SEC ROAD OPENER

- » No. 8 Auburn (4-1, 1-1 SEC) visits Mississippi State (3-2, 0-2 SEC) for an SEC West matchup Saturday, October 6, at Davis Wade Stadium in Starkville, Miss.; ESPN2 will televise the 6:30 p.m. CT contest that is the SEC road opener for the Tigers.
- Auburn travels only 848 total miles to its five away games this season, with contests in Atlanta; Starkville, Miss.; Oxford, Miss (the longest trip at 263 miles); Athens, Ga.; and Tuscaloosa, Ala. Only Ball State (827 miles) has a shorter FBS travel itinerary this year.

SERIES HISTORY

>> The Tigers hold a 63-26-2 (.703) record all-time against Mississippi State and have won seven of the last 10 matchups against the Bulldogs, including a 49-10 victory in Auburn last season.

Auburn has a 29-7 advantage in all games played at Auburn, a 13-6-1 lead in all games played at Starkville, and a 21-13-1 advantage in games played at neutral sites. Those include Birmingham, Ala. (AU leads 14-11-1); Columbus, Miss. (AU leads 1-0); Jackson, Miss. (AU leads 5-2); and Montgomery, Ala. (AU leads 1-0). Three of Auburn's last eight games versus Mississippi State have come down to the final drive of the game.

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 317-246-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 133-58-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 184-188-12 overall. The Tigers are 26-16 in SEC action under Coach Gus Malzahn.

Auburn is 44-35-6 all-time in SEC road openers. The Tigers have won 18 of their last 22 SEC road openers back through 1996, including a 51-14 win at Missouri last season.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- The Tigers are third nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 12.6 points per game
- » Auburn is also eighth in rushing defense (92.8), 15th in pass efficiency defense (103.00), third in third-down conversion defense (0.253), 16th in total defense (304.6) and seventh in turnovers gained (11)
- >> Tiger freshmen have accounted for 100 of Auburn's 163 points this season (61.3 percent), including 11 of 19 TDs (57.9 percent).
- » Auburn has held its opponent below a 50.0 pass completion percentage in three of the last four games, and in seven of 11 games back through last November
- Auburn has four opponents ranked in the current AP Top 10, and play three of those away from home

- The Tigers are one of only 18 teams nationally with eight or more scoring drives of 10+ plays this season
- Auburn leads the nation having allowed just five total TDs this season and only one rushing touchdown (vs. LSU) through five games
- » Jarrett Stidham to Ryan Davis is now the second most productive pass tandem in Auburn history, with 106 completions; the Auburn record is 140 completions by Pat Sullivan to Terry Beasley (1969-71)
- >> Auburn is ranked 10th nationally in total TFL, averaging 8.8 per game this season
- Auburn is one of nine teams nationally to return a kickoff and a punt for a TD, along with Alabama, Appalachian State, Michigan, North Texas, Pitt, Toledo, Troy and Utah State

SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

TOTAL OFFENSE

There have been nine 600-yard total offense games and 23 500-yard games during Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn, the latest being the 567-yard output against Alabama State.

Auburn has gained at least 200 yards total offense in a quarter 15 times under Gus Malzahn, eight times against SEC teams.

» Auburn has scored in all 72 games of the Malzahn era, the third-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012, the last game prior to Malzahn taking over at Auburn.

- >> The 63 points vs. Alabama State was the highest total by Auburn during the Malzahn era and the most since scoring 62 in the 2013 Western Carolina game. During the Malzahn tenure, it was the 27th time Auburn has scored 40 points or more, the 11th time during that era Auburn has scored 50 points or more, and the second time scoring 60 points or more.
- Auburn has scored first in 20 of its last 23 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign. Auburn scored first in 12 of 14 games last year. The Tigers are 38-11 under Coach Gus Malzahn when scoring first.
- Auburn had 27 first downs in the season opener against Washington and 28 vs. Alabama State. Under Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 51-72 games, with 32 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn averages 22.2 first downs per game under Malzahn.
- Auburn's 54-point win over Alabama State was its 20th of 50 or more points at Jordan-Hare Stadium and the third of the Gus Malzahn era.

ON THE RUN

- » Against Alabama State, JaTarvious Whitlow (122 yards, 14 carries) and Shaun Shivers (117 yards, 13 carries, 1TD) became the first pair of Auburn freshmen ever to rush for 100 yards each in a game, as the Tigers rushed for 429 yards overall, seventh most of the Malzahn era.
- » Whitlow followed that up with 104 yards rushing on 22 carries with a 7-yard touchdown against LSU, the first Auburn freshman since Michael Dyer in 2010 to rush for 100 yards in back-to-back games.
- » In just five games, Whitlow has scored four rushing touchdowns, tied for eighth among Auburn all-time freshman rushers; Arkansas was his first multiple-TD game. Whitlow's 326 yards for the season rank 21st all-time among Auburn freshmen.
- Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 49 of 72 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Twelve different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (61 100-yd performances).

Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher during the Malzahn era is 38-11; with two 100-yard rushers in the same game, it's 12-0. Current players' 100-yard rushing games:

PASSING ATTACK

- ›› Quarterback Jarrett Stidham recorded his 12th 200-yard passing game of his Auburn career with his 245-yard effort against Southern Miss (19-33, 2 TD).
- » Stidham recorded the highest completion percentage in a season opener in Auburn records for games with more than 25 passing attempts. Stidham was 26-36 (.722) for 273 yards with a touchdown vs. Washington. The previous best was 71.8% (28-39) by Patrick Nix vs. Ole Miss in 1995.
- » At 33.95 ppg, Stidham ranks sixth nationally among QBs who have led their team to an average of at least 30 points over 10 or more career starts. His teams have 747 points in 22 career starts at Baylor and Auburn.
- Stidham's career completion percentage (65.6) puts him close to Auburn's career mark of 66.1 percent by Cam Newton (2010). His 216.9 passing yards per game would break Pat Sullivan's (1969-71) career mark of 209.47, and Stidham's 17.26 completions per game would break Sullivan's record of 15.067.

Stidham's 146.81 career efficiency rating is close to the career mark of 148.20 set by Jason Campbell (2001-04).

- Senior Ryan Davis now has 130 career receptions, fifth in Auburn history. Davis ranks 21st in Auburn career receiving yardage with 1,175 career yards.

Davis has caught multiple passes in 19 straight games since the start of 2017. His streak of 19 straight games with a catch is the longest by an Auburn player since Ricardo Louis had a 24-game streak from 2013-15.

- Davis is averaging 6.75 receptions in eight games against ranked opponents since the beginning of last season. Last year, Davis set the Auburn single-season record for receptions with 84 and ranked second in the SEC in receptions per game (6.0).
- Stidham to Davis is now the second most productive pass tandem in Auburn history, with 106 completions, passing Dameyune Craig to Karsten Bailey (97 completions between 1995-97). The Auburn record is 140 completions by Pat Sullivan to Terry Beasley (1969-71)

- » Darius Slayton recorded his seventh career touchdown pass with a four-yard reception from Stidham against LSU, his first score of the season. Slayton led the 2017 team in yards per catch, averaging 22.2 yards per reception on 29 catches, fifth best nationally; he is averaging 14.46 yards per catch this season.
- Against Alabama State, true freshman Anthony Schwartz recorded his first career touchdown, a 57-yard reception. Schwartz then added a 23-yard rush in the second quarter for his first career TD run. The last Auburn receiver to score rushing and receiving TD in the same game was Stanton Truitt vs. Arkansas in 2016.

Schwartz added another touchdown vs. Southern Miss on a 6-yard rush.

>> Already this season, 16 different Auburn receivers have caught at least one pass.

DEFENSIVE DOMINATION

- » Auburn ranks third nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 12.6 points per game.
- Senior linebacker Deshaun Davis recorded a career-high 13 tackles against No. 12 LSU, and tied his career bests with 4.0 TFL, a sack and a PBU. He also had two QB hurries and was named Lott Trophy Impact Player of the Week.
- In 14 games against ranked opponents under Steele, Auburn has allowed an average of 20.4 ppg and has allowed 17 or fewer points eight times (57.1 percent).

Prior to his arrival, the Tigers allowed 31.5 ppg in 38 games against ranked opponents from 2009-15, and only held seven ranked opponents to 17 or fewer points (18.4 percent).

- >> The Tigers have improved in total defense during Steele's time on the Plains. The Tigers allowed 405.2 ypg in 2015 in the year before Steele joined Auburn's staff; in his first season (2016), the Tigers allowed 361.9 ypg and allowed 319.4 ypg last year [the fewest allowed in a season since 2007 (297.9)]. Auburn is allowing 304.6 ypg this season.
- Under Steele, the Auburn defense has held its opponent under its season rushing average coming into the game 26 times, including each of the last nine games (does not include season openers). In 21 of those games, Auburn has held its opponent to 40-or-more yards below its season average.
- >> Current players with career double-figure tackle games at Auburn:

Deshaun Davis (6)
Darrell Williams (1)

>> In a three-season span, Auburn is eighth nationally having allowed only 4.81 yards per play since the start of the 2016 campaign.

- Auburn has allowed only 17.0 points per game in Kevin Steele's three seasons as the Tigers' defensive coordinator, ninth among FBS teams.
- » In 32 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 77 sacks (2.4 per game) and has been held without a sack only four times. Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 22 of those games. The Tigers are averaging 8.8 TFL per game this season, 10th best nationally.

The Tigers have forced 46 turnovers (23 INT, 23 FR) and allowed only 20 rushing touchdowns during that stretch.

Against Alabama State, Daniel Thomas recorded his fourth and fifth career interceptions, his first multiple-interception game since the 2016 Alabama game. Thomas' first career TD came on his first quarter 29-yard interception.

Thomas is one of just five Auburn players since 1996 to record multiple interceptions in multiple games, along with Jonathan Jones (2), Walter McFadden (2), Larry Casher (2) and Brad Ware (3). Jamien Sherwood also had a pick against the Hornets.

Against Arkansas, Javaris Davis recorded his first interception of the season, with a 57-vard return.

Jeremiah Dinson and Christian Tutt grabbed their first career interceptions vs. Southern Miss.

- >> Career interceptions by current players:

- Auburn is third nationally having allowed just 20 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers are fourth nationally allowing only 59 total TD during that span.

- Auburn has held its opponent below a 50.0 pass completion percentage in three of its last four games, and in seven of 11 games back through last November. Auburn is 16th nationally allowing just a 51.7 completion percentage this season.
- Auburn ranks 19th nationally in total sacks, averaging 3.0 per game this season, and 10th nationally in TFL per game (8.8).

The Tigers recorded five sacks against Washington, the third time since the start of the 2017 season Auburn has recorded at least five sacks in a game. Prior to last season, the Tigers had only three such games in the previous 11 seasons, a span of 143 games.

Auburn had four sacks and 9.0 TFL against Alabama State and added 7.0 TFL against LSU and Arkansas. Auburn recorded 12.0 TFL against Southern Miss.

The Tigers ranked 103rd among FBS teams with just 19 sacks in 2015 prior to Kevin Steele's arrival. In his first season, Auburn recorded 25 sacks, ranked 71st nationally. Last season, the Tigers racked up 37 sacks, 19th nationally and the most for Auburn since notching 39 in 2005.

- >> Three current players have totaled more than 100 career tackles each at Auburn: Deshaun Davis (193), Darrell Williams (138) and Dontavius Russell (129). Soon to join that group are Marlon Davidson (97), Derrick Brown (89) and Montavious Atkinson (86).
- » LB Darrell Williams (8 tackles, TFL, FR, PBU) was the SEC defensive player of the week and buck Nick Coe (2 TFL, 1 sack, FF) was named SEC defensive lineman of the week for their play in the Washington win.
- Auburn's defense has allowed only four touchdowns in the first quarter in the last 24 games, and only three in the opening period since the start of 2017.

The Tigers have held three of their last four opponents under 300 total yards; Southern Miss had 260. Auburn held Southern Miss to just 45 rushing yards, the second time this season holding an opponent to fewer than 50 yards rushing (Alabama State 47).

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Auburn is one of nine teams nationally that have returned a kickoff and a punt for a TD, along with Alabama, Appalachian State, Michigan, North Texas, Pitt, Toledo, Troy and Utah State.
- Auburn kickers have converted 244 consecutive PAT attempts back to the 2013 Tennessee game, the longest active streak in the FBS. That is the SEC record, topping 234 consecutive PAT by Texas A&M from 2013-17.

Cody Parkey (2013) and Daniel Carlson (2014-17) were Auburn's previous kickers during the streak; Carlson set the SEC individual record for consecutive PAT (198) before graduating. The NCAA record is 302, set by Florida State from 2012-16.

- Auburn is two games ahead of Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (122) without having a punt blocked. Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.
- Redshirt freshman kicker Anders Carlson picked up where his brother, SEC career scoring leader Daniel Carlson, left off. Anders was 3-5 on field goals in his debut against Washington, making kicks from 28, 32 and 53 yards.

That 53-yarder ties for the second-longest field goal ever made by an Auburn freshman. The record is held by Win Lyle (55 yards vs. Tennessee in 1987); Robert McGinty was good on a 53-yarder against Cincinnati in 1984.

Anders Carlson is 16-16 on PAT attempts and 23-27 on touchbacks (10th nationally) on kickoffs during his young career.

With 508 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons are chasing Florida State's Roberto and Ricky Aguayo (634 current points) for the most points scored by an active kicking duo of brothers who kicked for the same college. The overall record for kicking brothers is 743 points by Kris and Drew Brown, who kicked at Nebraska.

- Auburn ranks 11th nationally in net punting (42.13). Punter Arryn Siposs is averaging 44.9 yards per kick (13th ranked nationally), with five punts of 50+ yards. His career best was a 60-yarder vs. Arkansas.
- Devan Barrett recovered a blocked punt for a touchdown against Alabama State for his second career score.

The punt was blocked by lordyn Peters. who also recorded a punt block versus Arkansas, making him just the second Auburn player since 1996 to block two punts in a season (Justin Fetsko, 2003).

- Noah Igbinoghene's 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Arkansas was the first of his career and the first for Auburn since Corey Grant in 2013 vs. Tennessee. It's the longest Auburn kickoff return since Tre Mason vs. Washington State in 2013 (100 yards). Igbinoghene was named SEC special teams player of the week.
- Ryan Davis, who ranks 13th nationally with a 13.9 yard punt return average, is tied for third among FBS players with three returns of at least 20 yards and one of only four players with three returns of at least 30 yards.

MORE FROM THE SOUTHERN MISS GAME

- The game was halted with a weather delay for lightning at 4:12 p.m., with 4:27 remaining in the second quarter; play resumed at 6:56 p.m., so a 2:44 overall delay. The last weather delay at Jordan-Hare Stadium was during the 2014 Arkansas game.
- Chandler Cox scored his first career receiving touchdown on the third-quarter pass from Jarrett Stidham. Cox has now tied his previous season best with eight receptions this season.
- Seth Williams' 46-yard touchdown reception from Jarrett Stidham in the first quarter was his first touchdown catch at Auburn and a career-long reception.

RANKINGS

- Auburn has played 32 games against ranked teams in Gus Malzahn's 69 games as the Tigers' head coach (45.6 percent of total games). Of those, 18 have been against Top 10 opponents. Auburn is 15-17 in games against ranked opponents under Malzahn, including a 7-11 mark against Top 10 teams.
- Auburn is 23-2 at home as an AP-ranked team under head coach Gus Malzahn.
- During the Gus Malzahn era, Auburn has been part of 24 matchups of AP-ranked teams. The Tigers are 12-12 in those meetings between ranked teams, including a 7-1 mark in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

>> The Tigers have played five of the six teams that have played in the CFP Championship Game over the last three seasons, including all four from the last two years.

This season, Auburn plays seven teams that played in a bowl game in 2017 and is one of 13 Power 5 teams, including Notre Dame, that plays five opponents ranked in the AP preseason poll. The Tigers are the only team from that group that plays four of those games away from home.

- Auburn's record as a ranked team alltime is 318-113-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 179-31-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 139-82-4 all-time.
- >> Auburn is 23-19-2 in Top 10 matchups all-time (9-7-1 at Jordan-Hare Stadium).
- >> Auburn is 109-157-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 50-41-2 at home against ranked teams, 27-66-2 on the road and 32-50-2 on a neutral field.
- When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 77-71-4 (33-13-1 at home, 21-36-1 away and 23-22-2 on a neutral field).
- >> The Tigers are 86-126-5 all-time when facing ranked SEC opponents (40-32-2 at home, 27-59-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 56-48-3 overall (27-9-1 at home, 18-29-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

- » Dontavius Russell is Auburn's first four-year defensive line starter since Nosa Eguae, who started 43 games from 2010-13. H-back Chandler Cox is also a four-year starter.
- >> Already this season, 44 players have seen their first game action in an Auburn uniform, including 21 true and 14 redshirt freshmen.
- >> In their 126th season of football, the Tigers have 763 total victories since 1892, 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs.
- Since 2001, Auburn is 136-24 (.852) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 192-32-1 (.857) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 531-52-9 (.904) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 333-9 (.974) when scoring 30 points, 166-3 (.982) when scoring 40 points, 75-0 when scoring 50 points and 26-0 when scoring 60 points.

» AUBURN, Ala. (Sept. 30, 2017) --Dominating defense, a vertical passing game and a trio of Kerryon Johnson touchdowns highlighted No. 13 Auburn's 49-10 win Saturday over No. 24 Mississippi State.

Auburn gained 205 yards on four of Jarrett Stidham's passes, including a 57-yarder to Eli Stove that Stidham launched from deep in Auburn's end zone to begin a 99-yard drive.

While Stidham averaged 20 yards per completion (13-for-16 for 264 yards), Auburn limited MSU's Nick Fitzgerald to 157 passing yards, while forcing 20 incompletions.

Auburn intercepted Fitzgerald twice, with Javaris Davis' 37-yard interception return early in the fourth quarter giving the Tigers a 42-10 lead. Tray Matthews made Auburn's other interception.

Through five games, Auburn has allowed 55 points. The Tigers are the only FBS team to allow 14 or fewer points in each game this

Johnson gained 116 yards on 23 carries, scoring three touchdowns, including two in the second half as Auburn pulled away.

Malik Willis scored his first Auburn touchdown, a 67-yarder with 3:04 remaining for the final score.

On the game's third play, Johnson ran 58 yards to MSU's 5. Four plays later, Johnson scored his seventh touchdown of the season on fourth-andgoal from the 1 after Malzahn called a timeout and decided against attempting a field goal.

State kicked a 40-yard field goal after recovering a Stidham fumble.

Auburn responded with razzle dazzle; a 49-yard flea flicker from Stidham to Darius Slayton. After Johnson's 13-yard run, Stidham hit Ryan Davis, who reached for the pylon for a 7-yard TD to put Auburn ahead 14-3 with 4:55 left in the first

After Auburn's defense forced its second three-and-out, Stidham found a wide open Will Hastings for a 47-yard, one-play drive that made it 21-3 with 13:38 remaining in the second quarter.

Auburn maintained the momentum when Daniel Thomas stopped State's punter 1 yard short of a first down on a fake punt, but a 52-yard field goal attempt hit the upright. The Bulldogs scored on a 5-yard touchdown pulled MSU within 21-10 with 59 seconds left in the half, but Auburn outscored State 28-0 in the second half.

FAST FACTS

- "Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in seven of his 12 seasons as a collegiate coach."
- » Malzahn had 35 victories in his first four seasons as Auburn head coach, the second-most in Auburn history behind only Terry Bowden.
- » His 20-7 record was the second-best start in Auburn history, only behind Terry Bowden, who started 20-1-1 in 1993-94.
- » Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last eight seasons with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012.
- » Now in his sixth season, Malzahn is fifth among Auburn football coaches all-time in total wins.

The leaders (and seasons coached): 176, Ralph "Shug" Jordan (25); 99, Pat Dye (12) and Mike Donahue (18); 85, Tommy Tuberville (10); 49 *Gus Malzahn (6)*; 48, Jack Meagher (9); 47, Terry Bowden (6); 33, Gene Chizik (4); 29, Doug Barfield (5); 22, Chet Wynne (4).

- "Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989).
- » Since 2000, in the seven seasons Malzahn has been at Auburn, the Tigers have posted 20 50-point games; in the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers have recorded three 50-point games in a season twice since Malzahn took over as Auburn head coach (2013 and 2016).
- » Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining Bernie Moore (LSU, 1935) and John Vaught (Ole Miss, 1947).

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is entering its 80th year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 23 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 411 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 322, losing 82 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .7912 against some of the best teams in college football.

In a victory that will provide a season-long strength of schedule resume boost, No. 9 Auburn defeated No. 6 Washington 21-16 Saturday in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

JaTarvious Whitlow's 10-yard touchdown run on third-and-7 gave Auburn a 5-point lead with 6:15 remaining, capping a 10-play, 76-yard drive.

Jarrett Stidham completed 26 of 36 passes for 273 yards and a touchdown. Kam Martin rushed for 80 yards on 22 carries. Ryan Davis had seven receptions for 52 yards.

As it had done throughout the second half, Auburn's defense came up big time after time, including the Huskies' final possession. On third-and-13 from the Auburn 40, Big Kat Bryant sacked Washington quarterback Jake Browning. The Tigers again harassed Browning on fourth down, forcing an incompletion. Auburn ran out the clock, celebrating a top 10 victory and posing with the old leather helmet trophy.

With Auburn leading 15-13 in the third quarter, Nick Coe forced a fumble on Browning's option pitch on third-and-goal at the 3. Darrell Williams recovered, preserving the lead.

The Huskies took a 16-15 lead when Peyton Henry's 30-yard field goal deflected inside the uprights.

Auburn's offense delivered when it mattered most, with Stidham leading the Tigers on the game-winning drive, hitting Darius Slayton for 21 yards to Washington's 25. Four rushing plays took the ball to the 10, where Whitlow powered in for the go-ahead score.

The Tigers led 15-13 at the half.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out on the opening possession, Ryan Davis' 32-yard punt return set up the Tigers at Washington's 36-yard line. On third-and-7 from the Huskies' 10, Stidham hit a leaping Sal Cannella in the end zone for Canella's first career touchdown and a 6-0 lead with 11:45 remaining in the first quarter.

Auburn soon added to its lead when pressure from Montavious Atkinson forced an errant Browning throw, which Jamel Dean intercepted.

Stidham completed third-and-longs to Darius Slayton for 18 yards and Nate Craig-Myers for 24, leading to Anders Carlson's 32-yard field goal and a 9-0 Auburn lead with 5:39 left in the first quarter.

After a Huskies field goal, Kam Martin's 19-yard run on fourth-and-one led to Carlson's 28-yard field goal, putting Auburn up 12-3 at the 10:35 mark in the second quarter.

The Huskies answered with a field goal, then Shaun Shivers' first career rush on third-and-3 picked up 6 yards, positioning Carlson for a 53-yarder and a 15-6 Auburn lead with 1:23 in the half.

Washington drove 75 yards in 40 seconds, with Browning completing four consecutive passes, including a 13-yard touchdown to Ouinten Pounds with 43 seconds left in the half.

Williams and Daniel Thomas led Auburn with eight tackles each.

The message all week was to improve. Improve from Week One. On Saturday, No. 7 Auburn (2-0) answered that call with a dominant 63-9 win over Alabama State.

More specifically, running the ball more effectively was a point of emphasis for Malzahn after the Tigers rushed for 147 yards in their opener. They responded with 429 rushing yards and six rushing touchdowns against Alabama State.

Redshirt freshman JaTarvious Whitlow led the way with 122 yards on 14 carries while true freshman Shaun Shivers added 117 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries. Including Shivers, six players (Shivers, Kam Martin, Harold Joiner, Malik Miller, Jarrett Stidham and Anthony Schwartz) scored rushing touchdowns. Three of the six were true freshmen.

Stidham and Schwartz also hooked up through the air for a 57-yard touchdown, the long play of the night for Auburn. Stidham, who gave way to Malik Willis in the second quarter, went 6 of 11 passing for 113 yards with the lone touchdown.

For Schwartz, it was a breakout performance. The true freshman didn't see a touch the week before but finished with three catches for a team-high 67 yards, three carries for 50 yards and scored his first two career touchdowns. He averaged 19.5 yards per touch.

But as impressive as the offense looked, it wasn't the only unit to find the end zone for Auburn on Saturday. Safety Daniel Thomas returned an interception 29 yards for a touchdown late in the first quarter, and later in the first half, Devan Barrett picked up a blocked punt and returned it 10 yards for a score to make it 35-0. The punt was blocked by cornerback Jordvn Peters

It was the first time since 2003 that the Tigers scored on an interception return and a blocked punt return in the same

Though the Tigers gave up a touchdown late in the third quarter, the defense forced four turnovers and allowed only 47 yards rushing for the game. Thomas added another interception in the first half, and true freshman Jamien Sherwood recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter.

JaTarvious Whtlow rushed for 104 yards and a touchdown but No. 12 LSU kicked a field goal as time expired to beat No.

LSU, aided by two pass-interference penalties, drove 52 yards on 14 plays to set up Cole Tracy's 42-yard game winner. Leading 14-10 in the third quarter, Jarrett Stidham's 4-yard touchdown pass to Darius Slayton on third-and-goal gave Auburn a two-score lead.

Auburn's defense responded with a three-and-out, with a third down sack from Davis forcing an LSU punt, giving the home team possession again less than a minute after its touchdown.

There was never a doubt inside Jordan-Hare Stadium on Saturday night. No. 9 Auburn jumped in front 7-0 early in the first quarter, and the Tigers never looked back as they bounced back with a convincing 34-3 win over Arkansas

Running back JaTarvious Whitlow put Auburn on the board on its opening drive with a five-yard touchdown run in which he ran up the middle untouched. The freshman added a second touchdown run later in the game and finished with 49 vards on 13 carries.

 $\tilde{\mathsf{T}}$ he first touchdown run from Whitlow was set up by a 48-yard punt return from Ryan Davis, which was the first of many significant plays from the Auburn special teams Saturday.

Later in the first half, Jordyn Peters deflected a punt - he nearly blocked one earlier in the game - that was returned by linebacker K.J. Britt down inside the Arkansas 10-yard line. That led to an Auburn field goal. Then sophomore Noah labinoghene broke the game wide open with a 96-yard kick return for a touchdown early in the third guarter that put the Tigers ahead, 24-3, at the time.

It was Auburn's first kickoff return for a touchdown since Corey Grant ran one back against Tennessee in 2013, and the longest kickoff return since Tre Mason ran one back 100 yards against Washington State that same season.

Like Malzahn alluded to above, it was another impressive performance from the Auburn defense, who held Arkansas to 290 total yards and kept the Razorbacks out of the end zone. The Tigers wreaked havoc in the backfield throughout the $game\ with\ seven\ tackles\ for\ loss,\ two\ sacks\ and\ nine\ quarterback\ hurries.\ Both\ sacks\ came\ from\ true\ freshmen-Richard$ Jibunor and Smoke Monday.

Auburn also forced a pair of turnovers with an interception from Javaris Davis and a fumble forced by Igbinoghene that was nearly picked up and returned for a touchdown by fellow defensive back Daniel Thomas.

Quarterback Jarrett Stidham completed 15 of his 22 passes for 134 yards in the win. His favorite target, Ryan Davis, caught six passes for 40 yards. The senior wide receiver, who returned a punt 36 yards later in the fourth quarter, finished with a game-high 124 all-purpose yards.

It took more than six hours, but No. 10 Auburn beat Southern Miss 24-13 Saturday on Homecoming at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

A 164-minute weather delay late in the first half made for a long day and night for players and fans alike.

Christian Tutt's interception in the fourth quarter led to Anders Carlson's field goal, sealing Auburn's victory.

Jarrett Stidham's 53-yard pass to Darius Slayton set up Stidham's 2-yard touchdown pass to Chandler Cox, giving Auburn a 21-6 lead with 5:39 in the third quarter.

Southern Miss made it a one-possession game with a touchdown pass early in the fourth quarter, but Auburn's defense held firm, tallying 12 tackles for loss.

Stidham completed 19 of 33 passes for 245 yards and two touchdowns.

Kam Martin rushed for 90 yards on 24 carries.

Auburn (4-1) held the Golden Eagles to 45 rushing yards on 21 carries.

Tutt and Jeremiah Dinson mades interceptions. Derrick Brown had a sack while Nick Coe and Marlon Davidson each had a half sack. Deshaun Davis led the Tigers with 10 tackles. Darrell Williams had nine tackles. The senior linebackers combined for 4.5 tackles for loss. Southern Miss was 2-for-13 on third down.

Auburn came out firing, with Stidham targeting Seth Williams for a deep pass on the Tigers' first offensive play. That pass fell incomplete, but on Auburn's third possession, Stidham and Williams connected for a 46-yard touch-

dwn pass to give the Tigers a 7-0 lead, Williams' first Auburn score.

In the second quarter, after a Southern Miss field goal, Auburn drove 73 yards on 13 plays, with Stidham twice complet-

ing passes to running backs on third-and-long for first downs.

Anthony Schwartz scored on a 6-yard jet sweep to put Auburn up 14-3 before a weather delay suspended the game

for the better part of three hours with 4:27 left in the half.

Auburn's special teams again excelled. Jordyn Peters recovered a fumbled USM punt. Arrryn Siposs then punted 37 yards, pinning the Golden Eagles at their own 3 when Javaris Davis fielded his teammates' punt.

A three-and-out from Auburn's defense gave the Tigers the ball at USM's 47. After a 1-yard run, Stidham and Williams teamed up for their long TD.
