OPENING DRIVE

- The ULM football team is set to open the 2026 season on the road against Mississippi State in Starkville. The Warhawks will face off at 6:30 p.m. CT in Davis Wade Stadium.
- In its 75-year football history, ULM is 33-40-2 (.440) in season openers, including a 6-4 record (.600) in its last 10 games, with a three-game streak of season openers. When opening the season at on the road, the Warhawks are 12-33 (.267), ULM having not opened its season on the road since 2022. The last time the Warhawks opened the season on the road was a 52-10 defeat at Texas.
- Saturday's game marks the seventh meeting between the Bulldogs and the Warhawks, having not seen action against Mississippi State since 1997. Mississippi State is the lone opponent ULM will face for the first time in the 21st century. The Warhawks have snagged a win over the Bulldogs, occurring in 1995 in Starkville, a 34-23 victory.
- ULM looks to defeat an SEC opponent for the first time since 2012, memorably defeating Arkansas in overtime to open the season, 34-31. Famed Warhawk quarterback Kolton Browning passed for 412 yards, scoring three passing touchdowns and a rushing touchdown on the way to the victory. The 2012 was also the lone season since joining the FBS that ULM qualified for a bowl.
- On the 2026 roster, ULM welcomes back 49 returners and brings in 56 newcomers, providing an 48% retention rate from 2025. Out of the newcomers, the Warhawks welcome 10 first-years, 23 NCAA transfers and 23 JUCO transfers to the bayou. Out of those returning to Monroe, 20 have played with ULM for one year, 21 for two years, three for three years and four for four years.
- 17 Warhawks on the roster are competing in the 2026 season having already completed a degree. On the defense, Billy Pullen, **Navarion Benson**, **Cooper Eldridge**, **Kelbee Holmes**, **Levontae Jacobs**, **Marcus Ross** and **CJ Wilson** have already graduated. For the offense, **Brandon Buckhaultner**, **Javon Campbell**, **Don Chaney**, **John Curtis Goodman Jr.**, **Quentis Griffin Jr.**, **Drew Hutchinson**, **Reese Steele** and **Korian Wilson** have collected degrees. **Max Larson** is the lone member of the special teams room to have received a degree prior to the 2026 season.
- As head coach **Bryant Vincent** enters his third season leading the Warhawks, he looks for a hot start. ULM has opened 3-1 in both of the last two seasons with Vincent at the helm. In 2024, the Warhawks opened 5-1, while the 2025 Warhawks went 3-1 to begin. ULM has not recorded a 3-1 (or better) start in three-straight seasons since a six-year stretch from 1980-85.
- ULM's 12-game football schedule features six home games, four being conference opponents. The last time ULM had six home games was the 2024 season, where the Warhawks went 4-2 at Malone Stadium. Overall, it marks the eighth time that the Warhawks have played a six-game home schedule since joining the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly known as Division I-A).
- ULM's 2026 opponents went a combined 72-81 (.471) in 2025, with five opponents going over .500. In addition, seven foes also participated in postseason bowl games a year ago: Mississippi State (Duke's Mayo Bowl), Louisiana Tech (Radiance Technologies Independence Bowl), Troy (IS4S Salute to Veterans Bowl), Southern Miss (New Orleans Bowl), Arkansas State (XBox Bowl), the Ragin' Cajuns (68 Ventures Bowl) and App State (JLab Birmingham Bowl).
- Four ULM football players have been recognized on the Preseason All-Sun Belt teams, the most in the Bryant Vincent era and the most since 2020. Two offensive and two defense players were featured on the teams for the Warhawks. **AJ Vinson** and **Noah Flemmings** were recognized on the Preseason All-Sun Belt First Team and **Nic Trujillo** and **Jabari Tiller** were named to the second team.
- ULM has 26 states featured on its roster in 2026. In announcing its roster, ULM Football posts 19 Louisiana players, 11 coming from Monroe's own Ouachita Parish. Louisiana is the state with the most representatives on the team, with Mississippi following close behind with 18. Texas records the third-most with 15 and Alabama records 10. Iowa, Florida, Pennsylvania and Georgia all record a few, while 19 other states are represented with one or two.
- ULM's coaching staff features six new faces in 2026, including offensive coordinator and receivers coach **Jesse Montalto**, special teams coordinator and defensive line coach **Tony McClain**, pass game coordinator **Chris Jones**, running backs coach **Shawn Simmons** and tight ends coach **Gavin Blomberg**. Montalto arrives after eight seasons at the helm

of Iowa Central CC, where he claimed the Region XI title and ICCAC Coach of the Year in 2019. McClain makes his ULM appearance after time at East Texas A&M, where he spent two seasons. Jones arrives from a season in the Belichick era at North Carolina as the senior associate director of player personnel. Simmons also arrives from Iowa Central CC, previously playing at Central Methodist. Blomberg rounds out the new staff from Iowa Central.

- Staff updates came in the offseason as well, with **Troy Reffett** taking over duties at defensive coordinator. **Derek Cronen-wett** was named the team's general manager as **Micheal Atiyeh** became the director of football operations. **Isaac Lopez** is responsible for strength & conditioning efforts for the team.

- Family connections on the ULM football coaching staff include **Bryant Vincent's** son, **Brady Vincent**, as the team's Tight Ends Coach. **Bret Vincent** makes it three Vincents featured in the ULM football program, with Bret playing wide receiver for the Warhawks.

OFFENSE NOTES

Quarterbacks

- Returning at the quarterback position this season is fourth-year **Aidan Armenta**, who assumed the starting position midway through the 2024 season. In 2025, Armenta completed 148 passes on 253 attempts for a 58.5% completion percentage, posting 12 touchdowns and 1,629 yards.

- Fourth-year **Landon Graves** also makes the return, after appearing in eight games on the offense making a start at Southern Miss last season. Graves totaled 185 yards and two touchdowns in his third season.

- **Bryson Kimbrough** returns for his second season in the quarterback room as well, having not seen time in 2025.

- Two more quarterbacks joined the Warhawks entering 2026, in Houston transfer **Austin Carlisle** and Iowa Central transfer **Ty Purdy**.

Running Backs

- The Warhawks reloaded at the running back position by adding transfers **Derrick Jameson** (Utah State), **Don Chaney** (Charlotte), **Julian Walker** (Saint Vincent), **CJ Phillip** (Iowa Central CC), **Bryson Roland** (Arkansas Tech), **Trevon Kinchen** (Georgia Military) and **Makin Lenard** (Ouachita Baptist).

- Chaney has already grabbed attention by being named to the Athlon Sports Preseason Sun Belt Second Team and the Phil Steele Preseason Sun Belt Fourth Team. He spent four years at Miami before spending seasons at Louisville and Charlotte.

- Walker was named All-PAC Honorable Mention with 564 rushing yards and four touchdowns under his belt for Saint Vincent in 2025.

- Roland was recognized multiple times in 2025, recognized on D2CCA All-Super Region 4 Second Team, GAC Freshman of the Year, All-GAC First Team. He logged 25 receptions for 396 yards and two touchdowns, averaging 15.8 yards per catch.

- ULM also brought in true freshman RB **Christian Ponti**, a local talent coming from West Monroe HS. **Jaydon Wright** also returns for another season in Monroe, looking to see time in 2026.

Offensive Line

- The Warhawks return two starting guards from last season. **AJ Vinson** and **Kaliem Croswell** are set for their second seasons in Monroe. Vinson was voted to the Preseason All-Sun Belt First Team.

- **Quentis Griffin Jr.** is back for a third season with ULM, after appearing in three games last season. Also returning for the Warhawks' offensive line is **David Applewhite** and **Drew Hutchinson**, both of whom saw action last season. **Roscoe Tucker** and **Reese Steele** return from injury in 2026.

Receivers/Tight Ends

- **Nic Trujillo**, named to the Preseason All-Sun Belt Second Team, is back on the roster and was one of Armenta's top targets last season. After returning from injury midway through the season, Trujillo caught four touchdowns, including two at the Ragin' Cajuns.

- **JP Coulter** appeared in all 12 games last season and totaled 234 yards from 21 catches, concluding his year with a career-high 56 yards at Texas State. **Brandon Buckhault** also returns for his second season, collecting 52 yards and a touchdown last season. **Javon Campbell** is also back after being sidelined through injury in 2025, appearing at Texas State to make his return.

- Added to the receiving room are transfers **LT Robinson** (Hutchinson CC), **Demarcco Blanton** (Arkansas State), **Parker Fulghum** (Clemson) and **Marcellus Jackson** (Itawamba CC). Freshmen in **Keidric Osunde-Brown** and **Jaiden Tucker** are also added to the roster.

DEFENSE NOTES

Defensive Line

- Returning from injury is defensive end **Derek Omoregie**, in his second season in Monroe.
- Moses Madubuike** (Navarro JC) and **Marvin Hall** (Garden City CC) both transfer in to add to the defensive ends. Sixth year **Levontae Jacobs** also makes the return on the defensive line, anchoring newcomers such as **CJ Wilson** (Butler), **Zyan Tremont** (Jones College) and **Colton Vatne** (Mississippi Valley State).

- James Smith** returns for a fifth year at ULM after appearing in 11 games and notching 14 tackles last season.

Linebackers

- Noah Flemmings** is back for his second season with the Warhawks after posting 80 tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss, a pass breakup, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries to receive All-Sun Belt Third Team accolades.

- Flemmings was recognized in the preseason by multiple watchlists, most notably named to the Chuck Bednarik Award Watchlist, honoring the best college defensive player of the season.

- Joining him is **Marcus Ross**, who registered 35 tackles, two sacks and two forced fumbles in his 2025 campaign. Back for a third year is **Jaeden Calender**, who appeared in all 12 games with 25 tackles and two quarterback hurries under his belt last season. Also returning after seeing action all last season is **Kelbee Holmes**.

- Newcoming linebackers include **Rickey Banks**, who recorded 70 tackles last season at Northeast Mississippi CC. **Jackson Parker** also arrives from Northeast Mississippi. Linebacker **LaZavier Amos** was named an NJCAA All-American last season after registering 125 tackles and five sacks at Trinity Valley CC.

Defensive Backs

- Returning for the defense includes **Jabari Tiller** appears for a second season with ULM after collecting 45 tackles, two sacks, a forced fumble and a pass breakup.

- Also returning is **Zy Jackson**, who totaled 25 tackles, a pass breakup and a tackle for loss last season and **Jay Harper**, who made a start and recorded three tackles. Defensive back **Navarion Benson** remains with ULM as **Korian Wilson** returns from injury to make an impact in 2026.

- Defensive newcomers include **Armoni Rue**, who saw action in five games and posted five solo stops while at UTSA. Other transfers include **RJ Hall** (Hinds CC), **Jonathan Crain** (Co-Lin CC) and **Willie Wilson** (American International).

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Special teams players **Max Larson**, **Makenzie Ryan** and **Nolan Wilson** are all back on ULM's 2026 roster. Larson missed the 2025 season due to injury, but went 14-for-17 on field goal attempts and 27-for-28 on PATs in 2024. Ryan booted 60 punts with an average of 38.8 yards per punt, downing 13 inside the 20-yard line last season. Wilson was the long snapper for all 12 games last season.
- ULM signed long snapper **Matthew Feibush** to the roster, who arrives from Colorado State-Pueblo. **Gavin Polk**, a Monroe native from Ouachita Christian School, joins the special teams room along with California transfer **Abram Murray**. Murray was named to the Phil Steele Preseason Sun Belt Fourth Team.

LAFAYETTE, La. – The ULM football team saw a shootout during rivalry weekend at the Ragin' Cajuns, falling 30-27. After both teams scored in the first two minutes, it was a fight to find who would get the winning tally. After tying the game with a field goal, the home team went on to secure victory with another field goal in overtime.

The Warhawks broke 500 yards in total offense in a game for the first time since 2021, averaging 6.8 yards per play. ULM also led in first downs (29) and possession time (30:21). The Ragin' Cajuns led with 70 total tackles, three sacks and recovered a fumble.

The game opened with a kickoff return touchdown by Ja'Corian Green, returning the ball 96 yards to the endzone for an early 7-0 score, just 13 seconds into the game. The Warhawks responded with a two-minute drive, two long balls from Armenta to Trujillo got ULM to the endzone for the response. Trujillo first notched a 52-yard ball to reach the 30-yard line, then a 25-yard pass got receiver the ball again for the score. A blocked extra point left the home team with the 7-6 advantage with 13:19 on the clock.

Zach Palmer-Smith was able to reach the endzone for seven yards and the 13-7 edge. A 29-yard pass and short improvements had the Cajuns entering the redzone, a four-yard rush securing the touchdown and the lead, 14-13.

Quarterback hurries by Jalen Foster and Jaeden Calender forced third down, a tackle for loss by Marcus Ross forcing the third-and-long to stop the Cajuns on the 38-yard line. Kicker Tony Sterner was able to get the ball through the uprights from 55 yards, extending the lead to 17-13, the score holding through the end of the half.

After a scoreless third quarter, Armenta notched the ball to Jonathan Bibbs, who ran 68 yards to the endzone for the score to regain the lead, 20-17, just 10 seconds into the quarter. Makenzie Ryan changed his tune from punting to kicking, making the extra point. The Cajuns returned the favor just two minutes later, as Bill Davis ran for 76 yards to the endzone for the lead.

Palmer-Smith carried the responding drive, rushing for 13 yards to cross midfield. It was a 43-yard reception from Armenta to Trujillo, their second touchdown connection, that gave the Warhawks the 27-24 lead with nine minutes remaining. New quarterback in Walker Howard for the home team got the Cajuns to the 15-yard line, but the Warhawk defense, led by Jyren Ester, forced the team to settle for a field goal. The game held tied at 27 with 3:36 left in the contest.

A deep shot from Armenta to Rylan Green got ULM to the seven-yard line, but two short rushes left the team with nothing. Hunter Herring entered the game at quarterback and took a final shot at the endzone, but it was intercepted by Brent Gordon Jr. After the Warhawk defense stopped the Cajuns three times, they sealed the victory with an overtime field goal, 30-27.

FMOL Health | St. Francis Stadium stands as a proud symbol of Warhawk tradition and community pride. FMOL Health | St. Francis Stadium has served as the home of ULM football since its opening on September 16, 1978.

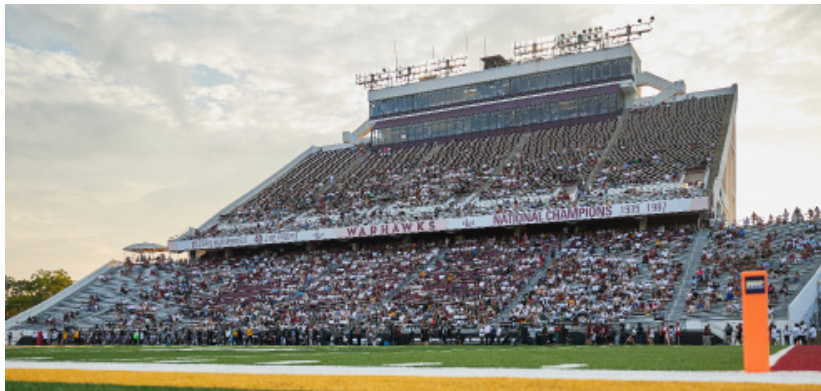
Before the stadium was built, the football team played at Brown Stadium, which seated just over 8,000. It was through the vision of local leaders, including former Monroe mayor Jack Howard, that a new facility was made possible.

Originally named Malone Stadium, the stadium held 20,000 fans and debuted with a then-Northeast Louisiana 21-13 victory over Arkansas State. In 1983, seating was expanded into both end zones. The west grandstand features the press box, sky box and ULM's athletic department offices. The east side of the stadium offers additional seating with double-deck bleachers that nearly stretch the full length of the field.

In 2007, the natural grass surface was replaced with a ProPlay synthetic surface, followed by a new FieldTurf installation in 2014. In 2011, ULM introduced a massive HD video scoreboard that measures 23 feet tall by 48 feet wide as well as a sound system.

In 2016, ULM opened a state-of-the-art fieldhouse located in the northwest corner of the stadium. The 11,750-square-foot facility includes a ULM football history display, locker rooms, coaches' offices and a patio with a view of the playing field. A players' lounge that features a full-sized kitchen, gaming tables and couches was introduced in the spring of 2022. New field turf was installed before the 2023 season. The facility was further upgraded in 2024 with enhancements to the team room, locker room and athletic department lobby.

FMOL Health | St. Francis Stadium has been the center stage for some of the most memorable moments in ULM football history, including a record-setting crowd of 31,175 set on September 21, 2012, versus Baylor. Regional rivalries between Louisiana Tech and Grambling State have drawn some of the largest crowds in ULM history.

BRYANT VINCENT

THIRD SEASON AT ULM (8-16) FOURTH SEASON OVERALL (15-22)

Bryant Vincent, known for his strong leadership and expertise in creating powerful offensive schemes in college football, was named the 17th head football coach in University of Louisiana Monroe history on Wednesday, December 6, 2023.

Coach Vincent entered his second season in 2025, leading his team to a 28-16 homecoming victory over Arkansas State, ULM's first defeat of the Red Wolves in over 16 years. Another notable 2025 score was the 29-0 season-opening win over Saint Francis, ULM's first shutout victory in over 10 years.

While managing duties as interim athletic director, Vincent's Warhawks led the Sun Belt and ranked third in FBS in kickoff return defense (13.24) and third in the conference with two blocked kicks. Linebacker Noah Flemmings was placed on the All-Sun Belt Defense Third Team, as senior cornerback D'Arco Perkins-McAllister signed an undrafted free agency contract with the Kansas City Chiefs.

In his first season as head coach of ULM football, Coach Vincent began establishing a culture of grit and resilience that propelled the Warhawks to one of their most successful starts in nearly four decades. ULM opened the 2024 season 5-1, the program's best start in 37 years, and Vincent was the only Sun Belt Conference Coach named to the 2024 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award Watch List.

Vincent secured his first victory as head coach

with a 30-14 win over Jackson State on August 29, 2024. After defeating Troy on the road 13-9 in the Sun Belt Conference opener, Vincent led the Warhawks to a signature victory over JMU by a score of 21-19 to give ULM its first 4-1 start in the FBS era.

Under Vincent's direction, the Warhawks led the SBC in several statistical categories, including passing yards allowed (183.9), blocked kicks (3) and fewest penalty yards per game (43.25).

He developed 2024 Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year Ahmad Hardy, who led the league with 1,351 rushing yards and 13 rushing touchdowns as a true freshman. Hardy was named ULM's first FWAA Freshman All-American in program history and was also voted Louisiana Freshman of the Year by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association.

Including Hardy, nine Warhawks garnered SBC postseason honors for the first time in over five seasons including All-Sun Belt Second Team defensive lineman Kevontay Wells and All-Sun Belt Third Team defensive stars Billy Pullen, Carl Glass Jr., and Wydett Williams Jr. Additionally, two of Vincent's players went on to compete at the professional level after senior cornerback Car'lin Vigers signed an undrafted free agent contract with the NFL's Washington Commanders and senior offensive lineman Sam Carson was drafted by the CFL's Ottawa Redblacks.

Off the field, Vincent's leadership produced unprec-

edented academic results. ULM football recorded the highest term GPA in program history in Fall 2024, and the team's 84% graduation success rate (GSR) led all Sun Belt programs. Additionally, major facility upgrades were completed at Malone Stadium, including renovations to the team room, locker room and main athletics lobby.

Before arriving in Monroe, Vincent served as the Offensive Coordinator at the University of New Mexico during the 2023 season. Under Vincent's offensive schemes, the Lobos earned national top-20 rankings in red zone offense (14th) and rushing offense (19th). Additionally, Vincent coached running back Jacory Croskey-Merritt to a record-breaking season. The New Mexico running back was the first Lobo to ever have back-to-back 200-yard rushing games and finished with 17 rushing touchdowns, which is third all-time in New Mexico football history.

Prior to New Mexico, Vincent served as the Interim Head Coach at UAB following the retirement of Bill Clark and led the Blazers to a 7-6 season and a win in the 2022 Bahamas Bowl. UAB's offense generated 30.1 points per game and 438.2 yards per game, which was the 33rd highest mark in the country. Vincent spent four seasons as UAB's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach and was a key figure in elevating the program since its reinstatement in 2017. In all, Vincent helped lead UAB to a pair of Conference USA Championships and bowl game victories.

UAB has been the winningest team in Conference USA since returning to the playing field and collected 42 wins since Vincent returned as OC. The Blazers won the 2018 CUSA title game 27-25 over Middle Tennessee State, winning on the road, and the 2020 CUSA title game, that one 22-13 over Marshall, again on the road.

UAB also made it to the 2019 championship game as champions of their division. Since the reinstatement of the program in 2017, Vincent coached in five bowls games, qualifying for six. UAB won the 2018 Boca Raton Bowl 37-13 over Northern Illinois, the 2021 Independence Bowl 31-28 over BYU and the 2022 Bahamas Bowl. UAB also played in the 2017 Bahamas Bowl against Ohio and the 2019 New Orleans Bowl against App State, and the team qualified for the 2020 Gasparilla Bowl against South Carolina, before being canceled due to COVID-19.

With Vincent at offensive coordinator, the Blazers set FBS-program records for wins in 2018, going 11-3. Vincent never had a losing season with Blazers, going 7-6 as head coach and going 48-27 overall in his six years with UAB. The 2018 Blazers had the best offensive season in program history which resulted in 21 school records, including the aforementioned 11-3 overall record and winning the program's first Conference USA title and bowl game.

Among the school records that fell in 2018 included total points (418), total touchdowns (53), rushing touchdowns (32), total yards (5,680) and rushing yards (2,818). Additionally, UAB set the single game school record for total yards (668) and rushing yards (419) in a 52-3 victory over UTSA on Nov. 3, 2018.

Vincent is no stranger to the Sun Belt Conference and spent six years in two separate stints with South Alabama. He served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2015-17 and was an assistant coach from 2011-13 for the Jaguars' football program. Vincent helped guide the Jaguars to the 2016 Nova Home Loans Arizona Bowl led by record setting quarterback Dallas Davis. In Vincent's offense, Davis threw for the most yards in school history (2,706) and his 2,951 total yards of offense are second most in program history.

Before entering the collegiate ranks, Vincent was a successful high school football coach in Alabama and tallied a record of 49-16 in five seasons at two different schools. In his first season as a head coach, Vincent led Greenville High School to a 10-3 record and was selected as the Class 5A Coach of the Year in 2006. Vincent was at the helm of Spanish Fort High School football for four seasons and produced a record of 39-13. His team captured the Alabama 5A State Championship in 2010.

Vincent is a native of Glasgow, Kentucky. He and his wife Holli have two sons, Brady, a member of the ULM football coaching staff and Bret, a wide receiver for the Warhawks.
