**KEY STORYLINES**

**VOLS WELCOME BULLDOGS TO NEYLAND**

- **UT LOOKS TO GET BACK IN WIN COLUMN:** Tennessee welcomes Mississippi State to Knoxville for the first time since 2008 and the 21st time overall...UT holds a 13-7 lead in the series in Knoxville and a 28-16-1 lead in all games vs. the Bulldogs...The Vols hold an all-time record of 839-394-53 - a mark that ranks 10th in FBS in wins, including a 468-134-17 record at Neyland Stadium - the second-most wins of any program at a current stadium.
- **THE MISSISSIPPI STATE MATCHUP:** The Vols fell to the Bulldogs, 41-31, in Starkville in their last matchup in 2012 despite 21 tackles from **A.J. Johnson** and a 98-yard kickoff return by **Cordarrelle Patterson**...Tennessee won the last matchup in Knoxville, 34-3, on Oct. 18, 2008 in a game that saw two Vols return interceptions for TDs in the fourth quarter, including an **Eric Berry** 72-yard score that set the SEC record for career interception return yardage...Mississippi State defensive coordinator **Bob Shoop** held the same position at UT from 2016-17, and his son **Jay Shoop** is currently a walk-on defensive back for the Vols...Tennessee overcame a 14-10 fourth-quarter deficit to MSU in the 1998 SEC Championship Game to win 24-14 in Atlanta behind a pair of **Tee Martin** TD passes en route to an undefeated National Championship season.

**JENNINGS LEAVING HIS MARK**

- **JENNINGS RANKS AMONG SEC'S BEST:** Redshirt senior WR **Jauan Jennings** ranks sixth in the SEC in receiving yards per game (79.0) and touchdown receptions (five) after he snagged seven catches for a career-high 114 yards and a score versus No. 3 Georgia. He is tied for 10th in UT history with 15 TD catches, 10th in career receptions (113) and 18th in career receiving yards (1,579).

**MAURER'S FIRST START SPARKS VOLS**

- **VOLS BATTLE:** After true freshman QB **Brian Maurer** tossed a 73-yard touchdown to **Marquez Callaway** and a 12-yard score to **Jauan Jennings**, Tennessee led 14-10 in the second quarter against No. 3 Georgia. The Bulldogs did not take the lead for good until the 1:59 mark in the second quarter.
- **IMPRESSIVE DEBUT:** Maurer, an Ocala, Fla., native started the game 10-of-17 and finished with 205 yards and two TDs before halftime, becoming the first Vol since **Josh Dobbs** against Vanderbilt in 2016 to have 200 passing yards in a half.
- **100 x 2:** Jennings (114) and Callaway (105) became the first pair of Vols to both hit the century mark in receiving yards in the same game since **Justin Hunter** (141) and **Mychal Rivera** (129) on Nov. 10, 2012.
- **MORE ON FRESHMEN:** Maurer joined LB **Henry To'o To'o** (7 tackles) and OL **Wanya Morris** and **Darnell Wright** as true freshmen in the starting lineup for the Vols against Georgia. To'o To'o has started all five games in 2019.

**UT COACHING STAFF AMONG NATION'S BEST**

- **YEAR 2 OF JEREMY PRUITT ERA:** The Vols will look to build on the foundation set by head coach **Jeremy Pruitt** last season. Pruitt led Tennessee to a pair of signature wins over ranked opponents with victories against No. 21 Auburn and No. 11 Kentucky. Pruitt was named National Coach of the Week by the Dodd Trophy for the Week 7 win over the Tigers.
- **UNPRECEDENTED SUCCESS:** UT's coaching staff has been part of 16 national championships as players or staff members, coached more than 200 NFL draft picks, won 29 conference championships and mentored 66 All-Americans. The 16 national championships are the most of any staff in the SEC.

NOTING THE BULLDOGS

- Tennessee is set to play Mississippi State for the first time since 2012, a 41-31 defeat in Starkville.
- The Vols haven't faced Mississippi State in Knoxville since 2008, a 34-3 Tennessee win.
- After this season's matchup, Tennessee and Mississippi State are not scheduled to play again until 2024 in Starkville.
- Tennessee head coach Jeremy Pruitt faced Mississippi State in 2016 and 2017 as defensive coordinator at Alabama, coming away with a win both times.
- In Pruitt's first season at the helm, Tennessee defeated its rotating opponent from the SEC West, grabbing a 30-24 win at Auburn. That win was UT's first over an SEC West school since 2010.
- The Bulldogs and the Vols have a family connection in this weekend's matchup. Mississippi State defensive coordinator and safeties coach Bob Shoop is the father of Tennessee redshirt sophomore defensive back Jay Shoop. The elder Shoop was also UT's defensive coordinator in 2016 and 2017,

- The Bulldogs are led by quarterback Tommy Stevens, who is a graduate transfer from Penn State. Stevens has amassed 448 yards and five touchdowns through the air in four games played on the year. He also has a pair of scores on the ground.
- In the running game, Kylin Hill is not only the top rusher on his team, but the SEC. He leads the conference with 596 yards, averaging 119.2 yards per game. In the Bulldogs' matchup with Kentucky, Hill rushed for 120 yards and three scores. The junior has found the endzone five times. Hill also has seven receptions for 70 yards.
- Osirus Mitchell is the Bulldogs' top receiver on the year. He is averaging 14.6 yards per grab, totaling 277 yards on 19 catches with four touchdowns.
- Defensively, C.J. Morgan is the top playmaker for the Bulldogs. The safety has collected 19 solo stops on the year, contributing to his 36 total tackles. He also has one interception he returned for nine yards against Southern Miss.
- Safety Brian Cole II leads the Bulldogs and is tied for seventh in the SEC in tackles for loss with 5.5 TFLs for 25 yards on the year. He has collected 25 total tackles, a pair of sacks, and has forced and recovered a fumble.

**Vols Fall To No. 19 Bulldogs, 41-31**

**STARKVILLE, Miss.** - For the first 30 minutes in Davis Wade Stadium, No. 19 Mississippi State was in control. For most of the second half, Tennessee moved into the driver's seat.

But the Vols were on the wrong end of a big turnover -- and an even bigger fourth-quarter drive -- in a 41-31 loss to Mississippi State on Saturday night in Starkville.

The Bulldogs led by 13 points at halftime after out gaining the Vols by a nearly 3-to-1 margin in the first half. After the break, though, Tennessee's defense plugged some holes and its offense scored 10 quick points to pull within three points at 27-24 midway through the third quarter.

But starting with a huge play by star cornerback Johnthan Banks, the fourth quarter belonged to Mississippi State (6-0, 3-0 SEC).

Tailback Devrin Young, seeing lots of action in the second half after starter Rajion Neal left the game with an injury, broke free for a 10-yard run to the UT 30. But at the end of the play, Banks pried the ball loose and fell on it, just barely remaining in bounds in front of Tennessee's bench.

Three plays later LaDarius Perkins scored from a yard out to give Mississippi State a 10-point lead with 7:58 remaining.

The Vols (3-3, 0-3 SEC) countered immediately, needing just 2 minutes, 36 seconds to move the ball 65 yards for a touchdown. Ben Bartholomew grabbed a 10-yard pass from Tyler Bray for his first career touchdown, which closed the gap to the three points once more at 34-31 with a little more than 5 1/2 minutes to go.

But that's when Mississippi State dug in its heels and held on to the ball. The Bulldogs converted twice on third down and kept moving the chains, running out the final 5:22 and eventually scoring a 9-yard touchdown on an incredible catch by Malcolm Johnson on fourth-and-goal with 9 seconds left.

After that fourth-quarter fumble, the Vols never had another chance to tie or take the lead.

The loss leaves the Vols winless in conference heading into its biggest test of the season next week in Neyland Stadium against No. 1 Alabama, which defeated Missouri on Saturday.

A kickoff time will be announced Monday.

The Vols' loss also overshadowed a stellar night from junior receiver Cordarrelle Patterson, who became the first Tennessee player to score a touchdown on a kick return and a reception since Carl Pickens.

And Patterson's 98-yard kickoff return was one of very few highlights in a first half that saw Mississippi State out-gain the Vols 297-93.

What's more, the Bulldogs did a fine job of turning those yards into points.

Mississippi State scored on its first six possessions of the game, and three of those drives went for more than 65 yards.

After the Bulldogs kicked a field goal on the game's opening drive, the Vols took the lead with a 75-yard, 10-play drive that ended with a 6-yard touchdown run by Neal.

MSU scored touchdowns on back-to-back drives to take a 17-7 lead, but Patterson brought the Vols within three points when he returned a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown with 14:02 left in the second quarter.

After another Mississippi State field goal made the score 20-14, the Bulldogs opted for a short kickoff to keep the ball out of Patterson's hands. The kick, though, went untouched and the Bulldogs recovered at the UT 33.

Four plays later, the Bulldogs took a 27-14 lead on a 7-yard touchdown pass from Tyler Russell to Marcus Green.

Mississippi State had a chance to pad its lead before the half, but Devon Bell missed a 38-yard field goal with a little more than 2 minutes to go before halftime.

## TO'O TO'O TACKLING MACHINE

- True freshman linebacker **Henry To'o To'o** has been one of the Vols' top defensive players through the team's first five games.
- The Sacramento, Calif., native has started all five games and ranks second on the team with 32 total tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss. He also has three quarterback hurries, a pass breakup and a fumble recovery.
- To'o To'o was third on the team with seven tackles against No. 3 Georgia in UT's last game, his fourth game of seven tackles or more.
- In the season opener, To'o To'o became the first true freshman to lead the Vols in tackles in a season opener since **Dwayne Goodrich** did so against UNLV in 1996.



## NOTING THE VOLTS

### RARE MEETING VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE

- Saturday's meeting between Tennessee and Mississippi State is the first game between the two schools since 2012 and the first meeting inside Neyland Stadium since 2008.
- Tennessee has faced every other SEC school at least once since the 2012 meeting against the Bulldogs.
- Tennessee has won the last four meetings in Knoxville (1991, 1995, 2003, 2008). Mississippi State's last win in Knoxville came in 1986.
- Following this season's matchup, Tennessee and Mississippi State are not scheduled to play again until 2024 in Starkville.

### PRUITT VS. SEC WEST

- During his first season as Tennessee's head coach, **Jeremy Pruitt** led the Vols to their first win over an SEC west opponent since 2010 with a 30-24 road victory over No. 21 Auburn.
- A win over Mississippi State would give Tennessee a win over SEC west opponents in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2007 and 2008.

### SHOOPS REUNITE IN KNOXVILLE

- Former Tennessee and current Mississippi State defensive coordinator **Bob Shoop** will square off against his son, **Jay Shoop**, and his former team Saturday in Neyland Stadium.
- Bob Shoop was the Vols' defensive coordinator during the 2016 and 2017 seasons, while Jay is a walk-on redshirt sophomore defensive back.

### MAURER IMPRESSES IN FIRST START

- True freshman quarterback **Brian Maurer** earned his first-career start against Georgia, marking the first start by a Tennessee true freshman quarterback since **Will McBride** started against Missouri on Nov. 11, 2017.
- Maurer finished the game with 259 yards passing, the most by a Tennessee true freshman quarterback in his first start since **Tyler Bray** had 325 at Memphis on Nov. 6, 2010.
- Maurer's 205 first-half passing yards were the most in a first half since the Vols' game against Vanderbilt in 2016.
- Maurer's 73-yard touchdown toss to **Marquez Callaway** was his first completion inside Neyland Stadium. It was also Tennessee's longest pass play since Oct. 31, 2015 against Kentucky, when **Josh Dobbs** connected with **Josh Malone** for a 75-yard touchdown.
- Maurer began the game 10-for-17, connecting with Callaway and **Jauan Jennings** for the first two touchdown passes of his career.

### CALLAWAY, JENNINGS BOTH TOP 100

- **Marquez Callaway** (105) and **Jauan Jennings** (114) each went over 100 yards receiving in Tennessee's game against No. 3 Georgia, marking the first time since Nov. 10, 2012 that UT had two receivers with 100-plus yards in the same game. On that date, **Justin Hunter** and **Mychal Rivera** had 141 and 129, respectively.
- Callaway's 73-yard touchdown reception from **Brian Maurer** was the longest reception of his career. His 105 yards were a season-high and his second career 100-yard performance.

### SPECIAL TEAMS HAVE BEEN SPECIAL

- Through the first five games of the 2019 season, Tennessee ranks at or near the top of the nation in several special teams categories.
- **Brent Cimaglia's** nine made field goals are the second most by any kicker in the SEC.

- UT has made 200 consecutive point after attempts (PATs), the third-longest streak in the nation behind Auburn (300) and Georgia (270).
- Tennessee is the only team in the nation that has not allowed a single kickoff return yard this season. **Paxton Brooks** has registered touchbacks on 22 of his 23 kickoffs, and his 95.65 percent touchback rate is the best in the nation.
- The Vols have allowed just 18 total yards in punt returns this season and redshirt sophomore punter **Joe Doyle** was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List earlier this season.
- UT ranks eighth nationally and first in the SEC in punt returns with an average of 17.8 yards per return. The Vols also rank second in the SEC and 27th nationally in kickoff returns (25.0 avg).

### JENNINGS CLIMBING ALL-TIME CHARTS

- Wide receiver **Jauan Jennings** has been Tennessee's biggest threat through the air through five games. The redshirt senior has 26 receptions for 395 yards and five touchdowns.
- Jennings ranks seventh in the SEC in receiving yards and fourth in touchdown receptions.
- Jennings had three receiving touchdowns over the course of the entire 2018 season. He surpassed that total through just three games in 2019. He is also just four receptions away from matching his 2018 season-long output of 30.
- Jennings' seven-catch, 114-yard outing against No. 3 Georgia tied a career high in receptions and set a new career-best yardage total.
- Jennings set a single-game career-high in receptions against Georgia State in the season opener with seven catches and has matched that total twice against Florida and Georgia.
- Jennings' four-catch, 88-yard, two touchdown performance against BYU in week two was the second multi-score game of his career (2016 vs. Missouri).
- For his performance in the season opener against Georgia State that included seven catches for 108 yards and a touchdown, Jennings was named to PFF College's SEC Team of the Week and graded out as a 79.8 — the highest grade of any slot receiver in the nation.
- Five games into his senior season, Jennings has continued to climb Tennessee's all-time list for career receiving touchdowns (10th), career receptions (11th) and career receiving yards.

## NOTING THE VOLS

- Wright started Tennessee's games against Chattanooga and Florida at right guard before starting at right tackle against Georgia. Morris has started four games this season, all at left tackle.

### 30 PLAYERS HAVE DEBUTED FOR VOLS

- Through five games, 18 Tennessee true freshmen and 12 other players have made their career debuts in the Orange and White.
- Four true freshmen — **Henry To'o To'o** (5), **Warren Burrell** (4), **Wanya Morris** (4) and **Darnell Wright** (3) — have started at least three games.
- Two non-freshmen newcomers have started games this season for Tennessee: **Aubrey Solomon** (5) and **Darel Middleton** (1).

### TRUE FRESHMEN SHINING EARLY

- A starter at linebacker in each of the first five games, **Henry To'o To'o** ranks second on the team in tackles with 32. In the season opener, he became the first true freshman to lead the Vols in tackles in a season opener since **Dwayne Goodrich** did so against UNLV in 1996.
- Running back **Eric Gray** has rushed for 170 yards through five games, including a 77-yard performance against BYU. Gray has also caught nine passes for 60 yards.
- Cornerback **Warren Burrell** has earned four starts and produced 10 tackles.
- In his first action as a Vol, defensive back **Kenney Solomon** intercepted a pass in the end zone against Chattanooga.
- **Quavaris Crouch** has seen action in all five games and has 11 tackles, two pass breakups and three quarterback hurries. Crouch, a high school running back, also registered a rush against Florida in which he picked up four yards and a first down.
- Fellow linebacker **Roman Harrison** has played in four games and registered four tackles and a quarterback hurry.
- **Wanya Morris** and **Darnell Wright** have each seen large amounts of playing time on the offensive line, with Morris earning four starts at left tackle and Wright starting the past three games — two at right guard and one at right tackle.

### BITULI'S RETURN BOLSTERS DEFENSE

- After missing the first two games of the season due to injury, senior linebacker **Daniel Bituli** has returned to start Tennessee's last three games at middle linebacker.
- Against Florida, Bituli made eight tackles (including two sacks) and forced a fumble in his first extended action of the season.
- In limited action against Chattanooga, Bituli recorded two tackles along with a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry.
- Bituli has led the Vols in tackles for the two straight seasons, making him the 11th Vol to lead UT in tackles in back-to-back seasons.
- The Nashville native had 79 tackles as a junior in 2018 and 90 tackles as a sophomore in 2017, including a 23-tackle game in the season-opener versus Georgia Tech.
- Bituli could become just the second player in Tennessee history (**A.J. Johnson**, 2012-14) to lead the team in tackles for three straight seasons if he were to accomplish the feat again in 2019.

### CIMAGLIA FOR THREE

- Placekicker **Brent Cimaglia** has put together an impressive start to his third season on Rocky Top, converting on nine of his 10 field goals and all 13 of his extra points.

- Cimaglia's nine made field goals rank second in the SEC.
- Cimaglia tied a career-long make against BYU, nailing a 51-yard kick in the second quarter. He previously made a 51-yarder at Florida in 2017.
- The junior has also made field goals from 19, 22, 31, 34, 39, 40 (2x) and 48 yards during the season's first four games, bringing his career total field goal mark to 27-for-36. He is also 48-for-48 on extra points over the course of his career.
- Cimaglia has made his last 11 of his last 12 field goals and has hit eight of his last 11 field goal attempts of 40 or more yards dating back to the end of last season.

### CHANDLER A BIG PLAY THREAT

- Junior running back **Ty Chandler** eclipsed 150 yards rushing in a game for the second time in his career during Tennessee's week two matchup against BYU, going for 154 yards on 26 carries.
- Chandler's 53-yard run in the second quarter against BYU was his third career run of 50 or more yards.
- In addition to his runs of 50 yards or more, Chandler has recorded 13 plays of 30 or more yards. Six of those plays have been rushes, two have been receptions and five have come on kick returns.
- The Nashville native has totaled a team-leading 320 yards and two touchdowns on the ground during the season's first five games.
- In kick return yardage, Chandler rank sixth in the SEC at 14.8 yards per return.
- Chandler led the Vols in rushing last season with 630 yards on 115 carries (5.5 ypc) and four rushing TDs.
- Chandler made history last season as a result of his pass-catching ability out of the backfield. With a 10-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter vs. No. 1 Alabama on Oct. 20, he became the first Tennessee running back to ever record a touchdown reception in three consecutive games. Chandler had a 35-yard catch and run for a score at No. 2 Georgia on Sept. 29 and a 42-yard touchdown reception at No. 21 Auburn on Oct. 13.

### BALL-HAWKING DEFENSE

- In games against Chattanooga and Florida, Tennessee intercepted multiple passes in back-to-back games for the first time since Sept. 27 and Oct. 4, 2014.
- The Vols picked off four passes against Chattanooga and two against Florida.
- Tennessee's five forced turnovers in its 45-0 win over Chattanooga were the most in a single game by the Vols since Sept. 10, 2016 in the Battle at Bristol against Virginia Tech.
- The Vols' four interceptions against the Mocs were the most in a single game since also tallying four in the Outback Bowl against Northwestern on Jan. 1, 2016.

### JG HIGH ON UT ALL-TIME LISTS

- Tennessee redshirt junior quarterback **Jarrett Guarantano** currently ranks second in program history for career completion percentage with a 62.1 percent rate, edging out **Jeff Francis**, **Heath Shuler** and **Tony Robinson** and coming into just behind **Peyton Manning** (min. 400 attempts).
- Guarantano also ranks 12th in program history in career passing yards with 3,654. He needs just 169 yards to pass **Alan Cockrell** (3,823) for 11th.
- Guarantano has tossed only nine interceptions in 483 career attempts and his 1.86 interception percentage is the lowest in school history (min. 400 attempts).
- Guarantano ranks No. 6 in the SEC with seven touchdown passes.

11 VOLS HAVE MORE THAN 12 STARTS

- UT has 11 players that have started over 12 games led by DB **Nigel Warrior** (29), WR **Marquez Callaway** (27), WR **Jauan Jennings** (24), QB **Jarrett Guarantano** (22), OL **Trey Smith** (23) and LB **Darrell Taylor** (22).
- **Daniel Bituli** (21), **Josh Palmer** (19), Callaway, Guarantano, Taylor and Warrior all could become three-year starters.
- Jennings has logged at least one start in five straight seasons. He started the 2017 season-opener before redshirting due to injury.

BUMPHUS EXCELS IN FIRST START

- Defensive lineman **LaTrell Bumphus** became the second player on Tennessee's roster with a multiple-sack game to his credit during the Vols' game against BYU.
- Bumphus, who registered two sacks after earning his first-career defensive start, joined **Darrell Taylor** as players on Tennessee's roster with games of two sacks or more.
- Before moving to defensive line prior to the 2019 season, Bumphus started one game at tight end against South Carolina in 2018.

THREE TRUE FRESHMEN START OPENER

- Linebacker **Henry To'o To'o**, offensive lineman **Wanya Morris** and defensive back **Warren Burrell** became the first Tennessee true freshman trio to start a season opener since 2014.
- To'o To'o became the first Tennessee true freshman to start at linebacker in a season opener since **A.J. Johnson** and **Curt Maggitt** in 2011 against Montana.
- Morris became the first Tennessee true freshman to start on the offensive line in a season opener since **Trey Smith** did so in 2017 against Georgia Tech. He was also one of only eight FBS true freshmen to start during week one.
- Burrell's start at defensive back marked the second straight season in which at least one true freshman defensive back has started the season opener for the Vols. **Alontae Taylor** and **Trevon Flowers** both started the 2018 opener against West Virginia, becoming the first true freshman DBs since VFL and current Pittsburgh Steelers defensive back **Cameron Sutton** did so in 2013.

BOUNCING BACK

- Time and time again, the Tennessee Volunteers have rebounded from season-opening losses to PUT ON MORE STEAM and CARRY THE FIGHT to the rest of their opponents.

- **1967:** Opened the season with a 20-16 loss at UCLA and won the next NINE games to win the SEC Championship and be named National Champions by one publication.

- **1981:** Lost the first two games in blowouts (44-0 at Georgia and 43-7 at Southern Cal), but rallied to finish 8-4, including a bowl win over Wisconsin.

- **1988:** Lost the first six games, but won the last five to set the momentum up for the 1989 (11-1) SEC Championship team.

- **1994:** Lost three of the first four games (including opener at UCLA and a 31-0 loss at home to Florida) before finishing 7-1 down the stretch to go 8-4 with a Gator Bowl win over Virginia Tech.

- **2007:** Lost first game at California and rallied to finish 10-4, win the SEC East, play in the SEC Championship Game and beat Wisconsin in the Outback Bowl.

QBs BEWARE, DT IS BACK

- Senior linebacker **Darrell Taylor** got back into the backfield again for the first time of the 2019 season against BYU, coming up with his first sack of the season.
- Taylor has one sack, two tackles for loss, 19 tackles, three quarterback hurries, two pass breakups and a fumble recovery through the season's first three games.
- Entering 2019, Taylor was the SEC's leading returner in sacks. No returning SEC player had more than Taylor's eight sacks in 2018.
- Taylor is on the Bednarik, Butkus and Nagurski Preseason Watch Lists.
- Taylor became the third Tennessee player ever to tally four sacks in a game against Kentucky on Nov. 10, 2018, joining **Reggie White** (1983 vs. The Citadel) and **Cory Miller** (2013 at Kentucky).
- Taylor also had three sacks and two forced fumbles against No. 2 Georgia in 2018.
- Last season, Taylor joined **Derek Barnett** (2014) and **Leonard Little** (1996) as the only players in program history to record two games of three or more sacks in the same season.

WELCOME BACK!

- Defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach **Derrick Ansley**, offensive coordinator **Jim Chaney** and assistant head coach/passing game coordinator/wide receivers coach **Tee Martin** all returned to Rocky Top to join **Jeremy Pruitt's** staff this offseason.
- Ansley, who served as Tennessee's defensive backs coach during the 2012 season, came back to UT following a one-year stint as the Oakland Raiders' defensive backs coach. Ansley also coached defensive backs at Alabama alongside Pruitt in 2016 and 2017.
- Chaney's offenses set multiple program records during his time as Tennessee's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2009-12. Since last coaching in Knoxville, Chaney has served as offensive coordinator at Arkansas (2013-14), Pitt (2015) and Georgia (2016-18).
- Quarterback of Tennessee's 1998 BCS National Championship team, Martin returned to Rocky Top coming off of a seven-year stint at USC. He coached 11 NFL Draft picks as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach at USC and Kentucky.

CHANNEY'S OFFENSES AT TENNESSEE

- **Jim Chaney's** offenses set multiple game and single-season records during his four previous seasons as Tennessee's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Twelve players from his offenses at Tennessee went on to be selected in the NFL Draft.

## DRAFT PROSPECTS

- Two Tennessee upperclassmen are already receiving some major attention when it comes to the 2020 NFL Draft.
- Redshirt senior outside linebacker **Darrell Taylor** and junior offensive lineman **Trey Smith** were both tabbed as projected first-round picks in a Mock Draft by CBS Sports' Chris Trapasso.
- Taylor was projected to be chosen with the 27th pick and was rated as the 55th best player overall.
- Smith was projected to be selected with the 18th pick and was rated as the 34th best overall prospect.

## UT SIGNS ONE OF TOP 2019 CLASSES

- According to 247 Sports Composite's Team recruiting rankings, Tennessee finished with the No. 12 recruiting class in the nation.
- ESPN, Rivals, The Athletic, Sports Illustrated and SB Nation named Tennessee a "National Signing Day Winner" following the additions of four-star linebacker **Henry To'o To'o** and five-star offensive lineman **Darnell Wright** on February's signing day.
- Tennessee's 2019 recruiting class included 13 four-star prospects and two five-star prospects (Wright and fellow offensive lineman **Wanya Morris**).
- 16 signees led their high schools to the playoffs last fall.
- UT signed players from seven different states - Tennessee, Georgia, California, West Virginia, Maryland, Florida and North Carolina; also one from Nigeria.
- Tennessee signed three Under Armour All-Americans and three All-American Bowl participants.
- Morris, Wright and To'o To'o, along with DB **Warren Burrell** were all named to the FWA Freshman All-America Team Preseason Watch List. UT led all teams with its four selections.
- Morris, Wright and To'o To'o were also all named to ESPN's Preseason Freshman All-America Team.
- Tight ends coach **Brian Niedermeyer** was named 247 Sports National Recruiter of the Year for his efforts on the recruiting trail. Niedermeyer joined **Jeremy Pruitt** (2013) and **Tee Martin** (2016) as winners of the National Recruiter of the Year award currently on Tennessee's staff.

## PRUITT GRABS BIG WINS IN YEAR ONE

- **VOLS DOMINATE WILDCATS, 24-7:** Tennessee held an SEC opponent to seven points or less for the first time in over 10 years (2008) and **Jarrett Guarantano** threw a 39-yard Hail Mary TD to **Marquez Callaway** to cap the first half as Tennessee won its second game over a ranked opponent in 2018, defeating No. 11 Kentucky for the 17th straight time in Neyland Stadium on Nov. 10.
- **Darrell Taylor** had an FBS-leading four sacks versus the Wildcats and collected several National and SEC Player of the Week honors.
- **PRUITT GRABS 1ST SEC WIN IN JORDAN-HARE:** **Jarrett Guarantano** passed for a career-high 328 yards in the 30-24 win at No. 21 Auburn - UT's first upset victory over a ranked team on the road since 2006. **Jauan Jennings** gave the Vols a 20-17 lead on a 25-yard TD catch late in the third quarter and **Alontae Taylor** recovered a fumble in the end zone for a TD to seal the victory.

## VOLS WITH NFL DADS

- Four players on Tennessee's current roster have fathers who have played in the NFL:
- **LB Kivon Bennett:** Father, Cornelius Bennett, was the No. 2 overall pick in the 1987 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts. He was a 3-time All-Pro, 2-time AFC Defensive Player of the Year (1988 & 1991) and played in five Super Bowls over his 14-year career.
- **DB Baylen Buchanan:** Father, Ray Buchanan, played in the NFL from 1993-2004 with the Indianapolis Colts, Atlanta Falcons and Oakland Raiders. He was a 2-time All-Pro (1994 & 1998).
- **DB Tyus Fields:** Father, Mark Fields, was selected with 13th overall pick in the 1995 NFL Draft by the New Orleans Saints. He played linebacker for 10 seasons in the NFL (1995-2004), spending time with the Saints, Rams and Panthers. Fields earned Pro Bowl recognition twice (2000 & 2004).

- **DB Nigel Warrior:** Father, Dale Carter, was a first round draft pick by the Kansas City Chiefs in 1992 before going on to win the NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year Award. Carter was a four-time Pro Bowler (1994-97) and two-time All-Pro (1995 & 1996).

## ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

- Four players on Tennessee's roster will take the field this fall already possessing degrees: **Jarrett Guarantano, Ryan Johnson, Brandon Kennedy** and **Riley Lovingood**.
- 58 players on Tennessee's roster were named Vol Scholars this past spring (3.0 GPA or higher).
- **Former Vols Who Have Recently Won Academic Awards:** **Parker Henry** won the 2018 McWhorter Award as the SEC's Male Student-Athlete of the Year. **Joshua Dobbs** won the 2017 Torchbearer Award - the most prestigious honor given to a student at UT.

## VOLEADERS

- Two members of Tennessee's football team are a part of the VOLEaders Academy Class of 2019-20.
- Offensive lineman **Ryan Johnson** and defensive back **Alontae Taylor** will represent the football team in the 20-member group comprised of student-athletes from 15 different sports at UT.
- Current Tennessee wide receivers **Marquez Callaway** and **Josh Palmer**, offensive lineman **Trey Smith**, defensive back **Cheyenne Labruzzo** and defensive lineman **Matthew Butler** have all been members of the VOLEaders Academy in past years.
- UT announced the inception of its VOLEaders Academy in July of 2015. Student-athletes admitted into the VOLEaders learn how to use sport to positively impact their team, campus and local and global communities.

## CFB 150

- The College Football 150th Anniversary (CFB 150) non-profit, headed by Executive Director Kevin Weiberg, was launched to stage several initiatives to commemorate the milestone, and several organizations have announced their own plans for celebrating the 150th anniversary. Joining the effort, the National Football Foundation (NFF) has established a special ceremonial committee, the NFF 150th Anniversary Team of Excellence, which is comprised of NFF Board Members who played football and have gone on to great success in life, to oversee the organization's plans.
- All teams will wear a special CFB 150 patch on their jerseys this season.
- Tennessee has also used social media to aid the initiative with a series of posts on its accounts, including a thread highlighting some of the most memorable moments in the program's history via the Tennessee Athletics (@Vol\_Sports) Twitter account.



## MOST OT GAMES, WINS EVER

- Tennessee has played 21 overtime games in program history — the most of any FBS team since the overtime rule was implemented during the 1995-96 bowl season.
- The Vols are 13-8 in overtime games and their 21 overtime appearances are the most in FBS history.

Jeremy Pruitt enters his second season as the head coach of the Tennessee football program looking to build on the foundation he set in year one on Rocky Top.

Introduced as the 26th head coach in Tennessee football history on Dec. 7, 2017, Pruitt took the helm of the Volunteers after collecting five national championships as an assistant and cementing himself as the nation's top defensive coordinator during stints at Alabama (2016-17, 2007-12), Georgia (2014-15) and Florida State (2013).

Pruitt has coached 52 NFL Draft selections, including 16 first-round picks and 20 All-Americans. Additionally, he guided the nation's No. 1 defense in 2017, 2016 and 2013. He was named the 2012 National Recruiter of the Year by 247Sports and was a two-time finalist for the Broyles Award, given to the nation's top assistant coach each year.

Pruitt's first season at UT was highlighted by a pair of upset victories over ranked opponents and a National Coach of the Week honor. Additionally, a pair of Vols collected freshman All-America honors as Tennessee improved by 33 spots nationally in total defense and 74 spots in rush defense, while allowing nearly 100 rushing yards less per game.

Pruitt was a standout high school coach before joining the Alabama staff as the Director of Player Development in 2007. He played collegiately for coaching legends Boots Donnelly, at Middle Tennessee State, and for Gene Stallings, at Alabama, after growing up in Rainsville, Ala., a town just 45 minutes south of Chattanooga.

Pruitt is a teacher at heart, spending time as a physical education instructor right out of college while serving as an assistant coach for his father, Dale Pruitt, a longtime high school head coach. He has joked that he taught every kid in Fort Payne, Ala. how to tie their shoes from 2001-04.

The list of players coached by Pruitt reads like a who's who of college football's top defensive players this decade and includes 2017 National Defensive Player of the Year Minkah Fitzpatrick, 2016 Butkus Award (nation's top LB) winner Reuben Foster, 2016 National Defensive Player of the Year Jonathan Allen, top 10 NFL draft picks Jalen Ramsey, Roquan Smith, Leonard Floyd, Mark Barron and Dee Milliner, and current NFL stars Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, Dre Kirkpatrick, Lamaricus Joyner and Telvin Smith.

## VOLS IMPROVEMENT UNDER JEREMY PRUITT IN 2018

Tennessee was demonstrably better in nearly every major statistical category on offense and defense in 2018 under head coach Jeremy Pruitt and his coaching staff. In many cases, the Vols have already exceeded last season's totals with two regular season games still remaining.

## VOLS IN THE NFL

### SUNDAY'S ACTION

- 18 VFLs saw action in Week 5 of the NFL season as of Sunday.

### STILL GOT IT

- Following a one-year stint in the broadcasting booth with ESPN's Monday Night football, VFL Jason Witten has returned to the Dallas Cowboys for his 16th NFL season.
- The 11-time Pro Bowler has the second-most receptions by a tight end in NFL history and the fourth-most overall with 1,163.
- Witten also ranks 21st all-time in receiving yards and is Dallas' franchise leader in catches, yards (12,567) and TD receptions (70).
- This week, the VFL had three receptions for 29 yards in the Cowboys 34-24 loss against the Packers.

### HAVE A GAME

- VFLs Alexander Johnson and Alvin Kamara did it all for the Broncos and the Saints on Sunday.
- Alexander collected a career-high nine total tackles, one tackle for loss, an interception and defended two passes in the Broncos' 20-13 win on the road against the Chargers.
- Kamara contributed in literally every way possible for the Saints offensively. He had 62 yards rushing, seven receptions for 42 yards, and was 1-for-1 passing for



13 yards. Kamara totaled 117 yards of offense in the Saints' 31-34 win vs. the Buccaneers.

### NOTABLES

- VFL Derek Barnett collected a pair of tackles, a sack and a tackle for loss in the Eagles' 31-6 win against the Jets.
- Both active VFL guards started in their games. Ramon Foster got the nod in the Steelers 34-27 loss to the Panthers and Zach Fulton started in the Texans 53-32 win against the Falcons.

- Jakob Johnson had a pair of catches for five yards in the Patriots 33-7 win on the road against the Redskins.

### PUNTERS SHINE

- Michael Palardy had five punts for 238 yards, pinning the Jaguars inside their 20-yard line three times in the Panthers 34-27 win against the Jaguars.
- Dustin Colquitt punted four times for 155 yards in the Chiefs' 19-13 loss against the Colts. He pinned Indianapolis inside their 20-yard line twice.

### NEW YEAR, NEW CONTRACT

- 12 VFLs signed NFL contracts this offseason.
- After spending five seasons with the Miami Dolphins, VFL Ja'Wuan James agreed to a four-year deal with the Denver Broncos. The deal is worth a reported \$51 million – the largest contract in the NFL for a right tackle.
- This offseason, Justin Coleman signed with the Detroit Lions for a reported four-year, \$36 million deal. The deal made Coleman the highest-paid nickelback in the NFL.
- Ramon Foster resigned with the Steelers on a two-year deal reported to be worth \$8.25 million. The veteran has started 131 games in the regular season over a 10-year span after signing with the Steelers as an undrafted free agent in 2009.

## THE NFL DRAFT



### The Vols have one of the most storied histories of producing NFL players:

354 drafted players, third most in SEC and ninth among all schools.

At least one former Vol has played in 26 of the last 27 Super Bowls, with a total of 41 playing in the big game since 2000. For Super Bowl LIII, VFL Cordarrelle Patterson was on the roster for the New England Patriots and John Kelly on the Los Angeles Rams.

Sixteen former Vols have been selected in the first round of the NFL Draft since 2000, while 77 UT players have been selected overall in that time frame.

UT is third in the SEC and seventh in the nation with 46 all-time first-round draft picks.

UT sack king Derek Barnett was selected by the Philadelphia Eagles with the 14th overall pick of the 2017 NFL Draft, making him the Vols' first NFL first-round pick since the Miami Dolphins selected Ja'Wuan James with the 19th overall selection in 2014. He also became Tennessee's first defensive player selected in the first round since 2010, when the Kansas City Chiefs selected Eric Berry with the fifth pick and the Arizona Cardinals selected Dan Williams with the 26th pick.

Six Vols were selected in the first four rounds of the 2017 NFL Draft. That marks the most Vols picked in the first four rounds since 2002.

**KNOXVILLE, TENN.** – Despite 108 receiving yards and a touchdown on a career-high seven catches by senior Jauan Jennings, a pair of fourth-quarter turnovers cost Tennessee, as the Vols fell to Georgia State, 38-23, in their season-opener at Neyland Stadium Saturday.

After UT took a 23-21 lead on a 31-yard field goal from Brett Cimaglia with 12:05 to go in the game, GSU tallied 17 unanswered points over a 10-minute stretch in the fourth quarter to secure the win.

UT outgained GSU in both total yards (404-352) and passing yards (311-139), however two trips to the red zone that ended in field goals instead of touchdowns proved to be pivotal to the final outcome.

Junior quarterback Jarrett Guarantano's 311-yard passing performance marked the second time he has eclipsed 300 yards in his UT career.

Senior tight end Dominick Wood-Anderson finished with a career-high 79 receiving yards on three receptions, highlighted by a 54-yard pitch-and-catch from Guarantano early in the fourth quarter to put the Vols in position to score.

Freshman linebacker Henry To'o To'o began his career on Rocky Top with an impressive seven total tackles, which tied for the team lead. He had four solo tackles and 0.5 tackles for loss.

**KNOXVILLE, TENN.** – Despite 154 rushing yards from junior Ty Chandler and a career-high-tying two receiving touchdowns from senior Jauan Jennings, Tennessee fell, 29-26, in double-overtime to BYU Saturday at Neyland Stadium.

**KNOXVILLE, TENN.** – A dominant performance in all three phases propelled Tennessee to a 45-0 victory over Chattanooga at Neyland Stadium Saturday.

“It’s really nice for these guys. We got a good win and got five turnovers today, which was very important. We didn’t turn the ball over, which was probably the difference in the game,” head coach Jeremy Pruitt said. “We created some opportunities in special teams and with the turnovers, we were able to keep them out of the end zone. I don’t know how many guys we played, but we had the opportunity to play a whole lot of guys. That was good for those guys. We definitely improved from last week to this week. It was a good day. We’ve got to be more consistent on both sides of the ball and we’ll do that the more these guys get an opportunity to play.”

Tennessee outgained UTC 360-227 in total yards, forced five turnovers and was a perfect 4-for-4 in the red zone– with three of those possessions resulting in touchdowns.

Junior quarterback Jarrett Guarantano tossed a career-high three touchdown passes—all coming in the first half—and accounted for 142 yards through the air while completing seven of eight pass attempts.

The Vols spread the wealth all afternoon, with five separate running backs gaining 20 or more yards on the ground, along with eight different receivers hauling in at least one catch.

**KNOXVILLE, TENN.** – Tennessee took a 14-10 second-quarter lead over No. 3 Georgia behind gritty play from true freshman quarterback Brian Maurer before falling, 43-14, in front of a crowd of 92,709 Saturday night at Neyland Stadium.

In his first career start for the Vols (1-4/0-2 SEC), Maurer completed 14 of 28 passes for 259 yards and two touchdowns. The Ocala, Fla., native connected on 10 of 21 attempts in the first half for 205 yards and two TDs, propelling UT to a four-point lead with 14:57 to go in the second stanza.

Redshirt senior Jauan Jennings turned in a career-high 114 yards receiving and tied his career best with seven receptions. He eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the fourth time as a Vol. Senior Marquez Callaway posted his second career 100-yard receiving game, hauling in three balls for 105 yards and a touchdown.

The efforts by Jennings and Callaway gave Tennessee a pair of 100-yard receivers in a game for the first time since Nov. 10, 2012. On that date, Justin Hunter and Mychal Rivera accomplished that feat vs. Missouri.

Georgia (5-0/2-0 SEC) stayed unbeaten behind junior quarterback Jake Fromm, who completed 24 of 29 passes for 288 yards and two touchdowns and helped the Bulldog offense win the time of possession battle 36:28 to 23:32.
