News, Quotes and Notes

AN 'A' FOR EFFORT

- The voting members of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) last Thursday selected Abilene Christian football upperclassmen Luke Anthony, Josh Fink, Jack Gibbens and Kade Parmelly to its Academic All-District 7 First Team.
- District 7 is composed of all NCAA DI student-athletes from Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Nebraska, New Mexico, Nevada, Oklahoma and Texas.
- Anthony, the reigning Southland Conference Student-Athlete of the Year, was the lone quarterback named to this year's list of district honorees, while Fink, a 2018 Google Cloud Academic All-America First Team honoree, was one of two receivers tabbed to the squad along with Kansas State's Dalton Schoen.
- Parmelly was accompanied on the offensive line by K-State's Adam Holtorf, Boise State's John Molchon, New Mexico's Kyle Stapley and Idaho State's Dakota Wilson.
- The linebacking trio featured Gibbens in addition to Luke Nelson of Northern Colorado and Nevada's Lucas Weber.

INTO THE LION'S DEN

Notes, milestone and record book updates following ACU's 35-14 loss to Southeastern La.:

- The Wildcats blocked a punt (Lakendrick Jones) and had a punt blocked (Justin Douglas) in the same game. ACU last blocked a punt on Sept. 30, 2017, at Incarnate Word (Erik Huhn), and had a punt blocked on Nov. 11, 2017, vs. Sam Houston State (Daegan Fowler).
- Sophomore quarterback Sema'J Davis led the Wildcats in rushing (33) and passing yards (195). His 195 passing yards tied his personal single-game high. He has passed for three touchdowns this season and run for four. He currently ranks seventh in the Southland Conference with 590 yards rushing.
- Senior running back Tracy James was kept out of the end zone for the first time all season. He ran the ball nine times for 29 yards, which was enough to eclipse 800 rushing yards for the first time in his career. James continues to lead the Southland with 10.4 points per game and 19 total touchdowns.
- Junior quarterback Luke Anthony passed Clint Longley for seventh place on the Wildcats' career passing yards list with 6,065. He needs 10 attempts to reach 1,000 for his career.
- With 89 receiving yards, senior wide receiver Josh Fink moved ahead of Johnny Knox for seventh on the school's all-time yardage list with 2,283 yards.
- Sophomore WR Kobe Clark caught six passes for 104 yards, lifting his season reception total to 76. He needs six more catches to catch Ronnie Vinson's single-season school record of 82 set in 1969. Clark has two 100-yard games this season and has 1,048 career receiving yards.
- Jeremiah Chambers surpassed 100 tackles in a single season for the second time in his career after registering nine vs. Southeastern La. (eight solo, 3 TFL). Chambers ranks first in the Southland with 6.2 solo tackles per game and second with 1.8 tackles for loss per game. He needs 11 tackles vs. Mississippi State to tie last season's total of 113.
- Quent Titre's sack was the first of his collegiate career, and for Bright Ihegworo it was his third with the Wildcats this season.
- Adonis Davis' forced fumble and recovery were the third of his career. He has two recoveries this season.

'KATS OVER 'CATS

Notes, milestone and record book updates following ACU's 24-10 loss to Sam Houston St.:

- Junior quarterback Luke Anthony threw his 50th career touchdown pass, and surpassed 6,000 career passing yards. His is only the eighth Wildcat signal caller to eclipse this milestone. Anthony is on pace to hit 1,000 career attempts in his next game vs. Mississippi State.
- Senior running back Tracy James moved in fourth place at ACU with 520 carries and needs 210 yards on the ground to surpass V.T. Smith Jr. (2,656) for fourth on the school's career rushing list.
- James caught a single-game career high nine passes for 33 yards vs. the Bearcats to set

career season highs with 34 receptions and 270 yards. He needs 94 receiving yards to reach 1,000 for his career.

- James' 14-yards touchdown reception in the first quarter was his 19th of the season and 36th of his career. Only three Wildcats have more career TD: Wilbert Montgomery (76), Bernard Scott (73) and Daryl Richardson (38).
- James' 114 points this season rank him seventh at ACU, and fifth among Wildcat running backs. Bernard Scott scored more than 200 points in both 2007 and 2008, Wilbert Montgomery totaled 224 in 1973, and Alex Davis scored 118 in 1977.
- James' 19 career touchdowns are tied with Davis' total from 1977. Scott scored 39 TD in 2007, and added 34 in 2008. Montgomery hit paydirt 31 times in 1973.
- With 65 all-purpose yards against the Bearkats, James moved into eighth on the Wildcats' all-purpose leader list with 3,362.
- ACU's eight sacks are a season best and are tied for the fourth-most in a single game in ACU history. The Wildcats' most recent eight-sack game was Sept. 1, 2011 vs. Tarleton State.
- Simon Laryea's 63 yard punt was his first past 60 yards since he booted the ball 61 yards at Stephen F. Austin on Sept. 22, 2018.

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS (AND WORKING OVERTIME)

Highlights from ACU's 37-21 overtime win at 15th-ranked Nicholls ...

- ACU football won its first game in Thibodaux and took a 2-1 series lead on the Colonels. Nicholls has been ranked in each of its last two meetings vs. the Wildcats, both losses.
- ACU has played two overtime games in the same season for the first time in program history.
- This was ACU's second straight OT win. The Wildcats are now 7-5 in extra-session games.
- This was ACU's first road OT win since Sept. 10, 2005 at Northeastern State. W, 20-14.
- This was ACU's first win over a top 25 opponent since last year's Oct. 13, 2018 win over Nicholls (W, 28-12), and first win over a top-25 team on the road since Nov. 15, 2004 (ACU 37, #24 Stephen F. Austin 35).
- The Wildcats' offense tied a season and program best with 33 first downs, and ran 91 plays for the second consecutive game (91 for 422 yards vs. SFA).
- ACU has scored in 20 consecutive games.
- The Wildcats recovered three or more fumbles in a game for the first time since Nov. 1, 2014 vs. UCA (3).
- Sema'J Davis ran for a single-game career high two touchdowns, and has two 100+ yard rushing games over the team's last three games. He rushed for 146 vs. Nicholls and 148 vs. HBU, and is up to 674 yards rushing on the season.
- Luke Anthony's 28-yard run was the longest of his career in a single game, and his touchdown pass to Josh Fink was the 49th of his career.
- Anthony became only the fourth Wildcat in program history with more than 600 completions with 601. Jim Lindsey ranks third with 642.
- Kobe Clark set a career single-game high with 11 catches for 72 yards.
- Josh Fink caught five passes for 47 yards and a touchdown. His TD was the 14th of his career as he set a personal single-season record with five TD. Fink is tied with Cle Montgomery for eighth place with 2,158 career receiving yards.
- Tracy James is up to 35 career TD (26 rush, 9 rcv) after raising his season total to 18 (14 rush, 4 rcv). He is only the fifth Wildcat RB in team history with more than 500 carries.
- James' 212 career points rank him eighth among the Wildcats' career leaders, and his 35 TD are tied for fourth with Charcandrick West. His season point and touchdown totals of 108 and 18 are tied with Johnny Knox (2007) for eighth.
- James' 14 rushing TD this season are tied for fifth in Wildcat history with West (2013) and Kelly Kent (1977).

TIMBER!

Highlights from ACU's 31-24 double overtime Homecoming win over Stephen F. Austin ...

- ACU won its first DI-era overtime game and first extra-session contest since Nov. 3, 2012. The Wildcats also have won back-to-back homecoming games for the first time since 2013-14 and consecutive homecoming games vs. conference opponents since 2010-11.
- For the first time since 2017 the Wildcats have not committed a turnover in three consecutive games.
- Senior running back Tracy James rushed for more than 100 yards in consecutive weeks for the first time in his career. His six career 100 yards games are tied for the ninth most in school history with Daryl Richardson, Gerald Todd and Alton Green.
- Senior wide receiver Josh Fink caught 12 passes for the second consecutive week, racking up 110 yards. He has three 100-yard receiving games this season and six for his career.
 - Fink is believed to be the first Wildcat of this century to post back-to-back games with 10+ receptions and 100+ yards. Taylor Gabriel was the last Wildcat in 2013 to have two non-consecutive 10 catch / 100 yard games as he caught 10 passes for 117 yards vs. Pittsburg State and had 15 catches for 188 yards at New Mexico State.
 - In Nov. 1981, Quinton Smith caught 11 passes in consecutive games for 220 and 221 yards, respectively, vs. Sam Houston State and Southwest Texas State.
 - In Oct. 1970, Ronnie Vinson caught 11 passes for 183 yards and two touchdowns vs. Lamar on the 17th and a week later he caught 13 passes for 193 yards and three TD vs. Arkansas State.
- Luke Anthony has 14 multi-passing TD games, including four this season.
- ACU's 12.0 tackles for loss were its most since a Nov. 10, 2012 game vs. UIW (12 for 63 yards lost).
- Freshman Ryan Stapp led the Wildcats in tackles for the second consecutive game as he recorded a season high 10.5 to go along with a forced fumble and INT. He has three picks this season to go along with 23 tackles.
- Temisan Kuyatsemi recorded sack No. 5 on the season, raising his career total to 7.5. He also was credited with two of 12 quarterback hurries.
- Jeremiah Chambers set a personal single-game record with 4.0 tackles for loss.
- Jack Gibbens became the first Wildcat with three pass breakups in a single game since Jamar Mack on Nov. 17, 2018.

CATS AND DOGS

Highlights from ACU's 45-20 win over Houston Baptist ...

- Senior running back Tracy James surpassed 3,000 all-purpose yards with 135 vs. the Huskies.
- Sophomore quarterback Sema'J Davis' 75-yard run from scrimmage to begin the second half is tied for the 25th longest in school history with Billy McCrary (Baylor, 2018) and three others. That run also is the second longest TD run by a Wildcat QB since Elbert Anderson took off for an 88-yard score in 1932 vs. Daniel Baker.
- Davis' 148 net yards rushing are the most by a Wildcat quarterback in a single game and a team season single-game high for 2019.
- Davis and James are only the third ACU QB / RB duo of the DI / Southland era to rush for more than 100 yards in a single game. QB John David Baker ran for 102 and RB Charcandrick West rushed for 139 in a 2013 win over McMurry, and the following season vs. Central Arkansas, RB De'Andre Brown ran for 171 yards and signal caller Kade Munden had 101.
- Senior wide receiver Josh Fink became the first Wildcat to catch 12 or more passes in a game since Taylor Gabriel caught 15 at New Mexico State on Oct. 26, 2013. His 12 receptions were the most by any Wildcat since Justin Miller caught 10 passes vs. Sam Houston State in Nov. 2017.
- Fink (112 yards) and sophomore WR Kobe Clark (107) became the first Wildcat duo to each surpass 100 yards receiving in a single game since Oct. 31, 2015 when Cedric Gilbert caught three passes for 122 yards and Carl Whitley grabbed eight for 100 and a TD.
- Fink went over 2,000 career receiving yards (2,001) in becoming only the 10th Wildcat in program history to reach this milestone.

His 43-yard kickoff return for a touchdown off an onside kick attempt was the Wildcats' first since Sept. 24, 2016 at Stephen F. Austin (Justin Miller, 93 yards) and marked ACU's first onside kick recovery since a Sept. 1, 2018 game vs. HBU.

HOUSE OF CARDS

Highlights from ACU's game at Lamar ...

- Senior running back Tracy James' two-point conversion pass to TE Branden Hohenstein was the Wildcats' first since Oct. 21, 2017 when Luke Anthony ran the ball in vs. Southeastern La. It also marked ACU's first two-point conversion pass thrown by a RB since Nov. 5, 2016 when De'Andre Brown connected with Trevor Crain in the Wildcats' 25-22 win over Northwestern State.
- Sophomore quarterback Sema'J Davis completed 18-of-26 passes with 159 yards, two TD and 61 net rushing yards. He was sacked once. Below is a list of numbers produced by Wildcat QBs in their first DI start:
 - 2013:** John David Baker at Illinois State (18-33-0, 2 TD, 232 yards, 5 sacks)
 - 2014:** Parker McKenzie at Georgia State (30-40-1, 4 TD, 403 yards, 2 sacks)
 - 2014:** Kade Munden vs. Central Arkansas (6-8-0, 3 passing TD, 49 yards passing, 100 yards rushing, 2 rushing TD, 3 sacks)
 - 2015:** Dallas Sealey vs. #7 McNeese (22-42-1, 284 yards, 1 TD, 1 receiving TD, 2 sacks)
 - 2017:** Luke Anthony at Northwestern St. (29-45-0, 345 yards, 2 TD, 3 sacks)
- Ryan Stapp's 53-yard interception return was his second of the season and the longest by any Wildcat since Adonis Davis had a 52-yard return last November vs. Northwestern St. The team's longest interception of the DI era was by Jonathan Epps (68 yards, TD) vs. Central Arkansas on Nov. 1, 2014.

FOR THE BIRDS

Highlights from ACU's game at Incarnate Word ...

- With 97 yards on the ground vs. UIW, Tracy James surpassed 2,000 career rushing yards (2,011).
- Luke Anthony eclipsed 5,000 career passing yards (5,160) with 197 vs. UIW.
- The Wildcat defense finished the game with four sacks, resulting in a loss of 28 yards.
- Jack Gibbens recorded his first sack of the season and second interception. He recorded 10 tackles vs. UIW.
- Jeremiah Chambers scooped up his second fumble recovery to go along with 13 tackles.

THE COWBOYS ARE FINISHED!

Highlights from ACU's first-ever program victory over McNeese, 17-10, at Wildcat Stadium ...

- With 313 yards, Luke Anthony passed for more than 300 yards in consecutive games for only the second time in his career. He passed for 345 and 315 vs. UIW and McNeese last season.
- Tracy James' 59-yard TD reception was the second longest of his career. He caught a 76 yarder in his very first collegiate game in 2016 at Air Force.
- Josh Fink has caught 18 passes in his last two games vs. McNeese.
- WR Justus Lee had a career-best long catch of 39 yards.
- The ACU defense has recorded 12 sacks in its last two games vs. McNeese.
- Junior Kameron Hill recorded his third 2.0 sack game of the season, tying his season high of 6.0 from 2018. Temisan Kuyatsemi also had two sacks vs. the Cowboys.
- Brandon Richmond's INT was the third of his career.
- Jack Gibbens' established a single-game high with 13 tackles. He also was credited with the game-ending fumble recovery as time expired.
- Jeremiah Chambers finished one tackle shy of tying his single-game record of 16 set last year at McNeese. He did, however, record a personal best two pass breakups.
- Simon Laryea's 10 punts were his most since recording the same number during the 2018 game vs. McNeese.

CLOSE CALL AT UCA

Abilene Christian's 31-30 loss Saturday, Sept. 14 at No. 14 Central Arkansas featured the following ...

- Josh Fink finished two yards shy of 100 receiving yards, but caught a pass of more than 40 yards for the third straight game after hauling in a 44-yard reception.
- Kicker Blair Zepeda booted ACU's first 50-yard field goal in eight seasons (2011, Morgan Lineberry vs. Incarnate Word) with his 51-yarder at the start of the fourth quarter. His distance was a career high and tied him for the seventh-longest in school history.
- The Wildcat defense has limited the opposition to less than 50 yards rushing over their last two games (44 yards per game).
- Kameron Hill recorded his second 2.0 sack game of the season (plus a fumble recovery).
- Jack Gibbens' interception was his first of the season and third of his career. His 25-yard return off the red-zone pick was a career single-game high.

"That's a really good football team. We've been talking the last five days about how they've outscored their opponents in the fourth quarter, and so when it happens to you ... it's disappointing. I thought we stayed aggressive. I don't feel like we got conservative. They made some plays over the top, and you have to take their hats off to them to do what they've done over the last three weeks. That says a lot about their coaching staff, leadership and character.

WHAT A RUSH!

Abilene Christian's 66-14 win Saturday over Arizona Christian featured the following ...

- The Wildcats recorded 400 or more yards rushing in a game (425) for the first time since Nov. 22, 2008 (427 vs. West Texas A&M). ACU's net yards rushing were the third most in team history as the record of 444 was set in Nov. 1963 vs. UT Arlington.
- The Wildcats 703 yards of total offense were its most since the aforementioned game vs. West Texas A&M (810), and fifth most in school history.
- ACU has scored 60 or more points 17 times in school history, and last night marked their fourth game over 60 points since moving up to DI.
- ACU had 12 scoring drives of less than three minutes in length and three shorter than a minute (14, 9 and 52 seconds. The Wildcats didn't punt until 3:41 remained in the third quarter.
- The last time ACU scored 50 points in a game at home was 2016 – doing it twice in a 55-52 loss to Central Arkansas and a 52-27 win over University of the Incarnate Word
- ACU's 33 first downs tied the program record from Nov. 1975 (Tarleton State). The Wildcats registered 19 first downs via rush, 11 via pass, and three on penalties. By comparison, Arizona Christian's eight first downs (2 rush, 5 pass, 1 penalty) were the fewest recorded by an opponent since Sept. 2014 when Incarnate Word mustered nine.
- Luke Anthony's four touchdown passes lifted his career total to 39 through 20 games. He ranks eighth all-time in school history, and during the first half he eclipsed both Jim Reese (37) and Parker McKenzie (38). He also set a career single-game high vs. Arizona Christian for longest run at 17 yards.
- Running back Tyrese White's 126 net rushing yards were his most since gaining 118 vs. Houston Baptist in Sept. 2018.
- Running back Tracy James hit paydirt three times vs. the Firestorm (two rush, one receiving), bringing his career total to 22 touchdowns (16 rushing TD, 134 points). This was his first three TD game since Nov. 2018 vs. Northwestern State (one rush, two receiving).
- Wide receiver Josh Fink caught four passes for 69 yards and a 48-yard touchdown reception.

"I'm proud of our team. We did what we should have done by starting fast and finishing strong. I think we also played well over 100 guys, and that's great for us to see the young guys, the true freshmen compete."

MEAN GREEN WITH ENVY

Spotlight notes from ACU's Aug. 31 game at North Texas ...

- Tracy James finished the game with 153 all-purpose yardage (106 rushing / 47 receiving) and two touchdown runs. This was the fourth 100-yard rushing game of his career and first vs. a FBS opponent. His all-purpose total was the second highest of his career. He combined for 180 yards in Nov. 2017 vs. Sam Houston St.
- With a 9.9 rushing average, Billy McCrary just missed recording his second career game averaging 10 or more yards per carry. He holds the school's single-game DI era record with 15.9 yards per rush vs. Southeastern La. (Oct. 2018). In his two season openers with the Wildcats he has two of the school's longest runs from scrimmage (75 at Baylor, 2018 and 69 at North Texas, 2019).
- Quarterback Luke Anthony finished the game with 273 yards, giving him 13 200+yard passing games through 14 starts. His 64-yard touchdown pass to Josh Fink with 5:57 left in the fourth quarter, kept his consecutive games with a TD pass alive at 14, was the second longest TD pass of his career (67 yards to Chase Cokley at HBU, 2018), and put him past 4,000 career passing yards (4,068).
- Sophomore Kobe Clark caught nine passes for 60 yards. The nine receptions tied his career single-game high from last season's home win vs. Angelo State. Only three Wildcats have caught 10 or more passes since the team's move to DI: Taylor Gabriel (x3), Darian Hogg and Justin Miller.
- Senior Josh Fink's TD reception was the 10th of his career and second vs. a FBS opponent (at Air Force, 2016).
- Senior Adonis Davis' sixth career interception (11:25 of the second quarter) was only the sixth thrown by North Texas QB Mason Fine dating back to the start of last season (31 TD).
- Junior Kameron Hill twice sacked Fine for the third 2.0 sack game of his Wildcat career. Hill also racked up two sacks in ACU's 2018 meetings vs. Central Arkansas and McNeese. He is the first Wildcat with a two sack game vs. a FBS opponent since Nic Richardson twice met the Georgia State QB in the backfield on Aug. 27, 2014.

"I was very proud of our team. I thought they competed at a really, really high level in the third and fourth quarters. I thought we played really good football against a really good football team who still had their starters in."

"If we could go back and replay that first quarter and not give up that kickoff return and those big plays early. I was really proud of our team. We settled in. I know we gave up some yards tonight. But (Fine is) a Heisman candidate. He's a heck of a player."

PRESEASON PREDICTORS: Five members of the Abilene Christian football team were named to the 2019 Southland Preseason All-Conference Teams. Seniors Jeremiah Chambers (LB) and Billy McCrary (RB) attained first team honors as returning all-conference selections, while Josh Fink (WR), Kade Parmelly (OL) and Bolu Onifade (DB) all received spots on the second team.

The 2019 Southland Conference preseason rankings reflected the closeness of last year's standings as three schools received at least one first-place vote and a mere 42 points separated the second to seventh-ranked teams. Nicholls (7-2), which won the league's regular-season crowd by a half game over Incarnate Word (6-2), collected 20 of 22 first-place votes to finish well ahead in the poll with 200 points. One of those Colonel's defeats came against the Wildcats, who ranked seventh with 112 points and one first place vote. The other first-place nod went to the third-ranked UIW Cardinals (150).

CONTRACT TALK: Head coach Adam Dorrel agreed to a multi-year extension that will keep him under contract through the 2023 season. A three-time Coach of the Year at Northwest Missouri State, Dorrel led the Wildcats to their first winning DI season in 2018.

"ACU fans saw the progress made in Adam's second season at the helm. They should be excited about the future of ACU football. And as the AD, it's pleasing to know that Coach Dorrel is making decisions in the long-term best interest of the program. He has earned this extension."

JUDGING CHAMBERS: Senior linebacker Jeremiah Chambers was named Second Team FCS Preseason All-America by STATS. This national recognition for Chambers comes on the heels of a brilliant 2018 season, in which the three-down linebacker finished third in the league in total tackles (113) and sixth in solo tackles (59). The Austin native also ranked eighth in the league in tackles for loss (14.5) and had one pass breakup, one pass defended, three quarterback hurries, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries. His 113 tackles were tied for 10th-best in ACU single-season history and he recorded a career-high 16 tackles at McNeese on Oct. 6. Chambers earned his lone Southland Conference Defensive Player of the Week plaudit on Oct. 15 after leading ACU to a 28-12 upset over then-No. 9 Nicholls. His performance was composed of 14 tackles (8 solo), including 3.0 tackles for loss and one sack.

QB ACADEMY: Luke Anthony served as a counselor at the Manning Passing Academy, joining the best quarterbacks in college football. Anthony was contacted by the camp after he emailed Cooper Manning – the older brother of Peyton and Eli Manning – and sent him film and stats. He was selected to be one of 38 camp counselors, including 30 quarterbacks from the FBS level.

WATCH ME NOW: College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) announced its 2019 preseason watch list for the CFPA FCS National Performer of the Year Trophy, and included among the 40 players was Wildcat quarterback Luke Anthony. The Dallas native ranked among the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) top 10 leaders in completions, attempts, passing yards, completions per game and total offense in 2018. He also led the Southland Conference in completions and attempts and was second in TD passes. Anthony additionally ranked second in total passing yards and fourth in passing yards per game, as he finished the season with 319 completions and 484 attempts to set new single-season ACU records. A two-year team captain and graduate of All Saints’ Episcopal School, Anthony received additional academic accolades at the conclusion of 2018. He was voted Southland Conference Football Student-Athlete of the Year and earned a spot on the FCS ADA Academic All-Star team after posting a 4.0 GPA as a finance major.

ON SCHOLARSHIP: Junior offensive lineman Jon Crisp (Abilene, Texas) and sophomore wide receiver Kobe Clark (Sweetwater, Texas) were surprised halfway through fall camp with scholarships presented to them by head coach Adam Dorrel. Clark hauled in 28 passes during his rookie campaign, including a season-high nine in the 2018 home opener vs. Angelo State for 83 yards. Crisp has been with the Wildcats since 2016. He made five appearances on the O-Line in 2017 before earning seven starts last year, helping the offense produce some of its best numbers at the DI level.

HEAD OF THE CLASS: Did you know seven members of the Wildcat football team are enrolled in graduate school? Sacred Heart and William & Mary are tied for the FCS lead with 12 players on each of their rosters with degrees. Sam Houston State leads the Southland Conference with eight players.
