the third true freshman wide receiver to start on opening day for the Gators in Week 1 of the season, joining Antonio Callaway (2015) and Percy Harvin (2006).
- Brown III was the 17th true freshman to start a season opener for UF dating back to 1972 and the first Gator to start opening day on offense since Jawaan Taylor in 2016.
- E. Wilson III led UF in receptions in each of the first two games of 2025 and sits third on UF in catches (18).
- Although he was limited to four games in 2024, Wilson III racked up 19 catches, 266 yards and one touchdown after dazzling across 10 games as a 2023 Freshman All-American: 61 receptions, 538 yards, six touchdowns.
- Redshirt senior transfer **WR J. Michael Sturdivant** (UCLA) sits third on the roster in receiving yards (171) and fifth in receptions (12). He recorded his first and only touchdown catch as a Gator in Week 1 vs. LIU.

- HANSEN AND THE TIGHT ENDS -

- TE Hayden Hansen** has started 28-consecutive games for the Gators at the position dating back to 2023 -the longest streak of any Florida offensive player and second-longest on Florida behind **DB Jordan Castell** (30).
- Hansen is second on Florida in receiving yards (175) and catches (18) behind **Vernell Brown III**.
- Hansen ranks fifth among SEC tight ends (t-25th in FBS) in receptions and eighth in receiving yards.
- Hansen set career highs with seven receptions and 50 yards receiving in Week 3 at LSU.
- From 2023-24, Hansen caught 27 passes for 357 yards and three touchdowns.
- Joining Hansen in two tight end sets is junior **TE Tony Livingston**, who made one start in 2024.
- Livingston has played in five games (one start) this season, tallying six catches for 47 yards and one TD.
- Livingston played in 10 contests with 11 receptions for 109 yards and two touchdowns in 2024.
- Having played in four games in 2024, **TE Amir Jackson** caught his first-career TD on his second-career reception in Week 7 at Texas A&M. He has already appeared in six games in 2025.

Florida **lost 63.1%** of receiving offense

The Gators welcome back **over 70%** of both their passing (**73.1%**) and rushing offense (**70.9%**) from last season, with **five** of Florida's six leading rushers back in Orange & Blue.

Despite each of its **top two receivers departing** for the NFL in WR Elijah Badger and WR Chimere Dike, Florida returns **six** of its top nine receivers from 2024 including **three** of its top five.

- 2025 DEFENSIVE OUTLOOK -

- Florida returned 62% of defensive production and five starters from last year's squad, which finished on a tear across the Gators' season-ending, four-game win streak.
- Florida returned 76.9% of its sack production (30 of 39 sacks) and each of its top five leaders in sacks, in addition to seven of its top 10 in sacks from last year.
- Florida also brought back 72.1% of its TFL production (62 of 86 TFLs) and each of its top four leaders in TFLs, as well as six of its top 10 in TFLs from the 2024 season.
- In the last four games of 2024, UF totaled 38 tackles for loss, 19 sacks, 18 pass breakups, 17 quarterback hurries, eight forced fumbles, seven fumble recoveries and five interceptions while allowing 13.0 points per game.
- Florida's 18 sacks and 34 tackles for loss were the most in the FBS over the last three weeks of the regular season.
- In those four games, UF opponents reached the redzone nine times and only scored 22 total points.
- UF forced -161 rushing yards in the final four games played as opponents only averaged 2.9 yards per carry.
- When opponents rushed the ball in the last four weeks of 2025, there was a 25% chance it would go for negative yards and a 31% mark for zero or negative yards.
- In eight of the last nine games of 2024, the Gators did not allow an opponent to rush over 150 yards, including under 100 yards vs. FSU (99) and Tulane (69). The Seminoles averaged just 2.25 YPC.
- As a result of the four-game finish, the Gators ended the season ranking ninth nationally in red zone defense (0.725), 11th in sacks (3.00 per game), 27th in passes intercepted (14), 33rd in tackles for loss (6.6 per game), 35th in turnover margin (0.46), 43rd in scoring defense (23.1) and 49th in team passing efficiency defense (124.2).
- Returning starters include **DE Caleb Banks**, **DL Tyreek Sapp**, **LB Grayson Howard**, **SS Bryce Thornton** and **FS Jordan Castell**, who combined for 57 games played and 48 starts during the 2024 campaign.
- Additionally, **CB Devin Moore** (six), **CB Dijon Johnson** (five), **STAR Sharif Denson** (five), **STAR Aaron Gates** (five), **LB Jaden Robinson** (four), **DE Kamran James** (four) and **JACK George Gumbs Jr.** (three) all made multiple starts on Florida's defense last year for an additional, combined 32 starts.

- ONCE YOUTHFUL DEFENSE READY TO FLY -

- Of the 143 starting opportunities on defense in 2024, a combined 55 came from underclassmen (38.4%) highlighted by five starts each in the last four games of the year, consecutively.
- Across the two previous seasons (2023-24), 128 out of 275 defensive starts were by underclassmen (47%).
- Additionally, 50% of Florida's defensive snaps in 2024 came from underclassmen, compared to the 2023 campaign, when 58% of snaps were logged by underclassmen, including 25% by freshmen alone.
- A combined 53% of defensive snaps were recorded by underclassmen from 2023-24.
- Last season, 16 players made their first UF starts while nine made their first-collegiate starts.
- Of those who played the 10-most snaps for the Gators in 2024, five were underclassmen: **FS Jordan Castell** (first), **DB Dijon Johnson** (fourth), **STAR Sharif Denson** (fifth), **SS Bryce Thornton** (sixth) and **LB Jaden Robinson** (eighth).
- Five of the Gators top-eight tacklers last season were second-year players: Castell (fourth), Robinson (fifth), Thornton (seventh), Denson (t-eighth) and **ILB Grayson Howard** (t-eighth).
- Florida's 25 takeaways in 2024 were its most since 2018, with 13 coming from underclassmen highlighted by three apiece from Thornton and **STAR Aaron Gates**.

- 2024 DEFENSIVE NOTABLES -

- With 25 takeaways last season, Florida more than tripled its takeaways (seven) from the 2023 campaign.
 - » It marked Florida's most turnovers gained (26) since 2018.
- The Gators produced at least one turnover in 10-straight games to end the season.
- Florida has forced at least 15 fumbles in four-straight seasons powered behind a season-high five at FSU in 2024.
- Florida posted four first-half shutouts (FSU, Samford, Tennessee, Tulane) and held its opponent without a first-half touchdown five times (FSU, Samford, Tennessee, UCF, Tulane).
- Florida's 14 interceptions quadrupled its total (three) from the 2023 season, and was UF's most since 2019 (16).
- The Gators held their opponents to zero points on the opening drive in the last-eight games consecutively.
 - » Florida had four takeaways on opening drives in that span: vs. LSU, Samford, Tennessee & Tulane.
 - » Outside of the season-opener vs. Miami, opponents only scored twice on their opening drives (both FGs).
- Against Kentucky, the Florida defense posted three interceptions, its most in a game since Nov. 28, 2020 vs. UK.
 - » It also tied for the total amount of interceptions (three) the Gators had during the entire 2023 season.
- Florida had three interceptions in back-to-back games in 2024 vs. Kentucky and Georgia for the first time since Sept. 14, 2019 vs. Kentucky (three) and Sept. 21, 2019 vs. Tennessee (three).
- Since 1996, the Gators rank sixth nationally in interceptions with an SEC-leading 431.



- DEFENSE MAINTAINS LATE SEASON MOMENTUM -

- Through the first six games, the Florida defense has allowed a total of 110 offensive points (safety vs. USF & pick-six at LSU) for an average of 18.3 points per game.
- Opposing offenses have accounted for a total of 12 touchdowns and 10 field goals as only seven scoring drives (4 FGs & 3 TDs) have started in Florida territory, with six of those beginning via UF turnovers.
 - The turnovers have resulted in three TDs and three FGs as the he drives totaled 50, 22, 21, 18, 14 and 12 yards.
- Florida ranks 33rd in total defense and 38th in scoring defense and is one of two schools (NIU) to be ranked in the top-50 of both categories and have a losing record.
- The Gators have forced a takeaway in 17 of 19 contests since the start of the 2024 season. **DB Jordan Castell** has interceptions in back-to-back games with his pick in Week 7 coming in his 30th-consecutive start.
 - Florida has picked off QBs in the four-straight games for five total INTs while allowing four passing touchdowns in that stretch, on top of just five total passing scores this season.
- UF has held opponents scoreless on their opening drive in 12 of the last 14 games and has not allowed any first-quarter points in eight out of its last 10 contests.
- The Florida defense is graded by PFF as No. 6 in rush defense and No. 11 in tackling, marking one of three schools (Georgia & Texas Tech) to be in the top-11 in each of those categories.
- Florida has yet to allow a 300-yard passer this season (season high: 289 vs. Texas).
- After allowing 196 total yards in the 1st quarter at A&M, Florida allowed just 221 yards in next three quarters.
- In the Aggies' first-three series of the second half, Florida forced two three-and-outs and allowed one first down with one of the series ending in a field goal after starting the drive on the UF 29-yard line.
- The Gators limited Texas to a season-low 52 rush yards, marking UF's third game allowing under 100 this season.
- Across Texas' 26 carries, only three went for seven-plus yards as 14 rushes went for zero or negative yards.
 - Texas was also held to 87 total yards (63 passing, 24 rushing) and four first downs in the first half.
- Florida racked up an astounding 35 QB pressures on Texas and QB Arch Manning, the most pressures against the Longhorns in the Sarkisian era, topping the previous record by Georgia in Austin last season (28).
- The Gators picked off Arch Manning twice. Every Manning that has played in The Swamp has now thrown an interception to total nine all-time against Florida (Arch, Eli, Peyton).
- Florida delivered a season-high six sacks against a Texas offensive line that had only allowed three all season.
 - DL Micahi Boireau**, **DB Devin Moore** and **DL Brien Taylor Jr.** all notched their first-career sacks.
- Miami's 80-yard TD drive to seal the game in Week 4 was the second-longest TD drive Florida has allowed this season, as the Canes only had to go 22 yards for their final TD after a failed Florida fourth-down conversion.
- After that opening drive and score at Miami, Florida held the Canes to 165 yards (20.6 avg), six points (2 FGs) and forced an interception over the next-eight possessions.
- The Gator defense is the only team this year to not allow Miami to throw a passing touchdown while it marked just the fifth time in QB Carson Beck's career as a starter that he did not throw a passing touchdown.
 - The Canes were also held to current season lows in points (26), passing yards (160) and completions (17).
- At LSU, Florida forced three-straight three-and-outs to start the game and allowed only 16 yards of offense.
- Outside of LSU's 76-yard touchdown drive, their two other offensive scores (FGs) only were 12 and 14 yards in length.
- Florida picked up where it left off last season with a 55-0 shutout of LIU in the 2025 season opener. It was the 25th all-time shutout in a season opener and first shutout since defeating Vanderbilt, 42-0, in 2021.
- Sophomore **LB Myles Graham** leads the Gators defense in tackles (34), stops (20), quarterback hurries (4) while being tied for the team-high in pass breakups (3) and sitting third in tackles-for-loss (2.5).

- Against the six ranked opponents (#3 LSU, #4 Miami, #5 Texas A&M, #9 Ole Miss, #9 Texas, #21 LSU) in the last 10 games, UF has only allowed 134 total points for an average of 22.3 points per game.
- In this stretch, only two times have opponents surpassed 400+ yards of total offense - Texas A&M (417) and Ole Miss (464).
- Across the 350 rush attempts in the last 10 games, 65 carries have gone for negative yards, 83 attempts have been for negative or zero yards and 117 for one yard or less, as only 29 rushes have eclipsed 10+.
- LB Myles Graham** has started six of the last 10 games and has totaled 45 tackles, 5.0 tackle-for-loss, five quarterback hurries, three pass breakups and one interception.
- Starting all 10 games, **LB Jaden Robinson** has 38 tackles, 4.5 TFLs, 2.5 sacks, three pass breakups, two QB hurries and forced fumble.
- DB Bryce Thornton** has tallied 50 tackles, 1.5 tackle-for-loss, four takeaways (2 INT, 2 FR), five pass breakups, four QB hurries and one forced fumble.

- THE NATION'S MOST UNDERRATED LB ROOM -

- Although Florida's linebacker room was its lowest-ranked preseason unit per Phil Steele at No. 25, the position group welcomes back **LB Grayson Howard**, **LB Jaden Robinson**, **LB Myles Graham** and **LB Aaron Chiles**.
- Graham (34) and Robinson (22) have started all six games of 2025 and are the top tacklers on the defense, as both set career highs in tackles vs. USF. They have also combined for 32 stops this season.
- As a true freshman and Gators legacy player, Graham earned his first-career start in the 2025 opener and led the team in tackles (five) with 1.0 tackle-for-loss, as all five of his tackles were stops.
- With five tackles last week vs. Texas A&M, Graham (34) broke his career-high of 30 set last season.
- Graham emerged in the last six games of 2024, posting 23 tackles, 1.0 sack, 2.5 TFLs, one interception, one forced fumble and one QB hurry. Prior to that, he owned seven tackles (one solo) and zero TFLs in seven games.
- Graham played the second-most snaps (183) among SEC freshman LBs in 2024 while Chiles ranked third (130).
- Graham also led all SEC freshman linebackers with 10 stops last season.
- Robinson played in all 13 games last season while starting each of the final four contests and started the 2025 season opener, making three solo tackles, 2.0 TFLs and one forced one fumble.
- Robinson filled the stat sheet vs. Texas in Week 6 with three tackles, 0.5 sacks, one pass breakup and one QB hurry. His PBU came on second down and the QB hurry on third to force UT to punt on their opening drive.
- Robinson recorded 52 tackles (28 solo) and 3.5 sacks in 2024, which ranked fourth on the Gators.
- At Texas A&M in Week 7, Chiles more than doubled his previous career high in tackles (three) with seven in the first half alone, finishing with nine (four solo) in the game.
- In Week 2 vs. USF, Chiles had two tackles, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry. The solo tackle and QB hurry both occurred on third down, forcing a Bulls punt both times.
- True freshmen **LB Ty Jackson** (Fort Lauderdale, Fla. / Seminole Ridge) and **LB Myles Johnson** (Brewton, Ala. / T.R. Miller) made their collegiate debuts in Week 1. Johnson had four tackles with three stops in 13 snaps played.

- SO, WHAT ABOUT THE DEFENSIVE BACKS? -

- Florida's 2025 defensive backs unit ranked preseason No. 10 in the FBS and No. 5 in the SEC, per Phil Steele.
- The Gators' secondary brought back a pair of starting safeties in **SS Bryce Thornton** and **FS Jordan Castell**, who combined for 23 games played and 20 starts during the 2024 campaign.
- This season, Thornton (359) and Castell (351) rank first and second in defensive snaps played.
- In all, Florida had 14 interceptions and 49 pass breakups in 2024. Ten of those interceptions came from players returning for the 2025 season (71.4%) while 28 pass breakups were recorded by returners (57.1%).
- Castell has played every game across the last three seasons (2023-25) while making 30-straight starts in Orange & Blue, which is the longest-such streak of any current Gator on the roster.
- For the second-straight season in 2024, Castell led the team in snaps played (831) after playing a team-best 751 snaps in 2023. He continued the trend into the 2025 opener and has now played over 1,500 career snaps.
- Also in 2024, Castell paced Florida with nine pass breakups - three more than the next-closest Gator.
- Castell compiled 115 tackles across the 2023-24 seasons, having led UF with 60 (30 solo) in 2023.
- Castell nabbed his second interception in as many games in Week 7, picking off QB Marcell Reed in the endzone on the first play of the fourth quarter. He has a career-high two picks this season (three in career).
- Meanwhile, Thornton has played in 27 games including 16 starts across the last three seasons (2023-25), starting each of the last-10 games consecutively dating back to last year.
- Thornton had Florida's first score of the 2025 season with a 37-yard fumble recovery on the first drive of Week 1 and later added a second fumble recovery, setting up a Gators touchdown in the second quarter.
- Thornton led Florida with three interceptions in 2024 on top of 41 tackles (22 solo), 1.5 TFLs, one forced fumble and three pass breakups - and played all but one snap of UF's final two SEC games (vs. LSU & Ole Miss).
- Additionally, **CB Devin Moore** (six), **CB Dijon Johnson** (five), **STAR Sharif Denson** (five) and **STAR Aaron Gates** (five) all started five or more games for the 2024 UF defense, bringing more experience back to the secondary. The group also features **CB Corman McClain** (five career starts).
- Against Texas, Moore had his first-career sack and fourth-career interception on the same drive.
- Moore has surpassed his career-high in snaps (278) set last season with 305, ranking third on the team.
- Although he missed six games due to injury, Moore totaled 17 tackles, two pass breakups and one interception, playing his best football in his last two games of 2024 against Kentucky (81.6 PFF grade) and Georgia (76.1).
- McClain nabbed his second-career interception against Miami in Week 4, marking the fourth interception QB Carson Beck has thrown vs. the Gators in his career.
- In 2024, Denson's 87.4 pass rush grade ranked 13th among FBS safeties, as he racked up 37 tackles (22 solo), 5.0 TFLs and 2.0 sacks in addition to two pass breakups, one interception and one forced fumble.



- DEPTH ON THE D-LINE -

- In addition to stars **DL Caleb Banks** and **EDGE Tyreek Sapp**, Florida's No. 10 defensive line (per Phil Steele) features returning edge rushers in **JACK George Gumbs Jr.**, **EDGE Kamran James** and **EDGE LJ McCray**.
- To aid with the interior side, the group consists of veteran **DL Jamari Lyons** and promising second-year players in **DL Michai Boireau** and **DL Brien Taylor Jr.**, along with Baylor transfer **DL Brendan Bett**.
- Sapp's 90.4 run defense grade led all FBS edge rushers in Week 6 as he led UF in tackles (six) and had one TFL.
- Against Texas, Taylor Jr. (Houston native) had three tackles which featured a team-high 1.5 sacks and two QB hurries, on top of one solo stop (0-yards) on a rush attempt by RB Quintrevion Wisner.
- With both Sapp and Gumbs Jr. back in the fold, Florida returned each of its top-two leaders in sacks from 2024, as well as the entirety of the top four in Sapp (7.0), Gumbs Jr. (5.0), Banks (4.5) and **LB Jaden Robinson** (3.5).
- Gumbs Jr. finished second on the team in tackles for loss (8.0) and sacks (5.0) in 2024 in just his second full season on defense after three seasons at Northern Illinois: one at WR, one at TE and one at DE.
- Returning from injury vs. Texas, Gumbs Jr. had a solo sack with eight seconds left to clinch the win.
- As a sophomore in 2024, James tied for the team lead with six QB hurries while tying for fifth on the Gators with 4.0 sacks. James totaled 28 tackles (20 solo), 2.0 sacks and one forced fumble.
- Notable newcomers to Florida's edge rushing unit include UMass transfer **EDGE Kofi Asare** and true freshman **EDGE Jayden Woods** out of Mill Valley HS in Shawnee, Kansas.
- Woods teamed up with James for a sack on Texas' first play of an attempted comeback with 53 seconds left in Week 6. The duo each had a quarterback hurry as Woods collected a pass breakup as well, while James' other tackle was a third-down stop (Arch Manning three-yard rush) to force a Texas punt.
- Woods made his first-career start at No. 4 Miami, marking the first Florida true freshman to start on the DL since Jabari Zuniga in 2016. He had his first-career sack and three tackles across 59 defensive snaps.
- Asare played a season-high 36 snaps at No. 4 Miami en route to five tackles (three solo), two stops and 0.5 TFL.

- THE GAMECHANGERS -

- Although 2024 Honorable Mention All-America **P Jeremy Crawshaw** departed for the NFL, Florida returns a pair of starting specialists in **K Trey Smack** and **LS Rocco Underwood**.
- Crawshaw finished as Florida's all-time leader in career punting average at 46.4, passing Johnny Townsend (46.2).
- Crawshaw set the single-season program record with 48.9 yards per punt last year & was AP All-SEC Second Team.
- Although replacing Crawshaw's production will be difficult, Florida brought in 2024 Third Team All-Big Ten **P Tommy Doman**, who won the 2023 National Title at Michigan.
- Serving as Michigan's primary punter, holder, and placekicker in from 2023-24, Doman punted 103 times in his career for an average of 43.4 yards, highlighted by 22 of 50-plus yards and 34 inside the 20.
- In Doman's 28 punt attempts this season, 10 have landed inside the opposing 20-yard line and eight have gone for 50-plus yards, including five inside the 12-yard line in addition to a season-long of 63 yards.
- Smack's 56-yard field goal vs. LIU is the longest in the SEC this season while Doman's 63-yard punt ranks fourth.
- Underwood became the first-ever Gator to win the Mannelly Award in 2024, given to the nation's top LS.
- Underwood was named All-SEC Second Team, AFCA Second Team and Phil Steel First-Team All-America.
- In 2024, Underwood totaled three solo tackles and one fumble recovery, making him one of 11 FBS long snappers to have three tackles and one of two in the SEC.
- Named to the 2025 Lou Groza Award Watch List, Smack took over UF's primary kicking duties two seasons ago in Florida's 29-16 upset vs. No. 11 Tennessee on Sept. 16, 2023 and went on to be a Lou Groza Semifinalist.
- He moved himself up in the record book with a 56-yarder in Week 1 vs. LIU, which was tied for second-longest in program history and marked his fourth field goal of 50-plus yards.
- Since missing three field goals in the season opener, Smack has made his last-nine attempts in a row.
- At Texas A&M in Week 7, he made a 45-yard field goal to rise to 19-for-27 in his career from 40-plus yards.
- With the 45-yard field goal last week, Smack now ranks fourth all-time in fields goals made in UF history.
- Smack was 44-for-44 on PATs and 18-for-21 on FGs in 2024 with a long of 55, and 8-for-10 from 40-plus.
- Smack drilled 50-plus yarders in three of the last-five, regular-season games with a 55-yarder vs. LSU, which was tied for third longest in program history.
- He made all five FG attempts vs. Charlotte in 2023 (23, 23, 27, 36, 54) and drilled seven touchbacks on all seven attempts, becoming the first Gator to make five field goals in a single game since Eddy Pineiro in 2017.
- WR Vernell Brown III** is one of three players in the nation with five 20-yard punt returns this season.
- In his lone punt return in Week 2, Brown III returned it for 40 yards to set up Florida's touchdown in the fourth quarter. The return is the longest by an FBS true freshman this season and the longest by a Gator since 2022.
- WR Taylor Spierto** blocked a punt for a safety vs. Texas for Florida's first blocked punt since Derek Wingo vs. Charlotte on Sept. 23, 2023 and first safety since Nov. 25, 2023 vs. FSU.
- It marked the first time Florida blocked a punt for a safety since Sept. 6, 2008 vs. Miami (Jeff Dumps).
- The play also represented Florida's first blocked punt in SEC play since Jordan Pouncey at LSU on Oct. 16, 2021.

JOE HOUSTON'S IMPACT

- Florida's 2025 special teams unit ranks No. 13 in the FBS and No. 5 in the SEC, per Phil Steele.
- Last offseason, the Gators added senior special teams analyst **Joe Houston** to the fold. He came from the New England Patriots after spending four seasons (2020-23) as a special teams assistant.
- He enters the 2025 season in the role of special teams coordinator.
- In 2024, the Gators climbed to No. 1 in the FBS in special teams for three-consecutive weeks (Weeks 2-4) by ESPN's SP+ metric and finished third in the final regular-season ranking.
- Florida ranked 11th in the FBS in net punting (42.37) and 18th in punt return average (13.36) while holding status inside the top-13 all season in ESPN's SP+ metric.
- The Gators were also one of 44 teams to not have a blocked kick and one of 80 programs to not have a blocked punt.

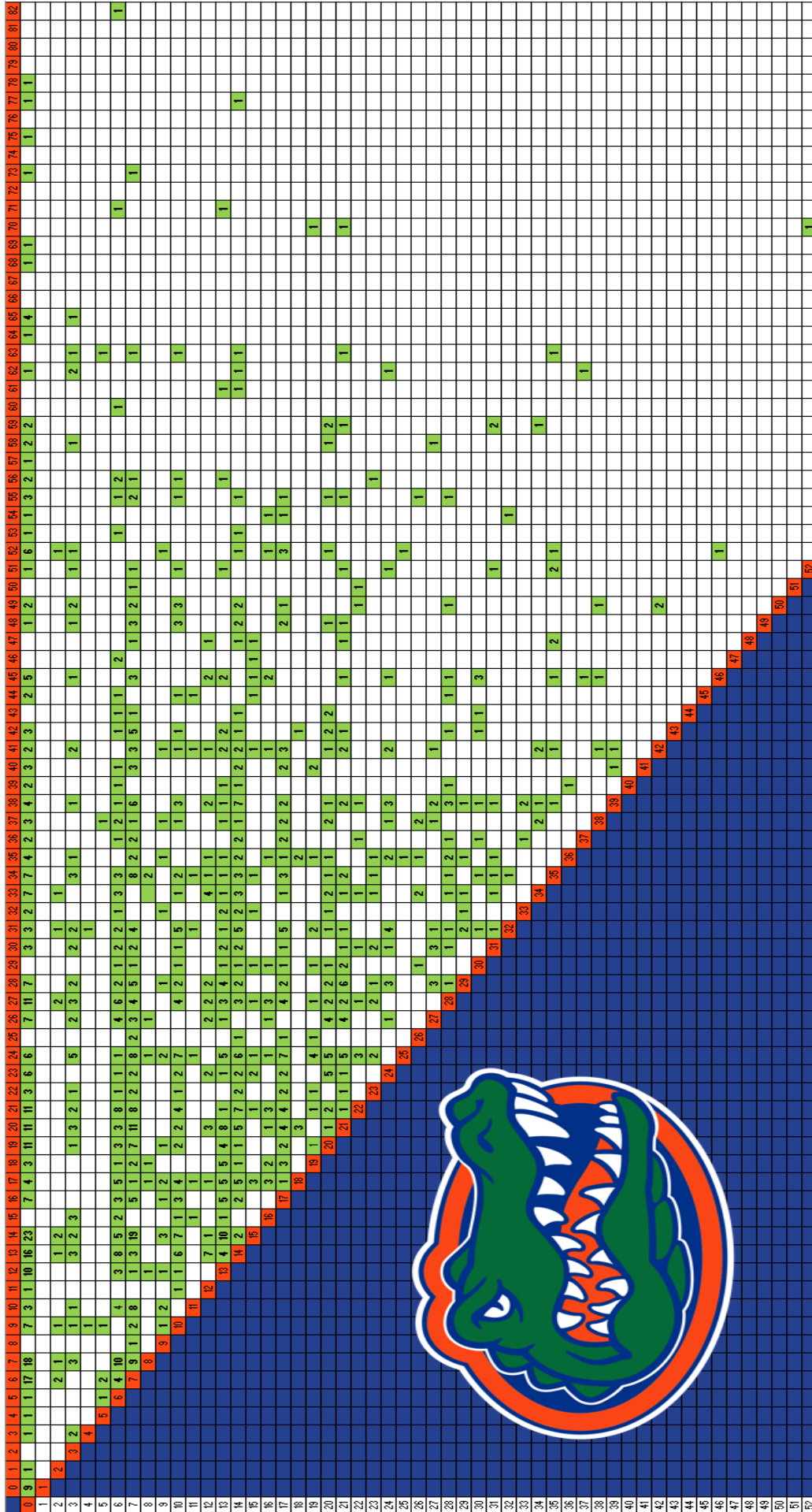

- Florida has averaged 271.5 passing yards in their last two games, which has increased its passing offense rank in the FBS from 88th before the Texas game to 69th.
- The Gators defense has continued to stand out on the year, ranking in the top-50 in total defense (33th), rushing defense (34th) and scoring defense (t-38th), and ranking highly in passing defense (51st) as well as passing efficiency defense (52nd).

- UF **Head Coach Billy Napier** is 1-0 all-time against Jeff Lebby, defeating his Mississippi State squad, 45-28, in 2024. The Gators are 35-19-2 all-time against the Bulldogs.

- During his time at Northern Illinois, UF **EDGE George Gumbs Jr.** played with three players on the Bulldogs' roster. DL Ray Thomas played with Gumbs from 2022-23 while WR Cam Thompson and LB Nevaeh Sanders played with Gumbs in 2023.
- UF **WR Coach Billy Gonzales** spent five seasons with the Bulldogs from 2013-17. In 2013, he was the WR Coach and from 2014-17 he added the title of Co-OC.
- Multiple Mississippi State coaches have spent time as coaches at Florida. MSU DC/LB Coach Coleman Hutzler spent 2010-11 as ST Coordinator/LB Coach and 2014 as ST Coordinator/OLB Coach. MSU Co-DC/Safeties Coach Matt Barnes spent 2012-2014 in Gainesville as a Defensive/Special Teams Graduate Assistant. Bulldogs CB Coach Corey Bell coached for the Gators in 2017 as a Secondary Coach and in 2021 as Assistant Director of Player Personnel. MSU DL Coach spent three years at Florida from 2019-21 as a DL Coach.

Fourth Season

Billy Napier enters his fourth season with the Gators after being named the 29th head coach in program history on Nov. 28, 2021.

In 2024, Napier led the Gators to a late-season charge, winning the last four games of the season to finish with an 8-5 record overall, with victories over No. 21 LSU, No. 9 Ole Miss, Florida State and Tulane in the 16th Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl. The Gators were one of just unranked six teams in the nation to post multiple top-25 wins on the year.

Florida finished in the top-25 in 10 NCAA statistical categories, including ninth in red zone defense (.725), ninth in passing yards per completion (14.11), 11th in team sacks (3.00) and 13th in turnovers gained.

Individually, center Jake Slaughter was named a First-Team All-American by the AP, while quarterback DJ Lagway earned Freshman All-America honors from ESPN and PFF. Rocco Underwood won the Mannely Award for best long snapper in the nation, while also earning AFCA Second-Team All-America honors and Second-Team All-SEC accolades from the league's coaches. Slaughter was also named First-Team All-SEC by the Associated Press. Running back Jadan Baugh, long snapper Gannon Burt, linebacker Myles Graham and offensive lineman Bryce Lovett were all named to the SEC All-Freshman Team, marking the second time under Napier that the Gators had four honorees.

After taking over full-time when quarterback Graham Mertz was injured in the Tennessee game, Lagway became a sensation for the Gators, finishing 6-1 as a starter and 6-0 in games when he finished. The true freshman ended the season ranked second in the nation in yards per pass attempt (9.97), third in passing yards per completion (16.65) and ninth in passing efficiency (154.9).

In his second season at the helm, Napier helped transform transfer quarterback Graham Mertz's career and led a youthful Gators roster highlighted by Jordan Castell and Eugene Wilson III while becoming the 12th FBS head coach to win 51 games since 2018.



During his first season with the Gators, Mertz went on to set career-highs in completions (261), passing yards (2,903), touchdown passes (20), completion percentage (72.9), passing yards per game (263.9) and efficiency (157.8) while only throwing three interceptions, marking a career-low and tied his career-best with four rushing scores. He set program records for consecutive passes without an interception (239), consecutive passes completed (19) and a season-best completion percentage of 72.9% (261 of 358). Mertz tied for second all-time in UF history with completion percentage in a game (83.3%) on two occasions and notched six multi-touchdown performances.

Mertz led the SEC and ranked third nationally in completion percentage while placing nationally among FBS quarterbacks sixth in TD-INT ratio (6.7) 14th in completions per game (23.7) and 17th in passing efficiency and 25th in passing yards per game. According to ESPN, he was one of four SEC quarterbacks to complete 70% of their throws, have 20 passing touchdowns and no more than six turnovers in a season over the past 20 years, joining LSU's Jayden Daniels and Alabama's Mac Jones and Tua Tagovailoa.

Florida's youth immediately contributed and carved out roles throughout the season while earning postseason honors. Four Gators in Jordan Castell, Kelby Collins, T.J. Searcy and Eugene Wilson III were named to the SEC All-Freshman team selected among conference coaches. The four selections were the most by a school and most by Florida since 2012. Among the group, Castell (CFN & ESPN), Collins (The Athletic) and Wilson (CFN, On3 and 247Sports) all collected freshman all-american honors.

Wilson made a name for himself nationally after each week as he led FBS true freshmen in receptions per game (6.1) while ranking second in receptions (61), tied for second in receiving TDs (six), fourth in receiving yards per game (53.8) and seventh in receiving yards (538).

Castell played all 12 games and started the last 11 consecutively while finishing as the team-leader in tackles (60) and most defensive snaps played with 660, one of two UF players (Jason Marshall Jr. / 651) to play over 600-plus snaps. There were only 51 defensive snaps Castell didn't play in. He accumulated 751 snaps (adding special teams), marking the only defensive player and sixth Gator to play in 700-plus snaps joining the likes of Graham Mertz and Ricky Pearsall.

During his first year at Florida, Napier established a new culture that emphasizes teamwork, toughness and discipline, setting a sturdy foundation for the future of Florida Football.

It didn't take long for Florida's culture shift to become evident. The Gators finished the 2022 regular season ranked fourth in the SEC in total penalty yards (584) and penalty yards per game (48.7), and eighth in total penalties (78). Napier's emphasis in playing disciplined football translated into a distinctive improvement from the 2021 season when the Gators ranked 13th in the conference with 104 penalties.

The turnover battle was another area where the Gators saw improvement in 2022. Florida finished ranked tied for eighth in the nation in turnover margin (8), giving up the football only 14 times while producing 22 takeaways during the regular season. The Gators outscored their opponents 70-42 points off turnovers during the 2022 campaign.

Florida's rushing attack took the nation by storm during Napier's first year at the helm. The Gators finished the 2022 regular season as the third-most productive rushing offense in the nation and best in the conference in yards per carry (5.84). Florida ran the ball for an average of 213.7 yards per game in 2022, which ranked 16th in the FBS and third in the SEC.



At the forefront of the Florida's mighty ground offense was the running back duo formed by freshman Trevor Etienne and Louisiana transfer Montrell Johnson Jr, who averaged 5.7 yards per carry and 120.0 rushing yards per game, while combining for a touchdown in all 12 regular season games and scoring 17 total touchdowns. They were one of only 15 running backs duos in the FBS to rush for over 700 yards apiece in 2022.

Johnson Jr. finished the 2022 campaign ranked tied-for-fourth in the SEC in rushing touchdowns (10) and became the first UF running back to rush for over 800 yards since La'Mical Perine in 2018. Meanwhile, Etienne ranked fourth in yards per carry (6.1), tied for 10th in touchdowns (six) and eighth in rushing yards (719) in the FBS among true freshmen.

The efficiency by Florida's running offense reflected an offensive line that allowed only 13 sacks in the regular season, ranking tied for second-fewest in the SEC and 16th in the FBS.

The offensive line was anchored by Louisiana transfer O'Cyrus Torrence, who finished as the top-rated guard in the nation at 88.0, according to Pro Football Focus.

Torrence became first Gators offensive guard to be named a Consensus All-American, and the fifth lineman in Florida history. He was named a First Team All-American by Sporting News, Associated Press, American Football Coaches Association and Walter Camp, and to the second team by the Football Writers Association of America. He was also named to the AP All-SEC First Team.

Torrence, who Napier recruited out of high school to play at UL, never allowed a QB hit or sack in 3,065 career snaps, including zero QB hurries or penalties in 698 snaps and 11 games started with the Gators in 2022.

Napier played a key role in the development of Anthony Richardson into the one of the hottest quarterbacks in college football. Richardson, who was ultimately drafted fourth overall in the 2023 NFL Draft, finished the 2022 season ranked fifth in the FBS among qualified quarterbacks in yards per carry (6.3) and was the only quarterback with two 400-yard games and two 100-yard rushing games in the season. Additionally, he was one of only five FBS players with over 2,500 passing yards and 650 rushing yards in 2022.

On the opposite side of the ball, the Gators continued their long-term defensive trends under Napier.

The Gators rank fifth nationally in interceptions with 409 and lead the SEC since 1996, while holding opponents to a 54.0 passing completion percentage, which is the seventh-lowest in the FBS and third in the SEC in that that span.

The Gators recorded an interception in six games during Napier's first season, the first of which secured a victory against No. 7 Utah—Napier's first game as Florida's head coach, to make him the only Florida head coach to defeat a ranked opponent in his first game.

Napier's emphasis on a new culture also became evident in the classroom. The Gators set a new Southeastern Conference record with 62 UF football players placing in the 2022 SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll. The team also set a squad record with a 3.30 team GPA for the 2023 Spring semester.

In spite of a 6-7 record during Napier's first season at the helm, UF outscored its opponents 29.5-to-28.8 points per game and a total of 384 to 375. Florida lost their six regular-season games by a total of only 61 combined points. Five of those games were lost by 10 points or less and three by only one score.

During his first season as Florida's head coach, Napier delivered a total 10 Gators to the NFL via the NFL Draft and free agency. Drafted were QB Anthony Richardson (Rnd. 1, Pick 4, Indianapolis), DT Gervon Dexter (Rnd. 2, Pick 22, Chicago), OL O'Cyrus Torrence (Rnd. 2, Pick 28, Buffalo), LB Ventrell Miller (Rnd. 4, Pick 19, Jacksonville), WR Justin Shorter (Rnd. 5, Pick 15, Buffalo) and LB Amari Burney (Rnd. 6, Pick 26, Las Vegas). The six picks were tied for fourth highest by a school that year and tied third in the SEC. Additionally, four other Gators were tabbed as undrafted free agents.

Louisiana (2018-21)

Napier spent four seasons at Louisiana and finished with a record of 40-12, a perfect 16-0 mark against members of the Sun Belt West Division, four consecutive West Division titles, four straight bowl appearances, a share of the Sun Belt title in 2020 and 2021 Sun Belt Conference Champions.

A two-time Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year (2019 & 2021), Napier took the Ragin' Cajuns to unprecedented heights when the team broke into the national rankings in 2020 for the first time in the modern era. The team finished the campaign ranked No. 15 in the AP Top-25, No. 16 in the USA Today/Amway Coaches Poll and No. 19 in the College Football Playoff, Louisiana's highest rankings in all three polls.

In 2021, he led the program to their first conference championship title since 2005 and only the second time in program history. Napier concluded his final season with a 12-1 record, the most single-season wins in school history after setting it with 11 in his second year. The 12 straight wins also set the program record for consecutive victories, as the previous record was eight in 1976.

Napier led Louisiana to its fourth straight Sun Belt Conference Championship game with a 24-16 victory over Appalachian State to finish with a career record of 28-7 against conference opponents. Louisiana became the first team in conference history to make all four conferences championship games.

Napier's Louisiana team produced two 2022 NFL Draft picks in safety Percy Butler and tackle Max Mitchell, who were both drafted in the fourth round by the Washington Commanders and the New York Jets, respectively.

The 2020 Louisiana Sports Writer Association Coach of the Year, Napier navigated Louisiana through a season heavily impacted by COVID-19 and claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference Championship, its third-straight West Division title and its second-straight bowl victory, a 31-24 win over UTSA in the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl. The Ragin' Cajuns also advanced to its third consecutive Sun Belt Championship game, but was canceled due to COVID-19.

Napier's team broke into the national rankings for the first time in the modern era following its week one upset at No. 23 Iowa State, marking the first win over a ranked opponent on the road and only the second time in program history. He concluded non-conference matchups at Louisiana with a record of 13-5, as three of the losses came against ranked opponents - No.1 Alabama, No. 16 Mississippi State and No. 19 Texas.

Both the offense and defense continued to flourish in 2020 under Napier's watch. Offensively, the team ranked 29th nationally in scoring offense (33.6) and 43rd nationally in total offense (421.5), while the defense ranked 31st in scoring defense (22.0) and 33rd in total defense (355.4).

Napier coached Louisiana to 14 Sun Belt All-Conference selections, led by First Team selections Elijah Mitchell and Chris Smith. Mitchell wrapped up his stellar career ranking fifth in career scoring (276), fifth in career rushing touchdowns (41) and sixth in career rushing yards (3,267) before being drafted in the sixth round by the San Francisco 49ers.

Smith additionally earned First Team All-America honors from CBSSports/247Sports, Pro Football Focus and Second Team All-America honors from the FWAA, marking the second consecutive season that a Ragin' Cajun earned All-America honors under Napier.

In just the second season (2019) under Napier, the program set the all-time single season victories (11) at the time and second-straight trip to the Sun Belt Championship Game after clinching the league's West Division title with a 53-3 victory over Troy. The 11 victories also marked the first double-digit win season in program history and the first of three consecutive 10-plus win years by Napier.

He was voted the program's first Sun Belt Coach of the Year, becoming the third Louisiana coach to earn the distinction of top coach and the first since 1993 in their respective conference.

Napier coached three 2020 NFL Draft picks in Raymond Calais (RB), Kevin Dotson (G) and Robert Hunt (G), tying the program record for draft selections in a year. Hunt became the third-highest pick in team history as he was selected 39th overall by the Miami Dolphins. A First Team All-American selection by the Associated Press, USA Today, Sports Illustrated, Pro Football Focus and a Second Team All-American by Sporting News, Dotson was drafted in the fourth round by the Pittsburgh Steelers. Calais was tabbed by the reigning Super Bowl Champions, Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the seventh round.

In Napier's first season at the helm, the Ragin' Cajuns (7-7, 5-3) won the 2018 Sun Belt Conference West Division Championship, advancing to the inaugural conference championship game. Louisiana accepted an invitation to the AutoNation Cure Bowl, its first bowl trip since 2016.

Arizona State (2017)

Prior to his stint at Louisiana, Napier was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Arizona State in 2017.

Napier guided the Sun Devils' offense to the 14th highest-graded offense in the FBS according to Pro Football Focus - including the 10th highest-graded passing attack in the nation. ASU was ranked 54th in the nation in total offense last season and 86th in the passing game the season prior. The offensive turnaround (+40 positions) was the eighth-largest in the FBS and ASU was one of just three programs to move from outside the Top-50 to inside of it in just one season. The 76-spot swing in the passing game rankings was the third highest in all of the FBS..

ASU developed one of the elite red zone scoring teams in the nation under Napier, tied for first nationally in converting on 95.83 percent of its red zone appearances (46-of-48) with the only two "blemishes" against the Sun Devils coming when the team took a knee late in the fourth quarter. ASU was 11th nationally in red zone touchdown scoring rate with 36 touchdowns on those 48 attempts (75.00).

Ball security was another notable facet of Napier's offense. The Sun Devils turned the ball over just 11 times in 2017, which ranked 12th nationally after finishing 82nd in the country a year ago with 21 turnovers.

Alabama (2011, 2013-16)

Napier's first experience in the SEC came at Alabama in 2011 and he later returned to Crimson Tide from 2013-17 as the wide receivers coach.

He was instrumental in helping Nick Saban and Alabama achieve a 63-7 record in five seasons (2011, 2013-2016), two National Championships (2011 & 2015) and was part of the great run of 26 consecutive wins from 2015-2016. In 70 games at Alabama, the Crimson Tide offense averaged 6.27 yards per play and 36.4 points per game. Napier coached three first round draft picks in Amari Cooper, Jerry Jeudy, Amari Cooper and Calvin Ridley while in Tuscaloosa.

In 2016, Napier's wide receiver corps were led by junior ArDarius Stewart, a third-round pick by the New York Jets in 2017 and Ridley. Stewart snagged in a team-leading eight touchdowns and 864 yards while Ridley totaled a team-high 72 receptions. Napier also helped develop wide outs Gehrig Dieter (Kansas City) and Cam Sims (Washington), both who were NFL free agent signees.

After recruiting Ridley to sign with the Crimson Tide, Napier coached him to a freshman-record and team-leading 89 catches for 1,045 yards and seven touchdowns in 2015 along with being named a USA Today Freshman All-American.

Napier played a vital role in Cooper's historical campaign in the 2014 season. He became Alabama's first Biletnikoff Award winner and caught a school- and SEC-record 124 passes for a UA-record 1,727 receiving yards and 16 touchdowns. Cooper led the country in receptions (124), was second nationally in receiving yards (1,727), receiving touchdowns (16) and catches per game (8.9) while ranking third in yards per game (123.4). A Heisman Trophy finalist and unanimous first team All-American, Cooper smashed all of the Tide's career receiving marks with 228 receptions, 3,463 yards and tied the SEC record with 31 receiving touchdowns.

In his first season as the Crimson Tide's receivers coach in 2013, Napier built a deep and talented group of wide outs. Alabama had four players with at least 32 receptions, led by Cooper's 45 catches for 736 yards.

The 2011 season marked the first year for Napier on the Alabama staff as he served as an offensive analyst, helping the Crimson Tide win the 2011 BCS national championship. The Tide ranked 16th in scoring offense, 30th in total offense and 17th in rushing offense in 2011.



Colorado State (2012)

After a year at Alabama, Napier served as the assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach at Colorado State in 2012 for former Florida head coach Jim McElwain.

Injuries forced Napier to go deep down the bench looking for quarterbacks during his one season in Fort Collins. The Rams saw three quarterbacks play significant snaps as the starter with Garrett Grayson going down early in the season and M.J. McPeck followed two weeks later, forcing redshirt freshman Conner Smith into action. The trio combined to throw for 2,520 yards and 17 touchdowns in 2012 as Colorado State won three of its final five games.

Clemson (2003-04, 2006-10)

Before his first stretch at Alabama, Napier spent seven years in two different stints at Clemson. During Napier's final two seasons at Clemson he was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

At the age of 29, he became the youngest coordinator in the nation and in Clemson history. In his first season as Clemson's coordinator, the 2009 Tigers scored a school-record 436 points and collected 54 touchdowns (third-most in school history), averaged 5.73 yards per play (fourth best) and finished as the ACC Atlantic Division champions.

He also served as Clemson's recruiting coordinator from 2006-08. In those three seasons, he compiled two top-25 recruiting classes, according to Rivals.com, and in 2008, his class was tabbed as the second-best in the nation by ESPN.com.

Napier was the 2007-08 tight ends coach at Clemson, helping lead the Tigers to two bowl games and a prolific offense.

The 2007 season featured a 9-4 record and the ACC's highest-scoring offense. In his first year back with Clemson (2006), Napier worked primarily with the Tigers' tight ends but also was responsible for the punt team and assisted in several special-teams capacities. The 2006 Tigers led the ACC in total offense, rushing and scoring offense, advancing to the Music City Bowl.

Clemson averaged 410.9 yards per game and 32.7 points, more than doubling its opponent's totals. Michael Palmer, who Napier coached for three seasons, went on to the NFL. He also worked with the special teams units, helping develop the 2009 ACC Player of the Year and a unanimous All-American C.J. Spiller.



He began his coaching career as an offensive graduate assistant at Clemson in 2003-04. The Tigers won nine games, including the Peach Bowl against Tennessee. The following season, Napier was a graduate assistant on defense, and gained his first experience with recruiting off the field.

Background

As a player, Napier was a four-year letterwinner and two-time All-Southern Conference selection as the starting quarterback at Furman. The Paladins won two conference championships and in 2001, Napier's junior year, advanced to the Division I-AA national championship game, losing to Montana.

He completed 64.8-percent of his career passes, setting a school record. As the team captain during a record-setting senior season, Napier amassed 2,475 passing yards, also a Furman record, and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award, given annually to the nation's most outstanding FCS offensive player.

Napier grew up in Chatsworth, Georgia, and graduated from Murray County High School in 1998. He is married to the former Ali Gunn and the couple has a daughter, Annie, and sons, Sammy and Charlie. He earned his Bachelor's degree in health & exercise science from Furman in 2002.

WHAT HAPPENED: Florida quarterback DJ Lagway passed for three first-half touchdowns, tailback Jadan Baugh rushed for 104 yards and a score and the nation's 15th-ranked team did what a power-conference program with high expectations is supposed to do to an FCS opponent in running roughshod over Long Island in a 55-0 rout Saturday night in the season opener for both teams at sold-out Spurrier/Field Field. Lagway, the 6-foot-3, 247-pound sophomore from Willis, Texas, had to shake off some rust after being limited for the first month of fall practice with a sore calf. Nonetheless, the UF franchise QB completed 15 of his 18 throws (83.3%) for 120 yards, with short scoring tosses of four yards to wide receiver Eugene Wilson III and tight end Hayden Hansen, plus an 8-yarder to wideout J. Michael Sturdivant, the transfer from UCLA. All three came in the second quarter, as the Gators built a 38-0 halftime lead, then shut Lagway down for the night. UF churned out 236 yards, including 120 rushing, and 16 first downs with Lagway under center. When the night was over, the Gators had out-gained the out-manned Sharks, by way of the Northeast Conference, 451 yards to 86, with a whopping 27-2 edge in first downs, an all-time low for a UF opponent. The Sharks' first 12 possessions went just three plays or less.

Florida's 55 points marked a single-game high under Coach Billy Napier, now in his fourth season. The Gators went an entire game without a penalty for the first time since 2021 and did not turn the ball over. LIU, in its seventh season of existence, was facing just its fourth power-conference program. The previous three were losses of 66-0 at West Virginia in 2021, 30-7 at Baylor in '22 and 45-0 at Texas Christian in '24. UF did not waste any time jumping in front, but did so on defense. The Gators won the coin toss, deferred to the second-half, but took the lead on safety Bryce Thornton's 37-yard fumble return — the first fumble for a score by the Gators' defense since 2020 — on the game's third play from scrimmage. On Florida's first offensive series, Baugh had runs of 17, 16 and seven yards before scoring on a 4-yard blast for a 14-0 lead. He got the second 100-yard game of his career on just nine carries. While LIU was cranking one three-and-out after another, Florida had three consecutive series ended in Trey Smack field-goal attempts. He missed from 40 and 39, but drilled a 56-yarder in between that tied the second-longest in school history and gave the home team a 17-0 lead. The Gators' next three series ended in the Lagway TD passes and fat halftime advantage. True freshman Tramell Jones Jr., out of Jacksonville, replaced Lagway in the second half and led a scoring drive to Smack's second field goal, a 41-yarder, and then a 64-yard march capped by a 4-yard touchdown pass to tight end Tony Livingston for a 48-0 lead. He threw an 11-yard scoring strike to former walk-on Taylor Spierto with 25 seconds remaining in the game. Jones finished 12 of 18 for 131 yards and the two TDs without a turnover.

WHAT IT MEANS: Not much. LIU may have been one of the most over-matched opponents ever to play at Florida Field. For the Gators, the best thing about beating up on the Sharks was getting Lagway some much-needed reps (and getting out of the game healthy) before things start to get real.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Legacy wideout Vernell Brown III made quite the splash in his collegiate debut. Brown, whose father played at UF from 2002-05 and whose grandfather played here from 1982-85, became the first true freshman to start for the Gators on offense since tackle Jawaan Taylor in 2016 and just the third receiver in program history to do so, joining Percy Harvin (2006) and Antonio Callaway (2015). Brown caught three passes for 79 yards, breaking the true freshman debut mark of 72 set by Josh Hammond against North Texas in 2016. Brown hauled a spectacular one-handed, 41-yard gem from Lagway in the second quarter to set up a score. He also returned three punts for 45 yards, with a long of 25.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: LIU's total offense of 86 yards marked the 10th-lowest total by an opponent in UF history. The Sharks did not run a play in Florida territory until quarterback Luca Stanzani, from the his 42, converted a third-and-7 with a 28-yard completion to Deion Richardson to the UF 28 with just over nine minutes to go in the game. The drive fizzled from there. As for their two first downs, the previous all-time low against the Gators was four against Western Carolina in 2006 and Miami in 1974.

UP NEXT: Florida (1-0) is back in "The Swamp" on Sept. 6 for a date against cross-state foe South Florida (1-0), which turned plenty of college football heads Thursday night in trouncing 25th-ranked Boise State, a College Football Playoff participant last season, 34-7 at Tampa. The Bulls are in their third season under Alex Golesh, who's put together back-to-back 7-6 seasons capped by bowl wins. The upset of the Broncos, though, was one of the program's biggest victories in years and should get the attention of the UF staff. Especially if USF, though unlikely, jumps into the Associated Press Top 25 this week.

WHAT HAPPENED: South Florida's Nico Gramatica kicked a 20-yard field goal as time expired and the down-south, cross-state foe Bulls shocked 13th-ranked Florida 18-16 before a sold-out, bummed-out crowd Saturday night at Spurrier/Florida Field. Gramatica's game-winner came after the Bulls — nine days removed from upsetting 25th-ranked and 2024 College Football Playoff participant Boise State at Tampa — capped an eight-play, 87-yard drive over the final 2:26, with the Gators defense doing its part in handing USF one of its biggest victories in school history by committing a disastrous unsportsmanlike-conduct penalty and a handful of missed tackles on a long catch-and-run. The victory gave the Bulls, in just their 25th year in Division I and FBS classification, wins over Florida, Florida State, Miami in their short history. Senior quarterback Byrum Brown completed 23 of 36 passes for 263 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing 17 times for 66 yards. Brown's 66-yard scoring strike late in the third quarter gave the Bulls their first lead of the game. The Gators, thanks to a 40-yard punt return by dynamic freshman Vernell Brown III, managed to retake the lead on a DJ Lagway short scoring toss to Eugene Wilson III, but the home team, despite getting the ball back twice more, left the door open for Brown and friends. The Bulls kicked it in. USF began the close-out drive at its 11. On second-and-10, defensive back Dijon Johnson was called for pass interference. On the very next snap, tailback Alvon Isaac was stopped for no gain at the 24, but in the middle of a mini-shoving match defensive lineman Brendan Bett was flagged for spitting on a player, resulting in a 15-yard penalty and automatic ejection. The ball was moved to the South Florida 39, where on first down Brown threw a short pass in the flat to Isaac, who turned the corner, broke two tackles and made another defensive back miss as he dashed 29 yards up the USF sidelines to the Florida 32. In field-goal range. From there, it was a slow green-and-gold bleed out, with either Brown or Isaac moving the ball to the UF 2 and calling a timeout with three seconds left. Gramatica, the son of former Tampa Bay Buccaneers kicker and Super Bowl champion Martin Gramatica, split the uprights from inside point-after range. It was his third field goal of the night. USF out-gained UF in total yards, 391 to 355, and on defense made Lagway look uncomfortable late most of the night. The sophomore finished 23 of 33 for 222 yards, one touchdown and a first-half interception. The Gators out-rushed the Bulls, though barely, 133 to 128, led by sophomore Jadan Baugh's 93 yards on 18 carries. Through the first 48 minutes, the game featured nothing but field goals; three by Florida's Trey Smack (from 28, 36 and 25) and two by Gramatica (38 and 25), with neither team able to finish drives. The Gators led 9-6 until what looked like a promising UF march, with a first down at midfield, stalled and ended in a punt. The Bulls took over at their 14, got out of a hole with a 15-yard completion from Brown to Mudia Reuben, then turned the game on its head. On third-and-5 from his 34, Brown got his fast-breaking, high-tempo offense to the line and got the ball snapped as the Florida defense was caught — and confused — in mid-substitution. Singleton sprinted upfield and Brown lofted a strike that split defensive backs Johnson and Sharif Denson, both of whom looked like they could make a play on the ball. Instead, the two dove past each other, the ball hit Singleton in stride and he went untouched into the end zone for the Bulls' first lead of the game at 13-9. The Gators' ensuing possession answer was a three-and-out followed by a high snap from punt formation by Rocco Underwood, a 2024 first-team All-Southeastern Conference selection, that sailed over the head of Tommy Doman and rolled out of the end zone for a safety that pushed USF's margin to 15-9 with 13 seconds to go in the third quarter. Then came Brown's big return, Lagway's scoring toss, the lead, the momentum and the crowd doing its part. It wasn't enough.

WHAT IT MEANS: Get ready for more of what Ron Zook used to call "noise in the system," as UF failed to go 2-0 under Coach Billy Napier for the fourth time in as many seasons. USF, meanwhile, now has to be considered one of the Group of Five front-runners for a possible CFP berth.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Brown, the senior from Raleigh, North Carolina, was the best player on the field against Boise last weekend and the best on the field Saturday.

STAGGERING STATISTIC: The Gators were flagged 11 times for 103 yards, several of them stalling drives or extending ones on defense. Quite a drastic turn after the season-opening 55-0 win against FCS-classed Long Island when the Gators had zero penalties. They were a huge reason UF punted on six of its seven possessions in the second half.

UP NEXT: Florida (1-1) dives into the meat cleaver portion (the first one) of a 2025 schedule that is ranked as the most difficult in the country this season. The Gators open their SEC slate Sept. 13 with a night game at No. 3 LSU (1-0), which faces Louisiana Tech later tonight. Come what may, then it's a trip down the Florida Turnpike to face fifth-ranked Miami, which blew out the home team at "The Swamp" by a 41-17 count a year ago.

WHAT HAPPENED: LSU safety Dashawn Spears returned one of DJ Lagway's career-high five interceptions 58 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter to break open a close game, as the third-ranked Tigers went on to a 20-10 defeat of the visiting Florida Gators in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams Saturday night at sold-out Tiger Stadium. Quarterback Garrett Nussmeier passed for 220 yards and a touchdown, but it was the LSU defense that dictated and determined the outcome. The Tigers thoroughly frustrated and confused Lagway, the sophomore who repeatedly made ill-advised throws either under duress or into double- or triple-coverage. The Gators also undermined themselves with another night of costly penalties, committing seven for 57 yards (all through the first three quarters), including three holding penalties, one of which cost UF an 87-yard touchdown pass. The UF defense played admirably, holding the Tigers to just 316 yards, 10 first downs and came up with an interception early in the fourth quarter when the Gators, trailing by 10, sorely needed to make a play. Lagway, though, after working the offense into LSU territory, forced a deep pass into triple coverage down the middle on the third-and-9 from the 36. The ball was intercepted in the end zone by defensive back Tamarus Cooley with 11 minutes remaining. The Gators' defense, though, forced a punt and Lagway, after starting at his 15, moved UF to the LSU 39, and in field-goal range, to possibly make it a one-score game late. But under pressure, Lagway danced in the backfield and tried to make a desperation, cross-field throw into heavy coverage. That one was picked off at the LSU sideline by defensive back DJ Pickett with 2:07 to go. Three plays later, on third-and-1 from the LSU 46, tailback Caden Durham ripped off a 51-yard run to the Florida 3, where the Tigers ran out the clock. Lagway, who missed virtually the entire offseason and most of preseason practice dealing with shoulder and calf injuries, finished 33 of 49 for 287 yards, one touchdown, the five picks and was sacked three times. The Gators out-gained the Tigers on the night, finishing with 366 yards (only 79 rushing), but the turnovers and penalties killed them. Both teams mostly struggled during a first half that ended with LSU's Damian Ramos drilling a 45-yard field goal as time expired to lead 13-10. The Gators took a 3-0 lead in the first quarter on a 45-yard Trey Smack field goal and -- for a moment -- thought they had jumped ahead 10-0 on an 87-yard touchdown strike from Lagway to tailback Jadan Baugh. Instead, the play was called back for holding and UF had to punt from its end zone. LSU tied the game on a Ramos' 47-yarder on the ensuing possession. The Tigers took the lead when Nussmeier hit wideout Zavion Thomas for a 23-yard scoring strike to cap a 10-play, 76-yard drive with 7:33 to go in the half. The Gators, though, matched it with a near-identical 10-play, 75-yard drive, with Lagway lofting a perfect pass to Aidan Mizell for a 10-yard score on third-and-9 that tied the game at 10 with 3:25 to go before intermission. That's where it should have stood at halftime, but Lagway tried to force a pass to freshman wideout Vernell Brown III for his second interception, with the Tigers taking over at the UF 40. Aided by a pass-interference call (and despite a false-start penalty), Ramos was able to give LSU a 13-10 lead on the final play of the half. The only score after the break was the game-sealing pick-6. For the second consecutive week, the Florida defense gave up just one touchdown in a loss. Sophomore running back Jadan Baugh (13) on the move Saturday against the Tigers.

What it Means: More noise. More adversity. More pressure. And more great opponents on the immediate horizon (read on).

In the Spotlight: The LSU secondary had a bead on Lagway all night. With good pressure up front, the Tigers' DBs sat back and locked in on the Gators' QB as he stared down his receivers.

Staggering Statistic: Lagway became the first Florida quarterback to throw at least five interceptions in a game since Shane Matthews threw five in a 30-6 loss at Mississippi State in 1992. The last UF quarterback to throw at least four in a game was Rex Grossman in a 17-14 loss at Ole Miss in 2002. The last time LSU intercepted at least four passes in a game occurred in 2021, when the Tigers picked off four passes (two each from UF's Emory Jones and Anthony Richardson) in defeating the Gators 49-42 at Baton Rouge.

Up Next: Florida (1-2) continues its harrowing run of ranked opponents with a road date at No. 5 Miami (3-0), which destroyed 18th-ranked South Florida 49-12 Saturday at Miami Gardens, a week after the Bulls came to "The Swamp" and did their well-chronicled damage in handing the Gators a stinging 18-16 loss. The prime-time UF-UM showdown will mark the Gators' first road date against the Hurricanes since 2013 (a 21-16 loss) and likely the last regular-season meeting between the two programs for a long time, given the SEC's expansion to a nine-game league schedule starting next season.

WHAT HAPPENED: Running backs CharMar Brown and Mark Fletcher Jr. each rushed for short touchdowns in the final four minutes and No. 4 Miami staved off a Florida second-half push for a 26-7 victory in their cross-state rivalry showdown Saturday night at Hard Rock Stadium. Brown's 1-yard run with 4:08 remaining capped a 13-play, 80-yard drive after the Gators, completely stifled (and shut out) in the first half, awakened in the third quarter with an impressive scoring march that turned what was looking like a rout into a one-possession game at 13-7. Brown's score made it 19-7, as UM missed the two-point try. The TD came after UF had a chance to take the lead -- or at least cut Miami's six-point edge in half -- after forcing a Carson Beck interception on the first play after scoring its touchdown. The Gators, though, could not capitalize, while the Hurricanes bowed up and put things away in the fourth quarter. After Brown's score, Florida went four plays and out, turning the ball over on downs deep in its own territory. Fletcher Jr. rushed 24 times for 116 yards, while Brown toted 18 times for 80. The Hurricanes finished with 344 total yards versus just 141 by the Gators, the team's fewest since gaining just 139 in a 30-3 loss to Oregon State in the 2022 Las Vegas Bowl. The Gators managed just seven first downs and 0-for-13 on third-down conversion opportunities. Sophomore quarterback DJ Lagway, a week after throwing five interceptions in a loss at LSU, had another frustrating night, completing just 12 of 23 passes for 61 yards, a career-low in games he has started. Lagway's longest completion went for 12 yards and he was sacked four times. UF got the ball to open the game and the Gators' first three plays, all runs, looked like this: minus-3, minus-1, minus-1. It was a preview of things to come. UM took the ensuing punt and drove 56 yards in seven plays, with Brown powering in from the 2 for a 7-0 lead and the first opening-drive touchdown against the Florida defense in 12 games. The Hurricanes made it look easy. Florida's second series went like the first; another three-and-out. Miami converted three consecutive third downs before a sack of Beck by freshman Jayden Woods forced the Canes to settle for the first of two field goals in the period. Carter Davis hit a 53-yarder less than a minute into the period and laater a 28-yarder with just over a minute to play in the half to take a 13-0 lead to the locker room. The Gators went to intermission with just 32 yards of offense, including only four on the ground, on 22 plays (1.45 per snap) and one first down. It looked like it would be all Miami. Until it didn't. The Hurricanes got the ball to start the second half and eventually punted. The Gators took over at their 20 and instantly looked like a different team. The offensive line began moving the UM defensive front, starting with a 27-yard by Ja'Kobi Jackson that almost equaled the team's entire offensive output of the first half. A 10-yard completion to Vernell Brown III and 11-yard run by Jadan Baugh set up a 4th-and-2 at the UM 12 that Lagway converted on a keeper around the right side. Two plays later, Baugh went to that same side for a 7-yard touchdown that suddenly made a completely lopsided game into a 13-7 contest. On the very next snap from scrimmage, Beck threw late down the middle on first down and was intercepted by UF's Cormani McClain near midfield. The Gators had a fourth and 3 at the UM 45, but Lagway threw short of the line to gain, with TJ Abrams tackled after a 2-yard gain on the first play of the fourth quarter. The Florida defense, though, forced a three-and-out, with UF still down by just six points. On third-and-1 at the Gators' 27, an inside handoff to Baugh was blown up in the backfield, forcing the Gators to punt the ball away with 11:20 to go. Miami started at its 20 and went to work on the first of its two late fourth-quarter TD marches. That one basically sealed the victory.

What it Means: More of the same, relative to adversity, only with no game to potentially quiet the noise this week. Read on.

In the Spotlight: The defense, like the previous two weeks, kept the Gators in the game. Through nearly 56 minutes, the unit had allowed just one touchdown (like it did in the loss at LSU and the home loss the week before against South Florida), but only had so much resistance left in the fourth quarter after the Florida offense could not stay on the field.

Staggering Statistic: The Gators have lost three of their first four games for the first time in 39 years. In 1986, UF opened with a 38-14 win over Division I-AA Georgia Southern, then lost at home to No. 2 Miami 23-15 and No. 4 Alabama 21-7 in consecutive weeks, followed by a 16-10 road defeat at Mississippi State. The Gators, who were in the final year under crippling NCAA sanctions, lost a fourth in a row, 28-17 at home against LSU, then reeled off five wins in their final six games to finish 6-6.

Up Next: Florida (1-3, 0-1) has a much-needed open date to process their latest loss, but will return to action Oct. 4 with a home Southeastern Conference game against Texas (3-1, 0-0), currently ranked No. 10 in the nation after tumbling from No. 1 following an ugly season-opening 14-7 loss at third-ranked Ohio State. The Longhorns defeated Sam Houston State 55-0 Saturday night.

WHAT HAPPENED: Sophomore quarterback DJ Lagway passed for 298 yards and a pair of touchdowns, with true freshman wide receiver Dallas Wilson accounting for the better part of those numbers in a spectacular collegiate debut Saturday, as Florida upset No. 9 Texas 29-21 before a sold-out and rollicking crowd at Spurrier/Florida Field that badly needed a game (and result) like this one. The finish was on the wild side, with the Longhorns scoring on a 1-yard Quintrevion Wisner run with 3:20 to go, then forcing a three-and-out and Gators punt, with UT taking over at its 31 with 54 seconds to go. On first down, UT quarterback Arch Manning was sacked by Kamran James and freshman Jayden Woods for a 12-yard loss, with Manning's helmet coming off and, by rule, forcing him to the sidelines for one play. Enter backup Matthew Caldwell, who fired a 26-yard completion, with UF also being flagged for a personal foul on the play. The 41-yard gain put UT at the UF 40 and Manning re-entering the game with 18 seconds remaining. The next (and final) three plays looked like this: incompleting; sack by UF edge George Gumbs Jr.; and a desperation spike by Manning to try (in vain) and stop the clock with one second remaining. Instead, the game ended and so did Florida's three-game losing streak. Lagway, in bouncing back from a three-week run of poor play, completed 21 of 28 passes (75%) and keyed an offense that cranked out 457 total yards against a Longhorns' defense that began the day ranked fourth overall nationally (211.0 yards per game) -- as well as second in scoring (7.8 points per) -- and 16th against the pass (151.3 yards per). UF sophomore tailback Jadan Baugh carried a career-high 27 times for 107 yards and a touchdown, as the Gators grounded out 159 yards against the nation's No. 3 rush defense (just 59.8 per game) and did not allow Lagway to be sacked. But it was Wilson, the 6-foot-3, 213-pound five-star prospect out of Tampa Bay Tech, who lit up the stadium and introduced himself to Gator Nation in stunning fashion. After missing the season's first four games with a foot injury, Wilson hauled in six receptions for 111 yards and both of Lagway's TDs; a 13-yarder in the first half and electrifying 55-yard catch-and-run in the second half that gave UF a 15-point lead with 38 seconds remaining in the third quarter and set up the final and frantic (for the home team and crowd) fourth period. Texas, which came in averaging 438 yards and 31.8 points a game, was limited to 341 yards, including just 52 on the ground. Manning, the sophomore with Hall-of-Fame family pedigree, completed 16 of 29 passes for 263 yards and a pair of scores, but also threw a pair of interceptions (one in the fourth quarter) and was sacked six times. The Gators used a near-flawless first half to take a 19-7 lead into the locker room. The lone flaw miscue was a fumble by tight end Hayden Hansen after a completion into Texas territory that led to UT's only score of the half when UF was threatening to blow the game open. UF took the opening kickoff and marched 84 yards in a methodical 13 plays, with Baugh scoring on a 5-yard run on third-and-1. The Florida defense forced a Texas punt on the Longhorns' first possession and answered with another long drive (10 plays, 64 yards) that Trey Smack capped with a 34-yard field goal for a 10-0 lead. The Gators were threatening yet again when Hansen caught a 13-yard pass and coughed up the ball at the Texas 40 on a hit by Ty'Anthony Smith. Linebacker Anthony Hill Jr. scooped and returned the play to UF 45. Manning's 33-yard pass to Parker Livingstone got the Longhorns to the 10 and Wisner scored the first of his two TDs on a 5-yard swing pass to make it 10-7. Lagway, who was playing through some pain, went back to work, with completions of 11 yards to Vernell Brown III, 19 to J. Michael Sturdivant and 18 to Wilson, all mixed with some nice running from backup freshman tailback Duke Clark (9 carries, 38 yards), who was on for injured backup Ja'Kobi Jackson. Lagway finished the drive by firing a 13-yard scoring dart to Wilson to make the score 17-7. Texas' next possession was a three-and-out, with UF fifth-year senior and former walk-on Taylor Spierto crashing the protection and blocking Jack Bouwmeester's punt out of the back of the end zone for a safety and 19-7 advantage. When the teams went to the locker room, Florida was up in total yards 263 to 87 (with a 113-24 differential on the ground), first downs 17 to five and had a nearly 10-minute advantage in time of possession. After the first three possessions of the third quarter ended in punts, the Gators struck midway through the period when Lagway bombed a 60-yard completion to Brown, who made a ridiculous catch in tight coverage at the UT 25. Florida, though, had to settle for Smack's 38-yard field goal, which kept the lead at two possessions, 22-7. But not for long. Manning struck for a 38-yard TD pass to Ryan Wingo with 2:43 left in the third, drawing to within 22-14. Lagway and Wilson answered. The former hit the latter on a deep sidelined rout, with Wilson running through defenders and tight-roping the UT sidelines for an incredible 55-yard scoring that made it a 15-point margin again at 29-14. It held up, but not without a little late-game angst.

What it Means: To say Coach Billy Napier and his team needed a win like this would be a Century Tower-sized understatement. It doesn't mean the pressure is off, not even close -- and not with the schedule the Gators are staring down (read on) -- but the team and fan base has a week to feel better about itself. Last year demonstrated that Napier's players have his back. They do not quit. The Gators showed more of the same against the Longhorns, in improving to 3-9 under Napier against teams ranked in the top 10.

In the Spotlight: Take a wild guess. Wilson's catches, yards and touchdowns were all single-game records for a UF freshman receiver playing in his first collegiate game. Think about that relative to the superstar wideouts who have come through this program over the years.

Staggering Statistic: For Longhorns coach Steve Sarkisian, the loss was his first in 18 games at UT when his team was ranked in the top 10 and facing an unranked opponent. Worth noting, Florida lost 49-17 at Texas last season, a game they trailed at one point 42-0.

Up Next: Florida (2-3, 1-1) gets to enjoy this one for ... oh ... about 20 minutes, then must begin preparations for next week's road date at No. 6 Texas A&M (4-0, 1-0), making for a fourth top-10 opponent in the Gators' first six games of the season (with more on the way). The Aggies, who were home against Mississippi State late Saturday night, whipped the Gators 33-20 in Gainesville last season.

Scott Carter's Quick Slant

WHAT HAPPENED: What began as an offensive shootout between Florida and Texas A&M at Kyle Field turned into an all-too-familiar result for the Gators: another road loss. The Gators remained winless away from The Swamp, losing 34-17 to the host Aggies on Saturday night. Florida (2-4, 1-2 SEC) dropped to 0-3 away from Ben Hill Griffin Stadium in losing for the second consecutive season to Texas A&M. The fifth-ranked Aggies (6-0, 3-0) iced their sixth consecutive victory with a 12-play, 53-yard drive in the fourth quarter to extend their lead to 31-17 with 4:39 remaining. Texas A&M running back Rueben Owens II capped the 8-plus-minute drive with a 2-yard touchdown run. The Aggies gained possession after stopping the Gators on downs. With UF trailing 24-17 and facing a fourth-and-6 from the Aggies' 49, Florida head coach Billy Napier opted to go for it. Quarterback DJ Lagway's pass to Vernell Brown III dropped incomplete, and Texas A&M took over and proceeded to march down the field. Lagway finished 21 of 37 for 245 yards and two touchdowns. "We were right there. We had our opportunities," Napier said. "We just have to make plays. We've got to stay the course, and we're going to have opportunities to play better moving forward. Offensively, we started fast and then settled in on defense. In general, we didn't sack their guy, and we struggled to protect DJ at times. Once we settled in on defense, I thought the effort was there. Our kids battled their ass off." Meanwhile, the teams traded punches early as Florida (157) and Texas A&M (196) combined for 353 yards in a back-and-forth first quarter, which ended in a 14-14 tie. Florida averaged 9.1 yards per play in the opening quarter, Texas A&M 13.1. The offensive fireworks flamed out over the next two quarters as the defenses caught up and surrendered only 244 yards (Florida 101, Texas A&M 143) over the second and third quarters. Still, the game was within reach for the Gators when safety Jordan Castell picked off Aggies quarterback Marcel Reed in the end zone on the first play of the fourth quarter. Lagway hit J. Michael Sturdivant for 27 yards on the next play to move Florida near midfield. But four plays later, the drive stalled and the Gators turned it over on downs, sparking a roar from the announced crowd of 105,086. The teams traded field goals in the third quarter. Texas A&M stretched the lead to 24-14 with 10:42 left in the third quarter on a 26-yard field goal by Randy Bond. The Aggies gained possession at UF's 29-yard line when linebacker Daymion Sanford forced Brown III to fumble, which was recovered by Aggies linebacker Taurean York. Five plays later, Bond split the uprights for Texas A&M's largest lead of the game at that point. The Gators answered with a nine-play, 47-yard drive that ended with a 45-yard field goal by Trey Smack to make it 24-17. The field goal was the 44th of Smack's career, moving him into fourth place in school history. The Gators struck first when Lagway led them on an eight-play, 75-yard drive on the opening possession. Lagway finished the drive with a 1-yard scoring throw to tight end Amir Jackson. It was Jackson's first career touchdown. The Aggies responded with scoring drives of 75, 81 and 75 yards on their first three possessions. Reed scored on an 8-yard run to make it 7-7, and after the Aggies forced a punt, Reed connected with Jamarion Morrow for a 22-yard touchdown. The Gators answered with Lagway's 6-yard touchdown pass to freshman receiver Dallas Wilson, but Florida's defense had no answer for the Aggies early. Texas A&M drove 75 yards on 11 plays, taking a 21-14 lead on a 22-yard touchdown run by Ja'Veon Moss, who left the game with an injury later in the first half. Reed finished 16 of 26 for 234 yards and added 37 yards rushing. "We're close, but close is not good enough," linebacker Myles Graham said. "We're right there, but we have to be better."

What it Means: For now, another week on the seesaw for the Gators, who, after upsetting No. 9 Texas at home last week to snap a three-game losing streak, could not sustain the momentum of a feel-good victory. The Gators sit with four losses in six games at midseason after starting the campaign ranked No. 15 in the AP Top 25.

In the Spotlight: The return home for Lagway, who grew up about 65 miles away from Kyle Field in Willis, Texas, started fast and furious as he threw two touchdowns on Florida's first three drives. However, the offense stalled as the Aggies turned up the pressure on Lagway, who was sacked three times.

Staggering Statistic: The Gators played hard and responded to some early shots from the Aggies, but they could not overcome their inability to beat a ranked team on the road on Napier's watch. Florida dropped to 0-14 in games away from Ben Hill Griffin Stadium against ranked opponents, including losses at LSU, Miami and Texas A&M this season. They dropped to 0-10 in true road games vs. ranked teams under Napier.

Up Next: The Gators return home to face Mississippi State (4-2, 0-2) on Homecoming at The Swamp. The Bulldogs were off Saturday after losing a week ago to Texas A&M, 31-9, at Kyle Field. The good news for the Gators is that, unlike their last four opponents, the Bulldogs are not ranked in the top 10.

WEEK 8: HONORARY MR. TWO BITS

THE LEGEND OF MR. TWO BITS

It all started in 1949 at Florida Field, when George Edmondson looked at the crowd around him as the Gators were playing The Citadel. Fans were booing the team and George would not stand for it. He jumped up and got the fans cheering, and so began the legend of Mr. Two Bits.

For 60 years, Gators fans from all across the world became eternally grateful for the man who started every Gators home football game with the phrase “Two-Bits, Four-Bits, Six-Bits, a Dollar. All for the Gators, Stand Up and holler!” George Edmondson led the cheer in his trademark yellow shirt with an orange and blue tie from 1949 until retiring from the role at the end of the 2008 season. Coincidentally, Florida’s home finale that season came against The Citadel, providing a unique symmetry to Edmondson’s decades of leading Florida fans in the Mr. Two Bits cheer.

Upon his retirement, Florida mascots Albert and Alberta continued the pregame Two Bits tradition until 2013 when UF began inviting celebrities to perform the role. Errict Rhett was the first honorary Mr. Two Bits, and multiple Gator Greats have gone on to fill that role since.

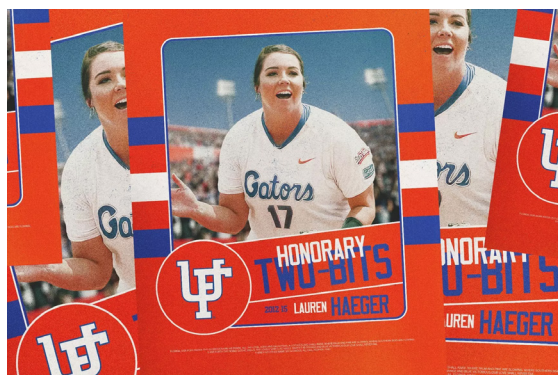


THIS WEEK’S HONORARY MS. TWO BITS IS...

GAINESVILLE, Fla. – Lauren Haeger was kicked back on her couch in North Carolina last week when Tim Walton, her softball coach from her days as a Florida All American, buzzed her cell phone. Her initial thought was, “Uh oh, what happened?” but Walton eased those concerns fairly quickly.

Haeger, a member of the UF Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2025 that will be inducted Friday night, was told she may want to reconfigure her already jam-packed social/partying calendar this weekend.



“I figured he was going to ask me to talk to the team or something,” Haeger said.

Nope. Instead, Walton extended an offer to be the celebrity “Mr. Two Bits” when the Gators (2-4, 1-2) take on Mississippi State (4-2, 0-2) in their homecoming game Saturday at Spurrier/Florida Field.

Haeger, now 33 and a decade removed from leading UF to the second of two straight Women’s College World Series championships, had to pick herself off the floor before breaking into tears of joy.

“Out of all the Hall of Fame inductees, they asked me, so I couldn’t believe it,” she said. “It may be the coolest thing I have ever been asked to do. I may black out in front of the whole stadium.”

Not likely. Haeger, after all, stood tall in the most pressure-packed moments of her athletic career. Plus, she’s been lobbying for this opportunity for a long time. She recalls tweeting about wanting to wear the George Edmondson get-up and do the chant in both 2017 and again in ‘21.

Now, she’ll become just the fourth softball player to get the nod, joining Stacey Nelson and Hannah Rogers, who tandemly did it in 2015, and Aubree Munro, who was part of a group cheer along with fellow 2021 USA Olympians with UF ties that same year.

“It’s one thing to be asked to throw out a first pitch,” said Haeger, who now tutors softball to young players in Charlotte. “But this is amazing.”

So was Haeger, the player, whose career statistics as both hitter and pitcher would be more than enough to define her Gator greatness. But even her loftiest numbers are no match for the fact she is one of only two athletes — male or female, amateur or professional — to play a bat and ball sport and club at least 60 home runs as a hitter and win at least 60 games as a pitcher. Two. Ever. The other is Babe Ruth.

Haeger smashed 71 homers and won 73 games during her four stellar UF seasons, the final two ending with WCWS titles. Walton called on Haeger to start Game 2 in the 2014 title series against Alabama. Haeger was the pitcher of record in a 6-3 victory, with Rogers coming in late to get the save.

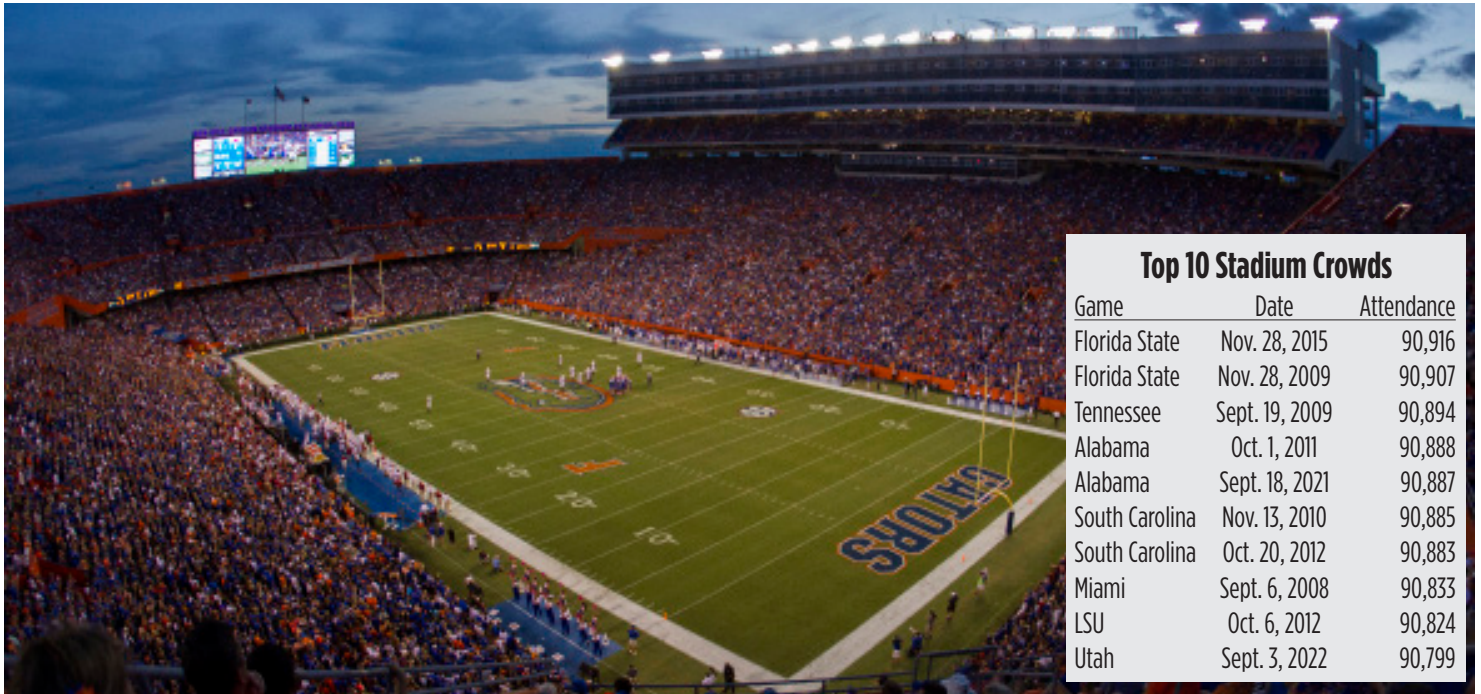
Her senior season was one of the greatest ever by a collegian, and also ended with a dog pile in Oklahoma City. Haeger, crowned 2015 NCAA Player of the Year and SEC Female Athlete of the Year, went a sparkling 32-2 in the circle, including a program-record 24 consecutive victories, to go with a career-low 1.58 ERA. In the NCAA Tournament, Haeger went 8-1 in the circle and hit .433 with 19 RBI and four homers, and was the winning pitcher in both games of the Gators’ best-of-three championship series defeat of Michigan.

Haeger’s career as a Gator, simply put, was Ruthian.

Now comes an orange-and-blue exclamation point in her post-career. She’s watched a bunch of celebrity “Two Bits” videos to get the routine down, but doesn’t plan to put any softball spin on the routine. As Haeger put it, she’ll keep it “OG.” And that’ll work just fine.

“What a weekend it’s going to be,” she said.

June 9, 1992. Once The Gainesville Sun hit newstands that Tuesday, Ben Hill Griffin Stadium's fitting nickname came to life.

Steve Spurrier, entering season three as Gators head coach, called writer Mike Bianchi the day prior and pitched him the storyline. It was seven months after the Gators ended the 1991 regular season with consecutive wins over Kentucky (which clinched an undefeated SEC record and the first league title in school history) and a thrilling 14-9 defeat of No. 3 Florida State, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles. It also gave UF a perfect 12-0 home record under Spurrier.

"The 'Swamp' is where Gators live," Spurrier told Bianchi. "We feel comfortable there, but we hope our opponents feel tentative. A swamp is hot and sticky and can be dangerous."

Initially, the UF athletic department didn't embrace the nickname. No posters, bumper stickers or marketing campaigns were put together right away. But Spurrier continued to use it. Then he and then-UF communications director Norm Carlson did some research. Turns out, in 1930, UF President John J. Tigert selected the location for the school's football stadium and described the area as a "swampy depression." The school hired engineers to drain the area and install pipes that funneled water down the hill along North-South Drive and dumped it into what is now known as Graham Pond.

Needless to say, the nickname caught on, and Spurrier delivered the perfect quote for the athletic department to utilize once it eventually did embrace the moniker: "The 'Swamp' is a place where only Gators get out alive."
