WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- This will be the 122nd meeting in one of the nation's most-played rivalries ... Ole Miss holds a 66-49-6 edge on the field dating back to 1901, including a 24-15-3 mark in Starkville.
- This game will be the 98th "Battle of the Golden Egg" since the two schools started playing for the trophy in 1927 ... Ole Miss holds a 60-30-5 advantage in the "Egg Bowl."
- The Rebels are on their second-longest AP poll streak ever at 47 straight since 2023, trailing only 73 from 1957-63.
- The Rebels currently rank No. 7 in ESPN's Strength of Record metric and No. 13 in its Football Power Index.
- Ole Miss has 10 wins for only the 11th season all-time, the fourth in the last five years ... Head coach Lane Kiffin is the first in program history with three consecutive 10-win seasons.
- Ole Miss is 49-14 since 2021, third among all SEC schools in wins in that span.
- · Mississippi State (23.0) and Ole Miss (23.7) own the SEC's second and third-fastest offenses in the SEC, respectively.
- Ole Miss is tied for the FBS lead in 30-yard plays (39) and averages 16.8 plays of 10 yards or more per game.
- RB Kewan Lacy is one of three finalists for the Doak Walker Award, the first in Ole Miss football history ... Lacy is tied for the FBS lead at his Ole Miss single-season record 19 rushing TDs.
- Lacy leads the SEC in rushing attempts (231) and points scored (114) ... Lacy reset the Ole Miss single-season scoring record in points by a non-kicker, and he is 15 points shy of Caden Davis' overall record 129 from 2024.
- QB **Trinidad Chambliss** is averaging 335.7 yards of total offense since taking over as the starter in Week 3.
- LB Suntarine Perkins recently moved into ninth all-time at Ole Miss in career sacks (16.0).
- TE Dae'Quan Wright leads the FBS in yards per catch among tight ends (17.3).

A win would mark the first 11-win regular season in Ole Miss history and only the second 11-win campaign alongside 2023.

Average margin of victory in the Egg Bowl since 2019, with a minimum of one point (2019) and a maximum of 12 (2024).

RB Kewan Lacy's next rushing touchdown will make him one of 12 in SEC history with 20 rushing TDs in a single season.

PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS: Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season with head football coach Lane Kiffin. Select players will be also available on Tuesday. There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystems.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials.

PARKING: Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The SIB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes are digital and must be requested during credential application process.

MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS: All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SIB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

SIDELINE ACCESS: Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

VIDEO CONTENT: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of Ole Miss Athletics. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos. Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions.

RECRUITS: Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

RADIO RIGHTS: The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by Learfield in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. 
COREY ADAMS: 2006-2025

Adams, a member of the 2024-25 Ole Miss signing class, enrolled at Ole Miss early and participated in spring drills while earning Dean's Honor Roll accolades in the classroom. Adams, a native of New Orleans, was a unanimous three-star prospect coming out of Edna Karr High School and was rated as high as the No. 16 overall recruit in Louisiana.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST MISSISSIPPI STATE

11/29/24 • Oxford, Miss. • #14 Ole Miss 26, Miss. State 14 No. 14 Ole Miss football withstood a strong start by Mississippi State in a 26-14 victory at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in the annual Egg Bowl. The Bulldogs came out inspired in search of their first SEC win, taking a 14-10 lead through the first quarter, but the Rebels didn't allow a point the rest of the way to win the Battle for the Golden Egg for the second straight

year and fourth time in five seasons under head coach Lane Kiffin.

11/23/23 • Starkville, Miss. • #13 Ole Miss 17, Miss. State 10 Both defenses gave no quarter early on, but two key second-half scoring drives by the Rebel offense helped lift Ole Miss to a 17-7 victory over Mississippi State in a slugfest of an Egg Bowl. With both defenses in prime form, it came down to timing, and Ole Miss struck at the right moments with late touchdowns to Quinshon Judkins and Caden Prieskorn to push the Rebels over the top.

11/24/22 • Oxford, Miss. • Miss. State 24, #19 Ole Miss 22

Scoring was at a premium on a wet and cold Thanksgiving night,, with the Bulldogs coming out of Oxford with a ranked win. Ole Miss had a chance to tie with 1:25 to play after the second of Jaxson Dart's passing TDs, but the two-point try from Dart to Mingo fell short, giving State the victory.

11/25/21 • Starkville, Miss. • #9 Ole Miss 31, Miss. State 21 Ole Miss kept Mississippi State out of the end zone until 7:20 of the fourth quarter at Davis-Wade Stadium. By then, the Rebels held a commanding 24-6 lead and cruised to victory behind Snoop Conner's two rushing TDs.

11/28/20 • Oxford, Miss. • Ole Miss 31, Miss. State 24

Ole Miss started fast and did just enough defensively to top Mississippi State and bring the Golden Egg back to Oxford. Matt Corral threw for $385\,$ yards, 139 to Elijah Moore, as Ole Miss claimed an early lead and held on for four hard-fought quarters. Trailing a touchdown, the Bulldogs drove into Rebel territory on the final drive but ran out of time.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin, one of college football's preeminent offensive minds and well-known personalities, is in his sixth season in charge of the Ole Miss football program. Kiffin has led the Rebels to unprecedented heights during his tenure, which has included five consecutive bowl berths, including three wins and two New Year's Six appearances. Kiffin has tallied three 10-win seasons in Oxford, including Ole Miss' first-ever 11-win season. In 13 seasons at the NCAA level, Kiffin owns an all-time record of 115-53, including a 54-19 mark with the Rebels. Kiffin came to Ole Miss from Florida Atlantic, where he turned around an FAU program that won nine games over the previous three seasons with two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

MISSISSIPPI STATE HEAD COACH JEFF LEBBY

Jeff Lebby is in his second season at Mississippi State and holds a 7-16 record during his stint in Starkville. Prior to MSU, Lebby spent one season as offensive coordinator at Oklahoma. His 2023 unit with the Sooners scored an FBS-best 65+ points three times and ranked No. 4 nationally in scoring offense (41.7 ppg). Lebby is no stranger to the Southeastern Conference, having spent two seasons in Oxford directing the Ole Miss offense and coaching quarterbacks. Under his direction, the offense led the SEC in total offense in 2020 and again in 2021, twice earning him semifinalist honors for the Broyles Award. Prior to Ole Miss, Lebby spent two seasons at UCF. He coached the quarterbacks in 2018 before being elevated to offensive coordinator in 2019. Lebby served as running back coach at Baylor from 2012-16, as well as the passing game coordinator and offensive recruiting coordinator in 2015 and 2016 for the Bears. A 2007 graduate of Oklahoma, Lebby was a four-year student assistant for the football program.

BULLDOG SCOUTING REPORT

Mississippi State comes into the 2025 Egg Bowl 5-6 overall and 1-6 in SEC play. Offensively, the Bulldogs are averaging 394.6 yards per game, with 241 yards through the air. Blake Shapen serves as the primary signal-caller for the Bulldog offense. Shapen is completing 64 percent of his passes for 2,431 yards and 15 touchdowns. Fluff Bothwell and Davon Booth provide a one-two punch at running back for the Bulldogs. Bothwell has rushed for 559 yards and six touchdowns on the season, while Booth has tallied 546 rushing yards with seven TDs. Brenen Thompson is second in the SEC in receiving yards per game (78.9 ypg) and fourth in receiving TDs (6). Anthony Evans Ill's 5.7 receptions per game ranks 17th in the FBS. Defensively, the Bulldogs are allowing 28 points and just under 395 yards per game. Mississippi State leads the SEC and ranks No. 19 in FBS with 12 interceptions. Jahron Manning, a transfer from Old Dominion, leads Mississippi State with 76 total tackles on the season.

OLE MISS-MISSISSIPPI STATE SERIES HISTORY

- This game will be the 122nd meeting of one of the nation's most-played rivalries.
- On the field, Ole Miss holds a 66-49-6 advantage dating back to 1901, including a 24-15-3 mark in Starkville.
- In Oxford, Ole Miss leads 25-14-3 on the field (23-14-3 after NCAA vacated wins).
- After vacated wins, the series stands at 66-47-6 in favor of Ole Miss... The Rebels had wins in 2012 & 2014 vacated due to NCAA ruling, while Mississippi State forfeited wins in 1976 & 1977.
- This game will be the 98th "Battle of the Golden Egg," as the two schools started playing for the trophy in 1927 ... Ole Miss holds a 60-30-5 advantage in the "Egg Bowl."
- This marks the second time in a row the Egg Bowl hasn't been on Thanksgiving, and will be only the sixth time the two schools have met on a Friday ... State leads 3-2 all-time on Friday, while the Thanksgiving record is 17-14-1 in favor of Ole Miss (11-4 in Starkville).
- The Rebels own the four longest separate winning streaks in the series (nine, six, six and five games).
- Including a pair of forfeited victories, Ole Miss posted a 38-7-2 record versus MSU from 1944-1990.
- From 1947-1963, the Rebels posted a 15-0-2 mark against MSU ... That means a child born in December 1946 was a senior in high school before they saw Ole Miss lose to the Bulldogs.
- From 2004-2014, the home team won all but two games ... Since then, the road team has won six of the last 10.



THE START OF THE GOLDEN EGG

The Golden Egg was first proposed by members of Sigma lota, an Ole Miss honorary society in 1927. Sigma lota proposed that a trophy be awarded in a dignified ceremony designed to calm excited fans, after Ole Miss fans stormed the field at Starkville's Scott Field following the Rebels' 7-6 win in the 1926 contest. The 1926 win snapped a 13-game losing streak to then-Mississippi A&M, and was just Ole Miss' fifth win in 23 tries. Following the game, Ole Miss fans made a dash for the goal posts, while Aggie fans took after them with cane bottom chairs and fights broke out. The mayhem continued until most of the chairs were splintered. After Sigma lota made its proposal, Mississippi A&M approved the suggestion, and Ole Miss, two weeks before the game, officially added its approval. The trophy, to be called "The Golden Egg," would be a regulation-size gold-plated football mounted on a pedestal. The cost of the \$250 trophy was split between both schools. On Thanksgiving Day, 1927, the first "Battle of the Golden Egg" was waged before a crowd of 14,000 in Oxford. The Rebels won 20-12 and the symbol of supremacy in the series was born.

ORIGINS OF THE NAME

The term "Egg Bowl" can be traced back to 1978, when Executive Sports Editor of The Clarion-Ledger Tom Patterson decided to spice up the 1978 meeting. A year earlier, the Clarion-Ledger headline on game day had been "Egg Bowl Is Up For Scramble." With the Rebels and the Bulldogs 6-4 and both apparently out of the bowl picture heading into the 1978 game, Patterson instructed his staff to follow the "Egg Bowl" theme throughout the week. The result was a special section on Sunday, which recounted in great detail the Rebels' stunning 27-7 victory. While the game is still officially the "Battle of the Golden Egg," most members of the media now refer to the annual game simply as the "Egg Bowl."

FRIDAY NIGHT FIGHT

The Egg Bowl and Thanksgiving have become synonymous, with the rivalry being held 32 times on the holiday -- including six of the last eight. But both the 2024 meeting and this fall's contest fall on a Friday, with this year's constituting only the sixth time in 122 contests. Prior Friday meetings for the Egg Bowl were in 1916 (L, 36-0), 1921 (L, 27-7), 2007 (L, 17-14), 2008 (W, 45-0) and 2024 (W, 26-14). However, this will only be the fourth true Battle for the Golden Egg held on a Friday, as the 1916 and 1921 meetings were before the trophy was introduced in 1927.

OLE MISS IN THE PLAYOFF ERA

Ole Miss came in at No. 6 in the first College Football Playoff committee rankings for 2025, its second-highest CFP ranking ever behind a No. 4 slot in the very first CFP release in 2014. In the playoff era since 2014, Ole Miss has appeared in the first CFP rankings seven times with an average opening slot of 11.6. The Rebels have finished within the CFP top-25 five times, including four times within the top-12 during the four-team playoff era from 2014-23.

CUSP OF HISTORY

At 10-1, Ole Miss has crossed the 10-win threshold for only the 11th time in program history -- the fourth under head coach Lane Kiffin in the last five seasons. Kiffin is the first coach in program history to win 10 games in three consecutive seasons, and this fourth double-digit year ties him with John Vaught for the most such seasons in Ole Miss history. Under Kiffin, Ole Miss has broken 10 wins in 2021 (10-3), 2023 (11-2), 2024 (10-3) and now 2025 (10-1), with 2021, '23 and '25 registering as the first 10-win regular seasons ever at Ole Miss. In 2023, Kiffin's Rebels went one step further in notching the first 11-win campaign in program history, and a win Friday in the Egg Bowl would make 2025 the first 11-win regular season ever by a Rebel squad. The 2025 campaign also marked the first eight-win home season ever at Ole Miss, which follows the first two seven-win home seasons in 2021 and 2023.

HIGH-FLYING OFFENSE

In the Lane Kiffin era, the Rebel offense ranks as the most prolific in the nation, leading the FBS in both yards per game since the beginning of the 2020 season (502.6), as well as total yards (36,690) despite playing six fewer games than Alabama (35,977) and Georgia (35,762). Ole Miss is also the lone school nationally to rank top-six since 2020 in both passing (3rd, 298.2 ypg) and rushing (6th, 204.4 ypg).

RACKING UP THE YARDS

Lane Kiffin's dynamic Ole Miss offenses have single-handedly dismantled the Rebel record books, recording four of the top-five and six of the top-10 offensive seasons in school history. Kiffin owns 29 games during his Ole Miss tenure with at least 600 yards of total offense, as opposed to just 19 times total from the beginning of the Ole Miss football program in 1893 until Kiffin's arrival in 2020. At the 700-yard plateau, Kiffin's Rebels own five of the seven total 700-yard games in Ole Miss history, as well as eight of the top-10 performances all-time.

GROUND GAME

Sophomore **Kewan Lacy** has been brilliant as Ole Miss' top rusher, stamping his name all over the Rebel record book and ranking near at or near the top of several national categories. Lacy's three touchdown performance against Florida on Nov. 15 gave him 19 rushing scores on the year, which not only ties for the current FBS lead but gave him both the Ole Miss single-season rushing TD record and all-purpose TD record. Lacy's season ranks highly in other categories as well, as he also leads the SEC in rushing attempts (231; FBS No. 3) and points scored (114), with the latter ranking as the most Ole Miss single-season history by a non-kicker. At his current pace of 21.0 attempts, 103.3 yards and 1.7 scores per game, Lacy is on pace for 252 rushes for 1,239 yards and 20 touchdowns by the end of the regular season. Entering the season, Lacy had just 104 yards on 23 carries in six games played at Missouri in 2024.

RB **Kewan Lacy**'s 19 rushing scores not only shattered the Ole Miss single-season record, but it also has the sophomore Rebel on the cusp of the all-time SEC top-10 list. Lacy's next rushing touchdown will tie him for ninth on the SEC season lists with Auburn QB and 2010 Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, Arkansas running back Alex Collins (2015) and Alabama QB Jalen Milroe (2024). Alabama RB and 2015 Heisman winner Derrick Henry holds the record at 28.

POWERFUL PERFORMANCE

RB **Kewan Lacy**'s 224-yard, three-touchdown outing against Florida ranks as the eighth-best rushing performance in Ole Miss history, only the 15th 200-yard game ever by a Rebel and the best by an Ole Miss rusher since 2010. Lacy's day against the Gators ranks as one of only four 200-yard games with at least three rushing touchdowns behind Dexter McCluster vs. Tennessee in 2009 (282 yards, 4 TD), Kayo Dottley vs. Chattanooga in 1949 (235 yards, 3 TD) and John Rhys Plumlee vs. LSU in 2019 (212 yards, 4 TD). Additionally, Lacy is only the fifth Rebel to rush for 200 yards and not lose a single yard all game. This season, Lacy's monster game vs. Florida currently ranks third-best among all SEC rushers and is one of only 20 performances of at least 200 rushing yards.

Among other PFF metrics, Lacy leads all SEC running backs in total snaps played (329; FBS No. 2), and of his 1,136 total rushing yards, PFF estimates 809 have come after contact (No. 2 SEC, No. 4 FBS). QB **Trinidad Chambliss** came to Ole Miss this offseason from Division II Ferris State, where he led the Bulldogs to a 14-1 campaign and a national title in 2024. Chambliss has helped push Ole Miss to its current 10-1 record and its No. 6 national ranking, which is thanks in large part to the Rebels owning the SEC's No. 1 total offense (493.8 ypg; FBS No. 3), No. 2 passing offense (305.1 ypg; FBS No. 5) and No. 4 scoring offense (37.2 ppg; FBS No. 13).

THE PRICE IS WRIGHT

In less than two seasons with the Rebels, TE Dae'Quan Wright is marching up several all-time Ole Miss lists among tight ends. With the Rebels, Wright owns a career line of 55 catches for 879 yards and eight touchdowns, and in his overall career when including his first two seasons at Virginia Tech he has 102 receptions for 1,453 yards and those eight scores with Ole Miss. This season, Wright leads all tight ends nationally in yards per catch (17.3).

DEFENSIVE NOTES

The Rebel defensive unit has been crucial to Ole Miss' success with timely big plays and big stops.

- · Ole Miss ranks top-30 nationally in passing defense (22nd, 183.0 ypg), scoring defense (29th, 20.2 ppg) and total defense (30th, 323.4 ypg).
- In November, Ole Miss is allowing just 220.7 total yards (140.3 passing, 80.3 rushing) and 12.7 points per game.
- Ole Miss has only allowed one 300-yard passer this season (Arkansas' Taylen Green, 305).
- Ole Miss shutout The Citadel, marking the first back-to-back seasons with at least one shutout since 2007-08.
- The Rebels stuffed The Citadel to 106 total yards, the fewest by any Rebel opponent since Memphis in 2014 (104).
- Ole Miss has 30 tackles for loss across its last four games, contrasted to 28 total in seven games prior.
- Likewise, the Rebels have 12 sacks across their last four games out of 22 total on the season.
- Ole Miss held The Citadel to 23 passing yards, the fewest by a Rebel team since allowing 21 against The Citadel on Oct. 8, 2005.
- LB Princewill Umanmielen leads Ole Miss with 9.0 TFL and 5.5 sacks.
- LB TJ Dottery leads all Rebels with 68 tackles ... Dottery is Ole Miss' top returning tackler from 2024 (76).
- DE Kam Franklin leads the team with an impressive 14 QB hurries on the season ... Franklin also ranks third on the team in tackles (50), TFL (6.5) and sacks (3.5).

KING OF SWAT

Senior DT Zxavian Harris has been a wrecking ball on special teams his entire career, and after another blocked kick against Georgia State in the opener, he stands on the edge of history as one of the best kick blockers in SEC history. Harris, who had a superb game with 1.5 TFL, 1.0 sack, two QB hurries and his first career interception, got a finger on the Panthers' field goal try during the first guarter -- his sixth career blocked kick across PATs and field goals. One more ties him with Kentucky's Lonnell Dewalt (2004) and Matt Roark (2008-11), who each set the SEC record at seven blocks.

CARNEIRO FROM DOWNTOWN

Kicker and Lou Groza Award semifinalist Lucas Carneiro currently ranks among the most prolific kickers nationally this season, ranking sixth in field goals made (21), sixth in scoring (106) and 12th in field goal percentage (91.3). Carneiro's 106 points, which lead the SEC among all kickers this year, ranks sixth on the Ole Miss single-season scoring list among kickers, as well as seventh among all scorers. Across his career, Carneiro owns a career line of 48-of-54 (88.9 percent) and a perfect 131-of-131 mark on PATs -- which makes him one of only 10 active FBS kickers to have never missed with at least 100 attempts. But it's from distance where Carneiro really shines, holding a career 11-of-13 mark from 40-49 yards and a 7-of-8 line from 50 yards out -- including a 54-yarder vs. Tulane that tied his career long and for sixth-longest in Ole Miss history.

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin, one of college football's preeminent offensive minds and well-known personalities, is in his sixth season in charge of the Ole Miss football program in 2025.

Kiffin has led the Rebels to unprecedented heights during his tenure, which has included five consecutive bowl berths (including three wins and two New Year's Six appearances), three 10-win seasons (including the first ever 11-win season and the first two 10-win regular seasons in program history), and several of the most statistically significant campaigns in the storied past of Ole Miss football.

Kiffin's Rebel teams have broken into the national top-10 in at least one poll in each of the last four seasons since 2021, the first streak at Ole Miss since John Vaught's hallowed teams from 1961-64. In that same stretch since 2021, Kiffin has won 49 games, which ranks third among all SEC schools behind Georgia and Alabama, and includes a superb 35-3 home record. Since 2023 alone, Kiffin's teams are 21-1 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Kiffin's well-renown prowess on the recruiting trail and in the transfer portal has helped transform Ole Miss into perennial contenders and a hot commodity on the transfer market. The "Portal King" has welcomed in four straight top-six transfer classes according to 247Sports -- including the No. 1 ranked class in 2024 -- as well as five-straight top-25 high school classes per On3.

In 14 seasons at the NCAA level, Kiffin owns an all-time record of 115-53 — including a 54-19 mark with the Rebels. Kiffin's 54 wins has him third in Ole Miss history, and he became the fastest in program history to 50 wins — doing so in 68 games, four fewer than Vaught. Kiffin (.740) and Vaught (.745) rank as the lone Rebel coaches all-time to have a win percentage of at least .700 (in at least 30 games coached).

Kiffin led the Rebels to a 10-3 mark and a dominant 52-20 Gator Bowl victory over Duke in 2024, marking the first consecutive 10-win campaigns at Ole Miss since 1959-60. The Rebels shattered program records in total yards (6,845), yards per play (7.3), passing yards (4,561), passing yards per game (350.8), sacks (52) and tackles for loss (120), as Ole Miss possessed one of the most dynamic passing attacks in the nation in addition to one of the most powerful rush defenses and pass rush capabilities in the FBS.

The 2024 campaign was simultaneously highlighted by the end of the incredible career of eventual first-round NFL Draft pick quarterback Jaxson Dart, who led the nation in total offense while dismantling several all-time Rebel records, and the stifling Ole Miss defense, which led the nation in both sacks and TFL alongside the best Rebel rush defense since 1966. Defensive tackle Walter Nolen led that defense, ending up as the 14th consensus All-American in program history and the first Rebel selected in the 2025 NFL Draft -- one of a seven-round era record eight Ole Miss draftees taken.

Kiffin's marquee win of the 2024 season was a 28-10 victory over No. 2 Georgia, the highest ranked win for the Rebels since 2015 and the first top-five win and highest ranked win in Oxford since 2014. The 2024 Rebels were the first non-Alabama team to best Georgia since Florida in 2020, and it stands as the largest top-five win by an Ole Miss team since Archie Manning led the Rebels to a 38-0 victory over No. 3 Tennessee in 1969.

Kiffin led the 2023 Rebels to the best season in Ole Miss history in terms of wins, notching an 11-2 overall record capped by a 38-25 Peach Bowl victory over Penn State. Kiffin owns the only two 10-win regular seasons in Ole Miss history, and alongside legendary coach John Vaught, is one of two Rebel coaches with multiple 10-win seasons.

Ole Miss succeeded in 2023 with a balanced attack, finishing within the top-15 in the final FBS ranks in yards per completion (10th, 14.5), passing efficiency (12th, 162.9) and total offense (13th, 461.9), while also leading the nation in fewest turnovers (7) and leading the SEC and ranking fifth nationally in turnover margin (+11). The Rebels finished the year ranked No. 9 in both the AP and Coaches polls, only the second final top-10 ranking by an Ole Miss team since 1969.

The Rebels once again ranked among the top of the nation in multiple offensive statistics in 2022. Ole Miss was No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4). Kiffin helped mentor and recruit talented true freshman running back Quinshon Judkins. Judkins set the Ole Miss single-season record in both rushing yards (1,567) and rushing touchdowns (16).

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history that included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, their highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg). The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer points per game compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. Wide receiver Elijah Moore and quarterback Matt Corral were two of the main cogs in the Rebels' high-powered offense.

Moore earned first-team consensus All-America accolades after a historic and shortened 2020 junior season. The Fort Lauderdale, Florida, native hauled in a school record 86 receptions for 1,193 yards and eight touchdowns during his last season in a Rebel uniform. Moore, a Biletnikoff finalist, led the country in receiving yards per game (149.1) and receptions per game (10.8).

Corral became just the fourth SEC player ever to finish as the NCAA leader in total offense per game (384.9), joining Pat Sullivan (1970), Rex Grossman (2001) and Johnny Manziel (2012). The signal-caller also finished No. 5 in passing yards per game (333.7), No. 7 in passing TDs (29), No. 9 in passing efficiency (177.6) and No. 11 in passing yards per completion (14.5).

The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set last season during the Tigers' run to a national title.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first seasons at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3.

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and guarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranked as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying and then developing guarterback Blake Sims in 2014. Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

OXFORD, Miss. — No. 15 Ole Miss football overcame a couple of early miscues to turn in a dominant 63-7 victory over Georgia State to open its 2025 season on Saturday night at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The Georgia State pass rush caused a pair of early interceptions to keep the game close in the opening half, but Ole Miss kept its foot on the gas to come away with a decisive win to start 1-0 for the fifth straight season. The Rebels became the first team in SEC history to score 60-plus points in three consecutive season-openers.

Lane Kiffin's squad outgained Georgia State 695-260, including a 400-69 advantage through the air. Ole Miss totaled 33 first downs in the victory, including an 8-for-13 mark on third downs, while the Rebel defense held Georgia State to 2-for-15 on third downs.

Austin Simmons finished 20-for-31 for 341 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions in his first career start. Harrison Wallace III led the receiving corps with 130 yards and a touchdown on five catches, while tight ends Dae'Quan Wright and Caleb Odom each scored, combining for eight catches and 135 yards. Kewan Lacy broke the century mark on the ground and found the end zone three times in his Rebel debut, going 108 yards on 16 carries.

TJ Dottery led the Rebel defense with nine tackles, including a shared tackle for loss, and broke up one pass. Zxavian Harris had a monster day, totaling five tackles, including a sack, with an interception and two pass breakups. Jaden Yates finished second behind Dottery with eight tackles in his Rebel debut.

OXFORD, Miss. — A game that began with a wild flurry of offense ended with a crucial defensive play as No. 13 Ole Miss football held off an Arkansas comeback attempt to win 41-35 and improve to 2-0 in SEC play just three weeks into the 2025 college football season.

The two SEC rivals combined for nine straight scoring drives in the first half, 997 yards of total offense and 53 first downs. But the shootout came down to a defensive stop in the end as TJ Dottery forced a fumble in the final minutes to halt the Razorback comeback.

Special teams proved to be crucial as well, as Ole Miss kicker Lucas Carneiro finished 2-for-2 on field goal attempts, while Arkansas was 0-for-2, ultimately spelling the difference in a six-point game.

Trinidad Chambliss was outstanding in his first Ole Miss start, going 21-for-29 passing with 415 total yards and three touchdowns. Harrison Wallace III once again led the receiving corps with six catches for 92 yards and a touchdown, just eight yards shy of his third straight 100-yard game to start the season. Kewan Lacy had a strong day out of the backfield with 84 all-purpose yards and a rushing touchdown.

Suntarine Perkins led the Ole Miss defense with nine tackles on the night, including one for a loss, as well as one QB hurry. TJ Dottery tallied eight tackles, broke up one pass and forced a fumble. Wydett Williams Jr. recovered that fumble and broke up a pass in addition to six tackles. Zxavian Harris notched five total tackles, including one for a loss and added a pass breakup. Will Echoles had a team-high two QB hurries to go with four tackles.

OXFORD, Miss. — A high-powered offensive attack paired with a stagnate defense guided No. 11 Ole Miss to a dominant 45-10 win on Saturday afternoon to improve to 4-0 for the second year in a row.

The Rebels dropped 548 offensive yards on the Green Wave, who only mustered 282 against a defense on fire. Tulane became the second team this season to not surpass the 300-yard plateau against Ole Miss, joining Georgia State. Two Tulane quarterbacks combined for only 104 yards on 10-for-29 passing as they struggled to find a rhythm with their receivers. Tulane went 0-for-3 on fourth down attempts, all halting momentum for the Green Wave and setting up Ole Miss for good field position.

Trinidad Chambliss once again shined behind center, going 17-for-27 with a pair of touch-downs. He eclipsed 400 yards of total offense for the second week in a row with 307 yards in the air and 112 on the ground. Chambliss became just the fourth Ole Miss QB ever to have 300 yards passing and 100 yards rushing in a single game. Deuce Alexander paced the Rebel receivers with four receptions for 94 yards, an overall career-high for the sophomore. His fourth quarter touchdown was his first in an Ole Miss uniform and effectively put the game away for the Rebels.

Kewan Lacy reached the endzone twice for the Rebels, his second multi-touchdown career game of the season as he increased his season total to seven through four games.

Linebacker Jaden Yates became the first Rebel defender this season to reach double-digit tackles in a game this season. His 11 tackles led Ole Miss' dominant defense, which had five tackles for loss in the game. Will Echoles had a career-high eight tackles and had an impressive pass breakup in the first quarter for the first of his career.

GAME FIVE #11 OLE MISS 24, #4 LSU 19

OXFORD, Miss. — In front of a packed Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, No. 11 Ole Miss football bested No. 4 LSU with a 24-19 victory, becoming 5-0 for the first time since 2022 in the process.

Ole Miss' stout defense headlined the days efforts by stifling and frustrating LSU on nearly every possession. The Rebels shutdown the Tiger offense for 254 yards, nearly 100 less yards than LSU's yearly average thus far, while holding the Tigers to 2-for-11 on third downs. Entering the game, Offensively, the Rebels dropped 480 total yards on the Tigers, the most they've allowed this season.

Ole Miss' win served as the 16th all-time top-5 win in program history and the sixth at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

For the third game in a row, Trinidad Chambliss passed for over 300 yards, reaching 314 and tallying a touchdown in the air. He became the first Ole Miss quarterback to surpass 300 yards of total offense in each of his first three Ole Miss starts since Jordan Ta'amu in 2017. With his performance, he surpassed 4,000 passing yards for his overall collegiate career.

Chambliss also added 71 rushing yards for the Rebels, with Kewan Lacy reaching 87 on the ground. His primary target today, Cayden Lee, had a team-leading four catches for 70 yards and reached the endzone for the first time this season.

Linebacker Suntarine Perkins paced Ole Miss with seven total tackles, three of which being solo. It's the second time in three games that Perkins led Ole Miss defensively. Kam Franklin and Will Echoles headlined Ole Miss' defensive front, each accounting for at least one tackle for loss and five tackles each, with Echoles recording a sack.

Wydett Williams Jr. secured his first interception as a Rebel during the second quarter, perfectly reading the ball to put Ole Miss' offense in scoring position.

OXFORD, Miss. — No. 4 Ole Miss football celebrated its 98th Homecoming game in Oxford with a gritty 24-21 win over non-conference foe Washington State on Saturday afternoon.

The Rebels are now 74-17-2 all-time in Homecoming games since 1924, and by besting the Cougars, Ole Miss is now undefeated through six games for the first time since 2022.

The difference in the matchup came on third downs, where Washington State struggled to convert all game. The Cougars went 2-for-10 on third downs for a 20 percent clip. Ole Miss has allowed a 34.8 percent conversion rate on third downs this season.

With the win, head coach Lane Kiffin became the fastest coach in Ole Miss history to 50 wins, needing just 68 games. Kiffin (50-18) broke 50 wins six games faster than John Vaught (50-19-5) and 26 games faster than Billy Brewer (50-51-3), the lone other Rebel coaches to cross the 50-win barrier. Under Kiffin, the Rebels are now 22-2 in non-conference action, and an undefeated 19-0 in regular season action.

Trinidad Chambliss went 20-for-29 through the air and accounted for three total touchdowns on the day. Dae'Quan Wright continued to etch his name further into Ole Miss' record book by catching his seventh touchdown as a Rebel. Wright, who finished the day with four catches for 80 yards on top of his score, is now tied with Don Williams for the sixth most touchdown receptions among Rebel tight ends in program history. On the ground, Kewan Lacy averaged 5.9 yards per carry for a total of 142 rushing yards for the day.

TJ Dottery, Wydett Williams Jr., Kam Franklin and Tahj Chambers paced the Rebel defense with six tackles apiece. Six total Rebels recorded at least five tackles, including Franklin, who recorded 1.5 sacks. Franklin paced the team in that category, with Princewill Umanmielen and Will Echoles recording one each as well. Ole Miss finished with four sacks on the day, which is a season-high for the team.

ATHENS, Ga. - The game saw seven lead changes and 78 combined points, but the No. 5 Ole Miss Rebels couldn't hold off a late charge from the No. 7 Georgia Bulldogs, falling 43-35 between the hedges on Saturday afternoon.

The Rebels and Bulldogs were in bitter competition for much of the game, as every drive until the late fourth resulted in either a Georgia or Ole Miss score. But the Bulldog defense figured it out late, finally frustrating the Rebel offense to two straight three-and-outs and a turnover on downs to close the game.

Trinidad Chambliss was effective at keeping the Georgia defense on its toes, going 19-of-36 passing for 263 yards and one touchdown while also leading Ole Miss in rushing at 42 yards and two touchdowns on nine attempts.

Kewan Lacy also had two scores alongside 31 yards on 12 attempts, making him only the 18th rusher in Ole Miss history with 10 rushing touchdowns in a single season. De'Zhaun Stribling had his best day as a Rebel with 96 yards on three catches - including a massive 75-yard score at the start of the third quarter.

Suntarine Perkins led the way with a season-high 10 tackles, one forced fumble and a half tackle for loss. Inside linebacker TJ Dottery tied his season-high with nine stops, while safety Wydett Williams Jr. had an Ole Miss career-high eight tackles.

NORMAN, Okla. - The Sooners ripped off an early second half run to make it tight, but timely defensive stops and some key movements downfield by the Rebel offense helped keep No. 8 Ole Miss on top of No. 11 Oklahoma, 34-26, on Saturday.

The Rebels led 22-10 at the break, but Oklahoma scored 13 unanswered across the final five minutes of the third quarter to take a 26-25 lead. But a crucial success by the Rebel offense – led by another strong day by quarterback Trinidad Chambliss - and a forced fumble on a punt by Trace Bruckler, who caught the previous touchdown, helped give Ole Miss the narrow edge for

Ole Miss notched 436 yards of total offense and yielded 359, but the Rebels had five more third-down successes and dominated time of possession at 35:36 - crucially 8:17 in the fourth quarter to keep the Sooner offense off the field.

Chambliss surpassed 300 yards passing for fourth time in six starts, ending with 315 yards and one touchdown on a 24-of-44 passing line. Chambliss is the first Ole Miss QB with at least 250 passing yards through their first six starts since Eli Manning in 2001, who did so six times.

Edge rusher Princewill Umanmielen had a breakout performance, notching six tackles with 2.0 TFL and 1.5 sacks to lead an effective Ole Miss pass rush. TJ Dottery and Kapena Gushiken were also tied for the team lead with six tackles apiece.

OXFORD, Miss. — A dominant defensive effort as well as Kewan Lacy's career day pushed No. 7 Ole Miss football past South Carolina on Saturday evening, 30-14, at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The Rebels stifled the Gamecocks' offense, causing havoc in the backfield all day after allowing a Gamecock touchdown on their first drive. Once the Rebels took the lead in the second quarter, they never looked back. A strong defensive fourth quarter that saw Ole Miss allow only 65 yards would be the deciding factor in shutting down South Carolina down the line.

Ole Miss had a season-high six sacks on the day, which marks the second consecutive season the Rebels had at least that many sacks in a single game. For Ole Miss, it's the most sacks by the Rebels in a single game since having eight against Arkansas last season. Offensively, the Rebels accounted for 417 total yards for the day, with Lacy accounting for 174 of the yards on his own. As a team, Ole Miss rushed for 258 yards. The Rebels have yet to drop below 400 total yards in a game this season.

The Rebels are 8-1 for the third time under head coach Lane Kiffin.

Lacy headlined Ole Miss' offensive efforts against South Carolina, accumulating 167 yards for the day on a 7.0-yard average per carry. For Lacy, it's his third game with triple-digit rushing in a Rebel uniform. His 29-yard and 54-yard runs in the game was his seventh and eighth run of at least 20 yards this season.

The Rebel defense highlighted the days efforts in total. Suntarine Perkins and Kam Franklin had six tackles apiece to lead the Rebel defense, with each picking up at least one sack. Perkins led the team with 1.5 on the day. Five other Rebels each had at least half sacks for the day. The Rebels had eight tackles for loss on the day.

OXFORD, Miss. — An unstoppable aerial assault and the definition of stout defense guided No. 6 Ole Miss to a dominant 49-0 victory over The Citadel Saturday afternoon.

The Rebels have now recorded a shutout in two consecutive seasons and third time in four seasons. It marks the first time since the 2007 and 2008 seasons that Ole Miss has recorded at least one shutout in back-to-back seasons. Ole Miss' defense continued to shut down its opponents, holding The Citadel to only 106 yards of total offense. It's the first time since 2014 against Memphis that the Rebels held their opponents to 150 yards or less of total offense.

The Rebels recorded 603 yards of total offense, marking the second time this season they've surpassed the 600-yard mark.

Trinidad Chambliss and Ole Miss' receivers lit up The Citadel's defense throughout the game. Chambliss went 29-for-33 through the air, an 88 percent completion percentage, with a trio of touchdowns to no interceptions. He accrued a 202.6 rating while passing for 333 yards, his fifth game with at least 300 passing yards.

The leading receiver for the Rebels was Harrison Wallace, who hauled in eight passes for 87 yards. Caleb Odom had a career day himself, recording career highs in catches (six) and receiving yards (64), while bringing in the second touchdown of his career. Winston Watkins and Cayden Lee were the other receivers to score touchdowns on the game.

TJ Dottery and Andrew Maddox led Ole Miss' defensive charge, bringing in seven tackles apiece. The Rebels recorded a season-high 13 tackles from behind the line of scrimmage, with Dottery, Suntarine Perkins and Talib Graham each recording two.

Chucky Mullins Award Winner Tyler Banks had a career-high six tackles, which included two solos. He recorded 1.5 tackles for loss which is also a career best. Andrew Jones also continued his upward trajectory, hauling in four tackles with two solo, and half of one for a loss.

OXFORD, Miss. — Kewan Lacy ran all over Florida as No. 6 Ole Miss football boosted its odds at reaching the College Football Playoffs, beating the Gators 34-24 on Saturday evening at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Lacy has been a force this season for Ole Miss, as he has once again set a career high in rushing yards in a game. Against the Gators, Lacy recorded 224 yards on the ground with a hat trick of touchdowns. By scoring three times on the ground, Lacy overtook Quinshon Judkins as Ole Miss' record holder for the most rushing touchdowns in a single season, finishing the day with 19 to his name in 2025. Lacy also broke the single-season all-purpose touchdown record of 17 that was set four times prior.

Ole Miss' defense shutout Florida in the second half, forcing two punts, two turnovers on downs and an interception. In that time, the Rebels scored 14 unanswered points to record win No. 10 on the season, making head coach Lane Kiffin the first coach in program history with three consecutive 10-win seasons.

Alongside his two touchdown records, Lacy finished with 224 yards on the ground alongside his hat trick. His rushing performance is the eighth best in Ole Miss history and so far this season, Lacy is averaging 111.1 yards and nearly two touchdowns per game at home. Trinidad Chambliss recorded his sixth game of the season with at least 300 passing yards, finishing 26-for-35 for 301 yards and a touchdown.

Wydett Williams Jr. had one of his best outings of the season thus far, leading the Rebels with eight tackles and an interception. His tackle total ties a season and Ole Miss high for the senior safety, while his interception was his third of the season.
