WILDCATS WELCOME NO. 18 BULLDOGS TO MANHATTAN

Following a come-from-behind win over South Dakota in the season opener, K-State hosts 18th-ranked Mississippi State at 11 a.m., Saturday morning in a Big 12/SEC battle at Bill Snyder Family Stadium. The contest will be shown nationally on ESPN with mark Jones (play-by-play), Dusty Dvoracek (analyst) and Molly McGrath (sideline) on the call.

The game can be heard across the 39-station K-State Sports Network with Wyatt Thompson (play-by-play), former K-State quarterback Stan Weber (analyst) and Matt Walters (sidelines) calling the action. The game will also be on Sirius channel 134, XM Channel 199 and in addition to the TuneIn app. Live stats are available at k-statesports. com, and Twitter updates (@KStateFB) will also be a part of the coverage.

A LOOK AT K-STATE

- K-State boasts 35 returning letterwinners including 14 starters - from a team that went 8-5 in 2017 and has won its last four games dating back to last season.
- Although Bill Snyder is back for a 27th year, he is flanked by two new coordinators in Andre Coleman (offense) and Blake Seiler (defense), two of the seven assistants on staff that played and graduated from Kansas State.
- K-State played both Skylar Thompson (started) and Alex Delton last week against South Dakota with Thompson leading the Cats to his third fourth-quarter comeback win in the Wildcats' last six total games.
- The running game is solidified by the Wildcats' leading rusher a vear ago. Alex Barnes, as well as Justin Silmon and Dalvin Warmack. Barnes topped 100 yards in the season opener with 103 on 21 carries.
- The Wildcats have the benefit of having all five returning starters along the offensive line back for another year, one of just five FBS teams to return 65-of-65 starts along the offensive line from 2017.
- · Wide receiver Isaiah Zuber not only caught the game-winning touchdown pass late in the game against USD, but he also returned a punt 85 yards for a score to earn Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week honors.
- Defensively, K-State held USD to just 77 yards on the ground, while defensive back Kevion McGee had four passes defended in the game, the most by a Big 12 defender in week one.
- The Wildcats had to replace their punter and kicker from a year ago, and Blake Lynch stepped right in to connect on 4-of-4 field goals in his first action as a Wildcat — which were the most by any kicker in the Big 12 this past week while punter Andrew Hicks averaged 42.7 yards per punt, which included one of 63 yards and another downed inside the 20 yard line.

Postgame Interviews

K-State's locker room is closed. Media will be asked to submit a list of player requests to either Ryan Lackey or Kenny Lannou at the start of the fourth quarter, During home games, Coach Snyder will address the media in the Steel & Pipe Team Theatre on the third floor of the Vanier Family Football Complex following a cooling off period, followed by the requested players. To get to the theater, proceed to the concourse and walk toward the Vanier Family Football Complex. Enter the first set of double doors and take an immediate left into the theater. On the road. these interviews will take place either in the designated visiting interview area or outside the visiting locker room.

When referring to Kansas State University, please only use the terms Kansas State or K-State. Please refrain from using KSU. Kansas St... Kan. St., or any other variation. The only acceptable nicknames include Wildcats or Cats. In addition, K-State plays in the Big 12 Conference or Big 12. Please do not use roman numerals (Big XII) when referring to the Conference. A LOOK AT MISSISSIPPI STATE

- The Bulldogs kicked off the Joe Moorhead era with a convincing 63-6 win over Stephen F. Austin last week.
- State totaled 618 yards of offense while holding SFA to just 254 and collecting 17 tackles for loss in the game.
- · Keytaon Thompson threw for 364 yards and five scores while running for another 109 yards and two scores. Returning quarterback Nick Fitzgerald is expected to be back under center this weekend.

A LOOK AT THE SERIES

- K-State and Mississippi State will be meeting for the third time overall on Saturday as the series is tied, 1-1.
- The Bulldogs won, 21-16, back in 1974 before forfeiting a 24-21 win in 1977.
- K-State will travel to Starkville next season in the second game of the current two-game series.

CATS AGAINST THE SEC

- The Wildcats hold an all-time record of 45-85-5 against current members of the SEC, while they are 7-16 when taking out K-State's games against former Big 8/12 members Missouri and Texas A&M.
- Recent Power 5 games against SEC opponents have included Auburn (2007 and 2014) and Vanderbilt (2017 and 2020) with the 2014 Auburn game (a 20-14 loss to the fifth-ranked Tigers) being the last time K-State has hosted an SEC program.
- K-State's last two wins against SEC teams has come in bowl games with the 2016 Texas Bowl (Texas A&M) and 2001 Cotton Bowl (Tennessee).

NON-CONFERENCE NOTABLES

- Since 1990, K-State has won 77 of its 88 (.875) regular-season non-conference games under Bill Snyder, including 67-of-70 (.947) at home.
- K-State has had perfect regular season non-conference ledgers in 15 of the last 25 years.

SNYDER IN SEPTEMBER

- Fast starts have propelled the Wildcats to winning seasons under Bill Snyder. Since 1992 under Snyder, K-State is a combined 68-9 (.883) in September.
- Of the losses, six came on the road, as the Cats are 55-3 (.948) in September home games during that stretch.
- K-State is riding a nine-game winning streak in September home games (Last loss: 20-14 loss to Auburn in 2014).
- Since Snyder's return to the sidelines in 2009. K-State is 26-6 (.813) in the month of September.

CATS NEED A QUICK START

- K-State will be looking to break a trend of slow starts it has developed the last three years. The 2015 Wildcats started out 3-6 before winning their final three to make a bowl. In 2016, K-State started 3-3 before winning six of its final seven, including a Texas Bowl win. Last year, the Cats started 3-4 but won five of their final six with a Cactus Bowl victory.
- It is especially important this year as the Wildcats will play five of their 12 games — and four of their seven homes games — prior to October 1 for the first time since the 2006 season.

ONE OF THE BIG 12'S BEST

- K-State is one of only three teams in the Big 12 to reach 100 league wins since the league's inception in 1996.
- The Wildcats also rank third in the conference in winning percentage since round-robin play began in 2011. They sit at .651 (41-22), trailing only Oklahoma (.810; 51-12) and Oklahoma State (.698; 44-19).
- During that stretch, the Wildcats are 22-10 (.688) at home in Big 12 play and 19-12 (.613) on the road.
- K-State, picked sixth by the league's media in the Big 12 preseason poll, has finished in the top four of the conference in five of the last seven years.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Since 1990, K-State holds a 149-38-1 (.794) record when playing at Bill Snyder Family Stadium, including a 73-5 (.938) mark in non-conference games.
- The Wildcats will be looking to bounce back from a 4-3 home record in 2017.
- Last year was just the third time since head coach **Bill Snyder** returned to the sidelines in 2009 that the Wildcats have won fewer than five home games.

THE HALL OF FAMER

- The architect of the "greatest turnaround in the history of college football," **Bill Snyder** is in his 27th season at K-State.
- Snyder is just the fourth person in the history of college football to be inducted into the Hall of Fame as an active coach when he was enshrined in 2015.
- Snyder, who has 211 wins, is one of just six coaches to reach the 200-win mark and coach at only one school.
- Holding 172 more victories than any other coach in K-State history, Snyder ranks first in the FBS in wins among coaches at their current schools and second in total wins among active coaches (FBS schools only).
- Snyder has 123 conference wins to stand as one of four coaches with 100 Big 8/12 victories (**Tom Osborne** [153], **Bob Stoops** [121], **Barry Switzer** [100]).

TWICE AS NICE

- **Bill Snyder** is one of two FBS coaches all time to have two different tenures at one school and record at least 70 wins each time after winning 136 games from 1989-2005 and 74 games since 2009.
- Snyder joins Vanderbilt's **Dan McGugin**, who had 95 wins from 1904-17 and 102 wins from 1919-34.
- There are only 11 teams in the FBS that have had the same head coach since 2009. Of those, only **Nick Saban**, **Dabo Swinney**, **Mike Gundy** and Snyder have won at least six games every year over the nine-year span.

CHANGE IS IN THE AIR

- Although consistency has been seen at the top in head coach Bill Snyder, this year marks the first time in quite a while that there were significant changes on the coaching staff.
- The Wildcats have two new coordinators as wide receivers coach **Andre Coleman** takes over the reins on offensive, while linebackers coach **Blake Seiler** will man the defensive coordinator position.
- It marks the first time in the middle of a Snyder tenure that the Wildcats will replace both coordinators in the same season since 1997 (1996 OC Dana Dimel; 1997 OC Ron Hudson; 1996 DC Bob Cope; 1997 DC Mike Stoops).
- Additionally, the Wildcats hired three new assistant coaches in Brian Norwood (Co-Defensive Coordinator/ Secondary), Zach Hanson (Tight Ends) and Eric Hickson (Running Backs).

SUSTAINABLE SUCCESS

- Kansas State is in rare company in college football as the Wildcats rank in the top 20 in wins among FBS programs over the last 23 seasons.
- Since 1995, K-State has picked up 192 victories, which ranks 19th in the nation.
- Among current Big 12 teams, only Oklahoma (3rd; 220), Texas (13th; 203) and TCU (14th; 197) rank higher.

BOWL STREAK CONTINUES

- In an era of college football where nearly 80 teams play in bowl games each year, K-State is one of just 16 FBS schools nationally to ride of streak of at least eight-consecutive bowl berths.
- The eight-year bowl streak is tied for 13th nationally with only Oklahoma (4th; 19) and Oklahoma State (10th; 12) ranking higher in the Big 12.

DRAWING FIRST BLOOD

- Since 1990. K-State is 165-34 (.829) when scoring first.
- K-State is 19-5 in that department over the last four seasons, including a 5-3 mark in 2017.
- Under **Bill Snyder**, K-State is 152-27 (.849) when scoring first.

QUICK OUT OF THE GATE

- Kansas State has started out games strong over the last two seasons with an average halftime advantage of 18.5 to 11.5
- The biggest disparity in that has been the second quarter with the Wildcats totaling 301 second-quarter points over the 2016 and 2017 seasons (11.6 ppg) to opponents' 171 (6.6 ppg).

LEADING AT THE HALF

- Under **Bill Snyder**, the Wildcats are 179-11 (.942) when leading at halftime, including a 60-4 (.938) mark in Snyder's second tenure, which began in 2009.
- The Wildcats finished the 2017 campaign with a 7-1 record when leading at the half.
- The lone blemish last season was against No. 9 Oklahoma when the Wildcats led, 21-10, at halftime before the Sooners scored a touchdown with seven seconds left in the game to win, 42-35.

- Attendance at K-State games has been at an all-time high over the last five years as K-State is one of just three teams — joining Oklahoma and Nebraska — to rank in the top seven in percentage of capacity filled each of the last five seasons.
- Each of the last 10 home openers since **Bill Snyder**'s return dubbed the "K-State Family Reunion" have been sellouts with an average of 51,356 fans in attendance.

CARDIAC CATS

- Four of Kansas State's last five wins dating back to last season have been double-digit comeback victories with three of those being overcome in the fourth quarter alone.
- The 2017 Wildcats had three wins after trailing by at least 10 points, the most comeback wins in a season when overcoming a double-digit deficit.
- Additionally, it was just the third time a Big 12 team won three games in a season in which they were trailing by 10-plus points in the round-robin era (2011). The other teams were Baylor (2012) and Oklahoma State (2015).
- At Texas Tech, K-State trailed, 35-24, with less than 10 minutes left but scored the final 18 points for a 42-35 win.
- In the regular-season finale vs. lowa State, K-State trailed, 19-7, with less than seven minutes remaining but won, 20-19.
- K-State trailed UCLA, 17-7, at halftime of the Cactus Bowl before outscoring the Bruins, 28-0, in the second half.
- K-State's victories against Texas Tech and Iowa State marked the first time in school history it had two wins in a season when trailing by double digits in the fourth quarter.
- The 11-point comeback at Texas Tech was the largest road deficit overcome for a win in school history.
- Fueled by an 85-yard punt return from **Isaiah Zuber** and a 10-yard pass from **Skylar Thompson** to Zuber, the Cats erased a 24-12, fourth-quarter deficit last week to defeat South Dakota

CATS TOPS IN NON-OFFENSIVE TDs

- K-State is the nation's best in non-offensive touchdowns over the last 19 seasons as it has 112 since 1999, nine more than the next closest team and one of only two to top 100.
- The Wildcats are averaging 5.8 non-offensive touchdowns per year since 1999, while the yearly average for the other 105 teams to play FBS football since 1999 is 3.3.
- Kansas State has at least five non-offensive touchdowns in six of the last seven years, which includes three

last year by 2018 returners. Two of them came from **Kendall Adams**, who had both a pick-six and a fumble-return touchdown against Charlotte, while **Duke Shelley** returned an interception for a score at Texas Tech.

• Since 1990, the Wildcats are 62-17 when scoring on special teams and 20-1 when scoring on special teams and defense, including an 18-0 mark under **Bill Snyder**.

Of the 112 non-offensive TDs since 1999, 38 have been punt returns, 37 interception returns, 27 kickoff returns, 8 fumble returns and 2 missed/blocked field goal returns.

NON-OFFENSIVE TD RECORDS

- Under head coach **Bill Snyder**, K-State is 76-21 (.784) when scoring a non-offensive touchdown, while the Cats are 57-14 (.803) since 1999 in that department.
- Since Snyder returned to the sideline in 2009, K-State is 32-7 (.821) in this same category.

FLAGGED

- Despite rallying for a 27-24 win last week, the Wildcats were flagged 13 times for 129 yards, most of which came on key plays.
- The 13 penalties were the most for a **Bill Snyder** team since the 2005 Nebraska game (14) and the 129 yards were the most since having 136 vs. Kent State in 2011.

THESE CATS ARE SMART

- Not only does K-State have a reputation of being one of the best in the Big 12 on the field under **Bill Snyder**, but the same mentality applies in the classroom.
- K-State leads the conference with 111 Academic All-Big 12 selections over the last four years, which is 31 more than the team in second place (Oklahoma State: 80).
- K-State tallied a school record 29 selections in both 2014 and 2016, while they had 25 in 2015 and 28 a year ago.

OFFENSIVE NOTES GROUND ATTACK

- K-State has leaned on its rushing game the past two years, including the 2017 season when the Wildcats tied for third in school history in rushing yards per carry (4.98) and finished seventh with 2,584 total rushing yards.
- The Wildcats were especially tough to stop the final three games of the year all wins as K-State averaged 223.3 rushing yards per game.
- The stretch was capped by a 344-yard rushing output in the Cactus Bowl victory over UCLA, the most rushing yards ever by K-State in a bowl game.
- Dating back to the 2016, K-State has hit the 200-yard mark on the ground in 16 of its last 23 games, including running for 256 last week against South Dakota.

PROTECTING THE FOOTBALL

- K-State has been one of the nation's best in limiting turnovers the last two years as the Wildcats are the only team to rank in the top 10 nationally in fewest turnovers lost in both 2016 and 2017.
- The Wildcats tied for fifth in 2016 with 12 turnovers lost, while they tied for eighth a year ago with 13.



- K-State's 25 total turnovers in 2016 and 2017 is its fewest in a two-year stretch since at least 1955-56.
- Ironically, the Cats were minus-4 in the turnover battle last week but still won, marking the first time since 2011 to win a game with four-plus more turnovers than its opponent (10-7 win over Eastern Kentucky).

LONG DRIVES

- In the era of quick-strike offenses in college football, K-State was a team that liked to possess the ball as, in 2016, 39 of the Wildcats' 64 scoring drives were seven plays or longer.
- That figure included 19 scoring drives of 10 or more plays, and 19 scoring drives that lasted at least five minutes.
- The Wildcats became more of a quick-strike offense in 2017 as 21 of their 45 touchdown drives were four plays or less (46.7-percent), while 36 drives (80.0-percent) were four minutes or shorter.
- Last week, K-State had four scoring drives that were seven or more plays two of which were 10-plus.

GOIN' DEEP

- The Wildcats ranked 13th in the nation last year in passing yards per completion (14.48), their highest ranking in that department since the 2013 squad ranked eighth (14.83).
- Last year's figure was impressive considering K-State started three quarterbacks and had multiple QBs take snaps in seven of its 13 games.
- Among the returning signal callers, Skylar Thompson averaged 13.5 yards per completion, while Alex Delton averaged 13.0.

QUARTERBACK BATTLE

- One of the biggest storylines for Kansas State this past offseason was the quarterback battle between Alex Delton and Skylar Thompson, both of whom started four games last year.
- It is one of the fiercest QB battles K-State has had since **Jake Waters** and **Daniel Sams** were competing for the No. 1 spot in 2013.
- With Thompson taking the first snap of 2018, it marked the fifth time under Snyder a sophomore started the season opener (Jesse Ertz in 2015; Dylan Meier in 2004; Ell Roberson in 2001; Paul Watson in 1989).

FAST TO 1.000

- Running back **Alex Barnes** became the 29th player in school history with 1,000 career rushing yards, a mark he eclipsed during the Texas Tech game last season.
- In doing so, he was just the fourth player in school history to reach the 1,000-yard barrier prior to the end of his sophomore season, while he was the second fastest player to reach 1,000 career yards in terms of carries (152), just five behind **Darren Sproles** (147).

MOVIN' ON UP

- Alex Barnes moved into the top 20 in school history in career rushing yards with his 103-yard effort in the 2018 season opener against South Dakota.
- Barnes now has 1,364 career rushing yards to rank 20th as he passed **Michael Bishop** (1,314; 1997-98).
- A product of Pittsburg, Kansas, who carded the sixth 100-yard rushing game of his career against the Coyotes, Barnes has averaged 6.12 yards per rush in his career to rank first in school history.

DOUBLE 1,000-YARD RUSHERS

- **Alex Barnes** and **Justin Silmon** each joined the career 1,000-yard club during the 2017 season.
- Last year marked the fifth time in school history that two running backs with 1,000 career rushing yards were on the same team.
- However, the duo of Barnes and Silmon are the first set of Wildcat running backs ever to enter a season with 1,000 rushing yards in a career.

RETURN OF THE O-LINE

- K-State returned all 65 total starts along the offensive line from 2017 to 2018, the first time under **Bill Snyder** all available starts from the previous year return for the next.
- The Wildcats are one of just five FBS teams joining Northern Illinois, Utah State, Wake Forest and Wisconsin to return 65-of-65 starts along the offensive line from 2017.
- Additionally, K-State is the only Power 5 team with five returners on the offensive line all grading out better than 80.0 by Pro Football Focus heading into 2018.

RISNER LEADS THE CHARGE

- The top returning offensive lineman is senior right tackle **Dalton Risner**, a Preseason All-American by multiple outlets entering this season.
- A product of Wiggins, Colorado, Risner ended the 2017 regular season grading out at a 90.7 mark according to Pro Football Focus (PFF), the highest-graded returning offensive tackle in 2018.
- His rating included a 98.9 mark on pass blocking efficiency to tie for the fourth-highest among FBS tackles in 2017.
- Risner, who is ranked as the 10th-best overall player and the top offensive lineman entering 2018 by PFF, has given up only 24 quarterback pressures over his 1,116 career pass blocking snaps (2.15-percent) entering his senior year. According to PFF, 69 FBS offensive tackles gave up more than that figure last year alone.

LEADER ON THE FIELD, IN THE COMMUNITY

- **Dalton Risner** has been a leader on the field for the Wildcats, being named a captain each of the last three years.
- Risner is just the fifth player in program history to be named a captain three times, joined by **Brooks Barta** (1990-92), **Mark Simoneau** (1997-99), **Collin Klein** (2010-12) and **B.J. Finney** (2012-14).
- The leadership by Risner does end on the field as he two-time candidate for the Wuerffel Trophy and AFCA Good Works team, both of which honor players' charitable work.

With the NFL season set to begin this weekend, K-State currently has 11 players on either active rosters or practice squads as organizations trimmed their preseason rosters last Saturday. Of the 11 players, six are on offense and five are on defense. The longest-tenured former Wildcats include **Darren Sproles** (14th year:



Philadelphia) and **Jordy Nelson** (11th year; Oakland). **Terence Newman** was set to enter his 16th NFL season this year with Minnesota but retired last weekend and immediately joined the Vikings' coaching staff.

K-State currently has two players from last year's squad on NFL rosters, including fifth-round draft pick **D.J. Reed** (San Francisco), whose selection extended K-State's Big 12-leading streak with at least one player selected in the NFL Draft to 25 years. **Byron Pringle** (Kansas City) signed as rookie free agent following the draft and was placed on injured reserve after sustaining an injury in the final preseason game.

K-State Athletics partnered with SIDEARM Sports prior to the 2017 season on an improved full digital platform, including a new k-statesports.com, in addition to collaborating with ESPN3 to add exposure and accessibility of live Wildcat sporting events to K-State fans across the country.

Highlighting the ESPN3 agreement is one home football game per year, which as last weekend's season-opener against South Dakota. The game was streamed live exclusively on ESPN3 and available through the WatchESPN app with the game produced by K-StateHD.TV. **Brian Smoller** and former Wildcat tight end **Travis Tannahill** called the action.

Additionally, weekly football press conference and home postgame press conferences will be streamed on K-StateHD.TV for FREE. And, prior to every home game, K-State Gameday gets you ready for the action as Smoller is joined by former K-State greats **Ian Campbell** and **Reggie Walker** beginning one hour prior to kickoff.

DEFENSIVE NOTES UNDER AVERAGE

- Although it plays in a high-powered offensive league,
 K-State was outstanding in terms of keeping opposing teams well below their season scoring average in 2017.
- The Wildcats held eight of their final 10 opponents to score less than their season averages entering the game.
- The only two foes to not score less were Oklahoma which scored 42 points when averaging exactly 42.0 and Texas which was averaging 34.5 points and needed two overtimes to top that mark.

TOUGH AGAINST THE RUN

- The Wildcats, who ranked 13th nationally in 2017 by allowing only 117.7 yards per game on the ground, are one of only four teams to rank in the top 15 nationally in run defense each of the last two years, joining Alabama, Wisconsin and Ohio.
- K-State surrendered less than 100 rushing yards six times last year, including two against ranked foes (No. 6 TCU 98 yards; No. 10 Oklahoma State 85 yards).
- The Wildcats topped the season by surrendering only 69 yards on 25 carries (2.8 yds/rush) in the Cactus Bowl win over UCLA, and then started 2018 on the right foot by allowing only 77 yards on 21 carries (3.7 yds/rush) last week against USD.

PICKING THEM APART

- The Wildcats have notched at least one interception in 37 of the last 51 games, with a majority of those coming from returners in 2018.
- K-State returns 12 interceptions from a year ago, its most returning picks since the 2012 squad brought back 16. Seniors **Kendall Adams** and **Duke Shelley** each have five picks, while **Denzel Goolsby** recorded a pair in his first season as a starting safety last year.
- Adams (Charlotte) and Shelley (Texas Tech) had both of K-State's interception-return touchdowns a year ago.

FEW STARTS IN THE SECOND LEVEL

- For the second-straight year, K-State returned limited career starts at linebacker as **Elijah Sullivan** was the only one with starts under his belt (two).
- Last season, the Wildcats were the only Power 5 school to not bring back a single start at the second level of the defense from 2016.
- The Wildcats are not void of game experience, however, as senior **Sam Sizelove** (40 career games played) and junior **Justin Hughes** (six games) each have game action at K-State, while **Eric Gallon II** played in 15 games with one start at Virginia before transferring to K-State prior to the 2017 season.

- K-State is also looking forward to seeing the contributions from **Da'Quan Patton**, a community-college All-American two years ago at Trinity Valley CC.
- In the season opener against South Dakota, Sizelove and Patton made their first-career starts and combined for eight tackles and a TFL.

SHELLEY LOOKS FOR BIG SENIOR YEAR

- Senior **Duke Shelley** is back for his final campaign as he leads an experienced defensive backfield.
- Shelley, who burned his redshirt five games into his true freshman season, has 30 career passes defended, which includes five interceptions.
- His 30 passes defended are the fourth most among active players through play on Sunday and rank 16th in school history.
- Of Shelley's five career picks, two have been returned for touchdowns to tie for fourth in K-State history.

WALK THIS WAY

- Junior **Reggie Walker** already has multiple accolades through the first part of his career, but he is looking to take his game to another level.
- A 2017 Honorable Mention All-Big 12 pick, Walker recorded 6.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks last year, which was a dip in production from his freshman season.
- As a freshman in 2016, Walker was named the Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year after totaling 11.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks.
- Walker started his junior campaign on a high note as he tallied three tackles, including a 10-yard sack, and also broke up a pass.

DISHON DIGS IN

- Junior defensive tackle Trey Dishon will be taking on a bigger role this year with the loss of fellow interior lineman and three-time First Team All-Big 12 performer Will Geary
- Dishon does have the benefit of experience, however, starting all 26 of his career games played, including all 13 a year ago en route to Honorable Mention All-Big 12 accolades.
- The Wildcats also have returning options for the spot beside Dishon in junior Joe Davies, who played in 12 games last year after transferring from community college, and Drew Wiley, a true freshman last year who played in every game.
- K-State also added **Jordan Mittie**, a graduate transfer from Texas State who has two years of eligibility remaining. Mittie, who was an All-Sun Belt player a year ago, is the son of K-State women's basketball head coach **Jeff Mittie**.

McGEE MAKES IMPACT

- Community-college transfer **Kevion McGee** may not have started the season opener against South Dakota, but he certainly made an impact with four pass breakups.
- His four breakups tied for second in the nation through play on Sunday, while it was the most by a Wildcat since **D.J. Reed** also had four against Baylor in 2016.
- It was the most pass breakups in a season opener by a Wildcat since at least 1989.



SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES SOLID SPECIAL TEAMS

- Kansas State has annually had one of the best special teams units in the nation, and 2017 was no different.
- K-State ranked in the top 25 nationally in kickoff-return defense (2nd), punt returns (10th) and kickoff returns (14th).
- For the collective special teams efforts, coordinator **Sean Snyder** was named the 2017 Special Teams Coach of the Year by Phil Steele.
- The Wildcats boasted four All-Big 12 players on special teams in place kicker **Matthew McCrane** (first team), returner **D.J. Reed** (first team), punter **Nick Walsh** (second team) and **Byron Pringle** (honorable mention) picking up honors
- Additionally, Reed was a Second Team All-American as he became Snyder's fifth All-American in just seven years coordinating the special teams.

SCORING IN THE THIRD PHASE

- Kansas State has been far and away the best team among FBS programs over the last decade when it comes to scoring via a kickoff or punt return.
- The Wildcats have a combined 48 kickoff- and punt-return touchdowns since 2005, 20 more than any other FBS school over the last 13 seasons.
- K-State averages 3.6 return touchdowns per year. The yearly average for the other 116 teams to play FBS football since 2005 is 1.1.

DEFENSE IN THE THIRD PHASE

- On the flip side, K-State has been just as consistent in terms of kickoff and punt coverage.
- The Cats have not allowed a kickoff-return touchdown in the last 64 games as the last was against Louisiana on Sept. 7, 2013. During that stretch, K-State has defended against 251 kickoff returns.
- K-State surrendered only 16.6 yards on kickoff returns in 2017, its best mark since 2000.
- The Wildcats have also not allowed a punt-return score in the last 51 games, the last being at lowa State on Sept. 6, 2014. The Wildcats have successfully defended against 67 punt returns during that stretch.

KICKOFF-RETURN STREAKS

- Kansas State is currently riding a pair of streaks in terms of kickoff returns as the Wildcats have returned a kick for a touchdown in each of the last 13 seasons the longest streak in the nation by five years.
- Since head coach **Bill Snyder**'s return in 2009, K-State has returned 19 kickoffs for touchdowns as opposed to only four in his first tenure, which lasted 17 years.
- Kansas State also is the only Power 5 team in the country to finish in the top 15 in kickoff-return average each of the last three seasons.
- Additionally, **D.J. Reed** earned First Team All-Big 12 honors, marking the 12th-straight year a Wildcat received all-conference honors for the discipline.

- Of the 29 First Team All-Big 12 returners in conference history, 12 (41.3-percent) have come from K-State to lead the league. The next closest team is Colorado, which had four
- The Wildcats are currently riding a streak of five-straight First Team All-Big 12 returners, which is the longest streak in conference history.

ZUBER TO THE HOUSE

- Junior **Isaiah Zuber** took the first punt-return attempt of his career 85-yards for a touchdown against South Dakota.
- It was the 10th-longest punt return in school history and the longest since **Tramaine Thompson** went 89 yards against Missouri State in 2012.
- Additionally, it was the longest punt return in the nation through play on Sunday.
- By going to the house on his first-career attempt, it marked the second time in as many season openers a Wildcat took their first-career punt return the distance as **D.J. Reed** went 62 yards on his first-career attempt against Central Arkansas in 2017.
- Prior to Reed, the last time a Wildcat took their first career punt return for a score was Thomas Randolph against New Mexico State in 1993.

LYNCH WITH A LEG

- Sophomore **Blake Lynch** was true on all four of his field-goal attempts against South Dakota, the most ever by a Wildcat in their debut.
- Through play on Sunday, Lynch was one of five kickers nationally to be true on at least four field-goal attempts.
- Lynch, who connected on distances of 24, 22 38 and 44 yards all in the first half, was the first Wildcat kicker with four field goals in a single half since **Jamie Rheem** also made four in the first half against Utah State on October 16, 1999.

HICKS, TOO

- Just like Lynch, redshirt freshman Andrew Hicks was making his debut at punter in the season opener against South Dakota and booted six punts for an average of 42.7 yards, which included a long of 63.
- His 63-yard punt to end the first half was the longest by a Wildcat in their debut under head coach **Bill Snyder**.

REPLACING SPECIALISTS

- Kansas State is replacing its place kicker, punter and long snapper as all three from last year — Matthew Mc-Crane, Nick Walsh and Drew Scott — graduated.
- It is the first time since 1999 that K-State did not return its primary player at all three positions. The 1998 squad featured a trio of seniors in place kicker Martin Gramatica, punter James Garcia and long snapper Brandon Knowles.

Bill Snyder's 100th coaching victory at Kansas State didn't come easy, with the 12th-ranked Wildcats being helped by a lucky bounce in the end zone and breakdowns in Southern California's kicking game.

Snyder played down his milestone win, saying: "The significance is that it is 100 and not 99. There was no celebration. Our players understand that this is only a foundation. We're a team without an identity and we're building one."

But he also said, "A win on the road is a plus, especially against a quality team like USC."

Although Josh Scobey rushed for 165 yards and quarterback EII Roberson ran for 119, guard Nick Leckey scored Kansas State's touchdown when he recovered Scobey's fumble into the end zone in the second quarter.

Jared Brite's 41-yard field goal in the first quarter provided Kansas State's other score as the Wildcats built a 10-0 half-time lead and barely held on.

Meanwhile, David Davis missed a 42-yard field goal try in the second quarter and had his PAT attempt blocked after Sultan McCullough's 7-yard touchdown run for USC (1-1) in the third quarter.

It was the first college coaching loss for the Trojans' Pete Carroll, the longtime NFL coach who took the USC job last

USC was threatening in the final minutes of the game, but Carson Palmer fumbled at the end of the 4-yard scramble. Defensive end Henry Bryant recovered at the Kansas State 24 with 2:33 left to play, and the Wildcats then marched down to the USC 15, running the clock down to a second before turning the ball over on downs.

Scobey carried 27 times, and Roberson, a redshirt sophomore making his first start at quarterback, carried 21 times. He was far less productive passing, completing just 7-of-16 passes for 26 yards with one interception.

BULLDOGS WIN GAME, LATER FORFEIT

MANHATTAN, Kan. – It was a game reminiscent of the glory days of K-State football when Lynn Dickey ruled the air and Purple Pride had reached its deepest hue.

An excited crowd of 30,060 fans watched as the Wildcats displayed a mighty offense that accumulated 481 yards but still lost a heartbreaker to 18th-ranked Mississippi State, 24-21.

However, K-State was later awarded a victory by forfeit as, in 1978, the NCAA ordered Mississippi State to forfeit every game from its 1976 and 1977 seasons for using an ineligible player.

Mack Green rushed for 181 yards on 37 carries and Wendell Henrikson passed for 131 yards while completing nine of 18 passes for one touchdown. But he also had three interceptions, the first which led to a 41-yard field goal by Dave Marler that gave MSU a 3-0 lead.

With 53 seconds remaining in the first half, Mack Green scored from seven yards out to make it 7-3. K-State kicked off following Green's TD and, five plays later, Len Copeland carried the ball two yards for the touchdown, which ended the half with the Bulldogs leading, 10-7.

Marler kicked a 45-yard field goal in the third quarter, and the period ended with the Bulldogs still on top, 13-7.

Then the fireworks began.

K-State mounted a 91-yard drive that interspersed with a fake punt and Ray Butler culminated the drive with a one-yard touchdown. MSU then took the ball and drove to the K-State 11 when Marler kicked his third field goal of the game that gave MSU the lead again at 16-14.

A 51-yard pass to Charlie Green sustained a drive that ended when Tony Brown scored on a 20-yard run that put K-State ahead, 21-16 with 3:19 left in the game. Mississippi State went on to score with 1:16 left to win the game.

BILL SNYDER

Head Coach 27th Year - William Jewell '63

Precise. Intense. Tireless. Accomplished. Dedicated. Caring. 200-Game Winner. Hall of Famer. Kansas State head coach **Bill Snyder** is all of these and much more.

To understand the full picture of Snyder, it is necessary to acknowledge his values, sincerity and warmth, along with the concern he shows for the people around him — all qualities that solidify his reputation as an innovator and mentor in college athletics.

The architect of the "greatest turnaround in college football history" returned to the sidelines in 2009 with hopes of revitalizing a program that he once built, piece by piece, into a national force. And, after eight seasons back in charge, he has done just that — and then some.

Over the past nine years under Snyder, K-State has totaled 73 victories — an average of 8.1 wins per year — advanced to eight-straight bowl games, won a conference championship in 2012 and finished fourth or better in the ultra-competitive Big 12 Conference in five of the last seven seasons. The Wildcats' eight-year bowl streak is tied for 13th in the nation and third in the Big 12.

Kansas State under Snyder has been a model of consistency, and that hasn't changed in his second tenure. From 2009-17, only 11 FBS programs had the same head coach but only four – K-State, Alabama, Clemson and Oklahoma State – have totaled at least six wins in all nine seasons.

Furthermore, Snyder became just the 26th coach in the history of college football to reach 200 career wins and only the sixth to do so while coaching at the same school for his entire career as he hit the mark against Kansas in 2016.

However, the recent success should come as no surprise as Snyder took over a program in 1989 that was in the midst of a 27-game winless streak and turned it into a national contender that advanced to 11-straight bowl games and tallied six 11-win seasons over a seven-year stretch

Turning around a program not only once, but twice, is one of the biggest reasons why Snyder became just the fourth person all-time to be elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as an active coach. The man who said, 'No,' to those who said it couldn't be done in Manhattan, Kansas, was enshrined in the hall in December 2015.

Holding 171 more victories than any other coach in K-State history, Snyder ranks first in the FBS in wins among coaches at their current schools and second in total wins among active coaches. Additionally, his 123 conference wins rank second all-time in Big 8/12 history to Nebraska's Tom Osborne (153).

The latest in a long string of bowl seasons was 2017, but it may have been one of the unlikeliest. The Wildcats lost to No. 9 Oklahoma by seven in late October when the Sooners scored a touchdown with seven seconds remaining. The defeat left the Wildcats with a 3-4 record as they were in search of three wins in their final five games, including three road tests.

All K-State did was rip off four victories to close out the regular season, which began with its ninth-straight win over in-state rival Kansas before climbing out of an 11-point hole in the fourth quarter at Texas Tech to earn a 42-35 overtime victory.

Two weeks later, the Wildcats secured bowl eligibility with a 45-40 triumph at No. 10 Oklahoma State, its first over a top-10 team on the road since 2012. K-State topped that feat with a one-point victory over lowa State in the regular-season finale. Trailing by five points with less than two minutes remaining, the Wildcats marched down the field and connected on a one-yard touchdown pass on the final play of regulation, marking the first time K-State scored on the final play for a victory since 1995.

The momentum carried into late December when the comeback Wildcats turned a 10-point deficit to UCLA in the Cactus Bowl to a 35-17 win. It was K-State's second-straight bowl win, posting consecutive bowl victories for the first time since 1999-2000.

The 2017 Wildcats produced an All-American for the ninth-straight year in the form of first-team offensive lineman Dalton Risner and second-team returner D.J. Reed. The duo led a group of four First Team All-Big 12 performers that also included place kicker Matthew McCrane and defensive tackle Will Geary.

Act Two of the renowned career started in 2009 when the Wildcats went 6-6 prior to a 7-5 campaign in 2010 and a berth in the inaugural Finstripe Bowl. K-State's climb back into the nation picture continued in 2011 as the Cats went 10-3, finished No. 8 in the BCS standings and earned their first Cotton Bowl invitation since 2001.

The bar was raised again in 2012 as Snyder led the Cats to their third conference championship in school history. Kansas State, which won its first 10 games of the season and finished the regular season at 11-1 with an 8-1 mark in Big 12 play, tied the school record for overall wins and conference victories while also ascending to No. 1 in the BCS rankings following its 10-0 start. Snyder went on to win the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award as well as top Big 12 coach honors for the second straight season following the Cats' memorable 2012 season that culminated with a berth in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

Named the 32nd head football coach at K-State on Nov. 30, 1988, and again as the 34th on Nov. 24, 2008, Snyder has amassed a 211-110-1 (.658) record during his tenure with the Wildcats, including a 123-84-1 (.593) mark in Big 8/12 games. His 211 victories are over five times the man in second place on K-State's all-time coaching victories list and rank 20th in FBS history, including a No. 1 ranking among active coaches at their current schools. Additionally, he is the 14th person in FBS history to be a head coach for at least 25 years at one school and never coach at another.

During his three-year hiatus, Snyder remained involved with the university and is currently a member of several halls of fame, while the long-time mentor is also involved in many organizations, and both of those lists are on page 58 of the 2018 K-State Football Media Guide.

Snyder, 78, received his B.A. from William Jewell in 1963. He earned his M.A. from Eastern New Mexico in 1965. As a player, he was a three-year letterwinner as a defensive back at William Jewell. Snyder and his wife, **Sharon**, have two sons (**Sean** and **Ross**) and three daughters (**Shannon**, **Meredith** and **Whitney**). They also have eight grandchildren, **Sydney**, **Katherine**, **Tate**, **Matthew**, **Alexis**, **Gavin**, **Kadin** and **Tylin**, and one great-grandson, **D.J.**

Associate Head Coach/Special Teams Coord. 25th Year - Kansas State '94

- Since taking over the special teams in 2011, K-State has set or tied eight team records, while players have etched their names at the top of 20 individual marks.

Offensive Coordinator/Wide Receivers Sixth Year - Kansas State '11

- Entering his first year as the program's offensive coordinator after earning a promotion to pass game coordinator prior to the 2017 season.
- Coached **Tyler Lockett** and **Curry Sexton** to become the top receiving duo in the nation in 2014.
- A 1993 All-American at K-State who had 3,443 career all-purpose yards.
 Played five years in the NFL and became the first former Wildcat to score a touchdown in the Super Bowl when he did so in Super Bowl XXIX while playing for the San Diego Chargers.



JON FABRIS [PB]

Defensive Ends Fourth Year - Ole Miss '80

- In the second season of his second stint at K-State (also coached 1997-98).
- Helped the 2017 Wildcats rank fourth in the Big 12 in points allowed per game (25.2) and 10th in school history in rushing yards allowed per game (117.7).
- Tutored Reggie Walker, who earned Second Team All-Big 12 honors in 2017.
- Has been vital to K-State's punt-return game in both tours of duty in Manhattan as the 2017 squad ranked 10th in the nation and ninth in school history with a 13.6-vard average.
- Has coached in every Power 5 conference, the NFL and community college.



BLAKE SEILER [F]

Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers 10th Year - Kansas State '07

- Enters his first season as K-State's defensive coordinator after moving to linebackers coach at assistant defensive coordinator prior to 2017.



▶ Game Notes

- Six Wildcats earned their first-career starts... On defense, linebackers Sam Sizelove and Da'Quan Patton were joined by defensive tackle Joe Davies, defensive end Kyle Ball and defensive back Walter Neil Jr... Offensively, only tight end Nick Lenners was making his first start.
- Sophomore quarterback Skylar Thompson opened the game for the Wildcats, making his fifth-career start but first in a season opener... He became just the fifth sophomore to start a season opener under head coach Bill Snyder, joining Jesse Ertz (2015), Dylan Meier (2004), Ell Roberson (2001) and Paul Watson (1989).
- Isaiah Zuber took a fourth-quarter punt 85 yards for a touchdown on his first career punt-return attempt... It was K-State first punt-return touchdown since D.J. Reed returned one 62 yards for a score in the 2017 season opener against Central Arkansas... The Wildcats have now returned a punt or kickoff for a touchdown in the first two games of the season in five of the last six seasons.
- The 85-yard punt return touchdown by Isaiah Zuber was the 10th-longest in school history... It was the longest by a Wildcat since Tramaine Thompson went 89 yards in the 2012 season opener against Missouri State.
- Place kicker Blake Lynch was true on 4-of-4 field goals in addition to two extra points... His four field goals were the most in a Wildcat debut... All four of his field goals came in the first half, the most by a Wildcat in a single half since Jamie Rheem also made four in the first half against Utah State on October 16, 1999.

FOURTH QUARTER SPARK LIFTS K-STATE

MANHATTAN, Kan. — With the help of an 85-yard punt return touchdown and 10-yard receiving touchdown from junior wide receiver Isaiah Zuber in the fourth quarter, the Wildcats pulled off a late-game 27-24 victory against South Dakota in front of 50,063 fans at Bill Snyder Stadium.

Trailing by 12 entering the fourth quarter, the Wildcats found a spark behind an 85-yard punt return for a touchdown from Zuber with 12:12 remaining in the game, marking the 10th longest punt return in K-State history. On the subsequent K-State possession, the Wildcats drove down the field before sophomore quarterback Skylar Thompson connected with Zuber on the game-winning touchdown with 7:21 to play.

Along with the fourth quarter comeback, sophomore place kicker Blake Lynch connected on four field goals in the first half, from 22, 24, 38 and 44 yards, as the Wildcats trailed 24-12 at halftime. After allowing 24 points in the first half, the Wildcat defense flipped the script in the second half, hosting a shutout in the second half, including a decisive final defensive possession that sealed the K-State victory.

HOW IT HAPPENED

After a fumble that resulted in a South Dakota field goal, the Wildcats responded with their first score of the game on a 24-yard field goal from Lynch. The Wildcat's scoring drive moved 66 yards in 10 plays, including a 44-yard scamper from Thompson, as the Wildcats tied the ballgame at 3-3 with 4:16 remaining in the first quarter.

South Dakota would drive down the field to take over the lead with a rushing touchdown by Coyotes quarterback Austin Simmons. The Cats trailed at the end of the of the first quarter, 10-3.

Like they did in the first quarter, the Wildcats responded to the Coyote's score with a field goal. After the Wildcat drive stalled in the red zone, Lynch connected on a 22-yard field goal to bring the score to 10-6, Coyotes.

Lynch continued to put points on the board in the second quarter, connecting on field goals from 38 and 44 yards to give the Wildcats their first lead at 12-10.

Trailing by two with 2:15 remaining in the first half, South Dakota was able to put together two consecutive touchdowns, including an interception returned for a touchdown by Coyotes' senior linebacker Alex Gray, to bring the South Dakota lead to 24-12 at the half.

Following a scoreless third quarter for both sides, the Wildcats got a spark from junior wide receiver Isaiah Zuber on special teams, where he fielded a punt at the Wildcats' 15-yard line. Zuber was able to find space along with several blocks, leading to an 85-yard punt return touchdown to bring the score to 29-19, South Dakota.

On the subsequent K-State possession, junior running back Alex Barnes busted a big run through the South Dakota defense, rushing 34 yards to the South Dakota 30-yard line. Later in the drive, sophomore quarterback Skylar Thompson found Zuber in the back of the end zone for the eventual game-winner. The Wildcats converted on the two-point conversion to lead 27-24.

On the final possession of the game, South Dakota place kicker Mason Lorber missed a game-tying 51-yard field goal as time expired, as K-State held on for its season-opening victory.



BILL SNYDER FAMILY STADIUM

51ST YEAR - 1968-2018



Renamed in honor of legendary head football coach Bill Snyder by a proclamation of the Kansas Board of Regents on Nov. 16, 2005, Bill Snyder Family Stadium is hosting its 51st season of Wildcat football this fall.

Originally named KSU Stadium, the facility was built at a cost of \$1.6 million and financed from student fees, athletics gate receipts and contributions. The stadium opened its doors Sept. 21, 1968, with a 21-0 shutout of Colorado State. The original seating capacity was set at 35,000, and an expansion in the summer of 1970 added 4,000 permanent bleachers on the east side and 3,000 temporary bleachers on the west side.

Following the 1998 season, the addition of a deck and sky suites on the east side of the stadium increased capacity to more than 50,000. On Nov. 11, 2000, 53,811 fans witnessed Kansas State's 29-28 win over Nebraska. It remains the largest crowd ever to witness a sporting event in the state of Kansas.

Multi-million dollar upgrades to the Vanier Sports Complex were complete in 2006, including the installation of new video and message boards, including a 23' X 61' ProStar VideoPlus display in the south end zone in 2006.

Bill Snyder Family Stadium's most recent changes include a \$75 million project to construct the West Stadium Center in 2013, while the most recent change is the new Vanier Football Complex, with full completion in time for the 2016 season. Prior to the 2018 season, K-State replaced its playing surface as it installed AstroTurf's newest product — RootZone Trionic 3D — becoming the first Division I football program in the country to install the product. Additionally, the east side club was renovated at the cost of \$1.75 million.
