SATURDAYS IN THE SOUTH: A HISTORY OF SEC FOOTBALL

The SEC Network and the Southeastern Conference will begin its celebration of the 150th anniversary of college football with the debut of the first episode of the epic series Saturdays in the South: A History of SEC Football on Tuesday, September 3, at 9 pm ET.

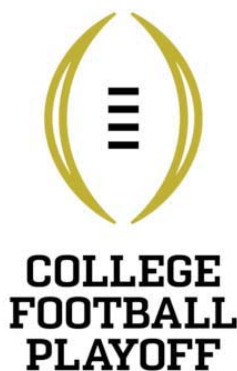

HENRY RUGGS III, WR (Alabama) -- Set a career high with 148 receiving yards on four receptions, which is the second highest per catch average in a game (min. 4 receptions) in school history...He found the end zone on two of his four catches, recording scoring grabs of 45 and 74 yards in the first half...All four of his receptions converted first downs for the Tide...Three of his four catches covered at least 17 yards.

BO NIX, QB (Auburn) -- True freshman led Auburn to first road win over a ranked opponents in four years after competing 12-of-20 passes for 100 yards and one touchdown...Ran 12 times for 38 yards including a 6-yard run on 3rd and 5 late in the fourth quarter to seal the victory...First Auburn freshman QB to ever win an SEC road game against a ranked opponent.

KYLE TRASK, QB (Florida) -- Trask recorded a career day in Saturday's win over Tennessee, throwing for a career-high 20 completions for 293 yards and two TDs. Trask's 293 passing yards is the highest single-game total by a Gators since Austin Appleby in 2016 (296 passing yards vs. Tennessee). Trask had eclipsed his career highs for completions (10) and passing yards (126, twice) by halftime, as he finished the first half 12-of-14 for 206 yards and one TD.

J.R. REED, S (Georgia) -- Had the team's second most tackles with seven during Georgia's 23-17 win over #7 Notre Dame...Hauled in his first interception of the year on the UGA 33 yard line with 11:11 left in the fourth quarter and the Bulldogs up 20-10; Georgia turned the miscue into a field goal ...Helped the Bulldog defense hold the Irish to 46 yards rushing and only seven points in the second half.

MICAH BASKERVILLE, LB (LSU) -- Blocked a punt a recovered it the endzone for a touchdown and returned a Vanderbilt inside kick 46 yards to Commodore 1-yard line to setup another TD in the 66-38 LSU win ... Both plays came within the first seven minutes of the third quarter ... Became first LSU player since Craig Steltz (2005 at Arizona State) to score a TD on a blocked punt ... It marked the second straight week LSU scored a touchdown on special teams.

KYLIN HILL, RB (Mississippi State) -- Hill, the SEC's leading rusher through four weeks, rushed for 120 yards on 26 carries with a career-best three touchdowns in a 28-13 win against Kentucky. Hill became the first MSU running back with three or more rushing touchdowns in a game since Vick Ballard had three in 2011 against Memphis. He was also the first MSU back to achieve the feat in an SEC game since 2010. One of Hill's rushing scores was a spectacular highlight as he leaped from the 4-yard line and extended the ball inside the pylon for a score. He closed the game out with a 1-yard run with 1:39 to play. Hill is the first MSU player to rush for over 100 yards in each of the first four games of a season. He is the only player in the FBS this season to rush for over 100 yards in each of the first four games.

KOBIE WHITESIDE, DT (Missouri) -- Made three tackles in Mizzou's big 34-14 win over South Carolina to open SEC play, with two of those going for quarterback sacks, as the Tiger defense was dominant in the win...Whiteside had a career-high two sacks on the day (both in the fourth quarter), and was a big factor in Mizzou controlling the line of scrimmage all day long...The Tiger defense was stout against Carolina on Saturday, allowing just 271 yards of total offense, a week after the Gamecocks rolled up 459 yards against Alabama. Mizzou held Carolina to just 16 rushing yards on 24 attempts, including four sacks on the day.

JOSEPH CHARLTON, P (South Carolina) -- Charlton boomed eight punts for a 53.4-yard average on Saturday at Missouri. His long was 63 yards and three were placed inside the 20...The 53.4-yard average was the most during the Will Muschamp era at South Carolina and moved Charlton into second in the SEC in punting average at 48.9 yards per punt.

BRADEN MANN, P/KOS (Texas A&M) -- The returning Ray Guy Award winner, Braden Mann, averaged 56.0 yards on six punts, which marked his eighth career game with a 50-yard plus average (in 17 chances)...Mann matched his career high with six punts in a game (vs. Clemson, 2019)...His long for the day was 68 with two going 60+ while he had five punts of 50+ yards...Two were killed inside the Auburn 20-yard line.
