2019 SEC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

JOE BURROW, QB, LSU

- -Set LSU record for touchdown passes with 6 in leading the Tigers to a 66-38 win over Vanderbilt in Nashville . . . Completed 25-of-34 passes for 398 yards and the 6 TDs as LSU scored the most points in regulation in a SEC game in school history.
- •The 6 TDs accounted for tie the school-record he set last year in 70T game vs. Texas A&M and is the most in regulation in school history . . . Extended his school-record streak of games with at least 20 completions to 7 straight.
- •With 398 passing yards vs. Vanderbilt, became first player in LSU history to pass for 350+ yards in three straight games ... 357 of his passing yards came in the first half, the most in LSU history, and the most by a SEC quarterback in a conference game in the last 15 years.
- •Through 4 games, has more completions (100) passing yards (1,520) and passing TDs (17) than any player in LSU history over that span.

DEFENSIVE

CALE GARRETT, DB, MISSOURI

- -Led the way in another brilliant defensive outing for Mizzou's defense, with nine tackles and a fumble recovery for a touchdown that keyed Mizzou's 34-14 SEC-opening win over South Carolina Saturday in Columbia, Mo.
- •Made a huge heads up play in the first quarter with no score, when he alertly picked up a ball in the South Carolina end-zone that had been ruled an incomplete forward pass initially. After he jumped on the ball, an instant replay review confirmed that the Gamecock quarterback had thrown a backward pass, giving MU a 7-0 lead, and Garrett his second defensive touchdown of the season matching the pick six interception he ran back 27 yards against West Virginia in week two.
- •The Tiger defense was stout against Carolina on Saturday, allowing just 271 yards of total offense, a week after the Gamecocks rolled up 459 yards against Alabama. Mizzou held Carolina to just 16 rushing yards on 24 attempts, including four sacks on the day.
- Garrett leads Mizzou with 37 tackles through four games.

SPECIAL TEAMS

RODRIGO BLANKENSHIP, PK, GEORGIA

- Connected on both of his PATs and drilled a trio of field goals, including a 40 and 43 yarder, to help Georgia knock off #7 Notre Dame.
- He moved to fourth on UGA's all-time career scoring list with 358 points, passing Hall of Famer Kevin Butler.
- Has connected on a school record 175 consecutive PATs and is 8-for-8 on his FG attempts this year.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN

BRETT HEGGIE, OL, FLORIDA

 Heggie graded out a team-high 95 percent on the offensive line for the Gators with one knock down on Saturday, as the 0line was responsible for 441 total yards on offense in Saturday's win.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN

DERRICK BROWN, DL, AUBURN

- Four tackles with 2.0 sacks (minus 11), 3.0 tackles for loss (minus 16), one forced fumble and two PBUs while helping Auburn to its first SEC road win over a ranked opponent since 2015.
- Disruptive force that helped hold Texas A&M to just 56 yards rushing (2.7 ypr), the fewest yards per rush by an SEC opponent since 2017 against Georgia (1.4 ypr)
- Career-high day in TFLs (3.0), sacks (2.0) and PBU (2)
- First AU player since Carl Lawson in 2016 (vs. Miss. State) to record at least two sacks, two TFLs and a forced fumble in the same game.
- First Auburn player in seven years to record at least one sack, TFL, forced fumble and PBU in the same game.

FRESHMAN

GARRETT SHRADER, QB, MISSISSIPPI STATE

- Shrader, making his first career start, accounted for 305 yards of total offense, including rushing for 125 yards on 11 carries, to lead MSU past Kentucky, 28-13 in its SEC opener. Shrader was just the second MSU true freshman QB to start in an SEC game in the last 12 years (Damian Williams, 2013 Egg Bowl the other).
- Shrader was an efficient 17-of-22 for 180 yards through the air. Shrader accounted for all six of the Bulldogs' 20+ yard plays in the game, including rushes of 49- and 36-yards. With the score a one-possession game and 4:32 remaining, Shrader engineered a six-play, 75 yard drive and extended the drive with a 49-yard rush on third down.
- The winning drive culminated with a touchdown and put the game out of reach. Shrader became the first MSU QB in school history to rush for over 100 yards and pass for over 100 yards in his first career start. He was the first to do it overall since senior Nick Fitzgerald last season.

OTHER OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCES LAST WEEK

HENRY RUGGS III, WR (Alabama) — Set a career high with 148 receiving yards on four receptions, which is the second highest per catch average in a game (min. 4 receptions) in school history...He found the end zone on two of his four catches, recording scoring grabs of 45 and 74 yards in the first half...All four of his receptions converted first downs for the Tide...Three of his four catches covered at least 17 yards.

BO NIX, QB (Auburn) -- True freshman led Auburn to first road win over a ranked opponents in four years after competing 12-of-20 passes for 100 yards and one touchdown...Ran 12 times for 38 yards including a 6-yard run on 3rd and 5 late in the fourth quarter to seal the victory...First Auburn freshman QB to ever win an SEC road game against a ranked opponent.

KYLE TRASK, QB (Florida) — Trask recorded a career day in Saturday's win over Tennessee, throwing for a career-high 20 completions for 293 yards and two TDs. Trask's 293 passing yards is the highest singlegame total by a Gators since Austin Appleby in 2016 (296 passing yards vs. Tennessee). Trask had eclipsed his career highs for completions (10) and passing yards (126, twice) by halftime, as he finished the first half 12-of-14 for 206 yards and one TD.

J.R. REED, S (Georgia) -- Had the team's second most tackles with seven during Georgia's 23-17 win over #7 Notre Dame...Hauled in his first interception of the year on the UGA 33 yard line with 11:11 left in the fourth quarter and the Bulldogs up 20-10; Georgia turned the miscue into a field goal ...Helped the Bulldog defense hold the Irish to 46 yards rushing and only seven points in the second half.

MICAH BASKERVILLE , LB (LSU) — Blocked a punt a recovered it the endzone for a touchdown and returned a Vanderbilt onside kick 46 yards to Commodore 1-yard line to setup another TD in the 66-38 LSU win . . . Both plays came within the first seven minutes of the third quarter . . . Became first LSU player since Craig Steltz (2005 at Arizona State) to score a TD on a blocked punt . . . It marked the second straight week LSU scored a touchdown on special teams.

KYLIN HILL , RB (Mississippi State) — Hill, the SEC's leading rusher through four weeks, rushed for 120 yards on 26 carries with a career-best three touchdowns in a 28-13 win against Kentucky. Hill became the first MSU running back with three or more rushing touchdowns in a game since Vick Ballard had three in 2011 against Memphis. He was also the first MSU back to achieve the feat in an SEC game since 2010. One of Hill's rushing scores was a spectacular highlight as he leaped from the 4-yard line and extended the ball inside the pylon for a score. He closed the game out with a 1-yard run with 1:39 to play. Hill is the first MSU player to rush for over 100 yards in each of the first four games of a season. He is the only player in the FBS this season to rush for over 100 yards in each of the first four games.

KOBIE WHITESIDE, DT (Missouri) — Made three tackles in Mizzou's big 34-14 win over South Carolina to open SEC play, with two of those going for quarterback sacks, as the Tiger defense was dominant in the win . . . Whiteside had a career-high two sacks on the day (both in the fourth quarter), and was a big factor in Mizzou controlling the line of scrimmage all day long . . . The Tiger defense was stout against Carolina on Saturday, allowing just 271 yards of total offense, a week after the Gamecocks rolled up 459 yards against Alabama.
