NOTEBOOK

Dominant road win in Big Ten country

- » Mississippi State's week two win at (RV) Minnesota marked the largest margin of victory on the road since Oct. 23, 2021 when the Bulldogs beat Vanderbilt by 39.
- » The 13 yards rushing allowed is also the least given up since that 2021 matchup at Vanderbilt.
- » The Bulldog offense, typically known for its quick tempo and short scoring drives, engineered a drive of 10:27 on Saturday, State's longest since a 12:29 drive vs. Kentucky on Nov. 4, 2023.

Scoring from far. Scoring often.

- » The Bulldog offense is off to a historically hot start in 2026. The Dawgs lead the SEC and are second in the nation in total offense at 620.5 yards per game.
- » State is also second in the SEC in yards per completion at 14.98, third in rushing offense (298.5) and fourth in passing offense (322.0) in the league.
- » MSU's 100 points through two games is the third-most in program history, trailing the 2017 season (106) and the 1914 season (131).

Best in class in Week Two

- » **Jakheem Shumpert-Perkins** was named the highest-graded right tackle in college football in week two according to Pro Football Network with a grade of 90.1.
- » State's offensive line, led by SEC Co-Offensive Lineman of the Week **Canon Boone**, dominated the trenches to reach 250+ rushing yards in back-to-back games.

Never Forget: 25 Years Since a Memorable Bulldogs-Gamecocks Game

- » The nation recently reflected on the 25th anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks that claimed the lives of 2,977 individuals. On Thursday, Sept. 20, 2001, the Gamecocks traveled to Starkville to play in the first major sporting event following those attacks, providing a dose of normalcy after so much tragedy.

State starts fast in season-opener

- » The uptempo Mississippi State offense scored on each of its first eight drives for the first time on record in the week one win over ULM. State finished with a program-record 762 total yards.
- » State's 41 first half points were four shy of a program record for points in a half. The 459 first half yards of offense were the most in the **Jeff Leiby** era.
- » Freshman **J.J. Hill**'s two touchdown performance makes him the first Bulldog with a multi-rushing touchdown game in his collegiate debut since **Ashton**

Shumpert ran it in twice against Alcorn State on Sept. 7, 2013. Hill was the highest graded true freshman from week one according to Pro Football Focus with a grade of 95.8.

- » State's penalty-free first half against ULM marked its first half of football without a penalty in the last four seasons (vs. Southeast Louisiana on Sept. 2, 2023).

Inter-locked In Once Again

- » Mississippi State will feature the MSU Interlocking mark as the primary logo on its helmet in 2026 for the first time since 2003.
- » Originally introduced in 1979, the mark was updated in 1986 and again in 1996. The logo returning as State's primary football mark for the 2026 season is the version presented in 1996.
- » The MSU Interlocking logo is synonymous with the Bulldogs' success of the late 1990s when State appeared in the Cotton Bowl and Peach Bowl.
- » After being discontinued at the end of the 2003 season, the Interlocking logo returned in 2023 as a tribute to the 1998 SEC West Championship team. The 2025 season saw the regular return of the Interlocking logo before it once again became the primary football mark for the 2026 season.

Fast as Hail

- » The speed limit on Mississippi State's campus is 20 miles per hour. The Bulldogs have 46 players on the roster whose top running speed exceeds the driving speed limit on campus.
- » MSU's speed and quickness program - aptly named 'Fast as Hail' - is headed up by **Jarwarski Beckum**. Beckum holds the title of Director of Speed.

Return of the Zach

- » **Zach Arnett** was the mastermind behind some of the best defenses in recent memory for Mississippi State. Arnett served as the Bulldogs' defensive coordinator under **Mike Leach** from 2020-22 and produced three consecutive top five SEC defenses.
- » During Arnett's tenure as defensive coordinator, MSU ranked inside the top five in the SEC in 28 different defensive efficiency and production categories including No. 5 in total defense each year, third in limiting explosive plays, fourth in forced turnovers and fifth in points per possession allowed.
- » The Bulldogs had seven defenders drafted by the NFL during Arnett's four-year stint in Starkville: CB **Emmanuel Forbes** (1st), CB **Martin Emerson**, DT **Cameron Young** (4th), LB **Nathaniel Watson** (6th), CB **Decamerion Richardson** (6th), DT **Jaden Crumedy** (6th) and DL **Marquiss Spencer** (6th).

» **Jeff Lebby** hasn't been shy about bringing former Bulldog players on board to his coaching staff. Lebby currently has five former State players on his staff in various roles.

» **Erroll Thompson** - Linebackers Analyst - (Lettered at MSU: 2017-20). Thompson led all SEC linebackers in tackles as a freshman, earning Freshman All-SEC honors. He was also a second team All-SEC selection in 2018 and a team captain from 2019-20 playing for **Dan Mullen**, **Joe Moorhead** and **Mike Leach**.

» **Jett Johnson** - Linebackers Analyst - (Lettered at MSU 2020-23). Johnson led the SEC with 115 tackles in 2022 and finished second in the conference with 130 stops in 2023. He earned second team All-SEC honors at linebacker in 2023 and spent the past two seasons as an assistant linebackers coach at UConn under **Matt Brock**. Johnson played for Moorhead, Leach and **Zach Arnett**.

» **Hayes Hammond** - Special Teams Fellow - (Lettered at MSU: 2021-24). Hammond spent four seasons at MSU's starting long snapper for Leach, Arnett and Jeff Lebby.

» **Gerri Green** - Senior Director of the DAWG Program - (Lettered at MSU: 2015-18). Green played both linebacker and defensive end during his time in Starkville. He was a Freshman All-SEC selection in 2015 and was named a team captain as a senior in 2018. He played for Mullen and Moorhead before being drafted in the sixth round by the Colts in the 2019 NFL Draft. Green went on to play four seasons with Indianapolis, Washington, Las Vegas, Tennessee and Chicago.

» **Rod Gibson** - Director of Football Recruiting Engagement - (Lettered at MSU: 1998-99). Gibson is in his 10th year working at his alma mater. He was a fullback on MSU's SEC Western Division championship team in 1998 and its 10-2 Peach Bowl champion squad in 1999 under **Jackie Sherrill**.

Second Stints in Starkville

» Three Mississippi State coaches are beginning their second stints in Starkville. Defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett**, co-defensive coordinator **Matt Brock** were with MSU from 2020-23 and offensive line consultant **Mason Miller** was an assistant from 2020-22.

» Arnett was hired as **Mike Leach**'s defensive coordinator in 2020 and served in that capacity until being named his successor in December 2022 following Leach's untimely death. Arnett guided the Bulldogs to a 19-10 win over Illinois in the Reliaquest Bowl and was the head coach for 10 games in 2023. He spent the past two seasons as a defensive analyst for Ole Miss and Florida State.

» Brock worked under Leach at Texas Tech and Washington State before accompanying him to Mississippi State. He was the Bulldogs special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach in 2020-21, linebackers coach in 2022 and promoted to defensive coordinator under Arnett in 2023. Brock spent the past two seasons as defensive coordinator at UConn.

» Miller was also on Leach's staff at Washington State as offensive line coach and served in that capacity in Starkville from 2020-21. In 2022, he added run game coordinator to his title for the Bulldogs. Miller coached **Charles Cross** for two seasons at MSU. Cross was drafted ninth overall by the Seahawks in the 2022 NFL Draft. Miller was the offensive coordinator for Tarleton State in 2023 and spent the past two seasons as the offensive line coach at Baylor.

- » Kamario Taylor was the highest-rated quarterback recruit to ever sign with Mississippi State in 2025 out of nearby Noxubee County High School in Macon.
- » Taylor appeared in 11 games as a true freshman last year and started the final two games in the Egg Bowl against Ole Miss and the Duke's Mayo Bowl against Wake Forest.
- » The 6-foot-4, 230-pounder was tabbed as the SEC Freshman of the Week twice in 2025. He had a rushing and passing touchdown in the Bulldogs' win at Arkansas and later ran for 173 yards and two scores while also throwing for 178 yards against Ole Miss in his first-career start.
- » Taylor is a lifelong Bulldog fan who grew up wanting to follow in his uncle Omarr Conner's footsteps. Conner, also a four-star QB recruit from Noxubee County, played quarterback and wide receiver for Mississippi State from 2003-06. Conner is currently the offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach at Hinds Community College.

- » Taylor's younger brother, Jayytee, is a freshman athlete at Mississippi State.
- » Taylor guided Noxubee County to three-straight Class 3A state championship games from 2022-24. He was named Mississippi's Mr. Football in Class 3A after throwing for over 2,400 yards, 30 touchdowns and just four interceptions as a senior while also adding more than 1,100 yards and 15 scores on the ground.
- » Noxubee County also produced former State greats Deontae Skinner and Jeffery Simmons, both of whom went on to play in the NFL. Skinner won a Super Bowl with the New England Patriots in 2014 and Simmons is a four-time Pro Bowl defensive tackle for the Tennessee Titans.

Fluff is the Stuff

- » Don't get it twisted, there's nothing soft about MSU junior running back Fluff Bothwell. The 5-foot-10, 230-pounder produced three multi-touchdown games and a pair of 100-yard rushing performances in 2025.
- » Bothwell led the Bulldogs with 677 yards on 142 carries and six touchdowns last season. He averaged 4.8 yards per carry and 61.5 yards per game on the ground while splitting time with Davon Booth in the backfield.
- » Bothwell's real first name is Da'Marion but was nicknamed "Fluff" at birth as an 11-pound baby.
- » The Oneonta, Alabama native is an admitted animal lover and has three dogs, two guinea pigs and a snake as pets.
- » Bothwell's family home burned down on Dec. 24, 2023 during his senior year of high school. Thankfully, no one was home at the time of the fire but the family lost everything. Bothwell said "You can always get another home, but you can't get somebody back. It was tough, but we all got through it and we're back on our feet now."
- » This isn't StarkVegas to me, it's home"
- » Senior Isaac Smith has been a standout on Mississippi State's defense since his arrival as a true freshman in 2023. Smith has racked up 206 tackles at both safety and linebacker during his stellar career. He led the Southeastern Conference with 127 tackles as a sophomore and was selected as a second team All-SEC performer in 2024.

NOTEBOOK

» During preseason camp, the Fulton native was asked why it was so important for him to finish out his career at MSU in today's transfer portal era. Smith replied "I started here and I want to end it here. Everybody uses the term 'StarkVegas'. This isn't StarkVegas to me, it's home. This place means something special to me. The fans, the people, I wouldn't trade this for anything in the world."

» Ironically enough, Smith's father - Reggie - played football at Ole Miss in the 1990s.

From the Diamond to the Gridiron

» Punter **Ethan Pulliam** began his athletic career at Mississippi State as a member of the baseball team. Pulliam played for the Diamond Dawgs from 2024-25 where he played in 34 games and drew 21 starts.

» The Starkville native made 16 starts at second base, three in right field, one in left field and one as a designated hitter. He was a career .236 hitter with five doubles, one triple, one homer, 11 RBIs and a stolen base.

» Pulliam walked onto the football team in the spring of 2024 and redshirted that fall. He left the baseball team in 2025 to focus on punting full-time.

» During his first football season on the field last fall, Pulliam set a single-season school record averaging 46.8 yards per punt and was named a second team All-American by Sporting News.

» Pulliam has three cousins that have played football professionally - A.J. Brown, Tom Johnson III and Alonzo Lawrence.

Kelley 'Kelley Jones' Jones

» Quarterbacks didn't throw cornerback **Kelley Jones'** way very often in 2025. And the few times that they did, it usually didn't end well for them.

» Jones allowed the fewest receptions (11) among all Southeastern Conference corners last season and his 11 pass breakups were tied for second in the conference. He also picked off two passes leaving his 13 total passes defended also ranking tied for second in the SEC.

» In the 2026 season opener, Jones deflected one pass and did not allow a reception.

Ant-Man: The Sequel

» **Anthony Evans III's** first season at Mississippi State was one of the most

productive in the program's history. Evans' 67 catches were the seventh-most in the school's annals and tied for third in the SEC in 2025.

» Evans also finished 10th in the conference in receiving yards (831) and 10th in receiving yards per game (63.9). He recorded at least four catches in 12 of 13 games for the Bulldogs last fall, including three 100-yard performances against Arizona State, Florida and Arkansas.

» Evans topped all State players with 18 explosive plays of 20+ yards in 2025 and was just the third Bulldog since 2016 to exceed 60 catches in a single season.

» Picking up where he left off last season, Evans leads the SEC in receptions (14) and is ninth nationally in receiving yards (119.5).

Featured on Feldman's Freaks List

» At 6-foot-4, 315 pounds and a former high school basketball and shot put star, defensive lineman **Jaray Bledsoe** enters the 2026 season on Bruce Feldman's Freaks List.

» Fellow D-Lineman Trevion Williams calls him "rubber band man" because of his flexibility.

Full Circle for Jardin Gilbert

» After three seasons at Texas A&M followed by two more at LSU, safety **Jardin Gilbert** is closing his college career where the opportunity of an SEC experience was first offered to him. Mississippi State was Gilbert's first SEC scholarship offer while at University Lab School in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

» "Mississippi State is my home now. They accepted me with welcoming hands, welcoming arms, so (I'm) making sure I'm doing what I have to do to pour back," Gilbert said.

Snaking His Way to the Backfield

» Defensive lineman **DJ Reed** hopes to ensnare quarterbacks this season just as his pet snakes devour their frozen mice snacks.

» Reed has four ball python snakes — the longest of which is a four-foot long albino named Penelope. Reed grew up with snapping turtles and fish as pets as a child.

» Reed hopes to open his own psychology practice up after football ends.

NOTEBOOK - RECORD WATCH

Ferrie Chasing Multiple MSU Records

- » After 8 points in week two at Minnesota, **Kyle Ferrie** enters week three 17 points shy of breaking Nick Fitzgerald's Mississippi State record for career points.
- » Last season, Ferrie set the all-time scoring record for a kicker at MSU in his 36th career game on Nov. 28, 2025 against Ole Miss.
- » The left-footer who is married to former MSU and current AUSL softball standout Sierra Sacco, also kicked the longest field goal in program history - a 55-yarder in the 2025 season opener against Southern Miss.
- » Ferrie has made 122 of his 123 career PATs (99%). His 99% made PATs would rank top 3 in a career at State.
- » Ferrie has made 85 straight PATs entering week three.
- » Ferrie was 44-44 in PATs in 2025, which was a program record for consecutive made PATs in a single-season.

NIL for Good

- » Many Bulldogs have chosen to lift up others in their community this past offseason, including Wuerffel Trophy Watch List member **DJ Chester**.

- » Chester and his JDC Thrive Foundation organized more than 20 of his teammates for a bed-building community service project benefiting the Golden Triangle's Bedz 4 Kidz drive to provide a safe and comfortable place for kids in need to lay their head every night.

- » As for the reason behind his service efforts Chester said "I just want everybody to be on the same playing field so they can be whatever they want to be."

- » Additionally, Starkville native **Ethan Pulliam** donated \$4,000 for school supplies to two Starkville Oktibbeha Consolidated School District elementary schools in July.

- » Pulliam said of the gift: "I just wanted to give back to the school teachers and support staff that do all they can for us. Looking back at it, they did a lot for us, all the way around."

Thompson, Traore Drafted

- » Mississippi State produced a pair of 2026 NFL Draft picks. Wide receiver **Brenen Thompson** was selected in the fourth round by the Los Angeles Chargers while tight end **Seydou Traore** was taken in the fifth round by the Miami Dolphins.

- » Thompson posted the fastest 40-yard dash time at the NFL Combine in a blazing 4.26 second. During his lone season in Starkville, Thompson set the program's single-season receiving record with 1,054 yards while also becoming the first Bulldog to ever lead the SEC in receiving yardage.

- » Traore, a native of London, England, also made history becoming the first player ever to be drafted via the NFL's International Player Pathway Program.

A Cowbell Tale

- » The most unique and certainly the most resounding symbol of Mississippi State tradition is the cowbell. Despite decades of attempts by opponents and authorities to banish it from scenes of competition, diehard State fans still celebrate Bulldog victories loudly and proudly with the distinctive sound of ringing cowbells.

- » The precise origin of the cowbell as a fixture of Mississippi State sports tradition remains unclear to this day. The best records have cowbells gradually introduced to the MSU sports scene in the late 1930s and early 1940s, coinciding with the 'golden age' of Mississippi State football success prior to World War II.

- » The most popular legend is that during a home football game between State and arch-rival Mississippi, a jersey cow wandered onto the playing field. Mississippi State soundly whipped the Rebels that Saturday, and State College students immediately adopted the cow as a good

luck charm. Students are said to have continued bringing a cow to football games for a while, until the practice was eventually discontinued in favor of bringing just the cow's bell.

- » In 1974, the SEC adopted a rule against artificial noisemakers that made it illegal to ring a cowbell during games. Despite creative efforts by MSU fans to circumvent the ruling and continue the tradition, the ban was in effect until 2010. That spring, the 16 schools of the SEC agreed to a compromise on artificial noisemakers, acknowledging the role cowbells play in the history of Mississippi State University by amending the conference by-law. In the fall of 2010, on a one-year trial with specified restrictions, cowbells were permitted in Davis Wade Stadium for the first time in 36 years. And due to MSU fans' notable adherence to the rules outlined by the league, cowbells have been allowed at MSU home football games since with similar restrictions in place.

Best Small Town In The South

- » Starkville has been named the "Best Small Town In The South" each of the last three years by USA Today.

- » Starkville is also featured nationally in other publications such as Southern Living, New York Post, and Miami Herald.

- » Starkville natives enjoy unmatched community support, great quality of life, and full buy-in for Mississippi State Football.

Facility Enhancements

- » A new Indoor Practice Facility project was announced back in May and is backed by Howard Industries. The facility will be named in honor of Billy W. Howard Sr., a beloved alumnus, former student-athlete, and pillar of the MSU community.

- » The new facility includes a new 110,000-sq. ft. indoor training facility. Additionally, there will be renovations and expansions to the current Leo Seal Jr. Football Complex that will enhance key areas such as sports medicine, nutrition and locker rooms. The project includes specialized areas for sports science, designed to advance recovery, reduce injuries and optimize performance.

- » Construction is expected to begin in 2027. More Information can be found [HERE](#).

HEAD COACH JEFF LEBBY

Jeff Lebbey, a dynamic playcaller and the mastermind behind many of college football's most feared offenses, was named the 36th head football coach in Mississippi State history on Nov. 26, 2023.

One of college football's top offensive minds, Lebbey has orchestrated high-octane offenses at every career stop. Since becoming an offensive coordinator at the FBS level in 2019, he led all active coordinators in 50+ point games (14). His 2023 unit at Oklahoma scored an FBS-best 65+ points three times and ranked No. 4 nationally in scoring offense (41.7 ppg). His offense was also one of only three to rank inside the top six nationally in total offense, scoring offense and passing offense.

Explosive plays have been a trademark of Lebbey-coached offenses. Since 2019, he has produced five individual 3,000-yard passing seasons and four individual 1,000-yard receiving seasons. His offensive units finished in the top six nationally in total offense three times since 2019, highlighted by a trio of top 3 finishes at UCF (No. 2 in 2019 with 540.5 ypg), Ole Miss (No. 3 in 2020 with 555.5 ypg) and Oklahoma (No. 3 in 2023 with 507.0 ypg).

Lebbey is no stranger to the Southeastern Conference, having spent two seasons in Oxford directing the Ole Miss offense and coaching quarterbacks. Under his direction, the offense led the SEC in total offense in 2020 and again in 2021 (492.5 ypg; ranked No. 6 nationally), twice earning him semifinalist honors for the Broyles Award.

Prior to Ole Miss, Lebbey spent two seasons at UCF under current Tennessee head coach Josh Heupel. He coached the quarterbacks in 2018 before being elevated to offensive coordinator in 2019. During the 2019 season, UCF ranked second nationally in total offense (540.5 ypg) and fifth in scoring offense (43.4 ppg). His unit was one of only two in the country to average more than 300 passing yards and 200 rushing yards per game.

Lebbey has found offensive success everywhere he has coached. In 2017, he guided Southeastern University to the NAIA's best scoring offense (55.1 ppg) and ranked third in total offense (557.4 ypg).

While at Baylor, he coached running backs from 2012-16 and was also the passing game coordinator and offensive recruiting coordinator in 2015 and 2016. In Lebbey's five seasons as Baylor's running backs coach, he coached five 1,000-yard rushers. Baylor's 2015 squad ranked No. 2 in the nation in rushing offense with two 1,000-yard rushers. In 2013, he earned the FootballScoop Running Backs Coach of the Year award after coaching Baylor's first back-to-back 1,000-yard rusher.

A 2007 graduate of Oklahoma, Lebbey was a four-year student assistant for the football program.

You won't have to research long to see the general consensus on the star Mississippi State cornerback. Not only is he on the cusp of going from State to Sundays, he's on a path that could very well make him the next Bulldog football player to be taken in the draft's first round, joining the likes of Jeffery Simmons, Emmanuel Forbes, Charles Cross, Montez Sweat, Fletcher Cox, Eric Moulds and so many more.

Greatness is well within reach for Jones, and with a productive 2026 season, he'd solidify himself as a young man that'll hear his name called early when NFL franchises gather next April.

Some folks might be shaken with so much riding on the months ahead. They'd be distracted by the hope and the hype.

Well, that's other folks. That's certainly not Kelley Jones.

"I'm just keeping God first and being thankful for the situation that he's blessed me to be in," Jones said. "I'm not worrying about the draft. I'm not stressing about the little things.

"I'm so glad to be at Mississippi State. All that other talk is heartwarming and special, but I don't worry about any of that. I'm here right now and taking it day by day, staying calm and staying level."
