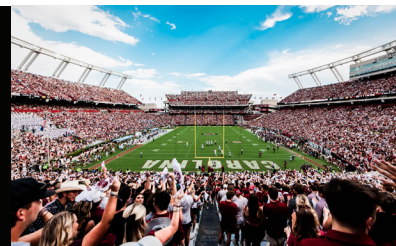

QUICKLY: The 133rd season of South Carolina football is officially underway as the Gamecocks opened the season with a pair of blowout victories over Towson (45-9) on Sep. 12 and Kent State (57-0) on Sept. 5 at Williams-Brice Stadium. The 57 points scored against the Golden Flashes were the most in a season opener in program history. The 57-point margin of victory was also the most in a season opener in program history, surpassing a 53-0 win over Erskine on Sept. 19, 1938. The Gamecocks 102 combined points scored in their first two games are their most since 1980 (scored 110 points in games 1 & 2). Head coach Shane Beamer, who is in his sixth season as head coach, has his team 2-0 for the fourth time in his tenure. His 33 wins in his first five seasons from 2021-2025 trail only Joe Morrison (37) and Steve Spurrier (35) for the most victories in program history through a head coach's first 63 games.

OVER THE AIRWAVES: Saturday afternoon's SEC opener will feature Matt Schumacker, Aaron Murray and Taylor Davis on the call for the SEC Network. The Gamecock Sports Radio Network features a pair of Gamecock Hall of Fame quarterbacks in play-by-play voice Todd Ellis (35th season) and analyst Tommy Suggs (54th season). Chet Tucker (4th season) will be on the sidelines.

SUPER SWAIN: All-SEC punt returner Vicari Swain cemented his name in the record books vs. Towson (Sept. 12) with two punt returns for touchdowns, the fourth and fifth of his career at South Carolina. He broke a 55-year old school record previously held by Dick Harris (1969-71) for the most career punt return touchdowns. Swain got loose for 58 yards with 9:37 to go in the first quarter and broke away for 45 yards with 3 seconds left in the third quarter to break Harris' long-standing program record. Since 1995, only 32 players have recorded multiple punt return TDs in the same game. Swain is the ONLY player on that list to do it twice (had two punt return TDs in a 38-10 win over SC State last season). He's currently No. 2 in the SEC with six returns for 152 yards (25.3 average) thru two games. He was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for the third time in his career on Monday. His five career punt return TDs are T-3rd most in SEC history.

GROUND GAME (#RTDB): The Gamecocks rushed 41 times for 416 yards (9.9 avg) against the Tigers on Sept. 12, the third-most rushing yards in a single game in program history. Matthew Fuller (125) and LaNorris Sellers (119) eclipsed the century mark and the Gamecocks had three touchdown runs of 50-yards or more for the first time in program history (Sellers - 58, Fuller - 55 & Isaiah Augustave - 55). Thru two games, South Carolina leads the SEC and ranks No. 3 nationally in rushing offense averaging 341.5 yards on the ground behind only Army (394.0) and Navy (376.0). The Gamecocks' 8.5 yard per carry average leads the nation, just in front of Georgia (8.2). Under Beamer, Carolina is 13-1 when rushing for 200 or more yards.

GAP INTEGRITY: Under sixth year defensive coordinator Clayton White, South Carolina has allowed just one touchdown in the first two games of the season. The Gamecocks are T-1st in scoring defense with Penn State, allowing just 4.5 points per game. Carolina ranks No. 8 in total defense, allowing 191.0 yards per game. Against Towson on Sept. 12, the Gamecocks allowed just 21 rushing yards, the fourth-fewest single game rushing yards allowed in program history.

CAROLINA VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE: The Gamecocks own a 10-7 series advantage on Mississippi State heading into Saturday's game. Carolina has won six of the nine meetings in Williams-Brice Stadium, dating back to the 1992 season. The Gamecocks have won eight of the last nine games, including the 37-30 win over the Bulldogs on Sept. 23, 2023.

WHEN WE LAST MET: Spencer Rattler went 18-for-20 passing for 288 yards and three touchdowns while Xavier Legette caught five passes for 189 yards, including touchdowns of 76 and 75 yards, in a 37-30 win over Mississippi State on Sept. 23, 2023. Rattler ran eight times for 43 while Mario Anderson had 88 yards on 26 carries. Carolina took a 37-27 lead with 9:36 to play on an Anderson 9-yard rush. Alex Huntley had a pair of sacks in the win while Judge Collier had a 25-yard fumble return.

HOW GOOD WAS THAT POPCORN?: South Carolina head coach **Shane Beamer** is very familiar with Starkville and the Bulldog program. He served on Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State from 2004-06, his first full-time coaching stop. He worked with the cornerbacks (2004-05) and running backs (2006) and served as the team's recruiting coordinator. Beamer did his best recruiting job by luring his now wife, Emily, to go out on a date, after initially laying eyes on her in the press box while she was working on the sports information staff at MSU. Emily's parents still make their home in Starkville.

A SERIES OF RUNS: Carolina is looking for its second straight win in the series after a 37-30 win in 2023. Carolina had won seven straight games over the Bulldogs from 2000 to 2013. Before that, Mississippi State won four games in a row from 1996-1999. Carolina had a 10-7 series advantage on MSU heading into Saturday.

AN EMOTIONAL GAME IN 2001: South Carolina and Mississippi State played the first NCAA Division I college football game following the September 11 terrorist attack 25 years ago on September 20, 2001. The game was televised on ESPN and pre-game ceremonies featured a massive U.S. flag on the field, a moment of silence and players and the marching band joining together to sing "God Bless America." The Gamecocks won that game in Starkville, 16-14, on a Thursday night.

BULLDOG BITES: Mississippi State comes into Williams-Brice Stadium after a pair of wins against ULM (62-13) and at Minnesota (38-13). The Bulldogs have seven touchdown passes this season, the most by the Bulldogs in the first two games of the season since 2022. Mississippi State snapped Minnesota's seven-game home winning streak this past Saturday, scoring 28 first-half points and holding the Golden Gophers to a third-quarter touchdown and a pair of field goals. Mississippi State concludes its road trip after Saturday with a pair of home games against Missouri and Alabama.

STAT LEADERS: Kamario Taylor has thrown for 581 passing yards and seven touchdowns in MSU's first two games of the year. Anthony Evans III has a pair of receiving touchdowns and has 239 receiving yards this season. Fluff Bothwell has 165 yards rushing with a pair of touchdowns. On defense, Jaray Bledsoe has 2.5 tackles for loss while Jalen Smith has a team-best 12 tackles.

A South Carolina win over Mississippi State would...

- ◆ Give the Gamecocks a 3-0 start for the first time since 2012.
- ◆ Improve head coach Shane Beamer's record to 2-4 in SEC openers.
- ◆ Be the ninth win over the Bulldogs in the last 10 matchups dating back to the 2000 season. The Gamecocks beat Mississippi State 37-30 on Sept. 23, 2023 at Williams-Brice Stadium in the last meeting between the two schools.

YOU GET A TOUCHDOWN! AND YOU GET A TOUCHDOWN!

After punting on the opening drive, South Carolina scored eight-straight touchdowns in its season-opening win over Kent State on Sept. 5. Six different players scored touchdowns for the Gamecocks marking the 15th different time that's happened since 1995 and the fourth time under Beamer. Sophomore wide receiver Donovan Murph and sophomore transfer running back Jabree Coleman each recorded their first career games with multiple TDs. Murph had four catches for a team-high 92 yards (23.0 avg), hauling in TD receptions of 29 and 37 yards. Coleman had four carries for 77 yards (19.3 avg) with TD runs of 60 and five yards. Senior running back Isaiah Augustave, junior wide receiver Mazeo Bennett Jr., junior running back Matthew Fuller and sophomore tight end Mike Tyler each added TDs as well. Augustave and Tyler's scores were each the first of their careers. Senior quarterback LaNorris Sellers had three TD passes and sophomore quarterback Cutter Woods added the first career passing TD of his career as well when he connected with Tyler from seven yards out with 6:24 remaining in the third quarter. Sellers' three TDs moved him into the top-10 all-time at South Carolina with 36 career TD tosses.

WE'VE GOT OURSELVES AN OFFENSE: Under first-year offensive coordinator Kendal Briles, the Gamecock offense racked up 645 yards of total offense (367 passing, 278 rushing) in the opener against Kent State, the fifth-most total yards in program history and the most in the Beamer era dating back to 2021. Carolina also had 35 first downs, which tied a program record (previously happened vs. Tennessee on 11/19/22). It marked the 12th time under Beamer with 500 yards of total offense and the 12th time with over 200 rushing yards.

DONUTS FOR DINNER: The South Carolina defense pitched a shutout against the Golden Flashes for the second time in the Beamer/Clayton White era (previously happened vs. EIU on 9/4/21). The Gamecocks allowed just 179 yards of total offense, forced eight punts and held the Golden Flashes to 5-of-14 (35.7%) on third down.

el capitán: For the first time in the Shane Beamer era at South Carolina, the team voted on its captains prior to the start of the season. In the past, individual captains have been selected on a game-by-game basis with a permanent vote at the end of the season. Fifth-year tight end Brady Hunt, junior linebacker Fred "JayR" Johnson, fifth-year defensive back Gerald Kilgore, fifth-year linebacker Shawn Murphy, senior quarterback LaNorris Sellers and fifth-year defensive back Peyton Williams were voted as captains for the 2026 season by their teammates. Sellers is now a three-time captain.

EXPERIENCE, EXPERIENCE, EXPERIENCE: Via Sam Khan Jr. and David Ubben of The Athletic, South Carolina has one of the most experienced teams in major college football this season ranking No.

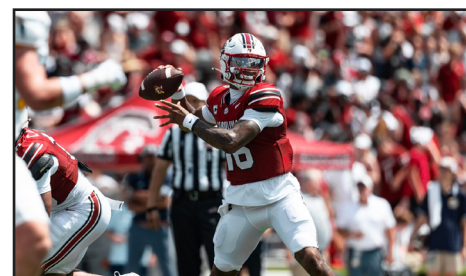

10 amongst ACC, Big 12, Big Ten and SEC programs with career snaps played on its roster. The Gamecocks' 2026 squad features 43,292 career snaps, 507 career starts and 1,386 career games played. Ole Miss is the only other SEC school to rank ahead of Carolina on the career snaps chart, checking in at No. 9 on the 68-team list.

KEEPING THE GANG TOGETHER: Carolina returns 32 letterwinners total this season, 13 on the offensive side of the ball and 17 letterwinners from 2025 on defense. The Gamecocks retained a number of key players in the offseason in quarterback LaNorris Sellers, EDGE Dylan Stewart, wide receiver Nyck Harbor, linebacker Fred "JayR" Johnson, defensive back Vicari Swain, running back Matthew Fuller, linebacker Justin Okoronkwo, defensive back Gerald Kilgore, linebacker Shawn Murphy, defensive back Judge Collier, defensive lineman Gabe Brownlow-Dindy, defensive back Peyton Williams, tight end Brady Hunt, wide receiver Donovan Murph and wide receiver Mazeo Bennett Jr. The 15 players listed have combined for 343 career games played and 165 career starts over the last three seasons at South Carolina.

TRANSFER HAUL: The Gamecocks' 2026 roster welcomes a 28-man transfer class which was recently completed with the signing of fifth-year defensive back Ethan Johnson (App State) and fifth-year kicker Ethan Sanchez (Houston). Offensive tackle Jacarius Peak headlines the portal class on the offensive side of the ball. The Valdosta, Ga. native was an All-ACC selection last season, playing in 38 career (32 starts) games in four seasons at NC State from 2022-25. A trio of players from UCF, wide receiver DJ Black, tight end Max Drag and offensive lineman Carter Miller are other key additions. Running back Christian Clark

(Texas) and wide receiver Nitro Tuggle (Purdue) also headline some of the transfer class on the offense. Defensively, Kelby Collins (Alabama), Tomiwa Durojaiye (Illinois) and Jordan Thomas (Georgia) were added to bolster the interior of the defensive line. Collins' younger brother, Drew (Arkansas State), and Caleb Herring (Tennessee) were added to the EDGE room. Quay'sheed Scot (Kentucky) projects to be in the mix at the nickel position on defense next to Gerald Kilgore.

35 YEARS IN THE SEC: The 2026 season will mark South Carolina's 35th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the SEC prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 114-158-1 (.419) all-time in SEC regular season play but posted a 42-38 (.525) record in conference action from 2010-19.

IT JUST MEANS MORE: Carolina's 2026 schedule features six teams ranked in the preseason AP/Coaches poll: No. 3/3 Georgia, No. 8/8 Texas A&M, No. 10/9 Oklahoma, No. 13/11 Alabama, No. 20/18 Tennessee and No. RV/23 Clemson in the regular season finale. Three of the games will be at Williams-Brice Stadium (Tennessee on 10/24, A&M on 11/7 and Georgia on 11/21). Entering the season, the Gamecocks' 2026 slate ranks No. 23 toughest in the ESPN Football Power Index (FPI).

REUNITED & IT FEELS SO GOOD: Georgia, Florida and Tennessee, old SEC East foes who Carolina met every year since joining the SEC in 1992 until 2024, are back on the schedule this season.

IN THE POLLS: The Gamecocks finished the 2024 season ranked 19th in both the Associated Press and the AFCA Coaches polls. It was the second time they have finished the season ranked under head coach Shane Beamer (also No. 23 in 2022) and was their highest final ranking since the 2013 season when they finished fourth, their highest ranking in school history.

THEY CALL IT A STREAK: The Gamecocks won six-straight games to finish the 2024 regular season, the first four of which came against SEC opponents (Oklahoma, Texas A&M, Vanderbilt and Missouri), and the last of which came against ACC Champion Clemson.

THAT'S A RECORD: The Gamecocks set a school record for wins over a ranked opponent in a season with four in 2024, knocking off the AP's No. 10 Texas A&M, No. 24 Vanderbilt, No. 24 Missouri and No. 12 Clemson over the final five weeks of the regular season. They had defeated three ranked teams in a season on six occasions previously. Here are the years, opponents and rankings of those wins: 2000 Georgia (9), Miss. NINE WINS: After finishing with a 9-4 record in 2024, the Gamecocks have won nine or more games eight times in their history. Carolina posted a school-record 11 wins in three-straight seasons from 2011-13...

11 wins - 3 times (2011, 2012, 2013)
10 wins - 1 time (1984)
9 wins - 4 times (2001, 2010, 2017, 2024)

ROAD WARRIORS: The Gamecocks won four true road games in 2024 for just the fourth time in school history, also winning four road games in 1968, 1994 and 2006. They logged a trio of impressive SEC road wins, all by at least three touchdowns, posting a 31-6 victory at Kentucky, winning in a 35-9 rout at Oklahoma and knocking off 24th-ranked Vanderbilt 28-7, holding all three of those opponents to under 10 points. They also won at Clemson, holding the ACC champions to just 14 points. South Carolina recorded three conference road wins for the first time since 2011 when they won at Georgia, Mississippi State and Tennessee en route to an 11-2 mark overall and a 6-2 SEC record.

MAKING SOME HISTORY: The Gamecocks recorded five SEC wins in 2024 for the first time since 2017 and for just the ninth time since joining the league in 1992.

BEAMER BEATS THE BEST: In his first four seasons as a head coach from 2021-2024, **Shane Beamer** collected seven wins over ranked opponents, including three over top-10 teams, the most by any coach in South Carolina history in their first four campaigns. THE FREAKS LIST: South Carolina has three players named to Bruce Feldman's annual Freaks List: wide receiver Nyck Harbor (No. 1), EDGE Dylan Stewart (No. 14) and quarterback LaNorris Sellers (No. 37). It's the third time (2022 & 2023 the others) Harbor has topped the list. He's the only player to be No. 1 three times since its start in 2005.

Feldman on Harbor:

"I've done this for almost a quarter century, and Harbor was the first back-to-back No. 1 Freak. It took a generational talent like Jeremiah Smith to bump him from the top spot, but Harbor is back at No. 1. To be this big and this blazing fast is truly rare. NFL scouts who came through Columbia this offseason measured him at 6-foot-6, 243 pounds with over 35-inch arms. His wingspan is 82 1/2 inches. He ran a 10.1 in the 100 and 20.20 in the 200 for the Gamecocks track team, where he's competing in the NCAAAs against runners 60 and 70 pounds lighter than him.

Harbor, who just turned 21 in July, has continued to blossom as a receiver. He caught 30 passes last season for a team-leading 618 yards and six TDs.

His 20.6 yards per reception ranked third in school history. He finished the season with back-to-back 100-yard receiving games — the first of his career — against Texas A&M and Clemson.

This offseason, Harbor, while weighing in at 235 pounds, topped out at 23.8 mph on the GPS and also measured in at just 5 percent body fat."

Feldman on Stewart:

A second-team All-SEC player in 2025, the 20-year-old is as talented as any D-lineman in college football. In 11 games last year, he had 12 TFLs, 4.5 sacks, eight QB hurries and three forced fumbles. In 2024, Stewart had 10.5 TFLs, 6.5 sacks and forced three fumbles as a freshman. The 6-6, 250-pounder, who has hit 22 mph on the GPS, was measured at just 8 percent body fat this summer.

Feldman on Sellers:

"At times, Sellers looks like Superman on the field. Clemson had a D-line full of NFL talent, and Sellers ran around and through each of them two years ago in a big road win for the Gamecocks against their archrival. He took home SEC Freshman of the Year honors in 2024 after he completed 66 percent of his passes for 2,534 yards with 18 TDs and seven INTs to go with 674 rushing yards and seven more TDs. Last year, with an offensive coordinator change, Sellers wasn't quite as sharp, but with Kendal Briles taking over, Sellers is expected to bounce back. The 6-3, 235-pound Sellers, who is down a few pounds, dropped his body fat from 7 percent to 6 percent this offseason. He also topped 22 mph on the GPS."

BROTHERLY LOVE: South Carolina is one of 13 teams in FBS with multiple sets of brothers on its squad: quarterback LaNorris Sellers and wide receiver Jayden Sellers, defensive lineman Kelby Collins and EDGE Drew Collins and linebacker Andrew Harris and defensive lineman Aiden Harris. The Harris brothers uncle is former NFL All-Pro linebacker Thomas Davis Sr.

STUDENT-ATHLETES: The Gamecocks' 2026 roster features 13 players who have already earned their undergraduate degrees: tight end Maurice Brown II, defensive back Judge Collier, wide receiver Jayden Gibson, offensive lineman Nolan Hay, tight end Brady Hunt, defensive back Gerald Kilgore, defensive back Ethan Johnson, offensive lineman Carter Miller, linebacker Shawn Murphy, linebacker Jamian Risher Jr., offensive lineman Seth Smith, defensive back Peyton Williams and EDGE George Wilson Jr. In six years under head coach Shane Beamer, Carolina has had 111 total graduates. The team's graduation success rate is 96%, No. 2 in the SEC in that stretch. The team's top-five team GPAs

all-time have come under Beamer. Sixteen current players are set to earn their undergraduate/graduate degrees in December from the University of South Carolina.

WORKING OVERTIME: The Gamecocks are 3-4 in games decided in overtime since the rule was added in 1996, the most recent being a double-overtime win at Georgia in 2019, a victory that earned them National Team of the Week honors.

OFFENSE

WELCOME HOME: The Carolina offense has a trio of new coaches this fall led by offensive coordinator Kendal Briles. Briles has 11 years of experience as a play caller at the FBS level, most recently spending the last three seasons at TCU (2023-25). He had top-35 offenses every season in Forth Worth, finishing No. 40 or higher in scoring offense each season there as well. Offensive line coach Randy Clements and running backs coach Stan Drayton were hired as well back on Dec. 11, 2025 shortly after the conclusion of the regular season. Clements and Drayton have a wealth of experience at their respective positions with Clements having 23 years of offensive line coaching under his belt and Drayton having 26 years of coaching the running back position on his resume in college and the NFL. Drayton was the running backs coach on teams that won the National Championship at Ohio State (2014) and Florida (2006), working under Urban Meyer.

THE QUARTERBACK: A three-time team captain, LaNorris Sellers returns for his third season as the Gamecocks' starting quarterback. He is one of 22 starting QBs in FBS with 24 or more career starts entering 2026. Auburn's Byrum Brown (32), Ole Miss' Trinidad Chambliss (29) and Oklahoma's John Mateer (24) are the only other QBs on the list from the SEC entering Week 1 this season. Sellers' 64.1% career completion rate is No. 3 all-time in program history behind only Spencer Rattler (67.5%) and Connor Shaw (65.5%). His 36 career touchdown passes are 10th in school history. His 14 career rushing touchdowns are fifth-most by a QB in program history, trailing Jeff Grantz (26), Connor Shaw (17), Garry Harper (15) and Stephen Garcia (15).

THE PLAYMAKERS: Nyck Harbor is back for his senior season as he looks to lead a talented crop of wideouts. A preseason All-SEC selection, he had the best season of his career in 2025 with 30 catches for 618 yards (led team) and six touchdown receptions (led team). His 20.6 yard per reception average in 2025 was No. 3 highest in school history. Harbor is a big play threat and his 17.3 career yard per catch average is No. 4 in program history. Despite losing a pair of talented players in preseason camp due to season-ending lower body injuries in sophomore Jayden Sellers and transfer Jayden Gibson (Oklahoma), it's a deep receiving corps behind Harbor with junior Mazeo Bennett Jr. and sophomore Donovan Murph. Transfers DJ Black (UCF) and Nitro Tuggle (Purdue) expect to play key roles. There's more talent with a trio of redshirt freshmen in Malik Clark, Lex Cyrus and Jordon Gidron. Freshman Sequel Patterson has had a strong preseason camp as he has pushed for early playing time as well.

THE RBs: Junior Matthew Fuller and transfer Christian Clark (Texas) headline the running back room with seniors Isaiah Augustave and Jawarn Howell and transfer Jabree Coleman (Penn State) in the mix for playing time. Fuller is a homerun hitter and Coleman leads Carolina with three rushing TDs the first two games, including his first multi-TD game against Kent State (Sept. 5).

REVAMPED O-LINE: The Gamecock o-line has nine transfers headlined by offensive tackle Jacarius Peak, an All-ACC performer and a three-year starter at NC State.

DEFENSE

MOLDING THE CLAY: Sixth-year defensive coordinator Clayton White, who has established himself as one of the top defensive play callers in the SEC, brings back 17 letterwinners from a defense that allowed 22.1 points per game and forced 22 turnovers (25th nationally) last season. Junior EDGE Dylan Stewart highlights the crop of returners with 22.5 career tackles for loss and 11.0 sacks in 24 games played the last two seasons.

SEE BALL, GET BALL: The Gamecock defense has been opportunistic under White's direction. The Gamecocks have ranked in the top-25 nationally in turnovers forced in four of his five seasons leading the defense. Carolina has forced 111 turnovers over the past six seasons, which is No. 1 in the SEC (8th nationally) during the stretch. White's defenses in Columbia have helped account for 26 total non-offensive touchdowns (seven each in 2025 and 2022) over the last six seasons.

THE LINEBACKERS: The linebacker room is led by three veterans in Fred "JayR" Johnson, Shawn Murphy and Justin Okoronkwo, who tied for the team lead last year with 64 tackles. Johnson was third with 61 stops and Murphy was sixth with 49 tackles. Former walkon Jamian Risher Jr. has had an excellent camp and projects to see some playing time as well behind the veteran trio.

THE INTERIOR OF THE DL: One of the deepest position groups on the Carolina squad projects to be the defensive tackle room led by returner Gabriel Brownlow-Dindy. The Gamecocks add three transfers who will make an immediate impact in Kelby Collins (Alabama), Tomiwa Durojaiye (Illinois) and Jordan Thomas (Georgia). Letterwinner Troy Pikes is also back. True freshmen Noah Clark and Aiden Harris are two talented players the coaching staff is high on as well. Clark checks in at 6-5, 345 pounds.

THE SECONDARY: Three-year letterwinner Judge Collier and two-year letterwinner Vicari Swain anchor the Gamecock defense at the corner spots. The safety position features veterans Peyton Williams and David Bucey with a pair of underclassmen in sophomore Kendall Daniels Jr. and true freshman J'Zavien Currence expected to see significant roles as well. Both players check in at 6-4 with size and speed to boot. Currence was an outstanding QB in high school amassing 4,403 total yards and 44 TDs his senior season in leading South Pointe (Rock Hill, S.C.) to the 4A state title.

THE EDGE FELLAS: Stewart, a consensus preseason First Team All-American, headlines the group as one of the best defensive players in the country. Transfers Drew Collins (Arkansas State) and Caleb Herring (Tennessee) provide some experienced depth. Anthony Addison, Jaquavious Dodd and Kobby Sakti-Prah are in their second years with the program, all with a chance to make an impact this season for Carolina. Highly-touted true freshman Julian Walker enters the fold as well this season and has pushed for early playing time with a strong preseason camp. The Dutch Fork (Irmo, S.C.) product is 6-6, 255 pounds.



SPECIAL TEAMS

MAKING A POINT: Sophomore Max Kelley earned the start at kicker in the opener against Kent State (Sept. 5) and was 3-for-3 on extra points. Sophomore Malik Orsan was 4-for-4 on extra points. It marked the first career points scored for each. Kelley made his first career field goal from 33 yards out vs. Towson (Sept. 12).

IT'S A BIRD! IT'S A PLANE! IT'S SUPERSWAIN: All-SEC punt returner Vicari Swain is back in the fold this season for South Carolina. He broke Dick Harris' (1969-71) 55-year old school record with his fourth and fifth career punt return TDs vs. Towson (Sept. 12). Swain and Iowa's Kaden Wetjen were the only players in FBS in 2025 with three punt return TDs. Swain's 302 punt retrun yards last season were the most by a Gamecock since Ace Sander's school record 429 yards in 2012. His 15.9 yard per punt return average was No. 3 in the SEC No. 7 in the country last season.

Shane Beamer is in his sixth season in Columbia leading the South Carolina Football program in 2026.

Beamer, who owns 35 wins in his six seasons at the helm, recently surpassed Lou Holtz for seventh among all South Carolina head football coaches. With a 35-30 record, he has coached the eighth-most games in school history. He has posted three wins over top-10 teams and seven wins over top-25 teams in his first five seasons at Carolina, tops among all Gamecock head football coaches over their first five seasons. During his tenure he has posted victories over three coaches who have won national championships – Jimbo Fisher, Dabo Swinney and Mack Brown, and has led the Gamecocks to three bowl appearances.

Beamer's 2025 squad was competitive in every game but fourth quarter struggles produced a 4-8 mark. The Gamecocks played nine teams that were bowl-eligible, six games against teams that were ranked when they played, and five that finished in the top-15 in the final CFP rankings. Carolina either led or was within a touchdown entering the fourth quarter in 10 of the 12 games, including losses to No. 23 Missouri, No. 4 Alabama and No. 3 Texas A&M when they took a lead into the final stanza. Individually, the Gamecocks placed two players on the Coaches' second-team All-SEC unit, two on the third-team and two on the SEC All-Freshman squad.

Beamer's 2024 squad was his most successful to date. The Gamecocks finished the season with a 9-4 record including a 5-3 mark in the SEC, posting nine wins in a season for just the eighth time in school history. The Gamecocks recorded a school-record four wins against ranked opponents, including three in consecutive weeks as part of a regular season-ending six-game winning streak. Carolina finished the season ranked 19th in both the final Associated Press and Coaches polls, its highest ranking since 2013 and its second top-25 ranking in the past three seasons.

Beamer was the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week for the third time in his career following the Gamecocks' upset win over Texas A&M and earned SEC Coach of the Year accolades from the AP, USA TODAY, Bear Bryant and College Football Nation. He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, the Bobby Dodd, and the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year honors and was a semifinalist for the George Munger Coach of the Year.

Individually, edge rusher Kyle Kennard was the school's first Bronko Nagurski Award winner as the nation's top defensive player and was the SEC's Defensive Player of the Year. Kennard, along with safety Nick Emmanwori, earned first-team All-America honors, while punter Kai Kroeger was a second-team selection. Quarterback LaNorris Sellers was selected as the SEC's Freshman of the Year. Sellers, offensive tackle Josiah Thompson and Edge rusher Dylan Stewart earned Freshman All-America honors, giving the Gamecocks six All-Americans as selected by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), the most of any FBS school in 2024. In addition, Kennard and Raheim Sanders were named first-team Academic All-America.

Named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020, Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award, presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

In 2022, the team again exceeded expectations by recording eight wins, including three wins over ranked opponents. The Gamecocks won eight games for just the 15th time in 129 seasons and for the first time since 2017. The Gamecocks were ranked 23rd in the country in the final AP and USA Today Coaches' polls. It marked the first time since 2013 that the Gamecocks finished the season ranked in the top-25 and the 10th time Carolina has finished the season ranked in the final AP poll. The Gamecocks defeated No. 5 Tennessee and No. 7 Clemson in the final two games of the regular season, the first time Carolina has posted back-to-back wins over top-10 teams and just the seventh time in history that a school has defeated AP Top-10 opponents in consecutive weeks as an unranked team, the first since 2003. Coach Beamer was a two-time Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week recipient after wins over Kentucky and Tennessee. Punter Kai Kroeger earned All-America honors, leading a special teams unit ranked No. 1 in the country. Five players were selected in the NFL Draft off that squad, the most since 2013.

Challenged by one of the toughest schedules in the FBS and in a season mired by numerous injuries, decimating the offensive line most notably, the 2023 Gamecocks finished the campaign with a 5-7 mark. The squad was led by quarterback Spencer Rattler and wide receiver Xavier Legette. Rattler set the school's single-season record for completions (275) and completion percentage (68.9), while his 3,186 passing yards was the third-highest total in school history. Legette, a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award, led the team with 71 receptions for 1,255 yards and seven receiving touchdowns. His 1,255 receiving yards was the second-highest single-season mark in school history.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven FBS schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He coached all three phases of the game – offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then

coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in school history.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks, tying for the SEC lead and for eighth in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked 15th in the country in total defense, and eighth in the nation in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

The Gamecocks' all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has helped build several programs during his career. He was on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs at Oklahoma from 2018-20. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring, 11th in total offense and 14th in passing offense. In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play, ranked third in total offense and fourth in passing efficiency rating. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense, scoring offense and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating in 2018.

Beamer spent two seasons (2016-17) at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart, helping the Bulldogs to a 21-7 combined record. In 2017, UGA won the SEC Championship before falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting and 20th in kickoff returns while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record, was named All-America and ACC Player of the Year, and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position came at Mississippi State in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in Dec. 2003.

Before joining the staff at UT, he worked one season (2000) as a G.A. at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He

was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, who was named the 2025 South Carolina Football Hall of Fame Humanitarian of the Year, are the parents of three children – two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.
